OLD RIVALS MEET FOR RELIEF

Penn State men's basketball travels to West Virginia as the two teams will play a charity exhibition game on Saturday, Nov. 3 at WVU Coliseum. All proceeds from the game will benefit American Red Cross hurricane relief efforts.

The United States was affected by two recent and devastating category 4 hurricanes, Florence and Michael, with damage across the Mid-Atlantic and Southeast.

Prior to landfall, Hurricane Florence was measured at 350 miles wide, 67 miles wider than the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, and dropped more than 30 inches of rain in some parts of the state of North Carolina. Hurricane Michael was ranked as the fourth-most powerful storm to hit the U.S. and worst since Hurricane Camille in 1969.

ESPN.com recently released its list of major collegiate coaches who excel at developing talent with Nittany Lion coach Patrick Chambers ranked in the No. 7 spot. The rankings were compiled from player improvement data from 2010-11 through 2017-18.

FOR OPENERS

The Nittany Lions will open the 2018-19 season at home in the Bryce Jordan Center for the 14th-straight year. Penn State has won 12 of its last 13 season openers.

Each Big Ten team will play two league games in early December for the second consecutive year. Penn State defeated Iowa for its first conference-opening win on the road since 2010-11 (69-60 W at Indiana, 12/27/2010) and first win in Iowa City since 2001.

BANNER YEAR

Penn State will unveil its 2018 National Invitation Tournament championship banner during pregame festivities on opening night Friday, Nov. 9 vs. North Florida.

KENPOM 2019

The 2019 KenPom rankings place the Nittany Lions at No. 32 overall for their highest preseason start ever and 12th in adjusted defense, best in the Big Ten.

GETTING DEFENSIVE

In preseason previews of the 2018-19 Big Ten Conference field and individual honors, senior guard Josh Reaves rises to the top as the pick for the league's top defensive player. Athlon Sports' superlatives tab Reaves and Lindy's also picks the league's two-time steals leader as its top defender.

THE NUMBERS GAME

With 113 victories in his seven-year tenure at Penn State, coach Patrick Chambers is closing in on the win totals of Ed DeChellis (114, 8 years) and Jerry Dunn (117, 8 years).

20 FOR THE BIG TEN

The Big Ten Conference announced in October 2017 that the league's 14 men's basketball programs would move to a 20-game schedule beginning in 2018-19. The Big Ten will be the first conference to play 20 conference games in the history of Division I basketball with each team playing seven opponents twice and six teams once (three home, three away) in a given season.

Penn State will play Illinois, Maryland, Michigan, Nebraska, Purdue, Rutgers and Wisconsin twice. The Nittany Lions will welcome Indiana, Iowa and Michigan State to the BJC and play road games at Minnesota, Northwestern and Ohio State.

CLIMBING WITH US

Penn State fans confirmed their passion for the basketball program's climb, averaging nearly 11,500 in attendance over the final five home games of the 2017-18 season. Courtside seats have sold out for the upcoming campaign with additional interest in those premier seat locations.

NEW TO NITTANY LIONS

Penn State's trip to Cancun will be the first time the Nittany Lions will play in Mexico and its first in-season international trip since a trip to Puerto Rico early in the 2012-13 season. Two opponents on the 2018-19 slate, North Florida and Jacksonville State, part of the U.S. Regional of the Cancun Challenge, are first-time foes for the Nittany Lions.

NEW FACES

Six newcomers join the Nittany Lions for the 2018-19 season with four freshmen signees: guards Rasir Bolton, Myles Dread, Myreon Jones and Daniil Kasatkin and two transfers in guards Izaiah Brockington (St. Bonaventure) and Kyle McCloskey (Villanova-FB). McCloskey will have four years to play basketball and Brockington will have three years of eligibility remaining.

NEW PLACES

Penn State guard and alumnus Tim Frazier (2009-14) recently signed a contract to join the NBA's New Orleans Pelicans. Shep Garner (2014-18) inked a deal with the Grand Rapids Drive of the G League during the fall while Donovan Jack (2012-16) signed with KD Hopsi Polzela in Slovenia. In June 2018, D.J. Newbill (2012-15) agreed to a new contract to play with the NBL's Cairns Taipans.

Tony Carr, drafted by the New Orleans Pelicans in June 2018, is currently playing for Fiat Torino in the Italian Lega Basket Serie A. Brandon Taylor will tipped off the 2018-19 season in October with his new team, Salon Vilpas, in Finland's Korisliiga.

GAVITT TIPOFF GAMES, THE SEQUEL

The Nittany Lions will participate in their second Gavitt Tipoff Games series in 2018-19. Penn State and DePaul were paired in the inaugural Gavitt Tipoff Games in 2015.

The unique series between the two conferences was named to honor the late Dave Gavitt, the founder of the Big East Conference and basketball visionary. Gavitt had a profound and lasting influence on the sport of basketball on the collegiate, professional and Olympic levels and was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in 2006.

STEVENS NAMED TO ERVING WATCH LIST

Penn State junior Lamar Stevens was named to the watch list for the Julius Erving Small Forward of the Year Award as announced in October by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. Stevens, from North Wales, Pa., is one of the 20 student-athletes selected for the watch list for the 2019 award.

Named after Class of 1993 Hall of Famer and 16-year professional basketball player Julius Erving, the annual honor in its fifth year recognizes the top small forwards in Division I men's college basketball. A national committee comprised of top college basketball personnel determined the watch list of 20 candidates.

Stevens was voted the Most Outstanding Player of the 2018 National Invitation Tournament as he helped lead Penn State to its second NIT title this past March. He scored a game-high 28 points in the championship game and with that total, eclipsed the 1,000 career point mark, becoming only the second Penn State sophomore to achieve that milestone. An All-Big Ten Conference honorable mention, Stevens recorded double figures in 33 games in 2017-18 and with 10 games of 20 points or more, including two 30-point games.

Penn State Athletics Marketing Manager P.J. Mullen initiated the idea to use the drawings and asked the children of the coaching staff to lend their artistic ability to the project.

With a unique picture for each of the 15 home games, each image will be unveiled on the Penn State men's basketball team's social media channels on the day of the game.

The Penn State Nittany Lion logo, basketballs, the court and the fan-favorite Nittany Lion appear in many of the pictures. Each child contributed their own creativity and drew their favorite things about basketball games.

POWER RANKINGS

At the end of the 2017-18 season, Penn State had climbed to its highest rankings of the season in kenpom.com (19), the ESPN Basketball Power Index (20) and Sagarin (27).

NATIONAL NOTICE

Penn State earned 19 votes in the final USA Today Coaches Top 25 poll, fifth among the other teams receiving votes. It was the first time since the 2008-09 season the Nittany Lions had been recognized. In the February 19 Associated Press poll, Penn State received six votes, the first time the program had received votes since December 29, 2014, and the most votes received since a total of 14 on January 31, 2011.

GOOD COMPANY

Penn State was one of only six NCAA Division I teams that had not lost a game by more than 12 points in 2017-18. Other teams in its company included Duke and Villanova.

HOME SWEET HOME

With a 78.9 win percentage (15-4) in the Bryce Jordan Center in 2017-18, Penn State took over the program's No. 4 spot for home season win percentages. The 15 wins in the BJC were the second-highest in a single season (17, 2008-09).

RANKED FOES TESTED IN BJC

Penn State won five of its last seven contests versus ranked teams at home in the Bryce Jordan Center. The Nittany Lions' 23-point margin of victory over No. 8 Ohio State is the largest over a ranked team in the program's 122-year history.

FIRST 20-WIN SEASON SINCE 2008-09

Coach Chambers and the Nittany Lions posted the first 20-win season since 2008-09 and Penn State's 10th season with 20 or more wins, fifth in its Big Ten era. The 26-win total is the second-highest all-time.

RECORDS BROKEN

More than 50 Penn State records fell during the 2017-18 season with 31 individual and 21 team records being replaced. One Big Ten record, the individual single-season mark for 3-point field goals, was broken by senior guard Shep Garner (120).

AH-MAZING MARCH

March was amazing for the Nittany Lions as they won seven games during the month, tied for the most by a Penn State team. The 2017-18 squad also posted the highest-ever win percentage in conference and postseason games in March 2018, at 87.5 percent (7-1 record).

TREY-MENDOUS

Since 2011-12, Penn State has had 60 games with nine or more 3-point field goals. Three of the top four totals in the Chambers' era occurred in 2017-18: Coppin State (14), Northwestern (BTT-13, Penn State BTT record) and at Iowa (12).

THE WINS

Penn State has achieved 15 or more wins in five straight years – a first for the Nittany Lion program. Prior to the 2013-17* seasons under Chambers, the Nittany Lions had not previously reached at least 15 wins in four consecutive seasons since joining the Big Ten.

The Lions also have at least eight regular-season, nonconference wins in each of Chambers' seven seasons with 10 in 2017-18.

EARLIEST TO 21 WINS

When Penn State recorded its 21st win of the 2017-18 season, a thrilling 69-68 win over No. 13 Ohio State in the quarterfinals of the Big Ten Tournament on March 2, it marked the earliest, by date, that Penn State achieved 21 wins.

ON THE ROAD, AGAIN

Penn State won six "true" away games (at an opponent's arena) in 2017-18, a total achieved only four times since joining the Big Ten Conference for the 1992-93 season. The 11 "away from home" wins logged is the most since the 2000-01 campaign (11).

The last season in which Penn State won seven "true" away games was 1971-72.

BIG WINS

With the February 3 Big Ten victory over Iowa, the 2017-18 Nittany Lions made another impact on Penn State's Big Ten basketball history. The sixth league win for coach Patrick Chambers gave the Nittany Lions a third consecutive season with six or more Big Ten wins, accomplished only once before in seasons 1993-94, 1994-95 and 1995-96.

NUMBER NINE

With its ninth Big Ten win at 9-6, only once before in its Big Ten history has Penn State had nine conference wins earlier in the season. In the 1995-96 season, the Nittany Lions reached nine wins in 13 league games (9-4).

BIG WINS ON THE ROAD

With the win at Illinois, Penn State matched its program-high three conference road wins (at Iowa, at Ohio State and at Illinois) since joining the Big Ten in 1992-93.

BIG STREAK: W4

The Nittany Lions' four-game Big Ten winning streak tied their longest since starting Big Ten play in 1992-93. The skein of four wins has been accomplished three times in Penn State men's basketball history, during this 2017-18 season, in 1995-96 and 2008-09.

TOP HALF

Penn State finished in a tie for sixth in the 2017-18 Big Ten standings, earning the No. 7 seed in the 2018 Big Ten Tournament. The sixth-place finish is only the third time in history the Nittany Lions finished in the top half of the standings and sixth time finishing above .500 at 9-9.

BIG STATEMENT

The Nittany Lions won games in consecutive years in the Big Ten Tournament for the first time since the 2000 and 2001 tournaments. In its last four Big Ten Tournament appearances, Penn State posted five wins, most in any four-year span since the tournament began in 1998.

HEAD COACH PATRICK CHAMBERS



"DETERMINED."

The new sign in the reception area of the Penn State men's basketball office in the Bryce Jordan Center is impossible to overlook. The word defines both the Nittany Lion program and Patrick Chambers, the coach who is determined to lead the program to its next level of success.

Chambers is determined to establish the Penn State program with a culture of teamwork and excellence, built on pillars of accountability, faith, humility, gratitude and passion. He's determined to set and achieve high expectations for Nittany Lion basketball. He's determined to challenge his student-athletes to get better each and every day and develop young men into leaders with the goal of competing for championships.

In 2017-18, Chambers had Penn State basketball program poised to take the next step in its pursuit of consistent, sustainable success.

By the end of December, the Nittany Lions reached double-digits in wins and in January, the Nittany Lions stepped into the spotlight, defeating No. 13 Ohio State at Value City Arena, one of only two teams in the nation to accomplish that feat in 2017-18.

By the end of February 2018, the Nittany Lions racked up nine Big Ten Conference wins, the most, to date, in the Chambers era. A week later, Penn State picked up its 20th and 21st wins, the latter coming at the earliest point ever for the Nittany Lions.

Playing their best basketball in March, Chambers' squad registered seven wins against only one loss and won the National Invitation Tournament title. Penn State defeated teams from the Atlantic Coast, Atlantic 10, Big East, Pac-12 and Southeastern conferences with an average scoring margin of 10.4 points per game in NIT contests.

Dozens of records were broken and the increase in offensive production saw Penn State score 70 points or more in 29 games, while the stalwart defense, a Chambers' hallmark, frustrated opponents. Fourteen teams in 2017-18 failed to score more than 60 points against the Nittany Lions.

Individual records were rewritten as well, as Shep Garner broke the 23-year-old Big Ten single-season record for 3-pointers with 120 and etched his name in the Penn State yearbook for both the single-season and career mark. Tony Carr became the first Penn State men's sophomore to reach the 1,000-point career mark with Lamar Stevens becoming the second to achieve that milestone.

A Philly native, Chambers was introduced as the 12th head coach in program history June 6, 2011, and has poured his passion and energy into building the Nittany Lion program.

Signing the top two recruiting classes in program history in back-to-back years, the 2016 group was ranked in the top 25 and the 2015 class in the top 30. A trio of players with freshmen eligibility started the 2016-17 season opener and would combine for 90 starts, with 23 more from a sophomore, giving the young Nittany Lions a birth by fire, but positioning them for success.

The impressive performances of the rookies earned them several honors during the course of their initial campaigns with Carr selected to the Big Ten All-Freshman team. Carr would become the first Penn State basketball player to earn Big Ten All-Tournament honors as a sophomore in 2018.

With Carr selected as a first-team All-Big Ten Conference pick by both the coaches and media following the 2017-18 season, junior Josh Reaves and redshirt sophomore Mike Watkins produced another program first – two Nittany Lions on the All-Defensive Team.

Chambers has sent Carr, Garner, Frazier, Newbill and numerous other players into the professional ranks. Garner inked a deal with the Grand Rapids Drive in fall of

2018 while Carr is playing for Fiat Torino in Italy's premier league. Frazier (2009-14) recently joined the New Orleans Pelicans organization and Newbill (2013-15) signed a new contract to play for the National Basketball League's Cairns Taipans. Over the summer months, Donovan Jack (2012-16) signed with KD Hopsi Polzela in Slovenia

AT BOSTON UNIVERSITY

Chambers came to Penn State after two years at Boston University, where in 2010-11 he led the Terriers to the America East Conference Championship and the program's first NCAA Tournament berth in more than a decade. He posted a 42-28 record, becoming the only coach in BU history to earn 20 wins in each of his first two seasons and the fastest in program history to win a conference championship.

AT VILLANOVA

A native of Newtown Square, Pa., Chambers previously played for and coached with two of the nation's most successful college coaches. From 2004-09, he was a member of Wright's staff at Villanova, serving as associate head coach in 2008-09. He helped the Wildcats earn four NCAA Sweet 16 appearances and advance to the 2009 NCAA Final Four. Chambers played for Magee at Philadelphia University (formerly Philadelphia Textile), helping Magee become college basketball's all-time victories leader (941) and a 2011 Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame inductee.

During Chambers' five seasons on Wright's Villanova staff, he was instrumental in helping lead the Wildcats to a 126-45 record (.737), including the then-single-season win record of 30-8 in 2008-09. In 2008, Chambers helped lead the Wildcats to the 2009 NCAA Final Four, a first in 24 years, and saw Villanova advance to the Sweet 16 for the fourth time in its five NCAA Tournament appearances.

AT PHILADELPHIA

Chambers joined the NCAA Division II Philadelphia University's basketball team as a walk-on in 1990 and went on to have an outstanding career under Magee. He became the team's starting point guard, earning first-team All-ECAC honors, and helped lead the Rams to four NCAA Division II Sweet 16 appearances and two Elite Eight appearances. He still holds the school record for career assists with 709.

THE CHAMBERS FAMILY

The Chambers family is well represented at Penn State basketball games. Chambers and his wife, Courtney, have four children, Grace, Ryan, Caitlin and Patrick and three of Chambers' 11 siblings are Penn State graduates – brothers, Chris and Joe, and a sister, Megan, who resides in State College.

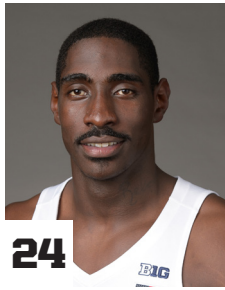
