NEW MEXICO AIMING FOR MORE SUCCESS AT NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS

Every November since 2008, the Lobos have competed against the nation's elite on the highest stage of collegiate cross country.

During that span, they've also cemented themselves as one of the best.

The second-ranked New Mexico women's cross country team heads to the NCAA Championships looking for another top-10 finish, with designs on also challenging for the national title behind its talented cast of runners.

Along with men's runner Josh Kerr, who qualified as an individual, the Lobos have the potential for some tremendous results on Saturday when they race at E.P. 'Tom' Sawyer State Park in Louisville, Kentucky.

The women run at 8:45 a.m. MT, while Kerr toes the line at 9:45 a.m. MT.

The same site of the UNM women's NCAA championship in 2015, head coach **Joe Franklin** and his harriers hope a return to Louisville produces some more stellar results.

The Lobo women, who have placed top 10 at every national championship since 2010 for the nation's longest active streak, are among the favorites for the team title.

But New Mexico will be facing off against a stacked field, including No. 1 Colorado — which has handed UNM its only two losses this season — and No. 3 San Francisco.

However, the Lobos can counter with their own talented roster, which includes some runners eyeing the individual title.

Ednah Kurgat, the reigning NCAA Mountain Region Female Athlete of the Year, can contend for the individual crown, having won every races she's run this season.

Along with **Alice Wright**, a two-time regional athlete of the year herself, **Weini Kelati** and **Charlotte Prouse**, UNM has the low sticks needed to have a chance for the team title.

Additionally, **Alex Buck**, **Kieran Casey**, **Alondra Negrón Texidor**, **Sophie Eckel**, **Sarah Lavery** and **Kendall Kelly** can all contribute.

While New Mexico's top four runners have been largely consistent all year, getting a strong finish from its No. 5 runner may very well determine the title race.

For Kerr, he'll be making his first NCAA appearance in cross country. A two-time national champion on the track (mile indoors and 1,500-meter run outdoors), Kerr is nonetheless familiar with high-level NCAA competition.

He is the first individual qualifier for New Mexico since Jeremy Johnson in 2007.

PUTTING 10 STRAIGHT NCAA QUALIFICATIONS IN PERSPECTIVE

Behind the trio of **Ednah Kurgat**, **Weini Kelati** and **Charlotte Prouse**, the New Mexico women's cross country team placed second at the NCAA Mountain Region Championships on November 10. That finish merited a berth at the 2017 NCAA Championships in Louisville.

The Lobo women have now qualified to 10 straight NCAA Championships, dating back to 2008. It's one of six active streaks by a women's team in the NCAA that has reached at least a decade.

UNM's run is also one of just 14 streaks in Division I history to reach at least 10 years, and ranks as the sixth longest current streak in Division I history.

Of the 10 longest active streaks, New Mexico and Providence are the only schools from a non-Power 5 conference.

KURGAT NAMED MOUNTAIN REGION ATHLETE OF THE YEAR

The U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association named **Ednah Kurgat** as the NCAA Division I Mountain Region Women's Athlete of the Year on November 14.

Kurgat, a sophomore from Eldoret, Kenya, won in the individual race at the NCAA Mountain Region Championships on Friday, November 10, completing the six-kilometer course at the Steve & Dona Reeder Cross Country Course in Logan, Utah in 20:01.4.

For the fourth time in as many races this season, Kurgat claimed the individual title. But this race had additional implications, as Kurgat's finish helped power the second-ranked Lobo women to their 10th-straight NCAA appearance.

The New Mexico women placed second at the Mountain Regional, their fourth top-two finish this season.

As a result, Kurgat earned her first-ever Regional Athlete of the Year honor, adding to her Mountain West Female Athlete of the Year selection in October.

The award, as voted on by the Division I coaches, is the fourth received by any Lobo athlete in program history, with all four coming since 2013.

Along with Kurgat, **Alice Wright** (2014 and 2016) and **Sammy Silva** (2013) earned the honor. Kurgat is also just the fourth Lobo ever to win a women's region race after Wright, Silva and Lisa Mitchell (1981).

Additionally, Kurgat also earned All-Region honors for her performance, along with teammates **Weini Kelati** and **Charlotte Prouse**.

Men's runner and individual NCAA qualifier **Josh Kerr** was also earned All-Region honors.

THE TOP-TEN STREAK

Although the New Mexico women's cross country team won the NCAA title in 2015, the Lobos aren't a one-hit wonder.

During head coach **Joe Franklin's** tenure in Albuquerque, the UNM women have qualified to 10 straight NCAA Championships, including the 2017 meet. But since 2010, the Lobo women have placed top-10 at every NCAA Championships, too.

UNM's streak of top-10 finishes at the NCAA Championships is the longest active streak and is tied for the seventh-longest in NCAA history.

A DECADE OF WINNING

Since 2008, only one NCAA Division I women's cross country team has won 10 consecutive conference titles.

That team? The University of New Mexico women.

The second-ranked Lobo women's cross country team captured its 10th straight league title, when it won the 2017 Mountain West Cross Country Championships on Friday, October 27 at the UNM North Golf Course in Albuquerque.

New Mexico's 10-year run is the longest active streak among in all of Division I women's cross country. It also ranks as the third longest winning streak by a women's team in Division I history.

The next longest active streak is the Eastern Kentucky women's six straight Ohio Valley Conference wins.

Among all active streak, regardless of gender, the Lobo women's run of 10 straight ranks fourth. The Iona men have won 27 straight Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference titles, while the William & Mary men have won 18 straight Colonial Athletic Association championships and the Eastern Kentucky men 12 straight OVC titles.

Lobos also the third longest run of consecutive titles in Mountain West history. Out of the 15 sports the league sponsors, the Lobo women's streak of nine straight is virtually unparalleled.

BYU owns the record with 12 straight titles in men's outdoor track & field (2000-11), while also sitting with a nine-year streak in men's indoor track & field (2003-11).

The New Mexico women have racked up the All-American honors during their run of top-10 finishes, amassing 14 since 2010.

However, the UNM women own the longest streak in any women's sport sponsored by the MW and the longest active streak in any league sport.

POLL POSITION

New Mexico women's cross country maintained its No. 2 ranking in the pre-NCAA Championship edition of the U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCA) National Coaches Poll, the association announced on November 13.

The Lobos earned four of a possible 12 first-place votes, holding steady behind No. 1 Colorado, which earned the other eight first-place votes.

New Mexico's No. 2 ranking is the team's best since occupying the same position in the third regular-season poll of 2016. Since the start of the 2015 season, the Lobo women have been ranked top-three in 19 of 24 polls and top-two in 15 of 24 polls.

This is also the 47th consecutive poll in which the UNM women have been ranked.

Colorado owns 356 points to lead the poll, with New Mexico earning 351, a three-point increase over the last release on Halloween.

San Francisco moved up to No. 3 with 334 points, while Stanford (309 points) and North Carolina State (305) rounding out the top five.

HE'S GOING TO NEED ANOTHER OFFICE TO FIT ALL OF HIS TROPHIES

New Mexico head coach Joe Franklin became the head cross country/track & field coach at Butler University in the fall of 1994.

Now in his 24th cross country season, he was named the Mountain West Women's Coach of the Year for 2017 after coaching the Lobo women to their 10th straight conference crown.

But if we look at the totality of Franklin's career, this isn't his first conference coach of the year honor. And it's not even close.

While at Butler, he was named the conference coach of the year for both genders in 1998, 1999, 2000, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2006. That 16 such honors.

He then arrived at New Mexico in the fall of 2007 and has earned MW women's coach of the year in 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015 and 2017 (another nine) and then MW men's coach of the year in 2009, 2011, 2012,

Having won this season at the Joe Piane Notre Dame & Nuttycombe Wisconsin invitationals and MW Championships, Kurgat added a 4th victory at the NCAA Mountain Regionals.

2013 and 2014 (another five).

All together, over his 24-year coaching career, Franklin has been named conference coach of the year 30 times out of a possible 48 opportunities. That's good for a 66 percent rate.

YOU GET AN HONOR, AND YOU GET AN HONOR

The group of **Ednah Kurgat**, **Alice Wright**, **Weini Kelati** and **Charlotte Prouse** have been the fab four for the UNM women's cross country this season.

The group added to their accolades at the 2017 Mountain West Cross Country Championships, as all four finished in the top five, with Kurgat winning, Kelati placing second, Prouse third and Wright fifth.

All four claimed First-Team All-Mountain West honors, the first time at least four teammates accomplished that since the Lobos had five claim the honor in 2015.

However, those four weren't the only ones taking home some hardware. **Sophie Eckel** also scored for the Lobos, placing 11th, while **Alex Buck** just missed out on a scoring finish, placing 12th. However, they both were named Second-Team All-MW.

It's the first time since the Lobos' magical 2015 season that at least six women runners earned all-conference honors.

LOBOS SWEEP MOUNTAIN WEST SUPERLATIVE AWARDS

After the New Mexico women won their 10th straight Mountain West title on October 27, they added some more hardware by sweeping the MW superlative awards.

Ednah Kurgat earned the team's second straight Mountain West Women's Athlete of the Year honor, while **Weini Kelati** captured MW Freshman of the Year. Head coach **Joe Franklin** made it a sweep as he earned MW Women's Coach of the Year.

For Kurgat, she claimed Athlete of the Year after winning her third race in as many tries, covering of the women's 6K course in 19:58.77.

Having already won this season at the Joe Piane Notre Dame and Nuttycombe Wisconsin invitationals, Kurgat added another victory as she broke away from her competition for a 13-second win. She is UNM's second straight women's titlist/athlete of the year, joining 2016 champ **Alice Wright**.

Kelati earned her honor after finishing second overall in 20:11.63. She is the first Freshman of the Year selection for New Mexico since Lacey Oeding in 2008, and is just the fourth women's freshman in league history to place top two at the championship, joining Oeding, Boise State's Allie Ostrander (2015) and BYU's Kassi Andersen (2002).

Franklin added his ninth MW Coach of the Year honor, as well, making UNM the first team to sweep Athlete, Freshman and Coach of the Year since Colorado State in 2007.

WRIGHT ON TIME

The Mountain West has hosted 18 championships in women's cross country, with hundreds of runners competing in the meet's history. But only one has earned First-Team All-Mountain West honors four straight year.

That runner? **Alice Wright**.

The redshirt senior has claimed First-Team honors — bestowed to the top seven finishers — every single year, finishing fourth in 2014 and 2015, first in 2016 and finally fifth in 2017.

Former teammate and All-American Calli Thackery came close to matching that streak of consistent success during her time in Albuquerque, finishing in the top seven three times. However, Thackery was one spot late her freshman year, finishing eighth.

In the men's championship, only once has an athlete earned First-Team All-Conference honors four straight years: BYU's Dustin Bybee, who did it in 2004, 2005, 2006 and 2007. Another BYU runner, Josh Rohatinsky, did it in 2000, 2004, 2005 and 2006, but didn't pull off the feat in consecutive years because of his Mormon mission.

KURGAT NAMED NATIONAL, MW ATHLETE OF THE WEEK

For the second time this season, **Ednah Kurgat** was named the U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCCA) NCAA Division I Women's Athlete of the Week.

That honor, which she received October 16, came a day before she earned Mountain West Women's Cross Country Athlete of the Week honor. It's the second time this season she completed the weekly award sweep.

Kurgat helped lead the UNM women to a win at the Nuttycombe Wisconsin Invitational Presented by Under Armour on Oct. 13, winning her second individual title of the season.

Just two weeks after capturing the individual title at the Joe Plane Notre Dame Invitational, Kurgat won the six-kilometer race at the Thomas Zimmer Championship Cross Country Course with a time of 19 minutes, 23.2 seconds.

The leader from virtually the start, Kurgat led at every intermediate split before running away from the competition over the final half of the race. She earned the victory by over 16 seconds, with Utah's Grayson Murphy finishing second in 19:39.4.

Kurgat's title also helped the UNM women to head-to-head wins over 15 other teams ranked in the USTFCCCA National Coaches' poll.

Kurgat, New Mexico's first-ever individual winner at Wisconsin, registered the best time ever by a female Lobo runner at the meet. She just missed the course record of 19:19.5 set by Boise State's Allie Ostrander in 2015.

With Kurgat's victory, the Mountain West has produced the individual titlist at Wisconsin each of the last three years, with Boise State's Brenna Peloquin and Ostrander winning the last two years.

Kurgat is also the first Lobo to win back-to-back meets since teammate Alice Wright won the Mountain West and NCAA Mountain Region championships in 2016.

Kurgat earned her first National Athlete of the Week honor after Notre Dame. She is the first female Division I athlete with two in a season since Peloquin did it last season.

IF THE PRICE IS WRIGHT

Alice Wright, a three-time cross country All-American, is one of the most decorated runners in program history.

But she's also one of the most consistent at every level, placing at the top 20 at 15 straight cross country meets.

That streak, which includes the 2014, 2015 and 2016 national championships, is unmatched on the team.

In fact, over her 19-race cross country career at New Mexico, Wright has placed outside the top 20 just twice: her first race as a true freshman at Notre Dame in 2013 and at the 2014 Wisconsin Invitational.

She's won three times in her career (2016 MW Championships, 2014 and 2016 NCAA Mountain Regionals) and has placed within the top 10 on 15 different occasions.

LAST TIME OUT: WOMEN EARN NCAA BID AT MOUNTAIN REGIONAL

Ednah Kurgat won her fourth meet in as many tries this season at the NCAA Mountain Region Championships, helping power the second-ranked New Mexico women to their 10th-consecutive berth at the NCAA Championships.

Paced by Kurgat, third-place finisher **Weini Kelati** and fifth-place finisher **Charlotte Prouse**, the Lobos took second overall at the regional meet en route to capturing one of the region's two automatic berths to the NCAA Championships.

On the men's side, the New Mexico men placed eighth as a team in the 18-team race.

Although the men likely missed a potential at-large bid by one or two positions, **Josh Kerr** captured an at-large berth as an individual.

However, the trio of Kurgat, Kelati and Prouse headlined UNM's effort, teaming up to send the Lobos back to the NCAA Championships for the 10th year in a row.

Kurgat won for the fourth consecutive meet this season, covering the six-kilometer course at the Steve & Dona Reeder Cross Country Course in 20:01.4. Kelati finished third overall in 20:05.5, while Prouse was third in 20:15.3.

Alex Buck (27th place, time of 20:57.7) and **Alondra Negrón Texidor** (34th, 21:04.3) also scored for New Mexico, with **Kieran Casey** (36th, 21:06.4) and **Sophie Eckel** (61st, 21:28.0) also running.

With three-time cross country All-American Alice Wright — the Mountain Region champ in 2014 and 2016 — training back in Albuquerque, the Lobos still managed a team score of 70

points, their best score since 50 points in 2015. No. 1 Colorado posted 62 points to win the team title in the low-score-wins format.

For the men, Kerr 15th-place performance highlighted a solid day of running. Kerr finished the men's 10-kilometer course in 15th place with a time of 30:43.5.

Behind Kerr, was **Alexander Palm**, who placed 42nd in 31:26.9. Also scoring for the men were **Jonny Glen** (61st, 32:07.3), **Jacob Simonsen** (62nd, 32:08.0) and **Linton Taylor** (80th, 32:34.5).

Jared Garcia (87th, 32:44.7) and **Tyler Valdez** (111th, 33:49.0) also ran for the Lobos, who scored 260 points..

KURGAT NAMED NATIONAL, MW ATHLETE OF THE WEEK, AGAIN

New Mexico cross country athlete **Ednah Kurgat** was named the U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCCA) NCAA Division I Women's Athlete of the Week, the organization announced Monday, October 2.

She also earned Mountain West Women's Cross Country Athlete of the Week honor on Tuesday, October 3, completing the weekly award sweep.

Running her first competitive cross country race as an attached collegian since the 2015 NCAA Championships, Kurgat won the Women's Blue Race last Friday at the Joe Plane Notre Dame Invitational in a time of 16:01.8.

Kurgat, a sophomore from Eldoret, Kenya, by way of Liberty University, helped lead the No. 3 New Mexico women to a second-place finish, just four points behind No. 1 Colorado (51-47).

The Lobos earned four wins over other teams ranked in the USTFCCCA poll as they earned their eighth-straight top-four performance at Notre Dame.

She won by 10.2 seconds over teammate and runner up Alice Wright.

Kurgat's final time also set a new race record over a full five-kilometer course, eclipsing Notre Dame's Anna Rohrer's best of 16:11.7, which Rohrer ran last year.

New Mexico's Charlotte Arter had the race's all-time, all-conditions best of 16:09.3, but that race was shortened by about 150 meters due to poor conditions. Arter was also the last Lobo to win at Notre Dame, and she was the last Lobo to earn National Athlete of the Week in cross country.

GREAT ON THE GRASS, GREAT IN THE CLASSROOM

New Mexico men's and women's cross country were named Division I All-Academic teams by the U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCCA).

Additionally, a pair of All-American from the women's team, Alice Wright and Calli Thackery, were accorded individual All-Academic honors.

After a strong 2016 cross country season last fall, which culminated in the UNM women's seventh-straight top-10 finish at the NCAA Championships, the Lobos are now being recognized for their work in the classroom.

The first honor, the USTFCCCA All-Academic Team award, recognizes teams that registered a cumulative team GPA of 3.00 or higher during the academic year.

The UNM women, with a team GPA of 3.71, were one of eight Mountain West schools to earn the honor, and were tops in the conference. The women also tied for the eighth-best GPA out of the 242 Division I institutions that were recognized.

The men's team, which combined for a 3.59 GPA, also claimed the highest GPA among the six MW men's teams that were honored. The Lobo men finished with the sixth-best GPA out of the 189 DI teams that were recognized.

Individually, UNM also produced strong academic results, as Wright and Thackery, 2016 cross country All-Americans, earned USTFCCCA All-Academic honors for their combined efforts in competition and in the classroom.

The individual award is awarded to student-athletes who posted a cumulative GPA of at least 3.25 on a 4.0 scale and finished in the top 25 finishers (or 10 percent) at regionals or as an All-American at the national meet.

LOBO WOMEN PICKED AS MW PRESEASON FAVORITES, MEN 4TH

New Mexico women's cross country was selected as the favorite to win the 2016 Mountain West women's cross country title, as voted by the league's coaches in the women's preseason coaches' poll.

The Lobo men were tied for fourth place in the men's poll, which the MW released in conjunction with the women's poll on August 31.

It's the seventh straight year that the Lobo women were picked as the preseason favorite, mirroring the team's seven-straight top-10 finishes at the NCAA Championships.

The New Mexico women captured the top spot in the preseason poll by earning 100 points and 10 of the 11 first-place votes.

The Boise State women scored the other first-place vote and 89 total points to place second, while Air Force registered 81 total points to place third. Colorado State (71 points), Utah State (61), Nevada (56), Wyoming (53), San José State (33), Fresno State (25), San Diego State (20) and UNLV (16) claimed fourth place through 11th, respectively.

In the men's poll, the Lobos tallied 28 points to tie Utah State for fourth. Colorado State earned the top spot with five first-place votes and 46 points, with Boise State in second place with the other three first-place votes and 45 points. Air Force was tabbed third with 36 points.

Wyoming (20 points), San José State (12) and Fresno State (9) rounded out the eight-team poll, placing sixth-to-eighth, respectively.
