HEAD COACH PAUL WEIR

On the win:

"I just told the guys now they just find ways to win. We have all year long, and I think it's a testament to our players' resiliency when you get in those moments."

"... I can't take credit. These guys in those moments have made big plays all year long, when the game has kind of been in the balance. We just seem to make big plays and I think it's a testament."

On JaQuan Lyle fouling out:

"I think long term it's a great thing for him individually to learn how to work through that. In a weird way I'm kind of happy that it happened because it forced everyone else to realize life does go on a little bit. He was the loudest member on our bench, he was coaching, and he was in every timeout trying to help us win the game. On defense:
