THE BUFFALOES: Colorado is 6-1 overall after dropping its first game of the season, 72-63, at Colorado State on Dec. 2. It was the first true road test for the Buffaloes, although CU has already played three neutral site games in winning the three-game Paradise Jam Tournament in Lynchburg, Va.

Colorado is averaging 76.3 points per game while shooting a solid 48 percent from the field. Overall the Buffaloes have been balanced in scoring with three players averaging double-figures and seven averaging between five and 16 points an outing. Defensively, Colorado is allowing 68 points per game while holding opponents to 40 percent shooting and 32 percent from 3-point range.

Colorado ranks third in the Pac-12 in scoring defense (67.7 ppg), field goal defense (.400), 3-point defense (.325) and rebounding defense (32.3 rpg). The Buffaloes are fourth in field goal percentage

and fifth in rebounding margin (+6.1).

McKinley Wright IV leads Colorado at 16.1 points and 4.1 assists per game. He had 19 points and eight rebounds at Colorado State leading the Buffaloes in scoring for the third time this season and in rebounds for the first time. Wright hit a personal best four 3-pointers while dishing out four assists. His eight rebounds were also a personal best.

Wright also leads Colorado in steals (8) and blocked shots (6) while ranking second in both overall field goal percentage (.531) and 3-point percentage (.435). He scored 19 points in the win over Air Force including a team season best 8 of 8 performance from the free throw line.

On the Pac-12 charts, Wright is 11th in assists, 14th in scoring and assist-to-turnover ratio (1.5) and 15th in 3-point percentage. He is the third in both scoring and assists and second in assist-to-turnover ratio among freshmen in the Pac-12.

George King leads Colorado in rebounding at 8.6 per game while ranking second in scoring at 15 points an outing. Over the last three games King is averaging 18.7 points and 10 rebounds while shooting 54 percent from the field.

King had back-to-back monster games, scoring 25 points with identical 9 of 13 shooting performances (.692) in wins over Air Force and Mercer.

King recorded his eighth career double-double adding a career-high 15 rebounds against Air Force. He also matched career bests with five 3-pointers made and three assists.

King had a game-high 25 points against Mercer in the championship game of the 2017 Paradise Jam. He scored back-to-back 20-point games for the third time in his career, the other two coming in 2015-16. His 50 points in a two-game span is a personal best.

On the Pac-12 charts King is fourth in overall rebounding, fifth in defensive rebounds (6.3 drpg), 10th in offensive rebounds (2.3 orgp), 15th in field goal percentage and 20th in scoring.

After beginning the season 2 of 10 (.200) from 3-point range, he has made 9 of his last 17 (.529).

Junior guard **Namon Wright** is third on the team in scoring at 11.6 points while grabbing 2.9 rebounds per game. He has been Colorado's top free throw shooter, hitting 79 percent from the foul line (27-34). Wright holds the Buffaloes' top performances this year at the line in both free throws made and attempted (9 of 11). He has made 18 of his last 21 foul shots.

Wright has back-to-back games with four assists against Air Force and Colorado State. At the Paradise Jam, Wright averaged 16 points while shooting 44 percent. He shot 83 percent from the free throw line, going 19 of 23.

Dominique Collier is averaging 5.3 points, coming off a season-best 10 at Colorado State, his 18th career game in double figures. He is third on the team in both assists and steals.

Sophomore forward **Lucas Siewert** returned to the lineup against Colorado State after missing the previous two games with an ankle injury. He is fourth on the team in rebounding at 4.2 per game while also pitching in 5.2 points a contest. He had seven points in three straight games before his injury. Siewert matched or set a personal best in rebounding in each of the first two games. Siewert tied King

for the team lead with a career high seven rebounds against Denver. He matched his previous career high with six rebounds against Northern Colorado.

Sophomore guard **Deleon Brown** is fourth on the team in scoring at 6.9 points per game and is second in steals with seven. Brown matched a season high with 13 points in the Paradise Jam championship game, reaching double figures for the fifth time in his young career. He also had 13 points in the win over Denver. He set new personal bests for field goals made and attempted (5 of 9) while also grabbing a career-high two steals. He had seven points on 3 of 5 shooting against UNC.

Colorado's freshman class is contributing early. Along with McKinley Wright, 7-0 forward **Dallas Walton** made his first career start at Colorado State for the injured **Tory Miller-Stewart**. He had a personal best six points while making all three of his field goal attempts.

Walton played only seven minutes in the Paradise Jam, but they were very important. With Siewert out, Walton made the most of his time with four points, two rebounds and his first career blocked shot against Mercer.

Tyler Bey, a 6-7, 206-pound guard/forward from Las Vegas, is averaging 4.3 points and 3.0 rebounds. He had a personal-best six rebounds at Colorado State and matched his best with six points. Bey has made 12 of his first 13 free throw attempts (.923).

Lazar Nikolic, a 6-7, 205-pound guard from Belgrade, Serbia, is averaging 2.0 points and 2.7 rebounds, coming off a season-best five-point effort against Colorado State. He grabbed six rebounds and drained his first career 3-point attempt against UNC. **D'Shawn Schwartz**, a 6-7, 223-pound guard/forward from Colorado Springs, is averaging 3.4 points and 2.0 rebounds while shooting 50 percent from the field. He matched his season high with seven points against Air Force. **Alexander Strating**, a 6-7 forward, made his Colorado debut against Denver scoring four points in the closing minutes.

THE LOBOS: New Mexico is 3-5 overall and coming off an 88-76 setback at UTEP on Dec. 2. The Lobos are averaging an impressive 86 points per game and have already hit the century mark twice this season. UNM is hitting 44 percent from the floor and 78 percent from the free throw line. New Mexico averages nearly 12 3-point field goals per game, ranking eighth in the country. Defensively, the Lobos give up 78 points an outing while allowing opponents to shoot 45 percent. New Mexico ranks sixth in NCAA Division I in turnovers forced at 20.4 per game and 10th in turnover margin at plus-6.1.

Senior Sam Logwood leads New Mexico at 16.5 points and 5.4 rebounds per game while shooting 50.5 percent from the floor and 83 percent from the free throw line. Junior guard Chris McNeal is second on the team in scoring at 15.6 points and is the team's co-leader in both 3-pointers made (23) and assists (28). Junior guard Anthony Mathis joins McNeal with a team-best 23 3-pointers while averaging 10.6 points an outing. Mathis and McNeal are a combined 46 of 101 from 3-point range (.455). Senior guard Antino Jackson matches McNeal's assists number at 28 while averaging 8.5 points per game.

Paul Weir is in his first season at New Mexico with a record of 3-5. He is 31-11 overall in his second year as a collegiate head coach.

SERIES RECORDS: This will be the 14th meeting between Colorado and New Mexico with the Lobos holding a slim 7-6 series lead. It is the first meeting since December 2010, when New Mexico defeated the Buffaloes 89-76 in Las Vegas. The Lobos have won the last three in the series, including a sweep in the last home-and-home set in 2006 and '07. Colorado's last win over New Mexico was a

77-65 decision in Albuquerque on Nov. 28, 1980. New Mexico was the opponent in Colorado's first regular season game at the Coors Events Center on Dec. 1, 1979, an 86-78 Buffaloes win.

Colorado head coach Tad Boyle is 0-1 vs. New Mexico. Paul Weir has never faced Colorado as a head coach.

FREE THROW IMPROVEMENT: Colorado is shooting 70.7 percent from the free throw line through seven games. The Buffaloes have rebounded from their opening night 11 of 25 result from the line against UNC to make 100 of 132 over the last six games (.758). Against Air Force, Colorado was 19 of 20 from the line. That effort was Colorado's best since its school record 26 of 26 game against Georgia on Dec. 28, 2013.

MILLER-STEWART OUT: Senior forward **Tory Miller-Stewart** sustained a foot injury during a practice session on Nov. 30 and is expected to be out for an indefinite period of time. Miller-Stewart was averaging 6.2 points and ranked third on the team in rebounding at 4.7 per game. Miller-Stewart had a season-high nine rebounds in the Paradise Jam win over Quinnipiac. He matched his season best of 11 points in the win over Drake, the 16th double-figure scoring game of his career.

START AMONG ALL-TIME BESTS: Colorado started the season with six straight wins for just the 11th time in team history (115th

season) and its 6-0 start tied for the seventh best start overall. The Buffaloes started 6-0 for the first time since the 2012-13.

WRIGHT IN DOUBLE FIGURES: Freshman **McKinley Wright IV** has scored in double figures in each of his first seven games after his 19-point performance against Colorado State. During that span he has hit the 20-point mark twice, with back-to-back 21-point efforts against Quinnipiac and Drake.

His seven double-figure games to begin his career are the most by a Buffalo since 2011 NBA lottery pick Alec Burks scored at least 10 points in his first 20 games in 2009-10.

PRESEASON TITLIST: Colorado claimed its seventh preseason tournament title with the 2017 Paradise Jam and just the third on a neutral court. It's the second time the Buffaloes have won a pre-season tournament with three games in three days, joining the 2002 Pepsi Classic in Charlotte, N.C. Overall, Colorado last won three games in three days, when it actually went four in four to win the 2012 Pac-12 Tournament.

This was Colorado's first stretch of playing three games in three days since the 2014 Pac-12 Tournament (2-1). The last three-game, three-day stretch during the regular season was Nov. 23-25, 2009, at the Maui Invitational (1-2).

M-IV-P PERFORMANCE: Freshman guard **McKinley Wright IV** was named the 2017 Paradise Jam Most Valuable Player by averaging 17.7 points and 6.0 rebounds while shooting 61 percent from the field (20-33). He had the game-winning 3-pointer at the buzzer in the first round vs. Quinnipiac, scoring a career-best 21 points. He matched that scoring effort in the semifinals against Drake while dishing out a team season-best nine assists against only one turnover. Wright had 11 points and dished out six assists in the championship game. He had 16 assists against just two turnovers in the final two games.

Wright is the first freshman to be named MVP in the 18-year history of the Paradise Jam.

HISTORIC COMEBACK: Colorado trailed Quinnipiac by 13 (60-47) with just under four minutes left before ending the game on a 23-9 run. It marked the largest comeback with under five minutes left in team history. The previous best was 10 coming against Wyoming on Dec. 10, 1981.

SENIOR EXPERIENCE vs. FRESH FACES: Six players made their Colorado debuts against UNC. The Buffaloes have nine players on

their roster (eight active) that had never played a minute in a Colorado uniform in a regular season game. That list includes six true freshmen and three red shirts who spent 2016-17 with the program.

Colorado's three senior regulars - **George King**, **Tory Miller-Stewart** and **Dominique Collier** - have combined for 299 career games and 145 starts. The other 12 players on the roster (11 active) have a combined 21 starts and 132 career games. Out of those 124 games, 18 of those belong to senior walk-on **Josh Repine** accounting for a total of 23 career minutes played.

NONCONFERENCE: Colorado has won 27 of its last 33 against nonconference regular season opponents. The Buffaloes have won 19 of their last 20 nonconference regular season games at the Coors Events Center.

KING'S COURT: Senior guard **George King** needs just 15 points to become the 34th member of Colorado's 1,000 point club. He currently ranks 35th in all-time scoring with 985 points.

King is tied for seventh in career 3-pointers made with 130. His 40.5 percentage from 3-point range would put him second all-time at Colorado, just behind of Mack Tuck's 40.6 from 1993-96.

King is 31st in rebounds with 490, needing 10 more to become the 29th player to reach 500.

DOM'S DIMES AND SWIPES: Senior guard **Dominique Collier** has moved into 25th in career steals with 85 and 29th in assists at

183. He is on pace to become the 16th Colorado player with 200 assists and 100 steals.

RIGHT AT HOME: Colorado has won 24 of its last 28 and 34 of 39 in the friendly confines of the Coors Events Center. In the **Tad Boyle** era, Colorado is a sparkling 104-19 at the Coors Events Center (.846). The Buffaloes are 417-170 (.710) all-time at the CEC.

FOR OPENERS: Colorado improved to 91-24 all-time in home openers and has won its last 10, making Boyle a perfect 8-0 in home openers. The Buffaloes have won 15 of their last 16. Colorado is 80-35 (.696) in all-time season openers. The Buffaloes are 6-2 under Boyle. The Buffaloes are 33-5 in overall season openers since the 1980-81 season.

AGAINST RANKED TEAMS: Colorado was 3-5 against ranked teams in 2016-17, marking the first time with three wins over ranked teams since 2012-13 (4-3 overall).

Colorado's 15 wins over ranked opponents in Boyle's six-plus seasons is by far the best streak in team history. In fact Boyle coached teams, with a record of 15-28, have accounted for 25 percent of wins over ranked opponents (59) since 1949-50.

KOUNTZ, PARQUET TO JOIN BUFFS IN 2018-19: Daylen Kountz and Elijah Parquet signed National Letters of Intent to attend and play basketball at Colorado in 2018-19. Head coach Tad Boyle made the announcement on Nov. 8, the first day of the early NCAA signing period.

Kountz is a 6-foot, 4-inch, 180-pound guard from Denver's East High School. Parquet is a 6-3 185-pound combo guard out of West Brook High School in Beaumont, Texas.

Kountz is rated as the No. 1 player in the state of Colorado by ESPN and 247Sports. He led the state in scoring as junior, helping the Angels to a spot in the 2017 Class 5A Great 8. He earned Class 5A All-State Second Team and All-USA Colorado Boys Basketball Second Team honors.

Parquet thrived on the summer circuit, helping Team S.T.A.G.E on deep tournament runs in Las Vegas, Houston and Dallas. He will be a key factor for West Brook in Texas Class 6A competition, the state's largest classification.

BATTEY TO REDSHIRT: Freshman forward **Evan Battey** will take an academic redshirt for the 2017-18 season.

A 6-8 forward from View Park, Calif., he will continue to practice and provide scout team duties for the Buffaloes for the duration of this season. He will have four years of eligibility beginning in 2018-19.

The NCAA mandated an academic redshirt for Battey after he did not meet the initial eligibility requirement of graduating from high school within four years – he repeated the ninth grade at the Los Angeles Center for Enriched Studies. Battey was not able to play basketball in 2016-17 as a senior at Villa Park High School, as the California high school governing body determined he had exhausted his eight semesters of high school eligibility.

Battey was an All-Orange County and All-Crestview League selection as a junior at Vila Park in 2015-16, averaging 24 points a game for the Spartans including a 44-point effort, second-best in a single game in school history.

Battey stayed involved with the Villa Park team for in 2016-17,

serving as a player-coach for the team's big men and junior varsity. He was part of the Spartans' team that placed second at the CIF Division III state championships. This spring, Battey was recognized by the Orange County Athletic Directors Association with its Athlete of Character Award.

BUFFS NINTH IN PRESEASON POLL: Colorado was picked to finish ninth in the annual Pac-12 Conference Preseason Media Poll.

Colorado earned 112 points, 13 votes behind Oregon State for eighth place and well ahead of 10th place Washington (71). The Buffaloes finished in sole possession of seventh place in the 2016-17 race with a record of 8-10.

Arizona was picked as the favorite for the fifth time in the past six seasons with 273 points and 22 of 23 first place votes. USC was second with 251 points, picking up one first place vote. UCLA was third (223), defending league co-champion Oregon was fourth (203) followed by Stanford (182), Arizona State (146), Utah (129) and Oregon State (125).

After Colorado, Washington was 10th with California (46) and Washington State (33) rounding out the poll.

ITALY TOUR: Colorado played four exhibition games during a 10-day tour of Italy in August 2017.

It was the perfect mix of basketball and sightseeing for the Buffaloes, touring some of the most storied locales in Italy, many ranging from 1,000 to over 2,000 years old.

The Buffaloes started their trip with four days in Rome that included tours of the Roman Colosseum, Pantheon, Trevi Fountain and the Vatican. From there it was off to Siena, Florence, Venice, Treviso and finally Lake Como.

Along the way, the travel party visited the Academia Gallery which houses Michelangelo's David, toured St. Marc's square and the waterways of Venice, enjoyed a biking tour of Treviso and a boat ride on Lake Como.

On the court, Colorado won its first three games before finishing 3-1 on the tour, an admirable record considering the inexperience of the team and the unusual circumstances surrounding the contests. The Buffaloes rarely had time to relax during the excursion, mixing in a day's worth of sightseeing before game action later in the evening.

The trip came at a perfect time for the program. Colorado enters the 2017-18 season with nine student-athletes who haven't played a minute in a Buffaloes uniform, which includes six true freshmen and three redshirts. The NCAA allows 10 full practices during the summer for teams going on summer tours. Colorado used two of those in June, and then after taking July off, had the last eight in the days before taking off for Italy.

BOULDER – Colorado seniors **George King** and **Tory Miller-Stewart** did what seniors are supposed to do Friday night.

CU freshman **McKinley Wright IV** did what Buffs fans were hoping he would do — and the combination of all three led the Buffs to a season-opening 66-51 win over Northern Colorado at the Coors Events Center.

After missing most of the first half with two fouls, King led the Buffs with 12 points — all in the second half — and nine rebounds. Miller-Stewart added 11 points and five rebounds while Wright added 10 points, four rebounds and three assists in his first game as a Buff.

All three were instrumental in a 12-0 run midway through the second half that broke open a tight game and helped Tad Boyle's crew to the double-digit win.

Andre Spight led UNC with 19 points, but was just 3-for-16 from 3-point range, part of a 6-for-37 night from long distance for the Bears.

HOW IT HAPPENED: After taking an 11-point lead into the locker room at the half, 35-24, Colorado led the Bears back in the game in a hurry after intermission. Sparked by five points from Spight, UNC went on a 13-0 run early in the half to tie the game at 37-37 barely four minutes in. The Bears, who held 21-16 rebounding edge at the half, boosted that margin to eight early in the half and with just more than 10 minutes to play, CU was clinging to a 45-44 lead.

But following a media timeout, the Buffs began to hit the boards, increase their defensive pressure and pull away. Sparked by four points from Miller-Stewart, three from King and a Wright driving layup, the Buffs carved out a 12-0 run that produced a 57-44 edge with just more than five minutes left in the game. UNC ended its drought with a Jordan Davis bucket, but King answered with a 3-pointer to bump the margin to 14, 60-46, with just more than four minutes to play.

Colorado then kept the lead in double digits for the remainder of the game, and finished with a 45-38 edge on the boards, including a 20-5 edge down the stretch.

King played just four minutes in the first half after two "silly fouls" and just one rebound to show for his effort. But he took control in the second half, finishing with 12 points on 4-for-7 shooting as well as a game-high nine rebounds, including three big boards in the decisive 12-0 run.

Wright had just four points and one rebound in the first half, but added six points and three rebounds to that total after the half, and also had a pair of big assists in the decisive run.

Colorado held double-digit leads at two different junctures in the first half but could not put the Bears away early.

CU jumped out to a quick lead, getting five quick points from Namon Wright and four from Miller-Stewart to go up 11-17 just six minutes in. CU then built the lead to double digits when **Dominique Collier** swiped a pass near midcourt and drove for a layup to bump the Buffs' edge to 23-13.

But the Buffs went cold and the Bears slowly chipped away. Spight hit five straight points in a 9-2 UNC run, and with just under four minutes to go, Colorado's edge had been cut to 25-22.

That forced a Boyle timeout and his words in the huddle evidently had an effect. The Buffs emerged to put together a 10-2 run over the final four minutes of the half, sparked by five points from **Deleon Brown**, including a 3-pointer, and a **Lucas Siewert** tray from the top of the key. **McKinley Wright** closed the half with a driving layup on a nice halfcourt pass from **Lazar Nikolic** to give the Buffs a 35-24 lead heading into intermission.

WHAT IT MEANS: The Buffs got good performances from all four true freshmen, something Boyle had been hoping to see, as well as steady performance from the three senior starters.

LYNCHBURG, Va. — One night after a furious comeback produced a buzzer-beating win over Quinnipiac, the Colorado Buffaloes withstood an opponent's rally to claim an 86-81 win over Drake on Saturday in the Paradise Jam semifinals.

The Buffs led by as many as 17 points the second half, but saw that lead whittled down to one before rebuilding their lead down the stretch.

Now 4-0, Colorado will meet 4-1 Mercer, a 78-59 winner over Drexel, in Sunday's 6:30 p.m. championship game.

CU freshman **McKinley Wright IV** just missed his first collegiate double-double, finishing with 21 points, nine assists and five rebounds. Junior **Namon Wright** added 19 points and three rebounds and senior **George King** added 14 points and seven rebounds.

Reed Timmer led Drake with 28 points, including a 16-for-18 night from the free throw line.

"Last night we didn't panic when we were down," head coach **Tad Boyle** said of his Buffs, who overcame a 13-point deficit in the final four minutes against Quinnipiac to collect a 70-69 win. "Tonight we were up and they made a run and we didn't panic. We stayed them off and I'm really proud of this team."

HOW IT HAPPENED: After taking an eight-point lead at intermission, the Buffs threatened to blow the game open early in the second half, jumping out to a 17-point lead after a Deleon Brown 3-pointer gave Colorado a 52-35 edge.

But the Bulldogs, much as they did one night earlier against Wake Forest, battled back. Drake put together a 23-7 run and with 7:54 to go in the game, the Bulldogs had cut Colorado's cushion down to one, 59-58, thanks in large part to regular trips to the free throw line. The Bulldogs were 25-for-31 from the free throw line, including 20-for-24 in the second half.

"In the second half they just started driving it and the whistles started blowing," Boyle said. "We have to do a better job with that. But it's hard to guard in college basketball now because any contact going to the rim seems like it's going to be on the defense."

The Buffs, however, regained their composure. After Drake had cut the lead to 59-58, Colorado went on an 18-9 run over the next five minutes to bump the cushion back to 10, 77-67, with just more than three minutes to go. McKinley Wright, who fouled out late in the game, had seven of the first eight points in the run, then finished it with a 3-pointer. Also getting key buckets in the surge were Namon Wright (five points) and **Tory Miller-Stewart**.

CU then kept the Bulldogs at bay down the stretch, getting buckets from **Dominique Collier** and Miller-Stewart, plus a handful of free throws in the final minute.

"They never gave up," Namon Wright said. "It was a great learning experience for us. We know how to play hard now."

Once again, the Buffs did not shoot the ball well from 3-point range. After going 4-for-20 from beyond the arc Friday, they hit just four of 17 tries Saturday. CU was also outrebounded, 32-30, but the Buffs outscored the Bulldogs 50-26 in the paint and also had an 8-0 edge on fastbreak points.

The Buffs finished with 15 assists after having just seven in Friday's 70-69 win over Quinnipiac.

Colorado led by as much as 15 in the first half when a Namon Wright layup gave CU a 31-16 edge with 6:28 to go. Colorado then went cold, going without a field goal over the last 5 minutes of the half, but still held a 39-31 edge at intermission thanks to hitting six of eight free throws in the final three minutes.

CU shot 14-for-27 from the field in the first half, but just 2-for-10 from 3-point range.

LYNCHBURG, Va. — A tournament that started Friday with a heart-stopping buzzer-beater for a win culminated Sunday with a championship, as the Colorado Buffaloes carved out a 79-70 win over Mercer in the Paradise Jam title game.

George King, named to the tourney's All-Star team, scored 25 points and grabbed eight rebounds to lead the Buffs to their third win in three nights as CU improved to 5-0 for the season. **Namon Wright** and **Deleon Brown** each added 13 points and Buffs freshman point guard **McKinley Wright IV** cemented his tournament Most Valuable Player award with 11 points, seven assists and four rebounds.

"These guys have unbelievable heart," head coach **Tad Boyle** said. "This guy (McKinley Wright) saved our bacon on Friday night and these guys have responded the next two games with unbelievable heart and desire. I've said I love this team's spirit from Day 1 and they showed it this weekend."

The Buffs indeed improved each day in the tournament. After erasing a 13-point deficit in the final four minutes Friday against Quinnipiac for a 70-69 win — capped by a McKinley Wright 3-pointer at the buzzer — they survived a Drake rally Saturday to claim an 86-81 semifinal win.

Sunday, they took the lead over Mercer for good with seven minutes to go in the first half and never trailed again.

HOW IT HAPPENED: After falling behind early by as much as seven, the Buffs slowly chipped away at Mercer's lead. Fittingly, it was a 3-point bucket from McKinley Wright at the 7:03 mark of the first half that gave them the lead for good. Colorado led by two at the half, 39-37, then slowly built a double-digit cushion, one that hit 13 points at the midway point of the second half, 64-51.

King put forth his best game of the season thus far, coming up with big baskets and rebounds and critical moments. He closed a 12-4 run that provided the big lead with a 3-pointer and a free throw, then came up with some crucial rebounds and baskets down the stretch when Mercer pulled back to within seven.

After the Buffs took their big lead, Mercer made a stab at a comeback, shaving the margin down to seven.

But with 3:34 to go, King drove inside for a basket to push the lead back to nine, 70-61. Less than a minute later, he grabbed an offensive rebound and converted it to a basket, drawing a foul in the process and hitting the free throw to bump the margin to 73-61.

Then, with just more than a minute to go, King extended a CU possession with an offensive rebound, which Namon Wright then converted into a basket for a 77-68 lead, putting the game away.

At the same time, the Buffs kept up the defensive pressure on Mercer, refusing to allow easy baskets.

Wright also had his share of crucial plays while playing the point at a level far beyond that what would normally be expected of a freshman. After hitting the game winner Friday night (he had 21 points and five rebounds vs. Quinnipiac), he scored 32 points and dished out 16 assists in the next two games — and committed just two turnovers.

Sunday, he had three of his seven assists in a 13-6 Buffs run to start the second half.

But Sunday's win was by no means a two-man show. Along with Namon Wright's 13 points, the Buffs received another solid effort off the bench from Brown. The sophomore guard had six points in a CU run midway through the half, then drew a charging call that led to a King 3-pointer and the Buffs' big lead of the night.

CU also got a nice effort from redshirt freshman big man **Dallas Walton**, who had four points and a pair of rebounds.

FORT COLLINS — Call it a learning experience for the Colorado Buffaloes — a very painful learning experience.

Down by as much as 17 points in the second half Saturday at Colorado State, the Buffs rallied to cut the deficit to four in the final minute, but could never get over the hump in a 72-63 loss to the Rams.

The loss dropped Colorado to 6-1 while CSU improved to 4-4.

CU was without the services of senior center **Tory Miller-Stewart**, who suffered a foot injury earlier this week in practice and is out for an "indefinite" amount of time, according to head coach **Tad Boyle**.

McKinley Wright IV led CU with 19 points and eight rebounds while **George King** added nine points and seven rebounds — but King hit just 3 of his 13 field goal tries as the Buffs shot just 39 percent from the field (24-for-61).

The Rams also dominated the Buffs on the boards, 46-32, and blocked nine CU shots. Despite not recording a field goal in the final seven minutes of the game, CSU managed to hold on by hitting free throws down the stretch.

"CSU beat us at our own game," Boyle said. "We want to hold our opponents to less than 40 percent, they did that to us. We want to be plus eight on the boards, they did that to us. We want to make more free throws than our opponent shoots — they did that to us. They beat us at our own game. That's disheartening and hopefully it's a learning experience for our young guys."

HOW IT HAPPENED: It was the first true road game of the year for the young Buffs, and they played like it at times in front of a raucous Moby Arena crowd. Colorado played well in spurts — CU trailed just 38-35 at the half — but the Rams broke open a tight game after intermission with an 18-7 run in the first eight minutes to open up a 56-42 edge with 11:48 to go in the game.

CSU hit the Buffs from every position on the floor in the decisive run, getting an early 3-point bucket from Prentiss Nixon before going inside for six straight points. J.D. Paige pushed the CSU lead to double digits with three free throws — the result of King's third foul — and the deficit grew to 14 on a fast-break slam dunk, then as high as 17.

The Buffs, meanwhile, hit a cold stretch. Along with King's 3-for-13 day from the field (1-for-5 from 3-point range), **Dominique Collier** was just 4-for-10 and **Namon Wright** just 2-for-9. Overall, CU hit just eight of its 25 3-point tries.

"You go on the road, you know the 3s may or may not drop," Boyle said. "You know the free throws may or may not go in. You don't do either of those two things well, your margin for error goes down significantly. We didn't do anything well enough tonight to win this game."

But, the Buffs never quit. McKinley Wright scored 11 straight points in a 1:27 span to cut CSU's lead to six with 5:26 still to play and King's only 3-pointer of the night with 2:41 to go pulled the Buffs to within five, 65-60.

Wright was spectacular in the run, hitting a pair of 3-point shots, a conventional 3-point play and a driving layup.

The Rams went the last seven minutes without a field goal, but hit just enough of their free throws to keep the Buffs at bay. Colorado cut the CSU cushion to four, 67-63, with just under a minute to go when Collier hit one of two free throws, but that was as close as the Buffs would get. The Rams then hit five of six free throws in the final minute to salt away the win.

The Buffs trailed by as much as eight in the first half after an early CSU onslaught of 3-pointers helped spur an 8-0 Rams run. But the Buffs came back with a 9-2 run, sparked by a pair of McKinley Wright 3-pointers and a George King 3-point play. Colorado then took the lead momentarily on a Dominique Collier trey, 33-32, but the Rams regained the lead just before intermission.
