MOUNTAIN WEST PLAYERS OF THE WEEK - SEPT. 5

OFFENSIVE

Josh Allen, Wyoming

Sophomore, Quarterback, Firebaugh, California / Reedley CC

- Completed 19-of-29 passes (65.5 percent) for 245 yards, two touchdowns and no interceptions in Wyoming's 40-34 triple-overtime victory over Northern Illinois. He also ran for 70 yards on 10 attempts and had one rushing TD.
- Accounted for 315 yards of total offense while leading the Cowboys to 488 yards of total offense in the victory.
- Scored the winning touchdown on a seven-yard scramble in the third overtime to give Wyoming the win.
- His game-winning touchdown came on a third-down and four play and was one of five third-down plays he converted into first downs or scores on the night. His third-down conversions included the seven-yard winning TD scamper, a 15-yard run and pass completions of 14, 13 and five yards.
- Connected with seven different receivers in the game, including two wide outs that posted 100-yard receiving games. Senior Tanner Gentry ended with 104 yards receiving, and fellow senior Jake Malhaurdt had 106 yards.
- Was responsible for three of Wyoming's five touchdowns (two passing and 1 rushing).
- In the second half and overtime, completed 77.8 percent of his passes (14-of-18) for 190 yards.
- Engineered scoring drives of 30 yards, 52 yards, 75 yards and 80 yards in regulation, plus two TD drives in the three overtime periods.

DEFENSIVE

Dakota Cox, New Mexico

Senior, Linebacker, Draper, Utah / Juan Diego HS

- Recorded a team-high 14 tackles (nine solo), including two for losses of eight yards, two tackles for zero gain and one sack for six yards. He also forced a fumble and picked off a pass in New Mexico's 48-21 win over South Dakota.
- The two forced turnovers came in the second half. The first was a sack/fumble that ended South Dakota's opening drive and led to a field goal. His second, a diving interception, came on the first play of the fourth quarter and led to the Lobos' final touchdown.
- Led a defense that allowed just 158 yards over the final 11 drives, in which the Coyotes scored just once.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Jason Sanders, New Mexico

Junior, Placekicker, Orange, California / Villa Park HS

- Was perfect on the night going 6-for-6 on extra points and hitting multiple field goals for the first time in his career in New Mexico's 48-21 victory over South Dakota.
- Went 2-for-2 on field goals, hitting from 27 and 22 yards.
- Recorded eight touchbacks on nine kickoffs, while the other kickoff that didn't make the end zone was only returned 13 yards.

- .@BroncoSportsFB has defeated a Power 5 team in 4 of 5 seasons since joining the MW. BSU hosts Washington State this week & plays at Oregon State in Week 3.
- After Week 1, @USUFootball & @NewMexicoFB lead the nation with 428 rushing yards.
- .@GoAztecs RB **Donnell Pumphrey** is the nation's active leader in career rushing yds (4,370), rushing touchdowns (46) and all-purpose yardage (5,284).
- In 54% of Pumphrey's collegiate games played, he has rushed for at least 100 yards (22-41).
- .@BroncoSportsFB RB **Jeremy McNichols** has scored a TD in a @MountainWest record 13 straight games.
- .@GoAztecs haven't thrown an interception in 13 games (9/12/15 at Cal).
- .@NewMexicoFB LB **Dakota Cox** is the nation's 2nd-leading tackler with 326 career tackles. Cox needs 47 stops to enter the MW's top-5.
- In its last 26 games, @SJSUSpartanFB has only allowed 135.7 passing yards per contest.

PUMPHREY RECORD WATCH

San Diego State senior running back **Donnell Pumphrey** is on the verge of rewriting the Mountain West record book. The native of Las Vegas, Nevada, has rushed for 4,370 yards and 46 touchdowns. In his career, Pumphrey has scored a total of 50 touchdowns and racked up 5,145 all-purpose yards.

MOUNTAIN WEST IN THE POSTSEASON

The Mountain West sent a record eight teams into postseason bowl games in 2015, posting a 4-4 record (.500). Overall, the Mountain West has earned 77 bowl bids since 1999 and holds a 42-35 (.546) all-time record. The league has also posted an overall postseason mark of at least .500 in nine of the last 12 seasons.

The 2015 postseason marked the ninth straight year the MW has sent at least five teams to bowls and 12th time since the league's inception in 1999. It also marked the third straight year that six or more MW squads advanced to the postseason.

Over the last 12 seasons, the Mountain West has captured the Bowl Challenge Cup four times and owns the third-best win percentage in bowl games among the 10 FBS conferences with a 35-27 mark (.565) during that span. The MW is the only conference to win the trophy four times since the award's inception in 2002-03.

NEW HEAD COACH JOINS MW RANKS IN 2016

The University of Hawai'i introduced **Nick Rolovich** as its 23rd head coach in program history. Rolovich, who was the Rainbow Warriors' offensive coordinator and record-setting QB, returns to the islands after a stint at Nevada where he was the Wolf Pack's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach.

Rolovich was a two-year letterwinner for Hawai'i from 2000-01. He threw for 4,176 yards and 40 touchdowns and holds six school passing records. Rolovich started his coaching career in 2002 as an assistant coach for San Marin High School. He got his first full-time college coaching position as QB coach at City College of San Francisco. After two seasons at CCSF, Rolovich spent four years with the Rainbow Warriors before joining the Nevada staff in 2012.

FIRST-YEAR HEAD COACHES IN THE MOUNTAIN WEST

The Mountain West has welcomed 25 new head coaches over the last 17 seasons. Former BYU head coach Gary Crowton and current Boise State head coach **Bryan Harsin** have posted the most victories and highest win percentage among the group with 12 victories and an .857 win percentage in their inaugural years in 2001 and 2014, respectively. Harsin became the first to conclude his inaugural season by winning the Mountain West Championship Game, the first of two outright MW Championships in program history. Harsin is the only alumnus to lead the Broncos as head coach in the history of Boise State. Harsin is one of three first-year coaches to win at least 10 games in their inaugural season, joining Crowton (12 wins, 2001) and Urban Meyer (10 wins, 2003).

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- Third-year Wyoming head coach **Craig Bohl** grew up in Lincoln, Nebraska, before attending the University of Nebraska where he was a reserve defensive back from 1977-79. Bohl went on to become a linebackers coach at Nebraska from 1995-99, and then added defensive coordinator responsibilities from 2000-02. As a coach at Nebraska, the Cornhuskers won the 1995 and '97 National Championships.
- The Cowboys haven't defeated a Power 5 institution since Nov. 8, 2008 when they earned a 13-7 victory at Tennessee.
- Wyoming RB **Brian Hill**, a junior, needs to rush for 412 yards to break the program record for career rushing yards. The record is currently held by Devin Moore, who rushed for 2,963 yards from 2005-08.
- Hill has rushed for at least 100 yards in 11 of the Cowboys' last 17 contests.
- Cowboy QB **Josh Allen**, who threw for 285 yards and two touchdowns and rushed for the game-winning score in the season opener vs. Northern Illinois, will make his first collegiate start on the road.
- UW WR **Tanner Gentry** has registered a reception of 30 yards or longer in five consecutive games. In four of those five contests, Gentry has had a catch of at least 40 yards. Additionally, he has caught at least three passes in six-straight contests.
- Nebraska, which has won 33 consecutive contests against current Mountain West teams, has only lost two nonconference games at Memorial Stadium since 2010. The Cornhuskers lost their season opener to BYU in 2015 (33-28) and to 16th-ranked UCLA in 2013 (41-21).
- The Nebraska defense has shut down the rushing attack of its last two opponents. Fresno State rushed for 31 yards on 26 carries last week, and UCLA posted just 67 rushing yards in the Foster Farms Bowl to conclude the 2015 season.
- Nebraska quarterback Tommy Armstrong Jr. needs two touchdown passes to tie a school career record in that category. Armstrong has 54 career TD passes, two behind Taylor Martinez's career total of 56 TD passes.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- Utah State is the only FBS program to have new offensive and defensive coordinators for the third straight season under the same head coach.
- Against Power 5 opponents, Utah State has lost six straight dating back to 2012. The Aggies' last victory against a Power 5 school was on Sept. 7, 2012 vs. Utah, defeating the Utes 27-20 in OT.
- When producing a 100-yard rusher, the Aggies have won 21 of 22 contests. Utah State had won 20 straight games when accomplishing this feat before the 2015 Famous Idaho Potato Bowl (lost 23-21) vs. Akron.
- In the Aggies season opener, senior RB **Devante Mays** rushed for a career-best 208 yards and a career-high-tying three touchdowns. Mays is the first USU player to rush for at least 200 yards since 2012 (Kerwynn Williams - 235). In the opening weekend of the 2016 season, only two FBS players ran for more yards: UTEP's Aaron Jones (249) and Georgia's Nick Chubb (222).
- Utah State rushed for 428 yards against Weber State last week, the seventh-most in program history. The rushing total is the most by an Aggies squad since 2011 (440 yards vs. Weber State). Additionally, the 428 yards were tied for the most by a FBS team in Week 1 (New Mexico).
- The Aggies haven't opened 2-0 since 2012 when they rattled off victories against Southern Utah (34-3) and Utah (27-20 in OT).
- Utah State head coach **Matt Wells** is 8-12 in road contests. Wells is 0-4 all-time against Pac-12 opponents.
- Entering the 2016 season, Utah State has five players who have already received degrees in senior WR **Andrew Rodriguez** (interdisciplinary studies), redshirt senior NG **Travis Seefeldt** (management information systems), senior OL **Jake Simonich** (sociology), senior OL **Austin Stephens** (interdisciplinary studies), and senior K **Brock Warren** (family, consumer and human development).
- USC is 29-1-1 (.952) against current Mountain West Conference teams, last losing in 1992 (to Fresno State). The Trojans also tied San Diego State that season.
- It is the earliest kickoff (11 a.m.) for a USC home game since at least the early 1950s when complete records became available. The last time the Trojans began a game before noon at home was the 1998 season opener against Purdue at 11:30 a.m.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- Georgia State at Air Force will be broadcast on Twitter, the third college football game ever to be streamed live on the site.
- Air Force will wear an alternate uniform this weekend to celebrate the Tiger Shark teeth nose-art which has been represented on multiple Air Force aircraft dating back to World War II. During the WWII era, fight plane pilots were called "Flying Tigers" and were part of the U.S. Army Air Corps, which later became the Air Force. The helmets worn for the game will feature a shark-teeth design like those painted on the aircraft.
- In six of the last seven home games, the Falcons have not trailed. The last time Air Force was losing at home was on Oct. 24, 2015 against Fresno State. In that contest, AFA only trailed for 10 minutes and 19 seconds.
- Air Force head coach **Troy Calhoun** is 18-3 at home against nonconference foes. The Falcons' last home nonconference defeat came on Oct. 26, 2013 vs. Notre Dame (45-10).
- The Falcons have scored in a school-record 286 games, the third-longest active streak in the nation. The last time AFA was shutout was in the 1992 Liberty Bowl vs. Ole Miss (13-0).
- Air Force senior WR **Jalen Robinette** ranks third in program history with 1,766 receiving yards and sixth in career receptions with 87. Robinette needs 627 receiving yards to take the top spot from Ernie Jennings (2,392; 1968-70).
- AFA RB **Jacobi Owens** has gone over 100 rushing yards 10 times in his career.
- Air Force is 36-2 when allowing fewer than 20 points in a game under Calhoun.
- Georgia State WR Robert Davis is the nation's fifth-leading active receiver with 2,484 yards. Among the same group, Davis ranks 11th with 163 career catches.
- Georgia State's five-game improvement from 2014 to 2015 was tied for the third-best in the FBS behind Southern Miss and Washington State who both recorded six-game improvements.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- Colorado State has won three consecutive home openers dating back to 2012, outscoring its opponent 148-51. The Rams defeated Cal Poly (34-17) in 2013, UC Davis (49-21) in 2014 and Savannah State (65-13) last season. CSU has won eight of its last 10 home openers.
- Head coach **Mike Bobo** announced that Georgia transfer **Faton Bauta** will make his second collegiate start, first at CSU, against UTSA. Bauta, who backed up **Nick Stevens** against Colorado, completed 6-of-9 passes for 32 yards and a touchdown, while rushing for 39 yards.
- Colorado State senior LB **Kevin Davis** registered a career-best 19 tackles in the Rams' season opener. The 19 tackles were the most by a Ram defender since 2013 and tied for the most by a FBS player in Week 1.
- CSU replaced eight starters on defense, in addition to its defensive coordinator. The Rams also switched their base front from a 4-3 to a 3-4. In total, six of CSU's 11 starters vs. Colorado (9/2) were making their first career starts, plus **Jake Schlager** who was made his second.
- In the opener against in-state rival Colorado, Rams RB **Dalyn Dawkins** rushed for a team-most 88 yards and averaged 6.3 yards per carry. Dawkins is averaging 108.2 yards per game over his past five regular-season contests.
- Entering Week 2, Colorado State has only had one play of at least 20 yards, a 24-yard rush by Bauta. Last season, the Rams recorded 63 plays of 20-plus yards (18 rush, 45 pass).
- In its season opener, UTSA recorded six sacks, which is tied for third among all FBS teams. The six sacks against Alabama State were a program record.
- The Roadrunners haven't won a road nonconference game since Aug. 29, 2014 vs. Houston (27-7). UTSA has lost four straight nonconference games outside of San Antonio.
- A victory over CSU would give the Roadrunners their second 2-0 start in program history and first since the 2012 season when they defeated South Alabama (33-31) and Texas A&M-Commerce (27-16) to open the year.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- A victory on Sept. 10 would improve San José State's record to 1-1 for the fifth consecutive season. The last time the Spartans opened 0-2 was 2011, losing at No. 6 Stanford and at UCLA.
- Since joining the Mountain West prior to the 2013 season, SJSU has compiled a 3-0 record against FCS institutions.
- San José State had been ranked in the top 5 nationally for pass defense each week of the NCAA stats since Sept. 20, 2014. That streak ended after the season opener at Tulsa. The Golden Hurricane threw for 207 yards, over 70 yards more than the Spartans average over the past 26 games (135.7).
- Dating back to the start of the 2014 season, the Spartans have only allowed seven opponents to throw for more than 200 yards (7-of-26, 26.9%).
- SJSU punter **Michael Carrizosa** had a record year in 2015, setting a school record with a 47.5 yards per punt average. This average was good for third nationally. Additionally, Carrizosa helped lead the Spartans to a 42.42 net punting average, which was second-best in the nation. In the season opener at Tulsa, Carrizosa picked up where he left off, booting seven punts for a 46.0 average. The Spartans recorded a net punting average of 44.4, good for 13th nationally.
- Portland State is ranked 16th in the Football Championship Subdivision. The Vikings will play their first road game of the year at San José State. PSU was 5-1 on the road in last year - including wins at Washington State and North Texas.
- Portland State is 4-32 against FBS teams all-time, but the Vikings defeated both FBS opponents in 2015 (Washington State 24-17 and North Texas 66-7). Against MW opponents, the Vikings are 2-16 all-time.
- PSU RB Nate Tago rushed for 136 yards and three touchdowns on 24 carries against Central Washington last week. All three totals were career highs.

- UNLV has lost 12 consecutive games against Power 5 opponents. The last win came over Iowa State in a home contest on Sept. 20, 2008 (34-31).
- The Rebels have dropped 13 straight nonconference road games dating back to Sept. 13, 2008 at No. 15/13 Arizona State (23-20 in OT). That win was also UNLV's last victory against a nationally ranked opponent. Since then, the Rebels have dropped 17 straight against ranked teams.
- UNLV junior WR **Devonte Boyd** caught four passes, three of which went for scores, in the Rebels' season opener against Jackson State. Boyd is the 13th Rebel to catch three touchdown passes in a game and first since Kendal Keys, who achieved this feat last season at Colorado State. Boyd has 14 career TDs in 26 games.
- Under head coach **Tony Sanchez**, the Rebels have either led or trailed by just one score in the fourth quarter during all but three contests (vs. UCLA, at Michigan and vs. San Diego State).
- After losing seven fumbles the past two years, UNLV put two balls on the ground, losing one, against Jackson State in the season opener.
- Under Sanchez, UNLV has scored at least 63 points in a single game in back-to-back years for the first time in program history. The Rebels hung 80 on Idaho State in 2015 and scored 63 points against Jackson State last week.
- UCLA has won five consecutive home openers dating back to 2011. The Bruins streak began after losing to Stanford (35-0) on Sept. 11, 2010.
- The Bruins have rushed for at least one touchdown in their last 15 games. UNLV didn't allow Jackson State to score a rushing touchdown in Week 1.
- UCLA QB Josh Rosen established a new school record by throwing 245 pass attempts without an interception (streak extended from third quarter game 6 at Stanford to 3rd quarter game 12 at USC) -- the old school mark was 199 by Drew Olson, 2005

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- New Mexico and New Mexico State first played in 1894, eight years before the first Rose Bowl game, and the matchup has been played every year since 1946.
- After losing three in-a-row from 2009-11, New Mexico has won four consecutive games against in-state rival New Mexico State. The Lobos have won by an average margin of 18.5 points.
- Lobos LB **Dakota Cox** is the nation's second-leading tackler with 326 career stops. Cox needs 47 tackles to enter the Mountain West's top-5.
- UNM senior TB **Teriyon Gipson**, who is coming off a 181-yard rushing performance in the Lobos season opener, needs to rush for 14 yards to surpass current San Diego State head coach **Rocky Long** (2,071) on New Mexico's career rushing list. Gipson scored two rushing touchdowns on Sept. 1, which vaulted him into a tie for ninth all-time in program history with Long (21).
- The Lobos enter the second weekend of college football tied for nation's top rushing attack (Utah State), after racking up 428 yards on the ground vs. South Dakota.
- The Lobos have recorded more than 500 yards of total offense in their last three games (Air Force - 512, Arizona - 508, and South Dakota - 615).
- Over the last four years, New Mexico has registered eight kickoff returns for touchdowns, which is tied for the most in the nation with Kansas State. Additionally, UNM has returned at least one kickoff for a touchdown in six consecutive years, a streak that ranks second nationally behind Kansas State.
- UNM has seven student-athletes on its 2016 roster season that have already graduated and will be working on their post-graduate degrees while playing football this fall: OL **Garrett Adcock** (biology), QB **Austin Apodaca** (liberal arts), LB **Dakota Cox** (business administration), TE **Cole Gautsche** (administration), S **Daniel Henry** (business administration), OL **Jack Lamm** (business administration) and DL **Jack Ziltz** (liberal arts).
- In its last 10 home games, the Aggies have compiled a 1-9 record dating back to 2014.
- New Mexico State head coach Doug Martin is one of six Division I head coaches to also hold an offensive coordinator title.
- New Mexico State RB Larry Rose III became the first back-to-back 1,000-yard rusher for the Aggies since Dennis Manns. Manns had four consecutive 1,000-yard rushing seasons from 1995-98. Rose III racked up 1,102 yards as a freshman and 1,651 yards as a sophomore.

- The Rainbow Warriors snapped a three-game home-opening losing streak last season to Colorado (28-20) and will now look to win back-to-back home openers for the first time since 2011-12. UH beat Colorado (34-17) in 2011 and Lamar (54-2) in '12.
- Since joining the Mountain West prior to the 2012 season, Hawai'i has an undefeated mark (3-0) against FCS opponents. The Rainbow Warriors have defeated UC Davis (47-27), Northern Iowa (27-24) and Lamar (54-2). Overall, UH has won 13 straight games against FCS foes. The last loss to an FCS team came on Sept. 9, 2000 vs. Portland State (45-20), a game in which first-year head coach **Nick Rolovich** made his UH debut at QB.
- The Rainbow Warriors have rattled off four straight nonconference home victories (Louisiana-Monroe, UC Davis, Colorado and Northern Iowa). Their last nonconference home loss was against Oregon State (38-30) on Sept. 6, 2014.
- The 114 points the Rainbow Warriors have surrendered in the opening two contests are the most in a two-game stretch since 2012. That year, UH allowed 69 points by Nevada and then 47 by BYU (116).
- Hawai'i kicker **Rigoberto Sanchez** nailed a career-long 55-yard field goal at Michigan on Sept. 10. This kick was just one-yard shy of the school-record, a 56-yarder by Jason Elam (1992) and Justin Ayat (2004).
- The Rainbow Warriors have produced a 100-yard rusher in five of their last six games.
- Tennessee-Martin is 1-21 all-time against FBS squads, with the lone victory coming against Memphis (20-17) in 2012.
- UT-Martin TB Jaimiee Bowe became just the fourth Skyhawk to rush for at least 100 yards against a FBS opponent in school history with 102 yards last week at Cincinnati. It also marked the first 100-yard rushing effort of his career.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- Fresno State head coach **Tim DeRuyter**, who is in his fifth season with the Bulldogs, is 3-1 in home openers. Since 2000, Fresno State has lost two home openers, both coming against ranked opponents (No. 10 Wisconsin and No. 21 Nebraska).
- Dating back to 1982, the Bulldogs are 26-1 against FCS opponents. DeRuyter is 4-0 against FCS foes and has a 26.0 margin of victory.
- On Sept. 10 at Nebraska, Fresno State wide receivers **Aaron Peck** (9) and **KeeSean Johnson** (8) combined for 17 of the Bulldogs 24 receptions. Both reception marks were career highs for Peck and Johnson.
- Bulldogs redshirt freshman QB **Chason Virgil** made his second career start in Week 1 at Nebraska. Virgil completed 17 passes for 133 yards and a touchdown.
- Sophomore WR **Jamire Jordan** has a reception in 13 consecutive games. The 2015 MW freshman leader in receptions, yards and touchdowns hauled in five receptions for 52 yards against Nebraska.
- Under DeRuyter, the Bulldogs have won the turnover battle 25 times, winning 17 of those contests. In Week 1, Fresno State lost the turnover battle throwing two interceptions.
- Sacramento State was upset by Western Oregon last week 38-30. Western Oregon competes in the NCAA Div. II Great Northwest Athletic Conference.
- Hornet QB Nate Ketteringham threw for 370 yards and three touchdowns in the loss to Western Oregon.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- San Diego State's 11-game win streak is its longest since 1968-70 when the Aztecs rattled off 21 straight victories. During the current win streak, SDSU has won 10 games by at least 14 points. Additionally, the Aztecs have a six-game win streak at Qualcomm Stadium.
- Aztecs senior RB **Donnel Pumphrey** is the nation's active leader in rushing yards with 4,370 yards. He needs 220 rushing yards to surpass Marshall Faulk for the program record. More information about where he stacks up in the MW record book can be found on page 4.
- San Diego State has won 23 straight games when rushing for at least 200 yards, and is 31-2 in the **Rocky Long** era when reaching 200-plus yards. SDSU had rushed for 200 yards in 10 straight contests before posting just 170 yards last week against New Hampshire.
- The Aztecs threw for 291 yards against New Hampshire, the most by a SDSU squad since Nov. 21, 2014 vs. Air Force (326).
- San Diego State has held its opponent under 400 yards of total offense in 12 straight games, trailing only Wisconsin (13) for the FBS lead.
- The Aztecs haven't thrown an interception in 13 games (at California, Sept. 12, 2015). Over that time, SDSU has logged 251 pass attempts, the longest active streak nationally.
- In July, the preseason All-Mountain West team was announced and the Aztecs had all three individual award winners. Pumphrey earned preseason offensive player of the year, **Damontae Kazee** was named defensive player of the year and **Rashaad Penny** was special teams player of the year. SDSU is the first MW team with all preseason honorees since 2010 when TCU QB Andy Dalton, LB Tank Carder and punt/kick returner Jeremy Kerley earned the recognition.
- The San Diego State game will be Cal's third straight contest against a Mountain West opponent. The Golden Bears defeated Air Force (55-36) in the 2015 Armed Forces Bowl and Hawai'i in the 2016 season opener in Australia (51-31).

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- Boise State has won 14 consecutive home openers dating back to a 42-20 loss to Washington State on Sept. 8, 2001.
- Broncos RB **Jeremy McNichols** has scored a touchdown in 13 consecutive games, which is a Mountain West record.
- Boise State has defeated a Power 5 institution in four of five seasons since joining the Mountain West. The Broncos host Washington State this week and travel to Oregon State in Week 3.
- Since 2010, the Broncos have compiled a 9-5 record against current Power 5 programs. Boise State has defeated Arizona, Arizona State, Georgia, Oregon State, Utah, Virginia and Washington in that time.
- Since 2000, the Broncos have the nation's best home win percentage (.941). In that time, Boise State has compiled a 96-6 home record.
- Sophomore QB **Brett Rypien** became the only Boise State player in program history to throw for at least 300 yards in a season opener when he threw for 347 yards on Sept. 3 at Louisiana.
- In 2015, the Broncos were one of two FBS teams to finish in the top 20 in scoring offense and defense, joining Houston in both categories. Boise State scored 39.1 points per game, while only allowing 20.2.
- Senior WR **Thomas Sperbeck** has racked up 2,459 career receiving yards. He needs 269 yards to enter Boise State's top 5 list for career receiving yards and 605 to take the top spot away from Titus Young (3,063, 2007-10).
- Washington State owns a 7-4 record against Mountain West opponents, including a 4-0 mark over Boise State.
- Washington State had 10 players record a catch last week against Eastern Washington. The Cougars had 10+ players catch a pass in all 13 games last season.



MW BOWL SYNOPSIS

The number of postseason appearances for the Mountain West will be driven by on-the-field performance, starting with the opportunity to play in the national semifinals or another New Year's Day bowl game as part of the College Football Playoff arrangement. The highest-rated champion from among the five non-contracted conferences (American, C-USA, MAC, MW, Sun Belt, or chosen by the playoff selection committee) is guaranteed a slot in the system. In the 17 seasons since the league's inception, the Mountain West's champion or a current MW member has secured that position 12 times, placing teams in the Fiesta (3), Rose and Sugar (2) Bowls during that period.

The MW also has agreements with six (6) different bowl games that in any given year will generate as many as six (6) postseason opportunities for its member institutions. These include primary positions in some or all years with the NOVA Home Loans Arizona Bowl, Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Bowl, Famous Idaho Potato Bowl, Gildan New Mexico Bowl, Royal Purple Las Vegas Bowl, San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl and Hawai'i Bowl - and a secondary position with the Cactus Bowl.

The Mountain West will collaborate with the bowl partners to place all eligible teams with consideration given to matchup, geography and historical considerations (e.g., last time a team participated in any bowl or a particular bowl). NOTE: The MW is the primary backup for the Ticket City Cactus Bowl if the Big 12 or Pac-12 does not fill.

ABOUT THE COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF

In its third season, the College Football Playoff format remains unchanged: top four teams, two semifinals played in bowl games, and the national championship game played in a different city every year. Each semifinal will be played during the New Year's holiday with the national championship game in prime time on a Monday night at least a week later.

THE SELECTION COMMITTEE

A selection committee will choose the four teams for the playoff based on their performances during the regular season, including strength of schedule, head-to-head results, championships won, and other factors. The teams will be seeded so that #1 will play #4 in one semifinal and #2 will meet #3 in the other, with the winners advancing to the national championship game.

THE ROTATION

The semifinals will rotate among six different bowls, extending the experience to more fans. In the years when the bowls are not hosting semifinals, the bowls will feature eight other teams in four compelling matchups.
