USU VOLLEYBALL TO OPEN MOUNTAIN WEST PLAY THIS WEEK

Utah State opens its 2018 Mountain West slate this week in a road opener at New Mexico (6-6) on Wednesday, Sept. 19, at 7 p.m., followed by its MW home opener on Saturday, Sept. 22, against UNLV (9-3) at 1 p.m. New Mexico leads the all-time series against USU, 18-12, and UNLV also leads the all-time series against the Aggies, 8-4.

SCOUTING THE LOBOS

New Mexico, picked fifth in the preseason coaches' poll, enters the match on Wednesday with an overall mark of 6-6 and having lost two of its last three matches.

The UNM attack is hitting .183 (578-275-1,659) on the year and led individually by junior outside Lauren Twitty with 160 kills, averaging 3.33 per set. Senior middle Mariessa Carrasco is the most efficient hitter for the Lobos, hitting .272 (65-25-147). New Mexico runs a 6-2 system with freshman Sabrina Bianco and redshirt freshman Jaclyn Inclan sharing the setting duties, totaling 274 and 183 assists and averaging 5.59 and 3.98 per set, respectively.

Senior Mercedes Pacheco paces the UNM back row with 82 digs, averaging 3.28 per set, but she has not appeared in a match since Sept. 7. In her absence, Twitty leads the Lobos in digs, totaling 120 on the year and averaging 2.50 per set. Senior middle Victoria Spragg leads the New Mexico block with 50 during the season, averaging 1.02 per set. Opposing teams are hitting .209 (597-261-1,606) against the Lobos this season.

SCOUTING THE REBELS

UNLV, picked last in the preseason coaches' poll, has exceeded expectations, leading the Mountain West with a 9-3 overall record. The Rebels will host Boise State on Thursday, Sept. 20, before making the trip to Logan on Saturday. UNLV is currently riding a six-match winning streak.

UNLV is hitting .268 (598-193-1,511) this season and paced individually by sophomore outside Mariena Hayden with 205 kills, averaging 4.56 per set. Junior setter Antonette Rolda directs the attack, totaling a team-best 302 assists and averaging 6.71 per set.

Defensively, Hayden also leads the UNLV back row with 160 digs, averaging 3.56 per set. Senior middle Elsa Descamps leads the Rebel block with 48 on the year, averaging 1.07 per set. Opposing teams are hitting .154 (455-230-1,463) against the Rebels this season.

AGGIES IN CONFERENCE ROAD OPENERS UNDER DUBOSE

Utah State is 6-6 all-time in conference road openers under head coach **Grayson DuBose**, but have won five of its last seven conference openers away from Logan.

AGGIES IN CONFERENCE HOME OPENERS UNDER DUBOSE

Utah State is 8-4 all-time in conference home openers under head coach **Grayson DuBose**, including a victory over San Diego State in its 2017 MW home opener.

QUICK STARTS LEAD TO WINS

Utah State has had the most success this season when winning the first set, with both of the Aggies victories coming when USU grabs an early lead.

HORNET INVITATIONAL ALL-TOURNAMENT

Senior middle **Lauren O'Brien** was named to the Hornet Invitational all-tournament team after proving to be the Aggies' most efficient hitter over the course of three matches. O'Brien hit over .400 in all three matches, averaging .453 (30-6-53), and finished second on the team with 14.0 blocks, averaging 1.08 per set.

USU INVITATIONAL ALL-TOURNAMENT

Senior setter **Kassidy Johnson** was named to the USU Invitational all-tournament team after totaling 93 assists and averaging 10.33 per set. Johnson logged a career-high seven blocks against Loyola Marymount en route to eight total blocks during the week. Johnson also recorded 18 digs, averaging 2.00 per set, and four kills during the week.

KALAMAZOO CONFERENCE CENTER ALL-TOURNAMENT

Senior libero **Tasia Taylor** was named to the Kalamazoo Conference Center all-tournament team after logging several career highs in matches against Loyola, Milwaukee and Western Michigan. Taylor finished the weekend with 67 digs, averaging 4.47 per set, including a career-high 26 against Milwaukee. Taylor also added 17 assists and eight service aces, including a career-high five aces against Loyola.

MOUNTAIN WEST LEADERS

Utah State is ranked fourth in the league in blocks per set, averaging 2.57 per frame.

Individually, senior middle **Lauren O'Brien** is eighth in the league in hitting percentage (.349) and sixth in blocks per set (1.24). Fellow middle **Corinne Larsen** is third in the MW in blocks per set, averaging 1.35 per set. Senior setter **Kassidy Johnson** ranks fourth in the MW in assists per set, averaging 8.91 per set. Senior libero **Tasia Taylor** is second in the MW in digs per set, averaging 4.48 per set, and ninth in aces per set, averaging 0.34 per set.

TOP BLOCKERS

Utah State is the only team in the Mountain West with two players ranked among the top six in the league in blocks per set, in freshman middle **Corinne Larsen** (third, 1.35 bps) and senior middle **Lauren O'Brien** (sixth, 1.24 bps).

DOUBLE DOUBLE-DOUBLE

Utah State had two players log double-doubles in the season opener against Sacramento State. Sophomore outside **Gabbi Shumway** recorded 12 kills and 13 digs, while senior setter **Kassidy Johnson** tallied 33 assists and 15 digs.

DOUBLE-DOUBLE LEADER

Johnson leads the Aggies this season with five double-doubles. Johnson leads every current USU player on the roster with 14 career double-doubles and ranks No. 7 among active players in the MW.

DOUBLE-DOUBLE STREAK

Johnson has recorded a double-double in three of the last four matches, logging double digits in assists and digs in each contest.

BLOCKING DOUBLE-DOUBLE

Freshman middle **Corinne Larsen** recorded her first career double-double against Milwaukee on Sept. 8, with 15 kills and 10 blocks, marking the first double-double by a Utah State middle since the 2014 season.

MARATHON AGGIES

Utah State has played five five-set matches this season, including three straight during the Kalamazoo Conference Center Tournament. The stretch marked the first back-to-back-to-back five-set matches for the Aggies since the 2014 season.

HIGH FIVE

Utah State had five players record double-digit kills in its victory over CSUN on Aug. 25, marking the first time that five Aggies have had double-digit kills in the same match since Nov. 11, 2006, against Nevada.

KILL STREAK

Sophomore outside **Bailey Downing** has recorded double-digit kills in each of the last four matches. Downing has been the leader in kills for the Aggies in three of the last four matches.

KILL LEADER

Downing's streak includes a 16-kill performance against Loyola, which is tied for the most in a single match this season by an Aggie.

SPEAKING OF LEADING THE ATTACK

Downing recorded 57 attempts against Loyola, marking the most attempts by an Aggie in a single match this season. The match also featured a season-high 183 attempts from the team.

SPEAKING OF LEADING THE ATTACK - PART II

Downing has recorded the most attempts by an Aggie attacker in three of the last four matches.

RISING IN THE RECORD BOOK

Senior libero **Tasia Taylor** entered the year ranked No. 9 in digs in Utah State history with 930 over the course of her career and could finish as high as fourth on the all-time record books.

DIG STREAK

Taylor has recorded double-digit digs in each of the last five matches.

GOING THE DISTANCE

Taylor has appeared in every match and every set for the Aggies over the course of her four-year career at Utah State.

AGGIE BLOCK PARTY

Utah State has totaled more blocks than its opponents to this point in the season, collecting 113.0 to the opposition's 89.5. The Aggies have recorded more blocks than their opponents in seven of the 11 matches this season.

CURRENT BLOCKING LEADER

Freshman middle **Corinne Larsen** leads the USU block with 58 on the year, averaging 1.35 per set.

PACING THE BLOCK

Larsen has led the Aggies in blocks in each of the last three matches.

BLOCKING LIKE IT'S 2015

Senior setter **Kassidy Johnson** recorded a career-high seven blocks in Utah State's match against Loyola Marymount (8/31), marking the most blocks in a match since her freshman year in 2015.

WHAT THE AGGIES BRING BACK

Utah State saw most of its attack depart through graduation last season, but returns its leader in digs in **Tasia Taylor**, blocks in **Lauren O'Brien** and assists in **Kassidy Johnson**. Also notable, Taylor finished second on the team in 2017 with 25 service aces. Below is the percentage that the Aggies return in 2018.

TENURED HELMSMAN

Head coach **Grayson DuBose** is the longest-tenured head coach in USU volleyball history, beginning his 13th year in 2018. Furthermore, DuBose is the second-longest tenured head coach in the Mountain West, second only to Tom Hilbert at Colorado State.

AGGIE ROAD TRIP

DuBose's tenure has included opponents from 34 of 50 states, including first-time opponents from Michigan and Wisconsin earlier this year.

FATHER/DAUGHTER

DuBose will have a unique opportunity this season as his daughter **Cassandra DuBose** is a freshman defensive specialist for the Aggies.

WEDDING BELLS ARE RINGING

Utah State had two players on its roster tie the knot during the offseason as **Madi Olson-Shepherd** was married in March, while **Izzie Hinton-Belnap** was married in May.

SUMMER IN EUROPE

Utah State had two players that traveled with the Mountain West All-Stars during the summer of 2018 to the World Volleyball Challenge in Pula, Croatia. Senior libero **Tasia Taylor** and sophomore middle/outside **Bailey Downing** helped the team to a second-place finish at the event.

FROM CAREER HIGHS TO CAREER AGGIE

USU junior transfer **Izzie Hinton-Belnap** was a two-year starter at Utah Valley the past two seasons on the right side and logged a pair of career highs against the Aggies during her time as a Wolverine. Hinton-Belnap hit a career-high .556 (10-0-18) in a match against the Aggies as a freshman in 2016 and then tallied nine digs against Utah State during her sophomore year in 2017.

HOMEGROWN AGGIES

Six members of the Utah State roster are from the state of Utah, including senior **Tasia Taylor** (Taylorsville), redshirt junior **Ally Packard** (Bountiful), sophomores **Madi Olson-Shepherd** (Cedar Hills) and **Gabbi Shumway** (South Jordan), and freshmen **Cassandra DuBose** (Smithfield) and **Corinne Larsen** (Sandy).

STRONG AGGIE TIES AMONG COACHES

Both assistant coaches (**Taubi Palmer** and **Sammi Stuart**) are Utah State alums and played on the volleyball (2002-03) and women's basketball teams (2003-05), respectively. Stuart's mother, Cindy, was the women's basketball head coach at USU from 1978-1982.

STRONG AGGIE TIES AMONG PLAYERS

Freshman outside **Whitney Solosabal's** parents both graduated from Utah State and have ties to Aggie athletics. Whitney's father, Joe, played football at Utah State from (1997-2002), while her mother, Joni, was the manager for the softball team.

HOME SWEET HOME

Utah State has had a winning season at home in 11 of the 12 years under head coach **Grayson DuBose**.

DEPARTED SENIOR CLASS

Utah State's 2017 senior class of Lauren Anderson, Rachel Gale-Hammond, Kayla DeCoursey and Carly Lenzen combined to play in more than 1,100 sets and totaled more than 1,700 kills, 1,100 digs, 650 blocks and close to 150 service aces over the course of their careers.

HEAD COACH GRAYSON DUBOSE

Brigham Young, 1993 13th Season at Utah State Overall Record 184-190 (.492)

2007 & 2012 WAC Coach of the Year

Grayson DuBose is entering his 13th season as Utah State's head volleyball coach after being hired on

March 27, 2006.

In his 12 years at USU, DuBose (pronounced Do-Boze) has brought stability to one of the top programs in the region as he has coached two All-Americans and 24 all-conference selections. Off the court, 38 of his student-athletes have earned academic all-conference honors a total of 90 times, as well as six academic all-district recipients. He enters the 2018 season as the longest tenured coach in USU volleyball history and is second on the all-time wins list.

"I consider it a distinguished honor to be the head coach of the Utah State University volleyball program. My family and I love Logan and the University, and we're proud to call this place home," DuBose said. "During my time here, I have deeply enjoyed sharing the passion for the sport of volleyball with not just our student-athletes, but our staff, administration and community."

In 2017, DuBose mentored Lauren Anderson to her second consecutive all-Mountain West recognition as the senior outside hitter finished second in the league in both kills per set (4.13) and points per set (4.68). The Aggies opened the year with their best start since 2010, going 11-4 over the first 15 matches, including a perfect 3-0 mark in league play. Utah State was also strong academically, as 11 student-athletes earned academic all-MW honors, while seven earned MW Scholar-Athlete accolades.

In 2016, DuBose led the Aggies to eight more victories than the previous season. The USU offense was especially sound as the team recorded a school-record .238 hitting percentage (1,465-562-3,797). Additionally, Utah State finished among the top four of the Mountain West in kills, assists and digs. Anderson went on to earn all-Mountain West honors at the end of the season, leading the team with 377 kills and finishing among the top 10 in the MW with 3.52 kills per set. Off the court, USU student-athletes also found success as 10 Aggies were named academic all-conference. Additionally, five more were named Mountain West Scholar Athletes.

In 2015, DuBose captured his 150th victory as head coach of the Aggies in a 3-1 win over Eastern Kentucky on Sept. 19. Additionally, five student-athletes earned Mountain West Scholar-Athlete honors, as well as nine being named academic all-Mountain West.

In 2014, DuBose led the Aggie volleyball program into new territory,

as USU opened up a new volleyball competition facility, Kirby Court at the Wayne Estes Center. DuBose had an integral voice in the design and layout of the new facility, which includes space for a competition court, two practice courts, team film room, team lounge, team locker room, strength and conditioning center, meeting rooms, coaches offices and an athletic training room. The new facility saw the Aggies go 7-6 at home, marking the ninth consecutive year that USU has had a winning record at home under DuBose. Individually, DuBose mentored senior Kaitlyn VanHoff to all-Mountain West honors, in addition to his charges earning nine academic all-Mountain West citations and six Mountain West Scholar-Athlete accolades.

DuBose led Utah State into the Mountain West in 2013, where the Aggies posted a 20-11 overall and 13-7 MW record. The 20-win season was the second in a row and third in the last four years, all under DuBose, and also marked the first time that USU had posted back-to-back 20-win seasons since 2000 and 2001. Overall, it was the Aggies' 12th 20-win season in 38 seasons of USU volleyball. USU also had success in the classroom in 2013, earning seven academic all-Mountain West honors and five Mountain West Scholar-Athlete accolades.

Under DuBose's leadership, USU notched the 600th all-time win in program history with its first victory of the 2013 season. The Aggies are believed to be the 102nd program in NCAA history to reach the 600-win plateau, according to available records. Sophomore opposite side hitter Elle Brainard capped the season by becoming the first Aggie volleyball player to earn all-Mountain West honors.

In 2012, DuBose led USU to the regular-season Western Athletic Conference title, as the Aggies collected nine conference postseason awards, including DuBose being named WAC Coach of the Year, while redshirt-freshman Brainard was tabbed WAC Freshman of the Year. The Coach of the Year award was DuBose's second as head coach of the Aggies and the first time in school history that a USU volleyball coach had earned multiple Coach of the Year honors. Paige Neves, Rachel Orr, Shay Sorensen and Josselyn White all earned first-team all-WAC honors, while Brainard and VanHoff were tabbed to the second team. Brainard was also named to the all-freshmen team.

USU's three first-team honorees in 2012 were the most in its eight years in the WAC and only the second time in school history to earn three first-team all-conference honors, joining 2000, when three Aggies collected first-team all-Big West Conference honors in Amy Crosbie, Denae Mohlman and Melissa Schoepf.

Utah State's five all-conference selections in 2012 were also the most during its time in the WAC, as well as the most since having five Big West honorees in 2001, including Neves' older sister, Chelsi, who was a first-team selection with Michelle Matheson. Three other Aggies also earned honorable mention all-Big West honors.

Utah State's block was especially strong in 2012 as the team finished ninth in the nation with 3.00 blocks per set, continuing a tradition of being among the national leaders. The trend followed the 2011 team that ranked 10th with 2.79 blocks per set and the 2010 team that ranked ninth with 2.89 blocks per set. The 2012 season was also another well-decorated one off the court, as eight Aggie players earned academic all-WAC accolades.

Under DuBose's leadership in 2011, Liz McArthur and Sorensen earned all-WAC honors, while Paige Neves was named to the all-freshman team. Off the court, the Aggies also had noteworthy success with eight players earning academic all-WAC honors, including McArthur earning first-team CoSIDA Academic All-District VIII honors for the second-straight year.

Utah State had one of its best seasons in school history in 2010, winning its first-ever WAC Tournament Championship and advancing to its fourth NCAA Tournament in school history. Overall, Utah State became just the third team in the history of the WAC to win its tournament championship as it was the first school in 11 years to defeat perennial power Hawai'i in the championship match. USU finished the year with a 24-9 record, including a third-place conference finish with a 9-7 league mark. Those 24 wins in 2010 were not only the seventh-most in school history, but the most

since 1982. Utah State also had four players earn all-WAC honors during the season, including McArthur, who was named to the first team. McArthur was also named the Most Valuable Player of the 2010 WAC Tournament and went on to earn American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) honorable mention All-American honors. USU also had seven players earn academic all-WAC honors in 2010, while senior middle blocker Katie Astle joined McArthur on the academic all-district team. DuBose also received national attention in 2010 as he was named one of five finalists for the Collegiate Volleyball Update National Coach of the Year award.

The 2008 and 2009 squads combined for 26 victories over the two years as four Aggies earned all-conference accolades in 2008 with eight more earning academic all-WAC honors. In 2009, McArthur was awarded the first of three all-WAC citations in her career and was one of nine Aggies recognized with academic all-WAC honors.

DuBose also had plenty of success during the 2007 season as he led Utah State to a 17-13 record and a third-place conference finish with an 11-5 mark. Among those 11 league victories was one of the biggest wins in school history as USU posted a three-set sweep at No. 10 Hawai'i, snapping a 108-match home conference winning streak for the Rainbow Wahine.

Following the 2007 season, DuBose had four players recognized by the WAC as senior Amanda Nielson was named first-team all-conference and an AVCA honorable mention All-American, while setter Chelsea Fowles was named the Freshman of the Year in the WAC. DuBose was also honored in 2007 as he became the first volleyball coach in school history to garner conference Coach of the Year honors.

In his 12 complete seasons at the helm of the Aggie program, DuBose has a 182-181 (.501) record, coaching his 300th career match as head coach vs. San Diego State on Nov. 14, 2015. DuBose earned his 100th career win with the Aggies' victory against Seattle on Sept. 20, 2012. DuBose became just the second coaching position to reach 100 wins as Marilyn McReavy and Mary Jo Peppler hold the school record with 209 wins as they were co-head coaches from 1976-81. USU has won 20 matches a total of 12 times in school history, including three under DuBose in the 2010, 2012 and 2013 seasons.

Prior to accepting the head coaching position at Utah State, DuBose spent four seasons (2003-06) as an assistant on Brigham Young University's men's volleyball team, helping the Cougars win the national title in 2004.

In his four seasons at Brigham Young, DuBose helped lead the Cougars' men's program to a 90-30 (.750) record, including a National Championship in 2004 and a second-place finish at the 2003 NCAA Tournament. During his time at BYU, he coached nine All-Americans, including the 2004 NCAA Player of the Year.

DuBose began his collegiate coaching career at Utah State from 1999-2000 as an assistant to Tom Peterson. During that time, the Aggies won the Eastern Division of the Big West Conference in 1999 and advanced to the school's first-ever NCAA Tournament in 2000, defeating Missouri in the first round. USU finished the 2000 season ranked 22nd in the country, the program's first-ever top 25 ranking.

DuBose began his coaching career as an assistant at Brighton High School in Sandy, Utah, from 1997-98 and also assisted with the Cache Valley Juniors and the Mountain West Volleyball Club during that time period. Following his two-year stint at Utah State, DuBose spent one year as an assistant to Peterson at the University of New Mexico, working with the women's program, before following Peterson to Brigham Young.

DuBose played two years of collegiate volleyball at Golden West Community College in Huntington Beach, Calif., after graduating from Edison High School in Huntington Beach, where he earned all-county honors his senior season.

DuBose graduated from Brigham Young University with a degree in history in 1993 and then received his teaching certificate from Utah State in 1995. He and his wife, Lenonnie, have three children, Kline, Cassandra and Jackson.
