### BIG TEN. BIG NEWS.

- With just three weekends remaining in the regular season, 11 Big Ten teams will take the field this week. The action opens on Saturday at noon ET and features five divisional matchups.
- Ohio State stands atop the East Division standings with a 6-0 record, with Penn State close behind at 5-1 in conference play. Indiana and Michigan are in third place at 4-2. Minnesota leads the West Division with a 6-0 Big Ten record, followed by Wisconsin at 4-2, Illinois at 4-3 and Iowa at 3-3.
- Two of the nation's five remaining undefeated FBS teams call the Big Ten home, as Minnesota and Ohio State are both 9-0. The Buckeyes have won 15 straight games dating back to last season, the second-longest streak among FBS teams. The Gophers are 9-0 for the first time since 1904 and 6-0 in Big Ten play for the first time since 1961.
- Minnesota has won 12 of its last 13 games, including 11 in a row, the school's longest winning streak since an 18-game run from 1939-42. It is also tied for the third-longest active win streak among FBS programs, trailing only Clemson and Ohio State. The Gophers have outscored their last seven conference opponents 274-113, breaking a school record set in 2003 with seven-straight Big Ten games scoring at least 30 points.
- Ohio State currently leads the nation in both scoring offense and scoring defense, scoring 51.0 points per game and allowing 8.6. The Buckeyes have won all nine of their games by at least 24 points this season to become the first Big Ten team since Ohio State in 1973 to start a season with nine straight 20-point wins.
- Minnesota's Tanner Morgan completed 18-of-20 passes for 339 yards and three touchdowns in the Gophers' victory against Penn State. Morgan is just the second FBS quarterback in the past 20 seasons to have multiple games in a single season completing 90 percent of his passes (min. 20 attempts). He completed 21-of-22 passes for a career-high 396 yards and four TDs at Purdue on Sept. 28. Florida State's Jameis Winston is the only other quarterback to accomplish the feat, doing so during his Heisman Trophy-winning campaign in 2013.
- Down 28-3 in the second quarter and 31-10 in the third quarter, Illinois scored 27 points in the fourth quarter to defeat Michigan State 37-34 on Saturday, giving the Illini four straight conference wins for the first time since 2007. The 25-point comeback marked the largest in school history. The Illini are now bowl eligible for the first time since 2014.
- Ohio State's Justin Fields threw for three touchdowns and ran for another in the first half Saturday as Ohio State rolled to a 73-14 win behind 705 yards of offense and 40 first downs. The Buckeyes scored 73 points, the most they have scored in a Big Ten game since 1950. It marks the first time Ohio State has had multiple games with 70 or more points in a season since 1996.
- Eight Big Ten schools – Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Michigan, Minnesota, Ohio State, Penn State and Wisconsin – have reached bowl eligibility by recording six victories on the season. The Big Ten will continue to feature the largest bowl lineup in conference history, and the full list of Big Ten postseason destinations can be found on page four.

## BIG TEN FOOTBALL AWARDS

The Big Ten will continue to honor its past while recognizing its current standouts at the conclusion of the 2019 campaign. The Big Ten's enhanced football awards program presents 19 individual trophies in addition to the Big Ten Championship trophy, bearing the names of one or two former standouts. The distinguished names on these football awards honor just a small sampling of the countless students and coaches who have contributed to the conference's rich and storied history.

Seventeen of the honors will be awarded immediately following the regular season, including awards for the best quarterback, running back, receiver, tight end, offensive lineman, defensive lineman, linebacker, defensive back, kicker, punter and return specialist. Each of these individual position awards features the names of two former standouts.

The Big Ten will also continue to honor the conference's top coaches, offensive and defensive players and linemen and freshmen with end-of-year trophies. Big Ten coaches have the opportunity to claim two awards. Media voters will select the Dave McClain Coach of the Year, which has been awarded since 1972, while coaches vote for the Hayes-Schembechler Coach of the Year award. The top offensive player will receive the Graham-George Offensive Player of the Year award, the best defensive player will be awarded the Nagurski-Woodson Defensive Player of the Year award and the top freshman will receive the Thompson-Randle El Freshman of the Year award.

The winner of the Big Ten Football Championship Game will receive the Amos Alonzo Stagg Championship Trophy, while the most outstanding player in the game will be awarded the Grange-Griffin Championship Game Most Valuable Player award. The conference also created two postcollegiate awards - the Ford-Kinnick Leadership Award and the Dungy-Thompson Humanitarian Award.

The Big Ten will administer over \$200 million in direct financial support to more than 9,800 students competing in intercollegiate athletics for more than 11,000 participation opportunities on more than 350 teams in 42 different sports.

## BIG TEN FOOTBALL DIVISIONAL TIEBREAKER

The Big Ten football championship will be decided by a game played between the two division champions. A team or teams that are not eligible to participate in a postseason football bowl game as a result of NCAA and/or Big Ten sanctions shall not be eligible to participate in the Big Ten Football Championship Game. The winner of the Big Ten Football Championship Game will represent the conference in one of the bowls that comprise the College Football Playoff - the Cotton, Fiesta, Orange, Peach, Rose or Sugar Bowl. If the Big Ten Champion is ranked No. 1, 2, 3 or 4 in the final College Football Playoff poll, the team will play in a semifinal game. Otherwise, the Big Ten Champion will play in the Rose Bowl Game (when not hosting a semifinal) or the Cotton, Fiesta or Peach Bowl.

The following procedure will determine the representative from each division in the event of a tie:

- (a) If two teams are tied, the winner of the game between the two tied teams shall be the representative.
- (b) If three or more teams are tied, steps 1 through 8 will be followed until a determination is made. If only two teams remain tied after any step (or sub-step), the winner of the game between the two tied teams shall be the representative. If three or more teams remain tied after any step, move to next step in tiebreaker with remaining tied teams.
  1. The records of the three (or more) tied teams will be compared based on winning percentage in games between the tied teams.
    - (a) Example: East 1 is 2-0 in games between the tied teams with wins over East 2 and 3 - East 1 would be the representative.
  2. The records of the three (or more) tied teams will be compared within their division.
  3. The records of the three teams (or more) will be compared against the next highest placed teams in their division in order of finish (4, 5, 6, and 7).
    - (a) When arriving at a group of tied teams while comparing records, use each team's record against the collective tied teams as a group, rather than record against the individual teams.
  4. The records of the three (or more) teams will be compared against all common conference opponents.
  5. The records of the three (or more) teams will be compared based on the best cumulative conference winning percentage of non-divisional opponents.
    - (a) Example: East 1 non-divisional opponents are 20-7, East 2 non-divisional opponents are 19-8, East 3 non-divisional opponents are 14-13 - East 1 would be the representative.
  6. The records of the three (or more) teams will be compared against the highest placed non-divisional teams in their division order of finish (1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7).
    - (a) When arriving at a group of tied teams while comparing records, use each team's record against the collective tied teams as a group, rather than record against the individual teams.
    - (b) When comparing records against a single team or a group of teams, the record will prevail, even if the number of games played against the team or group are unequal (i.e. 1-0 is better than 0-0, 2-0 is better than 1-0, etc.)
  7. The team with the best overall winning percentage [excluding exempted games] shall be the representative.
  8. The representative will be chosen by random draw.

If one or both of the Big Ten division champions is ineligible to play in the Big Ten Championship Game, then the participant(s) in the Big Ten Championship Game shall be determined by the following procedure:

- a) If the ineligible team is tied for the division championship, then the team it tied with shall be the Big Ten Championship Game representative.
- b) If two or more teams are tied with an ineligible team for the division championship, then the ineligible team is removed and the remaining teams revert to the tie-break procedure.
- c) The division runner-up shall be the Big Ten Championship Game representative.
- d) If there is a division runner-up tie, then the tied teams shall revert to the tie-break procedure.

If the championship game cannot be played (due to any reason beyond the control of the Big Ten Conference), the two division champions (using divisional tie-breakers as set forth above) shall be declared co-champions and the following procedure will be used to determine the Big Ten Conference representative to the College Football Playoff:

- a) Teams ranked No. 1, 2, 3 or 4 in the final College Football Playoff poll will automatically be placed in the College Football Playoff.
- b) If the two divisional representatives met previously in the season and neither is ranked No. 1, 2, 3 or 4 in the final College Football Playoff poll, the team ranked highest in the final poll shall be the representative to the College Football Playoff, unless the other team is ranked within five or fewer places of the higher ranked team. In this case, the head-to-head results of the two teams shall determine the conference's representative.
- c) If the two divisional representatives did not meet previously during the season, the team ranked highest in the College Football Playoff poll shall be the representative.
- d) If the two teams are tied in the College Football Playoff poll, the team with the best overall Big Ten record shall be the representative.
- e) If the two teams remain tied after d), the team with the best combined record of the tied teams against all common Big Ten opponents each team played that season shall be the representative.
- f) If the two teams remain tied after e), the representative will be the team with the best overall winning percentage.
- g) If the two teams remain tied after f), the representative will be the team furthest removed from College Football Playoff, Bowl Championships Series or Rose Bowl Game participation (as appropriate).
- h) If the two teams remain tied after g), the representative shall be determined by a random draw.

For all non-CFP partners, bowl will request a Big Ten school, subject to Conference approval based on selection parameters.

### THE ROSE BOWL GAME PRESENTED BY NORTHWESTERN MUTUAL (Pasadena, Calif.)

1. When not hosting a CFP national semifinal, the Big Ten Champion will play in the Rose Bowl Game, unless it is among the top four teams.
2. If Big Ten Champion is selected to play in a national semifinal, then the Rose Bowl will select a Big Ten replacement team for the 2020 Rose Bowl.

### CAPITAL ONE ORANGE BOWL (Miami Gardens, Fla.) or CITRUS BOWL (Orlando, Fla.)

1. When not hosting national semifinal game, the Orange Bowl will select the highest-ranked team from the Big Ten, SEC or Notre Dame to face an ACC team.
2. Citrus Bowl will feature at least five different Big Ten schools over six-year agreement.

### OUTBACK BOWL (Tampa, Fla.)

1. Will feature at least five different Big Ten schools during the six-year agreement.

### SAN DIEGO COUNTY CREDIT UNION HOLIDAY BOWL (San Diego, Calif.)

### FRANKLIN AMERICAN MORTGAGE MUSIC CITY BOWL (Nashville, Tenn.) or TAXSLAYER GATOR BOWL (Jacksonville, Fla.)

1. Either Music City or Gator Bowl will select Big Ten school in 2019.

Accepted Johns Hopkins University as the conference's first sport affiliate members in men's and women's lacrosse in 2013 and 2015, respectively, and added Notre Dame as a sport affiliate member in men's ice hockey in 2017.

### EXTENSIVE TELEVISION EXPOSURE

Through the Big Ten's current media agreements with BTN, ABC/ESPN, CBS and FOX, more than 2,000 Big Ten events are produced and distributed nationally and globally on an annual basis.

BTN is in almost 60 million homes across the United States and Canada, and is also available internationally via the Fox Sports App, delivering live and on-demand programming to computers, smartphones and tablets. BTN Plus streams hundreds of additional events each season.

### COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

For more than 30 years, through the Big Ten's SCORE (Success Comes Out of Reading Everyday) program, the conference has partnered with Chicago elementary schools to improve reading performance.

Surrounding the Big Ten Football Championship Game and Basketball Tournaments, the conference has held numerous community initiatives, partnered with the College Football Playoff Foundation and other events such as the Big Ten Career Expo, SaturDAY of Service and Youth Football Clinics. In addition, the Big Ten has hosted a downtown 5K, collaborated with a local breast cancer awareness group and provided unique event experiences for military veterans.
