

## ***POSTGAME NOTES: NEW MEXICO 80, SAN JOSÉ STATE 47***

### **Matchup Notes**

- Starting Lineup: Antino Jackson, Joe Furstinger, Dane Kuiper, Vladimir Pinchuk, Anthony Mathis
- The game was the 13<sup>th</sup> meeting between the two teams, with New Mexico now leading the all-time series 12-1
- Attendance: 10,799

### **Paul Weir Notes**

- Career record: 35-16
- UNM record: 7-10, 2-2 MW

### **In-Game Notes**

- Lobos forced five turnovers in the first 5:30 of the game, forcing 20 turnovers total
- UNM had just six turnovers in the game, the least in a game this season
- UNM had 23 assists, tied for the second-most this season, compared to San José State's seven
- Lobos held the Spartans to 23 points in the first half and 24 points in the second half, the second and third-lowest totals allowed by the Lobos this season in a half. (Lowest was 20 in the first half vs Air Force)
  - Held the Spartans to 31.8% shooting (14-44), the first time the Lobos have held an opponent to less than 35% since March 4, 2017 vs San Diego State (31.5%)
- Lobos scored 28 points off of turnovers compared to the Spartans' one
  - UNM also had 20 fastbreak points to San Jose State's zero
- Joe Furstinger broke his career-high in steals with five
  - First Lobo player with five steals since Troy Simons in the season-opener vs Northern New Mexico
  - He also scored his third career 3-pointer, second of the season
- Anthony Mathis brought down a career-high six rebounds
- Antino Jackson tied his UNM career-high in steals with three

- Makuach Maluach scored a pair of 3-pointers for the first time in his career.
- Jachai Simmons tied his UNM career-high four rebounds
- UNM finished with five players scoring in double-digits including Chris McNeal, Joe Furstinger, Makuach Maluach, Anthony Mathis and Antino Jackson
  - The Lobos have had five or more players score in double digits in five games this season.
- Mike Mondragon scored his first career points (2) while also dishing an assist in his two minutes on the floor.
