

2017 Season Preview

While it certainly isn't the most ideal thing to have three head coaches in three years, it certainly seems as though The University of New Mexico women's tennis team is showing no signs of slowing down. The signs they are showing? Signs of a ninth NCAA Tournament appearance for starters.

For Stephanie Wooten-Quijada, she might be the third women's tennis coach at UNM in the last three seasons, but that's certainly not a bad thing. Wooten-Quijada is looking for a second straight NCAA Tournament appearance herself after leading the UT-Rio Grande Valley Vaqueros into the NCAAs last year, winning the Western Athletic Conference Tournament. That title marked the first-ever WAC title for UTRGV (formerly Texas-Pan American) in any sport.

Now she will attempt to repeat that feat with the Lobos. "The choice to come to New Mexico was easy when you look at the great facilities and the great tradition that is here," said Wooten-Quijada. "Our goal is always going to be to compete hard on the court, and in the classroom"

Competing for a return to the NCAA Tournament for a second time in three years is a goal that will certainly be helped by perhaps the most veteran squad in the Mountain West. Five seniors dot the roster, and all have killer resumes to their credit. The headliners are three fourth-year seniors in Emily Olivier, Dominique Dulski and Rachana Bhat.

Just that trio has combined for 196 singles wins and 150 doubles victories in their three-plus seasons of playing. Olivier enters her final Spring with a 53-48 overall record in singles and 54-42 in doubles. Last year she excelled at the No. 2 singles flight, going 8-4 in the Spring. Whether she plays up at No. 1, as she did seven times a year ago, or remains at No. 2, her expertise (and her blistering forehand) will be counted on for certain.

Dulski has been a mainstay in the middle of the lineup over her first three seasons, going 11-9 in dual matches last year, coming off a 16-7 sophomore campaign. Dulski has won some major conference matches, including the 2015 Mountain West Tournament, and she earned All-Conference honors a year ago in doubles with Olivier.

Bhat has been solid as a rock in the bottom two flights with a 19-8 record in Flight 5 and a 23-3 record in Flight 6. Overall, Bhat has proven to be at her best in dual play, going an astonishing 42-12 in her first three seasons. Bhat, counting the Fall season, enters the Spring needing 19 more victories to hit 100 in her career, which would make her the just the fourth Lobo in school history. She enters the Spring already ninth on the UNM career wins list.

Two other seniors were transfers from a year ago, and both made themselves right at home. Ludivine Burguire, a VCU transfer, went 21-5 over the season, splitting most of her time between No. 3 and No. 4 singles. Where she has improved already in 2016-17 is in doubles, where her seven doubles wins in the Fall are slightly more than half her overall total for last year. Along with Burguire is Andrea Leblanc, who transferred to UNM from Morehead State. Leblanc led the team with 27 wins a year ago, including 11 in dual play. Leblanc last season spent time at both No. 1 and No. 2 in singles, giving UNM plenty of experience up and down the lineup.

With one spot seemingly open, it will come down to the lone sophomore Ruth Copas, who is already 25-14 in her brief Lobo career, and a pair of freshmen. Cassie Chung went 6-4 in singles and 2-2 in doubles in the Fall and Diana Wong went 4-3 in singles and 2-2 in doubles as well.

What won't be easy is a schedule that will see UNM face several NCAA caliber programs and play just six matches at home. UNM opens up with Georgia and also has power five non-conference foes in Illinois, Colorado, Utah, Wisconsin, Arizona and Texas Tech. Along with regional foes such as Denver, the Lobos will get six straight games at home, including Minnesota, Northern Arizona, New Mexico State and UTEP out of conference and Utah State and Boise State in Mountain West play. The 2017 Mountain West Tournament is April 27-30 at UNIV.

About ITA Kick-Off Weekend

(Courtesy UGA & the ITA) The spring season of collegiate tennis shifts into full gear January 27-29 during the annual ITA Kick-Off Weekend. Sixty men's and sixty women's teams will be competing across the country for the right to qualify for the ITA National Team Indoor Championships to be hosted in February by Virginia on the men's side and Yale on the women's side. The 15 men's and 15 women's universities hosting ITA Kick-Off Weekend events were designated as host sites in order of their year-end 2016 ITA team ranking. Three visiting schools will travel to each host site for a four-team tournament. The host school will meet the No. 4 seed, the No. 2 seed will play the No. 3 seed, and the winners will come back to play for a berth at the ITA National Team Indoor Championships.

The Georgia Regional site matches will be played indoors.

About Georgia

The top seed in the Georgia Regional for this tournament, the Bulldogs are currently ranked No. 6 in the latest Oracle/ITA Rankings. Last season Georgia went 22-5 last season in advancing to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament. Georgia was also nearly unbeatable at home, going 12-1. The Bulldogs feature three ranked singles players in No. 23 Eleni Christofi, No. 25 Kennedy Shaffer and No. 35 Caroline Brinson. Christofi and Shaffer are also ranked No. 26 in doubles.

The Bulldogs finished the fall season a combined 53-28 in singles and 25-8 in doubles, and Christofi is the fifth-highest ranked freshman in the nation. She won the ITA Southeast Regional Championship.

About Illinois

The Fightin' Illini are currently 0-2 on the season, dropping decisions of 6-1 at Alabama and then 5-2 to Washington in a neutral match in Tuscaloosa. Illinois last season went 15-9. Madie Ballion picked up Illinois' only singles wins on the opening weekend, winning against Alabama with a 7-6 (7-4), 6-0 decision and then 3-6, 6-3, 6-4 over Washington, with both matches at No. 4 singles. Illinois did pick up the doubles point against Washington, with Ballion against winning.

About Georgia State

Georgia State is currently 0-2 after dropping two matches on opening weekend, losing to ULM 4-2 and then to No. 15 Auburn 4-0. Georgia State is also 0-1 in the Sun Belt. Against ULM, the only singles victory was registered by freshman Arina Taluyenko 7-5, 6-2. GSU did take the doubles point in that match.

McKinnon Family Stadium, with a Topping of Tennis

Ruth Copas and Rachana Bhat tied for the most Fall wins with seven each, with Bhat going 7-3 and Copas going 7-4. Right behind them was Ludivine Burguiere and Cassie Chung, who went 6-3 and 6-4 respectively. Diana Wong went 4-3.

UNM's veterans of Dominique Dulski and Emily Olivier didn't compete all that much due to injury and/or illness, with Olivier going 1-1 and Dulski 1-2. The only other Lobo was Andrea Leblanc, who went 2-5 while also dealing with an injury.

Up In the Air: Lobo Women's Tennis Edition

The trip to Georgia for this weekend's ITA Kick-Off Weekend encompasses 2,918.6 miles round trip. While the university has acquired several new multi-passenger vehicles for team travel, the women's team won't have to travel on the ground, as UNM will fly out to Athens. UNM's next six road games, if driving on the ground (covering the games of Colorado, Denver, Utah, Wisconsin in Salt Lake City, Arizona and Cincinnati in Tucson) would cover 3,045 miles round trip.

The Comeuppance of UNM's Schedule

The New Mexico women's tennis team has an overall program record of 491-360, meaning that sometime this season, UNM should get win No. 500. Of those 491 wins, most were earned over 24 seasons by Kathy Kolankeiwicz, who went 354-212. Of UNM's five head coaches (not counting first year coach Stephanie Wooten-Quijada), four have had winning overall records, including the last two, Erica Perkins Jasper (40-33) and Kelcy McKenna (15-7).

Burguiere Confronts Transparency (in Doubles Play)

Ludivine Burguiere (or Ludi as her friends call her) was UNM's top doubles winning in the Fall, going 7-2. What makes that record so interesting is that she did it with four other partners. That's a lot when there are only eight players on the squad. Ludi went 3-1 with Ruth Copas, 2-1 with Dominique Dulski, 1-0 with Emily Olivier and 1-0 with Rachana Bhat.

Did UNM Ever Really Believe in the Estes Tennis Center?

The Linda Estes Tennis Center served as a wonderful home for UNM Tennis, and even though UNM doesn't play outdoor matches there, UNM's tennis offices, locker room and the Randy Briggs Indoor Tennis Dome are all still located there. The Briggs Indoor Dome covers three courts. It is 40 feet tall, 196 feet long and 128 feet wide, and was at one time the widest indoor tennis bubble in the world. There is a lobby area and the bleachers that seat close to 1,000 fans.

Now, UNM calls the McKinnon Family Tennis Stadium home for it's outdoor matches. The McKinnon Family Tennis Stadium is located directly across the street from Linda Estes, behind The Pit basketball arena and next to the Lobo baseball field. The stadium features stadium lights, electronic scoreboards and six sunken outdoor courts that include stadium seating for approximately 1,000 fans. Fans can keep up with all the action via a large electronic scoreboard located between the two central courts as well as smaller boards at each individual court.

The McKinnon Family Tennis Stadium comes courtesy of a \$1.2 million donation that was part of a \$7.5 million gift to UNM that Ian and

Sonnet McKinnon made in 2011. Another \$500,000 was raised privately for the project and the stadium lights were donated by the City of Albuquerque. The McKinnon family also contributed \$300,000 to an endowed scholarship in the name of Loren Dils, a former director of the Lobo Tennis Club and an ex-UNM assistant tennis coach, who has been diagnosed with ALS. Ed and Shirley Corley donated the scoreboards.

The McKinnon Family Tennis Stadium has also served as the host site of numerous events including the 2014 USTA/ITA Regional Championships and 2015 Mountain West Conference Championships.

In summer 2015, the McKinnon Family Tennis Stadium was recognized as one of 13 winners in its 34th annual USTA Facility Awards Program, which recognizes excellence in the construction and/or renovation of tennis facilities throughout the country.
