AZTECS LOOK TO CLINCH A SPOT IN THE MW CHAMPIONSHIP GAME FRIDAY AT NEW MEXICO

■ Sitting atop the Mountain West standings with a one-game lead on three teams, San Diego State travels to Albuquerque to meet New Mexico on Friday. The game is set for a 1:30 p.m. MT kick (12:30 p.m. PT), airing on CBS Sports Network and San Diego Sports 760, the flagship radio station of San Diego State athletics.

■ The Aztecs (9-2 overall), who were picked to finish eighth in the media preseason poll in the 12-team Mountain West, enter Friday's contest with a 6-1 record in MW play, one game ahead of Boise State, New Mexico and UNLV, all at 5-2.

■ The top two teams meet one another in the MW Championship game on Friday, Dec. 5.

■ Should SDSU beat the Lobos (8-3 overall), it will host the championship game at Snapdragon Stadium.

■ If San Diego State falls to UNM, it will have to deal with the MW Championship tiebreaking procedures. If there is a tie between two teams, head-to-head result will determine the host, followed by the highest CFP Selection Committee Rankings (or composite of selected predictive and results-based computer metrics [Connelly SP+, ESPN SOR, KPI, and SportSource]). If still tied, other tiebreaking procedures come into play, including overall winning percentage against all opponents, record against the next highest-placed team, winning percentage against common opponents and finally a coin toss conducted virtually by the Commissioner.

■ If there is a tie between three or more teams, head-to-head winning percentages among the tied teams are compared in a mini round-robin format until one or more teams gain an advantage or the process reverts to the two-team tiebreak format. If still tied, the highest CFP Selection Committee Rankings (or composite of selected predictive and results-based computer metrics [Connelly SP+, ESPN SOR, KPI, and SportSource]) and subsequent tiebreakers come into play as mentioned above.

■ The Aztecs, who have won the MW Championship three times before - 2012, 2015 and 2016 - are playing their fourth team with at least a .500 record at game time over the last five games (SDSU is 3-1 over that stretch against teams with at least a .500 winning percentage).

■ At 6-1, this matches SDSU's second-best start in MW history.

■ This is the sixth time San Diego State has started with at least a 6-1 league record in its 27 seasons of MW play (7-0 in 2015, 6-1 in 2012, 2013, 2016, 2021 and 2025). As mentioned, the Aztecs went on to win MW titles in 2012, 2015 and 2016.

■ Friday's game will be one of the best of the weekend with a combined 77.3 winning percentage (SDSU 9-2, UNM 8-3). There are only eight other games this weekend that feature two teams with at least eight victories, including Navy (8-2) at Memphis (8-3) on Thursday, Georgia (10-1) at Georgia Tech (9-2) on Friday, Texas A&M (11-0) at Texas (8-3) on Friday, Arizona (8-3) at Arizona State (8-3) on Friday, Ohio State (11-0) at Michigan (9-2) on Saturday, Miami (Fla.) (9-2) at Pittsburgh (8-3) on Saturday, Oregon (10-1) at Washington (8-3) on Saturday, and Vanderbilt (9-2) at Tennessee (8-3) on Saturday.

- Only 10 teams have more victories this season than San Diego State's 10, including Indiana, Ohio State and Texas A&M at 11-0, and Brigham Young, Georgia, James Madison, North Texas, Ole Miss, Oregon and Texas Tech at 10-1.
- The Aztecs are receiving votes in both the AP Top 25 poll and the Coaches poll for the seventh straight week. SDSU has 19 votes in the AP poll (up from 12 last week), the 30th most in the poll, and 29 in the Coaches poll (up from 19 last week), the 32nd most.
- SDSU is coming off a 25-3 win over San Jose State on Saturday night, its seventh win of the season without trailing.
- San Diego State limiting the high-powered Spartan offense, which came into the game averaging 313.8 passing yards and 7.53 yards per attempt, to a season-low 135 passing yards and a 3.55 yards per attempt average, its lowest since a 2.27 mark at Western Michigan on Sept. 25, 2021.
- The Aztecs held SJSU without a touchdown for the first time since that WMU game and the first time in a Mountain West contest since a 42-3 SDSU win on Oct. 21, 2016. Five of SJSU's 11 drives ended in either a three-and-out (or less) or a turnover, while another two ended in missed field goals. San Jose State didn't have a play longer than 19 yards in the game.
- The win completed an undefeated regular season at home for SDSU, its first since 1996 and sixth in its Division I history. San Diego State outscored the opposition, 187-41, at home in the regular season.
- The Aztecs also improved to 3-0 against teams from California this season, outscoring Cal, Fresno State and San Jose State by a combined 82-3 margin.
- In San Diego State's nine wins this year, it's outscoring the opposition, 260-54, (28.9-6.0).
- SDSU has wins against Boise State and Fresno State in the same season (note that San Diego State didn't start playing BS until it joined the Mountain West in 2011) for the first time. The only other teams to beat both Boise State and Fresno State in the same season in their MW era are Air Force (2015 and 2016) and Utah State (2015).
- Through 11 games, the San Diego State defense leads the Mountain West in rushing touchdowns allowed (3, 1st in FBS), passing yards per attempt (5.12, 2nd in FBS), touchdowns allowed (15, T-3rd in FBS), points allowed per game (11.64, 2nd in FBS), yards allowed per play (4.03, 3rd in FBS), pass efficiency rating (98.13, 3rd in FBS), red zone defensive percentage (68.18, 3rd in FBS), offensive touchdowns allowed (13, 3rd in FBS), total touchdowns allowed (15, T-3rd in FBS), defensive touchdowns (4, T-3rd in FBS), passing yards per completion (9.65, 4th in FBS), total yards allowed per game (262.91, 6th in FBS), passing yards allowed per game (159.73, 6th in FBS), first downs allowed (165, 8th in FBS), rushing yards allowed per attempt (3.03, 14th in FBS), passing touchdowns allowed (10, T-14th in FBS), rushing yards allowed per game (103.18, 16th in FBS), and ranks second in third down percentage (32.16, 18th in FBS).
- The Aztecs have allowed just 128 points (11.6 avg.), including 38 of those at Hawai'i on Nov. 8, 36 at Washington State on Sept. 6 and 24 on Oct. 3 vs. Colorado State. In the other eight games, SDSU has allowed just 30 points total (3.8 avg.).

REBOUNDING FROM 2024

San Diego State has already bettered its win total from the 2024 season. The Aztecs and Southern Miss are the only schools out of 20 who are bowl eligible after winning three or fewer wins a year ago.

He's also added four sacks for 44 yards, five pass breakups, an interception and five quarterback hurries.
- S Dalesean Staley (64 tackles, 9 PBU), CB Chris Johnson (49 tackles, 4 INT (2 for TD), 8 PBU) and EDGE Trey White (43 tackles, 8.5 TFL, 6 sacks) have been the other top defensive performers.
- RB Lucky Sutton leads the Mountain West with 1,127 yards and 102.5 rushing yards per game, to go along with nine touchdowns on 217 carries (5.2 avg.). Sutton is the 20th different Aztec with a 1,000-yard rushing season (28th time overall). He has five 100-yard games, including two 150-yard games, in the 11 starts this year.
- QB Jayden Denegal has thrown for 1,645 yards and eight touchdowns, completing 129 of 219 passes with seven interceptions for a 127.7 pass efficiency rating. He's added four rushing touchdowns.
- Three starters are out for the season because of injury, including WR/PR/KR Jordan Napier (48 rec., 629 yds., 2 TD | 22 PR, 193 yds., 1 TD), WR Jacob Bostick (11 rec., 157 yds., 3 TD) and LB Tano Letuli (30 tackles, 1 INT for a TD).
- K Gabe Plascencia, who is 18 for 20 on field goal attempts this season for a .900 field goal percentage and is a semifinalist for the Lou Groza Award, currently has the highest field goal percentage (.921) in NCAA FBS history (NCAA's minimum of 1.2 field goals per game and 30 made field goals).
- On July 1, 2026, the Aztecs officially become a member of the new Pac-12 along with league stalwarts Oregon State and Washington State, as well as Boise State, Colorado State, Gonzaga (for men's basketball only), Fresno State, Texas State and Utah State.
- SDSU is 68-35 (.660) in league play since the current 12-team Mountain West conference began play in 2013 (includes championship and bowl games), which ranks as the second-best mark in the league behind Boise State (87-20, .813), Utah State (third, .588), Fresno State (fourth, .581), and Colorado State (sixth, .475) each will join San Diego State in the new Pac-12 next season.
- Friday marks the 46th meeting between New Mexico and San Diego State, with the Aztecs owning a 29-16 series advantage.
- San Diego State has won the last nine of the last 10 games played between the teams, although the Lobos won the eight encounters before that stretch.
- SDSU has a 14-7 record all-time against the Lobos in Albuquerque, including four straight wins at UNM.
- The Aztecs also have a 48-11 win over Central Michigan in the 2019 New Mexico Bowl at University Stadium, making it five consecutive victories for SDSU inside the stadium.
- Amazingly, this is the fifth time in the last seven meetings that the two schools have played on a Friday (also 2014, 2017, 2022 and 2024), including three meetings.
- Prior to the New Mexico's 21-16 win at San Diego State last year, the last win in the series by the Lobos was Oct. 18, 2008. Last year's victory snapped a nine-game winning streak by the Aztecs.
- San Diego State's 29 victories are the second most for the program against any Division I opponent. The Aztecs' 32 victories over rival Fresno State are first.
- New Mexico enters Friday's game on a five-game winning streak, which is tied for the seventh-longest active streak in the country.

2025 SEASON SET-UP

- San Diego State head coach Lewis began his head coaching career at Kent State in 2018, as the Golden Flashes went 2-10 in his first season at the helm. The following year, Lewis led Kent State to a 7-6 record, including a 6-2 mark in Mid-American Conference play and a berth in the MAC Championship game. The Golden Flashes then went on to win the Frisco Bowl over Utah State, 51-41, the program's first bowl win in program history.
- In the COVID-shortened 2020 season, Kent State led the country in scoring (49.8) and total offense (606.5), ranked second in in pass efficiency rating (191.2) and third down conversion percentage (56.1), third in rushing (283.0) and fourth down conversion percentage (87.5), and 10th in passing (323.5).
- In 2021, Kent State set program records in plays (1,052), yards (6,907), first downs (364), rushing yards (3,482) and passing yards (3,425). Additionally, the Golden Flashes ranked third in the country that year in rushing (248.6) and first downs (364), fourth in total offense (495.2) and 30th in scoring (33.0).
- Lewis departed Kent State to be the offensive coordinator at Colorado in 2023. Over the last two-plus seasons without Lewis at the helm, the Golden Flashes are 6-29 with a 4-28 mark against FBS teams and a 4-19 record in MAC play. KSU snapped a 21-game losing streak on Aug. 30 with a 21-17 win over Merrimack out of the FCS.
- SDSU returns seven of its nine all-Mountain West players from a year ago, including first-team EDGE performer Trey White. White had a breakout season in 2024, totaling 60 tackles (40 solo), 18.5 tackles for loss (No. 1 in MW, No. 7 (tied) in FBS), 12.5 sacks (No. 1 in MW, No. 5 (tied) in FBS), two pass breakups and a forced fumble. White was named the MW preseason defensive player of the year in July at the media days in Las Vegas. He is the first San Diego State defensive lineman to be named the MW preseason defensive player of the year and the fourth defensive player overall, joining cornerback Leon McFadden in 2012, cornerback Damontae Kazee in 2016 and safety Patrick Morris in 2022.
- Plascencia was named the MW Preseason Special Teams Player of the Year after making 13 of 14 field goals a year ago for a SDSU single-season record 92.9 field goal percentage. He became SDSU's third MW preseason special teams player of the year over the last four seasons (also KR/PR Jordan Byrd in 2022 and P/K Jack Browning in 2023).
- The Aztecs also return honorable-mention performers safety Eric Butler, cornerback Chris Johnson, linebacker Tano Letuli, who joined White and Plascencia on the preseason all-MW team, wide receiver Jordan Napier and offensive lineman Ross Ulugalu-Maseuli.
- SDSU brings back all 11 starters on defense (note that returning Teivis Tuioti and departing Tupu Alualu each had six starts at defensive tackle and are counted as co-starters).
- The Aztecs have 26 players in their final season of eligibility, which is tied for the 11th most in the country.
- Additionally, SDSU returns 13 starters from a year ago, which is tied for the ninth most in the country. The only teams with more starters returning are Arizona State (16), Clemson (16), Illinois (16), Penn State (16), Alabama (14), Boise State (14), Duke (14) and Texas A&M (14).
- On offense, the Aztecs will have many new faces with just two starters returning in offensive linemen Ross Ulugalu-Maseuli and

Christian Jones.

- SDSU returns only 34 rushing yards from a year ago (second fewest in the country according to a recent FBS athletic communications survey), 48 passing yards (none by a quarterback, fourth fewest in the country), 82 yards of total offense (second fewest in the country) and 36 points scored (third fewest in the country).
- In all, San Diego State welcomes 55 total newcomers (combining scholarships and walk-ons).

PROGRAM AT A GLANCE

- SDSU's 71.9 combined winning percentage in football and men's basketball since the fall of 2010 only trails Ohio State (.726) and Oregon (.721). Rounding out the top 10 are Duke (.715), Alabama (.698), Arizona (.684), Wisconsin (.683), Michigan State (.682), Brigham Young (.679) and Houston (.678).
- Since the start of the 2015 campaign, San Diego State ranks in a tie for 20th in the country (also Wisconsin) with a 64.2 winning percentage (min. 100 games played as an FBS school) (87-49).
- SDSU had five double-digit victory seasons from 2015-21. Only eight schools in the nation can say that - San Diego State, Alabama, Appalachian State, Clemson, Georgia, Notre Dame, Ohio State and Oklahoma.
- San Diego State posted 13 consecutive seasons with at least a .500 record until 2022. That was tied for the sixth-longest streak nationally and was the longest streak among Pacific Time Zone teams.
- The Aztecs have played in 12 bowl games since 2010, tied for the 20th most in the country. The only teams with more bowl appearances since 2010 other than SDSU are Alabama, Clemson, Oklahoma, Georgia, Ohio State, Oregon, Wisconsin, Boise State, Notre Dame, LSU, Oklahoma State, Brigham Young, Michigan, Louisville, Texas A&M, Kansas State, Washington, Virginia Tech and Mississippi State.
- Since the start of the 2019 campaign, San Diego State is 36-21 in games decided by seven or more points.
- The Aztecs are 29-17 in their last 46 games decided by one score.
- San Diego State is 57-29 (.663) in its last 86 regular-season games against Mountain West opponents.
- SDSU's defensive rankings since 2014: 2nd in interceptions (175), 9th in both scoring defense (19.8) and total defense (325.2), and tied for 11th in turnovers forced (251).
- Since the start of the 2015 season, San Diego State has 14 kickoff returns for touchdowns, tied for the most in the country over that span.
- The Aztecs also have five 100-yard kickoff return touchdowns since 2015, tied for the second most in the nation over that span.

- San Diego State is 61-2 the last 63 times it has rushed for 200 yards. The Aztecs surpassed 200 yards in the opener vs. Stony Brook, Oct. 3 vs. Colorado State, Oct. 11 at Nevada and Oct. 25 at Fresno State.
- The Aztecs are 94-28 since 2011 when committing one turnover or less, something SDSU has done in 58 of its last 83 games.
- SDSU has an advantage in time of possession in 48 of the last 83 games. Since 2011, the Aztecs are 37-9 when possessing the football for at least 35 minutes.

DEFENSIVE KEYS

- The Aztecs are 80-5 since 2011 when holding the opposition to 17 points or less. SDSU has held 37 of its last 78 opponents to 17 points or less.
- San Diego State has won 30 of its last 35 games when forcing at least two turnovers (SDSU's 17-game winning streak came to an end on Sept. 3, 2022 vs. Arizona) and 36 straight games when forcing at least three turnovers (2-0 this season).
- San Diego State is 78-6 in its Division I history when owning at least a plus-3 turnover advantage, something it did on Sept. 20 in a 34-0 win over California.
- The Aztecs are 39-11 since 2011 when allowing less than 150 passing yards.
- San Diego State is 67-10 the last 77 times it has held the opposition to a 33.3 percent or less mark on third down.
- Since 2009, San Diego State's record broken down by opponent passing efficiency: less than 110: 82-11; between 110-150: 47-33; greater than 150: 8-37.
- Since the start of the 2015 campaign, SDSU is 55-5 when holding its opponent to a passing efficiency rating of below 110.

SPECIAL TEAMS / OVERALL TRENDS

- San Diego State is 24-4 since 2020 when winning the turnover battle and 57-6 since 2015.
- San Diego State is 43-14 the last 57 times it has an advantage in field position.
- Since the start of the 2015 season, San Diego State has 14 kickoff returns for touchdowns, tied with Kansas State for the most in FBS play over that time. To put that stat into perspective, six other teams have played at least 100 games over that span and do not have a single kick return touchdown.
- The Aztecs have 19 non-offensive touchdowns since the start of the 2021 season. Only six schools have more non-offensive touchdowns over that span, including Notre Dame (29), Pittsburgh (27), Iowa (22), South Carolina (21), Ohio State (20) and Utah (20). Over that span, SDSU has eight interception returns for touchdowns, four blocked punt returns for touchdowns, three fumble recoveries for a touchdown, two kickoff returns for a touchdown and two punt returns for a touchdown.
- Since the start of the Sean Lewis era in 2024, San Diego State has eight non-offensive touchdowns, tied for the seventh most in the country over that span. Only Notre Dame (14), Pittsburgh (12), Brigham Young (11), South Carolina (10), UNLV (10) and Louisville (9) have more over that span.
- SDSU has won 46 of its last 51 games leading after three quarters (30-game winning streak was snapped at Fresno State on Oct.

OFFENSES STOP HERE

San Diego State's defensive unit has improved dramatically from the first season of the Sean Lewis era in 2024 to this season in 2025.

Rob Aurich is in his first season as the defensive coordinator after coaching the edges last year. Although only 11 games into the 2025 campaign, SDSU has improved in almost every defensive category.

Through 11 games, the San Diego State defense leads the Mountain West in rushing touchdowns allowed (3, 1st in FBS), passing yards per attempt (5.12, 2nd in FBS), touchdowns allowed (15, T-3rd in FBS), points allowed per game (11.64, 2nd in FBS), yards allowed per play (4.03, 3rd in FBS), pass efficiency rating (98.13, 3rd in FBS), red zone defensive percentage (68.18, 3rd in FBS), offensive touchdowns allowed (13, 3rd in FBS), total touchdowns allowed (15, T-3rd in FBS), defensive touchdowns (4, T-3rd in FBS), passing yards per completion (9.65, 4th in FBS), total yards allowed per game (262.91, 6th in FBS), passing yards allowed per game (159.73, 6th in FBS), first downs allowed (165, 8th in FBS), rushing yards allowed per attempt (3.03, 14th in FBS), passing touchdowns allowed (10, T-14th in FBS), rushing yards allowed per game (103.18, 16th in FBS), and ranks second in third down percentage (32.16, 18th in FBS).

The Aztecs have allowed just 128 points (11.6 avg.), including 38 of those at Hawai'i on Nov. 8, 36 at Washington State on Sept. 6 and 24 on Oct. 3 vs. Colorado State. In the other eight games, SDSU has allowed just 30 points total (3.8 avg.).

Another way to look at SDSU's impressive numbers is that it is allowing 262.9 yards and 11.6 points per game. In SDSU's opponents other games this season, they are 51-60 (.456) and are averaging 357.4 yards and 23.7 points per game.

Here are some more bullet points on SDSU's defense, which returned all 11 starters on defense (note that returning Teivis Tuioti and departing Tupu Alualu each had six starts at defensive tackle, and are counted as co-starters).

- San Diego State shut out Stony Brook, 42-0, in the opener on Aug. 28. It was its first shutout since beating Weber State, 6-0, on Aug. 31, 2019.
- The 42 points were the fourth-most points the Aztecs have scored in a shutout in their Division I history (since 1969).
- That was SDSU's fifth shutout in a season opener in its Division I history.
- San Diego State then shut out California, 34-0, on Sept. 20. It was the Aztecs' first shutout against a current team from a Power 5 conference since beating Oregon State, 25-0, on Sept. 13, 1975.
- Cal, which came into the game averaging 32.0 points, was shut out for the first time since Oct. 26, 2019 at No. 12 Utah and the first time against an unranked team since Oct. 22, 1994 at USC.
- SDSU had home consecutive shutouts to start a season for the first time in its Division I history (since 1969).
- The Aztecs shut out Fresno State in Fresno on Oct. 25. **It was the first time the Bulldogs were shut out at home since Oct. 25, 1980, first time in any game since Nov. 5, 2016, first time in the series since 1998 and first time in Fresno in the series since 1975.**
- It was SDSU's first road shutout since Nov. 8, 2003 at UNLV and 10th in its DI history (since 1969).
- **San Diego State has three shutouts in the same season for the first time in its Division I history (since 1969).**
- **The Aztecs' three shutouts are the most in FBS play this season.**
- Only Wisconsin (four in 2019) has had more shutouts in a season than SDSU over the last 10 years.
- SDSU then allowed just three points in a 6-3 win at Northern Illinois on Sept. 27. The three points allowed over the two-game stretch (Sept. 20 vs. California and Sept. 27 at NIU) were its the fewest allowed in a two-game stretch by the Aztecs since 1975 (0 points at Fresno State on Oct. 11 and three points vs. New Mexico State on Oct. 18).
- San Diego State did not allow touchdowns in consecutive games for the first time since 2016 (Oct. 14 at Fresno State and Oct. 21 vs. San José State).
- The three points by NIU were its fewest in a game since also scoring three vs. South Florida in the 2010 International Bowl (Jan. 2, 2010) (Northern Illinois also scored three at Toledo on Nov. 5) and fewest in a home game since being shut out vs. Navy on Nov. 15, 2008.
- **Fourteen (14) of the 38 points allowed by San Diego State at Hawai'i on Nov. 8 came on a pick-6 and a kick return touchdown. If you take away those two scores, the Aztecs have allowed 114 points over 11 games (10.36).**
- This year, opponents have had 128 drives where they tried to score on SDSU (does not include kneeldowns) and the Aztecs have forced three-and-outs (or less) on 52 of those drives (40.6 pct.). SDSU is averaging 4.73 three-and-outs per game.

San Diego State junior Trey White made the most of his move from linebacker where he played in 2023 to the new EDGE position in SDSU's 4-2-5 defense. White, who prepped at nearby Eastlake High School in Chula Vista, was named a captain by his teammates in 2024, along with Tano Letuli the first Aztec underclassmen to be named captains since current Minnesota Vikings head coach Kevin O'Connell (O'Connell was a four-time team captain from 2004-07). He was then named captain once again for the 2025 season.

White has racked up a multitude of preseason awards, including the MW preseason defensive player of the year, and watch lists for the Chuck Bednarik Award (most outstanding defensive player), the Bronko Nagurski Trophy (national defensive player of the year) and the Senior Bowl Top 300, after earning first-team all-MW accolades in 2024. White was the first San Diego State defensive lineman to be named the MW preseason defensive player of the year and the fourth defensive player overall, joining cornerback Leon McFadden in 2012, cornerback Damontae Kazee in 2016 and safety Patrick Morris in 2022.

White has 18.5 career sacks, which are the tied for the eighth most in program history. In 11 games this season, White has totaled 43 tackles, 8.5 tackles for a loss, six sacks, a pass breakup and 15 quarterback hurries.

This year, White ranks fourth in the Mountain West in sack yards (46, T-32nd in FBS), tied for fifth in tackle for loss yards (52, T-55th in FBS), tied for sixth in total sacks (6.0, T-45th in FBS), tied for seventh in sacks per game (0.55, T-51st in FBS), ninth in tackles for loss (8.5) and tackles for loss per game (0.77).

Below are some notes on White's 2024 season.

- White totaled 60 tackles (40 solo), including 18.5 tackles for a loss of 102 yards and 12.5 sacks for 68 yards, while adding a forced fumble and two pass breakups.
- White ranked fourth in FBS last year in sacks per game (1.04) and tackles for loss per game (1.54), tied for fifth in sacks (12.5), seventh in total tackles for loss (18.5) and tackles for loss yards (102), and tied for 13th in sack yards (68). White led the Mountain West in all of those categories.
- White ranked in a tie for third in SDSU single-season history with 12.5 sacks with Andy Coviello (1991), only trailing Mike Douglass (21.0 in 1976) and Brett Faryniarz (13.0 in 1987).
- White's 18.5 tackles for loss, meanwhile, were the 13th most in SDSU single-season history.
- According to Pro Football Focus, White ranked in a tie for 39th in the country (third in MW) in quarterback pressures (39).
- White logged three sacks and four tackles for loss at Central Michigan on Sept. 28, 2024. He was the first Aztec with four TFLs in a game since Jay Henderson had four vs. Northern Illinois on Sept. 30, 2017.
- White followed with another three sacks and four tackles for loss once again vs. Hawai'i on Oct. 5 en route to being named the Mountain West Defensive Player of the Week on Oct. 7 for the first time of his career. According to Pro Football Focus, White's eight quarterback pressures were tied for the second most in the country that week, while his five quarterback hurries were tied for seventh.
- White came up with two sacks and three tackles for loss the following week at Wyoming on Oct. 12, making it four straight games with multiple sacks.

Johnson

Senior cornerback Chris Johnson is off to an incredible start in his senior season. Johnson, who was a honorable-mention all-Mountain West selection last year after recording 67 tackles, three forced fumbles, four pass breakups and an interception, has stepped up his game in 2025. In 10 games (Johnson missed the Hawai'i game with an injury), he has totaled 49 tackles (36 solo), four interceptions for 146 yards and two touchdowns, eight pass breakups, a forced fumble, sack and three tackles for loss.

Johnson was recently named a midseason first-team All-American by the Associated Press, along with a second-team pick by Sports Illustrated, Pro Football Network and Athlon Sports.

■ According to Pro Football Focus, Johnson is ranked as the top cornerback in the country this year with a 91.9 defensive grade. That mark is even more impressive when considering the minimum defensive snaps for that grade is just 10. He's also No. 1 in coverage grade among cornerbacks at 92.1 (min. just 15 snaps).

- According to PFF, when targeted against Johnson this year, receivers are 19-for-43 (44.2 pct.) for 185 yards, four interceptions and no touchdowns. That's a defensive pass efficiency rating of 61.72.
- Johnson returned an interception 97 yards for a touchdown against California on Sept. 20. It is tied for the seventh-longest interception return this season and tied for the fifth-longest interception return in program history. He then added a 45-yard interception returned for a score at Nevada on Oct. 11.
- Johnson's two interception returns for a touchdown are tied for the most in SDSU single-season history and tied for the third most in program history.
- Johnson's 232 career interception yards are the sixth most in program history.
- This year, despite missing the Hawai'i game on Nov. 8 with an injury, Johnson leads the Mountain West in interception yards (146, 3rd in FBS) and passes defended per game (1.20, T-9th in FBS), and is tied for first in interception returns for a touchdown (2, T-1st in FBS) and total interceptions (4, T-10th in FBS), tied for second in interceptions per game (0.40, T-13th in FBS), and tied for seventh in total pass breakups (8, T-38th in FBS).

SERIES HISTORY

- Friday marks the 46th meeting between New Mexico and San Diego State, with the Aztecs owning a 29-16 series advantage.
- San Diego State has won the last nine of the last 10 games played between the teams, although the Lobos won the eight encounters immediately prior to the Aztecs current win streak.
- Despite the Aztec victories in the last nine of the last games, New Mexico has still outscored San Diego State, 424-395 (23.6-21.9), in the last 18 games.
- San Diego State has a 14-7 record all-time against the Lobos in Albuquerque, including four straight wins at UNM.
- The Aztecs also have a 48-11 win over Central Michigan in the 2019 New Mexico Bowl at University Stadium, making it five consecutive victories for SDSU inside the stadium.
- SDSU and New Mexico met in 34 consecutive seasons from 1978 through 2011. That streak came to an end in 2012. On Friday, the Aztecs and Lobos will meet for the 42nd time in the last 48 seasons.
- Amazingly, this is the fifth time in the last seven meetings that the two schools have played on a Friday, including three straight games (also 2014, 2017, 2022 and 2024).
- Prior to the New Mexico's 21-16 win at San Diego State last year, the last win in the series by the Lobos was Oct. 18, 2008. Last year's victory snapped a nine-game winning streak by the Aztecs.
- San Diego State's 29 victories are the second most for the program against any Division I opponent. The Aztecs' 32 victories over rival Fresno State are first.
- Just 17 points would have been enough to win 10 of the last 19 games between the teams. The losing team has scored a total of 274 points in the last 19 games combined (average of 14.4 points per game).
- Of the last 26 series meetings, 11 have been decided by a touchdown or less. Of those 11 games, one game was decided by one point, five games were decided by three points, two games were decided by five points, one game was decided by six points and two games were decided by seven points.
- The Aztecs won 13 consecutive games in the series from Nov. 17, 1984 through Oct. 19, 1996, with the streak broken on Oct. 11, 1997.
- The composite score of the previous 45 meetings is San Diego State 1,165, New Mexico 1,107, making the average score SDSU 25.9, New Mexico 24.6. There is a 58-point difference in total points scored between the two teams in the 45-game history of the series.
- The last 17 times there has been a difference in the amount of turnovers between the two teams, the team committing fewer turnovers is 13-4.
- **SERIES TIDBITS:** San Diego State defeated New Mexico in nine consecutive meetings from 2009-22 for the first time in the Mountain West era and first time since a school-record 13-game winning streak from 1984-96... New Mexico has scored 122 points in the last eight meetings (15.3 ppg)... San Diego State has scored more than 24 points just seven times in the last 20 meetings, but in seven of the last nine... San Diego State has had a turnover advantage against New Mexico just three times since 2002... In the last 15 meetings, the Aztecs own a -14 turnover margin... In the last 13 meetings, San Diego State has had an average field position disadvantage five times, including games with a margin disadvantage of -22, -20, -13 and -7... In 2011, the Aztecs rushed for five touchdowns as part of a 230-yard effort on the ground... In the last eight encounters against UNM, San Diego State has rushed for 1,813 and yards and 23 touchdowns... San Diego State in three straight home games prior to last year's loss.

SAN DIEGO STATE-NEW MEXICO CONNECTIONS

- San Diego State running back Christian Washington spent two seasons at New Mexico. Washington rushed for 321 yards on 85 attempts (3.8 avg.) in 2022 and 2023, while adding 13 catches for 79 yards (6.1 avg.). He also returned 20 kickoffs for 479 yards (24.0 avg.), including a 100-yard touchdown against Boise State on Sept. 9, 2022.
- San Diego State defensive coordinator and linebackers coach Rob Aurich was in the same role at Idaho in 2022 and 2023, as was defensive line coach David Lose and senior defensive analyst Tyler Sutton was the recruiting coordinator and tight ends coach for those teams as well as the special teams coordinator and tight ends coach in 2024. New Mexico head coach Jason Eck ran the Vandals' program from 2022-24 and the Lobos' offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach Luke Schleusner had the same title for Idaho. New Mexico defensive backs coach and passing game coordinator Stanley Franks, Jr. was in charge of the Vandals' cornerbacks. New Mexico offensive line coach Cody Booth was in the same position for Idaho and UNM defensive line coach Hebron "Loni" Fangupo coached the Idaho defensive line in 2024. Lobos director of strength and conditioning Caleb Heim was the head strength and conditioning coach for those seasons at Idaho and New Mexico director of scouting John Waters was a recruiting quality control staffer at Idaho in 2023 and 2024.
- SDSU associate head coach, special teams coordinator and tight ends coach Zac Barton was a defensive line and special teams coach at Winona State in 2007 and 2008, while UNM head coach Jason Eck was the offensive line and tight ends coach for the Warriors during those seasons as well as co-offensive coordinator in 2008.
- Aztecs running backs coach Darian Hagan was in the same role at Colorado in 2016-18 while Lobos associate head coach and special

teams coordinator Daniel Da Prato was the director of quality control for the Buffaloes offense.

- New Mexico receivers coach Colin Lockett played wide receiver for San Diego State from 2010-13 and returned to The Mesa as a graduate assistant in 2020.
- SDSU associate head coach, special teams coordinator and tight ends coach Zac Barton was the special teams coordinator at Kansas in 2023 while UNM defensive recruiting graduate assistant Danny Urquhart was a scouting and recruiting intern for the Jayhawks.
- Aztecs tight end Connor Irons and Lobos offensive lineman Tyler Lawrence both transferred from Air Force in Colorado Springs, Colorado.
- San Diego State offensive lineman Joseph Borjon and New Mexico tight end Dorian Thomas spent time at Arizona in Tucson, Arizona.
- SDSU defensive lineman Tiumalu Afalava and running back Byron Cardwell Jr., and UNM tight end Simon Mapa attended California in Berkeley, California.
- Aztec defensive lineman Krishna Clay, punter Tashi Dorje, tight end Timothy Netane, kicker Gabriel Plascencia and long snapper Luke Williams, and Lobos tight end Simon Mapa all played football at the College of San Mateo in San Mateo, California.
- San Diego State safety Dwayne McDougle, and New Mexico running back Deshaun Buchanan, linebacker Jaxton Eck, defensive end Keyshawn James-Newby, quarterback Jack Layne, offensive lineman Kaden Robnett, defensive end Xavier Slayton and cornerback Abraham Williams competed at Idaho in Moscow, Idaho.
- SDSU punter Hunter Green and UNM offensive lineman Trace Edmundson both played at Northern Colorado in Greeley, Colorado.
- Aztecs safety Dalesean Staley and Lobos safety Albert Nunes attended Northern Iowa in Cedar Falls, Iowa.
- San Diego State safety Deshawn McCuin, and New Mexico tight end Cade Keith went to college at TCU in Fort Worth, Texas.
- SDSU wide receiver Jacob Bostick and UNM offensive lineman James Bailey both transferred from Texas A&M in College Station, Texas.
- Aztecs wide receiver Jerry McClure and Lobos safety Clint Stephens spent time at UCLA in Los Angeles.
- San Diego State offensive lineman Bayo Kannike and New Mexico cornerback Jayden Sheridan both attended Utah Tech in St. George, Utah.
- SDSU safety Hunter Haines and UNM defensive end Gabriel Lopez played football at Washington State in Pullman, Washington.
- Aztecs defensive lineman Tiumalu Afalava and Lobos tight end Aiden Valdez both prepped at Bishop Amat High in La Puente, California.
- San Diego State running back Christian Washington and New Mexico wide receiver Xavier Van competed at Helix High in La Mesa, California.
- SDSU running back Cincere Rhaney and UNM safety CJ McBean both played at Serra High in Gardena, California.
- Aztecs defensive lineman Malachi Finau and Lobos cornerbacks Frankie Edwards III and Jon Johnson attended St. John Bosco High in Bellflower, California.

TEAM NOTES

- San Diego State had its nine-game winning streak snapped against New Mexico. The nine-game winning streak was tied for the Aztecs' longest against a team (also New Mexico State).
- It was the first win in the series by the Lobos since 2008.
- SDSU fell to 2-3 on the season in one-score games (all happening over its last six). The five one-score games have been decided by a total of 15 points.
- San Diego State overcame its largest deficit (11 points) since overcoming a 14-point deficit to San Jose State on Nov. 12, 2022 and winning, 43-27.
- The Aztecs fell to 79-44 (.642) since the start of the 2015 campaign, which is the 20th-best record in the country over that span.
- SDSU fell to 51-25 (.671) in its last 76 regular-season games against Mountain West opponents.
- San Diego State fell to 38-5 over its last 43 games when leading after the end of the third quarter.
- The Aztecs allowed just their third 100-yard rusher of the season.
- SDSU allowed just seven points in the second half, its fewest since also surrendering seven at Colorado State on Nov. 11, 2023.
- San Diego State had 26 first downs, its most since getting 31 vs. No. 24 UTSA in the 2021 Frisco Bowl.
- The Aztecs had five more first downs than UNM, their largest advantage against an FBS opponent since having nine more than at New Mexico on Nov. 18, 2022.
- SDSU ran its most plays (88) since running 99 against Eastern Illinois on Aug. 28, 2013.
- San Diego State played in its first turnover free game since Nov. 13, 2021 vs. Nevada.
- The Aztecs had more time of possession than their opponent for the first time this season.
- SDSU had an advantage in penalty yards (less than New Mexico) for the first time this season.
- San Diego State had its most third down conversions (11) since having 11 at San Jose State on Nov. 4, 2017.
- The Aztecs had their highest third down percentage (55.0) since having a 55.8 mark at No. 14 Brigham Young on Dec. 12,

SDSU Edged by New Mexico, 21-16

SAN DIEGO — San Diego State rallied from an early 14-3 deficit but was unable to hold on in a 21-16 loss to New Mexico Friday night at Snapdragon Stadium.

Eli Sanders had two long touchdown runs in the first quarter and Devon Dampier had a go-ahead touchdown pass in the fourth as the Lobos (3-6, 3-3 MW) beat the Aztecs (3-6, 2-2 MW) for the first time since 2008, snapping SDSU's nine-game winning streak in the series.

Sanders scored on a 51-yard run to cap a four-play 99-yard drive the second time UNM had the ball.

San Diego State got deep into New Mexico territory on its ensuing drive and almost scored on a tricky reverse, but wide receiver Jordan Napier's pass just missed a wide-open quarterback Danny O'Neil end the end zone on third-and-goal. The Aztecs had to settle for a 22-yard field goal by Gabe Plascencia, finishing up a 13-play, 71-yard drive.

Sanders raced 68 yards for a touchdown on the Lobos' second play from scrimmage on their third possession for a 14-3 lead after one quarter.

Napier set SDSU up in good field position with a career-long 61-yard kickoff return. San Diego State got to the UNM 7-yard line, but consecutive TFLs by New Mexico and an incomplete pass by O'Neil made the Aztecs take the three points on a 31-yard field goal.

Late in the half, Marquez Cooper caught a 5-yard pass from O'Neil and ran into the end zone untouched to close the Lobo lead to 14-13 at intermission.

After the teams traded punts coming out of the locker room, San Diego State went 80 yards on 16 plays before Plascencia connected on his third field goal of the game, this time from 28 yards and giving the Aztecs their first lead of the game at 16-14 with 1:39 to play in the third quarter.

UNM answered with a 9-play, 65-yard drive, culminating with an 8-yard touchdown pass from Dampier to Ryan Davis, making it 21-16 New Mexico with 13:07 left to play.

SDSU got all the way to the Lobo 35-yard line on its next drive, but Cam Davis was stuffed on a third-and-1 situation with a 4-yard loss. San Diego State head coach Sean Lewis elected to punt and Tyler Pastula pined UNM at its own 2.

New Mexico made it to the Aztec 34, using up 3:46 of the clock before Aaron Rodriguez punted to the SDSU 4.

San Diego State managed only 13 yards on five plays and would have to rely on its defense to get the ball back following another Pastula punt.

The Lobos, however, ran out the clock, including converting a third-and-6 with a 7-yard Dampier run. Dampier then kneeled to give UNM the 21-16 victory.

Sanders carried 16 times for 173 yards for the Lobos. Dampier completed 16 of 24 passes for 175 yards and rushed 16 times for 120 more.

Marquez Cooper totaled 123 yards on 35 carries for the Aztecs for his fourth 100-yard rushing game of the season and 21st of his career.

O'Neil had 195 yards on 26-for-41 passing, targeting Napier 16 times. Napier finished with nine catches for 63 yards. Chris Johnson led the SDSU defense with six tackles, keeping a team that came into the game averaging just under 35 points to 21 points, including seven in the second half.

San Diego State fell to 2-3 on the season in one-score games (all happening over its last six), decided by a total of 15 points.

The Aztecs had their most first downs (26) since the 2021 Frisco Bowl vs. No. 24 UTSA and ran their most plays (88) since running 99 against Eastern Illinois on Aug. 28, 2013.

Chambliss

Sophomore Owen Chambliss has made a dramatic leap from his redshirt freshman season last year to his second season on The Mesa in 2025. Chambliss, who played in four games as a true freshman on special teams at Utah in 2023, logged 31 tackles (16 solo) and a pass breakup in seven games in 2024, while missing five with an injury.

This season, Chambliss has been the stalwart in one of the best defenses in the country. In 11 games this year, Chambliss leads the Aztecs in tackles (99, No. 2 is 64), solo tackles (58, No. 2 is 38), assisted tackles (41, No. 2 is 30) and tackles for loss (9.5 for 63 yards). He's also added four sacks for 44 yards, five pass breakups, an interception and five quarterback hurries.

- According to Pro Football Focus, Chambliss has the second-best defensive grade among linebackers in the country (min. 600 snaps) at 86.2.
- Chambliss ranks second in the Mountain West in solo tackles per game (5.27, T-6th in FBS), solo tackles (58, T-7th in FBS) and tackles for loss yards (63, T-26th in FBS), fourth in total tackles (99, 20th in FBS) and tackles per game (9.00, 21st in FBS), tied for fourth in total tackles for loss (9.5) and tackles for loss per game (0.86), tied for sixth in sack yards (44, T-45th in FBS) and ninth in assisted tackles (41).
- Chambliss has four double-digit tackle games this season.
- Chambliss has 99 tackles for the season in 11 games, already the most by an Aztec since Kyahva Tezino had 99 in 2019 in 13 games.

HIS NAME IS LUCKY



Sutton

Junior running back Lucky Sutton is making the most of his first season of being the main running back. After playing in one game as a true freshman in 2022 before eventually utilizing his redshirt season, Sutton played in five games in 2023, rushing 30 times for 157 yards and two touchdowns. Last season, however, Sutton only appeared in four games with 35 yards on five carries while running behind first-team all-Mountain West running back Marquez Cooper.

Now as the bell cow for the first time of his career, Sutton has rushed 217 times for 1,127 yards (5.2 avg.) and nine touchdowns in his first career 11 starts.

Sutton starred at nearby Cathedral Catholic High School in San Diego, capturing numerous awards including the KUSI Silver Pigskin, the Honor Bowl MVP and Holy Bowl MVP. He ran for 3,581 yards and 44 touchdowns over his career, averaging 10.5 yards per attempt, including an amazing 2,628 yards as a senior with 36 touchdowns on 232 carries (11.3 avg.).

- Sutton was named a semifinalist for the Doak Walker Award on Nov. 18. Sutton is the first Aztec semifinalist for the Doak Walker Award since Rashaad Penny in 2017. Former Aztecs Donnell Pumphrey (2016), George Jones (1995) and Marshall Faulk (1993) have each been finalists for the award.
- Sutton has rushed for 1,127 yards and nine touchdowns on the season.
- Sutton is the 20th different Aztec with a 1,000-yard rushing season in program history (28th time overall).
- Sutton's 1,127 yards are the 19th most in SDSU single-season history.
- Sutton has five 100-yard games (out of 11 played) this season.
- Sutton leads the Mountain West in rushing attempts (217, 6th in FBS), rushing attempts per game (19.73, 6th in FBS), rushing yards (1,127, 9th in FBS), total all-purpose plays (220, T-10th in FBS) and rushing yards per game (102.45, 11th in FBS), and is tied for second in rushing touchdowns (9, T-44th in FBS), fourth in total all-purpose yards (1,122, T-39th in FBS), fifth in rushing yards per carry (5.19, 55th in FBS), sixth in all-purpose yards per game (102.00, T-48th in FBS), and tied for sixth in total touchdowns (9, T-63rd in FBS).
- Sutton rushed for his first career 100-yard game in the opener against Stony Brook on Aug. 28 with 100 yards on 23 carries (4.3 avg.). Sutton became the 85th different Aztec with a 100-yard rushing game and it was the 18th 100-yard game in an Aztec season opener. Sutton had five carries for 35 yards last season and entered the game with 200 career yards on 37 carries. He scored his first two touchdowns since scoring his only two against Hawai'i on Oct. 14, 2023.
- Sutton notched another 100-yard game against Colorado State on Oct. 3, rushing for a career-high 113 yards and two touchdowns on 21 attempts. He had his third career multiple touchdown game (two this season).
- Sutton recorded his third 100-yard rushing game of the season (and career) with a career-high 131 yards on 21 carries (6.2 avg.) with a touchdown at Fresno State on Oct. 25.

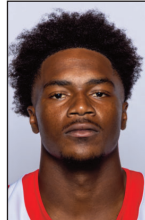

■ Sutton notched his second straight 100-yard rushing game for the first time of his career with a career-high 158 yards on 28 attempts (5.6 avg.) with a touchdown vs. Wyoming on Nov. 1. Included in the 158 yards was a career-long 50-yard run to score and seal the Aztec 24-7 win in his final attempt in the fourth quarter.

■ Sutton ran for 150 yards and 25 attempts (6.0 avg.) vs. Boise State on Nov. 15, his fifth 100-yard game of the year and second 150-yard effort. Sutton became the first player to run for at least 150 yards against Boise State since Wyoming's Titus Swen had 212 on Nov. 19, 2022. He's just the fifth player to run for at least 150 vs. Boise State in the last 10 years and the most ever by an Aztec vs. the Broncos.

Wide receiver Jordan Napier continues to impress, now in his third season at San Diego State. Napier, who was recruited as a safety and moved to wide receiver early in the 2023 camp, was off to a fast start 10 games into the season before an injury suffered against Boise State on Nov. 15 will cause him to miss the rest of the season.

Napier was named to the 2025 Paul Hornung Award Watch List during the preseason, goes out to the most versatile player in college football. He then was named to the Biletnikoff Award Watch List in October for the most outstanding receiver in FBS.

This season, Napier has 48 catches for 629 yards and two touchdowns through 10 games before suffering a season-ending injury. He also has rushed for 40 yards and a touchdown on 11 carries, and has returned 22 punts for 193 yards (8.8 avg.) with a 75-yard punt return touchdown and 11 kickoffs for 247 yards (22.5 avg.).

Last year, Napier reeled in 43 receptions for 440 receiving yards, while leading the team with four receiving touchdowns. He also played a role in the return game with four kickoff returns for 103 yards and three punt returns for 27 yards. For his efforts, he was named an all-Mountain West honorable-mention selection in 2024.

■ Jordan Napier was named to the Biletnikoff Award Watch List for the most outstanding receiver in FBS on Oct. 15. He's the first Aztec to make the list since Ezell Ruffin in 2014.

■ Napier was recently named a midseason second-team All-American by Pro Football Network.

■ In the receiving game, despite missing the last 1 1/2 games because of a season-ending injury, Napier ranks sixth in the Mountain West in receptions per game (4.80, T-67th in FBS), tied for sixth in total receptions (48), seventh in receiving yards per game (62.90, 73rd in FBS) and ninth in receiving yards (629).

■ Napier made nine catches for 151 yards and a touchdown against California on Sept. 20, then the most receiving yards since Jesse Matthews had 175 against No. 24/25 UTSA in the 2021 Frisco Bowl.

■ Two weeks later against Colorado State on Oct. 3, Napier had seven receptions for a career-high 153 yards and a touchdown. The 153 yards were the most by an Aztec in Snapdragon Stadium history.

■ Napier had his second straight 100-yard receiving game and third of the season (and career), all over the last four games, at Nevada on Oct. 11 with five catches for 110 yards. Napier also returned a punt 75 yards for a touchdown, SDSU's first punt return touchdown since Jordan Byrd had one against Idaho State on Sept. 10, 2022. The 75-yarder is SDSU's longest since BJ Busbee had a 90-yarder vs. Colorado State on Dec. 5, 2020.

■ In the return game, despite missing the last 1 1/2 games with an injury, Napier leads the Mountain West in punt returns per game (2.20, 2nd in FBS), total punt returns (22, T-3rd in FBS), punt return yards (193, 20th in FBS), combined kick and punt return yards (439, 20th in FBS) and punt return average (8.77, 29th in FBS), tied for first in punt return touchdowns (1, T-6th in FBS), fourth in all-purpose yards per game (110.80, 26th in FBS), fifth in kick returns per game (1.10, T-45th in FBS), total all-purpose yards (1,108, 46th in FBS) and all-purpose yards per play (12.00, T-65th in FBS), tied for fifth in total kick returns (11, T-57th in FBS) and ninth in kick return yards (246, 63rd in FBS).

■ Napier returned seven punts for 73 yards (10.4 avg.) against Stony Brook on Aug. 28. The seven punts were easily the most in Snapdragon Stadium history, three more than Mekhi Shaw from SDSU on Nov. 4, 2023 vs. Utah State.

Denegal

San Diego State football head coach Sean Lewis named Jayden Denegal the team's starting quarterback following practice on Aug. 13.

Denegal spent three seasons at Michigan from 2022-24 and was the backup quarterback to J.J. McCarthy for the Wolverines' national

championship season in 2023. He appeared in seven games at Michigan, completing 4 of 5 passes for 50 yards and a touchdown, while also rushing four times for 10 yards. The Aug. 28 opener was his first career start and he was named a captain on Aug. 23 by his team-

Denegal was a three-year starter at Apple Valley High School, totaling more than 4,600 passing yards and 69 touchdowns in his career. As a senior in 2021, he completed 121 of 145 passes for 1,545 yards and 24 touchdowns, while running for 281 yards and eight scores en route to being named the Mojave River League Offensive Player of the Year.

Denegal becomes the fourth straight quarterback to start at San Diego State having never started at another institution. The others were Jalen Mayden, who went 9-11 from 2022-23, Danny O'Neil (3-8 in 2024) and Javance Tupou'ata-Johnson (0-1 in 2024). The previous three quarterbacks went a combined 12-20 for a .375 winning percentage.

On the season, Denegal is 129-for-219 for 1,645 yards and eight touchdowns and seven interceptions, while owning a 127.66 pass efficiency rating.

- Denegal fourth in the Mountain West in yards per completion (12.75, 30th in FBS), sixth in yards per attempt (7.51, 58th in FBS), seventh in pass efficiency rating (127.66), eighth in completion percentage (58.90) and pass attempts per game (19.91), ninth in passing yards per game (149.45), passing yards (1,645), pass completions (129), pass attempts (219), total offense per game (157.82) and total offensive plays (279), and 10th in passing touchdowns (8), total offensive yards (1,736) and total offensive yards per play (6.22).
- Denegal's 189.1 pass efficiency rating in October was the fifth highest in the country (min. 50 attempts).
- In the opener against Stony Brook on Aug. 28, Denegal was 13-for-25 for 207 yards and a touchdown without throwing an interception, while owning a 134.8 passing efficiency rating. Quarterbacks are now 25-24-1 in their first game as a starter at SDSU in its Division I history (since 1969), but 8-3 since 2015.
- Denegal was 13-for-16 for a career-high 256 yards, two touchdowns (first game with multiple touchdown passes) and on interceptions against Colorado State on Oct. 3. The 256.90 pass efficiency rating is the third-highest mark in SDSU's Division I history (since 1969) and highest since Kevin McKechnie's school-record mark of 291.81 vs. Navy on Sept. 5, 1997. It was also a Snapdragon Stadium record.
- Denegal followed up with a 14-for-17 game at Nevada on Oct. 11 for 205 yards, two touchdowns and no interceptions for a 222.47 pass efficiency rating.
- Denegal's first career interception came on his 94th attempt (vs. Northern Illinois on Sept. 27).
- Denegal had two rushing touchdowns in a 17-7 Aztec win over Boise State on Nov. 15. Denegal became the fifth Aztec quarterback since at least the 1996 season with multiple rushing touchdowns in a game (also Kevin O'Connell - 4, Jalen Mayden - 2, Jordon Brookshire - 1, Ryan Katz - 1).
- If you take away the 12 times QB Jayden Denegal has been sacked this season (for 94 yards), he has rushed 48 times for 185 yards (3.9 avg.) and four touchdowns.
- Denegal's four rushing touchdowns are tied for the fourth most among quarterbacks in the Mountain West.

IT'S HEFTY LEFTY TIME



Plascencia

Senior kicker Gabriel Plascencia made the most of his first full season on The Mesa last season and is off to a great start this year. Plascencia, who played in four games in 2023, mainly as the kickoff specialist, before saving his redshirt campaign, was 13-for-14 (.929) on the year in field goal attempts. He's also been the main kickoff specialist as well.

This season, Plascencia has made 18 of 20 field goal attempts for a 90.0 field goal percentage and all 28 PATs. He's also kicked off 41 times for a 63.6 average with 31 touchbacks.

Below are some notes on Plascencia, who earned a scholarship after the 2024 spring season.

- Plascencia was named the 2025 Mountain West Preseason Special Teams Player of the Year. He's SDSU's third MW preseason special teams player of the year over the last four seasons (also KR/PR Jordan Byrd in 2022 and P/K Jack Browning in 2023).
- Plascencia was named a semifinalist for the Lou Groza Award on Nov. 18, the first Aztec semifinalist for the Lou Groza Award since John Baron II in 2018. Other Aztec semifinalists in recorded history were Baron II in 2016 and J.C. Mejia in 2003. Peter Holt was a finalist for the award in 1996.
- Plascencia was named a midseason second-team All-American by Pro Football Network.
- Plascencia is 35-for-38 on field goal attempts for his career. The 92.1 percentage is highest mark in NCAA FBS history (min. 1.2 field goals per game and 30 made field goals).
- Plascencia made 26 consecutive field goals before missing his second attempt against Wyoming on Nov. 1, which was longest streak in program history, the longest in Mountain West history and the longest active streak in the country.
- Plascencia went 427 days without missing a field goal from Aug. 31, 2024 to Nov. 1, 2025.
- Plascencia was 13-for-14 last season in field goal attempts. The 92.9 field goal percentage was a school record.
- This season, Plascencia is at 18-for-20 (.900), which is ranked third in SDSU single-season history (min. 10 att.).
- Plascencia has 13 career games with multiple field goals, including six this year.
- Plascencia made a pair of field goals in SDSU's 6-3 win at Northern Illinois on Sept. 27, including a 25-yarder as time expired. It was the first time the Aztecs won a regulation game with no time left since Sept. 10, 1994 vs. California when Peter Holt hit a 32-yard field goal with no time left in a 22-20 win. Those are the only two walkoff wins for SDSU since at least the 1982 season.
- Plascencia hit a 53-yard field goal vs. Colorado State on Oct. 4. It was a career long, the longest in Snapdragon Stadium history, tied

for the seventh longest in program history and the longest since Jack Browning hit a school-record long of 61 yards at Air Force on Sept. 30, 2023.

- **Plascencia** tied a career high with three field goals at Nevada on Oct. 11 and had another three at Fresno State on Oct. 25. For the Fresno State game, he was named the Mountain West Special Teams Player of the Week for the first time of his career.
- This season, **Plascencia** ranks in a tie for first in the Mountain West in PAT percentage (100.00, T-1st in FBS), second in kickoff average (63.63, 42nd in FBS), tied for second in made field goals (18, T-16th in FBS) and field goals made per game (1.64, T-19th in FBS), third in field goal percentage (90.00, T-16th in FBS), kickoff touchback percentage (75.61, 30th in FBS), field goal attempts (20, T-30th in FBS), field goal attempts per game (1.82, T-34th in FBS) and total points (82, T-51st in FBS), fourth in points per game (7.45, 56th in FBS), tied for fourth in kickoff touchbacks (31, T-70th in FBS), ninth in total kickoffs (41) and 10th in points responsible for per game (7.45).
- Last year, **Plascencia** led the Mountain West in field goal percentage (92.86, T-9th in FBS), and was third in made field goals per game (1.18, T-50th in FBS), tied for fourth in made field goals (13, T-73rd in FBS), tied for sixth in field goals attempted per game (1.27), tied for seventh in kickoff touchbacks (23), eighth in kickoff touchback percentage (46.00), total kickoffs (8), kickoff yards (2,980) and kickoff average (59.60), and 10th in field goal attempts (14).

HUNTER THE PUNTER



Green

Aztec junior punter Hunter Green has continued the excellence of the punting position at San Diego State. Green, in his first season at SDSU after spending the previous three years at Northern Colorado at the FCS level, replaced first-team all-Mountain West punter Tyler Pastula. Before Pastula, Jack Browning was a two-time all-conference selection and the 2022 MW Special Teams Player of the Year and Matt Araiza was the 2021 Ray Guy Award winner for the top punter in the country and was the MW Special Teams Player of the Year.

Green was added to the Ray Guy Award Watch List for the top punter in the country on Sept. 3.

So far this season, Green has punted 53 times for 2,499 yards and a 47.2 average with 19 50-yarders and a long of 67 yards, and 22 inside the 20-yard line. He's also kicked off 19 times for 1,224 yards (64.4 avg.) with 15 touchbacks.

- Last year, **Green** ranked fifth in FCS last year in punt average (46.3). The 46.3 average would've ranked fifth in FBS last year and eclipsed the all-MW first-team punter Tyler Pastula of San Diego State (46.1).
- The 46.3 average would've ranked third in SDSU single-season history.
- Including FCS play, **Green** is averaging 45.7 yards per punt for his career, which is first among all active FBS and FCS punters (min. 150 punts).
- This year, **Green** ranks first in the Mountain West in punts inside the 20-yard line (22, T-6th in FBS), second in punt average (47.15, 5th in FBS), third in net punt average (41.67, 25th in FBS), and fourth in total punts (53, T-26th in FBS) and punts per game (4.82, T-26th in FBS).
- **Green** punted four times for 209 yards and a 52.3 average in the opener with Stony Brook on Aug. 28 with a long of 67 yards. His 52.3 average was the second best for an Aztec in a season opener in their Division I history (since 1969), while the 67-yarder was the third longest.
- The 67-yard punt was the longest in Snapdragon Stadium history.
- **Green** had another 67-yard punt at Washington State on Sept. 6.
- **Green** is one of only five players in the country with multiple punts of at least 67 yards.
- **Green** was named to the Ray Guy Award "Ray's 8" honor roll for his play at Northern Illinois on Sept. 7 when he punted six times for 282 yards (47.0 avg.) with a long of 63. Five of his six punts landed inside the 20-yard line.
- **Green** averaged 54.3 yards per punt at Nevada on Oct. 11, punting three times for 163 yards with two inside the 20 and a long of 61 yards.
- **Green** averaged 54.0 yards per boot at Hawai'i on Nov. 8, punting four times for 216 yards with a 54.0 average and a long of 64 yards. The 54.0 average ranks seventh in SDSU single-season history (min. 4 punts). P Tashi Dorje added two punts for 114 yards for a 57.0 average, including a 60-yarder in his first career Division I punt. SDSU became the first team since Georgia State on Sept. 10, 2016 with multiple players with at least a 60-yard punt and just the 10th time it has happened since at least 1996.
- **Green** punted four times for 216 yards (54.0 avg.) with a long of 63 yards at Hawai'i on Nov. 8.

BULLET NOTES - OFFENSE

- **Sean Lewis** is in his second season at San Diego State. One of the most innovative minds in college football over the past decade, Lewis was named the 19th head coach in the history of the San Diego State football program on Nov. 29, 2023. Lewis, 39, brings an extensive résumé to The Mesa, serving as head coach at Kent State from 2018-22 before spending the 2023 campaign as offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach at Colorado under head coach Deion Sanders. He has also witnessed great success as a coordinator/assistant coach in stops at Syracuse (2016-17), Bowling Green (2014-15) and Eastern Illinois (2012-13). Colorado ranked sixth in the country in passing offense (330.0) last season when Lewis was calling plays and 39th in scoring (32.1). In 2021, Kent State set program records in plays (1,052), yards (6,907), first downs (364), rushing yards (3,482) and passing yards (3,425). In 2020, Kent State ranked first in scoring (49.8) and total offense (606.5), second in pass efficiency rating (191.2) and third down conversion percentage (56.1), third in rushing (283.0) and fourth down conversion percentage (87.5), and 10th in passing (323.5).
- Three other assistant coaches on the Aztec offensive staff have previous offensive coordinator experience, including offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach **Matt Johnson** (2023 offensive coordinator at Kent State), run game coordinator **Mike Schmidt** (2023 run game coordinator at Mississippi State, 2022 run game coordinator at Syracuse) and pass game coordinator **Laneer Sampson**

(2023 co-offensive coordinator/2022 pass game coordinator at Austin Peay), Additionally, senior offensive analyst Ryan Lindley was SDSU's offensive coordinator in 2023.

- San Diego State returns two offensive starters from last year, including C Ross Ulugalu-Maseuli and T Christian Jones.

OFFENSIVE NUMBERS

- The Aztecs returned only 82 yards of total offense, the second fewest in the country according to a preseason FBS athletic communications survey.
- SDSU also only returns 36 points scored, the third fewest in the country.
- **San Diego State is 75-22 since 2015 when scoring just 20 or more points (7-0 this year).**
- **The Aztecs are 55-5 the last 60 times they have scored at least 30 points (4-0 this season).**
- SDSU has won 24 straight games when scoring 40 points (3-0 this year).
- **In San Diego State's nine wins this year, it's outscoring the opposition, 260-54, (28.9-6.0).**
- SDSU beat Stony Brook, 42-0, on Aug. 28, winning without trailing for the first time since winning at New Mexico, 34-10, on Nov. 18, 2022.
- San Diego State hasn't trailed in seven of its nine wins this year (also Stony Brook on Aug. 28, California on Sept. 20, Colorado State on Oct. 3, at Nevada on Oct. 11, at Fresno State on Oct. 25, vs. Boise State on Nov. 15 and Nov. 22 vs. San Jose State).
- **San Diego State finished with a perfect 6-0 record at home in the regular season, its first undefeated home regular season since the 1996 team went 6-0 at home. The Aztecs now have six undefeated home campaigns - 1969 (6-0), 1972 (7-0), 1974 (7-0-1), 1977 (7-0), 1996 (6-0) and 2025 (6-0). Note that SDSU could still host the MW Championship on Dec. 5.**
- **The Aztecs are outscoring the opposition, 187-41, in six home games this season.**
- **SDSU is 3-0 against teams from California this season, outscoring them, 82-3.**
- San Diego State has been shut out just three times over its last 240 games (streak started on Nov. 25, 2006).
- San Diego State has a 100-yard rusher and 100-yard receiver three times in 23 games in the Sean Lewis era, including the Colorado State game this year on Oct. 3.
- The Aztecs started three different offensive line combinations in 12 games last year with 12 different offensive linemen logging snaps. This year, SDSU has started one different combination in 10 games with 10 players logging snaps.
- **The Aztecs are one of only nine schools to start the same starting five on the offensive line in every game this season (also Duke, Iowa, Kansas, Maryland, Miami (Fla.), Minnesota, Old Dominion and Texas Tech).**
- Despite starting the same five, only one Aztec - LT Christian Jones - has yet to exit a game due to injury.
- SDSU is 30-6 since 2011 when having at least 36 minutes of time of possession (1-0 this season).
- The Aztecs are 6-1 this season when not committing a turnover (San Diego State won 11 straight games when not committing a turnover until falling at Central Michigan, 22-21, on Sept. 28, 2024).
- San Diego State had gone five consecutive games without having a turnover until committing two in a 6-3 win at Northern Illinois on Sept. 27, which is the longest streak in its Division I history (since 1969) and was tied with UConn for the longest active streak in FBS play at the time.
- The Aztecs have not recorded a turnover in nine of their last 13 games.
- Since the beginning of 2012, SDSU is 43-8 when not committing a turnover, 87-25 when committing one turnover or less and 25-38 when committing multiple turnovers in the same game.
- San Diego State has one turnover or less in 59 of its last 83 games and in 77 of its last 110 games.
- **The Aztecs have won 57 of their last 63 games (57-6) when committing fewer turnovers than their opponent dating back to 2012 and 24 of their last 28 games (24-4) dating back to 2020 (4-0 this season).**
- SDSU snapped a 14-game losing streak when committing more turnovers than its opponent in a 6-3 win at Northern Illinois on Sept. 27.
- Last season, the Aztecs scored 51 points off 12 turnovers forced, while their opponents scored 36 points off nine turnovers. This year, SDSU has 59 points off 15 opponent turnovers, while its opponent has seven points off 10 San Diego State turnovers.
- San Diego State played in three consecutive turnover-free games (includes both teams in the game) (Nov. 30, 2024 vs. Air Force, Aug. 28, 2025 vs. Stony Brook and Sept. 6 at Washington State) for the first time in its Division I history (since 1969). Prior to this stretch, SDSU had never played in two consecutive turnover-free games in its DI history, let alone three.
- The three straight games without a turnover was tied for the longest streak in FBS play since at least the 1996 season, joining a three-game stretch by Rutgers in the 2008 season (Oct. 4-18).
- SDSU is 65-18 in its last 83 games when owning an edge in time of possession (7-0 this season).
- The Aztecs are 43-14 over the last 57 games when winning the field position battle.
- **San Diego State lost only one fumble last season, which is tied for the fewest in a season in NCAA FBS history. The other schools with just one fumble lost on a season are Bowling Green in 1996, Miami (Ohio) in 1998, Northern Illinois in 2004 and Iowa State in 2017.**
- The Aztecs have only lost three fumbles this season, which is tied for the 11th fewest in the country (No. 1 in MW).
- San Diego State's 42-point margin of victory (42-0) vs. Stony Brook in the opener on Aug. 28 its largest in a game since beating San Jose State by 45 points (52-7) on Nov. 4, 2017 and largest in Snapdragon Stadium history.
- SDSU outgained Stony Brook by 369 yards, its largest margin in a game since a DI school-record 448-yard advantage vs. San Jose State on Nov. 4, 2017. It was the largest margin in Snapdragon Stadium history.
- San Diego State scored on its opening drive vs. Stony Brook for a second straight game (also a touchdown vs. Air Force in 2024

season finale). The Aztecs went scoreless on their opening drive for the first 11 games last year.

- SDSU has gone two consecutive season openers (2024 vs. Texas A&M-Commerce and 2025 vs. Stony Brook) without a turnover for the first time in its Division I history (since 1969).
- In a 34-0 win over California on Sept. 20, SDSU recorded its largest margin of victory (34 points) against a team from a Power 5 conference in its Division I history (since 1969).
- San Diego State's 34-point victory is tied for the fourth-most lopsided shutout by a non-Power 5 conference team against a power conference team since 2000, trailing only a 59-0 victory by Brigham Young over UCLA in 2008, a 45-0 win by South Florida over Syracuse in 2023 and a 38-0 win by East Carolina vs. Duke in 2000.
- The Aztecs beat Colorado State, 45-24, on Oct. 3, scoring their most points in a Mountain West game since winning at San Jose State, 52-7, on Nov. 4, 2017.
- The 45 points were the most by San Diego State in the series with the Rams since scoring 48 on Sept. 28, 1985 (W, 48-23).
- San Diego State's 45 points were its most against a FBS opponent since 48 against Central Michigan in the 2019 New Mexico Bowl.
- SDSU's 540 yards against CSU were its most since gaining 570 at Utah State on Oct. 31, 2020 and most by an Aztec team in Snapdragon Stadium history.
- It was the first time the Aztecs had over 300 yards in the first half of a game (313) since November 14, 1992, against Hawai'i (362).
- The Aztecs averaged 8.18 yards per offensive play vs. Colorado State, their highest mark since averaging 9.03 yards per play vs. Army West Point in the 2017 Armed Forces Bowl. It was SDSU's highest mark in Snapdragon Stadium history.
- San Diego State was 7-for-11 on third down vs. the Rams, its best percentage (63.6) since going 11-for-13 (84.6 pct.) at San Jose State on Nov. 4, 2017.
- The 45-24 win vs. CSU was its first by that score in SDSU's DI history.
- The Aztecs then beat Nevada, 44-10, on Oct. 11. SDSU has consecutive 40-point games for the first time since 2017 (52 at San Jose State on Nov. 4 and 42 vs. Nevada on Nov. 18).
- After scoring just 19 points in their first two road games this season, the Aztecs scored 44 at Nevada.
- That was the first 44-10 game in San Diego State's Division I history (since 1969).
- SDSU scored 35 points in the first half vs. the Wolf Pack, matching its most in a first half since at least the 2000 season.
- San Diego State's five first half touchdowns were its most since scoring five at Arizona on Sept. 11, 2021.
- San Diego State committed its fewest penalties (2) in the Sean Lewis era against Boise State on Nov. 15 and fewest since committing just two vs. Fresno State on Nov. 25, 2023 in the last game of the Brady Hoke era.
- The Aztecs beat San Jose State, 25-3, on Nov. 22 for their first 25-3 score in their Division I history.
- SDSU had a 20-yard advantage in field position against the Spartans, their largest margin since a 24-yard advantage at San Jose State on Oct. 19, 2019.

RUSHING OFFENSE

- The Aztecs returned only 34 rushing yards from a year ago, the second fewest in the country according to a pre-season FBS athletic communications survey.
- San Diego State is 62-2 the last 64 times it has rushed for at least 200 yards (5-0 this season) and is 59-1 in its last 60 regular-season games when rushing for 200-plus yards.
- The Aztecs have won 21 straight games when rushing for at least 200 yards.
- San Diego State had two 100-yard rushers vs. Colorado State on Oct. 4 (Byron Cardwell - 129 and Lucky Sutton - 113) for the first time since Sept. 14, 2019 at New Mexico State. The Aztecs are now 30-1 in those occasions, including a 20-game win streak.
- SDSU is 33-1 in its Division I era (since 1969) when rushing for at least 300 yards in a game (0-0 this season).
- SDSU's rushing average this season by down - 1st: 5.2; 2nd: 4.3; 3rd: 3.1 and 4th: 2.5.
- San Diego State's rushing average this season by quarter - 1st: 4.5; 2nd: 4.6; 3rd: 4.6 and 4th: 4.3 - and by half - 1st: 4.5 and 2nd: 4.5.
- In the opener against Stony Brook on Aug. 28, San Diego State had its most rushing first downs (14) since rushing for 14 at Arizona on Sept. 11, 2021. It matched the Aztecs' most since getting 18 at Utah State on Oct. 31, 2020.
- SDSU's 54 rushing attempts were the most in a season opener in its Division I history (since 1969) (also Snapdragon Stadium), while its four rushing scores tied a best in a season opener (tied for most in Snapdragon Stadium).
- The Aztecs ran for 281 yards vs. Colorado State on Oct. 3, their most against an FBS opponent since running for 326 vs. Hawai'i on Nov. 14, 2020.
- SDSU lost only two yards rushing vs. the Rams, its fewest since losing one yard at UNLV on Nov. 21, 2015.
- San Diego State rushed for 277 rushing yards against Boise State on Nov. 15, the most allowed by BS since a 280-yard effort by UCLA in the 2023 Los Angeles Bowl and the most in a conference game since Wyoming had 278 on Nov. 19, 2022.
- SDSU averaged 6.02 yards per rush attempt in the Boise State game, its highest mark against a FBS school since averaging 6.58 yards vs. Toledo on Sept. 24, 2022 and highest in a Mountain West game since averaging 6.39 yards per carry vs. Hawai'i on Nov. 14, 2020.
- RB Lucky Sutton was named a semifinalist for the Doak Walker Award on Nov. 18. Sutton is the first Aztec semifinalist for the Doak Walker Award since Rashaad Penny in 2017. Former Aztecs Donnel Pumphrey (2016), George Jones (1995) and Marshall Faulk

(1993) have each been finalists for the award.

- Sutton has rushed for 1,127 yards and nine touchdowns on the season.
- **Sutton is the 20th different Aztec with a 1,000-yard rushing season in program history (28th time overall).**
- Sutton's 1,127 yards are the 19th most in SDSU single-season history.
- Sutton has five 100-yard games (out of 11 played) this season.
- Sutton leads the Mountain West in rushing attempts (217, 6th in FBS), rushing attempts per game (19.73, 6th in FBS), rushing yards (1,127, 9th in FBS), total all-purpose plays (220, T-10th in FBS) and rushing yards per game (102.45, 11th in FBS), and is tied for second in rushing touchdowns (9, T-44th in FBS), fourth in total all-purpose yards (1,122, T-39th in FBS), fifth in rushing yards per carry (5.19, 55th in FBS), sixth in all-purpose yards per game (102.00, T-48th in FBS), and tied for sixth in total touchdowns (9, T-63rd in FBS).
- Sutton rushed for his first career 100-yard game in the opener against Stony Brook on Aug. 28 with 100 yards on 23 carries (4.3 avg.). Sutton became the 85th different Aztec with a 100-yard rushing game and it was the 18th 100-yard game in an Aztec season opener. Sutton had five carries for 35 yards last season and entered the game with 200 career yards on 37 carries. He scored his first two touchdowns since scoring his only two against Hawai'i on Oct. 14, 2023.
- Sutton notched another 100-yard game against Colorado State on Oct. 3, rushing for a then career-high 113 yards and two touchdowns on 21 attempts. He had his third career multiple touchdown game (two this season).
- Sutton recorded his third 100-yard rushing game of the season (and career) with a then career-high 131 yards on 21 carries (6.2 avg.) with a touchdown at Fresno State on Oct. 25.
- Sutton notched his second straight 100-yard rushing game for the first time of his career with a career-high 158 yards on 28 attempts (5.6 avg.) with a touchdown vs. Wyoming on Nov. 1. Included in the 158 yards was a career-long 50-yard run to score and seal the Aztec 24-7 win in his final attempt in the fourth quarter.
- **Sutton ran for 150 yards and 25 attempts (6.0 avg.) vs. Boise State on Nov. 15, his fifth 100-yard game of the year and second 150-yard effort. Sutton became the first player to run for at least 150 yards against Boise State since Wyoming's Titus Swen had 212 on Nov. 19, 2022. He's just the fifth player to run for at least 150 vs. Boise State in the last 10 years and the most ever by an Aztec vs. the Broncos.**
- RB Byron Cardwell Jr. ran for a career-high 129 yards and a touchdown on just 15 attempts vs. Colorado State on Oct. 3. It was his second career 100-yard rushing game and first since having 127 yards against Colorado while playing for Oregon on Oct. 30, 2021. He became the 86th different Aztec with a 100-yard rushing game, scoring his first touchdown since Sept. 10, 2022 against Eastern Washington while playing for Oregon.
- WR Parker Threatt scored his first career rushing touchdown for five yards vs. Stony Brook on Aug. 28 in his first time touching a ball in a college game.
- If you take away the 12 times QB Jayden Denegal has been sacked this season (for 94 yards), he has rushed 48 times for 185 yards (3.9 avg.) and four touchdowns.
- Denegal's four rushing touchdowns are tied for the fourth most among quarterbacks in the Mountain West.
- Denegal had two rushing touchdowns in a 17-7 Aztec win over Boise State on Nov. 15. Denegal became the fifth Aztec quarterback since at least the 1996 season with multiple rushing touchdowns in a game (also Kevin O'Connell - 4, Jalen Mayden - 2, Jordan Brookshire - 1, Ryan Katz - 1).
- If you take away the one time QB Bert Emanuel Jr. has been sacked this season (for eight yards), he has rushed 21 times for 110 yards (5.2 avg.).

PASSING OFFENSE

- San Diego State returns only 48 passing yards from a year ago (none by a quarterback), which is the fourth fewest in the country according to a preseason FBS athletic communications survey).
- San Diego State has thrown 75 interceptions, the fourth fewest in the country behind option teams Navy's 57 (min. 100 GP), Army West Point (68) and Air Force (69). In contrast, Hawai'i has thrown 148 interceptions over that span, which is the most since 2015.
- SDSU has won five of its last six games when throwing for at least 300 yards.
- The Aztecs outpassed Stony Brook by 190 yards in the opener on Aug. 28, their largest margin since a 199-yard edge at New Mexico on Nov. 3, 2018 and their largest in a game at Snapdragon Stadium.
- San Diego State posted an 83.3 completion percentage (15-for-18) against California on Sept. 20, tied for its fourth-highest mark in a game in its DI history (since 1969).
- The Aztecs' 235.31 pass efficiency rating vs. Colorado State on Oct. 3 was the fourth-highest mark in its Division I history (since 1969) and its highest since recording a 245.66 mark at San Jose State on Nov. 4, 2017. It was also a Snapdragon Stadium record.
- SDSU followed with a 210.11 mark at Nevada on Oct. 11, its highest mark in a road game since a 213.15 mark at Arizona on Sept. 11, 2021.
- San Diego State had consecutive games with at least a 200 pass efficiency rating since the final games of the 2015 season (Dec. 5 vs. Air Force in the Mountain West Championship game and Dec. 24 vs. Cincinnati in the Hawai'i Bowl).
- Jayden Denegal was named SDSU's starting quarterback following practice on Aug. 13. The Michigan transfer became the fourth straight quarterback to start at San Diego State having never started at another institution. The others were Jalen Mayden, who went 9-11 from 2022-23, Danny O'Neil (3-8 in 2024) and Javance Tupou'ata-Johnson (0-1 in 2024). The previous three quarterbacks went a combined 12-20 for a .375 winning percentage.
- Denegal was named a captain on Aug. 23 as voted on by his teammates.
- Denegal ranks fourth in the Mountain West in yards per completion (12.75, 30th in FBS), sixth in yards per attempt (7.51, 58th in

FBS), seventh in pass efficiency rating (127.66), eighth in completion percentage (58.90) and pass attempts per game (19.91), ninth in passing yards per game (149.45), passing yards (1,645), pass completions (129), pass attempts (219), total offense per game (157.82) and total offensive plays (279), and 10th in passing touchdowns (8), total offensive yards (1,736) and total offensive yards per play (6.22).

- Denegal's 189.1 pass efficiency rating in October was the fifth highest in the country (min. 50 attempts).
- In the opener against Stony Brook on Aug. 28, Denegal was 13-for-25 for 207 yards and a touchdown without throwing an interception, while owning a 134.8 passing efficiency rating. Quarterbacks are now 25-24-1 in their first game as a starter at SDSU in its Division I history (since 1969), but 8-3 since 2015.
- Denegal was 13-for-16 for a career-high 256 yards, two touchdowns (first game with multiple touchdown passes) and on interceptions against Colorado State on Oct. 3. The 256.90 pass efficiency rating is the third-highest mark in SDSU's Division I history (since 1969) and highest since Kevin McKechnie's school-record mark of 291.81 vs. Navy on Sept. 5, 1997. It was also a Snapdragon Stadium record.
- Denegal followed up with a 14-for-17 game at Nevada on Oct. 11 for 205 yards, two touchdowns and no interceptions for a 222.47 pass efficiency rating.
- The two Aztec quarterbacks - Denegal and Bert Emanuel Jr. - combined to complete passes to 10 different receivers in the opener with Stony Brook.
- Denegal's first career interception came on his 94th attempt (vs. Northern Illinois on Sept. 27).
- In the receiving game, despite missing the last 1 ½ games because of a season-ending injury, WR Jordan Napier ranks sixth in the Mountain West in receptions per game (4.80, T-67th in FBS), tied for sixth in total receptions (48), seventh in receiving yards per game (62.90, 73rd in FBS) and ninth in receiving yards (629).
- Napier was named to the Biletnikoff Award Watch List for the most outstanding receiver in FBS on Oct. 15. He's the first Aztec to make the list since Ezell Ruffin in 2014.
- Napier made nine catches for 151 yards and a touchdown against California on Sept. 20, then the most receiving yards since Jesse Matthews had 175 against No. 24/25 UTSA in the 2021 Frisco Bowl.
- Two weeks later against Colorado State on Oct. 3, Napier had seven receptions for a career-high 153 yards and a touchdown. The 153 yards were the most by an Aztec in Snapdragon Stadium history.
- Napier had his second straight 100-yard receiving game and third of the season (and career), all over a four-game stretch, at Nevada on Oct. 11 with five catches for 110 yards. Napier also returned a punt 75 yards for a touchdown, SDSU's first punt return touchdown since Jordan Byrd had one against Idaho State on Sept. 10, 2022. The 75-yarder is SDSU's longest since BJ Busbee had a 90-yarder vs. Colorado State on Dec. 5, 2020.
- WR Donovan Brown ranks eighth in the Mountain West in yards per reception (15.36).
- WR Mikey Welsh (44 yards), TE Ryan Wolfer (18 yards), TE Jackson Ford (18 yards) and RB Lucky Sutton (2 yards) each had their first career catch in the Stony Brook game.

BULLET NOTES - DEFENSE

- Rob Aurich is in his first season as SDSU's defensive coordinator and second season overall after coaching the EDGEs last year. Aurich has previous coordinator experience at Idaho (2022-23 defensive coordinator), South Dakota (2018-21 special teams coordinator) and Bemidji State (2015-17 defensive coordinator).
- Demetrius Sumler was promoted to the defensive pass game coordinator this past offseason. Sumer is in his eighth year of coaching the cornerbacks, having had three cornerbacks make NFL teams following their time at SDSU.
- San Diego State all 11 starters on defense (note that returning Teivis Tuioti and departing Tupu Alualu each had six starts at defensive tackle, and are counted as co-starters).

- The Aztecs return all 11 starters on defense (note that returning Teivis Tuioti and departing Tupu Alualu each had six starts at defensive tackle, and are counted as co-starters).
- Since 2014, SDSU ranks for second in interceptions (175), ninth in both scoring defense (19.8) and total defense (325.2), and tied for 11th in turnovers forced (251).
- Through 11 games, the San Diego State defense leads the Mountain West in rushing touchdowns allowed (3, 1st in FBS), passing yards per attempt (5.12, 2nd in FBS), touchdowns allowed (15, T-3rd in FBS), points allowed per game (11.64, 2nd in FBS), yards allowed per play (4.03, 3rd in FBS), pass efficiency rating (98.13, 3rd in FBS), red zone defensive percentage (68.18, 3rd in FBS), offensive touchdowns allowed (13, 3rd in FBS), total touchdowns allowed (15, T-3rd in FBS), defensive touchdowns (4, T-3rd in FBS), passing yards per completion (9.65, 4th in FBS), total yards allowed per game (262.91, 6th in FBS), passing yards allowed per game (159.73, 6th in FBS), first downs allowed (165, 8th in FBS), rushing yards allowed per attempt (3.03, 14th in FBS), passing touchdowns allowed (10, T-14th in FBS), rushing yards allowed per game (103.18, 16th in FBS), and ranks second in third down percentage (32.16, 18th in FBS).
- Through 11 games, the Aztecs have allowed just 128 points (11.6 avg.), including 38 of those at Hawai'i on Nov. 8, 36 at Washington State on Sept. 6 and 24 on Oct. 3 vs. Colorado State. In the other eight games, SDSU has allowed just 30 points total (3.8 avg.).
- San Diego State shut out Stony Brook, 42-0, in the opener on Aug. 28. It was its first shutout since beating Weber State, 6-0, on Aug. 31, 2019.
- The 42 points were the fourth-most points the Aztecs have scored in a shutout in their Division I history (since 1969).
- That was SDSU's fifth shutout in a season opener in its Division I history.
- San Diego State then shut out California, 34-0, on Sept. 20. It was the Aztecs' first shutout against a current team from a Power 5 conference since beating Oregon State, 25-0, on Sept. 13, 1975.
- Cal, which came into the game averaging 32.0 points, was shut out for the first time since Oct. 26, 2019 at No. 12 Utah and the first time against an unranked team since Oct. 22, 1994 at USC.

- SDSU had home consecutive shutouts to start a season for the first time in its Division I history (since 1969).
- **The Aztecs shut out Fresno State in Fresno on Oct. 25. It was the first time the Bulldogs were shut out at home since Oct. 25, 1980, first time in any game since Nov. 5, 2016, first time in the series since 1998 and first time in Fresno in the series since 1975.**
- **It was SDSU's first road shutout since Nov. 8, 2003 at UNLV and 10th in its DI history (since 1969).**
- **San Diego State has three shutouts in the same season for the first time in its Division I history (since 1969).**
- **The Aztecs' three shutouts are the most in FBS play this season.**
- Only Wisconsin (four in 2019) has had more shutouts in a season than SDSU over the last 10 years.
- SDSU allowed just three points in a 6-3 win at Northern Illinois on Sept. 27. The three points allowed over the two games (Sept. 20 vs. California and Sept. 27 at NIU) the fewest allowed in a two-game stretch by the Aztecs since 1975 (0 points at Fresno State on Oct. 11 and three points vs. New Mexico State on Oct. 18).
- San Diego State did not allow touchdowns in consecutive games (Aug. 28 vs. Stony Brook and Sept. 20 vs. California) for the first time since 2016 (Oct. 14 at Fresno State and Oct. 21 vs. San Jose State).
- The three points by NIU were its fewest in a game since also scoring three vs. South Florida in the 2010 International Bowl (Jan. 2, 2010) (Northern Illinois also scored three at Toledo on Nov. 5) and fewest in a home game since being shut out vs. Navy on Nov. 15, 2008.
- SDSU has held its opponent scoreless in 30 of the 40 quarters this season.
- Fourteen (14) of the 38 points allowed by San Diego State at Hawai'i on Nov. 8 came on a pick-6 and a kick return touchdown. If you take away those two scores, the Aztecs have allowed 114 points over 11 games (10.36).
- SDSU's points allowed this season by quarter - 1st: 31 (2.8); 2nd: 42 (3.8); 3rd: 24 (2.2) and 4th: 31 (2.8) - and by half - 1st: 73 (6.6) and 2nd: 55 (5.0).
- **SDSU has held seven of its 11 opponents to single digits in points, eclipsing the 1973 squad for the most in SDSU's Division I history.**
- San Diego State has held its opponent to single digits (or less) 28 times time since 2015 (137 games) with six shutouts and to 10 or less points 47 times over that span.
- The Aztecs have allowed just 1,577 points over the last 310 quarters (5.09 points per quarter) (does not include overtime periods).
- SDSU has allowed just 1,651 points over the last 83 games (19.9 ppg).
- San Diego State has held its opponent scoreless on its opening possession in nine of the 11 games his year, 16 times in 23 games under Sean Lewis (since 2024), 32 times in 48 games since 2022, 44 times in 61 games since 2021 and 98 times since 2015 (137 games).
- The Aztecs have not allowed a first-quarter touchdown in 19 of the last 32 games.
- SDSU has allowed seven or fewer points in 41 of the last 47 first quarters (had 18-game streak of allowing seven or fewer snapped when Central Michigan scored 10 of its 22 points in the first quarter on Sept. 28, 2024).
- SDSU has held 13 of its last 45 opponents without a touchdown in the first half.
- Last year, opponents had 137 drives where they tried to score on SDSU (does not include kneeldowns) and the Aztecs have forced three-and-outs (or less) on 31 of those drives (22.6 pct.). San Diego State averaged 2.58 three-and-outs per game.
- This year, opponents have had 128 drives where they tried to score on SDSU (does not include kneeldowns) and the Aztecs have forced three-and-outs (or less) on 52 of those drives (40.6 pct.). SDSU is averaging 4.73 three-and-outs per game.
- San Diego State is allowing 262.9 yards and 11.6 points per game. In SDSU's opponents other games this season, they are 51-60 (.456) and are averaging 357.4 yards and 23.7 points per game.
- SDSU allowed just six first downs vs. Stony Brook in the opener on Aug. 28, tied for its second-fewest allowed in its DI history (Weber State, 5 on Aug. 31, 2019).
- San Diego State held a team (Stony Brook) below 100 total yards of offense for the fourth time in its DI history (also Sept. 19, 1970 at North Texas; Oct. 17, 1970 vs. San Jose State; Oct. 3, 2015 vs. Fresno State).
- The 1.79 yards allowed per play vs. Stony Brook was the third-fewest allowed in the Aztecs' DI history and fewest in a game at Snapdragon Stadium.
- SDSU had two defensive touchdowns against California on Sept. 20, including a 35-yard fumble return by S Dwayne McDougle and a 97-yard interception return by CB Chris Johnson. It was the second time the Aztecs had multiple defensive touchdowns in the same game in the Sean Lewis era (19 games) (also vs. Texas A&M-Commerce on Aug. 31, 2024). The last time SDSU had multiple touchdowns in the same game prior to this stretch was Nov. 5, 2016 vs. Hawai'i.
- San Diego State scored another touchdown with a 45-yard interception return by Johnson at Nevada on Oct. 11 and a 31-yard interception return by LB Tano Letuli at Fresno State on Oct. 25.
- **San Diego State's four defensive touchdowns this season ranks in a tie for third in the country, only trailing Louisiana Tech (7) and Tennessee (6).**
- SDSU has won nine straight games when scoring a defensive touchdown (3-0 this season).
- San Diego State held San Jose State without a touchdown on Nov. 22 for the first time since Sept. 25, 2021 at Western Michigan and the first time in a Mountain West game since Oct. 21, 2016 against the Aztecs (SDSU won, 42-3).
- EDGE **Trey White** was named the Mountain West Preseason Defensive Player of the Year by the league's media. White was the first San Diego State defensive lineman to be named the MW preseason defensive player of the year and the fourth defensive player overall, joining cornerback Leon McFadden in 2012, cornerback Damontae Kazee in 2016 and safety Patrick McMorris in 2022.
- White also made two preseason watch lists, including for the Chuck Bednarik Award (most outstanding defensive player) and the Bronko Nagurski Trophy (defensive player of the year).
- LB Tano Letuli joined White on the preseason all-MW team. Letuli led the Aztecs last season with 70 tackles, despite missing two games with a broken hand.
- LB Owen Chambliss ranks second in the Mountain West in solo tackles per game (5.27, T-6th in FBS), solo tackles (58, T-7th in FBS) and tackles for loss yards (63, T-26th in FBS), fourth in total tackles (99, 20th in FBS) and tackles per game (9.00, 21st in FBS), tied for fourth in total tackles for loss (9.5) and tackles for loss per game (0.86), tied for sixth in sack yards (44, T-45th in FBS) and ninth in assisted tackles (41).
- Chambliss has four double-digit tackle games this season.
- Chambliss has 99 tackles for the season in 11 games, already the most by an Aztec since Kyahva Tezino had 99 in 2019 in 13 games.
- S Dalesean Staley was named the Mountain West Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 22 for his play against California on Sept. 20. Staley helped SDSU shut out California, 34-0, the largest margin of victory against a Power 5 team in its Division I history (since 1969). Cal, which came into the game averaging 32.0 points, was shut out for the first time since Oct. 26, 2019 at No. 12 Utah and the first time against an unranked team since Oct. 22, 1994 at USC. Staley forced his first career fumble, which was picked up by Dwayne McDougle and run back 35 yards for a touchdown in the third quarter. Staley also logged his first interception as an Aztec, one of three turnovers SDSU forced for the game, and added a pass breakup.
- S Eric Butler is tied for seventh in the Mountain West in fumble recoveries (1, T-67th in FBS).

RUSHING DEFENSE

- Through 11 games, the San Diego State rushing defense leads the Mountain West in rushing touchdowns allowed (3, 1st in FBS), rushing yards allowed per attempt (3.03, 14th in FBS) and rushing yards allowed per game (103.18, 16th in FBS).
- This season, opponents have rushed 374 times with only seven explosive runs (runs of at least 20 yards (1.9 pct.).
- Over the past four-plus seasons since 2021, opponents have rushed 2,135 times with only 61 attempts longer than 20 yards (2.9 pct.).
- Opponent rush average this year vs. SDSU by down: 1st - 3.1; 2nd - 3.7; 3rd - 2.5; 4th - (-)0.3.
- Opponent rush average this year vs. SDSU by quarter: 1st - 4.0; 2nd - 3.3; 3rd - 2.9; 4th - 2.0 - and by half: 1st - 3.6; 2nd - 2.4.

PASSING DEFENSE

- Through 11 games, the San Diego State passing defensive leads the Mountain West in passing yards per attempt (5.12, 2nd in FBS), pass efficiency rating (98.13, 3rd in FBS), passing yards per completion (9.65, 4th in FBS), passing yards allowed per game (159.73, 6th in FBS) and passing touchdowns allowed (10, T-14th in FBS).
- SDSU's 175 interceptions since the 2014 season are the second most in the country over that span while its 21 interceptions returned for a touchdown rank in a tie for eighth over that span.
- San Diego State had gone 25 consecutive games without allowing a 100-yard receiver until Hawai'i's Jackson Harris had 130 vs. SDSU on Nov. 8. The 25-game streak without allowing a 100-yard receiver was a Mountain West record and the by any FBS team since Kentucky (28 straight) from 2017 to 2019.
- SDSU allowed just one passing first down vs. Stony Brook in the opener on Aug. 28, tied for the fewest allowed against a non-option team in San Diego State's DI history (also one vs. UNLV on Oct. 8, 2016).
- EDGE Trey White has 18.5 career sacks, which are the tied for the eighth most in program history.
- White ranked fourth in FBS last year in sacks per game (1.04) and tackles for loss per game (1.54), tied for fifth in sacks (12.5), seventh in total tackles for loss (18.5) and tackles for loss yards (102), and tied for 13th in sack yards (68). White led the Mountain West in all of those categories.
- White ranked in a tie for third in SDSU single-season history last year with 12.5 sacks with Andy Coviello (1991), only trailing Mike Douglass (21.0 in 1976) and Brett Faryniarz (13.0 in 1987).
- White's 18.5 tackles for loss, meanwhile, were the 13th most in SDSU single-season history.
- According to Pro Football Focus, White ranked in a tie for 39th in the country (third in MW) last year in quarterback pressures (39).
- White has six career games with multiple sacks (2+), including this year against Colorado State on Oct. 3 and vs. Wyoming on Nov. 1.
- SDSU has five different players this season who have recorded at least two sacks in a game, including EDGE August Salvati vs. California on Sept. 20, EDGE Niles King vs. Colorado State on Oct. 3, White (twice), LB Owen Chambliss at Hawai'i on Nov. 8 and EDGE Ryan Henderson vs. San Jose State on Nov. 22.
- This year, White ranks fourth in the Mountain West in sack yards (46, T-32nd in FBS), tied for fifth in tackle for loss yards (52, T-55th in FBS), tied for sixth in total sacks (6.0, T-45th in FBS), tied for seventh in sacks per game (0.55, T-51st in FBS), ninth in tackles for loss (8.5) and tackles for loss per game (0.77).
- CB Chris Johnson returned an interception 97 yards for a touchdown against California on Sept. 20. It is tied for the seventh-longest interception return this season and tied for the fifth-longest interception return in program history. He then added a 45-yard interception returned for a score at Nevada on Oct. 11.
- Johnson's two interception returns for a touchdown are tied for the most in SDSU single-season history and tied for the third most in program history.
- Johnson's 232 career interception yards are the sixth most in program history.
- This year, despite missing the Hawai'i game on Nov. 8 with an injury, Johnson leads the Mountain West in interception yards (146, 3rd in FBS) and passes defended per game (1.20, T-9th in FBS), and is tied for first in interception returns for a touchdown (2, T-1st in FBS) and total interceptions (4, T-10th in FBS), tied for second in interceptions per game (0.40, T-13th in FBS), and tied for seventh in total pass breakups (8, T-38th in FBS).
- CB Bryce Phillips and S Dalesean Staley are each tied for second in the Mountain West in total pass breakups (9, T-21st in FBS) and a tie for seventh in passes defended per game (0.91, T-38th in FBS).
- Phillips had four pass breakups against California on Sept. 20 and Staley had four at Fresno State on Oct. 25, which are both tied for the sixth most in a game in the country this year and tied for the third most in a game in program history.
- S Dwayne McDougale ranks in a tie for seventh in the Mountain West interceptions (3, T-37th in FBS), interceptions per game (0.27, T-46th in FBS) and fumble recoveries (1).
- LB Tano Letuli returned an interception 31 yards for a touchdown at Fresno State on Oct. 25. He's tied for fourth in the Mountain West in interceptions returned for a touchdown (1, T-10th in FBS).

BULLET NOTES - SPECIAL TEAMS

- Associate head coach Zac Barton is in his second season as SDSU's special teams coordinator. Barton joined San Diego State after spending 2024 at Kansas, where he served as the Jayhawks' special teams analyst. In his lone season at KU, the Jayhawks ranked seventh in FBS in special teams grading according to Pro Football Focus, grading just behind CFP playoff teams Alabama, Texas, and Washington. Kansas would go on to earn a selection into the 2023 Guaranteed Rate Bowl to cap off an 8-4 regular season, their best regular season record since 2007. Prior to Kansas, Barton coached the special teams at Kent State from 2018-22 under head coach Sean Lewis and helped the Golden Flashes' special teams unit to new heights.
- Barton was named a Broyles Award nominee for the 2024 season for the top assistant coach in the country.
- Special teams have long been a key to San Diego State's success. **The Aztecs have won five of the 10 Mountain West Special Teams Player of the Year awards issued since 2015. Those five include three kick returners (Rashaad Penny from 2015-17), two punters (Matt Araiza in 2021 and Jack Browning in 2022) and one kicker (also Araiza in 2021).**
- SDSU also has won three the MW preseason special teams player of the year over the last four seasons (KR/PR Jordan Byrd in 2022, P/K Jack Browning in 2023 and K Gabe Plascencia in 2025).
- ESPN's special teams efficiency rating had San Diego State at 72.2 in 2022, which ranked second in FBS, trailing only South Carolina (79.8). The Aztecs were fifth in 2021 at 69.9, ninth in 2023 at 65.8 and eighth last season at 67.6. This season, SDSU is fifth through 11 games at 69.4.
- **Since the start of the 2015 season, San Diego State has 14 kickoff returns for touchdowns, tied with Kansas State for the most in FBS play over that time. To put that stat into perspective, six other teams have played at least 100 games over that span and do not have a single kick return touchdown.**
- The Aztecs also have five 100-yard kickoff return touchdowns since 2015, one behind Western Michigan for the most in FBS play over that span.
- SDSU has five non-offensive touchdowns this season, including two against California on Sept. 20, including a 35-yard fumble return by S Dwayne McDougale and a 97-yard interception return by CB Chris Johnson, two at Nevada on Oct. 11 with a 75-yard punt return by Jordan Napier and a 45-yard interception by Johnson, and a 31-yard interception return by LB Tano Letuli.
- San Diego State, South Carolina and South Florida are the only teams with multiple non-offensive touchdowns in multiple games.
- The five non-offensive touchdowns are tied for the sixth most in the country, only trailing Louisiana Tech (8), Notre Dame (7), South Carolina (7), Pittsburgh (6) and Tennessee (6).
- The Aztecs have 19 non-offensive touchdowns since the start of the 2021 season. Only six schools have more non-offensive touchdowns over that span, including Notre Dame (29), Pittsburgh (27), Iowa (22), South Carolina (21), Ohio State (20) and Utah (20). Over that span, SDSU has eight interception returns for touchdowns, four blocked punt returns for touchdowns, three fumble recoveries for a touchdown, two kickoff returns for a touchdown and two punt returns for a touchdown.
- Since the start of the Sean Lewis era in 2024, San Diego State has eight non-offensive touchdowns, tied for the seventh most in the country over that span. Only Notre Dame (14), Pittsburgh (12), Brigham Young (11), South Carolina (10), UNLV (10) and Louisville (9) have more over that span.
- K Gabe Plascencia was named the Mountain West Preseason Special Teams Player of the Year. He's SDSU's third MW preseason special teams player of the year over the last four seasons (also KR/PR Jordan Byrd in 2022 and P/K Jack Browning in 2023).
- Plascencia was named a semifinalist for the Lou Groza Award on Nov. 18, the first Aztec semifinalist for the Lou Groza Award since John Baron II in 2018. Other Aztec semifinalists in recorded history were Baron II in 2016 and J.C. Mejia in 2003. Peter Holt was a finalist for the award in 1996.
- Plascencia is 35-for-38 on field goal attempts for his career. The 92.1 percentage is highest mark in NCAA FBS history (min. 1.2 field goals per game and 30 made field goals).
- Plascencia made 26 consecutive field goals before missing his second attempt against Wyoming on Nov. 1, which was longest streak in program history, the longest in Mountain West history and the longest active streak in the country.
- Plascencia went 427 days without missing a field goal from Aug. 31, 2024 to Nov. 1, 2025.
- Plascencia was 13-for-14 last season in field goal attempts. The 92.9 field goal percentage was a school record.
- This season, Plascencia is at 18-for-20 (.900), which is ranked third in SDSU single-season history (min. 10 att.).
- Plascencia has 13 career games with multiple field goals, including six this year
- Plascencia made a pair of field goals in SDSU's 6-3 win at Northern Illinois on Sept. 27, including a 25-yarder as time expired. It was the first time the Aztecs won a regulation game with no time left since

- Sept. 10, 1994 vs. California when Peter Holt hit a 32-yard field goal with no time left in a 22-20 win. Those are the only two walkoff wins for SDSU since at least the 1982 season.
- Plascencia hit a 53-yard field goal vs. Colorado State on Oct. 4. It was a career long, the longest in Snapdragon Stadium history, tied for the seventh longest in program history and the longest since Jack Browning hit a school-record long of 61 yards at Air Force on Sept. 30, 2023.
 - Plascencia tied a career high with three field goals at Nevada on Oct. 11 and had another three at Fresno State on Oct. 25 en route to being named the Mountain West Special Teams Player of the Week for the first time of his career.
 - This season, Plascencia ranks in a tie for first in the Mountain West in PAT percentage (100.00, T-1st in FBS), second in kickoff average (63.63, 42nd in FBS), tied for second in made field goals (18, T-16th in FBS) and field goals made per game (1.64, T-19th in FBS), third in field goal percentage (90.00, T-16th in FBS), kickoff touchback percentage (75.61, 30th in FBS), field goal attempts (20, T-30th in FBS), field goal attempts per game (1.82, T-34th in FBS) and total points (82, T-51st in FBS), fourth in points per game (7.45, 56th in FBS), tied for fourth in kickoff touchbacks (31, T-70th in FBS), ninth in total kickoffs (41) and 10th in points responsible for per game (7.45).
 - Last year, Plascencia led the Mountain West in field goal percentage (92.86, T-9th in FBS), and was third in made field goals per game (1.18, T-50th in FBS), tied for fourth in made field goals (13, T-73rd in FBS), tied for sixth in field goals attempted per game (1.27), tied for seventh in kickoff touchbacks (23), eighth in kickoff touchback percentage (46.00), total kickoffs (8), kickoff yards (2,980) and kickoff average (59.60), and 10th in field goal attempts (14).
 - Last year, P Hunter Green ranked fifth in FCS last year in punt average (46.3). The 46.3 average would've ranked fifth in FBS last year and eclipsed the all-MW first-team punter Tyler Pastula of San Diego State (46.1).
 - The 46.3 average would've ranked third in SDSU single-season history.
 - Including FCS play, Green averaging 45.6 yards per punt for his career, which is first among all active FBS and FCS punters (min. 150 punts).
 - This year, Green ranks first in the Mountain West in punts inside the 20-yard line (22, T-6th in FBS), second in punt average (47.15, 5th in FBS), third in net punt average (41.67, 25th in FBS), and fourth in total punts (53, T-26th in FBS) and punts per game (4.82, T-26th in FBS).
 - Green punted four times for 209 yards and a 52.3 average in the opener with Stony Brook on Aug. 28 with a long of 67 yards. His 52.3 average was the second best for an Aztec in a season opener in their Division I history (since 1969), while the 67-yarder was the third longest.
 - The 67-yard punt was the longest in Snapdragon Stadium history.
 - Green had another 67-yard punt at Washington State on Sept. 6. Green is one of only five players in the country with multiple punts of at least 67 yards.
 - Green was named to the Ray Guy Award "Ray's 8" honor roll for his play at Northern Illinois on Sept. 7 when he punted six times for 282 yards (47.0 avg.) with a long of 63. Five of his six punts landed inside the 20-yard line.
 - Green averaged 54.3 yards per punt at Nevada on Oct. 11, punting three times for 163 yards with two inside the 20 and a long of 61 yards.
 - SDSU returned nine punts for 89 yards against Stony Brook on Aug. 28, both the highest marks in Snapdragon Stadium history.
 - Green averaged 54.0 yards per boot at Hawai'i on Nov. 8, punting four times for 216 yards with a 54.0 average and a long of 64 yards. The 54.0 average ranks seventh in SDSU single-season history (min. 4 punts). P Tashi Dorje added two punts for 114 yards for a 57.0 average, including a 60-yarder in his first career Division I punt. SDSU became the first team since Georgia State on Sept. 10, 2016 with multiple players with at least a 60-yard punt and just the 10th time it has happened since at least 1996.
 - In the return game, despite missing the last 1 ½ games with an injury, PR Jordan Napier leads the Mountain West in punt returns per game (2.20, 2nd in FBS), total punt returns (22, T-3rd in FBS), punt return yards (193, 20th in FBS), combined kick and punt return yards (439, 20th in FBS) and punt return average (8.77, 29th in FBS), tied for first in punt return touchdowns (1, T-6th in FBS), fourth in all-purpose yards per game (110.80, 26th in FBS), fifth in kick returns per game (1.10, T-45th in FBS), total all-purpose yards (1,108, 46th in FBS) and all-purpose yards per play (12.00, T-65th in FBS), tied for fifth in total kick returns (11, T-57th in FBS) and ninth in kick return yards (246, 63rd in FBS).
 - Napier returned seven punts for 73 yards (10.4 avg.) against Stony Brook on Aug. 28. The seven punts were easily the most in Snapdragon Stadium history, three more than Mekhi Shaw from SDSU on Nov. 4, 2023 vs. Utah State.
 - Napier returned a punt return for a 75-yard touchdown at Nevada on Oct. 11. It was SDSU's first punt return touchdown since Jordan Byrd had one against Idaho State on Sept. 10, 2022 and the longest since BJ Busbee had a 90-yarder vs. Colorado State on Dec. 5, 2020.
 - Eric Butler has two career blocked kicks (both in 2023), tied for the fifth most in school history.

SAN DIEGO -- Lucky Sutton, Jayden Denegal and Christian Washington each had a rushing touchdown and the San Diego State defense put up another standout performance in a 25-3 win over San Jose State on Saturday night at Snapdragon Stadium.

The Aztecs (9-2), who were picked eight in the Mountain West preseason poll, remained in first place atop the league standings at 6-1, one game ahead of Boise State, New Mexico and UNLV with a game to play.

Sutton rushed for 79 yards and Washington added 70 as SDSU continued its bully-style play with two starting wide receivers (Jordan Napier and Jacob Bostick) out for the season with injuries.

Denegal was 8-for-16 for 81 yards, and scored his third rushing touchdown over the last two games.

Defensively, San Diego State continued its historic season, limiting the high-powered Spartan (3-8, 2-5 MW) offense, which came into the game averaging 313.8 passing yards and 7.53 yards per attempt, to a season-low 135 passing yards and a 3.55 yards per attempt average, its lowest since a 2.27 mark at Western Michigan on Sept. 25, 2021.

The Aztecs held SJSU without a touchdown for the first time since that WMU game and the first time in a Mountain West contest since a 42-3 SDSU win on Oct. 21, 2016. Five of SJSU's 11 drives ended in either a three-and-out (or less) or a turnover, while another two ended in missed field goals. San Jose State didn't have a play longer than 19 yards in the game.

On the third play from scrimmage, Dwayne McDougale picked off a Walker Egat pass and returned it 25 yards to the 20. Six plays later, Sutton's 1-yard touchdown run opened the scoring less than four minutes into the game.

Denis Lynch missed badly on field-goal attempt from 43 yards and San Diego State later made it 11-0 in the first quarter on a 35-yard field goal by Gabe Plascencia.

Mathias Brown got the Spartans on the scoreboard on its ensuing drive with a 37-yard field goal.

After forcing a punt, SJSU got the ball back midway through the second quarter, but Brown missed a 39-yard field goal.

The Aztecs then used a meticulous 10-play, 79-yard drive over 3:16, before Denegal's quarterback keeper on fourth-and-goal from the San Jose State 1 in the waning moments of the first half made it 18-3 at the half.

Neither team scored in the third quarter with only the Spartans running any plays in their opponent side of the field. SJSU converted a fourth-and-3 from the SDSU 46 and tried again on a fourth-and-1 pass on the San Diego State 34, but Aztec cornerback Chris Johnson snuffed it out and tackled wide receiver Danny Scudero for a no-gain and turnover on downs.

In the fourth quarter, Tama Amisone's pass was picked off by Johnson in spectacular fashion. Despite not scoring on its ensuing drive and giving the ball back to San Jose State, SDSU's Ryan Henderson sacked third-string quarterback Robert McDaniel on a fourth-and-19 from the San Diego State 42.

The Aztecs went 45 yards on five plays - all rushes by Washington - before an 8-yard Washington touchdown capped the scoring at 25-3 with 2:03 left in the game.

The Spartans' last-ditch effort was stopped by SDSU in four plays, giving San Diego State the ball back to win the game in victory formation.

Henderson became the fifth Aztec to record at least two sacks in the game, two of four against SJSU, which allowed just 0.90 per game (seventh in FBS) coming in. Dalsean Staley led the team with eight tackles.

The win capped a perfect 6-0 regular-season record at home for SDSU, its first undefeated home regular season since 1996 and sixth in its Division I history (since 1969). San Diego State has outscored its opponents, 187-41, at home this season, which is an average of 31.2-6.8.

This was the seventh time of the season that the Aztecs held a team to single-digits in points, breaking the record set in 1973 at six games.

SDSU improved to 3-0 against teams from California this season, outscoring California, Fresno State and San Jose State by an 82-3 margin.

BIG NOTES

- After finishing with a 3-9 record and losing the final six games of the 2024 campaign, San Diego State improved to 9-2 on the season with the victory.
- The Aztecs have their most wins (9) in a season since setting a program record with 12 victories in 2021.
- Only 10 teams have more victories than SDSU's nine this year.
- After being picked to finish eighth in the Mountain West in the preseason poll, San Diego State improved to 6-1 in league play, its best conference start since also starting 6-1 in 2021.
- This is the sixth time San Diego State has started with at least a 6-1 league record in its 27 seasons of MW play (7-0 in 2015, 6-1 in 2012, 2013, 2016, 2021 and 2025).

COACHING HIGHLIGHTS

- Has amassed 13 years of coaching experience at the collegiate level with stops at Nebraska Omaha (2008), Akron (2011), Eastern Illinois (2012-13), Bowling Green (2014-15), Syracuse (2016-17), Kent State (2018-22) and Colorado (2023) prior to coming to The Mesa.
- One of the most innovative minds in college football over the past decade, he's seen his offenses consistently rank among the nation's leaders at each of his last four stops including the nation's highest scoring offense and best total offense at Kent State during the 2020 season - 49.8 points per game and 606.5 yards per game.
- Led Kent State to their first two bowl games in program history, appearing in the 2019 Tropical Smoothie Cafe Frisco Bowl and 2021 Famous Idaho Potato Bowl. The 2019 Frisco Bowl was also the program's first ever bowl victory, topping Utah State 51-41.
- Excluding Power 5 games, Lewis owns a 35-26 record as a head coach.

OTHER COACHING EXPERIENCE

- Served as the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach at Colorado under head coach Deion Sanders in 2023. While serving as the offensive coordinator, the Buffaloes ranked sixth in passing (330.0) and 39th in scoring (32.1).
- In five seasons at the Kent State helm, Lewis transformed a moribund program into an offensive juggernaut, with his 2021 team setting school records for plays (1,052), total yards (6,907), rushing yards (3,482), passing yards (3,425) and first downs (362). That season, the Golden Flashes boasted the third-best rushing attack in the nation while ranking fourth in total offense (495.2) ultimately clinching their second postseason berth under Lewis in the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl.
- During a shortened 2020 season, Lewis guided the Golden Flashes to a 3-1 mark, securing the program's first back-to-back winning records since 1976-77. The FlashFAST offense was on full display in those four games, leading the nation in total offense (606.5) and scoring offense (49.75) as well as ranking second in pass efficiency (191.2) and third down conversion (56.1), third in rushing (283.0) and fourth down conversion percentage (87.5), and 10th in passing (323.5).
- Lewis' 2019 season was tied for the eighth-best improvement in FBS with five additional wins from the previous year, finishing with a 7-6 overall record.
- Under Lewis' tutelage, 28 Golden Flash players earned all-conference honors and a MAC Player of the Year with quarterback Dustin Crum garnering the award in 2021.
- Prior to Kent State, Lewis spent two seasons at Syracuse where his Orange offense set or tied over 40 school records in 2017 including passing yards in a season (3,855), while its 5,290 total yards of total offense ranked second in program history.
- With Lewis on staff as the co-offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach, Bowling Green ranked fourth nationally in total offense (546.8) during the 2015 campaign while also ranking sixth in scoring offense (42.2 ppg).
- On an individual in 2015, Falcon quarterback, and current SDSU quarterbacks coach, Matt Johnson collected MAC Offensive Player of the Year honors after finishing second nationally in both passing yards (4,946) and touchdown passes (46).

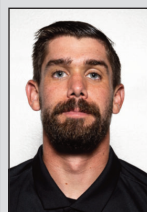

SDSU Rolls Past Stony Brook, 42-0, in 2025 Opener

SAN DIEGO -- San Diego State's Lucky Sutton rushed for a career-high 100 yards and scored two touchdowns on Thursday, lifting the Aztecs to a 42-0 romp over Stony Brook in the season opener for both teams at Snapdragon Stadium.

The Aztecs outgained the Seawolves 453-95 in total offense and used a swarming defense to help build an unsurmountable 20-0 advantage by halftime. SBU was unable to cross midfield until the fourth quarter, as the Scarlet and Black forced six three-and-outs for the night.

The victory marked SDSU's first shutout since a 6-0 shaving of Weber State at SDCCU Stadium on Aug. 31, 2019, and represented the team's first blanking at Snapdragon Stadium. In addition, the win marked the Aztecs' largest shutout margin since a 55-0 rout of Hawaii at home on Nov. 5, 2016.

Along with Sutton's production, starting quarterback Jayden Denegal completed 13-of-25 passes for 208 yards and one touchdown in his Scarlet and Black debut, connecting with nine different receivers.

Sutton set the tone for the contest, rushing for 41 yards on SDSU's opening possession, highlighted by a 20-yard scamper on fifth play from scrimmage. After a 16-yard completion from Denegal to Jackson Ford to the Seawolf 3, Sutton burst across the goal line from a yard out to give the host school a lead they would not relinquish.

After forcing a quick SBU punt, Denegal directed a 13-play, 75-yard drive, punctuated by a 25-yard scoring strike over the middle to a wide-open Jacob Bostick on a 3rd-and-12 situation.

Later in the second quarter, Gabriel Plascencia split the uprights from 42 and 35 yards out, respectively, extending his streak to 14 consecutive field goals.

Leading 20-0, the Aztecs turned the game into a blowout, as Sutton added his second touchdown with 1:40 remaining in the third quarter on a two-yard run to pay dirt. Previously, Denegal hit a streaking Donovan Brown with a 44-yard completion on the first play of the drive, putting SDSU in business at the Stony Brook 10. The Aztecs then flashed some razzle-dazzle with a two-point conversion, as DJ Herman connected with Brady Anderson in the left corner of the end zone.

Christian Washington displayed his talents in the fourth quarter, capping a 9-play, 61-yard advance with a 1-yard touchdown burst, increasing the SDSU advantage to 35-0. Earlier in the drive, Washington plowed through the right side of the Seawolf defense for 27 yards on a 2nd-and-13 play, while Nathan Acevedo put the Aztecs in the red zone on the ensuing snap with a 17-yard reception from backup quarterback Bert Emanuel Jr.

With the clock winding down, Parker Threatt closed out the scoring with a five-yard touchdown on sweep around left end to culminate an 8-play, 44-yard march, as backup placekicker Nick Clegg booted the extra point.

SDSU rushed for 228 yards on 53 carries, improving to 58-2 in its last 60 games when gaining 200 yards on the ground. Washington ran for 38 yards on seven attempts, while Brian Cardwell added 29 yards on seven rushes of his own.

Bostick finished with three catches for a game-high 56 yards to lead the Aztec receiving corps, while Brown, Sutton, Acevedo, Jerry McClure and Jordan Napier hauled in two receptions apiece.

Defensively, Owen Chambliss and Yano Letuli tied for team-high honors with five tackles apiece. Chambliss contributed a sack for one of his four solo stops, while Trey White (3 tackles) maintained the pressure with a pair of quarterback hurries.

Team Notes

- San Diego State wore all-white jersey and pants for the first time since Sept. 28, 2013 at New Mexico State. The Aztecs played 149 games in between wearing their all-white combo.

- San Diego State fell to 1-1 on the season and 4-3 under Sean Lewis when scoring first.
- The Aztecs allowed a first-quarter touchdown for just the 11th time in the last 23 games.
- SDSU has allowed seven or fewer points in 33 of the last 38 first quarters.

Aztecs Fall on the Road at Washington State

PULLMAN, Wash. -- San Diego State jumped out to a 7-0 lead but yielded 29 consecutive points, including 16 in less than a 5-minute span in a 36-13 loss at Washington State on Saturday night in Pullman.

The Aztecs (1-1) struck first when Jayden Denegal found a streaking Jacob Bostick on a 35-yard pass on a fourth-and-5 situation with 10 minutes left in the first quarter.

After the teams exchanged punts, the Cougars (2-0) took advantage of good field position after a 15-yard kick catch interference penalty on Brady Anderson. WSU went 48 yards on six plays, converting a fourth-and-1 from the SDSU 39 and later scoring on a 3-yard pass from Jaxon Potter to Trey Leckner to tie the game with 5:18 left in the first quarter.

WSU got into San Diego State territory on its next drive, but the Aztec defense limited Washington State to a 49-yard field goal by Jack Stevens to make it 10-7 early in the second quarter.

The Cougars later got to the SDSU 32-yard line, but on fourth-and-2, San Diego State All-American Trey Edge stuffed Kirby Vorhees run play, keeping it a 3-point game.

The teams played a game of field position for most of the second quarter as WSU couldn't get past the San Diego State 35, instead punting to the Aztec 8. On second-and-10, however, Denegal was sacked in the end zone for the safety.

Washington State then used just 32 seconds, going 62 yards on four plays, highlighted by a 34-yard pass from Potter to Josh Meredith, a 20-yard rush by Leo Pulalasi and another 3-yard TD pass from Potter to Leckner.

Instead of trailing, 10-7, at the half, SDSU suddenly found itself down, 19-7, with the Cougars receiving the second-half kickoff. WSU outgained San Diego State, 261-108, in the first half.

Washington State took its opening drive of the third quarter 75 yards on seven plays, culminating with an 18-yard touchdown pass from Potter to Leon Neal Jr., opening up a commanding 26-7 advantage just 4 minutes, 5 seconds into the second half.

The Aztecs was stuffed on a fourth-and-3 from the Cougar 49, and WSU received a 42-yard field goal by Stevens to take a 29-7 lead.

SDSU responded with a 10-play, 75-yard drive over 4:24 before Denegal punched it in from the 1. San Diego State's 2-point conversion attempt was snuffed out by the Washington State defense, making it 29-13 with 57 seconds left in the quarter.

The Aztecs forced consecutive three-and-outs, but was unable to convert on fourth down, first failing from four-and-7 from the Cougar 37 and then later a fourth-and-9 from the WSU 36 as Denegal was sacked for a 12-yard loss.

WSU ate up 6:17 of clock, going 42 yards on 12 plays before Julian Dugger punched it in from three yards out to close the scoring. It appeared SDSU changed the momentum when Chris Johnson blocked a 28-yard field goal attempt by Stevens and Bryce Phillips ran it 67 yards for a touchdown. A referee, however, called Johnson for offsides on back-to-back field goal attempts, giving Washington State the first down and the ability to run more time off the clock.

San Diego State had to punt and the Cougars knelt to take the 36-13 victory.

Lucky Sutton ran for 88 yards on 15 attempts (5.9 avg.) to lead the Aztecs, while Denegal was 15-for-30 for 133 yards and a touchdown. Jordan Napier caught seven of the 15 Denegal passes for 69 yards.

Tano Letuli had a game-high 11 tackles to lead SDSU, while Owen Chambliss chipped in with nine and Johnson eight with a forced fumble.

San Diego State fell to 1-3 in the series with Washington State, playing in its first 36-13 game in its Division I history (since 1969). The Aztecs extended their DI era record with their third consecutive turnover-free contest.

- San Diego State's 34-point victory is tied for the fourth-most lopsided shutout by a non-Power 5 conference team against a power conference team since 2000, trailing only a 59-0 victory by Brigham Young over UCLA in 2008, a 45-0 win by South Florida over Syracuse in 2023 and a 38-0 win by Easter Carolina vs. Duke in 2000.
- The Aztecs recorded their first shutout against a current team from a Power 5 conference since beating Oregon State, 25-0, on Sept. 13, 1975.
- SDSU has home consecutive shutouts to start a season for the first time in its Division I history (since 1969).
- Cal, which came into the game averaging 32.0 points, was shut out for the first time since Oct. 26, 2019 at No. 12 Utah and the first time against an unranked team since Oct. 22, 1994 at USC.
- San Diego State handed California its first loss of the season. Entering tonight, the Bears had outscored the opposition, 96-32, over their 3-0 start.
- The Aztecs won their first game against a team from the Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC). SDSU was 0-3 against the ACC entering the game with two losses to North Carolina (20-13 in the 1998 Las Vegas Bowl and 31-27 at UNC on Sept. 6, 2014), and a loss last year at California (31-10 on Sept. 14, 2024).
- San Diego State snapped a six-game losing streak against teams with at least a 2-0 record. The Aztecs' last win against team with at least a 2-0 record was Sept. 15, 2018 vs. No. 23/25 Arizona State. The Sun Devils were 2-0 and SDSU won, 28-21.
- San Diego State did not record a turnover for a fifth consecutive game dating back to last season, extending its Division I record (since 1969). The streak is also the longest active streak in FBS play.

Aztecs Power Past Cal in 34-0 Shutout

SAN DIEGO -- Bolstered by a bruising, opportunistic defense, San Diego State recorded its second straight home shutout with a 34-0 blanking of California on Saturday at Snapdragon Stadium.

With the victory, the Aztecs posted their first shutout against a current team from a Power 5 conference since a 25-0 triumph over Oregon State on Sept. 13, 1975.

In addition, SDSU (2-1) logged consecutive home shutouts to start a season for the first time since joining the Division I ranks in 1969, while handing the Golden Bears (3-1) their first loss of the year.

With a 13-0 lead hanging in the balance, the Aztecs scored two defensive touchdowns in the third quarter when Dwayne McDougle rumbled 35 yards after a fumble recovery, while Chris Johnson hit pay dirt on a 97-yard interception return, which broke the game wide open.

Cal entered the contest having outscored its opponents by a combined margin of 96-32, but the Scarlet and Black limited the visitors to 289 yards of total offense, 98 yards below their season average.

Aztec defenders harassed freshman quarterback Jaron-Keawe Sagapolutele all night, posting four sacks of the Bears' signal-caller, who completed just 17 of 38 passes for 208 yards and two interceptions.

Offensively, the Aztecs were paced by Jordan Napier, who recorded career highs of 10 receptions for 154 yards with one touchdown.

Pinned deep at its own 10 after a holding penalty, Napier gave SDSU the spark it needed with an 80-yard reception after hauling in a pass from Jayden Denegal near midfield and racing down the sideline to the Cal 10. Two plays later, Denegal connected with Napier for a 6-yard touchdown pass at the 11:42 mark of second quarter, giving the Aztecs a 7-0 lead they would not relinquish.

After forcing a three-and-out, SDSU set up shop in Cal territory at the 41 courtesy of Eric Butler's 22-yard punt return. The Aztec reached the Bear 12 on three consecutive carries for 18 yards by Christian Washington, who previously hauled in an 11-yard reception. However, the drive stalled when SDSU was flagged for offensive pass interference, forcing the hosts to ultimately settle for a 34-yard field goal by Gabriel Plascencia.

Plascencia also split the uprights from 41 yards out as time expired in the first half to cap a nine play, 51-yard march. Previously, Denegal scrambled for a 16-yard gain to the Bear 25 after hitting Bostick on a 19-yard completion. Shortly thereafter, the Aztecs caught a break when Cal jumped offsides, negating an end zone interception by Isaiah Crosby.

The teams traded possessions to begin the third quarter, with the Aztecs' pinning the Bears at their own 4-yard line following Hunter Green's pooch punt. Trondell Grizzell promptly caught a 24-yard pass from Sagapolutele to get Cal out of the shadow of its own end zone. Just one play later, however, Dasean Staley forced a fumble by Kendrick Raphael after a seven-yard gain. The ball took a fortuitous bounce into the waiting arms of McDougle, who darted 35 yards down the left sideline to increase SDSU's lead to 20-0.

After another exchange of punts, Cal marched 53 yards in eight plays to the Aztec 20, where Sagapolutele lofted a pass to the near left corner of the end zone on 1st-and-10. However, Johnson jumped the receiver's route and made an easy interception at the 3-yard line, following his blockers down the sideline for a touchdown that gave the Scarlet and Black a commanding 27-0 advantage.

SDSU closed out the scoring on its first possession of the fourth quarter when Lucky Sutton plowed up the middle for a 3-yard touchdown run with just over nine minutes left, punctuating a 12-play, 76-yard advance.

With time winding down in the fourth quarter, the only drama remaining was whether the Aztecs would keep the shutout intact. The Bears reached the SDSU 31, but backup quarterback Devin Brown was sacked for a 12-yard loss on fourth down with 1:46 left on the clock, preserving the whitewash.

Denegal finished with 189 yards on 15-of-18 passing, while Sutton led all Aztec runners with 61 yards on 12 carries.

Defensively, SDSU was paced by Owen Chambliss' game-high eight solo tackles, while Staley made seven solo stops of his own. August Salvati recorded a pair of sacks, while Bryce Phillips totaled three pass breakups.

• San Diego State improved to 3-1 on the season, equaling the win total for Sean Lewis in his first season with the Aztecs in 2024 (3-9).

• The Aztecs are now 17-2-1 against current teams in the Mid-American Conference (MAC), including a 12-2-1 mark against teams that were members of the MAC at game time.

• SDSU had its first turnover of the season 37 seconds into the second half, a Jayden Denegal interception. San Diego State had gone 231 offensive plays before giving up its first turnover of the season.

Aztecs Outlast Northern Illinois, 6-3

DEKALB, Ill. -- Gabe Plascencia kicked a 25-yard field goal as time expired to give San Diego State a 6-3 road win over Northern Illinois on Saturday.

Plascencia's winning kick came after the Aztecs (3-1) almost blocked a Huskie (1-3) punt, which resulted in SDSU starting on its own 44-yard line with 1:44 remaining. Five Lucky Sutton rushes, a facemask penalty, an offsides after NIU couldn't get a sub on the field and a kneel down by quarterback Jayden Denegal set up Plascencia on the Northern Illinois 6. After the Huskies called a timeout to try and ice Plascencia, he sailed it through the uprights for his 18th consecutive made field goal, tying Chris O'Brien's school record set from 1984-85.

It was the first time San Diego State won a regulation game with no time left since Sept. 10, 1994 vs. California when Peter Holt connected on a 32-yard field goal in a 22-20 win. Those are the only two walkoff victories for the Aztecs since at least the 1982 season.

SDSU improved to 3-1 with the win, matching the win total for Sean Lewis in his first season at the helm in 2024 (3-9). San Diego State is off to its best start since starting 7-0 in 2021 en route to a 12-2 season and No. 25 ranking in the final Associated Press Top 25 poll.

Both teams scored on long drives to opening the game, the Huskies going 62 yards and 12 plays over 7:50, ending with a 31-yard field goal by Andrew Glass.

The Aztecs responded with a 13-play, 63-drive of their own over 7:15 before Plascencia converted a 30-yarder on the first play of the second quarter.

Neither team got inside the 40 of the other side until the fourth quarter when SDSU reached the NIU 34. Facing a fourth-and-1, however, Jayden Denegal was picked off by Jasper Beeler on the Northern Illinois 32.

The Huskies took advantage of a San Diego State personal foul while punting and got into Aztec territory for the first and last time since their opening drive, but quarterback Josh Holst was stuffed on fourth-and-2 on the SDSU 44 by Trey White and Krishna Clay.

Each team traded punts before San Diego State's game-winning drive.

The Aztecs outgained NIU, 266-169, and limited the home team to 10 first downs and a 4-for-15 effort on third down.

SDSU didn't allow a touchdown for a second straight game for the first time since 2016 (Oct. 14 at Fresno State and Oct. 21 vs. San José State). The three points allowed over the last two games are the fewest allowed in a two-game stretch by San Diego State since 1975 (0 points at Fresno State on Oct. 11 and three points vs. New Mexico State on Oct. 18).

The three points by Northern Illinois, meanwhile, are its fewest in a game since also scoring three vs. South Florida in the 2010 International Bowl (Jan. 2, 2010) and fewest in a home game since being shut out vs. Navy on Nov. 15, 2008.

Sutton ran for 88 yards and 17 carries. Denegal was 13-for-20 for 110 yards and his first two interceptions of his career as the Aztecs snapped a five-game streak without a turnover (a SDSU DI-era record), but ended a 14-game losing streak when committing more turnovers (2) than their opponent (1).

Jordan Napier had six catches for 52 yards and 22 yards on the ground, while Donovan Brown added five receptions for 42 yards.

Owen Chambliss had a team-high 11 tackles with a 10-yard sack, while Chris Johnson had seven tackles and an interception for a second straight game.

Coupled with a 42-0 shutout over Stony Brook in the opener on Aug. 28, a 36-13 loss at Washington State on Sept. 6 and a 34-0 shutout over California on Sept. 20, SDSU has allowed just 39 points, its fewest through four games in 50 years.

San Diego State improved to 7-0 all-time against Northern Illinois. The seven victories without a loss are the most by the Aztecs against current NCAA Division I teams (second is a 3-0 mark against FCS programs Idaho State, Montana State, Northern Arizona and Weber State). SDSU is also now 17-2-1 against current teams from the Mid-American Conference (MAC).

- SDSU is 4-1, its best five-game start to a season since starting 7-0 in 2021. That 2021 team set a program record with 12 victories (12-2) and finished 25th in the final Associated Press Top 25 Poll.
- This is the sixth time San Diego State has started a season with at least a 4-1 record through five games over the last 10 years: 4-1 in 2025, 5-0 in 2021, 4-1 in 2019, 4-1 in 2018, 5-0 in 2017 and 4-1 in 2016.
- The Aztecs won their 18th straight game when rushing for at least 200 yards, improving to 59-2 over their last 61 200-yard rushing games.

- San Diego State is now 30-1 in its Division I history when having multiple 100-yard rushers in the same game, including wins in 20 straight games.
- QB Jayden Denegal finished with a pass efficiency rating of 256.90, the third-best mark in SDSU's DI history (since 1969) and best since Kevin McKechnie's school-record mark of 291.81 vs. Navy on Sept. 5, 1997.
- WR Jordan Napier had a career-high 153 yards and a touchdown on seven catches.
- K Gabe Plascencia made a career-long 53-yard field goal and now has made 19 consecutive field goals, the longest streak in program history.

Team Effort Propels Aztecs Past CSU, 45-24

SAN DIEGO -- After mustering just two field goals last week, San Diego State's offense came to life on Friday, scoring touchdowns on four straight drives in the first half to highlight a 45-24 triumph over Colorado State in the Mountain West opener for both teams at Snapdragon Stadium.

With the victory, the Aztecs improve to 4-1 overall, eclipsing their win-total from the entire 2024 campaign (3-9) in head coach Sean Lewis' first year at the helm. SDSU also won its conference opener for the 10th time in the last 13 years.

In addition, San Diego State remains unbeaten at home with a 3-0 mark, outscoring the opposition 121-24 in that stretch, as the Rams drop to 1-4 on the season.

The Aztecs outgained CSU on Friday, 540-355, marking the first time the Scarlet and Black produced over 500 yards of total offense since a 38-7 rout at Utah State on Oct. 31, 2020.

In a contest featuring a series of superlative performances, Byron Cardwell Jr. led all players with a career-high 129 yards on 15 carries and one touchdown, all in the second half, while Lucky Sutton set a collegiate best as well, rushing for 113 yards on 21 attempts with a pair of scores.

With their efforts, Cardwell and Sutton gave the SDSU its first pair of 100-yard rushers in the same game since Sept. 14, 2019, when Jordan Byrd (118) and Chance Bell (116) accomplished the feat at New Mexico State.

Jayden Denegal also helped direct a balanced offense, passing for a career-high 256 yards with two touchdowns after completing 13-of-16 attempts. Jordan Napier was Denegal's favorite target, hauling in seven receptions for a collegiate-best 153 yards and one touchdown.

Not to be outdone, the Aztec defense flashed its mettle with eight tackles for 44 yards in losses, including four sacks.

SDSU's big-play potential was on full display in the first half, as Denegal connected with a streaking Donovan Brown on a 45-yard touchdown pass down the right sideline on the Aztecs' second possession of the game.

SDSU extended its lead to 14-0 early in the second quarter when Christian Washington barreled across the goal line from two yards out, capping a 13-play, 64-yard march.

The teams traded scores on their next four possessions, with CSU trimming the deficit to 14-7 courtesy of Jackson Brousseau's 49-yard scoring strike to Armani Winfield. However, the Aztecs quickly drove 73 yards in seven plays, culminating in Denegal's 42-yard touchdown bomb to Napier, which restored their two-touchdown advantage at 21-7.

The Rams followed with a lengthy 15-play march before Isaiah Hankins salvaged three points with a 30-yard field goal. SDSU wasted no time on its next foray down the field, consuming just 41 seconds of clock in three plays before Sutton scampered up the middle for a 14-yard touchdown run, giving the Scarlet and Black a 28-10 cushion at the half.

The Aztecs played ball control in the second half, outrushing the Rams, 194-46, while maintaining the edge in time of possession (17:35-12:25).

Gabriel Plascencia split the uprights from a career-long 53-yards out on the SDSU's first possession of the second half for his school-record 19th consecutive field goal, surpassing the previous standard of 18 set by Chris O'Brien in 1984-85.

Following a three-and-out, the Aztecs extended their advantage to 38-10 when Sutton scored his second touchdown of the night on a 1-yard run, punctuating a 12-play, 75-yard advance.

CSU finally responded to the Scarlet and Black's 17-0 blitz, when Brousseau scrambled four yards for a touchdown at the 12:35 mark of the fourth quarter, with a subsequent two-point conversion narrowing the gap to 38-18.

Cardwell stole the spotlight on SDSU's ensuing possession, accounting for all 59 yards in four carries, capped by a 20-yard touchdown run that gave the Aztecs an insurmountable 45-18 lead.

The final margin was later settled when Ram backup quarterback Darius Curry found Kory Hall on a 12-yard touchdown pass as time expired.

Aztecs Blow Past Nevada, 44-10, on the Road

RENO, Nev.-- San Diego State scored on a punt return and an interception return in the first quarter, and Jayden Denegal threw for two more scores in a 44-10 victory at Nevada on Saturday night.

It was the fourth consecutive victory for the Aztecs (5-1, 2-0 MW), who continued their best start since beginning the 2021 campaign with a 7-0 record en route to a school-record 12 wins.

Jordan Napier returned a punt 75 yards for a touchdown less than a minute into the game. It was SDSU's first punt return touchdown since Jordan Byrd had one against Idaho State on Sept. 10, 2022 and the longest since BJ Busbee had a 90-yarder vs. Colorado State on Dec. 5, 2020.

After a second straight three-and-out by the Wolf Pack (1-5, 0-2 MW), Chris Johnson picked off Carter Jackson and returned it 45 yards to put San Diego State up, 14-0. Johnson became the first Aztec since Andrew Aleki in 2021 with multiple interceptions returned for a touchdown in the same season.

It was the first time San Diego State had punt return and interception returns for a touchdown since Nov. 23, 2013 vs. Boise State.

SDSU picked off Jackson again on Nevada's ensuing drive as Dwayne McDougale came up with it and gave San Diego State the ball on its own 30-yard line. Denegal found Christian Washington with a 2-yard pass into the end zone on the first play of the second quarter to put the Aztecs up three touchdowns at 21-0. SDSU marched 70 yards on eight plays on the drive.

San Diego State got the ball back after a Wolf Pack punt and went 73 yards on seven plays before Denegal found Jacob Bostick running across the field. Bostick ran it 31 yards into the end zone to make it 28-0.

Nevada got all the way to the Aztec 7, but the relentless SDSU defense held on fourth-and-goal, giving the visitors the ball back with 4:22 left in the first half.

San Diego State promptly went 93 yards on six plays, ultimately finishing with a 3-yard tough touchdown run by Lucky Sutton. Two big plays got the Aztecs down inside near the goal line, including a 29-yard run by Denegal and a 41-yard pass from Denegal to Napier.

SDSU's 35 points in the first half were its most since at least the 2000 season.

San Diego State didn't score a touchdown in the second half as its starters hardly played in the fourth quarter on both sides of the ball. Gabe Plascencia made field goals on three straight drives for the Aztecs in the third quarter, including a 29-yarder, a 45-yarder and a 49-yarder as SDSU led, 44-0, heading into the fourth.

Nevada got on the scoreboard with 12:50 left in the game on a 34-yard field goal by Joe McFadden. The Wolf Pack closed out the scoring with a 16-yard pass from Carter Jones to Marshaun Brown.

Denegal was 14-of-17 passing for 205 yards and two touchdowns. Napier logged his third 100-yard game over the last four with 110 yards on five catches to go along with his 75-yard punt return touchdown. Sutton ran for 81 yards on 17 carries (4.8 avg.).

It was the second straight game with at least 40 points for San Diego State, the first time that has happened since 2017.

Dalesean Staley and Owen Chambliss had six tackles apiece to lead the Aztec defense.

SDSU Shuts Out Fresno State, 23-0, for Old Oil Can

FRESNO, Calif. -- Lucky Sutton rushed for a career-high 131 yards and a touchdown, and the San Diego State defense pitched its third shutout of the season in a 23-0 victory over Fresno State Saturday at Valley's Children Stadium in Fresno.

The win made the Aztecs (6-1, 3-0 Mountain West) bowl eligible for the first time since 2022, but the 14th time in the last 16 seasons. It was the fifth consecutive victory for SDSU, which held onto the Old Oil Can Trophy in the rivalry of two teams who will leave the Mountain West for the new Pac-12 Conference in 2026.

San Diego State became the first team to shut out the Bulldogs (5-3, 2-2 MW) in Fresno since 1980 and the first time overall since 2016. It was the first shutout for the Aztecs in the series since 1998 and first in Fresno since 1975, improving SDSU to 32-27-4 all-time in the series.

This is the first time in San Diego State's Division I history (since 1969) that it has three shutouts in a season. It was also the first shutout for the Aztecs in a road game since Nov. 8, 2003 at UNLV.

SDSU outgained FS, 332-227, including a decisive 208-45 advantage on the ground. San Diego State won its 20th straight game and improved to 61-2 over its last 63 games when rushing for at least 200 yards.

Sutton got the Aztecs on the scoreboard on their second drive of the game, scoring on a 1-yard touchdown on a 9-play, 92-yard drive. The big play came on a 54-yard catch-and-run from Jordan Denegal to a wide-open Byron Cardwell on a second-and-7 that got SDSU to the 1, before Sutton punched it in.

San Diego State got into Fresno State territory early in the second quarter but had to settle for a 42-yard field goal by Gabe Plascencia. It was the 23rd consecutive field goal for Plascencia, which broke the Mountain West record and extended his school record. He added two more later in the game.

The Aztecs threatened on their next drive, but Denegal's pass on the Bulldog 32 was picked off on the 3 by Al'zillion Hamilton.

SDSU, however, got the ball back when Trey White hit quarterback Carson Conklin and August Salvati was there to grab the interception at the FS32. San Diego State was unable to get a first down and, after a 5-yard false start, Plascencia nailed a 50-yarder to put the Aztecs up 13.

FS got into SDSU territory late in the half, but San Diego State stood tall on a fourth-and-10 play, keeping the score at 13-0 at the half.

The Aztecs got deep into Fresno State territory in their first drive of the second half after the Bulldogs were forced to punt, but on a trick play that started on the FS 8, Jordan Napier fumbled and Fresno State got all the way to its own 47.

SDSU, however, came up big by forcing a three-and-out and getting the ball back on its own 9. San Diego State went 82 yards on 11 plays, using up 5:34 before Plascencia's third field goal of the night -- this time from 27 yards -- put the Aztecs up, 16-0, with 13:22 remaining.

On the Bulldogs' ensuing drive, facing a third-and-10, Conklin was picked off by SDSU linebacker Tano Letuli, who returned it 31 yards for the touchdown for the final points of the game.

FS got into San Diego State territory in each of its final two drives, but couldn't convert at fourth-and-5 from the Aztec 12 or on a fourth-and-9 from the SDSU 47. San Diego State then knelt to complete the 23-0 victory.

Sutton notched his third 100-yard game of the season (and career) to lead the Aztec offense. Cardwell caught two passes for 59 yards and ran for another 26.

Dalesean Staley led the SDSU defense with seven tackles, including 0.5 for loss, and a pair of pass breakups. San Diego State didn't allow a play longer than 14 yards.

At 6-1, the Aztecs are off to their best start since starting 7-0 in 2021. That 2021 team set a program record with 12 victories (12-2) and finished 25th in the final Associated Press Top 25 Poll.

SDSU is 3-0 in MW play for the sixth time in league history.

Aztecs Down Wyoming, 24-7, for Homecoming

SAN DIEGO -- Lucky Sutton ran for a career-high 158 yards, highlighted by a 50-yard touchdown run late in the fourth quarter, and the San Diego State defense once again put up a dominating performance in a 24-7 San Diego State victory over Wyoming Saturday night for Homecoming at Snapdragon Stadium.

It was the sixth consecutive victory for the Aztecs (7-1, 4-0 MW), who moved into sole possession of first place in their last season playing in the Mountain West.

Sutton put the game away with a 50-yard run - the longest of his career - on a first-and-15 with 2 minutes, 55 seconds left to play to put SDSU up, 24-7.

The Cowboys (4-5, 2-3 MW), who were coming off a 28-0 shutout over Colorado State, were stuffed on four plays by the stifling San Diego State defense.

The Aztecs then knelt in victory formation to remain unbeaten at home at 4-0, outscoring the opposition, 145-31, so far with two home games still to be played.

It was the second straight game Sutton set a career high in rushing yards after running for 131 in SDSU's 23-0 win at Fresno State last Saturday.

UW jumped out on front of San Diego State in its first visit at Snapdragon Stadium, which debuted in 2022, by using an 8-play, 75-yard drive before Landon Sims connected on a 3-yard pass to Sam Scott.

It was the first time the Aztecs trailed in a game since a 3-0 deficit at Northern Illinois on Sept. 27 with 14:56 left in the second quarter. SDSU had one 229 minutes, 26 seconds of game time without trailing until the Wyoming touchdown.

That would be the last time the Cowboys would score, however, as San Diego State forced nine three-and-outs (or less) over their 14 drives the rest of the game. After its opening drive, UW was held to just 110 yards the rest of the game, missing a pair of field goals and turning the ball over four times.

The Aztecs tuned two of those turnovers into points, beginning with an interception by Brice Phillips in the first quarter that gave SDSU the ball on the Wyoming 24-yard line. San Diego State wasted no time as Jayden Denegal found Byron Cardwell Jr. for a catch and run touchdown, tying the game up at 7-7 with 3:32 left.

Early in the second quarter, Dwayne McDougle picked off Kaden Anderson on the Cowboy 36. San Diego State got to the 15, but elected to settle for a 34-yard field goal by Gabe Plascencia on fourth-and-1 to give the Aztecs a lead they would never relinquish.

The Cowboys got into SDSU territory when Tegen Seeds intercepted Jayden Denegal. Erik Sandvik, however, was well short on a 50-yard field goal try.

San Diego State then went 67 yards on six plays before Jordan Napier rushed it in the end zone from seven yards out to make it 17-0.

The Aztecs intercepted for a third time in the first half when Dalsean Staley broke up a pass and Owen Chambliss came up with it, getting to the UW 48. With 1:20 left in the half, Denegal found Cardwell for a 25-yard gain. After a 4-yard rush by Cardwell, Denegal was picked off with an errant pass in the end zone, keeping the score at 17-7 at the half.

Plascencia missed a chip 23-yard field goal try on the opening drive of the second half, snapping a streak of 26 consecutive field goals.

After a scoreless third quarter, Wyoming got all the way to the SDSU 19, but a false start and holding penalty on back-to-back snaps, moved the Cowboys back. One play later and facing a second-and-27, Michael Fitzgerald caught a pass but defensive tackle Malachi Finau forced the ball loose and Eric Butler pounced on it.

San Diego State couldn't take advantage, but luckily Sandvik was woefully short on another 50-yard try midway through the fourth.

Looking to wind down the clock late in the game, Sutton ran for a first down with an 11-yard carry before getting whistled for a false start. He then took the next snap 50 yards to seal the Aztec win.

Denegal, who was a game-time decision because of an injury, threw for 194 yards and a touchdown, completed 11 of 22 passes.

Chambliss had a career and game-high 13 tackles, including eight solo, to pace the SDSU defense. Trey White added a pair of sacks in another good effort for the MW preseason defensive player of the year.

SDSU's Win Streak Snapped at Hawai'i, 38-6

HONOLULU -- San Diego State saw its six-game winning streak come to an end with a 38-6 loss at Hawai'i on Saturday night in Honolulu.

The Aztecs (7-2, 4-1 MW) were outmatched in all three phases against a Rainbow Warrior (7-3, 4-2 MW) team that was playing its first home game in four weeks.

Playing with out All-American candidate cornerback Chris Johnson, SDSU gave up three passing touchdowns and 300 total yards in the first half. San Diego State, which entered with a second-ranked scoring defense (10.0), sixth-ranked overall defense (246.3) and sixth-ranked passing defense (157.8), gave up 386 total yards, including 256 through the air, and 20 first downs.

On offense, the Aztecs didn't find the end zone despite having seven of their 14 drives go into UH territory. SDSU, which totaled 267 yards of offense, was 2-for-14 on third down and 0-for-2 on fourth down. San Diego State committed four turnovers, its most in a game since also having four in the same Clarence T.C. Ching Athletics Complex in the 2022 Hawai'i Bowl against Middle Tennessee State.

On special teams, SDSU wasted a historic punting night by giving up its first kick return touchdown since Nov. 23, 2013 against Boise State. San Diego State made two field goals, but missed a third in the waning moments of the first half because of a bad hold. Punters Hunter Green and Tashi Dorje each logged a punt of at least 60 yards, the first time that has happened in a game since Georgia State on Sept. 10, 2016 and just the 10th time it has happened since at least 1996.

Lucky Sutton rushed for 78 yards, while Jayden Denegal was 10-for-27 for 132 yards, two interceptions and zero touchdowns. Donovan Brown caught three passes for 60 yards.

Owen Chambliss had 13 tackles for a second straight game, including a pair of sacks and three tackles for loss. Dalsean Staley chipped in with eight stops.

Micah Alejado threw three first-half touchdown passes to Jackson Harris, and a Kansei Matsuzawa 22-yard field goal made it 24-6 Hawai'i at the half.

Cam Barfield then returned the opening kickoff of the second 86 yards for a touchdown and Elijah Palmer later added a 53-yard pick-6 that capped the scoring in the fourth quarter.

In addition to having its six-game overall winning streak snapped (was tied for the eighth longest in the country), SDSU also had its five-game winning streak in the series snapped, a four-game conference winning streak (was tied for the 11th longest) and a three-game road winning streak (was tied for the 10th longest).

San Diego State fell to 26-12-2 all-time against the Rainbow Warriors, finishing 11-3 in the series in UH's Mountain West era.

- The Aztecs already have their most wins (8) in a season since setting program record with 12 victories in 2021.
- SDSU improved to 5-1 in Mountain West play, its best conference start since also starting 5-1 in 2021.

- SDSU improved to 62-2 the last 64 times it has rushed for at least 200 yards (5-0 this season).
- With 150 rushing yards, RB **Lucky Sutton** broke 1,000 for the season. He's the 20th different Aztec with a 1,000-yard rushing season in program history (28th 1,000-yard rusher overall). Sutton now has 1,048 rushing yards, which currently ranks 23rd in SDSU single-season history.
- **Sutton** logged his fifth 100-yard rushing game of the season with 150 yards on 25 attempts (6.0 avg.).

Aztecs Power Past Boise State, 17-7

SAN DIEGO -- Bolstered by a strong running game and a hard-hitting defense, San Diego State rebounded with a big 17-7 victory over Boise State in a key Mountain West showdown Saturday at a rain-swept Snapdragon Stadium.

The Aztecs (8-2, 5-1 MW) posted their second-highest team rushing total of the season with 277 yards to snap a three-game losing streak to the Broncos (6-4, 4-2 MW) and take over sole possession of first place in the MW.

Lucky Sutton led the SDSU ground attack with 150 yards on 25 attempts, while Christian Washington added 98 yards on just nine carries, helping the Aztecs improve to 62-2 in their last 64 games when rushing for over 200 yards.

Not to be outdone, quarterback Jayden Denegal punctuated two first-half scoring drives with a pair of short touchdown runs.

Despite the slick conditions, neither team committed a turnover, as the Scarlet and Black raised its record to 42-8 since the 2012 campaign without giving the ball away.

A defensive battle unfolded from the outset, with the two teams trading punts on the first seven possessions of the contest.

After mustering just five yards on its first three drives, San Diego State was finally able to get its running game in high gear during a game-defining six-play, 80-yard touchdown march, capped by Denegal's keeper from a yard out with 1:45 elapsed in the second quarter.

Washington accounted for all but the final yard on that foray, highlighted by a 41-yard burst down the right sideline to the Boise State 39 on the first snap following a Bronco punt. Two plays later, the San Diego native plowed up the middle for another sizable gain of 26 yards, putting the Scarlet and Black in the red zone at the Boise State 11.

The Broncos responded with a scoring drive of their own, marching 75 yards in 14 plays, culminating in Dylan Riley's nine-yard touchdown run on a 3rd-and-goal situation, which knotted the score at 7-7.

Undaunted, the Aztecs turned to Sutton on their next foray down the field, and the SDSU junior delivered, rushing for 65 of team's 71 yards on an 11-play march that consumed 4:13 on the clock.

On the second play of the drive, Sutton helped the Aztecs out of a 2nd-and-12 hole with a 14-yard rush up the middle to the SDSU 41. Facing a 4th-and-1 situation at midfield four plays later, he darted through a gaping hole on left side for a crucial 27-yard scamper to the Bronco 23.

Sutton gained 15 yards on the next five plays before Denegal scored on an eight-yard scramble on 3rd-and-goal, giving the hosts a 14-7 lead they would not relinquish with 1:10 left before intermission.

San Diego State rushed for 166 yards in the first half, its highest total over the first two quarters since 2020.

The Aztecs seemed poised to increase their advantage on their first drive of the second half when Denegal connected with Donovan Brown for an apparent 29-yard gain to the Boise State 17 on a 3rd-and-2 play. However, the call was overturned after an official replay, forcing an SDSU punt.

The score remained unchanged until the 10:51 mark of the fourth quarter when Gabriel Plascencia booted a 47-yard field goal. Previously, Washington kept the drive alive with a 14-yard burst up the middle to the Boise State 49 on a 3rd-and-4 situation.

The Broncos reached the SDSU 43 on the ensuing possession where Riley was stuffed for a one-yard loss on 3rd and 2. On the next play, Max Cutforth completed a 19-yard pass to Cameron Bates, but a holding penalty nullified the gain, forcing Boise State to punt.

The Broncos had one last chance to narrow the deficit, but Boomer's 41-yard field goal attempt drifted wide left, and the Aztecs ran out the remaining 1:20 with three straight kneel downs to seal the victory.

Cutforth completed 5-of-9 passes for 72 yards in desperation mode on that final drive. Otherwise, the SDSU defense held the Boise State signal caller in check for the balance of the night with just 32 yards through the air.

Although the Broncos gained 164 yards on the ground, they averaged 4.0 yards per carry, compared to the Aztecs' 6.0 clip.

Individually, Owen Chambliss and Mister Williams led the Aztecs with eight tackles apiece, followed by Trey White (7 tackles) and Chris Johnson (6 tackles), who topped the squad with five solo stops each.

Big Notes

- Only 10 teams have more victories than SDSU's nine this year.
- This is the sixth time San Diego State has started with at least a 6-1 league record in its 27 seasons of MW play (7-0 in 2015, 6-1 in 2012, 2013, 2016, 2021 and 2025).
- All three of the Aztecs' MW titles came when they started with at least a 6-1 record in league play (2012, 2015 and 2016).
- SDSU remains in sole possession of first place in MW play at 6-1 with one regular season game to play (Nov. 28 at New Mexico), one game ahead of Boise State (5-2), New Mexico (5-2) and UNLV (5-2).
- San Diego State finished with a perfect 6-0 record at home in the regular season, its first undefeated home regular season since the 1996 team went 6-0 at home. The Aztecs now have six undefeated home campaigns - 1969 (6-0), 1972 (7-0), 1974 (7-0-1), 1977 (7-0), 1996 (6-0) and 2025 (6-0).
- San Diego State has outscored its opponents, 187-41, at home this season, which is an average of 31.2-6.8.
- The Aztecs are one of 25 teams with a perfect record at home this year.
- This was the seventh time (in 11 games) that San Diego State held its opponents to single-digits in points, which eclipsed the 1973 squad for the most in SDSU's Division I history.
- In the nine Aztec wins this year, they are outscoring the opposition, 260-54, (28.9-6.0).
- This was the seventh game SDSU did not trail this season.
- The Aztecs improved to 3-0 against teams from California this season, outscoring them, 82-3.
- San Diego State held San Jose State without a touchdown for the first time since Sept. 25, 2021 at Western Michigan and the first time in a Mountain West game since Oct. 21, 2016 against the Aztecs (SDSU won, 42-3).

SDSU Dispatches San Jose State, 25-3

SAN DIEGO -- Lucky Sutton, Jayden Denegal and Christian Washington each had a rushing touchdown and the San Diego State defense put up another standout performance in a 25-3 win over San Jose State on Saturday night at Snapdragon Stadium.

The Aztecs (9-2), who were picked eight in the Mountain West preseason poll, remained in first place atop the league standings at 6-1, one game ahead of Boise State, New Mexico and UNLV with a game to play.

Sutton rushed for 79 yards and Washington added 70 as SDSU continued its bully-style play with two starting wide receivers (Jordan Napier and Jacob Bostick) out for the season with injuries.

Denegal was 8-for-16 for 81 yards, and scored his third rushing touchdown over the last two games.

Defensively, San Diego State continued its historic season, limiting the high-powered Spartan (3-8, 2-5 MW) offense, which came into the game averaging 313.8 passing yards and 7.53 yards per attempt, to a season-low 135 passing yards and a 3.55 yards per attempt average, its lowest since a 2.27 mark at Western Michigan on Sept. 25, 2021.

The Aztecs held SJSU without a touchdown for the first time since that WMU game and the first time in a Mountain West contest since a 42-3 SDSU win on Oct. 21, 2016. Five of SJSU's 11 drives ended in either a three-and-out (or less) or a turnover, while another two ended in missed field goals. San Jose State didn't have a play longer than 19 yards in the game.

On the third play from scrimmage, Dwayne McDougle picked off a Walker Egat pass and returned it 25 yards to the 20. Six plays later, Sutton's 1-yard touchdown run opened the scoring less than four minutes into the game.

Denis Lynch missed badly on field-goal attempt from 43 yards and San Diego State later made it 11-0 in the first quarter on a 35-yard field goal by Gabe Plascencia.

Mathias Brown got the Spartans on the scoreboard on its ensuing drive with a 37-yard field goal.

After forcing a punt, SJSU got the ball back midway through the second quarter, but Brown missed a 39-yard field goal.

The Aztecs then used a meticulous 10-play, 79-yard drive over 3:16, before Denegal's quarterback keeper on fourth-and-goal from the San Jose State 1 in the waning moments of the first half made it 18-3 at the half.

Neither team scored in the third quarter with only the Spartans running any plays in their opponent side of the field. SJSU converted a fourth-and-3 from the SDSU 46 and tried again on a fourth-and-1 pass on the San Diego State 34, but Aztec cornerback Chris Johnson snuffed it out and tackled wide receiver Danny Scudero for a no-gain and turnover on downs.

In the fourth quarter, Tama Amisone's pass was picked off by Johnson in spectacular fashion. Despite not scoring on its ensuing drive and giving the ball back to San Jose State, SDSU's Ryan Henderson sacked third-string quarterback Robert McDaniel on a fourth-and-19 from the San Diego State 42.

The Aztecs went 45 yards on five plays - all rushes by Washington - before an 8-yard Washington touchdown capped the scoring at 25-3 with 2:03 left in the game.

The Spartans' last-ditch effort was stopped by SDSU in four plays, giving San Diego State the ball back to win the game in victory formation.

Henderson became the fifth Aztec to record at least two sacks in the game, two of four against SJSU, which allowed just 0.90 per game (seventh in FBS) coming in. Dalesan Staley led the team with eight tackles.

The win capped a perfect 6-0 regular-season record at home for SDSU, its first undefeated home regular season since 1996 and sixth in its Division I history (since 1969). San Diego State has outscored its opponents, 187-41, at home this season, which is an average of 31.2-6.8.

This was the seventh time of the season that the Aztecs held a team to single-digits in points, breaking the record set in 1973 at six games.

SDSU improved to 3-0 against teams from California this season, outscoring California, Fresno State and San Jose State by an 82-3 margin.
