New Mexico Weekly Press Conference

The New Mexico Weekly Press Conference will take place on Mondays (which is a change from Tuesday) and Coach Bronco Mendenhall will meet with the media for about 30 minutes or so starting at noon.

Mendenhall Interview Opportunities

During the week, Mendenhall will be available on Mondays at his press conference, and then after games. After home games he will meet the media in the New Mexico Mutual Champions Training Center.

New Mexico Player Interview Opportunities

All player interviews must be arranged through the UNM athletics communications office. For the season, players are available after practice on Monday and Tuesday.

Postgame: The UNM locker room is closed. Requested players will be brought to the New Mexico Mutual Champions Training Center and outside the locker room for road games.

The press box at University Stadium is fully equipped for wireless connections. Access is free, but those wanting access need their own internal or external wireless cards. Phone lines are available.

Game Credentials

Visiting team media should request single-game credentials through their team's media relations office. Media passes work as parking passes for the Baseball South lots.

Media members not associated directly with a team can email requests via our media request link, which is located near the top of the football page on GoLobos.com under "Credential Request Form".

For media members picking up credentials at will call without parking passes, it is located in the Northeast corner of the stadium by Gate 7 or 8. With parking passes credentials will be located at the University Drive entrance to the Baseball South lot with the parking attendant.

Parking

Media parking is located across and just south of the stadium off University Drive. Media members can park in the Baseball East lot which is located next to University Drive.

Visiting Radio

The visiting radio booth is located on the fourth level of the main press box, next to the main media area.

# The Opening List

Entering the 2024 season, there were quite a few unknowns for the Lobos on offense. It was obvious that UNM was going to start a new quarterback in Devon Dampier, the true sophomore who inherited the offense. UNM knew it had the Mountain West's returning leader in yards per catch in Caleb Medford, the sure-handed Ryan Davis and a tight end that was talented if not slightly underused as a pass catcher in Trace Bruckler, but everything else was a question mark.

Could Luke Wysong rebound from his injury redshirt season?

Could Nic Trujillo be a guy to be counted on as a receiver?

Who would run the ball as UNM? In the end UNM lost nine of its top 11 rushers from 2023 (the only non-quarterback rushing years that returned were six... four for Jaylen Morgan and two from tight end Trace Bruckler, and yes you read that right).

The other question is what would Bronco Mendenhall and Offensive Coordinator Jason Beck do and run? Mendenhall gave a hint at his initial press conference, when he was asked what type of offense the team would run. He said it's undefinable, because it's based on the personnel and what fits the personnel best, and that could change from year-to-year, and even week-to-week.

Why did anyone doubt the guy with 16 bowl eligible seasons out of 17?

All UNM has done this year is average 461.2 yards per game on offense (and remember UNM has played an SEC team, Arizona, the No. 3 team in the FCS and Fresno State one of the better defensive teams in the nation). Overall, the Lobos in five games have totaled 2,306 over five games. How good is that 461.2 yards per game average? Two years ago, UNM averaged 228.1 yards per game, so the current 2024 squad is DOUBLING the average from two years ago.

And since the offense is doubling that season total, we thought we would double to amount of Opening Lists for this game. UNM's last 12 seasons of offense, and where UNM has ranked in the FBS, and where the 461.2 stands in school history are the subject of a very offensive, double-shot Opening List:

# Beating NMSU Was Quite the Rush

It had been a hot minute since New Mexico put up half a hundo against New Mexico State in Aggie Memorial Stadium, as the Lobos won 50-40. The last time UNM had scored 50 or more at Aggie Memorial Stadium was all the way back in 1994 on October 22 when UNM won 56-31. The only other time UNM has ever scored at least 50 in Las Cruces was on November 22, 1975 when UNM won 52-28.

The Lobos put up those 50 points with seven touchdowns, and all of them were rushing touchdowns. The seven rushing touchdowns tied for the sixth-most in school history as UNM has five times previously scored eight rushing touchdowns in a game, with one of those against New Mexico State (back in 1982). The seven rushing touchdowns tied for the second-most ever in a road game, behind the eight UNM scored at UTEP in 1972.

### The Gospel According to Luke

For big time music fans, The Gospel According to Luke is a must-read autobiography by Steve Lukather, considered one of the greatest guitarists to have ever live. Lukather, a founding member of the band Toto, can be hard on hit songs from Boz Skaggs to just about every song on Michael Jackson's Thriller album along with songs and albums by Elton John, Aretha Franklin, Paul McCartney, Stevie Nicks, Don Henley and Bruce Springsteen.

For Lobo fans, The Gospel According to Luke is pretty much the Lobo offensive playbook because of receiver Luke Wysong.

For the fifth straight game, Wysong was UNM's leading receiver in terms of receptions, catching a team-high five passes for 47 yards, which was actually his lost total in either category this season.

Yet, here's where we are with Mr. Wysong. He now has 35 catches for 454 yards and a touchdown (and he's added 42 yards rushing and 45 yards on kickoff returns).

The 35 receptions through five games equals his career-high for an entire season. In 2022, Wysong caught 35 passes over 11 games, and his 454 yards receiving easily has topped his previous season-best of 293 yards, also in 2022.

Wysong, who last year played four games before an injury (ironically against New Mexico State) sidelined him for the rest of the season, was a preseason Comeback Player of the Year Watch List member. How good has his 2024 been? Wysong was highlighted at the end of September as one of the CSC College Football Player of the Week Award's September 8 Players of the Month.

### Speaking of Wysong

In the Jeopardy! category of "Things We'd Never Thought We'd Type", Luke Wysong currently ranks 20th in the FBS in total catches with his 35.

He also ranks 20th in receiving yards per game with 90.8 per game, and his receptions per game ranks 12th at 7.0 per game.

### Setting Records is Cool. Setting THESE Records? So Not Cool

Look records are great ... it gives me plenty of things to write about for these notes, which gives you plenty of things to read and to figure out what tangent these notes will go off to. Sometimes setting records aren't great, but we are sort of forced to mention them. This is that mention.

For the third straight game, the Lobos have set a penalty record, and since it wasn't "Fewest penalties in a game", it sort of sucks, but again, here we are.

- 9/14 at Auburn: UNM ties school record for most penalties in a road game with 16.
- 9/21 Fresno State: UNM ties school record for most penalties in a game with 17.
- 9/28 at New Mexico State: UNM sets a school record for most penalty yards with 170.

The previous record for most penalty yards in a game was 163 against San Diego State set on October 3, 1981. It was also the most penalty yards in a Rio Grande Rivalry game since UNM recorded 159 at New Mexico State on September 19, 1998, which was the previous most for the Lobos in a road game.

What's odd about the 170 yards ... was it started so innocently. At the half, UNM had a grand total of 15 yards, 10 on a hold in the first quarter, and then five on an illegal formation in the second quarter.

In the third quarter, UNM only had four penalties, but all four were personal fouls (two unsportsmanlike conducts, one offensive pass interference and one face mask).

The fourth quarter featured eight Lobo penalties for 95 yards with six of those personal fouls, and five of those penalties were on the final drive of the game giving NMSU 40 yards of 64 (including 15 at the end of the kickoff return).

New Mexico ranks last in the FBS in total penalties with 59 (fellow MW teams Nevada [53] and San Diego State [52] are closest), last in penalties per game at 11.8 (San Diego State is next at 10.4), last in penalty yards per game at 101.0 (San Diego State again is next at 97.8). UNM is next to last in total penalty yards at 505 (fitting, right?), 14 yards behind Nevada, which has been tagged for 519 yards.

Maybe They have Been Talking with Colby Brewer

Later in the notes you can read about Colby Brewer of the Lobos, a former Navy Special Ops man who dismantled explosives. The Lobo defense through the first three games had allowed several explosive plays, and not little firecracker-type explosives but more like the M-80 keep them away from your hands type of explosives.

Entering the week, the Rio Grande Rivalry game, New Mexico had allowed six plays of 40 or more yards, and that tied for the most in the nation. However, while UNM did allow a long touchdown run in the game, UNM moved from last in the nation in most 40-yard plays allowed to 115th.

Conversely, New Mexico has also had eight offensive scrimmage plays this year of 40 yards or more (four just on Saturday against NMSU) and that number moved UNM into the top 20 nationally, tying for 18th.

And Then There Was One

And then there was one is a phrase that has been utilized quite a bit in Hollywood and in popular culture, from an award winning Lifetime Movie (there's a sentence that almost never gets typed) starring Amy Madigan about a Hollywood Couple that visits a fertility clinic only to conceive a child and then learn that they all have contracted HIV, to a book where triplets go to see three different movies in the same movie theater but two of them get kidnapped.

For Lobo Football, the phrase "And Then There Was One" is a source of pride, because when it comes to teams allowing sacks, the Lobos are the last offensive line standing. The fact that UNM is the last team standing is honestly a little shocking as after a season in which UNM's offensive line was a team strength and most transferred out with the change in coaches, Bronco Mendenhall brought in 16 new offensive linemen, and the squad has done it through a bunch of shuffling.

UNM's original offensive line was supposed to be McKenzie Agnello at left tackle, Baraka Beckett at left guard, Juvaun Singletary at center, Richard Pearce at right guard and Wallace Unamba at right tackles. Of those five, one Pearce had ever started an FBS game (playing in 23 and starting three), and Unamba had played in just one. Of course, that lineup never saw the field.

The week of the opening game, Singletary was declared out for the season with an undisclosed injury. So, UNM moved Agnello, who had not only never played in an FBS game but had never played center before ... to center and Tevin Shaw started at left tackle. Shaw had played one game in the FBS at offensive line (and nine others on the field goal unit). Shaw's season lasted about six quarters before he was injured for the season. Enter Lajuan Owens. Owens had never before taken a snap in the FBS, and he has now started three straight games at left tackle.

Against New Mexico State, Wallace Unamba missed the game, so Agnello moved to right tackle and Malik Aliane became the seventh starter along the line.

Through all of that, plus some snaps for Jermarques Bailey, Matthew Toilolo, Elvin Harris and James Bailey, 11 Lobos have seen snaps on the offensive line this season, and after five games, Devon Dampier has hardly been touched. The Lobo offensive line hasn't allowed a sack yet this season, and according to PFF, the line has allowed one hit on Dampier charged to them. UNM became the last team to allow a sack when Army got sacked on last Saturday.

Amazingly, nearly single snap taken by an offensive lineman this season did not take a snap for UNM last season. Of the 1,970 snaps taken by offensive linemen this season, three have been taken by a player who had ever played a down for the Lobos prior to this year (Jermarques Bailey), a paltry 0.05%

Taylor's Heater

Bryson Taylor over the first 21 games of his career, covering two seasons, had a grand total of one pass breakup. This year he has been on a little bit of a heater. Through four games, Taylor has seven pass breakups, and he is more than halfway to getting his name on the single-season charts. Taylor would need just four more over the last eight games of the regular season to get on the list, as 11 would actually tie him for ninth place. The last time a Lobo had 11 PBUs in a season was in 2022 when Jerrick Reed II (who is now on the Seattle Seahawks) had 11.

Taylor's seven PBUs is tied for second in the FBS lead and it's a high enough total that he would have tied for the team lead in both 2015 and 2018. He trails only Will Lee III of Texas A&M, who has eight PBUs in six games.

The answer to the ultimate question of life, the universe, and everything

If you've ever watched The Hitchhiker's Guide to the Galaxy (and yes, I'm one of those who would say read the book ... it's so much better, and you should read more ... it's good for you), you know that the answer to the ultimate question of life, the universe and everything is the number 42.

That bodes well for UNM then. Beside the fact that the No. 42 is retired for the great Bobby Santiago, 42 represents the number of transfers into the Lobo program this season as Bronco Mendenhall and company needed to replenish and fortify, and better the roster. The 42 is easily the most in Lobo history, bettering the 30 from last year. Where does the 42 stand for the school with the most transfers? We did the research, and for the second straight year, Colorado has the most transfers, this time with 44 but they are tied with Charlotte, and UNM is third with 42. When you couple the transfers with the 17 freshmen, UNM has 59 newcomers, and that total ranks 12th overall.

That's UNM's opponents field goal kicking over the last three seasons, going 43-for-51 and that would probably win the Groza Award. In 2022, opponents were 15-for-18, and last year 20-for-24. In 2024, so far UNM's opponents are 8-for-9, the only miss from 57 yards.

Power 4 Fun

Well generally, playing a Power 4 isn't associated with fun, but it will be for UNM as the team will play two Power 4 teams (and one former Power 4 in Washington State which counts as a Power 4 this year and next year but not in 2026 when the Pac-12, which is the Pac-2, becomes the Pac-7, but maybe the Pac-8, which is what it was 1978, because who doesn't want to go back to 1978?). UNM took on Arizona and Auburn in back-to-back games (with a bye week between the two games). It marked the first time UNM faced two Power 4 teams in the same season since 2015 when UNM lost to Arizona State in the regular season 34-10 and then to Arizona in the Gildan New Mexico Bowl 45-37. The last time UNM faced off with two such opponents in the regular season was in 2012 when UNM in Bob Davie's first season when UNM lost to Texas (45-0 in a game that was 10-0 at the half) and Texas Tech (49-14) in back-to-back weeks.

Speaking of the Schedule...

The Mountain West schedule is just seven games this season instead of eight, since the league has a scheduling alliance with Oregon State and Washington State for the next two years this year only and those games don't count as conference games. Oregon State and Washington State also aren't involved in postseason awards as well.

However, UNM will have three bye weeks for the first time in a season in school history. The Lobos also have just five home games for the first time since 2005, which was also the last time that UNM played an 11-game schedule. Also, yes, we remember that UNM famously became the first time in since 1914 (Clemson) to play at least a seven-game season without a home game and the first time in FBS history to play an entire season without a home game or a game within its own home state. Still can't forget that one.

UNM will play just three home games over the first 10 weeks of the season. The last time UNM had five non-conference games scheduled in a season was in 2012 when UNM went 3-2, beating Southern, New Mexico State and Texas State but losing at Texas Tech and Texas.

Well That was Fast...

When Bronco Mendenhall was hired, on that day (December 6, 2023), he was quite obviously 12th in terms of longevity among all Mountain West coaches at one day.

When the season starts, just 253 days later ... amazingly he is tied for seventh, and he would be fifth if the announcement was three days earlier. Seriously. The 2024 season will see eight new head coaches in the Mountain West, and that's easily the most new coaches since the 1999 season, when all nine coaches were new to the Mountain West ... because it was the first season of the league.

3+3=3

Listen, common core math is just stupid, but 3+3=3 isn't common core math, it's Lobo rushing touchdown math. Against New Mexico State, Davon Dampier and Na'Quari Rogers both scored on three rushing touchdowns. That marked the first time in Mountain West history that a set of teammates scored three rushing touchdowns in a game, joining Utah State's Gerold Bright & Darwin Thompson (Nov. 11, 2018 vs. Hawai'i) & BYU's Brian McDonald-Ashford & Luke Staley (Oct. 27, 2001 vs. San Diego State).

Crazy Stat: 13. That's the number of tackles for loss allowed by UNM, and that number is third nationally, behind only Navy and Army, which both run the option. The Lobos are tied for third nationally with Ohio State.



### UNM vs. Ranked Teams

New Mexico is 6-61 all-time against ranked opponents dating back to the 1940 season. UNM is 4-26 at home vs. ranked opponents, 2-34 on the road and 0-1 on neutral fields. UNM's last win over a ranked opponent was on October 25, 2003 when the Lobos won at No. 23 Utah 47-35. UNM's last win over a top 10 program was also against Utah, a 23-21 win on November 5, 1994. UNM is 1-18 all-time against top-10 teams and 0-5 vs. top-five teams. UNM has lost 26 straight to ranked foes.

### They Were Just Keeping Up With the Head Coach

In the past coaching cycle, two different publications named Bronco Mendenhall either an A or A+ hire, or the best hire of the coaching cycle. 247 Sports graded all the coaching hires (doing so twice, as it had looked settled until Nick Saban retired, kicking off a chain of coaching moves that necessitated some new grades). That didn't matter as the only coach in the complete hiring cycle to get an A+ grade was the hire of Mendenhall. CBS Sports also gave out one A+ and it was for Mendenhall's hire.

Athlon Sports ranked the hire of Mendenhall as the best of the cycle with an A+, well, the players had something to shoot for grade wise. Now, UNM's grade report history goes back to 1988 (obviously there were grades before 1988, but as for good record-keeping of those grades? Whoever had them doesn't work here anymore), so over the course of the previous 75 semesters, the best the Lobo Football had every done collectively was a 3.05 in the Spring of 2023. The team had a 3.10 in the pass/fail COVID semester of the Spring of 2020.

What did the team do in the first semester under Bronco Mendenhall? They destroyed the old record. The team, a team with over 30 newcomers and transfers last semester AND still had players on scholarship that were in the transfer portal, recorded a 3.22 GPA.

It marked the highest GPA in the history of the program, and it very quick tangible piece of evidence that it's a whole new era.

### Eight is Enough? Is it?

Bronco Mendenhall has been a head coach for 17 previous seasons, so that's a lot of players that he has coached. Well, it would only stand to reason that at least one of them would eventually be on his staff for year 18.

But eight?

Among the 10 full-time assistant coaches on staff for Mendenhall, eight were coached by Mendenhall in college.

The great eight are Jason Beck (BYU), Famika Anae (BYU), Kirk Garner (Virginia), Matt Johns (Virginia), Nick Howell (BYU), Shane Hunter (BYU), Jan Jorgensen (BYU) and Charles Mack (Virginia). Only Micah Simon and Donte Wilkins were not coached in college at any point by Mendenhall.

It got us (and Bronco) wondering if that was the most in the country. It's not even close.

The only school with even FOUR assistant coaches that played at one time for the head coach is Iowa, as Kirk Ferentz has coached four of his players. Utah is close, but of their four players, two played under Kyle Whittingham when he was an assistant coach at Utah.

It should be noted that UNM's total doesn't include guys like Director of Operations Joe Spaziani or Director of Scouting Evan Butts or several of UNM's graduate assistants.

### The Old Man Down the Road

In 1984, Credence Clearwater Revival front man John Fogerty had his first solo top 10 hit after a 13-year solo career with "The Old Man Down the Road", hitting number ten on the Billboard charts. In 2024, forty years later, the Lobos could potentially play that song for a freshman. Colby Brewer is a member of the squad, and he is the oldest position player in the FBS in 2024 checking in at 29 years of age. He is just ahead of Arkansas wide receiver Monte Harrison as Brewer a little over two months older.

While Harrison's excuse is a good one, having played baseball (including 50 games with the Marlins and Angels and being one of four players traded for eventual National League MVP Christian Yelich), it's not as good as Brewer's. What's he been doing?

Dismantling bombs. Seriously.

Brewer was in the United States Navy from 2015-2024, serving as in Navy Special Operations for nine years. His primary responsibility was disarming bombs and IED (improvised explosive device). Suddenly running down on special teams isn't a big scary thing. Brewer is the oldest position player, and overall he is the sixth-oldest player in the game.

### Symbolism

If you look at UNM's roster on previous pages, there's a lot of symbols, so much so that you might think Professor Robert Langdon was needed or maybe did the roster himself. However, with COVID still being a thing we are all dealing with (it was only three years ago, which is baffling), here is what everything means.

In the experience column, returners either have a 1VL, 2VL or 3VL, meaning you lettered that many times (played more than four games or made a start) an SQ, which means you were on the team but didn't play enough, on an RS, which means they redshirted. If you redshirt, that RS stays with you for the duration of your career (provided you redshirted at UNM).

New players have either HS for high school last year, JC for junior college last year, or TR for a transfer that played at a four-year school last year.

As for the symbols, if you see a # sign, that just means a player has a redshirt year available. There are a few players (Kyler Drake for example) who have redshirted already, but still have a redshirt available, because their redshirt year was the 2020 COVID season. An \* (Jahvante Royal) means that player has a potential super senior year available due to playing in the 2020 COVID season. An & (Aaron Rodriguez) means that player is utilizing his super senior year this season, so they are done after this.

We wish more teams adopted this. Apparently we aren't alone. MW Wire praised Lobo Football and stated "@UNMLoboFB has done an exceptional job on their roster page clarifying this exact thing (COVID eligibility). Every team should do the same."

### He Doesn't Have to Nurse His Leg Anymore

Aaron Rodriguez, UNM's Ray Guy candidate, must have really enjoyed last season. After back-to-back years in 2021 and 2022 where he finished the regular season as the nation's leader in most punts, Rodriguez practically had a vacation in 2023, punting just 52 times. Rodriguez, who is entering his sixth and final year of college football in 2024 (we think, who really knows these days), but he has the chance to really cement his name into the UNM record books.

Rodriguez punted just twice against Fresno State. Overall, he has punted 231 times in his Lobo career and he has amassed 9,958 yards overall, and he is third on the career average list at 43.1 yards per punt. The school record for most total punts is 276 by Tyler Gaus from 2002-05. That puts Aaron 45 punts away with a minimum of seven games left (we are happy he's not getting that record.)

Additionally, the record for most total yards is 11,096, putting Rodriguez 1,138 yards away. Aaron is quickly moving behind pace of catching that record, again a record he'd rather not have, and honestly a really good thing for UNM.

The neat thing is Rodriguez will become just the fourth Lobo punter to lead the team in punting four straight years, joining Ron Keller (1983-86), Gaus (2002-05), and the last to do it, Ben Skaer (2010-13).

Rodriguez started his career at Missouri in 2019 and 2020, where he was not only a teammate of transfer Ishmael Az-Zahir, but both other those guys were teammates of current graduate assistant coach Tre'Vour Wallace-Simms.

With the additions of Washington State and Oregon State into the Mountain West for a scheduling alliance, the Mountain West dropped one conference game, meaning the league will be decided on a seven-game season. It also means that every team in the league will miss four conference opponents.

Somehow, UNM lucked on in a way. Last year, three teams tied for first place in the Mountain West at 6-2. Boise State and UNLV were the team teams to move onto the Mountain West title game, with San Jose State the odd man out. In 2024, every Mountain West team has to play at least one of those teams ... except UNM, who through sheer randomness, will miss all three of those teams.

### Total Football

If you ever watched Ted Lasso (and if you haven't seriously ... borrow an Apple password and watch it) you know that in season three they switch AFC Richmond to "Total Football". While it's sort of not known what "Total Football" actually is, in football there is a thing called "Total Offense", which combines passing yards per game and rushing yards per game ... that's total offense.

Devon Dampier is the Mountain West leader in total offense as the only player averaging over 300 yards a game. Dampier is averaging 328.2 yards per game of total offense, with 261.8 yards passing per game and 66.4 yards rushing per game.

Among Group of 5 Group of 6 players, Dampier is third overall behind only John Mateer of Washington State and Chandler Morris of North Texas. Overall, Dampier is 10th nationally.

Dampier is on pace for 3,938 yards of total offense, which would break Stoney Case's school record of 3,649 yards set exactly 30 years ago in 1994.

### It's a Pledge Ceremony, Not a White Coat Ceremony

Listen, did I predict the amazing week Aaron Rodriguez was going to have when I had a punter meet with all the media on Tuesday of Rio Grande Rivalry Week? I'm just saying prove that I didn't.

Prove it.

Rodriguez was one of four players selected to meet with the media because he was taking part in a unique weekend. On Friday, when the Lobos loaded our four busses to make the three hour drive to Las Cruces, missing was starting punter Aaron Rodriguez. While the team was enjoying the ride to Las Cruces (aka, sleeping with noise-canceling head phone on), Rodriguez stayed behind to participate in the UNM School of Nursing Pledge Ceremony.

Formerly called a White Coat Ceremony, the UNM graduating nursing students wear their scrubs and are officially presented their coats, signifying the students' transition into the professional nursing world.

So how did Rodriguez get to Las Cruces? He hopped on the department staff/cheer/booster bus. While we don't know if he was asleep for the three-hour drive listening to noise-canceling headphones, we do know that he arrived at the team hotel about 30 minutes before the team left for the stadium, just in time to get a bit of a pregame meal.

Maybe he should show up just beforehand every game. Rodriguez helped UNM win the early field position battle with a 49-yard punt that went out of bounds at the 2-yard line and then he followed that up with a 56-yard punt that went out of bound at the 4-yard line.

Overall he averaged 45.8 yards per punt and was named the Mountain West Special Teams Player of the Week, and he became the first Lobo punter to earn Mountain West Special Teams Player of the Week since Aussie Tyson Dyer got named after his effort against Air Force in 2018. He is just the fourth Lobo punter to win Mountain West Player of the Week since 2005, joining Dyer, Corey Bojorquez and Zach Rogers.



Bronco Mendenhall, a 17-year veteran head coach who has twice turned around struggling programs, joined the Lobo Family on Dec. 6, 2023 when he was named the 33rd head football coach at The University of New Mexico. The announcement was made by Vice President/Director of Athletics Eddie Nuñez. Mendenhall is no stranger to Albuquerque or The University of New Mexico, having served as defensive coordinator and associate head coach for the Lobos under Rocky Long from 1998-2002.

Mendenhall, 57, served as the head coach at former Mountain West rival BYU for 11 years and at Virginia for six, both times inheriting programs that were coming off a string of losing seasons and turning both into consistent winners.

After leaving UNM in 2002, Mendenhall spent two seasons as the defensive coordinator for BYU under Gary Crowton before being elevated to the head coaching position in 2005. In his first season at the helm of the Cougars, Mendenhall led BYU to a 6-6 record, returning BYU to a bowl game for the first time since 2001, losing 35-28 in the Las Vegas Bowl to California.

Mendenhall enamored himself to the Cougar fan base in that first season by returning the traditional "Y" to the team's helmets and more traditional uniforms. That opening season with BYU in 2005 would be his only non-winning season, as the Cougars reeled off double-digit wins four consecutive years from 2006-09, winning a pair of Mountain West titles as BYU would play in bowl games in all 11 of his seasons in Provo.

In 2006 and 2007, BYU went 11-2 each season and a perfect 8-0 in the Mountain West, finishing the 2006 season ranked No. 15 in the final AP Poll and No. 16 in the final Coaches Poll. In 2007, BYU finished 14th in both polls. The 2006 squad won its final 10 games including a 33-31 win over rival Utah to end a four-year winning streak for the Utes, a game in which BYU threw an 11-yard touchdown pass with no time left. Mendenhall was named Mountain West Coach of the Year as well as the Region 5 Coach of the Year by the AFCA.

In 2007, BYU again finished the season off with 10 consecutive wins, and by the time of season's end, it was the nation's longest winning streak. The Cougars again won the Las Vegas Bowl and this time they were able to exact some revenge with a 17-16 win over UCLA after the Bruins won the regular season matchup 27-17. The BYU defense finished 10th nationally, and overall BYU allowed 16 or fewer points in eight of the team's 13 games.

The 2008 Cougars again won double-digit games, going 10-3, and Mendenhall became the first Cougar coach to ever go unbeaten at home over three consecutive seasons. BYU opened the season 6-0 to run its winning streak to 16 straight, moving as high as No. 7 in the polls after a 21-3 win over New Mexico in Provo. BYU again played in the Las Vegas Bowl, and three Cougars earned Academic All-America honors, a program first.

The following season in 2009, BYU went 11-2, going 7-1 in the Mountain West and 3-1 against nationally-ranked foes. Included in that was a season-opening 14-13 neutral site win over No. 3 Oklahoma State in Arlington, Texas. Once again the Cougars excelled on the field and in the classroom. Two more Cougars earned Academic All-America honors while quarterback Max Hall threw for 3,560 yards. Running back Harvey Unga rushed for 1,087 yards and tight end Dennis Pitta earned All-America honors as he broke the NCAA record for most career receiving yards by a tight end.

In 2010, Mendenhall took over as defensive coordinator after a 2-5 start and BYU won five of its final six games. That season culminated in a 52-24 thrashing of UTEP in the Gildan New Mexico Bowl, making Mendenhall a perfect 4-0 inside University Stadium.

Mendenhall led the Cougars into the uncharted territory of football independence from 2011-15, starting with another double-digit win season in 2011 as BYU went 10-3, winning a third-straight bowl game. The Cougars finished 22nd nationally in points allowed per game at 20.4, and BYU won nine of its last 10 including a come-from-behind win over Tulsa 27-24 in the Armed Forces Bowl. The Cougars finished the season ranked No. 25 in the Coaches Poll, giving BYU five seasons under Mendenhall in the final rankings.

The Cougars reeled off three straight 8-5 seasons under challenging schedules that saw BYU face off, and beat, the likes of No. 15 Texas (40-21 and 41-7), Boise State (37-20), Georgia Tech (38-20 and 41-17), Cal (42-35) and Washington State (30-6). BYU made it 10 straight seasons of bowl games as BYU earned bids to the Poinsettia Bowl in 2012, beating former conference foe San Diego State 23-6. BYU also faced off with Washington in the 2013 Fight Hunger Bowl and with Memphis in the 2014 Miami Beach Bowl.

In 2015, his final season with the Cougars, Mendenhall led BYU to a 9-3 record that included wins over No. 20 Boise State 35-24 and a season-opening win at Nebraska 33-28. The Cougars also won seven of their final eight games to finish off the regular season before facing Utah in the Royal Purple Las Vegas Bowl.

After stepping down from BYU, Mendenhall took over the Virginia Cavaliers, who were suffering through four straight losing seasons. It took Mendenhall two seasons to get the Cavs back to a bowl game for the first time in six years as his 2017 team went 6-6 in the regular season, earning an invitation to the Military Bowl Presented by Northrop Grumman. He also continued to win games against ranked opponents, beating Boise State 42-23 in Boise, and he continued to win rivalry games, defeating North Carolina in "The South's Oldest Rivalry" for the first time in eight years.



His next two seasons saw Virginia go 8-5 in 2018 and 9-5 in 2019. The 2018 squad again won the "South's Oldest Rivalry" and Virginia picked up another ranked win, beating No. 16 Miami 16-13. Virginia was invited to the Belk Bowl, where Mendenhall's Cavs shut out South Carolina of the SEC 28-0.

In 2019, Virginia went 9-3 and won the ACC's Coastal Division with a 6-2 mark, playing Clemson for the ACC title. The Cavs went unbeaten at home and defeated Virginia Tech for the first time in 15 years, earning a New Year's Six Bowl appearance against Florida in the Capital One Orange Bowl. The Cavs finished the year ranked No. 25 in the final Coaches Poll, and defense was again a calling card as the Cavs had three players record double-digit TFLs.

Mendenhall navigated Virginia to a 5-5 mark over the abbreviated 2020 COVID season, passing up a bowl opportunity. The squad did pick up another ranked win with Virginia winning 44-41 over No. 13 North Carolina. In 2021, the Cavs went 6-6, finishing third nationally in total offense and 24th in scoring offense before Mendenhall stepped away from coaching. It marked the 16th time in 17

seasons as a head coach that his team was bowl eligible.

The Alpine, Utah native got his start in the coaching world at Oregon State as a graduate assistant after finishing a two-year playing career there as a defensive back in 1986 and 1987. His two years with Oregon State saw Mendenhall assist with the defensive line. He moved to the junior college ranks with the highly successful Snow College program, serving as the defensive coordinator and defensive backs coach in 1991 and 1992. He then spent two years at Northern Arizona (one as co-defensive coordinator) before returning to Oregon State in 1995 as a defensive line coach. In 1996, he served as the Beavers' defensive coordinator and defensive backs coach.

After a season at Louisiana Tech in 1997, he came to Albuquerque to serve as Rocky Long's first defensive coordinator, coaching five seasons from 1998-2002. UNM's defense excelled under Mendenhall, earning a quick reputation as a hard-nosed, hard-hitting unit led by safety Brian Urlacher, whom Mendenhall served as position coach for two seasons.

In his first seasons as defensive coordina-

tor, the Lobos had six players earn first team All-Mountain West honors and Brandon Ratcliff was co-Mountain West Freshman of the Year. Under Mendenhall, Urlacher was twice an All-American and Nick Speegle earned Freshman All-America honors as well.

Over his time with UNM, the Lobos improved from just three wins in 1998 to seven wins and an invitation to the Las Vegas Bowl in 2002. In the Lobos' 27-13 loss against UCLA in the Las Vegas Bowl, the Mendenhall-led defense held the Bruins to a season-low 167 yards.

Under Mendenhall, the Lobos led the Mountain West in rushing defense for three straight seasons. In 2001, New Mexico gave up just 87.4 yards per game over the season. In his final season in Albuquerque, Mendenhall led the Lobos to a top ranking against league opponents in total defense, allowing just 316.4 yards per game. The Lobos also led the MWC in sacks in the 2000 and 2002 seasons, totaling 46 and 38, respectively.

Mendenhall and his wife, Holly, have three sons, Raeder, Breaker and Cutter.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- Montana State outscored New Mexico 21-0 in the final quarter as the No. 4 FCS Bobcats defeated the Lobos. The Bobcats got the winning score on a 4-yard Scottre Humphrey run with 10 seconds left in the game. That score gave MSU its first lead of the game.

Until that fourth quarter, it was a stellar performance by the Lobos, which got two touchdowns by the offense and two by the defense to take a 31-14 lead. The Lobos scored twice on fumble recoveries, the first time that has happened in at least 50 years.

The Lobos got into Montana State territory on the opening possession but had to punt, but the defense ended up scoring first. On second down from midfield, Jayden Wilson sacked Tommy Mellott, who fumbled, and the ball bounced right to Christian Ellis, who raced 41 yards for his first career touchdown. Luke Drzewiecki added a 45-yard field goal later in the quarter and UNM led 10-0 at the break.

It was 17-0 after Devon Dampier hit Trace Bruckler for a 12-yard touchdown and just 1:15 into the second quarter UNM led 17-0. After that, Montana State started to get its offense in gear, and they got on the board with a 5-yard pass from Mellott to Rylan Schlepp. That was the first of five 75-yard touchdown drives for the Bobcats.

Mellott threw a second TD, this to an open Ty McCollouch to make it 17-14, but UNM answered as Dampier scored untouched from 24 yards out on a drive in which UNM never faced a third down. That made it 24-14, and it stayed that way into halftime.

UNM's only score in the second half came on the opening drive for Montana State when Gabe Lopez sacked Mellott and knocked the ball loose with Noah Avinger picking it up and scurrying 13 yards for a second defensive touchdown. That made it 31-14 and set up the fateful fourth quarter.

The Bobcats, after getting stopped by Ellis and Bobby Arnold III on the fourth-and-1 at the Lobo 25 in the third quarter, opened the fourth with a 15-yard run by Mellott.

UNM drove from its 25 to the Bobcat 23-yard line, but on third-and-5, Eli Sanders lost two yards and with the wind suddenly whipping to 40 miles per hour, Drzewiecki missed his second field goal of the game. In the end, UNM's defense got a stop as Ellis and Randolph Kpai got in Mellott's face and forced an incompleteness from the Bobcat 42. UNM had the ball up 10 in MSU territory with just 6:15 to go.

However UNM couldn't kill much clock and on third down, Luke Wysong dropped an out-pattern that had the first down and a lot more, forcing UNM to punt. On the second play of the drive, Adam Jones went around the left end and raced 93 yards for the second-longest rushing touchdown in MSU history, and the second-longest one given up by UNM. That made it 31-28 with 4:35 left.

UNM again got the ball back, and picked up one first down, but another critical third-down drop, this by Caleb Medford, force a punt. A catch there would have forced MSU to use its final timeout with the two-minute warning and at worst-case gotten the ball back with under 30 seconds. Instead, a Rodriguez punt meant the Bobcats would start with 1:59 left at its 11.

The key plays on the drive were a pair of third-down conversions. The first was a broken play that went for 37 yards and put the Bobcats in field goal territory. The second came on third-and -6 from the Lobo 16 and set up MSU at the 4, where they took the lead on the next play.

TUCSON, Ariz. --- No. 21 Arizona scored two touchdowns in the opening 2:34 of the second half to give itself some breathing room and New Mexico couldn't ever quite close the gap as the Wildcats outlasted the Lobos 61-39 at Arizona Stadium. The loss dropped UNM to 0-2 on the year while Arizona started 1-0.

The loss spoiled a brilliant offensive day for UNM as Devon Dampier and Luke Wysong both had career days, but there was no stopping Terairoa McMillan, who had 10 catches for an Arizona record 304 yards and four touchdowns. The 304 yards were the most ever allowed by UNM, besting the 281 by Marshall Sperbeck of Boise State, who did that on 14 catches on November 14, 2015 in UNM's 31-24 win over the Broncos.

The Lobos went toe-to-toe with the Wildcats in the first half in what was a back-and-forth affair in the opening 30 minutes. Arizona scored on a 69-yard pass from Fafita to McMillan in what was the start of a career-day for him. However, UNM had an answer as Dampier led the Lobos right down the field, and two highlight reel catches by Luke Wysong, the last from 16 yards out tied the game at 7-7.

After Arizona responded with another Fafita to McMillan scoring strike, this from 17 yards, UNM again answered with Na'Quari Rogers scoring his first UNM touchdown on a short pass from Dampier. That made it 14-14 at the break. After the teams traded field goals at the start of the third, UNM got a stop when Noa Pola-Gates, who played terrific with two pass breakups, forced a tipped pass that Christian Ellis picked off. That led to a Dampier 13 yard touchdown run and a 24-17.

That lead was short-lived as Fafita had time and hit a crossing McMillan for his third touchdown of the half, this time going for a 78-yard catch and run for a 24-24 tie. A late 46-yard field goal by Tyler Loop gave the 'Cats a 27-24 lead at the break. The Wildcats opened the second half with the ball and on a third-and-1 from midfield, Quali Conley raced 51 yards for a touchdown and a 34-24 lead. The back-breaker came when a Dampier pass went off the hands of a Lobo receiver and into the waiting arms of Treydan Stukes. Arizona took that interception and turned it into six when McMillan caught his fourth TD on the next pass, this from 40 yards out for a 41-24 lead.

Dampier led UNM right back and got UNM within 10 with some nifty work. He hit Nic Trujillo to move the sticks on third down, and then eventually scored his second rushing touchdown when he faked a pitch and scored from seven yards out.

After another Conley TD made it 48-31, UNM was forced to punt, but Aaron Rodriguez' punt hit a Wildcat blocker and Hyrum Hatch, the long snapper, recovered for UNM. The Lobos couldn't capitalize on the short field and Conley eventually added his third TD to make it 55-31.

The Lobos stayed in the game with a 13-play, 75-yard touchdown drive with Dampier accounting for a fifth touchdown on the night, hitting Caleb Medford for a 9-yard score. UNM went for two and Dampier flipped the ball to Eli Sanders for a deuce and UNM was within two scores at 55-41. The Lobos didn't recover the onside kick and Arizona tacked on a late TD to account for the 61-39 final.

AUBURN, Ala. --- New Mexico threw a critical interception in the third quarter on a fourth-and-5 and UNM couldn't capitalize in the red zone in the first half and Auburn was able to outlast the Lobos 45-19 in a game that was playing in the rain for most of the game.

UNM had four first half drives in the red zone but only got 13 points on a touchdown and two field goals. UNM opened the game with a 60-yard drive that led to a 33-yard Luke Drzewiecki field goal.

Auburn got a 66-yard kickoff return to the UNM 32, and the Tigers took nine plays to get into the end zone for a 7-3 lead. The Lobos answered right back with its lone touchdown drive of the opening half.

Auburn eventually scored on its next two possessions for a 17-10 lead, sandwiched around a ricochet interception for the Tigers. UNM went down and got a second Drzewiecki field goal to make it 17-13, but could have had six as a long pass from Dampier to Jacobs was a little behind the running back, and he adjusted to make the catch but got caught from behind.

After a three-and-out, UNM again drove into the red zone, but Drzewiecki missed a 37-yard field goal in a driving rain storm as the game got sloppy due to the conditions.

After the break at 17-13 Auburn, the Tigers took the second half kickoff and went 75 yards in 10 plays with Hunter Brown tossing a 3-yard touchdown pass to Micah Riley. UNM drove the field but on fourth-and-5 from the 25-yard line, Bronco Mendenhall passed on a field goal and went for it, but a pass to Ryan Davis had its timing thrown off when he was clipped by a defender, and the pass was intercepted, eventually leading to a touchdown and a 31-13 lead.

The Lobos got back in it early in the fourth when Caleb Medford hauled in a four-yard touchdown pass from Dampier to make it 31-19, missing on a two-point conversion. Auburn then gave itself breathing room with a third straight second half touchdown after a long kickoff return to the UNM 43 set up a short field, with a third Hank Brown touchdown pass making it 38-19, and a fourth quarter TD after a missed fourth down conversion made it the final of 45-19.

UNM gained 448 yards on offense and allowed 503 but were hampered by a 16 penalties, third-most in school history, although they went for just 112 total.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. --- Fresno State took an early lead and never let UNM into the game, despite a solid effort, as the Bulldogs moved to 3-1 on the season and 1-0 in the Mountain West with a 31-10 victory over UNM, the seventh straight win in Albuquerque over UNM for the Bulldogs.

The Lobos head on the road next week to take on rival New Mexico State in Las Cruces.

UNM's defense opened the game with a three-and-out, forcing an early punt by the Bulldogs, but UNM coughed the ball up. On third down, Eli Sanders went around the end for a first down but the ball was punched out and recovered at the Lobo 39-yard line.

UNM then went right down the field, going 73 yards on 14 plays, but UNM couldn't punch it in on first-and-goal from the 10-yard line when on third down Devon Dampier's scramble only got to the three-yard line.

UNM started its next drive at the 7-yard line, but moved all the way down the field, scoring on a 5-yard Dampier to Trace Bruckler pass for a 25-10 deficit with six seconds left in the half.

First, a holding call nullified a 58-yard Dampier to Nic Trujillo score that would have made it 28-16 with the conversion pending in the third quarter. After that was marked off, UNM continued down the field and a Dampier scramble to the half-yard line was nullified by another holding penalty, and UNM had to settle for a second Luke Drzewiecki field goal.

After a stop, UNM in desperation mode down 28-13 went for a fourth-and-1 at its own 12-yard line and couldn't convert. Fresno State eventually punched that one in, somehow getting three first downs due to penalties, giving the Bulldogs a 35-13 lead.

After UNM got a 1-yard run by Javen Jacobs and then a two-point conversion run by backup quarterback James Laubstein, UNM looked to have recovered an onside kick, but Isaiah Chavez was called for being offside, although all replays showed otherwise.

UNM outgained the Bulldogs 485 to 345, the 345 being the lowest output allowed by UNM this season.

**LAS CRUCES, N.M.** --- New Mexico rushed for seven touchdowns including a back-breaking 50-yard touchdown on an end-around by Javen Jacobs as the Lobos rolled to 579 yards of offense in taking the 114th meeting of the Rio Grande Rivalry, winning 50-40 over New Mexico State. The 50 points were the most by the Lobos in Aggie Memorial Stadium in 30 years.

The Lobos never trailed in the game, and were tied just once, at 7-7. UNM rushed for 331 yards in the game, it's most of the season, and never suffered an offensive play for a loss until Devon Dampier took two kneel-downs to end the game. The team's seven rushing touchdowns were rolled up by three players with three by Dampier, three by Na'Quari Rogers and one by Jacobs.

Rogers was the superstar with 122 yards rushing on just 21 carries with his career-best three touchdowns.

Up 21-10, UNM opened the third quarter with a 75-yard drive that took just 3:01 with Dampier racing in from 24 yards out. UNM went for a two-point conversion and missed, keeping the game at 27-10. The Aggies answered with a touchdown to make it 27-17, but Luke Drzewiecki capped off a time-consuming driving with a short 20-yard field goal and UNM had a 30-17 lead at the end of three.

UNM then held on a first-and-goal, allowing just a short field goal to move the score to 30-20, but Na'Quari Rogers scored his second rushing touchdown of the day to make it 36-20. It stayed a two-score game when UNM missed the extra point. The Aggies scored but missed their own two-point conversion leaving it at 10 points, 36-26. After Nigel Williams recovered the onside kick, UNM faced a third-and-9 at midfield when Jacobs went around the end and outraced everyone for a clinching touchdown. The Aggies tacked on a touchdown on a quarterback scramble but Williams again recovered the onside kick, and again UNM ended up scoring as Rogers scored on the third play from 29 yards out with 1:46 to go, making it 50-33.

The Aggies ended the scoring with a 2-yard run on a drive that was aided by four penalties. UNM didn't need to recover the onside this time as it was kicked straight out of bounds, and Dampier knelt down twice for the win.

The Lobos took a 21-10 lead into the break when Dampier scored his second touchdown of the game with just 22 seconds left in the half. That capped a 67-yard drive, although UNM allowed a late long field goal by the Aggies to make it 21-10 at the break.

The Lobos pulled away in the second quarter when Dampier led UNM on a long 95-yard touchdown drive, capping that off with first of his three touchdowns. Dampier, who started the game just 6-for-15 passing, ended up 13-for-28 for 248 yards but his career-high three TDs led the way.

Rogers capped the opening touchdown drive, a drive that featured UNM converting on a fourth-and-1. On the first play after that touchdown, New Mexico State got an 84-yard run for a score, but until the field goal at the end of the half, that was its only points.
