- TCU will try for its 10th consecutive win when it takes on New Mexico in the Emerald Coast Classic.
- The winner of the TCU-UNM game will play the winner of Maryland-St. Bonaventure Saturday at 6 p.m. on CBSSN. The losers of the two games will play each other on Saturday at 3 p.m. and will be streamed online at EmeraldCostTV.com/eccl7.
- The Frogs are 2-0 so far in the Emerald Coast Classic, with a 100-63 win over Tennessee Tech and a 99-66 win over Omaha.
- TCU has won nine-straight games and 11 of its last 12 dating back to last season.
- TCU is looking for its second-straight regular season tournament championship after winning the Global Sports Classic last season in Las Vegas. The Frogs defeated UNLV 63-59 before beating Washington 93-80 over Thanksgiving weekend.
- TCU will be playing in the state of Florida for the first time since Feb. 9, 2004, a 54-51 win over USF in Tampa.
- TCU has started the season 4-0 for the third time in the last four seasons. The Frogs started 13-0 in 2014 and 8-0 in 2016.
- TCU ranks among the national leaders in assists (22.0, 11th), field goal percentage (52.7, 25th) and steals (9.8, 26th).
- After averaging 7.1 points as a freshman last season, Desmond Bane is averaging 15.0 points as a sophomore.
- TCU was without Alex Robinson (right foot) during its 99-66 win over Omaha.
- Vladimir Brodziansky is 45 blocks away from James Penny's school-record of 171 from 1995-98. Brodziansky currently ranks fifth in blocked shots with 126.
- TCU is receiving votes in the AP and USA Today Top 25 polls for the third consecutive week.
- TCU returned its top six scorers from last season's team that went 24·15, finished tied for seventh in the Big 12 and won the NIT, including all five starters. It's the first time Jamie Dixon has had a team with every starter returning from the year before.
- TCU returned 79 percent of its scoring and 79 percent of its rebounding from last season.
- One season after winning its first postseason tournament, TCU will try to make the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1998. Since 1985, 58 percent of the teams that won the NIT made the NCAA Tournament the following season.

## ABOUT THE OPPONENT

- New Mexico returned five from last season's team that finished 17-14 overall and 10-8 in the Mountain West Conference.
- The Lobos are coming off a 104-96 loss to Tennessee Tech on Tuesday. Chris McNeal had 29 points and six assists in the loss. He leads the team in scoring this season with 18.0 points per game.
- Paul Weir is in his first season as the head coach of the Lobos after one successful season as head coach at New Mexico State. Weir led the Aggies to a 28-6 record, WAC Tournament championship and NCAA Tournament appearance.

## **ABOUT THE SERIES**

- TCU and New Mexico are meeting for the first time since both were members of the Mountain West Conference together from the 2005-06 to 2011-12 seasons.
- New Mexico leads the all-time series 16-6, including a 2-1 record over TCU in neutral site games.
- Maryland leads the all-time series 2-0 over TCU with the last meeting coming on March 26, 2005, an 85-73 win by the Terrapins.

## LAST TIME OUT

#### TCU 99 - OMAHA 66 // NOV. 20, 2017

FORT WORTH, Texas (AP) Vladimir Brodziansky scored 19 points and a swarming TCU defense forced 26 turnovers, cruising to a 99-66 win against overmatched Omaha on Monday night in the Emerald Coast Classic

The Horned Frogs (4-0) overcame the absence of starting guard Alex Robinson, who sat out with an injured foot. Robinson, who led the Frogs in assists, had started the first three games of the season, plus the final four games of the 2016-17 season, which ended with an NIT title.

Starting in his place was sophomore guard Jaylen Fisher, who finished with nine points and a team-high nine assists. Desmond Bane had 14 points, while Kenrich Williams chipped in 11 points, six rebounds and six assists

Junior guard Zach Jackson led the Mayericks (0-5) with 17 points.

The Frogs opened with a 10-2 run, eventually building a lead that reached 24 points in the first half. That lead would extend to 42 points late in the game.

Omaha had been averaging 17 turnovers through its first four games and again had trouble managing pressure. The Frogs had eight steals and forced 13 Omaha turnovers on their way to a 50-28 halftime lead.

Overall, TCU forced 26 turnovers and finished with 13 steals, both season-highs.

#### **BIG PICTURI**

Omaha: The Mavericks already have dropped games to bigger-named foes such as Oklahoma, New Mexico and No. 18 Louisville. They'll be hardpressed to match last year's 7-6 non-conference record.

TCU: Dating back to last season's NIT championship run, the Frogs have won nine straight games. Their 4-0 start isn't surprising for a team that returned nearly 80 percent of its scoring and rebounding leaders from a season ago.

#### UP NEXT

Omaha travels to Destin, Florida for the conclusion of the Emerald Coast Classic, with games against Tennessee Tech on Friday and either Jackson State or Maryland Eastern Shore on Saturday.

TCU is also headed to Destin for the Emerald Coast Classic, playing New Mexico on Friday night and either Maryland or St. Bonaventure on Saturday

## LAST MEETING WITH OPPONENT

#### TCU 83 - NEW MEXICO 64 // FEB. 25, 2012

FORT WORTH-Six Horned Frogs scored in double figures Saturday as TCU earned its second straight victory over a top:25 opponent by defeating No. 18 New Mexico at Daniel-Meyer Coliseum, 83-64. The win marked the team's eighth straight at home.

TCU improved to 17-11 overall with the win and 7-5 in Mountain West play while climbing to within one game of conference leaders New Mexico, UNLV and San Digo State. The Lobos, who entered the day in sole possession of first place, dropped to 22-6 overall and 8-4 in the league standings.

The win helped the Frogs post wins in consecutive games against ranked foes for only the second time in program history, and the first time since 1998. TCU downed No. 11 UNLV on Feb. 14 at the DMC, 102-97, while the Lobos entered the week ranked No. 18 in the Associated Press Top 25 and No. 21 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll.

The Frogs played one of their most well-rounded games of the season while handing UNM its most lopsided setback of the year. New Mexico actually led by two points early in the second half, 43-41, before TCU took total control with a 23-8 run that pushed its lead to 13 points.

Sophomore forward Amric Fields came alive during stretch, scoring eight straight points for TCU after entering the half scoreless. Senior guard Hank Thorns drained his second 3-pointer with 8:20 remaining, while two free throws by fellow senior guard J.R. Cadot pushed the score to 64-51 on the following possession. TCU's defense was key to its big run, as the squad held the Lobos to only a 3-pointer by freshman guard Hugh Greenwood during the more than seven-minute stretch.

New Mexico tried to piece together a comeback late, scoring on five straight possessions while cutting the Frog lead to eight points with 4:01 remaining, but TCU was up to the challenge. Senior forward Craig Williams answered with his fourth 3-pointer of the game, and the Frogs started a parade to the free-throw line late, going a perfect 5-for-5 at the stripe in the final two minutes. Junior guard/forward Garlon Green scored five points in the last minute to help account for the final 19-point margin.

Cadot led an inspired TCU effort, collecting his second straight double-double with a game-high 15 points and 10 rebounds. Six of Cadot's board total came on the offensive glass, as he helped the Frogs match the Lobos in total rebounds (35) after the squad fell nine shy of UNM during the two teams' earlier meeting this season. Thoms added 14 points and a season-high nine assists in 39 minutes.

Joining Cadot and Thorns in double figures were Green (13), Williams (12), Fields (11) and freshman guard Kyan Anderson (10). The six Frogs combined to shoot 11-of-26 from 3-point range, the fifth time in the last seven outings TCU has made at least 11 treys. The squad also regrouped from a recent slump at the free-throw line, making 20-of-25 attempts, while it shot 45.6 percent overall from the field.



Last season, TCU defeated UNLV (63-59) and Washington (93-80) to win the Global Sports Classic at the Thomas & Mack Center in Las Vegas. Alex Robinson has a career night against the Huskies in the final with 24 points, including a 4-of-6 effort from 3-point range. He scored 16 of his points in the second half. Robinson was named to the all-tournament team following the game. The Frogs went against the Huskies Markelle Fultz, who scored 27 points and went on to be drafted No. 1 overall by the Philadelphia 76ers.

#### EMERALD COAST CLASSIC

## 26 TURNOVERS FORCED VS. OMAHA

TCU forced Omaha into 26 turnovers in its 99-66 win on Nov. 20. It was the most turnovers a TCU team had forced since Nov. 14, 2011 when Austin College had 35 turnovers. FGCU had 29 turnovers three days prior on Nov. 11, 2011. The most TCU forced last season was 25 on Nov. 26, 2016 against Washington.

- Nine different TCU players have made multiple

#### 3-pointers.

- TCU ranks second in the Big 12 in field goal percentage (52.7%) and 3-point percentage (41.6%).
- TCU ranks second in the Big 12 and 22nd in the NCAA in field goal shooting (52.6%) and second in the Big 12 and 33rd in the NCAA in 3-point shooting (43.7%).
- Nearly half of TCU's field goals (128) were assisted (63). The Frogs rank second in the Big 12 in assists per game (22.0).

#### HOT SHOOTING NIGHT VS. TENNESSEE TECH

TCU used a hot shooting night to route Tennessee Tech, 100-63 on Nov. 13.

- The Frogs shot 62.5 percent from the field, the ninth best in school history and the best since Dec. 27, 1998 when they shot 65.9 percent against Oklahoma.
- TCU was 16-of-29 from 3-point range, the most made threes since March 13, 2008. On that date, TCU had 17 3-pointers against UNLV to match the school record set against Grambling State on Dec. 30. The 16 made threes was tied for the third-most in school history.

#### DESMOND BANE GOES OFF

Sophomore guard Desmond Bane exploded with a career-high 24 points in just 25 minutes of play against Tennessee Tech on Nov. 13. He matched his previous career-high of 19 (vs. Alabama St., Nov. 14, 2016), in the first half. Bane was 6-of 10 from 3-point range, a career high for made threes. It was the most 3-pointers in a game by a TCU player since Hank Thorns hit eight threes against UNLV on Feb. 14, 2012.

### **GOOD IN NOVEMBER**

The Frogs hope to continue the momentum in November like they have in the past. TCU has won 12-straight games in November, dating back to the 2015-16 season. Over the last three years, the Frogs have gone 21-2 in the month of November and was a perfect 7-0 last season as they won their first eight games of the season.

### THEY'RE BACK

TCU returns its top six scorers from last season, including all five starters. Altogether, the Frogs return 79 percent of their scoring and 79 percent of their rebounding from last year. Kenrich Williams is the Big 12 Conference's top returning rebounder after averaging 9.7 per game last season. Vladimir Brodziansky's 14.1 points per game is the third-most of a returning player in the conference.

## KENPOM CONTINUITY

One of the newest KenPom stats is minutes continuity. What percentage of a team's minutes are played by the same player from last season to this season. TCU ranks 34th in continuity, the best in the Big 12, at 67.5 percent. The national average tends to be 50 percent.

## REBOUNDING MACHINE

Under Dixon, TCU is 26-5 when outrebounding their opponent. Over the past three seasons, TCU is 35-6 overall when out-rebounding its opponent. When broken down even further, head coach Jamie Dixon is 290-53 overall as a head coach when his team out-boards the opposition.

Ed Schollmaier is the retired CEO of Alcon Laboratories, Inc., while the late Rae Schollmaier was a dedicated civic volunteer. Through the Schollmaier Foundation, they are both longtime philanthropic leaders in Fort Worth. Of the \$72 million of renovations that went into the previously known Daniel-Meyer Coliseum, the Schollmaier's provided the lead gift of \$10 million. The Daniel-Meyer name is still prominent as the entire area is known as the Daniel-Meyer Athletic Complex. Ed Schollmaier routinely sits courtside at the half-court line.

that returns all five starters for the first time in his 15-year career. In 2010-11, Dixon's Pittsburgh team returned four starters from the 2009-10 season. The 2011 team went 28-6, won the Big East Conference and earned a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament.

#### HIGH IN THE BPI

On Nov. 1, ESPN released its preseason BPI rankings where it ranked TCU ranked fifth with a 24.3 percent chance to win the Big 12 Conference. The BPI is a predictive model of team strength that incorporates a variety of factors including the past performance of the coach and players on the roster, recruiting rankings, and the percentage of minutes returning.

## FOR COUNTRY

Sophomore guard Desmond Bane (USA) and Lat Mayen (Australia) each accepted an invitation to their country's U19 training camp during the summer.

Last season, TCU reached the 20-win plateau for the first time since going 21-14 in the 2004-05 season. For Jamie Dixon, it was the 13th time in 14 seasons as a head coach to reach 20 wins. TCU will try for to record back-to-back 20-win seasons for the first time since the 1998-99 season, the third of threestraight seasons with 20 wins. TCU went 22-13 in 1996-97, 27-6 in 1997-98 and 21-11 in 1998-99.

#### LAST NCAA TOURNAMENT APPEARANCE

TCU last made the NCAA Tournament in 1998. The Frogs lost to Florida State, 96-87, in the NCAA Midwest Regional in Oklahoma City on March 13, 1998. TCU's last win in the NCAA Tournament came on March 12, 1987, a 76-60 win over Marshall in the NCAA East Regional in Charlotte. Jamie Dixon was a senior on the 1987 team that went on to lose to Notre Dame in the second round.

## PRESEASON ALL-CONFERENCE FOR BRODZIAN-SKY, WILLIAMS

Vladimir Brodziansky and Kenrich Williams became the first TCU men's basketball players to earn preseason all-conference honors since Hank Thorns in the Mountain West Conference in 2012.

- Brodziansky was one of five to earn Preseason All-Big 12 Conference and Williams was named honorable mention. Brodziansky earned second team All-Big 12 Conference honors last season after averaging 14.1 points, 5.7 rebounds and 2.1 blocks per game.
- Williams averaged 11.4 points and 9.7 rebounds and was named All-Big 12 honorable mention last season. Brodzinasky was joined on the preseason team by Jevon Carter (West Virginia), Jeffrey Carrol (Oklahoma State), Devonte' Graham (Kansas) and Zach Smith (Texas Tech).

### HOME ATTENDANCE, THE DIXON FACTOR

■ TCU has sold a school-record 4,931 season tickets, up from last season's total of 4,718, which was a record at the time. In comparison, the Frogs sold a total of 3,704 season tickets for the 2015-16

- In TCU's 2017 season-opener with ULM on Nov. 10, there was an announced attendance of 6,715 which was then the third-largest in the history of Schollmaier Arena.
- On Jan. 21, 2017, a crowd of 7,276, which included over 1,400 students, witnessed an exciting game with 16 lead changes that resulted in a 62-53 loss by TCU to No. 6 Baylor. It was the largest crowd in the two-season history of the Ed and Rae Schollmaier Arena. Overall, it was the third-largest in TCU history. Schollmaier's capacity is listed at 6,700. The student-section capacity is 1,000.
- TCU averaged 6,127 fans per home game last season. That is the most since the program saw an average of 6,341 for its 11 home games during the 1986-87 season, Jamie Dixon's senior year, which stands as the most in program history.
- TCU's total attendance last season of 128,658 was the most in program history. The previous high was 106,912 over 18 games in Daniel-Meyer Colisum during the 1998-99 season. The 21 games TCU hosted last year was the most in program history, toping the 18 in 1998-99 and 2012-13.

#### FEELING THE LOVE

After winning the NIT Championship on March 30, with an 88-56 victory over Georgia Tech, TCU felt the appreciation of TCU and Fort Worth. It started that March evening when the town was lit up in purple in support of the basketball team's first postseason championship.

April 8 - Signed autographs and posed for pictures with fans for over an hour during TCU football's annual Spring Game. Later that day, they were at Lupton Stadium where seniors Brandon Parrish, Karviar Shepherd, Chris Washburn and Michael Williams threw the ceremonial first pitch for TCU baseball's game with Murray State.

April 11 - Helped with the lunch menu at Market Square, TCU's primary dining hall on campus. The chef cooked up favorite foods of Parrish, Shepherd. Washburn, Williams and head coach Jamie Dixon. Members of the team also signed autographs and posed for pictures with the NIT trophy during lunch.

April 27 - The mayor of Fort Worth, Betsy Price, and the Fort Worth City Council held a pep rally downtown at Sundance Square to recognize the Frogs' accomplishments of the past season.

May 23 - Members of the team accepted a proclamation from the Tarrant County Commissioners Court and sponsored by Commissioner Roy Charles Brnnks.

On multiple occasions, TCU has returned the favor. On April 25, Dixon hosted a cookout for students in the right field terrace at Lupton Stadium. Free food and fun games were available to students to show appreciation for the student section which has come to be known as Frog Army and was a part of 128,658 people who watched TCU at home, the most in school history.

### FROGS DOWN UNDER

TCU embarked on a foreign tour of Australia from Aug. 5-16. The Horned Frogs went 5-0 on the trip, playing games in Sydney and Melbourne. It was a joint trip with the TCU women's basketball team and the schedule allowed for plenty of sightseeing. Among the sites were Bondi Beach, Manly Beach, Moonlit Animal Sanctuary, Eureka Skydeck 88 and an Australian Football Game. The trip also allowed Australian native Kouat Noi to play in front of his family as well as get the chance to show his teammates his home country. Noi led the team in scoring with 14.0 points per game and averaged 5.2 rehounds.

## TCU IN OVERTIME

The Frogs have posted an all-time record of 48-64 (.428) in overtime games and 35-30 (.538) in overtime games at home since 1961. TCU is a combined 5-0 in games that extend beyond two overtimes in its history. Jamie Dixon is 19-8 all-time in overtime

games and 5-2 in double overtime contests.

## DIXON'S YOUNG ACTING CAREER

As a youngster growing up in North Hollywood, Dixon had an acting career. He still is a card-carrying member of the Screen Actors Guild. In his early 20s, Dixon was in a Bud Light commercial that featured a woman dunking on him. The commercial was one of the more popular basketball ads of the year and aired on virtually every basketball event.

At age 12, Dixon fired a space gun in a commercial for Mattel. At age 10, he was the star of a TV commercial for Rice Krispies, pretending to celebrate a birthday while eating cereal. At age 5, he did a TV commercial for Volvo, sitting in the back seat and smiling while his father played the driver. He was also in a Kentucky Fried Chicken commercial. Father Jim Dixon was an actor and screenwriter who starred in a variety of movies and productions.

#### BEST OF 2016-17

- TCU defeated an AP No. 1 team for the first time in school history when it beat No. 1 Kansas on March 9.
- TCU finished eighth in the Big 12, the highest in its five seasons in the league. TCU was picked 10th in the preseason poll.
- TCU's 24 wins ties for the second-most in a season (1951-52: 24-4, 1986-87: 24-7). It's the most wins in a season since the 1997-98 season (27-6).
- TCU reached the 20-win plateau for the first time since 21 wins in the 2004-05 season.

#### NIT + Foreign Tour = ?

About four months after the longest season in program history (by games, 39, and date, 3/30), TCU began its 10 practices allowed by the NCAA prior to its departure for Australia. The Frogs hope to reap the benefit of their extra practice days. The last team to use the NIT as a launch into the NCAA Tournament was Baylor, which won in 2013 and the following year went 26-12 and advanced to the Sweet 16. The Bears went on to make the Big Dance every season since. Wichita State was the last team to win the NIT and take a foreign tour the season before making the NCAA Tournament. The Shockers won in 2011, traveled to Brazil and then went 27-6 and started its string of six-straight NCAA Tournament appearances. TCU has not made the NCAA Tournament since 1998, but has set the goal of changing that this season.
