WVU-Penn State Meet in Charity Exhibition Game

- Proceeds from today's game will benefit the American Red Cross' hurricane relief efforts. The NCAA approved that an institution may use one of its possible two exhibition games against a Division I institution for the purposes of raising funds for a catastrophic event.
- WVU is one of nine schools to win 25 or more games four straight years. WVU is 105-39 since the 2014-15 season.
- The last time West Virginia won 25 or more games in four consecutive years was from 1957-60.
- For the third year in a row, WVU finished second in the Big 12 regular season and postseason tournament in 2017-18.
- WVU and Kansas are the only two Big 12 teams to win 11 or more conference games in each of the last four seasons.
- West Virginia is ranked No. 13 in the preseason Associated Press poll and No. 13 in the USA Today Coaches poll.
- WVU's No. 2 AP ranking on Jan. 8, 2018, was its highest since a No. 2 ranking on Dec. 29, 1959.
- The Mountaineers have been ranked 99 weeks in the AP poll under Bob Huggins, including 37 weeks in the AP Top 10. Huggins has had WVU ranked more weeks than any other coach in school history.
- Dating back to 2015, WVU has been ranked for 55 consecutive weeks in the AP poll and 72 of the last 75 weeks in the AP rankings. WVU has been ranked for 76 consecutive weeks in the USA Today Coaches poll.
- This is WVU's second longest streak of ranked weeks in the AP poll, behind 56 weeks from March 1956 to March 1960.
- West Virginia has been ranked 119 weeks since Jan. 3, 2005 in the AP poll and 233 weeks total in school history.
- WVU's streak of 55 weeks in the AP rankings is the fourth longest active streak in the country.
- Beginning his 37th season as a head coach, Bob Huggins has 29 20-win seasons and 18 25-win seasons.
- Last year was WVU's ninth NCAA appearance in the last 11 years and 11th appearance in the last 14 seasons.
- WVU has reached the Sweet 16 in eight of its last 12 NCAA appearances (2018, 2017, 2015, 2010, 2008, 2006, 2005, 1998).
- WVU has made 14 postseason appearances in the last 15 years, including the NCAA Final Four in 2010.
- With a win at Oklahoma State on Dec. 29, 2017, Bob Huggins moved past Jim Phelan for seventh place all-time on the NCAA Division I winningest coaches list. Huggins' record now stands at 845-341 in his 37th season as a head coach.
- Huggins is the third-winningest active Division I coach behind Mike Krzyzewski and Jim Boeheim.
- Sagaba Konate posted 116 blocks last season, second most in a season in school history. He had 53 his entire freshman season. He needs 22 blocks to break the WVU school record set by D'or Fischer.
- Konate had at least five blocks in nine games last season, one of three players nationally to complete that feat.
- Konate was named to the Preseason All-Big 12 Team prior to the season.
- The Mountaineers have won 78 of their last 80 games when holding opponents to 69 points or less.
- WVU is 199-31 under Huggins when holding opponents to 69 points or less.
- West Virginia has allowed its opponent to shoot 50 percent or better only 65 times under Bob Huggins (385 games).
- West Virginia is 68-5 under Bob Huggins when shooting 50 percent or better from the field.
- West Virginia is 201-38 under Bob Huggins when leading at halftime.
- West Virginia is 207-24 under Bob Huggins when leading by 10 or more points in a game.
- West Virginia is 176-12 under Bob Huggins when posting a higher shooting percentage than its opponent.
- This is the 110th season and 116th year overall for West Virginia basketball, which began in 1903.
- The Mountaineers own a 1,756-1,079 all-time record in intercollegiate basketball competition, ranking the Mountaineers 22nd in wins among all Division I schools.
- WVU has earned 29 NCAA berths and 16 NIT trips since 1941, and has finished in the Top 25 21 times, including an amazing nine straight years from 1955-63.
- West Virginia has made at least one 3-point field goal in 633 consecutive games.
- WVU has won 88 of its last 91 and 144 of its last 157 games when holding opponents to less than 69 points.
- The Mountaineers are 191-41 under Bob Huggins when scoring 70 or more points in a game.
- West Virginia is 187-46 under Bob Huggins when outrebounding its opponent.
- Bob Huggins has wins over 44 ranked teams at WVU, including 16 wins over Top 10 teams and three over No. 1.
- West Virginia is 180-41 in its last 221 games against unranked teams, including 93 of its last 106 at the WVU Coliseum.
- West Virginia is 133-35 at the WVU Coliseum under Bob Huggins, including a 69-30 mark in league games.
- WVU is 542-155 (.782) all-time at the WVU Coliseum and 174-41 at the WVU Coliseum in the last 14 seasons.
- Under Bob Huggins at the WVU Coliseum, WVU is averaging 82.5 ppg while holding its opponents to 62.9 ppg.
- West Virginia is 98-7 at home against non-conference teams in the last 16 years, including 79 of its last 84.
- West Virginia is 113-28 in non-conference regular season games under Bob Huggins, including a 64-5 mark at home.

Bob Huggins

- Huggins is WVU's 21st head basketball coach.
- Huggins is a Morgantown native and a 1977 graduate of West Virginia University.
- Huggins has won 845 games entering his 37th season as a head coach.
- Huggins ranks third in total victories among active Division I head coaches.
- Huggins ranks seventh among the NCAA's all-time winningest coaches.
- Huggins' teams have participated in postseason play in 32 of 36 seasons, including 24 NCAA Tournaments.
- His squads have won 20 or more games in all but seven of his 36 campaigns, including 30 or more twice.
- Huggins averages 23.7 victories a season.
- Huggins has made two NCAA Final Fours and four NCAA Elite Eight appearances.
- Huggins has been named national coach of the year six times.
- Huggins' teams have finished in the Top 10 final rankings nine times.
- Huggins has coached 13 All-Americans and 68 all-conference selections.
- Huggins has coached 19 NBA draft picks, including six first round selections and four lottery picks.
- Huggins has won 13 conference regular season titles.
- Huggins has won 10 conference tournament titles.
- Huggins has led West Virginia to nine NCAA Tournament appearances.

Scouting Penn State

- Penn State returns three starters and 10 lettermen from the team that posted 26 wins last season, second-most in program history, and Penn State won the NIT in 2018.
- Senior guard Josh Reaves, a four-year starter, has led the Big Ten Conference in steals twice.
- Junior forward Lamar Stevens, who was the 2018 NIT Most Outstanding Player, has started every game in which he has played.
- Patrick Chambers is 113-122 entering his eighth season at Penn State. Overall in 10 years as a head coach, he has a 155-150 record.

Series Record

- Even though this game won't count in the all-time records, WVU and Penn State have met 119 times on the court.
- West Virginia leads the all-time series by a 66-53 margin in series play that began in 1906.
- The two teams, former members of the Atlantic 10, last met on Jan. 31, 1991, a 66-63 Penn State win in Morgantown.
- The Mountaineers are 41-17 against Penn State in Morgantown.
- Bob Huggins has never faced Penn State as a head coach.
- Huggins was 4-2 as a player at West Virginia against Penn State.

WVU Basketball Tradition

- This is the 110th season and 116th year overall for West Virginia basketball, which began in 1903.
- The Mountaineers own a 1,756-1,079 all-time record in intercollegiate basketball competition, ranking the Mountaineers 22nd in wins among all Division I schools.
- WVU has earned 29 NCAA berths and 16 NIT trips since 1941, and has finished in the Top 25 21 times, including an amazing nine straight years from 1955-63.
- In the past 14 years, WVU has reached the Sweet 16 in 2018, 2017 & 2015, NIT First Round in 2014, NCAA Second Round in 2012, NCAA Third Round in 2011, the NCAA Final Four in 2010, made the NCAA Tournament in 2009, reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2008, won the NIT in 2007, reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2006 and the NCAA Elite Eight in 2005.
- In 1958, the Mountaineers finished the regular season ranked No. 1 in both polls and in 1959, West Virginia, led by All-America guard Jerry West, lost in the NCAA finals to California.
- West Virginia has had 12 first team All-Americans, headlined by West, who went on to become one of basketball's all-time greats with the NBA's Los Angeles Lakers.
- Under Bob Huggins, Jevon Carter was named to the John Wooden, Lute Olson and Senior CLASS All-America teams in 2018. Juwan Staten was named to the Lute Olson All-America team in 2015, Da'Sean Butler earned All-America first team honors in 2010 by John Wooden and *Basketball Times* and Kevin Jones earned All-America first team honors in 2012 by John Wooden.
- Besides West, some of basketball's biggest names have been affiliated with the Old Gold & Blue, including former Lakers coach and general manager Fred Schaus, former NBA President of Basketball Operations and NBA Hall of Famer Rod Thorn and former Utah Jazz broadcaster and NBA Hall of Famer "Hot Rod" Hundley.

Winning Non-Conference Mark

- West Virginia has finished with a winning non-conference mark for 26 consecutive seasons.
- West Virginia is 144-34 against non-conference teams in regular season games in the last 14 seasons.
- The last time WVU did not post a winning non-league record was 1990-91, when WVU went 4-4 outside of conference.
- WVU is 113-28 in non-conference games under Bob Huggins.
- WVU has finished with one loss during non-conference play in eight different seasons. They were: 1981-82 when West Virginia went 11-1 out of the Atlantic 10, 1957-58 when WVU lost only to Duke in going 11-1, 1996-97 when the Mountaineers were 7-1, losing the season opener at Minnesota, 2004-05 when WVU went 10-1 outside the Big East, 2006-07 when the Mountaineers went 12-1 with their only loss to Arkansas, 2009-10 when WVU was 11-1 with its only loss at Purdue, 2014-15 when the Mountaineers had a one point home loss to LSU, finishing 12-1 and in 2016-17 when WVU finished 12-1 with a four-point loss to Temple in Brooklyn, New York.
- WVU has had one perfect non-conference regular season, 10-0, in 1997-98.

In The Rankings

- West Virginia is ranked No. 13 in the Associated Press preseason poll and No. 13 in the USA Today Coaches poll.
- Last season, West Virginia finished ranked No. 15 in the Associated Press poll and No. 13 in the USA Today Coaches poll.
- WVU's No. 2 AP ranking on Jan. 8, 2018, was its highest since a No. 2 ranking on Dec. 29, 1959.
- The Mountaineers have been ranked 99 weeks in the AP poll under Bob Huggins, including 37 weeks in the AP Top 10. Huggins has had WVU ranked more weeks than any other coach in school history.
- Dating back to 2015, WVU has been ranked for 55 consecutive weeks in the AP poll and 72 of the last 75 weeks in the AP rankings. WVU has been ranked for 76 consecutive weeks in the USA Today Coaches poll.
- This is WVU's second longest streak of ranked weeks in the AP poll, behind 56 weeks from March 1956 to March 1960.
- West Virginia has been ranked 119 weeks since Jan. 3, 2005 in the AP poll, and 233 weeks total in school history.
- WVU was No. 6 in the final AP poll in 2010, its highest final ranking since a No. 5 ranking in 1959-60.
- In 2010, WVU was ranked in the Top 10 for nine straight weeks - the most consecutive weeks in the Top 10 since 1960.

Academic Success

- Forty-one of the last 42 seniors on the WVU men's basketball team have graduated on time or early since 2004.
- Last season, Jevon Carter was named CoSIDA Academic All-American of the year for men's basketball and first team Academic All-American.
- Carter was named to the CoSIDA Academic All-District II First Team in 2017-18 and 2016-17.
- In 2018, Chase Harler was named to the Academic All-Big 12 Men's Basketball First Team, while James Bolden and Logan Routt were named to the second team.
- Last year, WVU had 13 players on the Garrett Ford Academic Honor Roll with a 3.0 GPA or better.
- In 2010, 2011, 2016, 2017 and 2018, WVU men's basketball was also recognized nationally for ranking in the top 10 percent nationally among men's basketball programs for the Academic Progress Rate (APR).
- In 2016, 2017 and 2018, WVU men's basketball was recognized by the NCAA for a perfect four-year APR score of 1,000.

Huggins Receives Contract Extension

- On Nov. 6, 2017, Director of Athletics Shane Lyons announced a four-year contract extension to 2021-22 for Bob Huggins.
- It will extend his relationship with the University until 2027.
- Under the agreement, following the 2021-22 season, Huggins will assume a five-year Emeritus status within the WVU Department of Intercollegiate Athletics, which concludes June 30, 2027.
- Huggins will be paid \$3,850,000 in 2018-19, \$3,950,000 in 2019-20, \$4,050,000 in 2020-21 and \$4,150,000 in 2021-22.

- The Sweet 16 game vs. Villanova marked the 311th time in school history WVU played a team ranked in the AP Top 25.

- Since 1995, the Mountaineers have played 198 nationally ranked teams. WVU has played 311 total games against nationally ranked competition. That means more than 64 percent of the games against the best teams in the country have come during the last 24 seasons.
- WVU has played 149 ranked teams since the start of the 2004-05 season, winning 58 of those games.
- Bob Huggins has faced 96 ranked teams during the regular season in 11 years, the most in school history. Gale Catlett faced 66 ranked teams during the regular season in 25 years, while John Beilein faced 34 ranked teams during regular season play in five years.

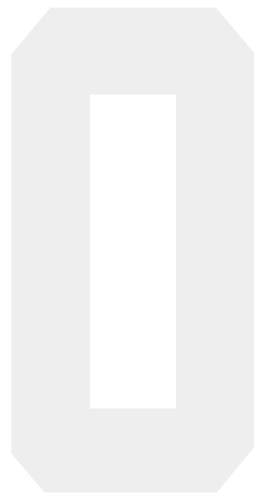

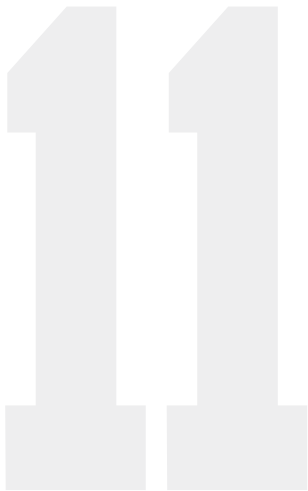
