## Post-game Notes:

- The Lobos remain undefeated at home (10-0) and for the month of December (7-0).
  - o The last time the Lobos were 10-0 at home was during the 2009-10 season.
  - The last time UNM went 7-0 for the month of December was during the 2011-12 season.
- Four Lobos finished in double-figures: Corey Manigault (20 points, sixth game this season), Makuach Maluach (14 points, eighth game this season), Vante Hendrix (13 points, second time this season), Vance Jackson (12 points, fifth time this season) and Zane Martin (10 points, sixth time this season).
  - There have been six games this season where five Lobos have scored in double digits, and the team is currently on a three-game streak of five Lobos registering double figures.
- UNM posted a season-high 19 offensive rebounds.
  - The Lobos improve to 9-1 when outrebounding their opponent.
- The Lobos finish 2019 on an eight-game win streak that started on Nov. 26 at Barclay's Center.
- Corey Manigault posted his first double-double of the season and his third at UNM. During Sunday's game he notched 20 points and 11 rebounds.
  - This marks Manigault's third game this season scoring 20 points and his fifth at UNM.
  - He posted a new season-high 11 rebounds and tied his UNM career high, which he last posted against Colorado State on March 2, 2019.
  - Manigault notched a new UNM career-high four steals. His previous was three which he posted against McNeese on Nov. 16.
- Redshirt senior JaQuan Lyle has now accumulated 997 points during his collegiate career, just three way from 1,000 points.
- Vante Hendrix posted a UNM career-high 13 points and seven rebounds during Sunday's contest.
- The Lobos are now 9-0 when leading at the half and 7-0 when shooting between 40-49.9 percent from the floor.
