## STORYLINES

- The Bulls are 1-8 all time against teams from the Big Ten Conference. UB won at Rutgers last season for its first Big Ten win. Buffalo did defeat Penn State in 1900 and Rutgers in 2002, but it was before the teams joined the conference.
- The Bulls are 1-12 all time against ranked opponents. Their lone win came against #14 Ball State in the 2008 MAC Championship Game.
- Penn State leads the all-time series, 2-1.
- This will be the first time the Bulls will appear nationally on an over-the-air network. UB did play Holy Cross on ABC in 1970, however the game was only broadcast on the east coast.
- Matt Myers was the first freshman/redshirt-freshman quarterback to start a season opener for the Bulls since redshirt-freshman Cliff Scott started under center in the 1991 opener.
- This will be Buffalo's third trip to Beaver Stadium in its history - the largest stadium the Bulls have ever played in. UB also played at Penn State in 2007 and 2015.
- The Bulls only attempted 10 passes last week against Robert Morris, it's fewest pass attempts since attempted seven passes in a 48-20 win over UCF on Oct. 2, 2004.
- Returning MAC Freshman of the Year Jaret Patterson is on the watchlist for both the Maxwell Award and the Doak Walker Award.
- This will be the only regular season game the Bulls will play on natural grass.

In 2016 and 2017, players were chosen by the coaching staff to wear "41" for the entire year. Cornerback Boise Ross wore it for the 2016 season, while linebacker Jarrett Franklin wore it in 2017.

This is the second season the coaching staff with rotate #41 on a weekly basis.

Solomon Jackson passed away unexpectedly following an offseason workout on February 29, 2016. Jackson, respected and beloved by his teammates, played both linebacker and defensive end over his career. The slogan ALL41 is a prominent fixture throughout the Murchie Family Football Center to honor his legacy.

### Bulls Travel to Penn State to Face 15th-ranked Nittany Lions

The University at Buffalo football team will travel to Penn State for a prime-time matchup with the 15th-ranked Nittany Lions on Saturday night.

The Bulls are 1-0 on the season following a 38-10 win over Robert Morris last Thursday night. The Bulls were led by quarterback **Matt Myers** who threw for two touchdowns and ran for another.

Penn State is 1-0 after routing Idaho, 79-7, last Saturday. The Nittany Lions are led by quarterback Sean Clifford who threw for 280 yards and two touchdowns against the Vandals.

Penn State leads the all-time series, 2-1. The Nittany Lions won the last meeting, 27-14, on Sept. 12, 2015 at Beaver Stadium.

### Ground and Pound

Buffalo used a steady dose of the run game to earn a 38-10 win over Robert Morris in the season opener. Of the Bulls' 57 plays, 47 were run plays. UB rushed for 285 yards against the Colonials, averaging 6.1 yards per carry. The Bulls only attempted 10 passes in the game. It was their fewest pass attempts in a game since the 2004 season when they attempted seven passes in a 48-20 win over UCF. Former quarterback Chris Moore went 5-for-7 for 195 yards against the Knights that day.

### Not Standing Patt

UB running back **Jaret Patterson** is coming off the finest freshman season in school history and looks to build on it in his second year with the program. Patterson rushed for 1,013 yards and 14 touchdowns in 2018, becoming the first freshman running back in school history to rush for 1,000 yards in a season. He broke the previous record of 917 set by Aaron Leeper in 2002. In addition, Patterson's 14 rushing touchdowns were the most ever by a UB freshman and was two shy of the single season record held by James Starks (2008).

Patterson, the 2018 MAC Freshman of the Year, is on the preseason watchlist for the Maxwell Award and the Doak Walker Award.

In the opener against Robert Morris, Patterson rushed for 90 yards and a touchdown on only 12 carries. He has now scored a rushing touchdown in 10 of his last 11 games dating back to last season.

### Experience on the Offensive Line

One of the strengths of the 2019 UB football team is the offensive line. The Bulls return four of their five starters from a season ago. Right guard **Tomas Jack-Kurdyla** has the most starts under his belt with 29. Left tackle **Evin Ksiezarczyk** is second with 26 starts. Right tackle **Kayode Awosika** started all 14 games for the Bulls last season and left guard **Paul Nosworthy** had 13 starts last season. In addition, **Jacob Gall** started the final five games at right guard last year.

Last season, UB's line blocked for an offense that ran for a school-record 2,648 yards and also allowed only 15 sacks, a program low since moving to the FBS level in 1999.

### Welcome Matt

Redshirt-freshman **Matt Myers** earned the starting quarterback job out of camp. The local product is the first freshman or redshirt freshman quarterback to start the season opener in the Bulls FBS era (since 1999). Cliff Scott was the last freshman to start under center for the Bulls when he started the 1991 opener as a redshirt-freshman.

In his debut against Robert Morris, Myers had a productive game, throwing for 69 yards and two touchdowns and rushing for 47 yards and another score.

As a senior at West Seneca West High School, he led the Indians to an undefeated season and its first ever state championship in 2017 and was named the game MVP. He was named the 2017 Buffalo News Western New York Player of the Year and was a two-time All-WNY First Team choice. He threw for 2,397 yards and rushed for 1,037 yards his senior year to become just the third quarterback in WNY history to pass for 2,000 yards and rush for 1,000 yards in the same season. He had 24 passing touchdowns, only two interceptions and 22 rushing touchdowns in senior season.

### Lefebvre Carries the Tight End Torch

Tight ends have excelled in coach Leipold's offense since he came to Buffalo in 2015. The Bulls have had tight ends named All-MAC in three of the last four years, including Matt Weiser (2015/1st team), Mason Schreck (2016/2nd team) and Tyler Mabry (2018/1st team). **Zac Lefebvre** is hoping to add his name to that list as the Bulls' starting tight end in 2019. The junior from Victor, NY is off to a good start as he had two catches

for 43 yards and two touchdowns in the opener against Robert Morris. He was the first UB tight end with two touchdown receptions in a game since Jesse Rack caught two against Gardner Webb on Oct. 10, 2009.

The Bulls have three players on five different NCFAA award preseason watch lists. Running back Jaret Patterson, linebacker Matt Otwinowski and Evan Finegan all appear on watch lists.

Nine Bulls Named to Athlon Preseason All-MAC Team

Athlon Sports released its preseason All-Mid-American Conference football team and nine University at Buffalo players were named to the squad. The list was headlined by three first-team selections, running back Jaret Patterson, offensive tackle Evin Ksiezarczyk and offensive guard Paul Nosworthy.

Defensive end Taylor Riggins and linebacker James Patterson were named to the second team.

The third team included running back Kevin Marks, offensive tackle Kayo-

de Awosika, defensive end Malcolm Koonce and cornerback Aapri Washington.

International Flavor

The Bulls have nine international players on this year's roster - by far the most in school history.

Buffalo has six players who hail from Canada, including Dominic Johnson (Ontario), Dev Lamour (Quebec), Cole Burniston (Ontario), Tomas Jack-Kurdyla (Quebec), Gabe Wallace (BC) and Julien Bourassa (Quebec). In addition, the Bulls have three players from Europe, Fabian Weitz (Germany), Alain Schaerer (Switzerland) and Jordan Avissey (France).

The Stable is Able

There is a term running backs coach Andy Kotelnicki uses to describe his group of running backs and that is "the stable". The Bulls have a deep backfield led by MAC Freshman of the Year Jaret Patterson. The sophomore rushed for 1,013 yards and 14 touchdowns in 2018. He split time with Kevin Marks who also posted impressive numbers in his first season. Marks rushed for 845 yards and 13 touchdowns in 2018, on three less carries than Patterson.

However the Bulls are even deeper than the sophomore duo of Patterson and Marks. Junior Theo Anderson has been a productive back over his first two seasons. The Florida native has

rushed for 488 yards and three touchdowns, averaging 4.3 yards per carry over his career. He rushed for a career-high 133 yards and a touchdown in a game against Bowling Green in 2017.

Redshirt-freshman **Dylan McDuffie** and freshman **Ron Cook** have both had strong camps and should also get carries as well.

**Otwinowski Named Campbell Trophy Nominee**

Senior linebacker **Matt Otwinowski** is a nominee for the William V. Campbell Trophy. Given annually to college football's top student-athlete, the Campbell Trophy is also known as the Academic Heisman.

Otwinowski is an accounting major with a 3.89 cumulative grade point average. He is a two-time Academic All-MAC selection and has been honored as a MAC Distinguished Scholar Athlete.

A pillar of the community, Otwinowski helped save the life of a stranger by donating his stem cells through the Be The Match Program. For his work in the community, he has been placed on the watch list for the AFCA Allstate Good Works Team and the Weurffel Trophy.

**Pallotti Boys**

The Bulls have five players from Maryland's Saint Vincent Pallotti High School on this year's team. Running back **Jaret Patterson**, linebackers **James Patterson** and **Justin Mulbah**, wide receiver **Jelani Foster** and cornerback **Dylan Powell** all played together for the Panthers.

Justin Winters, a former All-MAC line-

backer for the Bulls, was a coach at Pallotti when the players were there.

**Youth at Receiver**

The Bulls have a number of new faces at wide receiver this season. In fact, of the UB receiving corps, only two players have registered a catch for the Bulls. **Antonio Nunn** has the most experience, playing in 26 games and making 27 receptions for 447 yards and two touchdowns. **Tito Overton** is the only other receiver with game experience and he has one career catch.

Recruiting wide receivers was a clear focus for the coaching staff in the off-season - especially adding receivers with experience. The Bulls have three new receivers from the junior college ranks on the squad in the fall, including **Daniel Lee** (Cisco College), **Bernard Porter** (Highland CC) and **Carlton Todd** (Iowa Central CC).

**Bulls vs. the Big Ten**

This will be Buffalo's tenth matchup with a Big Ten opponent. The Bulls are 1-8 all-time against Big Ten foes with their lone win coming last season at Rutgers, 42-13.

**New Faces on the Coaching Staff**

Head Coach Lance Leipold added three new coaches to his staff during the offseason.

Scott Fuchs is the new offensive line coach. A 25-year coaching veteran, he most recently spent the past five seasons as offensive line coach at Wyoming.

Jeff Burrow is the new safeties coach. He was the safeties coach at Kent State from 2011-17. He was the Golden Flashes' co-defensive coordinator in 2017.

Brad McCaslin will coach the defensive tackles. McCaslin has over 20 years of coaching experience. He was the defensive coordinator at Eastern Michigan in 2014 and 2015.

**Murchie Family Fieldhouse Opens**

Thanks to a record gift by the Murchie family, the Murchie Family Fieldhouse opened in April. The 92,000-square-foot indoor practice facility is situated just beyond the north end zone of UB Stadium on the university's North Campus.

The multi-use facility not only houses a full-size football field, but also features 6,000 feet of rubber track for sprint practice as well as long/triple jump and pole vault pits. It will also have motorized suspended softball hitting tunnels.



## Last Meeting Penn State 27 Buffalo 14 September 12, 2015

**UNIVERSITY PARK, PA** - As Christian Hackenberg walked off the field Saturday, his blue jersey and white pants were nearly as clean as when he walked out of the tunnel four hours earlier.

It was a welcome sight for the Penn State junior quarterback's teammates, coaches and Penn State fans who watched as Hackenberg was sacked 10 times the week before. But a reshuffled offensive line with kept Buffalo pass rushers off Hackenberg and Penn State's offense slowly built momentum to outlast Buffalo 27-14.

True freshmen Brandon Polk and Saquon Barkley each ran for touchdowns for Penn State (1-1). Hackenberg completed 14 of 27 passes for 128 yards and a touchdown and Joey Julius kicked a pair of field goals in the 27-14 win.

Buffalo quarterback Joe Licata tossed touchdown passes to Ron Willoughby and Marcus McGill.

But the Bulls struggled to move the ball into the red zone for most of the afternoon. Buffalo (1-1) punted nine times, turned the ball over on downs once and Licata was intercepted by defensive end Carl Nassib in the second quarter.

Nassib led Penn State's defense with three sacks while tackle Austin Johnson led the Nittany Lions with nine tackles.

After the teams traded futile opening possessions, Bulls kicker Adam Mitcheson missed a 47-yard field goal that would've given the Bulls a first-quarter lead.

Penn State took a lead it would never relinquish and got help from its special teams to do so.

Redshirt freshman DeAndre Thompkins returned a second-quarter punt 58 yards to set Penn State's offense up in the red zone. Two plays later, Polk took a sweep around the left side of Buffalo's defense untouched for a 22-yard score.

Joey Julius added a 22-yard field goal in the second quarter and the Nittany Lions led 10-0 at halftime. The Bulls used their second possession of the second half to go 78 yards with 11 plays. The drive ended when Licata hit Willoughby in the corner of the end zone and the Bulls' receiver fought off tight coverage from Christian Campbell to secure the catch.

Penn State responded with a 12-play scoring drive but had to settle for a 21-yard field goal from Julius after sophomore tight end Mike Gesicki dropped two would-be touchdown passes -- one at the goal line. Julius' kick gave Penn State a 13-7 lead.

It was the first of three consecutive scoring drives for the Nittany Lions. Barkley ripped off a 33-yard run then hurdled a Buffalo defender en route to a 17-yard gain to set up Hackenberg's 5-yard touchdown pass to DaeSean Hamilton that gave Penn State a 20-7 lead. Hackenberg hit Chris Godwin for a 38-yard gain down the sideline before Barkley plunged in from nine yards out to cap Penn State's scoring.

Penn State's reshuffled offensive line -- Andrew Nelson moved to left tackle, Brendan Mahon moved to right tackle from left guard and Derek Dowrey started at left guard -- gave Hackenberg time to take the deep shot. Hackenberg had no such time in the season opener wherein Penn State threw deep just once.

But Penn State lost Nelson to an unspecified injury in the first half. Nelson was helped off the field and did not return. Palmer took his spot in the lineup.

Licata hit McGill from 10 yards out with less than five minutes to play.

**BUFFALO, NY** – The University at Buffalo football team used a steady dose of the run game to cruise to a 38-10 season-opening win over Robert Morris at UB Stadium on Thursday night. Of the Bulls 57 plays in the game, 47 were run plays that resulted in 285 yards on the ground.

Redshirt-freshman quarterback Matt Myers looked quite comfortable in his first career start. The first freshman to start at quarterback for the Bulls since 1991, Myers finished 5-for-10 for 69 yards and two touchdowns and added 47 yards and another score on the ground.

Myers opened the scoring with a 1-yard rushing touchdown on UB's first possession. He also tossed a pair of touchdown passes to tight end Zac Lefebvre. He hit Lefebvre in stride for a 40-yard touchdown on the final play of the first quarter and later hit Lefebvre on a three-yard strike late in the first half.

Five different UB running backs had carries in the game led by returning Mid-American Conference Freshman of the Year Jaret Patterson who finished with 90 yards and a touchdown on only 12 carries. Kevin Marks rushed for 75 yards on 13 carries. Dylan McDuffie added 27 yards on four carries and freshman Ron Cook, Jr. had 24 yards on seven carries and scored his first career touchdown on a 3-yard run.

Robert Morris scored all 10 of its points in the first 20 minutes of the game, before the Bulls shut them out for the remainder of the contest. Redshirt-freshman Cory Gross had a team-high seven tackles. James Patterson had five tackles, including 1.5 for loss.

Buffalo had seven tackles for loss in the game. Both Malcolm Koonce and Ledarius Mack each had two tackles for loss and a sack. Koonce forced a fumble on his sack resulting in a recovery by Taylor Riggins.

Overall, Leipold was pleased UB was able to convincingly win the game by playing a fairly one-dimensional offense.

# HEAD COACH LANCE LEIPOLD

Lance Leipold is in his fifth season as head coach of the Buffalo football team.

Leipold led the Bulls to a school-record 10-win campaign in 2018. The 10 wins, included a program-best 7-1 record in the Mid-American Conference, a MAC East Division title and the school's second trip to the MAC Championship game. Among the Bulls non-conference victories in 2018, included a 42-13 win at Rutgers, for the school's first-ever win over a Power 5 opponent. The Bulls earned an invitation to the 2018 Dollar General Bowl for just their third bowl game berth in program history.

Leipold was named the 2018 Mid-American Conference Coach of the Year as well as a semifinalist for the George Munger College Coach of the Year Award, presented yearly by the Maxwell Football Club.

Buffalo had the finest offensive campaign in school history in 2018. The Bulls scored 484 points, 64 touchdowns and rolled up 5,803 yards of total offense on the season - all school records. Quarterback Tyree Jackson was named the MAC Offensive Player of the Year - the first UB player to ever win the award. Running back Jaret Patterson was named the MAC Freshman of the Year after becoming the first freshman in school history to rush for 1,000 yards in a season. The Bulls had a school-record 10 players named to the All-MAC team, including six on the first team.

In 2017, he guided the Bulls to a 6-6 record and bowl eligibility for just the third time as an FBS program. The six wins were the fourth most in a season since the Bulls made the move to the FBS ranks in 1999.

The Bulls featured an explosive offense in 2017 that ranked second in the Mid-American Conference, averaging 432 yards per game and led the MAC with 291 passing yards per outing. UB's 5,183 yards of total offense were the third most in school history for a single season. The Bulls produced 20 plays of 45 yards or more and those 20 plays came from 10 different players.

Buffalo posted key wins against Conference USA Champion Florida Atlantic as well as a nine-win Ohio team. The Bulls finished the season with three straight wins for the first time as an FBS program. In addition, UB's six losses were by a total of 29 points, including two one-point losses and a three-point, seven-overtime loss.

In 2016, Leipold led a very young squad, featuring 42 new players. The Bulls were the fourth most inexperienced team in the nation. Buffalo earned impressive wins over Army (a bowl team) and Akron. Buffalo had four players named to the All-MAC team.

In 2015, his first with the Bulls, Leipold led UB to a 5-7 mark. He became the first UB head coach to win five games in his first season since Bob Deming went 6-3 in 1969.

Included in the Bulls five wins was a victory at Florida Atlantic - Buffalo's first non-conference road win since the 2009 season. The Bulls won three road games in 2015 - the most in UB's FBS era (since 1999).

The Bulls had five players named to the All-MAC football team in 2015, led by tight end Matt Weiser who was also named an Academic All-American - becoming the first UB football player in the modern era to earn the distinction.

Leipold was named the 25th head coach in the history of the Buffalo football program on December 1, 2014.

Leipold came to UB from Wisconsin-Whitewater where he compiled an astounding 109-6 record and won six Division III National Championships over his eight seasons. A six-time National Coach of the Year, Leipold reached 100 career victories faster than any other coach in NCAA history - at any level.

Leipold has gathered multiple honors from as many as five football-related organizations. He earned his sixth American Football Coaches Association Division III Coach of the Year award in 2014. He has won the award more times than any active coach at any level. He passed the late Joe Paterno, who was a five-time recipient of the award.

In his first season as head coach at Whitewater, The Warhawks went 14-1 and won the national title. He led the Warhawks back to the national championship game in 2008, but they lost to Mount Union, 31-26. Wisconsin-Whitewater went 15-0, winning the national championship in 2009, 2010 and 2011 and won 46 straight games over that span. Following a 7-3 season in 2012, UWW went a perfect 15-0 and won the national championship in 2013 and followed with another perfect 15-0 season and a national title in 2014.

In Division III, where athletic scholarships aren't a part of the game, Leipold was able to recruit top-notch talent to the campus in southeastern Wisconsin. During his tenure, running back Justin Beaver earned the Gagliardi Trophy as the top player in Division III. Brent Allen earned the Division III Rimington Award as the top center. Jeff Schebler was the first recipient of the Fred Mitchell Award, given to the top placekicker in Division II or III. Tailback Levell Coppage earned D3football.com Offensive Player of the Year accolades, and Cole Klotz was selected D3football.com Defensive Player of the Year. Defensive back Jared Kiesow was named an NCAA Elite 88 Award winner. The Warhawks have piled up 56 All-America honors under Leipold's tutelage.

A native of Jefferson, WI, Leipold began his coaching career at Wisconsin-Whitewater in 1987 as a quarterbacks coach and then wide receivers coach. He moved to the University of Wisconsin from 1991-93 as a graduate assistant and helped the Badgers to a Big Ten title and a Rose Bowl appearance in 1993.

As an assistant coach at Division II Nebraska-Omaha from 1994-2000, Leipold helped turn the Mavericks from a 1-10 team in 1994 into three-time North Central Conference champions during his tenure. After being promoted to offensive coordinator in 2000, he moved on to the University of Nebraska, where he served for three seasons under current Ohio head coach Frank Solich. He was on the same staff as former UB head coach Turner Gill. The Cornhuskers competed in the national championship game in 2001 and earned bowl bids in 2002 and 2003.

He returned to Nebraska-Omaha to serve as associate head coach and offensive coordinator from 2004-06. The Mavericks finished 8-3 and won the conference championship each of his three seasons.

Leipold is a 1987 graduate of Wisconsin-Whitewater where he was a standout quarterback for the Warhawks. He ranks second in school history in career pass attempts (647), fourth in yards (4,277), sixth in completions (303) and tied for 10th with 27 touchdowns. He was inducted into the Whitewater Hall of Fame in 2003. He was inducted into the Wisconsin Football Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 2018.

He is a member of the AFCA Ethics Committee.

Leipold and his wife, Kelly, have a daughter, Lindsey, and a son, Landon. His daughter, Lindsey plays volleyball at Stetson University.

# University History

## Here is how the years add up to something big.

Through a steady succession of big ideas, big ventures and big achievements, UB has advanced dramatically over the past century and a half. Starting in 1846 as a small, private medical school, we've grown to become the largest institution in the State University of New York system, and we're charging toward world renown as a top-rated public research university. Our history is proud and prodigious—just like UB itself.

### Through continual growth

**1** First was medicine, then pharmacy, followed by law and dentistry: UB in its earliest days was a series of professional schools. The creation of the College of Arts and Sciences (CAS) in 1913 made the university all the richer with its focus on the arts and humanities, natural sciences and social sciences. Students today can choose from 13 schools and colleges, of which CAS is the largest, with 27 departments.

### By breaking new ground

**2** As UB has evolved through the decades, so has our physical presence. The original downtown medical school moved north in 1953 to join the largely E.B. Green-designed Main Street Campus (now the South Campus). Land for the North Campus in suburban Amherst was purchased in 1964. Our newest campus, in downtown Buffalo, has brought the medical school full circle, this time to anchor the city's first academic medical center.

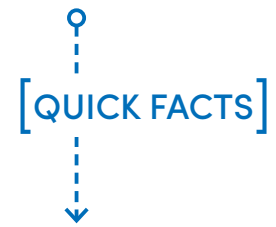
