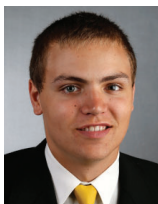

- DE A.J. Epenesa leads a defense that ranks third in the country in scoring defense (8.8 ppg) and fifth in the country in total defense (254.2). Those marks rank third and fourth in the Big Ten respectively. The Hawkeyes have allowed just 61 first downs, third fewest in the country and second in the Big Ten. (page 8)
- QB Nate Stanley has eight touchdowns this season and 60 career touchdowns passes, third all-time in program history. He trails Chuck Long (74) and Drew Tate (61) on the all-time list. (pages 6-7)
- QB Nate Stanley has started the last 31 games at quarterback (21-10), and the Hawkeyes have averaged 29.5 points per game in those starts. That average ranks fifth in school history, and 10th nationally among active quarterbacks. Stanley is 13-4 at Kinnick Stadium, 10-10 in all Big Ten games, and 6-4 in conference games at Kinnick Stadium. (pages 6-7)
- Smith-Marsette leads the team in touchdowns (4) receptions (19), receiving yards (254), and all-purpose yards (468). He averages 29.4 yards on 33 career kickoff returns. The Big Ten record of average kickoff return yardage (minimum 40 returns) is 28.8, set by Stan Brown of Purdue (1968-70). (page 9)
- RB Tyler Goodson has 40 carries and 14 receptions. His 14 receptions are the most among all Big Ten running backs. His 65 combined touches ranks second on the team to Sargent (72). (page 7)
- K Keith Duncan has made 11-of-12 field goal attempts and 14-of-14 PAT attempts. The 11 field goals made tie for second in the country. He leads the team and ranks sixth in the Big Ten in scoring with 47 points. Duncan has connected on all six kicks of at least 40 yards. (page 7)
- Iowa has allowed five touchdowns this season. Among Big Ten schools, only Penn State (4) and Wisconsin (4) have allowed fewer.
- The Hawkeyes allowed their first rushing touchdown of the season last week at Michigan. It was the only touchdown of the game. Iowa and Penn State are two of six schools in the country to allow one rushing touchdown or fewer. Georgia is the only team to allow zero rushing touchdowns.
- Iowa hosts Penn State in the 20th night game in the history of Kinnick Stadium. Iowa is hosting Penn State under the lights for the fourth time (1-2), more than any other school. The Hawkeyes are 13-6 all-time in games played under the lights at Kinnick, and 3-4 against ranked opponents. (page 6)
- Saturday marks the second year in a row the schools are meeting as AP top 25 opponents. No. 17 Penn State beat No. 18 Iowa, 30-24, on Oct. 27, 2018 in University Park, Pennsylvania. The last top 25 matchup between these schools in Iowa City was Oct. 2, 2010, when No. 17 Iowa defeated No. 20 Penn State, 24-3. That was Iowa's last win in the series. (page 4)

HAWKEYE HISTORY

Iowa has played 1,251 games since beginning football in 1889. Iowa's overall record is 654-558-39 (.538). That includes a 408-221-16 (.645) record in home games, a 246-337-23 (.425) record in games away from Iowa City, a 330-379-25 (.467) mark in Big Ten games and a 292-186-15 (.607) record in Kinnick Stadium. Oct. 5, 2019 marked the 90th anniversary of the first game in Kinnick Stadium, a 46-0 win over Monmouth.

When Iowa hosts Minnesota on Nov. 16, it will mark the 130th anniversary of Iowa football. The Hawkeyes played their first football game on Nov. 16, 1889, against Grinnell.

IOWA HOSTS ANNUAL ANF GAME

The Iowa Hawkeyes and the Iowa Farm Bureau Federation are hosting the ninth annual America Needs Farmers (ANF) game Saturday. A former Hawkeye will be recognized as the ANF Wall of Honor recipient. The ANF Plaza is located at the northwest corner of Kinnick Stadium.

The ANF honoree will be available for a press conference Tuesday, Oct. 8, immediately following the weekly press conference of head coach Kirk Ferentz.

IOWA TO HOST 2009 TEAM REUNION

Members of the 2009 Iowa football team will be recognized this weekend as part of the home football game with Penn State. As many as 50 members of the 2009 team are expected to be at Kinnick Stadium on Saturday.

The 2009 Hawkeyes posted an 11-2 overall record, dropping an overtime contest (20-17) at Ohio State in game that decided the Big Ten title. The Hawkeyes won their final game of the regular season in Kinnick Stadium and concluded the campaign with a 24-14 win over ninth-ranked Georgia Tech in the 2010 Orange Bowl.

Orange Bowl representatives Phillis Oeters and Henry Viera will also be present for the in-game recognition.

THE SERIES

Saturday will be the 29th meeting between Iowa and Penn State. The Nittany Lions have won the last five meetings and hold a 16-12 advantage in the series. Penn State leads the series, 10-9, since 1993 when the Nittany Lions joined the Big Ten Conference. Iowa is 5-9 all-time in games played in Iowa City.

Saturday marks the second year in a row the schools are meeting as AP top 25 opponents. No. 17 Penn State beat No. 18 Iowa, 30-24, on Oct. 27, 2018 in University Park, Pennsylvania. The last top 25 matchup between these schools in Iowa City was Oct. 2, 2010, when No. 17 Iowa defeated No. 20 Penn State, 24-3. That was Iowa's last win in the series.

HEAD COACH KIRK FERENTZ

Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents) is in his 21st season as head coach at Iowa. He is the dean of NCAA Division I football coaches and is Iowa's all-time winningest coach, surpassing Hayden Fry earlier this year. His contract runs through the 2025 season.



- Named Big Ten Coach of the Year for the fourth time in his career (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015). Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year awards.
- Guided Iowa to Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, and the Big Ten West Division title in 2015.
- Named Woody Hayes, Eddie Robinson, and Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year in 2015. Was a finalist for the Maxwell Football Club, Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year award.
- Ferentz is fifth all-time with 156 overall wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference. He has 92 Big Ten wins, which ranks sixth all-time.
- Named the 2002 Associated Press and Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year.
- Iowa has made two BCS bowl appearances, including a 24-14 win in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, and one CFP Bowl (2016).
- Iowa has played in 11 January bowl games with five January bowl victories (2004 Outback Bowl, 2005 Capital One Bowl, 2009 Outback Bowl, 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2019 Outback Bowl).
- Iowa has posted a 147-81 (.645) overall mark and an 88-59 (.599) Big Ten record since 2001. Ferentz has placed in the top one-half of the conference 13 times, including Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, a second-place finish in 2009, and a West Division title in 2015.
- At Iowa, Ferentz holds an overall record of 156-102 (.605) and an 92-73 (.558) mark in Big Ten games. He is Iowa's all-time winningest football coach with 156 wins. In 22 seasons as a college head coach, he holds a career mark of 168-123 (.577).
- The only Division I head coach to coach three sons at the same college. Brian, an assistant coach since 2012 and Iowa's offensive coordinator, was a Hawkeye letterman from 2003-05. James was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line before graduating in May, 2013. Steven was a senior offensive lineman in 2016.

FERENTZ MOVES UP BIG TEN CHARTS

Head coach Kirk Ferentz's 156 wins in all games coached as a member of the Big Ten Conference rank fifth in league history. He is one of five coaches in Big Ten Conference history to win at least 150 games as a member of the Big Ten Conference. The top five includes Woody Hayes (202), Amos Alonza Stagg (199), Bo Schembechler (194), Joe Paterno (162), and Ferentz (156).

Ferentz has 92 Big Ten wins as Iowa's head coach. The 92 conference wins rank sixth among the conference's all-time winningest coaches in Big Ten games.

Ferentz (156-102) became Iowa's all-time winningest coach on Sept. 1, 2018. The Hawkeyes defeated Northern Illinois, 33-7. It was Ferentz's 144th win as Iowa's head coach, one more than his predecessor, Hayden Fry (143-89-6). Fry coached Iowa for 20 years (1979-98). Ferentz is in his 21st season in 2019.

Both Ferentz (156, 92) and Fry (143, 96) rank in the top six in overall wins and Big Ten wins. Only Iowa and Michigan have two coaches ranked in the top 10 of both win categories (Bo Schembechler 194, 143; and Lloyd Carr 122, 81). Iowa is the only school in the country to have just two head football coaches since 1979.

FERENTZ TOPS IN LONGEVITY

Kirk Ferentz is in his 21st season as Iowa's head football coach. He is the longest tenured active head coach in college football. Ferentz was named Iowa head coach on Dec. 2, 1998. Gary Patterson of TCU is No. 2 in coaching tenure. Patterson's first year with the Horned Frogs was 2001. Among Big Ten coaches, only Pat Fitzgerald (2006) and Mark Dantonio (2007) have been at their current schools for 10 seasons or more. Iowa is the only school to have just two head football coaches since 1979.

Defensive coordinator Phil Parker and strength and conditioning coach Chris Doyle are also in their 21st seasons on Iowa's staff. Quarterbacks coach Ken O'Keefe was on Ferentz's original coaching staff before he left for the NFL following the 2011 season. He returned to Iowa in 2017 to coach Iowa's quarterbacks.

Ferentz is the only Division I coach to coach three sons. Brian Ferentz, a former Hawkeye letterman and captain (2003-05), enters his eighth season on Iowa's coaching staff. James Ferentz was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line and a team captain before graduating in 2013. Steven was an offensive lineman and letterwinner in 2015 and 2016.

WIN, GRADUATE, DO IT RIGHT

Ten Hawkeyes wear a decal on their helmets indicating they have received their undergraduate degrees from the University of Iowa. The graduates include Drew Cook, John Milani, Landan Paulsen, Levi Paulsen, Colton Rastetter, Brady Reiff, Brady Ross, Ryan Schmidt, Jackson Subbert, and Nate Wieting.

MOVE THE CHAINS

The Hawkeyes set a Ferentz-era record in their 48-3 win over Middle Tennessee in Week 4. Iowa had 644 yards of total offense, the most in the Ferentz era (previous best was 613 vs. Minnesota in 2005), and the most by any Hawkeye team since 1997 (658 vs. Northern Iowa). Iowa rushed for 351 yards against Middle Tennessee, a mark that ranks fourth in the Ferentz era.

IN THE RANKINGS

Iowa is ranked No. 17 in the AP poll and No. 18 in the coaches poll. Iowa has four opponents ranked in the top 25 (#8/8 Wisconsin, #9/10 Penn State, #16/16 Michigan, and #25/--- Minnesota). Those four opponents have a combined 19-1 record.

Iowa is 0-1 against ranked teams this season, falling 10-3 at Michigan on Oct. 5. The Hawkeyes last win over a ranked opponent was against No. 18 Mississippi State, 27-22, on Jan. 1 at the 2019 Outback Bowl.

STANLEY CLIMBS SCHOOL AND CONFERENCE CHARTS

QB Nate Stanley has eight touchdown passes this season and 60 in his career, third all-time in program history. He trails Chuck Long (74) and Drew Tate (61) on the all-time list.

Stanley has started the last 31 games at quarterback (21-10), and the Hawkeyes have averaged 29.5 points per game in those starts. That average ranks fifth in school history, and 10th nationally among active quarterbacks.

Stanley is 13-4 at Kinnick Stadium, 10-10 in all Big Ten games, and 6-4 in conference games at Kinnick.

Stanley has 17 career multi-touchdown games, including three this season. He

completed three touchdown passes in the season opener against Miami, Ohio, three more in Week 2 against Rutgers, and two against Middle Tennessee in Week 4. He has 10 career games with at least three passing touchdowns. Only Long has more in program history (11).

Stanley threw 26 touchdown passes in 2018, second most in the Big Ten, one shy of tying Chuck Long (1985) for the most in single season school history, and tied for second most all-time in single season history. Stanley also threw 26 touchdown passes in 2017. Stanley's 52 touchdown passes from 2017-18 are the most ever in school history over a two-year span. Long tossed 49 touchdown passes from 1984 (22) to 1985 (27).

Stanley threw for a career-high 2,852 yards in 2018, the seventh-highest single-season total in school history. He ranks sixth in career passing yards (6,576) and sixth in career total offense (6,439).

Stanley is named to six preseason watch lists and listed on the preseason Big Ten third team by Phil Steele.

GRAND THEFT SECONDARY

DB Michael Ojemudia is tied for second in the Big Ten lead with two interceptions. He intercepted a pass in each of the first two weeks. LB Djimon Colbert recorded the first interception of his career in Week 2. SS Geno Stone had one interception in Week 5.

The Hawkeyes have four interceptions this season. Iowa led the Big Ten and tied for second in the country in 2018 with 20 interceptions. Over the last three seasons, no school has more interceptions than Iowa. The Hawkeyes have 45 interceptions since 2017, one more than Boston College has over the same period.

Entering this season, Iowa has at least one interception return for a touchdown in each of the last 11 seasons, and 16 of the last 18 seasons.

DUNCAN GETTING HIS KICKS

K Keith Duncan has made 11-of-12 field goal attempts and 14-of-14 PAT attempts. The 11 field goals made tie for second in the country. He leads the team and ranks sixth in the Big Ten in scoring with 47 points. Duncan has connected on all six kicks of at least 40 yards. He kicked a career-long 49 yard field goal against Middle Tennessee in Week 4.

Duncan is seeing his first action since 2016, when he made 9-11 field goal attempts and 38-39 PAT attempts (one was blocked). That year he kicked a 33-yard field goal as time expired to lift Iowa over #2 Michigan, 14-13.

Duncan was named Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week and Lou Groza Award Star of the Week on Sept. 16 following his performance at Iowa State. Duncan connected on a career-best four field goals at Iowa State. His final kick from 39 yards provided the margin of victory with 4:51 remaining in the fourth quarter. He also connected from 25 yards on Iowa's first drive of the game and from 40 yards on the final play of the first half. He nailed a 42-yarder late in the third quarter.

The Big Ten weekly honor was the second of his career. He was previously recognized in 2016, earning the weekly honor following Iowa's 14-13 win over Michigan. Duncan contributed two field goals in that win, including the game-winner from 33 yards on the final play of the game.

POCKET PRESSURE

DE A.J. Epenesa leads a defense that ranks third in the country in scoring defense (8.8 ppg) and fifth in the country in total defense (254.2). Those marks rank third and fourth in the Big Ten respectively. The Hawkeyes have allowed just 61 first downs, third fewest in the country and second in the Big Ten.

Iowa has allowed five touchdowns in five games. Among Big Ten schools, only Penn State (4) and Wisconsin (4) have allowed fewer.

The Hawkeyes allowed their first rushing touchdown of the season last week at Michigan. It was the only touchdown of the game. Iowa and Penn State are two of six schools in the country to allow one rushing touchdown or fewer. Georgia is the only team to allow zero rushing touchdowns this season.

Iowa's defense allowed just five first downs against Rutgers in Week 2. That ties for the fewest allowed in the Kirk Ferentz era (Syracuse, 2007). Rutgers' 125 yards of total offense ranks as the fifth lowest total in the Ferentz era.

Epenesa leads Iowa with two sacks and five quarterback hurries. He led the Big Ten and ranked ninth in the country with 10.5 sacks in 2018.

Epenesa is named to four preseason All-America first teams, is listed on six preseason watch lists, and is preseason Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year by CollegeFootballNews.com.

Epenesa recorded at least one sack in nine of 13 games last season and was named first-team All-Big Ten by league media, and second-team All-Big Ten by league coaches. He ranked second in the conference and 16th nationally in forced fumbles (4), and ranked fourth in the Big Ten in tackles for loss. He totaled 37 tackles, four pass breakups, eight QB pressures, and a blocked punt in 2018. He recovered his own forced fumble and returned it 19 yards for a touchdown at Illinois.

The Hawkeyes ranked third in the Big Ten last season with 35 sacks, the second highest single-season total in the Ferentz era (2002, 40).

RB Mekhi Sargent leads the team in carries (61) and rushing yards (311). He has started the last nine games and is named on the Doak Walker Award Preseason Watch List.

RB Toren Young ranks second on the team in carries (41) and rushing yards (291). He has led Iowa in rushing each of the last two weeks, and ranks fifth in the Big Ten with 7.1 yards per carry. He rushed for a career-high 131 yards in Week 4. It was his first career 100-yard rushing game.

RB Tyler Goodson has 40 carries and 14 receptions. His 14 receptions are the most among all Big Ten running backs. His 65 combined touches ranks second on the team to Sargent (72).

Young (131) and Goodson (97) rushed for career-highs Week 4 against Middle Tennessee State. The Hawkeyes rushed for 351 yards in the game, the fourth highest total in the Ferentz era.

The trio combined for 392 carries, 1,723 rushing yards and 16 rushing touchdowns (nine by Sargent, five by Young, and two by Kelly-Martin). Sargent had 40.6 percent of the carries (159-745), Young had 34.7 percent of the attempts (136-637), and Kelly-Martin has 24.7 percent of the carries (97-341).

YOUNG, SARGENT SURPASS 1,000 CAREER RUSHING YARDS

Junior running backs Toren Young and Mekhi Sargent each surpassed 1,000 career rushing yards in Iowa's win over Middle Tennessee on Sept. 28.

Sargent entered the game with 953 rushing yards and moved past 1,000 for his career on a 12-yard run late in the first period. He ended the contest with 91 rushing yards. His career totals include 1,056 yards on 220 attempts. He is the 48th Iowa running back to surpass 1,000 career yards and currently ranks 44th on the all-time list.

Young entered the contest with 950 career yards and surpassed 1,000 on a 15-yard run early in the second quarter, becoming the 49th Iowa running back to surpass the century total. He led the Hawkeyes with a career-high 131 rushing yards against Middle Tennessee. Young now has 1,121 career yards on 222 attempts to rank 37th on the career list.

Sargent moved over 1,000 career yards on career attempt 207, while Young went past 1,000 yards on career attempt 209.

RETURN TO SENDER

WR Ihmir Smith-Marsette is named on the Paul Hornung Award watch list, an honor bestowed to the most versatile player in college football.

Smith-Marsette leads the team in receptions (19), receiving yards (254), and all-purpose yards (468). He rushed for a touchdown (14 yards) in Week 4, his team-best fourth touchdown of the season. He set a career-high with 113 receiving yards in Week 2.

Smith-Marsette averages 29.4 yards on 33 career kickoff returns. The Big Ten record of average kickoff return yardage (minimum 40 returns) is 28.8, set by Stan Brown of Purdue (1968-70).

In 2018, Smith-Marsette led the Big Ten and ranked No. 2 in the country, averaging 29.5 yards on 24 kickoff returns. He was named Rodgers-Dwight Return Specialist of the Year in the Big Ten Conference. He had 23 receptions for 361 yards and three touchdowns. His 15.7 yards per catch led the Hawkeyes (minimum 20 receptions).

D.J. JOHNSON NAMED CO-BIG TEN FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

DB D.J. Johnson was named Big Ten Co-Freshman of the Week on Sept. 16 following his performance at Iowa State. In his second career start, Johnson recorded a career-high eight tackles, including six solo tackles and two assists, and added two pass break-ups. The Big Ten weekly honor is the first of his career.

The UI Stead Family Children's Hospital opened in 2017. It is connected to the south end of the University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics and overlooks Kinnick Stadium from the southeast grandstands. During Iowa football home games, patients and their families can watch the game from the top floor (Level 12), one of the highest vantage points in Iowa City.

ALL ABOARD TO KINNICK STADIUM!

The Hawkeye Express, the passenger train that transports fans from Coralville to Kinnick Stadium, is in its 16th season in 2019.

Adults can ride the train for \$15, round trip, while children (12-and-under) ride for free. All passengers must have a ticket. Tickets can be purchased in advance at the UI Ticket Office or on game day (cash only on game day) at the Hawkeye Express depot located near the boarding ramp. The trip to Kinnick Stadium is approximately 10 minutes. Media credentials are accepted, as well.

Free parking is located in lots near the Comfort Suites and Coral Ridge Mall. Fans can begin boarding the train three hours prior to kickoff. Return trips begin at the start of the fourth period and run 90 minutes after the game.

The Hawkeye Express is owned by the Iowa Northern Railway Company and operates on the Iowa Interstate Railroad.

BACK ON CAMPUS

Four former players are on the University of Iowa football staff in 2019. Brian Ferentz, a three-year letterman from 2003-05, is in his eighth year on staff, his third as offensive coordinator.

LeVar Woods, a three-year letterman from 1998-2000, enters his 12th year on the Iowa staff. Woods was named Special Teams Coordinator in 2017. He coached tight ends from 2015-17 and linebackers from 2012-14. He rejoined the program as an administrative assistant in 2008.

Kelvin Bell joined the Iowa program as a defensive lineman in 2000, but had his career cut short due to injury. He returned to the program as a graduate assistant and served as director of on-campus recruiting from 2012-13. He was named recruiting coordinator and defensive assistant coach in February, 2016, and was named defensive line coach in 2019.

Broderick Binns, a four-year letterman from 2008-11, was named director of player development in April, 2016. Binns previously served as a graduate assistant in 2014 and 2015, working with Hawkeye special teams.

HAWKEYE LEGACIES

Iowa has seven players on its 2019 roster whose father played for the Hawkeyes: TE Drew Cook (Marv, 1985-88), DL A.J. Epenesa (Epenesa, 1997), DE Joe Evans (Spence, 1989), DB Thomas Hartlieb (Jim, 1989-92), WR Henry Marchese (John, 1985), DE Nathan Nelson (Jeff, 1990-92), and QB Ryan Schmidt (Rick, 1984-85).

Iowa has two sets of the brothers on the team: OL Landan Paulsen and OL Levi Paulsen, and TE Bryce Schulte and WR Quinn Schulte.

Iowa has three players whose brothers played at Iowa: LB Nick Niemann (Ben in 2014-17), FB Johnny Plewa (Macon in 2013-15), and DL Brady Reiff (Riley in 2008-11).

LS Austin Spiewak is the grandson of Gary Grouwinkler, who played for Iowa in the 1957 and 1959 Rose Bowl games.

LB Dillon Doyle is the son of head strength and conditioning coach Chris Doyle.

SEEING DOUBLE

Senior offensive linemen Landan and Levi Paulsen started Weeks 1-4, becoming the first set of twin brothers to start for the Hawkeyes since SS Kent Ellis and CB Kevin Ellis in 1980. The last brothers to start in the same game for the Hawkeyes were James and LeShun Daniels. James was Iowa's starting center in the 2016 season opener against Miami (Ohio), and LeShun was Iowa's starting running back.

The Paulsens are the sixth set of twins to play football at the University of Iowa. The offensive linemen from Woodbury High School in Northwest Iowa join the company of Leo and Lloyd Jensvold (1929-30), Harold and Herbert Shoener (1946-47), Kent and Kevin Ellis (1977-80), Aaron and Evan Kooiker (1992), and Shane and Shaun Prater (2008).

IOWA FOOTBALL AND THE NFL

- The Hawkeyes have had 180 former players in the NFL since 1999, Kirk Ferentz’s first year as head coach (70 draft picks/110 free agents).
- At least one Iowa Hawkeye has been selected in every NFL Draft since 1978 (42 consecutive years).
- TE T.J. Hockenson (eighth overall, Detroit) and TE Noah Fant (20th overall, Denver) became the first tight ends from the same school to be drafted in the first round of a single NFL Draft.
- DB Desmond King (Los Angeles Chargers), LS Casey Kreiter (Denver), TE George Kittle (San Francisco), and OL Marshal Yanda (Baltimore) were named All-Pro in 2018.
- Over the past 17 years, 150-of-175 (86 percent) of Iowa’s senior starters have been drafted in the NFL or signed NFL free agent contracts.
- Over the past 12 years, Iowa has had 44 NFL Draft picks, fourth most in the Big Ten -- Ohio State (63), Wisconsin (45), and Michigan (45). Since 2010, Iowa has had 37 players drafted in the NFL, tied for fourth most in the Big Ten – Ohio State (62), Penn State (39), and Wisconsin (37).
- Iowa has had six first round picks in the last nine NFL drafts -- OL Bryan Bulaga, 2010; DE Adrian Clayborn, 2011; OL Riley Reiff, 2012; OL Brandon Scherff, 2015, TE T.J. Hockenson, TE Noah Fant.
- Iowa had six players drafted in the 2012 NFL Draft, which tied for the most in the Big Ten and tied for fourth in the country.
- Former Hawkeye Marshal Yanda (Baltimore OL) is a seven-time Pro-Bowler (2011-16, 2018) and was named NFL All-Pro in 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, and 2018.
- In NFL 2011 regular season statistics, former Hawkeye linebackers Chad Greenway (Minnesota) and Pat Angerer (Indianapolis) finished third and fourth, respectively, in tackles. Greenway was named to the Pro Bowl in 2012 and 2013.
- Three former Hawkeyes were involved in the 2012 Super Bowl. DB Tyler Sash played for the Super Bowl champion New York Giants, while LB Jeff Tarpinian was on the injured reserve roster of the New England Patriots. Former Iowa center Brian Ferentz, now is his seventh year on staff and first as Iowa’s offensive coordinator, was New England’s tight ends coach.
- Former Iowa DB Sean Considine and OL Marshal Yanda won Super Bowl rings with the 2012 Baltimore Ravens in the 2013 Super Bowl.
- Former Iowa LB James Morris (injured reserve) earned a Super Bowl ring with the New England Patriots in 2015. Former TE Tony Moeaki played for the Seattle Seahawks in the same game.
- Former center James Ferentz was a member of the 2016 Super Bowl champion Denver Broncos.
- Former DT Jonathan Babineaux played for the Atlanta Falcons in Super Bowl LI. Former DE Adrian Clayborn and former DB Charles Godfrey were on the Atlanta injured reserve roster.
- Former OL Cole Croston was on the New England Patriots roster in Super Bowl LII. Former C James Ferentz and WR Riley McCarron were on the Patriots practice squad.
- Former DL Adrian Clayborn (active), OL James Ferentz (inactive), WR Riley McCarron (injured reserve), and OL Cole Croston (practice squad) earned Super Bowl rings as members of the New England Patriots in Super Bowl LIII.
- Entering the 2019 season, every Iowa senior starting tight end (14) under Kirk Ferentz has been drafted in the NFL or made an NFL team. The NFL has employed 16 Iowa tight ends since 1999 (11 drafted/5 free agents).
- All 11 members of Iowa’s starting defensive unit in 2008 were either drafted or signed to NFL free agent contracts following the draft.

IOWA PROGRAM NOTES

- The Hawkeyes have earned bowl eligibility in 17 of the last 18 seasons. Iowa is 8-8 in bowl games since 2001. Only Ohio State (9) and Wisconsin (8) have more bowl wins among Big Ten teams since 2001. The Hawkeyes are 16-15-1 in 32 bowl games. Iowa has won five January bowl games under Ferentz.
- Iowa is the only school to have two head football coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry took over prior to the 1979 season and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk Ferentz (156-102) replaced Fry and is in his 21st season in 2019. Ferentz also served as Iowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under Fry.
- Iowa played in the Big Ten title game for the first time in program history on Dec. 5, 2015. Iowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. Iowa (8-0, 2002; 8-0, 2015) is one of three Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era), joining Michigan State (1) and Ohio State (5).
- Iowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/USA Today coaches polls five times since 2002, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004. The Hawkeyes finished 2015 ranked ninth in the AP poll and 10th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. In the Big Ten, only Ohio State has more top 10 finishes since 2002.
- Since 1936 when the first AP poll was released, Iowa has appeared in the poll 325 times, the fifth highest total in the Big Ten (Ohio State, Michigan, Wisconsin, and MSU). Iowa has been the top-ranked team in the country 11 times.
- Iowa set a school record with 12 wins in 2015. The Hawkeyes won 11 games in 2002 (11-2), and 2009 (11-2). In 2009, Iowa started 9-0 and won 10 regular season games for just the fourth time in school history.
- Iowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history.
- Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015) and was named National Coach of the Year in 2002 and 2015. Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year honors. Iowa's Hayden Fry and Penn State's Joe Paterno both won the award three times.
- Iowa has had 10 individual national award winners under head coach Kirk Ferentz. They include Brad Banks (2002 Davey O'Brien, Top Quarterback; 2002 Associated Press National Player of the Year); Dallas Clark (2002 Mackey, Top Tight End); Nate Kaeding (2002 Groza, Top Kicker); Robert Gallery (2003 Outland, Top Lineman); Shonn Greene (2008 Doak Walker, Top Running Back); Brandon Scherff (2014 Outland, Top Lineman), Desmond King (2015 Jim Thorpe), Josey Jewell (2017 Lott IMPACT), T.J. Hockenson (2018, Mackey, Top Tight End).
- Iowa's offensive line earned the Joe Moore Award in 2016, an honor bestowed upon the top offensive line unit in the country.
- Iowa's football record in the 2000 decade was 80-45 (.640), a record that ranks as the best decade in Iowa football history, based on total wins. Iowa posted a record of 77-40-4 (.652) during the 1980's and the Hawkeyes were 62-53-2 (.538) in the 1990's. Iowa is 69-46 (.596) since 2010.

QB Nate Stanley had 252 yards passing, raising his career total to 5,603 and passing C.J. Beathard for eighth all-time in school history.

LG Landan Paulsen and RG Levi Paulsen became the first set of twin brothers to start for the Hawkeyes since SS Kent Ellis and CB Kevin Ellis in 1980. The last brothers to start in the same game for the Hawkeyes were James and LeShun Daniels. James was Iowa's starting center in the 2016 season opener against Miami (Ohio), and LeShun was Iowa's starting running back.

K Keith Duncan scored 8 points (1 FG, 5 PAT). Duncan had not played in game since January 1, 2017 at the Outback Bowl.

WR Oliver Martin made his Hawkeye debut and caught a 9-yard touchdown. Martin had one receiving touchdown for Michigan in 2018.

MISCELLANEOUS

Iowa is 97-32-2 (.740) in season-opening games, including a 18-3 mark under coach Kirk Ferentz. The Hawkeyes have won six straight season openers and are 18-1 since 2001. Iowa has won nine straight nonconference games over the last two seasons.

Iowa opened the season under the lights at Kinnick Stadium for the first time in program history. Iowa has hosted 19 night games in Kinnick Stadium's history, holding a 13-6 record in those contests.

Miami won the toss and elected to defer. The Hawkeyes have played 254 games under head coach Kirk Ferentz. Iowa has opened the game on offense 190 times (117-73). The Hawkeyes have opened the game on defense 64 times (36-28).

Ten different Hawkeyes had at least one reception. Including career firsts from TE Sean Beyer, WR Oliver Martin (first as a Hawkeye), and RB Tyler Goodson.

PK Keith Duncan connected on a career-long 46-yard field goal in the second quarter.

LB Djimon Colbert recorded his first career interception (6-yard return). The turnover set up a 19-yard field goal before halftime.

DB Michael Ojemudia recorded an interception, his second of the season and fifth of his career.

MISCELLANEOUS

Iowa's defense allowed five first downs, tied for the lowest in the Ferentz era, and 125 yards total offense, the fourth lowest total in the Ferentz era.

It is the first time in 67 meetings the game was decided by a single point.

Iowa retains possession of the Cy-Hawk Trophy. Iowa is 14-3 in its last 17 rivalry trophy games (Iowa State, Minnesota, Nebraska, Wisconsin).

Iowa has won five straight in the series, its longest streak since winning 15 in a row from 1983-97. The Hawkeyes have won four straight in Ames. Iowa improved to 45-22 in the series.

Saturday's game is the second event in the 16th annual Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk series. Iowa leads the 2019-20 Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series, 5-0 with wins in soccer and football.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

QB Nate Stanley totaled 222 yards of offense, raising his career total to 5,979, seventh most in school history. He passed James Vandenberg (5,853) and Matt Sherman (5,948) in today's game.

K Keith Duncan set a career high with four field goals (25, 40, 42, 39). His 39-yard field goal with 4:51 left in the fourth quarter proved to be the game winner. He is 8-8 on field goal attempts this season, and 4-4 on attempts 40 yards or longer.

P Michael Sleep-Dalton averaged 47.2 yards on five punts. He had punts of 50 and 51 yards.

WR Nico Ragaini led Iowa with a career-high five receptions.

DB D.J. Johnson led Iowa with a career-high nine tackles. He had seven solo stops, one tackle-for-loss, and two pass breakups.

FS Jack Koerner had a career-high eight tackles. LB Djimon Colbert and DB Geno Stone matched their career highs with eight tackles.

MISCELLANEOUS

Iowa held a 2-0 advantage in turnovers, including a fumble recovery in the fourth quarter to clinch the game. Iowa has not had a turnover against Iowa State since 2015.

Iowa has won 10 straight non-conference games since the 2017 season opener.

IOWA NOTES

Iowa had 644 yards of total offense, the most in the Ferentz era (previous best was 613 vs. Minnesota in 2005). Iowa's 351 rushing yards rank fourth in the Ferentz era.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

QB Nate Stanley made his 30th consecutive start at quarterback. The only other players in school history with 30 or more consecutive starts at quarterback are Chuck Long (47), Matt Sherman (32), and Matt Rodgers (31). Stanley is 21-9 in 30 career starts.

QB Nate Stanley improved to 11-0 all-time against non-conference opponents (9-0 in the regular season, 2-0 in bowl games).

QB Nate Stanley totaled 275 yards of offense, raising his career total to 6,244, sixth most in school history. He passed C.J. Beathard (5,991) in today's game.

QB Nate Stanley threw two touchdown passes, raising his career total to 60. He has 17 career multi-touchdown games. He is one of three players in school history to throw 60 or more touchdowns (Drew Tate, 61; Chuck Long, 74).

K Keith Duncan kicked a career-long 49-yard field goal on Iowa's second possession. He connected on a 42-yard attempt in the third quarter. He is 6-6 on attempts 40 yards or longer this season. His miss from 39 yards was his first miss of the season. He is 10-11 on field goal attempts this season.

DE Daviyon Nixon had a career-high seven tackles and 2.5 tackles-for-loss (14 yards). He registered his first career sack (8 yards)

RB Toren Young rush for a career-high 131 yards. It is his first career 100-yard rushing game.

WR Tyrone Tracy had a career-high 85 yards receiving.

TE Shaun Beyer's 27-yard reception is a career-long.

WR Brandon Smith set career highs in receptions (6), receiving yards (71), and receiving touchdowns (2).

RB Tyler Goodson rushed for a career-high 97 yards on a career-high 12 attempts.

Three Hawkeyes scored their first career rushing touchdowns: FB Brady Ross (1), WR Ihmir Smith-Marsette (14), and QB Spencer Petras (1).

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

QB Nate Stanley passed for 260 yards, raising his career total to 6,576. He passed Matt Sherman (6,399) in today's game for sixth all-time in program history.

DB Geno Stone's interception in the second quarter was his first of the season and sixth of his career. He tied for the team lead with four interceptions in 2018.

WR Ihmir Smith-Marsette's 37-yard kickoff return was a season-long.

DE Chauncey Golston tied for the team-lead with a career-high eight tackles. LB Kristian Welch also had eight tackles. Welch has led or shared the team lead in tackles in four-of-five games this season.

WR Nico Ragaini led Iowa with a career-high six catches. His 46 yards receiving are also a career best.

RB Tyler Goodson set career highs in receptions (6) and receiving yards (62). His 62 receiving yards led the team.

On his fourth pass attempt, QB Nate Stanley threw his first interception of the season, ending his streak of 139 attempts without an interception. Stanley threw three interceptions, a career-high, and the most by a Hawkeye quarterback since C.J. Beathard threw three interceptions against Florida at the 2017 Outback Bowl.

MISCELLANEOUS

The 10 points allowed by Iowa are the fewest points allowed in a loss since falling to Iowa State, 9-6, on Sept. 8, 2012. Iowa came into the game 61-1 when holding opponents to 10 points or fewer under Kirk Ferentz.

RB Mekhi Sargent's fumble on Iowa's first play from scrimmage was the first fumble lost by a Hawkeye tailback (Goodson, Kelly-Martin, Sargent, Young) in 186 carries (at Northwestern, Nov. 10, 2018).

Michigan's 2-yard touchdown rush in the second quarter was the first rushing touchdown allowed by Iowa this season.

The Hawkeyes were held scoreless in the first quarter. It was the first time this year Iowa was held scoreless in a quarter, and the first time in 19 quarters dating back to the first quarter of the 2019 Outback Bowl.

Iowa was held out of the endzone for the first time since the 2017 Outback Bowl (L, 30-3).

Today's attendance was 111,519, the second largest crowd ever for an Iowa football game. The top five attended games are all at Michigan.
