SCHEDULE FULL OF RANKED TEAMS

Three of UNM's first four matchups of the season have been against ranked squads including No. 22 Seattle, No. 24 Washington and No. 30 Cal State Fullerton. The Lobos scored four goals against Seattle and five against Cal State Fullerton. CSUN was also ranked at one point this season and the Lobos will head into battle with No. Tulsa on Friday. Looking at the schedule, the first five squads the Lobos have taken on have been top-30 teams in 2018.

OFFENSE ON FIRE - LEADING C-USA

In the first four games, the Lobos have racked up 25 points on nine goals and seven assists to lead Conference USA in all three categories. The Lobos also lead the league in points per game with 6.25.

SCORES GALORE!

Last season, the Lobos scored 25 goals all season. With nine, UNM is just 3.5 away from halfway there, after just four games. Only four players scored three goals or more in 2017 while sophomore Matt Puig already has three in four games, followed by two for freshman Omar Grey, senior Antoine Vial and sophomore Nick Taylor.

TAYLOR EMERGES

Sophomore Nick Taylor scored twice all season in 2017 in 12 games and 354 minutes. On Sunday night in UNM's 5-1 victory over No. 30 Cal State Fullerton, Taylor scored twice including the first goal of the game to give UNM the advantage.

5 OR MORE

The last time the Lobo scored five goals or more in a single game prior to Sunday night's 5-1 win over Cal State Fullerton came on Oct. 1, 2014 when the then No. 15 Lobos topped West Virginia 6-1.

3 IS THE MAGIC NUMBER

In Coach Fishbein's tenure, the Lobos are 80-1-0 when scoring three goals or more in a match, which UNM has done twice so far this season.

PARKER IN GOAL

Redshirt-junior Ford Parker spent just less than 20 minutes in goal prior to this season over four games. He had collected just one save and posted a .500 save percentage and a 4.63 goals against average, not including his outstanding PK blocks in the 2016 postseason. This season, Parker has collected 14 saves for a .700 save percentage in 354:38 minutes. In the Lobos' game against Cal State Fullerton alone, Parker tallied five saves.

PUIG RETURNS HOME

A native of Edmond, Okla., Matt Puig will have a homecoming as the Lobos travel to Tulsa to take on the Golden Hurricanes. Not only is Puig from the area, he also played for Tulsa last season before transferring to UNM.

LOBOS BATTLE

The Lobos claimed their 4-2 victory over No. 22 Seattle, then fell into a scoring rut, getting shut out in two straight games. But the Lobos battled back and racked up five goals on No. 30 Cal State Fullerton to put their offense back on track.

PUIG CONFERENCE USA OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Sophomore Matt Puig earned Conference USA Offensive Player of the Week this on August 27 after posting five points on two goals and an assist in UNM's 4-2 season-opening victory over No. 22 Seattle at home. He opened the contest with an assist on the first goal of the season in just the 24th minute, dribbling solo up the right side of the field, passing defenders and then passing in for the goal to put UNM up 1-0.

He followed less than five minutes later with his first goal as a Lobo in the 30th minute, taking a header pass from the right side of the box and putting it away for a 2-0 lead. After Seattle narrowed the lead to one before the half, 2-1, Puig came out just 5:33 into the second half with his second goal of the game to put UNM back up by two, 3-1.

EARLY RANKED OPPONENT TRADITION

Coach Fishbein's Lobos have a habit of starting off the season with a strong, nationally-ranked test. Including 2018, the Lobos have faced a nationally-ranked opponent within their first three games in the last seven seasons. Last season, the Lobos entered the season ranked No. 20 in the nation and fell 2-1 to then-#11 Washington. In 2016, UNM took on #15 Indiana (L, 1-0) and #9 Notre Dame (L, 1-0). UNM fell by just one (1-0) in the 2015 season opener at #1 UCLA, tied #18 San Diego 2-2 and then claimed a 2-1 victory over #13 UCSB at home.

season's underclassmen and redshirts to step up. Players that departed for professional contracts include goalkeeper Jason Beaulieu (Montreal Impact MLS), Aaron Herrera (Real Salt Lake MLS), Sam Gleadle (Reno 1868 FC USL) and Alex Vedamanikam (Eintracht Braunschweig of the Second Bundesliga).

While we're on the topic of professional contracts - former Lobo Chris Wehan received USL Rookie of the Year honors last season as a member of Reno 1868 FC and has now signed with the San Jose Earthquakes (MLS). Speaking of former Lobos, Wehan's classmate Niko Hansen is still with the Columbus Crew SC (MLS).

PRESEASON HONORS

While the Lobos might have lost some significant starters last year to graduation and professional contracts, there are still some stellar returners set to take to the pitch in the Cherry and Silver this season. Redshirt-junior and 2018 co-captain Tom Smart was named to the Conference USA Preseason Team on August 5.

Smart was named to the C-USA Second Team last season for his extraordinary defensive efforts.

PARKER'S YEAR

With the departure of Beaulieu, two-year backup keeper Ford Parker gets the spotlight in Friday night's season opener. Parker, an Albuquerque native, made a name for himself in the 2016 season when he entered the first game of the Conference USA Tournament for PKs and propelled the Lobos past the first round. UNM eventually claimed the tournament championship and advanced to the first round of the NCAA Tournament against Portland, which took place in the Duke City. After two overtime periods, the PK specialist was brought in again and Parker saved one of the six kicks to send the Lobos to the NCAA Second Round at #14 Washington.

LOBO SOCCER: A MILE HIGH AND LOUDER THAN ...

The UNM Soccer Complex has a reputation as one of the nation's toughest venues to play in. In addition to being "a mile high and louder than...", New Mexico has turned Albuquerque into one of the hottest tickets in college soccer. The Lobos have ranked in the top 25 in attendance nationally every season since the NCAA began keeping those statistics in 2001.

EXCELLING OFF THE PITCH

Lobo Soccer has a rich tradition of academic success. During the Fishbein era (2002 to present), UNM has had 22 Academic All-Americans - more than any other men's soccer program in the country among all divisions. In addition, the Lobos have garnered 95 Academic All-Conference honorees and 20 NSCAA Scholar All-Americans under Fishbein's tutelage. As a team, the Lobos have earned the NSCAA Academic Team Award in 13 of the last 14 seasons - Soon to be 14 of the last 15 when the new awards are released.

INTERNATIONAL PRIDE

While the diversity of the team roster is obvious, many Lobos have some serious international credentials. Eight have represented their country in top-level international competition: Billy Jones (captained New Zealand U17 in select World Cup qualifying matches), Aaron Scott (U15, U16, U17 Scottish National Team), Tom Smart (Northern Ireland U19, U20), Gladimir Mendoza (United States U20), Omar Grey (Jamaica U17), Maliek Howell (Jamaica U17, U20) and Alex Fetterly (United States U18).

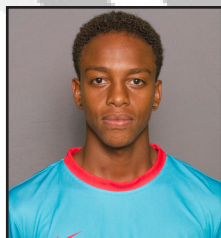

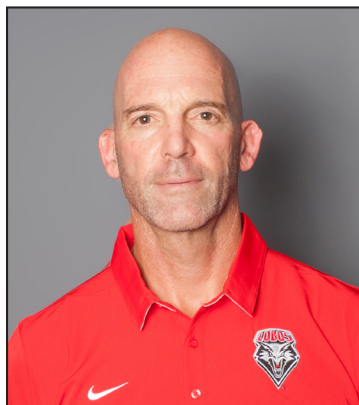
