LOBOS AIMING FOR NCAA₅ AS THEY HOST NCAA MOUNTAIN REGIONALS

For the second year in a row, the University of New Mexico cross country team is hosting the NCAA Mountain Regional Championships this Friday as they eye capturing bids to the NCAA Championships.

The No. 1 Lobo women, who have won every meet they're run at this year, have all but secured their berth to next week's national championships, but the Lobo men can stake their claim this week at the UNM North Golf Course.

UNM has qualified both teams to the NCAA Championships six years in a row, with six straight NCAA appearances for the women and five consecutive for the men.

With both teams expected to compete in arguably one of the most difficult fields of the NCAA's slate of regional championships, the Lobos will rely on their solid regular-season credentials.

The women collected a number of résumé-building performances via wins at the Notre Dame Invitational, the Wisconsin adidas Invitational and the Mountain West Championship.

By dint of those showings, the women have essentially guaranteed their spot at the NCAA Championships next week in Louisville.

The top two teams at the nine regional meets automatically advance to the NCAA Championships. After that, the NCAA will chose at-large teams based their wins over other teams and their 'A' squads to fill out the 31-team roster.

The top-ranked Lobo women will look to **Courtney Frerichs**, **Rhona Auckland Calli Thackery** and **Molly Renfer** to continuing leading the women. That group, along with **Alice Wright**, who has the weekend off in anticipation for the NCAAs, has scored at every meet this season for the Lobos.

UNM can also look to **Lindsey Andrews**, **Whitney Thornburg** and **Natasha Bernal** for strong runs. The Lobos can only run seven at this meet, and is giving some runners a race off before a potential run at a national title.

For the men, they'll need to continue improving in order to have a chance to qualify.

After placing ninth at Notre Dame, the men were 23rd at Wisconsin and fifth at the MW meet. But the men improved meet by meet, if not by finish,

by experience.

The men's team will lean on **Elmar Engholm**, **Dan Milechman** and **Graham Thomas** for strong runs. Like the women's fearsome fivesome, that trio has been the frontrunners for the men. But finding low finishes from **Matt Bergin**, **Zac Castillo**, **Josh Kerr** and **Taylor Potter** will be key.

WE'RE NO. 1! WE'RE NO. 1!

New Mexico women's cross country opened as the top-ranked team in the nation in the first regular-season USTFCCCA Coaches' Poll. The Lobo women have held that rank for the entire season heading into the regional championships, earning all 12 first-place vote for the fourth straight poll.

It's the highest ranking ever for the women's team, and makes the squad the first women's athletic team in New Mexico history to be ranked No. 1 in the country in their sport's respective poll.

UNM is also the only current member of the Mountain West to ever have either it's men's or women's team ranked No. 1 in the USTFCCCA National Cross Country Poll. Former member BYU is the only other institution with MW ties to ever claim the top rank in cross country.

It's the 30th-straight poll that the New Mexico women's team was ranked in the national poll.

The Lobos' previous high in the poll was No. 2, which they achieved in this season's preseason poll and in four weeks in 2011.

LIFE AT THE TOP

For six straight polls, the U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association has ranked New Mexico women's cross country No. 1. Outside the preseason poll (where the Lobos owned eight of the 12 first-place vote and were

just eight points behind then-No. 1 Iowa State), the Lobo women have been the top team in every poll since mid September.

The last time a women's cross country team started the regular season ranked No. 1 and held that ranking for six straight polls was in 2010, when the Villanova women were tabbed No. 1 in the preseason and held that ranking through a national title.

In fact, including the UNM women, there have been a dozen instances of a team starting the regular season ranked No. 1 and holding that spot for the every regular-season poll.

In four of those instances, (Villanova, 2010; Stanford, 2006 & 2007; BYU, 2002), that team won the national title that year.

New Mexico is the second team in MW history to accomplish that, along with former conference member BYU (1998, which was technically in the Western Athletic Conference, and 2002).

LAST TIME OUT: WOMEN WIN 8TH STRAIGHT MOUNTAIN WEST TITLE

Placing seven runners in the top 12, No. 1 New Mexico women's cross country captured its eighth-straight team title in a resounding win at the 2015 Mountain West Cross Country Championships Friday, Oct. 30, in Reno, Nev.

The Lobos torched the course at the Montr eux Golf Club, scoring 24 team points, besting runner-up and ninth-ranked Boise State 24-71. The UNM men placed fifth as a team, breaking its streak of six consecutive team titles.

Courtney Frerichs led the charge, taking runner-up honors in 22 minutes, 5.19 seconds. Alice Wright was UNM's next scorer, as she led a pack of Lobos from fourth to eighth place. Wright finished fourth in 22:24.42, ahead of Rhona Auckland (fifth, 22:39.98), Molly Renfer (sixth, 22:54.01) and Calli Thackery (seventh, 22:55.14).

All five also claimed First-Team All-Mountain West honors, the first time since 2002 five teammates earned first-team honors.

Heleene Tambet almost made a bid for a scoring finish, too, placing eighth in 22:55.47, just .33 seconds behind Thackery. Emily Hosker-Thornhill was 12th in 23:32.02, followed by Sophie Connor (26th, 24:26.77) and Natasha Bernal (30th, 24:41.65).

For the men, first-team All-MW performer Elmar Engholm took sixth in 26:43.73, leading the Lobos to a team score of 120 points.

Dan Milechman, who earned second-team all-conference honors, placed 11th (27:03.44), with Graham Thomas (26th, 27:56.26), Josh Kerr (37th, 28:16.58) and Zac Castillo (47th, 29:03.35) rounding out the Lobos' scoring. Jesus Mendoza (54th, 29:23.78) and Matt

Bergin (DNF) also ran for New Mexico.

RUNNING AWAY TO VICTORY

No. 1 Lobo women's cross country won the 2015 Mountain West Cross Country Championships with a dominant 24-point performance. No. 9 Boise State finished second behind top-ranked New Mexico, scoring 71 points in the low-score-wins format.

The Lobos' 47-point victory over the Broncos is the largest since now-departed member BYU registered a 51-point win over New Mexico, 23-74, in 2005.

YOU GET AN HONOR, AND YOU GET AN HONOR

The group of Courtney Frerichs, Alice Wright, Rhona Auckland, Calli Thackery and Molly Renfer have been the fab five for No. 1 UNM women's cross country this season.

The group added to their accolades at the 2015 Mountain West Cross Country Championships, as all five finished 2-4-5-6-7.

All five claimed First-Team All-Mountain West honors, the first time since 2002 five teammates earned first-team honors.

However, those five weren't the only ones taking home some hardware. Heleene Tambet almost scored for the Lobos, placing eighth, while Emily Hosker-Thornhill was 12th. They both were named Second-Team All-MW.

It's the first time since 2009 that seven women runners earned all-conference honors. Last to do it: UNM.

THE 8-TO-5 ADVANTAGE

No. 1 Lobo women's cross country placed seven runners in the top 12 at the 2015 Mountain West Cross Country Championships, with another two finishing 26th and 30th.

Although UNM won the meet 24-71 over No. 9 Boise State, New Mexico could have won if it scored eight runners vs. the Broncos five.

UNM's top eight finishers combined to score 70 points, which would have won the championship against any other teams' five scorers.

WINNING WISCONSIN

The Lobos women has little trouble winning the Wisconsin adidas Invitational on Oct. 16, claiming the team title with a team score of 32 points. That total was fueled by all five scorers placing top 10, with Courtney Frerichs (4th), Rhona Auckland (5th), Calli Thackery (6th), Alice Wright (7th) and Molly Renfer (10th).

Whitney Thornburg (50th) and Heleene Tambet (73rd) also ran for the women.

Then-No. 11 Arkansas took second place with 188 points, 156 points behind the Lobos.

That domination of the top regular-season meet was of historic proportions:

- New Mexico's 32-point score obliterated the previous meet record of 78 points that was set by Duke in 2009.
- New Mexico could have scored all seven of their runners vs. every other team's five and still won the meet.
- Renfer, the Lobos' final scorer, finished the women's six-kilometer race in front of 25 teams' top finisher.

FRERICHS NAMED MOUNTAIN WEST ATHLETE OF THE WEEK

The Mountain West named New Mexico cross country runner **Courtney Frerichs** as the MW Women's Cross Country Athlete of the Week for meets contested from Oct. 2-3.

Frerichs, a senior from Nixa, Mo., by way of UMKC, placed second overall and guided the top-ranked Lobo women to a team victory at the Joe Piane Notre Dame Invitational this past Friday in Notre Dame, Ind.

In her first race at New Mexico, Frerichs finished with a time of 16 minutes, 27 seconds over the five-kilometer course at the Burke Golf Course, her fastest time over a 5K cross country course in her collegiate career.

She moved from fourth place to runner up in the final kilometer, running her final kilometer in 3:08.66 to finish behind USTFCCA National Athlete of the Week Ryen Frazier of NC State.

Her performance led New Mexico's scoring five, as all five runners placed in the top 12 at the meet. UNM's team score of 29 points was the lowest at the Notre Dame Invitational in three years.

It's Frerichs' first Mountain West honor, but she claimed five weekly honors racing for UMKC in the Western Athletic Conference.

THE POWER OF THREE: MOUNTAIN WEST EDITION

With UNM women's cross country taking third at the 2014 NCAA Championships (which is the program record), New Mexico is the only school in the current configuration of the Mountain West to have any team in any conference-sponsored sport place top three at any NCAA Championship in conference history.

In other words, since the founding of the Mountain West in 1999, no athletic team from any of the current conference schools have placed top three in a NCAA Championship in a sport sponsored by the conference.

A handful of former MW teams did place top-three at a conference-sponsored NCAA championship, including:

- BYU women's cross country (1st in 1999, 2000 & 2003, 2nd in 2001 & 2002)
- TCU baseball (3rd in 2010)
- BYU men's golf (4th in 2005)

- BYU men's track (3rd indoors in 2011 & 4th outdoors in 2005)
- BYU women's track: 3rd outdoors in 2009 & 4th outdoors in 2000

THE POWER OF THREE: NEW MEXICO EDITION

The Lobos women's third-place finish is also significant in the history of the university, too. Only two other current athletic team at the University of New Mexico—men's soccer and skiing—can beat the third-place showing women's cross country produced. In fact, since skiing in a co-ed sport, women's cross country is the only women's program at UNM to place top three at an NCAA Championship.

UNM men's soccer was second in 2005 and tied for third in 2013, while Lobo skiing was third six times (1984, 1993, 1994, 2009, 2010, 2014), second twice (1992, 2006) and won it all once (2004).

PUTTING SIX STRAIGHT NCAA QUALIFICATIONS IN PERSPECTIVE

The Lobos have qualified both the men and women to six straight NCAA Championships, dating back to 2009. It's one of three active streaks in the NCAA, along with Colorado and Stanford.

However, New Mexico's NCAA qualification streak is historic. There have been 21 distinct instances of a school qualifying both its men's and women's team for five straight years, and only 14 instances of streaks extending to six year.

UNM's streak is tied for the eighth longest streak in Division I history, tied with Colorado's current streak. Consequently, New Mexico's run of qualifications is tied for the second-longest current streak.

LOBO CROSS COUNTRY AND TRACK RACKING UP THE TITLES

UNM has done pretty well for itself at the conference championships in cross country, indoor track & field and outdoor track & field, winning 14 of the last 16 Mountain West Cross Country Championships and sweeping the last two Mountain West Indoor Track & Field Championships.

Since the 2009-10 season, New Mexico has won 19 of a possible 36 Mountain West titles between cross country and track & field. By comparison, only one other FBS schools, Arkansas, has won more conference titles as an FBS school in the same span.
