LOBO SKIING - TEAM NOTES

About the 2016 Lobos

The 2016 University of New Mexico Lobos return 12 letter winners from 2015's squad which finished fifth at the NCAA Championships. The team features plenty of experience on the women's side with two NCAA titles in Nordic in the form of Emilie Cedervärn in last year's classical race and Eva Sever Rus in the 2014 freestyle race.

Cedervärn and Sever Rus are the only two All-Americans that return from the 2015 season, but UNM is still plenty deep. While the only other member of the women's Nordic squad returning is Heleene Tambet, the women's alpine squad features five returnees from last year, and of those five, Sydney Staples (2015), Sara Ottosson (2015), Karoline Sjøvik Myklebust (2014) and Courtney Altringer (2014) all have NCAA experience, and Taylor Grauer is ready to make that leap as well in her third season.

Three newcomers in Kati Roivas, Julia Devaux and Brenna Egan will be looking to take the departed Jessica Gnüchtel's place at the 2016 NCAA championships, while Katharine Irwin is the only addition for the alpine squad.

It's the men's side where experience is lacking. Aljaž Praznik is the top Nordic returner, and he qualified for the 2015 NAAs but was a late scratch due to illness. The rapidly improving Kyle Beling is the only other Lobo with Nordic experience, and they are joined by Austin Huneck and Niklas Rombock.

For Alpine, 2015 NCAA qualifier Carl-Johan Öster returns along with Patrick Brancher, who like Myklebust, missed most of 2015 with an injury. Five talented rookies in Alex Barounos, Rob Greig, Yuri Mougel, Tyler Theis and Nick Veth will all have chances to showcase their abilities and qualify for NAAs.

Do You Believe in Miracles? Yes!

New Mexico finished fifth at the NCAA championships, behind only Colorado, Denver, Vermont and Utah. New Mexico recorded 402 points in the meet, and was just 41 points from fourth place. The meet was held at the site of the 1932 and 1980 Winter Olympics, Lake Placid, New York.

The Lobos sat tied for third after the opening day, the Nordic freestyle. The Lobos dropped to fourth after the giant slalom, but picked up big points with Mateja Robnik's win. UNM again got big points and leaped into third after day three when Emilie Cedervärn won the classical mass start.

UNM struggled in the slalom, particularly on the men's side, getting just 75 points, and 56 of those from the women, and the Lobos were passed by both Utah and Vermont.

Alaska Out, Montana In, and Thankfully We Got New Rides...

The 2015 season showcased two insanely long plane flights...to Anchorage, Alaska and to Albany, New York. The first was for the final meet of the season and the RMISA/NCAA West Region Championships, and the second was for the NCAA Championships in Lake Placid, New York, the home of the 1932 and 1980 Winter Olympics.

The 2016 schedule features no such flights as the entire schedule is in the Mountain Time Zone. Off of the rotation is the Alaska-Anchorage Invitational and in is the Montana State Invitational in Bozeman.

This year the RMISA/NCAA West Regionals will be hosted by the University of Denver and the 2016 NCAA Championships will be hosted by the team that currently holds the national title trophy, the University of Colorado.



Welcome Back

The Lobos get two alpine skiers back from injury in 2016 as Patrick Brachner, who skied just the opening meet, and Karoline Sjøvik Myklebust, who skied in just the first two meets before suffering a broken bone in her foot.

Both are back and healthy. Myklebust brings tremendous experience as a 2014 NCAA qualifier and an All-America candidate. Brachner is one of only two on the men's alpine squad with collegiate experience, so his return is vital.

Can I Buy A Vowel?

Because of Brachner's injury, there wasn't a lot of fun with his secondary school name, but officially, Brachner's graduated from Höhere Technische Bundeslehr- und Versuchsanstalt Waidhofen an der Ybbs. That's 72 letters, one hyphen and amazingly enough, only 18 of the 26 letters the alphabet. Somehow Pat Sajak would say sorry if you guessed G J K M P Q X or Z. If you bought an E you would get you money's worth, as there are 10 of them.

Cedervärn, Robnik Win 2015 National Titles

Mateja Robnik was the first alpine competitor to go at the 62nd NCAA Championships at Whiteface Mountain. She posted an opening time of 1:10.80 and dared anyone to beat her. None could, and Robnik flew through the course on her second run to easily win the NCAA title in the giant slalom, giving UNM a national title for a school record third consecutive season.

Robnik helped UNM pick up 98 points on the day as UNM dropped one spot to fourth place in a very close race for the 2015 title. Utah leads with 241 points, followed by Colorado at 237, Denver at 232, UNM at 204 and Vermont at 192. UNM and Vermont were tied for third after day one.

Robnik excelled on the bottom portion of the race course in both runs, a portion called Draper's Drop. Robnik's opening run was punctuated by a final 19.70 on the Drop, the best ending to anyone's opening run. After she posted her 1:10.80, she watched 33 other skiers try to best that mark, but none could.

Her biggest challenge came from Denver's tandem of Monica Hübner and Kristine Haugen. Haugen, the two-time defending giant slalom champion (winning the NCAA title in 2013 and 2014), was third after the opening run and was flying down the course with the fastest split in the middle portion of the course. However, she nearly went down at the top of Draper's Drop and although she was able to right herself and continue, the bobble cost her the title as her final third was slowest of the second run.

Hübner was sixth after her first run, and she turned in the best run of the second go with a 1:11.70 to give her the lead. However, Robnik, needing to record at least the fifth-best run in the second go, and she made it easily. Sitting in good position entering the final third, Mateja hit Draper's Drop as hard on run two as she did on run one. She turned in the best time again in the lower third, giving her the title with plenty of room, 0.89 seconds, to spare.

"I knew I would have to fight, because we were really close," in talking about herself, Hübner, and Haugen. "I knew a nice run wasn't going to be enough. It had to be no mistakes, and it worked out well."

As for winning the giant slalom as a senior, Mateja had one thought going through her head.

"My one word was 'finally', because I've had bad experiences at NCAAAs. I've always made mistakes and I haven't skied as well as I could. It's amazing ... I wasn't winning a lot, but I was close a lot of time. This is the greatest place that I could get a win."

One day after Mateja Robnik gave UNM a national title in the women's giant slalom, Emilie Cedervärn got back to her winning ways, taking the NCAA title in the 15K Nordic Classical. Her win gives UNM two individual titles in the same championship meet for the first time in school history.

The win was Cedervärn's fifth of the season, the most among RMISA skiers. She entered the race tied with Utah's Veronika Mayerhoffer with four wins on the season, and it was a battle for the ages by those two that Cedervärn won with a late surge.

Cedervärn and Mayerhoffer were basically never more than two seconds apart for most of the race, with Emilie holding the lead at the end of the first lap and Veronika leading after two of the three lap race. Coming into the final stretch in front of the crowd at the Lake Placid Olympic Sports Complex, Mayerhoffer held a slim lead, helping part when Cedervärn fell coming out of the last downhill turn.

"That last turn I had so much speed that I almost ran her over," said Cedervärn. "Instead I fell. I was so pissed at myself because I thought I messed things up, but I felt strong and kept trying to go for it. After I fell I felt like I at least have to try all the way in. I had good skis."

The two athletes went around the back curve which has a slight incline, and Cedervärn went to the second track and made her move at the start of the last straightaway, not taking the lead until around 50 meters to go. In the end, she won the 15K (9.3 mile) race for 1.5 seconds.

"She tried to get rid of me in the last uphill, but I felt strong so I just followed up her back," said Cedervärn.

She is the 29th individual national champion in school history and the 19th in skiing. She is the second classical champion on the women's side since the sport became co-ed in 1983, joining Kristina Strandberg who won it in 2000. Since becoming co-ed, this is the first time that UNM has had two national titles in the same championship meet.

Cedervärn set the school record with her fifth Nordic win of the year, moving ahead of Martina Stursova and Ivana Radlova. She is now fifth in career wins as well. Cedervärn won her last three Classical races. She tied Stursova for most Classical wins in a season as well as she has taken to rewriting the UNM record books.

Lobos Net Seven on All-RMISA Lists

Seven Lobos were named to the Rocky Mountain Intercollegiate Ski Association All-Conference team in 2015, including three first teamers in Emilie Cedervärn, Mats Resaland and Mateja Robnik.

Joining them on the second team were Sydney Staples, Aku Nikander, Aljaž Praznik and Eva Sever Rus. Denver led the way with 10 All-RMISA student-athletes, and Colorado and Utah had nine each. Alaska Anchorage and Montana State each had three.

The All-RMISA teams are selected based on the final NCAA Qualification lists, which includes the regular season races and the RMISA Championships. The first five on the list are named first team and then next five are second-team selections. The RMISA MVPs, which were determined and announced at the RMISA banquet in Alaska on February 26, were based on the four regular season meets, totaling 10 races for alpine and eight for Nordic.

Denver's Sebastian Brigovic was awarded the Men's Alpine MVP Award and teammate Monica Hübner won the Women's Alpine MVP. On the Nordic side, Colorado's Rune Oedegaard was named Men's Nordic MVP and Utah's Veronika Mayerhoffer took home the Women's Nordic.

Resaland, Cedervärn and Robnik earned first team honors for the first time in their careers. Resaland, a second team pick last year, was UNM's top point scorer on the season for men's Nordic with 250, and he broke the 1,000-point mark in his career at the RMISA Championships. He picked up a win on the season in the freestyle at the Jade Enterprises/UNM Invitational a win that marked the only time all season in 10 races that Rune Oedegaard or Mads Stroem of Colorado didn't win.

Cedervärn was a revelation, winning her last four races of the regular season. Had she competed the opening weekend she had a shot at RMISA Nordic MVP honors. Still, she led the entire team for the season with 293 points, and she became the first Nordic in school history to sweep the freestyle and classical at an away event, and she did it twice in the span of six days.

Robnik, a second team pick in 2014, has led the alpine squad with 219 points, scoring in eight of her 10 races on the season. She picked up a win at the Seawolf Invitational in the giant slalom, and then came in second in the slalom at the RMISA Championships.



Among the second team selections, Aljaž Praznik and Sydney Staples earned their first honors. Praznik was rock steady throughout the season, although he struggled with a shoulder injury in Alaska that hampered him a bit. Yet, he was the only other person not named Oedegaard, Stroem and Resaland to finish in the top two this season (coming in second behind Resaland in the Jade Enterprises/UNM Invitational). His 164 points were second-most on the men's Nordic side.

Staples entered the season with just one career top-10 finish, but raced her way to second team All-RMISA honors after scoring in six of eight regular season races and recording seven top-10 finishes. Staples earned herself her first career trip to the NCAAs with her breakout season.

Joining Praznik and Staples on the second team were Aku Nikander and Eva Sever Rus. Sever Rus, a first team pick last season, earned second team honors this year after missing the first three races of the season. Sever Rus had a pair of podiums and was the reigning NCAA freestyle champion.

Nikander missed more time than Sever Rus, missing the opening six races of the season while back in Finland. He arrived in time for the last two meets, scoring 105 points with a podium finish at the RMISA Championships.

Thirteen Named To National Collegiate All-Academic Ski Team

Thirteen Lobos were among the 276 student-athletes from 29 colleges and universities that were named to the 2015 National Collegiate All-Academic Ski Team, announced and awarded by the United States Collegiate Ski Coaches Association.

One of, if not the, most difficult academic teams of its kind nationally, to make the team student-athletes must maintain a cumulative 3.5 grade point average in the classroom and have competed in one of three NCAA Regional competitions.

For the Lobos, Kyle Beling, Jessica Gnüchtel, Taylor Grauer, Sean Horner, Mark Miller, Anni Nord, Christian Otto, Sara Ottosson, Juho-Pekka Penttinen, Mats Resaland, Mateja Robnik, Eva Sever Rus and Sydney Staples all were named to the team. Nine of those student-athletes (Gnüchtel, Horner, Otto, Ottosson, Penttinen, Resaland, Robnik, Sever Rus and Staples) competed for UNM this week at the NCAA Championships.

New Mexico's 13 honorees was tied for sixth nationally behind Alaska Anchorage (20), Williams College (19), Utah (15), Northern Michigan (14) and New Hampshire (14).

Year End Banquet Reaps Plenty of Hardware for Lobo Skiers

After a terrific 2015 season that saw the Lobos finish fifth in the NCAA and be the only program in the nation with a pair of national champions, head coach Fredrik Landstedt put a bow on the season at the Lobo Skiing Awards Banquet, held at the Hotel Albuquerque.

Taking home MVP honors on the women's side were a pair of NCAA champions in Emilie Cedervärn for women's Nordic and Mateja Robnik for women's Alpine. Cedervärn, who set a school record with five wins in a season, and four in a row, won the NCAA title in the 15K Classical. Robnik earned her third and fourth All-America honors, and won the NCAA title in the Giant Slalom.

Robnik's MVP Award is her third straight in women's Alpine, making her only the second Lobo skier in the last 25 years to earn three straight MVP awards, behind Malin Hemmingsson, who won four from 2007-10.

On the men's side, Juho Pekka Penttinen was the men's Alpine MVP. Penttinen, a senior, qualified for his first NCAA championships this past season. Mats Resaland was the Nordic MVP on the men's side. He picked up his first career victory, winning his final home race, the 10K freestyle at the Jade Enterprises/UNM Invitational. Resaland is the fifth three-time winner of the men's Nordic MVP Award, and the first since Martin Kaas 2009-11.

Christian Otto, who was injured and missed last season, returned as a graduate student and qualified for his fourth NCAA championships, finishing in the top 15 in both races. He was honored with the 2015 Senior Award.

Other award winners were Mark Miller, who won the Ben Abruzzo Scholarship Award, and Sydney Staples, who won the Pat Abruzzo Acholarship Award.

Four Straight Wins and Cedervärn

Emilie Cedervärn last year did something no Lobo skier had ever done before, and that was sweep the freestyle and classical races in a non-home meet. She finished off the feat on Thursday, February 25 at the Seawolf Invitational in Alaska. Three days later she repeated the feat at the RMISA/NCAA West Region Championships.

The four straight wins is the first time in school history a skier has won four consecutive races, and it tied her for first on the single season women's Nordic wins list at UNM with Martina Stursova (2004 and 2005) and Ivana Radlova (1993), who each won four. Her national title gave her a school record five in one season. She is now in second place in career wins at UNM with five, behind Stursova, who has eight. She is now ahead of Kjersti Stenberg (1982-85) and Heidi Sorensen (1983-86) on the women's Nordic career victories list with four.

Head Coach Fredrik Landstedt

Head Coach Fredrik Landstedt, himself a former Lobo Nordic skier, is entering his eighth season as the head coach of the Lobo ski team and his 20th season overall as he served as a student assistant coach and assistant coach before becoming the second head coach in program history the summer of 2007. With Landstedt at the helm of the program, the Lobos have finished fourth, third, third, seventh, eighth, sixth, third and fifth at NCAA Championships.

During his tenure at UNM (assistant coach from 1990-91; 98-2007 and head coach from 2007-present) he has coached 45 Nordic Lobos to 72 All-American awards and four individual event Nordic team national championships, and one individual Nordic national champion. Since taking over as the head coach, Landstedt has fostered 35 Alpine All-America performers and four individual event Alpine team national championships. He has mentored three Nordic individual national champions in Kristina Strandberg (2000), Jimmy Vika (2003) and Eva Sever Rus (2014). He has been an integral part of the coaching staff for six Alpine individual national champions in Marte Dolva (2002), Jennifer Delich (2004), Malin Hemmingsson (2007, '09, '10) and Joonas Räsänen (2013).
