OPENING TIPS

- Penn State kicks off its 57th season of women's basketball Wednesday night when the Lady Lions welcome Coppin State to the Bryce Jordan Center.
- Penn State enters its second season under head coach Carolyn Kieger who will look to lead a slew of new faces along with talented returners. Kieger and her staff added three transfers and eight freshmen to Penn State's roster over the offseason.
- The Lady Lions will look to the sophomore trio of Anna Camden, Shay Hagans and Makenna Marisa to lead the way as the three returners who saw court time last year, in addition to transfers Kelly Jekot and Nia Staples who were with the team last season and will be eligible to play this year.

IF PENN STATE BEATS COPPIN STATE

- Penn State would improve to 44-13 all-time in season openers. The Lady Lions have won 13 of their last 14 season-opening contests.
- The Lady Lions would improve to 2-0 all-time vs. Coppin State.

2020-21 Lady Lions

- A new-look Penn State enters its second season under head coach Carolyn Kieger in 2020-21.
- Kieger added eight talented freshmen and three experienced transfers to the roster over the offseason.
- Sophomores Makenna Marisa, Anna Camden and Shay Hagans will look to lead Penn State's young group as the three returning players who have seen plenty of court time under Kieger.
- Grad transfers Kelly Jekot (Villanova) and Nia Staples (West Virginia) joined the team last season and will be eligible to play this year.

Sophomores Ready To Shine

- The three-member sophomore class of Makenna Marisa, Anna Camden and Shay Hagans are primed to be key on-court leaders for the 2020-21 season.
- Marisa is the team's returning leading scorer after averaging 9.2 points per game a season ago. The McMurray, Pa. native added 4.5 rebounds and 2.2 assists per game while starting in 29 of 30 games in 2019-20. She tallied 14 double-digit efforts and led all Big Ten freshmen in minutes played with 32.5 mpg.
- Hagans ranked ninth amongst conference freshmen with 24.5 minutes per game. The lightening-fast guard saw action in all 30 games while making 13 starts a season ago. She finished with 5.2 points, 2.7 rebounds and 1.1 assists per game.
- Camden also saw action in all 30 games, averaging 4.9 points and 2.0 rebounds per game. The Downingtown, Pa. native ended the season on a high note, going 4-for-5 from three-point range in the Big Ten Tournament against Minnesota.

Highly-Touted Transfers

- Penn State is now home to five players who began their collegiate basketball careers at other institutions.
- Kelly Jekot, a graduate transfer from Villanova, joined Kieger's squad in January 2020 and will be eligible to play this season. Jekot averaged 10.2 points, 4.0 assists and 2.0 assists over her three years at the Big East's Villanova, including marks of 13.8 points and 4.6 rebounds per contest in her junior season in 2018-19.
- Nia Staples, a transfer from West Virginia, was also with Penn State last season and will be eligible to play this year.
- Kieger added three more transfers to the Penn State roster over this past offseason: Johnasia Cash (SMU), Niya Beverley (Wisconsin) and Britnay Gore (Cleveland State Community College).
- Cash, a McKeesport, Pa. native, is coming off a 2019-20 season at SMU in which she averaged 11.1 points and 9.4 rebounds per game. The forward will provide strong presence to Penn State's low post group.
- Beverley was a three-year starter at Wisconsin with career numbers of 6.7 points, 3.2 assists and 2.6 rebounds per game. She is expected to add experienced depth to Penn State's guard corp.
- Gore is also a strong low-post threat and was a two-time first team All-Conference pick at Cleveland State Community College. She averaged career numbers of 13.5 points, 9.8 rebounds and 1.9 blocks per game.

Fresh Faces

- Penn State's eight-member freshmen class is full of highly-touted new faces. The eight newbies come to Penn State from seven different states and Sweden.
- The initial November 2019 signing class was ranked inside the Top 20 by ESPN and comprised of Maddie Burke (Doylestown, Pa.), Kaci Donovan (Owego, N.Y.), Nan Garcia (Jeffersonville, Ind.) and Leilani Kapinus (Madison, Wis.).
- Kieger then added four more fresh faces over the offseason: Nyam Thornton (Columbus, Ohio), Tova Sabel (Stockholm, Sweden), Constance Thomas (Plant City, Fla.) and Mekkena Boyd (Williston, Vt.).

Season-Opening Success

- Penn State has a successful history in season openers, holding an all-time record of 43-14.
- The Lady Lions have won 13 of their last 14 season-opening contests.

Among The NCAA's Elite

- The Lady Lions have collected 955 wins since the program's inception in 1965, an all-time win mark that ranks 22nd in NCAA history.
- Penn State is one of only 19 schools with at least 25 NCAA Tournament appearances, joining Tennessee, Georgia, Stanford, Texas, UConn, Louisiana Tech, Vanderbilt, North Carolina, Purdue, LSU, Maryland, Old Dominion, Iowa, Notre Dame, Ohio State, Rutgers, Virginia and NC State.
- Penn State has been to 25 NCAA Tournaments, 13 Sweet Sixteens, four Elite Eights and one Final Four.

#IgniteTheCHANGE

- The Penn State women's basketball team has been highly active in the fight against social injustice.
- The team's mantra is #IgniteThePRIDE, and the team's culture is centered around the acronym PRIDE - Passion, Respect, Investment, Discipline, Excellence.
- The "R" in PRIDE stands for Respect and treating others how they want to be treated.
- During quarantine, the initiative of #IgniteTheCHANGE developed as a way for the team to commit to taking purposeful steps every month to ignite change, with the intention of educating themselves and others as well as continuing to spread awareness of social injustice.
- Action items that were spearheaded by the Lady Lions over the offseason included a candle lighting, registering the entire team to vote in the 2020 general election, watching the Netflix documentary "13th" and holding a powerful discussion about the documentary with the women's soccer team, and participating in a peaceful protest in honor of Breonna Taylor.
- The team plans to participate in this initiative every month in order to continue the important conversations surrounding social injustice.

THE OPPOSITION

Scouting Coppin State

- Coppin State enters its first season under head coach Laura Harper.
- The Eagles will be looking to improve upon last season's 3-26 overall record and 3-13 mark in MEAC play.
- Junior Aliyah Lawson was named to the MEAC Preseason third team. Lawson averaged 10.0 points and 3.0 rebounds per game a season ago, in addition to dishing a team-best 67 assists.
- The Eagles will also turn to graduate transfers Nailah Delinois and Roni Richardson for added leadership this season.
- Coppin State is a relatively young team, with the two graduate transfers being followed by four juniors, seven sophomores and one freshman.
- First-year Head Coach Laura Harper was a four-year standout at Maryland and was named the 2006 NCAA Final Four Most Outstanding Player after leading the Terrapins to a National Championship.

Against The Eagles

- Penn State and Coppin State will be meeting for the second time in program history.
- The two teams first met on Nov. 29, 2008 while playing in the Timeout for HIV/AIDS Tournament in Malibu, Calif.
- Penn State won that meeting, 76-61.

HEAD COACH CAROLYN KIEGER

Second Season • Marquette '06

Overall Career Record: 106-87

Penn State and Vice President of Athletics Sandy Barbour announced the selection of Carolyn Kieger as the sixth head coach of the women's basketball program on April 3, 2019. Kieger (pronounced KEY-grr), a 2019 Naismith Women's Coach of the Year Award semifinalist, enters her second season at the helm for the 2020-21 season.

In her first season leading the Lady Lions, Kieger coached Kamaria McDaniel to a First Team All-Big Ten selection as the conference's second-leading scorer with an average of 19.8 points per game, also a top-15 mark in the nation (13). She developed an aggressive up-tempo offense whose speed got the Lady Lions to the charity stripe 555 times during the 2019-20 season.

Kieger, a 2006 Marquette graduate, came to Happy Valley after five years at the helm of her alma mater, posting a 99-64 overall record. During the past three seasons, Kieger led the Golden Eagles to sparkling 76-26 mark (43-11 in Big East), which included a pair of Big East regular-season championships and a Big East Tournament Championship. Marquette made three consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances for the first time in 20 years, advancing to the round of 32 the past two seasons.

Widely regarded as one of the nation's brightest and rising coaching stars, Kieger's first Marquette team in 2014-15 won nine games. She proceeded to lead the Golden Eagles to 14, 25, 24 and a program-record 27 victories over the next four seasons.

Kieger was named a semifinalist for the 2019 Naismith Women's Coach of the Year Award after leading the Golden Eagles to one of the best seasons in program history in 2018-19. Marquette captured its second consecutive, but first-ever outright Big East regular-season title and a posted a school-best 27-8 record. The Golden Eagles were ranked in every Associated Press poll of the season for the first time in school history.

Marquette earned its third-straight NCAA Tournament berth in 2018-19, advancing to the second round for the second consecutive year. The Golden Eagles garnered a No. 5 seed and defeated Rice before dropping a two-point decision at No. 4 seed Texas A&M in the second round. The three consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances were Marquette's first since a three-year run from 1997-99.



Kieger mentored Allazia Blockton and Natisha Hiedeman to become Marquette's first Big East Players of the Year in 2017-18 and 2018-19, respectively. Kieger coached nine All-Big East selections in the last three seasons.

The 2017-18 campaign was another banner year as Kieger was named Big East Co-Coach of the Year after guiding the Golden Eagles to a program-record 15-3 conference mark and their first Big East regular season title. Kieger earned her first NCAA Tournament coaching victory with a first-round win over Dayton before falling at No. 1 seed Louisville.

Kieger coached Marquette to new heights in 2016-17 as the Golden Eagles won the Big East Tournament title for the first time in program history, while also earning a program-best No. 5 seed in the NCAA Tournament. She directed MU to the Big Dance for the first time since 2011. Kieger led Marquette to a 25-8 record in 2016-17, finishing with a 6-0 mark against teams ranked in the Top 25.

In her second year at the helm of the Golden Eagles, Kieger had the youngest program in NCAA Division I with eight freshmen on the roster in 2015-16, as MU improved its win total by five games. She made her collegiate head coaching debut on Nov. 15, 2014 against Green Bay and earned her first career victory on Nov. 17, 2014 when Marquette defeated Loyola-Chicago.

Prior to being named head coach at her alma mater, Kieger spent six seasons as an assistant coach at the University of Miami from 2008-14. Following graduation, she was at Miami as the coordinator of basketball operations (2006-07) and then served as director of operations at Marquette in 2007-08.

Kieger returned to Miami as an assistant coach in 2008-09 and was primarily responsible for guard development with the Hurricanes. She helped advance the skills of Miami guard Shenise Johnson, who earned All-America and ACC Player of the Year honors in 2010-11, while the squad was crowned ACC regular-season champions. She also helped guard Riquna Williams earn All-ACC first team accolades and finish as the ACC scoring leader with 21.7 points per game. Miami made three NCAA Tournament appearances and two in the WNIT during Kieger's last five seasons with the Hurricanes.

Kieger was a four-year starter at Marquette, a three-year captain and is MU's all-time assists leader. She is the only player in program history with at least 1,200 career points, 400 career rebounds and 600 assists. Kieger averaged 10.3 points per game during her career and was a second-team All-Big East selection in 2005-06, as well as, a second-team All-Conference USA selection for the 2003-04 and 2004-05 seasons. During her senior campaign, Kieger was a finalist for the Nancy Lieberman Award, presented to the nation's top point guard. In addition to her athletic accomplishments, Kieger received the Big East Conference's Sportsmanship award as a senior.

A native of Roseville, Minnesota, Kieger graduated Cum Laude from Marquette with a bachelor's degree in broadcasting and electronic communications in 2006. She received the McCahill Award in 2007, presented to a graduated MU senior student-athlete who demonstrated the highest performance in scholarship, leadership and athletics.
