West Regional
Hosted by University of Arkansas



The Lobos are headed to Fayetteville, Ark., to compete in the NCAA Outdoor West Regional on May 25-28.

The preliminary round will be hosted by the University of Arkansas and will feature the top-48 student-athletes in each event from the west region.

21 Lobos were selected to compete in this season's west preliminary round - the fourth most in program history. The most in school history was 29 in 2011, second most was 25 in 2015 and third most was 23 in 2016.

Camillo Dunninger will get action started on Wednesday, May 25, at 2 p.m. (CT) in javelin as the 40th seed in the event. Abdirizak Ibrahim is the 29th seed in the 1500m run prelims, set to go at 6:30 p.m. In the men's 400m dash prelims, two Lobos qualified - Jevon O'Bryant (19th seed) and Jovahn Williamson (20th) - set for 7:25 p.m. Matthew Larkin is the 40th seed in the 800m run prelims, which is set for 7:50 p.m. Rivaldo Leacock will conclude Wednesday's events as he competes in the 400m hurdles prelims at 8:20 p.m. as the 11th seed.

The trio of Abbe Goldstein (9th seed), Stefanie Parsons (30th) and Sarah Eckel (35th) will start Thursday's events as they run in the 1500m run prelims at 6:30 p.m. Tianna Holmes is the 15th seed in the 400m dash prelims, set for 7:25 p.m. The day will be concluded as three Lobos - Amelia Mazza-Downie (5th seed), Emma Heckel (8th) and Ali Upshaw (12th) - run in the 10K at 9:10 p.m.

In each first round event, the top-24 in each event will advance to the quarterfinal rounds that are set for Friday, May 27, and Saturday, May 28. As of now, there is no knowing who advances, so the full Lobo schedules for the final two days is still to be determined.

As of now, Awet Yohannes is set to open competition on Friday, May 27, as he competes as the 13th seed in the men's 3000m steeplechase at 5:40 p.m. Then, Aidan Quinn will compete as the 26th seed in triple jump at 6 p.m. Ibrahim will run in the 5K at 8:10 p.m. as the 35th seed. The men's 4x400m relay of Leacock, O'Bryant, Williamson and Victor Akhalu will compete as the 15th seed in the event at 8:45 p.m.

On Saturday, the trio of Elise Thorner (2nd seed), Adva Cohen (8th) and Samantha Valentine (32nd) are set to compete in the women's 3000m steeplechase at 5:40 p.m. A handful of Lobos are set to run in the 5K at 8:10 p.m. - Cohen (4th seed), Gracelyn Larkin (5th), Heckel (12th), Samree Dishon (14th) and Mazza-Downie (23rd) to close out regional competition.

From here, the top-24 competitors in each event will advance to the NCAA Championships set for June 8-11 in Eugene, Ore.

LOBOS REMAIN IN TOP-15

The women's team started the season with just a few qualifying teams, debuting at 194 in week 1 of the USTFCCA rating index, but quickly moved its way up. In week 2, the Lobos moved up to No. 19, then to No. 18 in week 3.

In week 4, the squad debuted in the top-25 at No. 9. They spent weeks 5-7 at No. 12, then dropped to No. 15 in week 8, before moving up to No. 13 in this week's index (week 9).

WHAT'S 9 + 12? TWENTY ONE... LOBO REGIONAL QUALIFIERS

21 Lobos were selected to compete in the NCAA West Regional - the fourth most in program history. The most was 29 in 2011, second most was 25 in 2015 and third most was 23 in 2016.

On the men's side, nine Lobos qualified in their respective events. On the women's side, 12 student-athletes qualified in their events.

THREE IS A LUCKY NUMBER

Both the men's and women's teams finished in third at the Mountain West Outdoor Championships, which were on May 11-14 in Clovis, Calif.

The women's team ended with 116.50 team points, while the men's team ended with 100 team points.

BEST IN THE MOUNTAIN WEST

16 Lobos placed in the top-three finishers in their respective events at the Mountain West Championships, earning All-Conference Team selections - an even split of eight Lobos on the women's team and eight on the men's team.

The Lobos earned the top spot in eight different events - Samree Dishon in the 10K, Adva Cohen in 3000m SC, Aidan Quinn in triple jump, Elise Thorner in the 1500m run, Jevon O'Bryant in the 400m dash, Jovahn Williamson in the 200m dash, Gracelyn Larkin in the 5K, Rivaldo Leacock in the 400m hurdles, and the men's 4x400m relay team.

The women's team earned podium sweeps in three events - the 1500m, 5K and 10K, just further proving New Mexico's dominance in distance events.

The women that earned All-Mountain West are Adva Cohen, Samree Dishon, Emma Heckel, Tianna Holmes, Gracelyn Larkin, Amelia Mazza-Downie, Stefanie Parsons and Elise Thorner.







SUCCESS ON THE TRACK AND IN THE CLASSROOM

16 Lobos graduated this spring, including three of our qualifiers. Camillo Dunninger (javelin) graduated with his Master's of Business Administration, Aidan Quinn earned his Bachelor's of Science in Exercise Science and Awet Yohannes graduated with his Bachelor's of Art in Liberal Arts.

SPRINTING TO SCHOOL RECORDS

New Mexico is not necessarily known for their sprints like they are known for their distance runners. A few transfers to the men's team has changed that this season.

Jevon O'Bryant transferred in from Barton County Community College, Jovahn Williamson is a graduate transfer from Harvard, Rivaldo Leacock is a graduate transfer from South Carolina and Victor Akhalu transferred in from New Mexico Junior College.

These four have had an immediate impact on the program as the 4x400m relay team this season. For the first time in school history, the relay team took first at the MW Championships. Just a few weeks before that, they also ran the fastest time in the event in 45 years at 3:06.76, which set a stadium record and was the fifth fastest time in conference history.

FROM BEST IN BARBADOS TO THE BEST IN THE WEST

After transferring from South Carolina, Rivaldo Leacock has shined bright for the Lobos. His event of choice is the 400m hurdles. His time of 50.04 in the event is the best by a Barbados-born athlete this season and second best all-time.

He was named the Mountain West Men's Track Athlete of the Week on March 29, after placing first in his event at the ASU Invitational the week prior.

THORNER CONTINUES LEGACY OF LOBO 3000M SC DOMINANCE

Elise Thorner is the latest Lobo to find success in the women's 3000m steeplechase event. Earlier in the season, she took the No. 1 spot in the nation with a time of 9:40.98. It was short lived though as Courtney Wayment of BYU claimed the top spot the very next day.

Since then, Thorner improved by eight whole seconds in the event, earning the ninth-fastest time in NCAA collegiate history and fastest in U23 UK history with a time of 9:32.42. After this performance, she was named the MW Women's Track Athlete of the Week.

Her time is currently ranked No. 3 in NCAA Division I and No.

14 in the nation this season.

BOWERMAN GETS THE CALL

Associate head coach Laura Bowerman was officially named to the USATF staff for this upcoming summer's World Athletics Championships Oregon22, set for July 15-29 in Eugene, Ore.

Bowerman has coached 43 All-Americans on the oval through her past six years at New Mexico. She also led two NCAA Champions - Courtney Frerichs in the 3000m SC in 2016 and Weini Kelati in the 10K in 2019. She has also led the cross country team to seven straight MW titles, extending their streak to 14 seasons in a row.

UP NEXT

The top-12 competitors in each event at this regional, along with the top-12 in each event at the East regional, will advance to the NCAA Championships. The NCAA's will be held on June 8-11 in Eugene, Ore.

NOTEWORTHY :

JOE FRANKLIN enters his 14th year as the head track and field/cross country coach at The University of New Mexico. Franklin took over the program on June 18, 2007 after 13 years in the same role at Butler University. He replaced Matt Henry who retired after seven years at New Mexico. Franklin is the seventh men's and fifth women's head track and field coach at UNM.

At the time of his hiring Franklin said, "I'm excited and thrilled. This is a very unique opportunity, especially when you look at the great tradition and history that New Mexico has had in cross country and track and field. I think the University of New Mexico and city of Albuquerque are tremendous settings for competition and training and places that provide unique opportunities for student-athletes."

Franklin said he has lofty expectations for the future of the UNM track and cross country programs. "The goals for the program are always to see where we can max out in every event," he said. "Let's see how high we can go. Let's see if we can get to be a top-10 team in cross country. Let's see if we can get to be a top-25 team in track and field. We want to have athletes in the sprints, throws, jumps, vaults and distance events qualifying for the NCAAs consistently and then see if we can build on that and start moving up in the team standings."

Since that time Franklin has wasted little time making his mark at New Mexico and achieved many of the goals he laid out in his hiring, which culminated with UNM's most successful season for the women in 2018-19.

In 2008 the United States Track & Field and Cross Country Association created a "Program of the Year" award to honor those teams who succeeded in all three sports — cross country, indoor track & field, outdoor track & field — on a yearly basis at the NCAA Championships. Since the awards inception New Mexico has made the list six times on the men's side and five times on the women's side.

Franklin has also assembled a considerable collection of championship hardware while leading UNM. Since the start of the 2009-10 school year, the Franklin-led Lobos have claimed the most conference titles of any Mountain West member, with 23 total (11 women's cross-country; six men's cross-country; three men's indoor track & field; one men's outdoor track & field; two women's indoor track & field). Franklin delivered two national

championships in cross country, the first individual national championship in cross country in Ednah Kurgat and eight individual track and field champions.
