NEW MEXICO KICKS OFF 2017 SEASON AT LOBO INVITATIONAL

New Mexico opens its season Saturday, September 2 as it hosts the Lobo Invitational at the UNM North Golf Course.

Essentially a preseason tune up, the Lobos will look to evaluate their depth and talent before beginning their season in earnest at the Notre Dame Invitational on September 29.

Since the first date to evaluate competitions for an at-large bid to the 2016 NCAA Championships is September 98, UNM won't compete all of its top runners this Saturday.

But this weekend's affair is a good test for a number of Lobos as they kick off the season.

For some runners looking to crack UNM's top seven, this race provide an avenue for possibly contending for a larger role.

For others aiming to get back in the competitive swing or making their New Mexico debut, this meet serves as solid early-season challenge.

The No. 4 New Mexico women open their season with three-time cross country All-American **Alice Wright** leading the way, while returners **Natasha Bernal**, **Alex Buck** and **Kendall Kelly** — all of whom scored for the Lobos last fall — can also contribute.

New Mexico also adds **Sophie Eckel**, **Weini Kelati**, **Alondra Negrón Texidor**, **Charlotte Prouse** and **Ednah Kurgat**, who sat out as a transfer last fall.

That group, which runs exceptionally deep, has the pedigree to continue the Lobos' streak of seven-straight top-10 finishes at the NCAA Championships. It's the longest-active streak of top-10 finishes in the nation.

On the men's side, the New Mexico brings track standout **Josh Kerr**, plus **Jacob Simonsen**, **Alexander Palm**, **Jared Garcia**, **Taylor Potter** and **Tyler Valdez**.

Newcomers **Ian Crowe-Wright**, **Jonny Glen**, **Iolo Hughes** and **Michael Wilson** can also add to the Lobos as they look to make the NCAA Championships for the first time since 2014.

The Lobos will be joined by New Mexico State, UTEP, Fresno State, UNLV and New Mexico Highlands at the Lobo Invitational, with both the men and women competing in a combined race at 9:50 a.m.

THE TOP-TEN STREAK

Although the New Mexico women's cross country team won the NCAA title in 2015, the Lobos aren't a one-hit wonder.

During head coach Joe Franklin's tenure in Albuquerque, the UNM women have qualified to nine straight NCAA Championships. But since 2010, the Lobos have placed top-10 at every NCAA, too.

UNM's streak of top-10 finishes at the NCAA Championships is the longest active streak and is tied for the seventh-longest in NCAA history.

POLL POSITION

New Mexico women's cross country checked in at No. 4 in the preseason National Coaches Poll, the U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCCA) announced Tuesday, August 29.

The Lobos, who have placed top-10 at the NCAA Championships each of the last seven years for the nation's longest active streak, logged their third straight top-five ranking in the USTFCCCA preseason poll.

Additionally, the UNM women have been ranked or receiving votes in the preseason poll for nine straight years, and have been ranked for 40 consecutive polls overall.

Colorado claimed the top spot in the preseason poll, with eight first-place votes and 335 points overall. 2016 NCAA team champion Oregon is ranked second with two first-place votes and 331 points, just ahead of No. 3 Michigan's haul of two first-place votes and 330 points.

The Lobos received 323 points, while Stanford rounded out the top five with 313 points.

New Mexico and Colorado are the only teams

Additionally, the women were ranked second in the women's USTFCCCA Mountain Region's preseason rankings that were released Monday.

PUTTING NINE STRAIGHT NCAA QUALIFICATIONS IN PERSPECTIVE

The Lobo women have qualified to nine straight NCAA Championships, dating back to 2008. It's one of six active streaks in the NCAA that has reached at least eight years.

UNM's run is also one of just 22 streaks in Division I history to reach at least eight years, and ranks as the sixth longest current streak in Division I history.

LOBO WOMEN PICKED AS MW PRESEASON FAVORITES, MEN 4TH

New Mexico women's cross country was selected as the favorite to win the 2016 Mountain West women's cross country title, as voted by the league's coaches in the women's preseason coaches' poll.

The Lobo men were tied for fourth place in the men's poll, which the MW released in conjunction with the women's poll on Thursday.

It's the seventh straight year that the Lobo women were picked as the preseason favorite, mirroring the team's seven-straight top-10 finishes at the NCAA Championships.

The New Mexico women, who debuted at No. 4 in Tuesday's preseason USTFCCCA National Coaches' Poll, have also won nine straight MW cross country titles, while the men have won six of the last eight men's championships.

The New Mexico women captured the top spot in the preseason poll by earning 100 points and 10 of the 11 first-place votes. The women return All-American Alice Wright and key pieces in Natasha Bernal, Alex Buck and Kendall Kelly while adding a number of talented newcomers.

The Boise State women scored the other first-place vote and 89 total points to place second, while Air Force registered 81 total points to place third. Colorado State (71 points), Utah State (61), Nevada (56), Wyoming (53), San José State (33), Fresno State (25), San Diego State (20) and UNLV (16) claimed fourth place through 11th, respectively.

In the men's poll, the Lobos tallied 28 points to tie Utah State for fourth place. The men bring back Jacob Simonsen, Alexander Palm, Jared

Garcia and Josh Kerr, and add a number of new runners into the mix.

Colorado State earned the top spot in the poll with five first-place votes and 46 points, with Boise State in a close second place in the poll with the other three first-place votes and 45 points. Air Force was tabbed third with 36 points.

Wyoming (20 points), San José State (12) and Fresno State (9) rounded out the eight-team poll, placing sixth-to-eighth, respectively.

NINE STRAIGHT

When the New Mexico women's cross country team won the 2016 Mountain West Cross Country Championships in Kuna, Idaho, on October 28, 2016, it was the team's ninth straight such title.

That victory broke a tie with former MW member BYU for the conference record for most team titles in women's cross country.

It's also the third longest run of consecutive titles in Mountain West history. Out of the 15 sports the league sponsors, the Lobo women's streak of nine straight is virtually unparalleled.

BYU owns the record with 12 straight titles in outdoor track & field (2000-11), while also

sitting with a nine-year streak in indoor track & field (2003-11).

However, the UNM women own the longest streak in any women's sport sponsored by the MW and the longest active streak in any league sport.

The Lobos' run of nine straight is also quite impressive in regards to the entire nation. UNM's streak is the longest active streak in the NCAA, with Alabama State's string of six straight titles in the SWAC closest.

GREAT ON THE GRASS, GREAT IN THE CLASSROOM

New Mexico men's and women's cross country were named Division I All-Academic teams by the U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCCA).

Additionally, a pair of All-American from the women's team, Alice Wright and Calli Thackery, were accorded individual All-Academic honors.

After a strong 2016 cross country season last fall, which culminated in the UNM women's seventh-straight top-10 finish at the NCAA Championships, the Lobos are now being recognized for their work in the classroom.

The first honor, the USTFCCCA All-Academic Team award, recognizes teams that registered a cumulative team GPA of 3.00 or higher during the academic year.

The UNM women, with a team GPA of 3.71, were one of eight Mountain West schools to earn the honor, and were tops in the conference. The women also tied for the eighth-best GPA out of the 242 Division I institutions that were recognized.

The men's team, which combined for a 3.59 GPA, also claimed the highest GPA among the six MW men's teams that were honored. The Lobo men finished with the sixth-best GPA out of the 189 DI teams that were recognized.

Individually, the Lobos also produced strong academic results, as Wright and Thackery, 2016 cross country All-Americans, earned USTFCCCA All-Academic honors for their combined efforts in competition and in the classroom.

The individual award is awarded to student-athletes who posted a cumulative GPA of at least 3.25 on a 4.0 scale and finished in the top 25 finishers (or 10 percent) at regionals or as an All-American at the national meet.
