GAME NOTES

Final Score: No. 5 Seed San Diego State 82, No. 3 Seed New Mexico 75

- The Aztecs earned their Mountain West record fifth tournament title and first since 2011. SDSU is now 5-5 all-time in the MW Championship final. New Mexico drops to 4-2 in tournament final appearances.
- The win was the first in three tries for SDSU over UNM in the championship game.
- San Diego State improved to 39-47 all-time versus New Mexico, including a 2-4 mark in the league tournament. The win halted the Lobos' three-game win streak overall versus the Aztecs.
- SDSU is now 6-1 all-time in the MW Tournament as a No. 5 seed and is 2-0 in the title game. Overall, San Diego State is a MW-best 30-14 (.682) in the tournament.
- The Aztecs extended its win streak to a season-best nine games. The last loss suffered by SDSU came on Feb. 10 at nationally-ranked Nevada.
- San Diego State will be making its first appearance in the NCAA Tournament since the 2014-15 season.
- New Mexico opened the game on a 12-4 spurt over the first 3:18. San Diego State responded with a 9-0 run to take the lead, at 13-12, at the 13:48 mark of the first half. Neither team led by more than six points for the remainder of the period.
- The Lobos held a 63-57 lead after a **Makuach Maluach** basket at the 7:39 mark of the second half. The Aztecs concluded the contest on a 25-12 run to secure the win.
- **Trey Kell** recorded a career-high 28 points on 10-of-16 shooting from the floor and 7-for-8 conversions from the charity stripe. Over the tournament, Kell averaged 18.3 points per game and was named MVP for his efforts.
- Kell was one of three Aztecs to reach double digits in points, as Malik Pope tallied 16 points and Devin Watson added 12. Pope tied for the game high in rebounds with five. SDSU's Jalen McDaniels matched Pope with five rebounds as did UNM's Joe Furstinger and Sam Logwood.
- Five players reached double figures in points for New Mexico. **Antino Jackson** paced the team with 17 points, followed by **Anthony Mathis**, **Joe Furstinger**, **Sam Logwood** and **Troy Simmons** with 13, 12, 11 and 11 points respectively.
- The New Mexico bench outscored the San Diego State reserves, 32-15.
