OPENING TIPS

- Penn State returns home to open a three-game homestand in a nationally-televised showdown against defending Ivy League Champion Princeton Sunday.
- The Lady Lions are coming off a 72-55 victory at Fordham Wednesday night. Penn State outscored the Rams 34-11 in the second half to pick up the Lady Lions' second victory of the season.
- Three Lady Lions are averaging double-digit points, led by Teniya Page's 16.0 ppg.

IF PENN STATE BEATS PRINCETON

- Head Coach Coquese Washington would capture her 200th career victory, becoming the sixth active Big Ten women's basketball coach to earn 200-plus victories at their current school.
- The Lady Lions would move to 29-7 in the Bryce Jordan Center dating back to the start of the 2016-17 season.

The Big 200

- After victories over Providence (74-72) and Fordham (72-55), head coach Coquese Washington needs just one more win to reach the 200-victory mark for her career. She currently holds a 199-152 career record.
- Over her 11-plus seasons on the Penn State sidelines, Washington has enjoyed three Big Ten regular-season championships and seven national postseason appearances, including four NCAA Tournament berths.
- If Penn State beats Princeton, Washington will become the sixth active Big Ten women’s basketball coach to earn 200-plus victories at their current school. She would join Iowa’s Lisa Bluder (369 wins), Maryland’s Brenda Frese (432 wins), Michigan State’s Suzy Merchant (245 wins), Purdue’s Sharon Versyp (259 wins), and Rutgers’ C. Vivian Stringer (450 wins).

Cardiac Kids

- Penn State has shown great deal of tenacity in its first two wins of the season, rallying from a pair of 12-plus point deficits to come back and win.
- Penn State erased a 14-point fourth quarter deficit by outscoring Providence 23-9 in the final 10 minutes to claim a thrilling 76-74 victory in the season opener on Nov. 8.
- It marked the first time that Penn State rallied from a 15-point deficit to win in six years. The last time the Lady Lions erased a 15-point deficit was on Nov. 24, 2012 in an 85-73 win at Cal State Northridge. Penn State trailed by 17 with 5:52 left in the first half in that game.
- Penn State put together another gutsy comeback performance at Fordham on Nov. 14. The Lady Lions trailed by 12 with 8:19 to play in the second quarter, but outscored the Rams 34-11 in the second half en route to a 72-55 victory.

Frazier Flourishing

- Junior Siyeh Frazier is off to a hot start this season. She’s averaging 14.0 points per game while shooting 48.6 percent (17-for-35) from the field. The Detroit native also leads the team with 10 steals.
- Frazier contributed 7.4 points per game as a sophomore in 2017-18. She was named the Team’s Defensive MVP at the conclusion of her sophomore season.
- Frazier has come in clutch in Penn State’s two wins. She secured a steal in the final seconds that led to PSU’s game-winning points in the 74-72 comeback win over Providence. She then contributed eight points and two steals in a 3:30 second-quarter stretch at Fordham to help the Lady Lions trim down a 12-point deficit.

Tracking Teniya

- Teniya Page, a 2018 Consensus Preseason All-Big Ten Selection, has proven to be one of the strongest guards in the Big Ten from the day she stepped on campus. The guard has collected All-Big Ten accolades in each of her first three years, earning first team honors as both a sophomore and junior. Page was named a WBCA All-America honorable mention selection in 2016-17 following her standout sophomore campaign.
- Page has totaled 1,637 career points, putting her just 363 points away from hitting the 2,000-point mark. She would become the sixth Lady Lion to reach the milestone if she hits the 2,000-point mark. With 29 regular-season games scheduled and at least one postseason contest guaranteed (Big Ten Tournament), Page will need to average 13.7 points per game this season to reach the milestone. She averaged 15.3 points per game as a freshman, 19.9 as a sophomore and 18.4 as a junior.
- Her 1,637 career points put her at No. 11 on PSU’s all-time career scoring list. She’s 26 points away from entering the top ten.
- The standout has already etched her names into several of Penn State’s record books. Her 17.8 points per game career scoring average ranks No. 4 all-time. She is one of five Penn Staters with 1,500 career points and 300 career assists. Page owns seven career 30-point games to sit tied for No. 2 all-time at Penn State with Maggie Lucas (7; 2011-14). She’s averaged 35.4 minutes per game throughout her career, a mark that ranks second in the Lady Lion history books.

SCOUTING THE OPPOSITION

2018-19 PRINCETON TIGERS

- Princeton, the defending Ivy League Champions, has made nine-straight national postseason tournament appearances, seven of which were NCAA Tournament bids.
- The Tigers are 1-2 on the young season, with their most recent game being a 70-66 loss to a 4-0 Seton Hall team Wednesday night.
- Princeton opened the season with a big 89-65 win at Rider on Nov. 16 before falling at George Washington, 64-49, on Nov. 11.
- Three Tigers are averaging double-digit points, led by Gabrielle Rush's 16.0 points per game. Carlie Littlefield follows with 15.3 ppg, while Taylor Baur has chipped in 10.0 ppg and a team-best 9.0 rebounds per contest.
- The Tigers have played without 2018 Ivy League Player of the Year Bella Alarie so far this year. Princeton released a statement on Nov. 1 stating that Alarie will miss time during the non-conference season due to a broken bone in her arm.

AGAINST THE IVY LEAGUE

- Penn State and Princeton will be meeting for the first time Sunday.
- The Lady Lions are 1-0 all-time against current Ivy League members. Penn State beat Yale 97-47 on Feb. 22, 1985 in the only other meeting with an Ivy League squad.

First-ever meeting between Penn State and Princeton

No Sophomore Slump Here

- The three-member sophomore class of Sam Breen, Kamaria McDaniel and Alisia Smith have come into their own in the first three games of the season.
- The three sophomores have combined for 35.3 percent (72-of-204) of PSU's points and 38.1 percent (45-of-118) of Penn State's rebounds in the first three games combined.
- All three have up-ed their production from last season, with Alisia Smith making the biggest jump. As a freshman she averaged 5.2 points and 3.8 rebounds per game. So far this season, the forward has contributed 13.0 points and 8.7 boards per contest.

Rookies Ready To Roar

- Accumulation of talented people is paramount to any organization, and that is a motto that head coach Coquese Washington builds her teams around. The additions of Lauren Ebo (Washington, D.C.), Karisma Ortiz (San Jose, Calif.) and Bexley Wallace (Pickerington, Ohio) to the 2018-19 roster fit that model and each of them should have an impact for the Lady Lions on and off the court.
- Ortiz hails from Archbishop Mitty High School, which ranked as the No. 1 team in the nation by USA Today at the end of her senior year. The six-foot guard was ranked as the No. 54 prospect nationally by ESPN.com.
- Ebo and Wallace will add strong size to the post group, coming in at six-foot-four and six-foot-three, respectively. Ebo led her Riverdale Baptist team to an Independent School National Championship and Title IX Pat Summitt Division title as a senior.
- Wallace, who comes to Happy Valley from a suburb of Columbus, Ohio, guided Pickerington Central to a Division I State Championship as a senior and was also a part of the USA Basketball 16U squad that captured the bronze medal at the 2015 FIBA Championship. Wallace was ranked as the No. 91 prospect nationally and No. 16 forward in her class by Prospect Nation.

iHola España!

- Penn State enjoyed a once in a lifetime experience this summer when the Lady Lions embarked on a 10-day tour of Spain. It marked the first foreign tour for the Lady Lions since a 2012 trip to Italy and France.
- Penn State spent time in the famous cities of Madrid, Valencia and Barcelona, while also playing three exhibition games against foreign competition. The Lady Lions went 2-1 on the trip with wins over CD CREF Madrid (108-81) and the Valencia All-Stars (87-80) and a narrow 76-70 loss to reigning Slovenian/Adriatic League Champion ZKK Cinkarna Celje.
- In addition to the valuable team bonding experience overseas, the Lady Lions were also granted 10 practices leading up to the trip per NCAA rules. The extra game and practice experience should prove crucial as Penn State gears up for the 2018-19 campaign.

Among The NCAA's Elite

- The Lady Lions have collected 938 wins since the program's inception in 1965, an all-time win mark that ranks as the 18th-most in NCAA history. Penn State is one of only 16 schools with at least 25 NCAA Tournament appearances, joining Connecticut, Georgia, Iowa, Louisiana Tech, LSU, Maryland, North Carolina, Notre Dame, Ohio State, Old Dominion, Purdue, Stanford, Tennessee, Texas and Vanderbilt.

Grand Marshal

- One of the Lady Lions' most famous alumna returned to campus this fall as Lisa Salters served as the 2018 Penn State Homecoming Grand Marshal. Salters is a sideline reporter for two of ESPN's biggest sports properties – the NFL's Monday Night Football and NBA games on ESPN and ABC – and a featured correspondent for the company's award-winning E:60 newsmagazine.
- Salters was a guard for the Lady Lions from 1986-87 and earned her bachelor's degree in broadcast journalism from Penn State in 1988.
- A Penn State alum is selected as the Homecoming Grand Marshal each year. Selected Grand Marshals are those alum that embodied the values and mission of Penn State during his or her time at PSU and continue that dedication beyond graduation, making notable achievements in his or her field and demonstrating what it truly means to be a Penn Stater.

- Three former Lady Lions suited up in the 2018 WNBA playoffs as Penn State's power was felt on the sport's biggest stage.
- Alex Bentley ('13) averaged 15.6 points per game in the WNBA Semifinals as her second-seeded Atlanta Dream team dropped a tight 3-2 series to the Washington Mystics.
- WNBA veteran Tanisha Wright ('05) suited up for the Minnesota Lynx in their first-round action at the Los Angeles Sparks. Maggie Lucas ('14) joined the Dallas Wings for the team's first-round playoff game at Phoenix.
- Under head coach Coquese Washington, Penn State has seen four pupils drafted - Bentley, Tyra Grant, Nikki Greene and Lucas - and three more sign free agent contracts - Ariel Edwards, Kam Gissendanner and Zhaque Gray.
- Overall, Penn State has seen 15 Lady Lions selected in the WNBA Draft, including seven picked in the first 20 selections of the event.

COQUESE WASHINGTON

Head Coach - 12th Season

Overall Record: 199-152

7 National Postseason Tournament Appearances in 11 Years

Upon arriving on the University Park campus as the fifth head coach in Penn State women's history - and first female African-American head coach in Penn State history - Coquese Washington quickly returned the program to national prominence with her up-tempo, aggressive style of play. Entering her 12th season on the sideline in Happy Valley, her passion for creating a winning culture, predicated on innovative coaching techniques, tireless recruiting, cultivating meaningful relationships with student-athletes and an unmatched enthusiasm for teaching the game she loves, Washington is in the conversation as one of the nation's top head coaches.

Washington has seen success at every level of basketball and in every role she has filled on the sidelines. She became the first player at Flint Central High School to earn a starting position all four seasons and helped her squad to the program's first Saginaw Valley League and district championships, while earning all-state honors on two occasions.

She went on to earn four varsity letters at the University of Notre Dame, leading the team in steals four times and assists on three occasions, before moving on to professional basketball where she was a member of the 2000 WNBA Champion Houston Comets squad.

On the sidelines, she has appeared in the postseason 15 times, with 12 of those being NCAA Tournament appearances. She helped the Lady Lions to four-straight berths in the NCAA Tournament - including a pair of Sweet Sixteen appearances - and was an assistant coach on Notre Dame's 2001 NCAA National Championship team. Her three-straight Big Ten Championships make her one of just four coaches in Big Ten history with three-or-more consecutive Big Ten regular-season championships (Jim Foster, Ohio State; C. Vivian Stringer, Iowa & Tara VanDerveer, Ohio State), taking home outright crowns in 2012 and 2013, while sharing the 2014 title.

Growing the Game

Washington is currently serving on the WBCA Board of Directors and held the role of President from 2015-17 with the organization that is tasked with solving issues, preserving the history and growing the game of women's basketball. She was also the Vice President/President-Elect from 2013-15.

Her service to the game also includes time with USA Basketball, the Kay Yow Cancer Fund and the NCAA Women's Basketball Issues Committee. She won a gold medal with Team USA in Kazan, Russia at the 2013 World University Games and served on the USA Basketball Women's Junior National Committee from 2009-12. Her work with the Kay Yow Cancer Fund Board of Directors ran from 2012-15 and she served five years on the NCAA Women's Basketball Issues Committee.

Of her many accomplishments, Washington was the founding President of the WNBA Players Association in 1999 and was a primary force in negotiating the association's first two collective bargaining agreements.

Dancing Shoes

In 19 years as a collegiate coach, Washington has laced up her dancing shoes and headed to the postseason on 15 occasions, including 12 trips to the NCAA Tournament. While coaching the Blue and White, Washington has guided the program to four NCAA Tournament berths and three appearances in the WNIT.

From 2011-14, the Lady Lions advanced to the NCAA Tournament each season, reaching at least the second round on all four occasions. The 2012 and 2014 squads moved on to the Sweet Sixteen with a pair of postseason wins, before falling to top-five ranked opponents.

The 2017-18 and 2016-17 squads made a pair of WNIT appearances, with the 16-17 squad advancing to the third round.



Trophies & All-Americans

Washington's competitive side shines brightest on the biggest stages and that is a trait that her teams have taken on during her tenure on the University Park campus, as well. Washington's teams have advanced out of the first round of the NCAA Tournament in all four trips, while earning berths to the Sweet Sixteen twice.

From 2012-14, the Lady Lions claimed three-straight Big Ten regular-season titles, making them one of just four teams in conference history to win three-or-more regular season crowns in a row. Washington's squads took the title outright in 2012 and 2013, while sharing the crown in 2014.

Washington is a three-time Big Ten Coach of the Year (2012, 2013 & 2014), a two-time WBCA Region Six Coach of the Year (2012 & 2013) and a two-time finalist for WBCA National Coach of the Year (2012 & 2013). She was also selected as the 2011 and 2014 Black Coaches Association (BCA) Female Coach of the Year.

BIG Things Happening

In 11 seasons on the sideline, Washington has seen 17 players earn All-Big Ten laurels on 30 occasions, along with three each earning Big Ten All-Freshman Team and Big Ten All-Defensive Team honors. Among the All-Big Ten honorees, five of Washington's pupils account for 11 first team selections and Penn State has seen multiple players earn all-conference in 10 of her 11 seasons on the sideline.

Play to Your Strengths

Washington’s style of play lends itself to being up-tempo and high scoring, which has enabled the program to rise to new heights and return to the national spotlight. As a member of the Big Ten Conference, her teams are playing one of the toughest conference slates in the country, but that doesn’t stop Washington from scheduling key non-conference games against the nation’s best teams – home and on the road.

In each of Washington’s first six years, Penn State improved its Big Ten win total and the Lady Lions posted three consecutive 25-win seasons, joining the 1993-94, 1994-95 and 1995-96 squads as the only teams in program history to accomplish the feat.

During Washington’s first 11 seasons, Penn State has toppled ranked opponents in nine of those seasons; winning multiple games against ranked foes during eight of those campaigns.

Double Domer

Washington was a four-year starting point guard for Notre Dame under Muffet McGraw and was the team captain on Notre Dame’s first-ever NCAA Tournament team. She was a two-time All-Midwestern Collegiate Conference (MCC) selection and led the Irish to three MCC Tournament titles. Washington led the team in steals in each of her four seasons and was top on the squad in assists three times.

Washington is first on UND’s all-time steals per game list (2.7), third in career steals (307) and sixth in assists (554).

The epitome of a student-athlete, Washington graduated from Notre Dame in 1992, a full year ahead of schedule, with a bachelor’s degree in history. She went on to attain “Double Domer” status in 1997 after earning her Juris Doctorate from the Notre Dame Law School.

The Consummate Professional

Washington juggled finishing her law degree with the start of her professional basketball career, returning to the hardwood as a professional in 1997-98 with the ABL’s Portland Power before spending a two-year stint with the WNBA’s New York Liberty (1998-99) and playing in the WNBA Finals in 1999.

Moving to Houston in 2000, Washington played an instrumental role in leading the Comets to the WNBA title. Her solid season in 2001 with the Comets for Hall of Fame coach Van Chancellor, saw her finish ninth in the WNBA in assists and fourth in steals as Houston earned its fifth consecutive playoff berth. Washington started the 2002 campaign in Houston before being traded to the Indiana Fever at the midway point of the season. Washington guided the Fever to their first-ever playoff berth, helping her become the first player in WNBA history to lead three different teams to the postseason. She retired from the WNBA in 2003 as a member of the Fever.

Utilizing her law degree, Washington was a central figure in helping create the WNBA Players Association (WNBPA), serving as the founding president of the WNBPA from 1999 until 2001. She also served as the Executive Vice President of the WNBPA from 2001 until her retirement in 2003.

Serving the Community

Be it on the hardwood, on the golf course, or out on a speaking engagement, Washington is among the most active Penn State coaches in the community. Her annual efforts include Coquese’s Drive for the Centre County Women’s Resource Center, championing the fight against breast cancer for the Penn State Play4Kay game and supporting her team during their many hours of giving back to the Centre region.

The Personal Side

Washington and her husband, Raynell Brown, have a son, Quenton (13), and a daughter, Rhaiyna (9). Raynell is an Adjunct Professor of Law at Penn State Law School and is a former partner at Hicks & Brown Sports Agency, where he represented athletes in the NFL, FIBA, NBA and WNBA. They reside in Port Matilda.
