LOBOS OPEN 2017 SEASON WITH FIVE MATCHES IN ARIZONA

New Mexico beach volleyball opens its 2017 campaign with five matches over three days as the team looks to translate its burgeoning experience and talent into a fast start with the ultimate goal of postseason play.

The Lobos, ranked 18th in the preseason DiG Magazine Poll, take on Benedictine University at Mesa in Mesa, Arizona, on Thursday before heading to Phoenix to play No. 20 Loyola Marymount, No. 11 Grand Canyon, Colorado Mesa and No. 15 TCU.

Three of those teams — LMU, GCU and TCU — are the benchmark and the litmus test for the Lobos as they enter 2017.

If they can pick up some wins against these ranked foes, then Nelson and his squad will have passed the first test of the season.

Those three teams are formidable opponents for New Mexico, with their own experience and talent. Add in a Benedictine team that already played this season and a Colorado Mesa team that's familiar with the Lobos, and this weekend is shaping up to be a solid early-season challenge for the Lobos.

But New Mexico, anchored by seven returning starters and a strong class of newcomers, has the know-how on how to navigate a weekend like this.

For this first weekend, the Lobos will look to their depth, relying on veterans in the top three slots of their projected starting lineup.

In the top spot, the duo of **Cassie House & Ashley Kelsey** will face off against some tremendous opposition, but they've had experience together playing some of the top pairs in the nation, going 11-10 last season.

Devanne Sours & Lise Rugland are slated to compete in the No. 2 spot after compiling a 14-6 record last season, while **Marisa Doran & Eastyn Baletto** move up a notch, competing in the No. 3 position after logging a 23-3 record in the No. 4 slot last season.

Taking on the No. 4 spot is **Julia Warren & Lauren Twitty**, while the No. 5 position will be **Jackie Baro & Carly Beddingfield**.

LOBOS RANKED 18TH IN DiG MAGAZINE PRESEASON POLL

The University of New Mexico beach volleyball team checked in at No. 18 in the nation in the preseason edition of the DiG Magazine Beach Volleyball Poll released Thursday, February 23.

The Lobos, who return seven starters from their team that went 17-9 in 2016, remain in the 20-team DiG poll after finishing 2016 ranked in the same position. New Mexico has been ranked in every DiG poll since the third release of last year, which was published March 29.

USC, winners of the inaugural NCAA Beach Volleyball Championships last May, are the preseason No. 1, followed by No. 2 UCLA, No. 3 Florida State, No. 4 Pepperdine and No. 5 Hawai'i.

The Lobos play 11 matches against teams ranked in the poll, including six top-10 matches.

During its opening weekend, UNM faces No. 11 Grand Canyon, No. 15 TCU and No. 20 LMU.

LOBOS FINISH 2016 WITH STRONG PRESENCE IN POLLS

The New Mexico beach volleyball team finished its second season with a strong presence in the national polls, ranking 18th in the season-ending DiG Magazine Poll and receiving votes in the final AVCA Collegiate Beach Volleyball poll.

The Lobos, who compiled a 17-9 record on the year, unofficially finished as the 17th-ranked team in the 10-team AVCA ranking released Tuesday, May 10, and closed their second season as the youngest program ranked in the DiG Magazine poll released Thursday, May 5.

Overall, New Mexico received votes in the AVCA poll in all but three releases since the start of the regular season, rising to an unofficial high of 13th twice (March 28 and April 11).

The Lobos also maintained a steady presence in the DiG Magazine poll, first being ranked on March 29 and climbing to a program-best No. 12 on April 12.

During the 2016 season, UNM played USC, Florida State, No. 6 Arizona and No. 10 LSU and had matches against six other teams — No. 11 Grand Canyon, No. 14 Tulane, No. 16 California, No. 20 South Carolina, (RV) TCU and (RV) Washington — that were either ranked or receiving votes in the DiG Magazine poll.

BEACH VOLLEYBALL POSTS PROGRAM-BEST GPA IN FALL 2016

After posting a tremendous campaign in the sand last spring, the University of New Mexico beach volleyball team posted a stellar semester in the classroom last fall.

The Lobos recorded a team GPA of 3.64 for the Fall 2016 semester, the highest in the five-semester history of the program. It's fourth semester that the team registered a mark of at least 3.4.

The beach team combined with the rest of the women's sports at UNM for a 3.55 GPA. It's the 13th-straight semester of at least a 3.4 by the combined women's teams, as well.

SCOUTING BENEDICTINE

Benedictine University at Mesa — commonly called BenU at Mesa to distinguish it from Benedictine University in Chicago and Benedictine College in Kansas — is in its first year of competition of beach volleyball.

In fact, the volleyball program at Benedictine is in just its second season of both indoor and beach competition, but that hasn't stopped the Redhawks and coach Sonia Jones from experiencing success.

Indoors, the Redhawks racked up 20 wins in 2016, advancing to the California Pacific Conference championship game in just their second season. A number of those indoor players will transition to the sand for BenU at Mesa, including the Redhawks top pairing of

Hannah Marang and Jade De La Rosa. 19 players listed on BenU at Mesa's roster play both indoors and beach.

Unlike most teams, which open their seasons this week, the Redhawks have already played six matches, compiling a 1-4-1 record. BenU at Mesa's lone victory came against Pierce College, while it fell to a handful of other SoCal community colleges.

SCOUTING LOYOLA MARYMOUNT

Loyola Marymount enters its sixth season of competition with a youthful roster, fielding no seniors, one graduate transfer and three juniors. The rest of the Lions' 17-player roster is underclassmen, which makes 2017 a bit of a rebuilding year for second-year head coach John Mayer.

But LMU does return All-WCC Freshman Team members Kekai Whitford and Sascha Dominique (who went 4-4 together in 2016) and Sarah Sponcil, who was an All-American and went 26-7 during her freshman beach season in 2015.

The Lions also bring back Lindsay Carr & Veronica Nederend (5-15 in 2016) and Kristen Castellanos & Sara Kovac (7-9). However, LMU will have to replace their top duo from 2016, Avery Bush & Rachele Suaava, which went 10-8 overall.

LMU finished 2016 at 6-17, but reached the semifinals of the inaugural WCC Championships and ended the year ranked in the Top-20 of the DiG Magazine poll.

SCOUTING GRAND CANYON

Under second-year head coach Kristen Rohr, No. 12/11 Grand Canyon faces a challenge in 2017. Although the Lopes have a veteran roster -- five seniors and three juniors -- they will have to find a new No. 1 pair after the graduation of All-Americans Mackenzie Phelps and Shannon Dugan.

GCU does return Rebecca Conrad, Kelli Iverson, Jordyn Sanchez, and Molly Turner, who was recently named to the A1 USA Beach Volleyball National Team, from its 2016 squad that finished 18-8 and No. 11 in the DiG Magazine Poll.

The Lope also add in AVCA All-American Honorable Mention Jessica Stansfield and their indoor volleyball standout, Leigh Stonerook. Additionally, GCU brings in a handful of beach transfers, including Maggie DeMore from Arizona, Tyanna Roy from San Jose State and Tjasa Kotnik from Eckerd College.

New Mexico and Grand Canyon have faced off four times in program history (tied for the most of any UNM opponent), with GCU winning every matchup. This will be the third straight year the Lobos have played at GCU.

SCOUTING COLORADO MESA

Entering Year Two in the sand, Colorado Mesa, a Division II school from Grand Junction, Colorado, looks to build on its inaugural season after finishing with a 1-12 record. The Mavericks only win was in an exhibition vs. New Mexico State in Albuquerque.

However, head coach David Skaff and his squad enters 2017 with depth and some experience, returning 11 players and adding six freshmen.

Like Grand Canyon, the Lobos have some history with the Mavericks, defeating CMU three times in 2015. Every match was a sweep in favor of UNM.

SCOUTING TCU

TCU, like New Mexico, posted a tremendous 2016 season after starting their programs in 2015. The Horned Frogs posted an 18-7 record in 2016, picking up wins against the Lobos and then-No. 10 LSU in Baton Rouge.

Now under the guide of first-year head coach Hector Gutierrez, the Horned Frogs have considerable depth and experience, returning nine of their 11 top players from 2016. Although half of its No. 1 duo has graduated, TCU brings back Sarita Mikals (15-6 playing 1's in 2016), Jaelyn Greene & Jillian Bergeson (19-5 playing 3's) and Molly Scheel & Ariah Palter (13-1 playing 5's).

It's a loaded team that finished 2016 winning 11 of its final 14 matches, including a 3-2 win in Fort Worth over the Lobos.

New Mexico and TCU have faced off twice in program history, with the Lobos sweeping the first match on the team's first ever day of action.

A PRIMER ON BEACH VOLLEYBALL

Beach volleyball and court volleyball share many of the same basic rules. Each side gets three hits, there's rally scoring, and a team earns a points when the ball hits the ground or goes out of bounds. But there are some key difference between the two sports:

- Beach volleyball is a partner sport played during the spring. Court volleyball is a six-player sport played during the fall.
- Beach volleyball plays the best of three sets, with the first two sets played to 21 points, and a tiebreaker set played to 15 points, if necessary. A set must be won by at least two points.
- Open-handed tipping is prohibited in beach volleyball and the block touch counts as one of three permitted contacts.
- Coaches may only speak or give any kind of input to their players during timeouts or between sets.
- Beach volleyball players switch sides of the court every seven points during a 21-point set and every five points during a 15-point

set.

- Beach volleyball is usually contested in dual matches, where the winning team is the school that wins three of five individual matches versus its opponent. Similar in format to tennis, each of those individual matches consist of a doubles — a pair of teammates ranked by ability — that are matched against their corresponding doubles from the opposing team.

BEACH VOLLEYBALL ENTERS 2ND SEASON AS 90TH NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP

Before the 2016 season, the NCAA approved beach volleyball as the 90th NCAA Championship at the 2015 NCAA Convention, which allowed the sport to advance from the emerging sports for women list to a full-fledged NCAA championship.

The NCAA Beach Volleyball Committee also determined the sport will be officially referred to as "beach volleyball". When the sport was placed on the list of emerging sports for women in 2009, it was called sand volleyball. But because the sport is known as beach volleyball at all other levels of play throughout the world, the committee made its decision to refer to the sport as beach volleyball.

The second-annual NCAA Beach Volleyball Championships will take place May 5-7, 20167 at the Gulf Shores Public Beach in Gulf Shore, Alabama. The championship will have an eight-team bracket that will be played in a double-elimination format.

USC won the inaugural NCAA National Championship 3-0 over Florida State.

Beach volleyball is the fastest-growing NCAA sport with 53 Division I colleges and universities sponsoring. NCAA rules require 40 sponsoring schools to request an NCAA championship. Data shows that on average, 60 percent of participants at a sponsoring school participate only in beach volleyball instead of playing both beach and indoor volleyball.
