LEADING OFF

- The week is finally here for Hillenbrand Memorial Stadium, which will re-open following an \$8 Million renovation this offseason. The comprehensive renovations include amenities for fans (shade structure with cooling fans underneath, club level and field level seating, pole-free netting to provide improved sightlines, new entryway/concourse with upgraded ticket office, restrooms, concession areas, A Store and Wall of Fame), players (enlarged home and visiting dugouts with restrooms, improved bullpens and new padding on outfield and infield walls), as well as media (enclosed and climate controlled press box).
- The Wildcats are coming off a 3-2 weekend at the USF Opening Weekend Invitational, including victories over #19 Michigan, USF and Illinois State and losses to fifth-ranked Florida and NC State.
- Arizona hit 11 home runs last weekend in Tampa, including four from Alyssa Palomino-Cardoza. Both Arizona's 11 total homers and Palomino-Cardoza's four lead the Pac-12.
- Palomino-Cardoza is one of four Wildcats to have hit multiple home runs last weekend. Dejah Mulipola is second in the Pac-12 with three homers while Jessie Harper and Malia Martinez had two apiece.
- The Wildcats dropped to No. 9 in the NFCA Top 25 after starting the season ranked No. 7. Arizona will welcome seventh-ranked Alabama to Hillenbrand this weekend, UA's second top-10 opponent and third ranked foe through two weeks of 2019. The last time UA played three ranked teams in its first nine games was 2010.
- Arizona head coach Mike Candrea is second in NCAA history with 1,566 career victories in 31 years. He trails only Michigan's Carol Hutchins, who has won 1,574 games over 35 seasons.
- The Wildcats are hosting the Hillenbrand Invitational for the 23rd time in history. UA is 112-3 (.974) all-time in the event and went 4-0 in the rain-shortened tournament last year.

THIS WEEK: Ninth-ranked Arizona (3-2) is set to open up renovated Hillenbrand Memorial Stadium this week, showing off the \$8 Million facelift the stadium received this offseason. UA opens its 29-game home schedule with the 23rd Hillenbrand Invitational this weekend in Tucson. Arizona, which went 3-2 at the USF Opening Weekend Invitational to open the season, will host #7 Alabama, Cal State Fullerton, Illinois-Chicago, New Mexico and South Florida for the four-day, 16-game event at Hillenbrand Stadium. UA, which is 112-3 all-time in the tournament, will get things going on Thursday evening at 6 p.m. vs. New Mexico for the stadium's Grand Re-Opening. Prior to the game, Doby Hillenbrand, UA Athletics Director Dave Heeke and head coach Mike Candrea will assist in the ribbon cutting prior to first pitch. On Friday, UA will take on South Florida and Illinois-Chicago in a doubleheader beginning at 3:45 p.m. followed by a doubleheader with Alabama and New Mexico beginning at 3:45 p.m. on Saturday. UA and Cal State Fullerton will conclude the event at 1:30 p.m. on Sunday. All six games UA can be watched live at arizonawildcats.com/sblive. All non-Arizona matches can be seen at FloSoftball.com.

OPPONENTS

New Mexico: The Lobos went 2-1 at the season-opening New Mexico State Invitational in Las Cruces with wins over UTEP (15-6) and Creighton (8-0) and a one-run loss to New Mexico State (8-9). The Lobos hit .373 on the weekend, led by Cameryn O'Grady, who went 7-for-9 (.778) with a double, a triple and two homers in nine at-bats. The Wildcats are 32-1 all-time vs. New Mexico and have won the last 28 vs. the Lobos, including two wins last season. Arizona is Full series history on page 8.

South Florida: The Bulls went 1-4 at their season-opening USF Opening Weekend Invitational in Tampa with a win over Illinois State (2-1) and losses to #7 Arizona (1-4), #19 Michigan (1-10), NC State (1-2) and #5 Florida (1-7). Bethaney Keen hit two home runs and led the team with a .385 average on the weekend. Arizona 10-0 all-time against South Florida, including a 4-1 victory over the Bulls last week in Tampa; Alyssa Denham threw a complete-game and allowed one run on three hits with a career-high 11 strikeouts. Full series history on page 8.

Illinois-Chicago: The Flames went 2-3 at the Kickin' Chicken Classic in Conway, South Carolina with wins over Boston University (4-3) and Rider (17-0) and losses to #8 Tennessee (2-13 & 1-11) and Coastal Carolina (1-9). UIC hit .358 with 11 extra-base hits in the five games, led by Skylee James, who hit .538 with two doubles a homer and seven RBI. Arizona is 13-0 all-time vs. UIC; Arizona won the last meeting between the teams on March 12, 2010 in Tucson (8-0, five innings). Full series history on page 8.

#7 Alabama: The seventh-ranked Crimson Tide started the season 5-0 at the season-opening Trojan Classic in Troy, Alabama, defeated Murray State (12-0 & 16-10), Troy (7-1 & 8-0) and Maryland (10-0). Alabama put up big offensive numbers in the tournament, outscoring its opponents 53-11 in the five wins, three of which came via the mercy rule. Bailey Hemphill, who hit .571 with three doubles and a homer, drove in 11 runs in 14 at-bats. The Wildcats are 12-4 all-time against the Crimson Tide, but Alabama has won four of the last six, most recently an Alabama sweep of two games in Tuscaloosa at the 2016 Bama Bash. Cal State Fullerton: The 2018 Big West Champions started the season 4-1 at their season-opening Titan Classic with wins over Idaho State (3-2), Buffalo (5-4), Utah State (3-2) and Pacific (8-0) and a 9-0 loss to Louisville. The Titans were led by Irie Siofele, who had five hits, including two homers, and had six RBI in the five games. Arizona owns a 26-20 all-time record vs. CSUF; the Wildcats have won the last two meetings, including a 15-0, five-inning victory on March 8, 2014 in Fullerton. Full series history on page 8.

ARIZONA AT THE HILLENBRAND INVITATIONAL: Arizona is 112-3 (.974) all-time in the Hillenbrand Invitational and has not lost since 2009 (Creighton). Last season, in a rain-shortened tournament, UA went 4-0 with victories over Louisiana-Monroe (4-0), Montana (2-1), Colorado State (3-0) and Bryant (14-0). Arizona has hosted the event 22 times since 1994, the year after Hillenbrand Stadium's opening. For a full breakdown of Arizona's history in the Hillenbrand Invitational, head to page 8.

WHO'S HOT?

Alyssa Palomino-Cardoza: The preseason All-American impressed in her first weekend of 2019. She homered in four of UA's five games in Tampa, four of her eight hits on the weekend (.500). Dating back to last season, Palomino-Cardoza has a hit in six straight games, including five with a home run (four of which occurred in the first inning). The redshirt junior slugged 1.250 and got on base at a .556 clip in the five games.

Dejah Mulipola: The U.S. Women's National Team member started 2019 red hot at the dish. Mulipola led the team with a .533 batting average and six RBI over 15 at-bats in Tampa. She hit a double and three homers, all during Friday's doubleheader, in which she combined to go 4-for-6 with six RBI. The catcher threw out the only player brave enough to attempt a stolen base on the weekend.

Reyna Carranco: The junior closed the USF Opening Weekend Invitational with two straight three-hit games, her sixth and seventh three-hit efforts in her career. She became the first Wildcat since Katiyana Mauga in 2016 to record back-to-back three-hit games.

Malia Martinez: The junior was one of four Wildcats to record multiple home runs on the weekend, blasting two homers over 13 at-bats in Tampa. That figure is already half of her 2018 total, when she hit four in 164 at-bats. Martinez batted .462 in the five games and led the team with three walks, helping her to a team-high-tying .563 on-base percentage.

Alyssa Denham: The junior, who struck out 4.51 batters per seven innings in her freshman and sophomore seasons, fanned 18 batters in her 11 innings in Tampa, good for a 11.45 Ks/7 IP mark which ranks second in the Pac-12 behind 2018 USA Softball Player of the Year Rachel Garcia. Denham struck out a career-best 11 vs. South Florida in a complete-game three-hitter in her first start of 2019.

RANKINGS

- Arizona moved down to ninth in all three polls.
- The Wildcats started the season ranked seventh in the NFCA Top 25 and Softball America Top 25 and sixth in the USA Softball Top 25.
- Arizona is one of five Pac-12 teams in the top 25 and three in the top 10.

STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE

- When it's all said and done, Arizona will play what is sure to be among the toughest schedules in the country. Arizona's schedule includes each of the top seven teams from the final 2018 NFCA Top 25 (and 11 total ranked teams), 17 games against 2018 WCWS teams, 21 2018 NCAA Tournament teams and home series vs. the defending national champions (Florida State; March 8-10) and national runners up (Washington; May 3-5).
- The Wildcats will play or have already played each of top five teams in the current NFCA Top 25 and six of the top seven. In all, UA's schedule includes 12 teams currently ranked in the top 25.
- Arizona is scheduled to play at least one ranked team in each of the first seven weeks of the season, including six games vs. top-10 teams in that span.
- Since 1994, Arizona is above .500 against ranked teams, top-10 teams and top-five competition. UA is 565-263-1 (.690) against ranked competition, 265-175 (.617) against top-10 teams and 129-122 (.536) against top-five teams.

LAST WEEK

- Arizona went 3-2 at the USF Opening Weekend Invitational, beating #19 Michigan, South Florida and Illinois State and suffering losses to #5 Florida and NC State.
- The Cats' offense was long-ball reliant on the weekend; UA hit a Pac-12-most 11 home runs that accounted for 16 of Arizona's 18 runs scored on the weekend.
- Four Wildcats hit multiple homers in the tournament, led by Alyssa Palomino-Cardoza. The 2018 Pac-12 home run leader started where she left last season with a Pac-12-leading four big flies.
- The top five in the UA order combined to go 34-for-77 (.442), but the rest of the Wildcats hit just .075 on the weekend.
- Arizona's pitching staff, like its offense, was all-or-nothing on the weekend. UA's three pitchers, Taylor McQuillin, Alyssa Denham and Hanah Bowen combined to strike out 42 batters over 31 innings and held opponents to a .174 average on the weekend. However, the trio surrendered seven home runs that accounted for eight of the 10 runs scored by Wildcat opponents.

THE CHASE FOR HISTORY: Two legends, two Hall of Famers, Arizona's Mike Candrea and Michigan's Carol Hutchins, are battling it out to become the winningest coach in the sport's history. Hutchins currently has an eight-win advantage on Candrea. Below are some notes on their chase for history.

- In 2017, Candrea became the first coach in NCAA softball history to reach 1,500 Division I victories. Candrea, who is 1,566-408-2 (.794), trails only Michigan's Carol Hutchins (1,574-506-5, .757) in NCAA history. Candrea's victories have occurred over 31 years of coaching at Arizona while Hutchins is in her 36th year (including a season in a lower NCAA division).
- Candrea is the fastest coach in NCAA history, in any sport, in any division, to record 1,500 career wins.

HOME RUN U

- Arizona hit 11 home runs on opening weekend, the most in the Pac-12.
- Alyssa Palomino-Cardoza, who led the Pac-12 in homers in 2018, leads the conference in home runs this year with four.
- Jessie Harper has finished second in the Pac-12 each of the last two seasons (to teammates Katiyana Mauga, 2017, and Alyssa Palomino-Cardoza, 2018) with 19 and 18 home runs, respectively. She hit two home runs vs. South Florida (2/8) and now has nine career games with multiple home runs. Arizona is 29-1 in games in which Harper homers in her career.
- Arizona has hit 2,097 home runs since softball became a Division I sport in 1982, the most of any team in NCAA history.
- Arizona has four of the top six home run hitters in NCAA history, including Katiyana Mauga, who hit a Pac-12 record 92 from 2014-17, three shy of the NCAA record.
- Arizona has hit 100-or-more home runs six times in program history, the most in NCAA history. Only two other schools have hit the century mark more than twice (UTSA and Louisiana Lafayette).

THE CHASE FOR 40: Juniors Alyssa Palomino-Cardoza (117 career games played) and Jessie Harper (125 games) enter this weekend's action with 39 career home runs, which ties for 20th most in Arizona history. As they rapidly ascend up the UA career charts here's Arizona's current top five fastest players to 40 career home runs some perspective on their career trajectory and current pace:

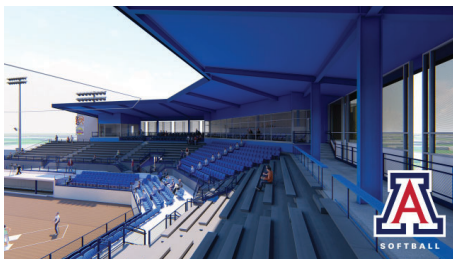

HILLENBRAND STADIUM RENOVATIONS

- Hillenbrand Stadium received a full facelift this offseason, transforming the historic stadium into a state-of-the-art modern facility with upgrades for fans and players alike.
- The seating area behind home plate was renovated, backed by a new press box and suite level and topped by a shading structure that will cover the majority of the infield seating.
- Upgrades to the concourse feature new restrooms and concession stands. New dugouts and netting behind home plate have been added as well. The eight-million dollar project began in May of 2018 and will be complete prior to Opening Day on Feb. 14, 2019.
- The upgrades to Hillenbrand Stadium are a part of Arizona Athletics' Capital Campaign. Additional projects currently underway or recently completed include updates to Arizona Stadium, Hillenbrand Aquatic Center, McKale Center and an Indoor Sports Center.

PRESEASON NOTES

PRESEASON HONORS

- Arizona placed four players (Jessie Harper, Taylor McQuillin, Dejah Mulipola, Alyssa Palomino-Cardoza) on the USA Softball Player of the Year Preseason Top 50 "Watch List", tying Washington for the most in the country.
- The four Wildcats were also named to Softball America's Preseason Top 100 Players (#31 Dejah Mulipola, #43 Alyssa Palomino-Cardoza, #51 Taylor McQuillin, #55 Jessie Harper) and were Justin's World of Softball Preseason All-Americans.

ALL-AMERICA MENTALITY

- First-team All-Americans Alyssa Palomino-Cardoza (2018) and Jessie Harper (2017) return this season for the Wildcats. Last year, Palomino-Cardoza earned Arizona's 100th all-time All-America honor.
- The power-hitting duo finished first and second in the Pac-12 in home runs last season -- Palomino-Cardoza, 19; Harper, 18 -- and will once again form a frightening middle-of-the-order 1-2 punch.
- Arizona is one of only four teams nationally (Florida, Oklahoma, UCLA) with multiple former first-team All-Americans on its roster.
- Both of the Wildcats' assistant coaches were All-American players at Arizona. Caitlin Lowe is one of only two players in UA history to be a four-time first-team All-American (2003-07) while Taryne Mowatt was a second-team All-American in 2007. Head coach Mike Candrea knows a thing or two about coaching All-Americans; he has coached 50 of them with 99 total citations over his 33 years at Arizona.

SUPER JUNIORS

- Arizona is expected to be led by its junior class, a class that features three of the four Wildcats named to the preseason USA Softball Player of the Year Watch List: Jessie Harper, Dejah Mulipola and Alyssa Palomino-Cardoza.
- All six juniors on the roster for the Wildcats are expected to be significant contributors this season for the Wildcats. Reyna Carranco, Jessie Harper, Malia Martinez, Dejah Mulipola and Alyssa Palomino-Cardoza should all be members of the starting lineup while Alyssa Denham figures to be the Wildcats' No. 2 pitcher.
- The top four Wildcat hitters (by batting average) in 2018 were all sophomores (now juniors). Alyssa Palomino-Cardoza led the team with a .363 average, Jessie Harper was second (.340), Reyna Carranco was third (.335) and Dejah Mulipola was fourth (.313).

A PATRIOTIC CONNECTION

- Junior catcher Dejah Mulipola was selected to compete for the U.S. Women's National Team this summer following USA Softball's Selection Camp in January. The team will train and compete internationally this summer in its continued preparation for the 2020 Olympics. It will be Mulipola's second consecutive summer competing with USA Softball after she and graduate manager Mo Mercado were members of USA Softball's Japan All-Star roster in 2018.
- Mulipola is one of 18 players on the roster, but just one of two current collegiate players (Rachel Garcia, UCLA).
- Mulipola will become the 17th Wildcat to compete for the U.S. Women's National Team. Next year, she will try and become the fifth Wildcat to compete in the Olympics.
- Arizona's USA Softball connection runs deep and extends to UA's current coaching staff. Head coach Mike Candrea was the head coach of the national team from 2001-08, helping guide the United States to a gold medal in 2004 and a silver medal in 2008. Associate head coach Caitlin Lowe was on the Women's National Team from 2005-10 and was on the 2008 silver medal winning team.

2018 RECAP

- Behind elite pitching and a powerful offense, the 2018 Wildcats finished 43-16, good for the 31st 40-win season in program history.
- Arizona earned its 32nd consecutive NCAA Tournament berth, adding onto the longest streak in the history of the sport. UA went 3-2 in the postseason, sweeping the Tucson Regional for its 29th regional championship and advancing to its 13th super regional in the last 14 years. Arizona's 13 super regional appearances in the round's 14 years are the second most in the NCAA behind only Alabama, who has been to all 14 NCAA Super Regionals.
- The Wildcats, who finished the season ranked 11th in the final NFCA Top 25, won eight games against ranked opponents, including three against teams that advanced to the Women's College World Series (2 vs. ASU, 1 vs. Oklahoma).
- Alyssa Palomino-Cardoza became Arizona's 100th All-American when she earned first-team NFCA All-America honors for her superb season. Palomino-Cardoza led the Wildcats in batting average (.363), home runs (19), slugging percentage (.750) and on-base percentage (.446).
- Palomino-Cardoza led the Pac-12 in home runs (19), marking the fifth straight season that Arizona has had the Pac-12 leader (or co-leader) in home runs. A Wildcat has led (or finished tied for the lead) the Pac-12 in 20 of the last 30 years.
- Jessie Harper finished second in the conference in home runs (18) for the second straight season. Over the last five seasons, Arizona has had the top two home-run-hitters in the Pac-12 every year except 2016.
- Seven Wildcats were named all-Pac-12 in 2018, six of whom return in 2019. Sophomore shortstop Jessie Harper, junior pitcher Taylor McQuillin and sophomore first baseman Alyssa Palomino-Cardoza were named first-team all-Pac-12, senior outfielder Ashleigh Hughes and sophomore catcher Dejah Mulipola were second teamers, and sophomore second baseman Reyna Carranco and sophomore pitcher Alyssa Denham were named third-team all-conference. Mulipola was also named to the Pac-12 all-defensive team.

GOING STRAKING: Arizona has appeared in every NCAA Tournament since 1987, Mike Candrea's second year on campus. That's an NCAA-Record 32 consecutive years in the tournament for Arizona. Not only is that the longest active streak, but it is seven years longer than the second longest streak. In 2017, UA broke Fresno State's inactive 30-year streak for the longest in the history of the sport.

- Arizona has made 22 trips to the Women's College World Series under his guidance, missing just eight times in the last 30 years.
- Under Candrea, Arizona has a spectacular postseason record of 167-61. The Wildcats have played in an NCAA-record 32 consecutive postseasons.
- Fifty All-Americans with a staggering 100 total citations have played in the program since Candrea took over.

Mike Candrea enters his 34th season as the head coach of the University of Arizona softball team in 2019 and under his guidance reaching the pinnacle should once again underscore a record of success almost unparalleled by any program in any sport at any level.

Candrea is one of the most respected coaches in the nation, with the accomplishments to supplement: eight national titles in a 24-season span, 22 trips to the Women's College World Series in the last 29 seasons, more than 1,500 career victories, a mind-boggling career winning percentage of 79%, 50 All-Americans with a staggering 100 citations, four national players of the year and stewardship of Team USA to an Olympic gold medal, to name a few.

Candrea earned the 1,500th victory of his career against Washington On March 26, 2017. Like many milestones before this, Candrea was the fastest coach in NCAA softball history to 1,500 wins. Candrea's **1,566** career victories are second in NCAA history. While others on the list have spent time at lower divisions, each of Candrea's victories occurred at Arizona, making him the winningest coach in NCAA Division I Softball history. Only five coaches in any sport have more Division I victories than Candrea.

The aforementioned gold medal came with his stint as the head coach of Team USA in 2004. His second Olympic squad took home the silver in 2008. Softball was then put on a hiatus from the Olympics, but Candrea's work in the sport's final two Olympic years prior to being reinstated for 2020 will not soon be forgotten. Under his tutelage in 2004, the team posted a perfect 9-0 record, outscoring its opponents 51-1 on its way to a gold medal in one of the most dominant team performances in any sport in Olympic history. In 2008, the team came just short of winning its fourth consecutive gold medal.

Built in 1993, Rita Hillenbrand Memorial Stadium was the first of its kind and became the model that programs across the country emulated. For 26 seasons, the sport's original mecca stood as a historical setting to watch some of the best softball in the nation.

After just over a quarter century of dominance, the legendary stadium underwent a complete renovation from foul pole to foul pole, transforming the iconic venue into a state-of-the-art modern facility with modern amenities for fans and players alike.

The 2019 updates included brand new infield bleachers, including 100 additional seats, backed by a two-level, enclosed press box. Shade structure down both baselines and off the press box will provide cover from the Tucson sun for the majority of the infield seating.

For the players, widened dugouts with a restroom on both the home and visiting sides will improve the gameday experience. Also included in the renovations were new bullpens as well as a new outfield wall.

The 2019 renovations pair with the Lapan Family Center, Arizona's state-of-the-art team room and locker room erected in 2015, make Arizona's softball facility the standard, just as it was in year 1 in 1993.

Additional fan amenities include a renovated concourse, with a brand new entrance area and updated concession stands and restrooms. Pole-free netting will provide fans with improved sightlines from all infield seats.

Whether they come out to the tune of 3,541 for an exhibition pitting Team USA against Arizona, or for a Wildcats' regular-season game, the Arizona fans have proved themselves as some of the best in the country.

In 2017, the stadium's all-time attendance reached surpassed the 1,000,000 mark. The stadium opened in 1993 with 8,808 fans attending 12 home dates. Now, nearly three decades later, Hillenbrand has attracted over 50,000 fans in eight of the last nine seasons.

One reason for the stadium's appeal obviously is the Cats' typical home success. UA has played to a **721-93** record at home. That's 89 victories in every 100 games. In 2002, UCLA snapped a remarkable 70-game home field winning streak the Cats had built, which remains the national record.

That fan support underscores the attraction of UA softball and its home field, named in honor of the late Rita Hillenbrand, sister of the late Wildcat benefactor William G. Hillenbrand and his wife, Doby (Delores D.). The couple financed the stadium and initial landscaping project, and the Hillenbrand family has continued to contribute funds to support Arizona softball and Wildcat athletics.

The family has provided tremendous support for a number of UA athletic programs through gifts to develop and support the UA's aquatic center, the baseball stadium and Arizona's football program. Another focal point in daily Wildcat athletics is the John W. Hillenbrand Meeting Center, named in memory of Bill's late father. That facility gave the athletics department a main auditorium, a half dozen classrooms and meeting rooms, and various office spaces used for the athletics department's mentoring programs and its Commitment to Athletes' Total Success (C.A.T.S.) program.

The NCAA has found the facility to be a quality site for postseason play as well, with The University of Arizona playing host to NCAA Regionals in 21 of the stadium's 26 years of existence. National television networks have also found the Wildcats and the stadium to be attractive to their audiences for a number of broadcasts since the facility was built for the 1993 season, including 100s of nationally televised contests in the last 10 years. All games attract a solid contingent of fans, area television and print reporters.

Hillenbrand Stadium and its success in helping bring Division I collegiate softball into increased national focus made it a national model in the early 1990s for dynamic softball programs. As on-campus college softball facilities go, it had elite status for several years until it engendered considerable copying. Today, major universities around the country are putting their teams in facilities with style and substance.

But Hillenbrand maintains one special feature, which makes it second to none — the infield, outfield and foul territories provide a top playing surface. Tucson's climate and round-the-year maintenance keep the facility in game-ready condition more than 300 days per year. Aside from the .900 home winning percentage, Arizona and visiting teams alike enjoy the facility for its playing surface. In 2004 and again in 2008, the infield was rebuilt with new clay and soil composition.

The University of Arizona softball program moved into the facility for the 1993 season and went out and proved it was equal to the trappings by winning consecutive NCAA championships and leading the nation in attendance in 1994 and 1995. UA added another back-to-back NCAA title splurge in 1996 and 1997, a sixth title in 2001, and the most recent back-to-back championships in 2006 and 2007. The outfield wall is festooned with those and other championship banners. UA also has won 10 conference titles since moving into Hillenbrand Stadium. The Cats also led the nation in attendance for three years from 2000-2002. Arizona has led the nation in attendance five of the past 13 seasons.
