NO. 10/9 PENN STATE RETURNS TO PITTSBURGH FOR KEYSTONE CLASSIC

No. 10/9 Penn State and Pittsburgh meet on the gridiron for the 99th time Saturday at Heinz Field for the third installment of the Keystone Classic presented by Peoples Natural Gas. The primetime tilt is set to start at 8 p.m. on ABC.

Penn State returns to Heinz Field for the first time since 2016 when the teams renewed their historic series. Pitt prevailed, fending off a Penn State rally for a 42-39 victory, but the Nittany Lions answered with a 33-14 victory last season in Beaver Stadium.

Penn State opened 2018 in thrilling fashion, rallying with less than two minutes in regulation to force overtime and eventually defeat Appalachian State. KJ Hamler, one of 17 Nittany Lions to take the field for the first time, setup the tying drive with a 52-yard kickoff return out of the end zone, and caught the game-tying touchdown to cap a drive engineered by quarterback Trace McSorley. In overtime, Miles Sanders, who was playing his first game as the featured running back, rushed four consecutive times for a total of 25 yards and the go-ahead touchdown. Amani Oruwariye then sealed the win on defense with a game-ending interception.

Pitt, which closed its 2017 season with a win over No. 2 Miami, cruised past Albany for a 33-7 win in its 2018 opener. Quarterback Kenny Pickett accounted for three scores (two passing, one rushing), and the Panthers rushed for 238 yards as a team.

This is the second of Penn State's three non-conference games. The Nittany Lions conclude the out-of-conference slate by hosting Kent State in Beaver Stadium at noon

WINNING RECORD

Penn State is one of eight teams to have a winning season each of the last 13 years, joining Florida State, Wisconsin, Oklahoma, Virginia Tech, USC, Boise State and LSU as the only teams to achieve the feat. Penn State holds the FBS record for most consecutive seasons without a losing record at 49 (1939-87). (ESPN Stats & Info)

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

A total of 424 of Penn State football student-athletes, including a program-record 35 in 2017, have earned Academic All-Big Ten honors since 1993 for owning at least a 3.0 grade point average and being a letterwinner.

ONE OF NATION'S TOUGHEST HOME VENUES

Penn State owns a superlative 286-72 (.799) record inside Beaver Stadium, the nation's second-largest facility, which opened in 1960 and has a capacity of 106,572.

LIONS IN THE NFL

33 NITTANY LIONS ON NFL OPENING WEEK ROSTERS

A total of 33 Penn State football alumni are populating the training camp rosters of 22 National Football League teams. The Nittany Lions annually are among the top 20 programs nationally in producing players in the NFL. In addition, eight former Nittany Lions are members of NFL coaching staffs and two former non-football student-athletes are on rosters.

The Miami Dolphins and Pittsburgh Steelers boast a leaguehigh three Penn Staters with 10th-year defensive end Cameron Wake, linebacker Mike Hull and rookie tight end Mike Gesicki in South Florida and tight end Jesse James, rookie safety Marcus Allen and fellow safety Malik Golden in the nearby Steel City.

Seven teams - Arizona Cardinals, Chicago Bears, New York Giants, Oakland Raiders, San Francisco 49ers, Tampa Bay Buccaneers and Tennessee Titans -- each have two PSU alums. Fourth-year safety Adrian Amos enters the Bears season following a breakout 2017 campaign and is joined by former Jaguars receiver Allen Robinson II, who is coming off an ACL injury suffered in last season's opening week. Fourteen-year vet and San Francisco All-Pro placekicker Robbie Gould is Penn State's elder statesman. In the NFC East, Pro Bowl linebacker Sean Lee returns for his ninth season with the Cowboys, while sixth-year offensive lineman Stefen Wisniewski is looking to help the Eagles defend their Super Bowl title.

A total of 10 players from Penn State's 2017 Fiesta Bowlwinning squad are on NFL rosters. In addition to Gesicki, Marcus Allen (Pittsburgh Steelers), Saquon Barkley (New York Giants), Brendan Mahon (Carolina Panthers), DaeSean Hamilton (Denver Broncos), and Troy Apke (Washington Redskins) are on active rosters, while Curtis Cothran (Minnesota Vikings), Grant Haley (New York Giants), Saeed Blacknall and Jason Cabinda (Oakland Raiders) will start the season on practice squads.

Former Penn State men's lacrosse player Chris Hogan also appeared in the most recent Super Bowl and is returning to the Patriots for his sixth season in the NFL. Additionally, former men's basketball player Ross Travis is with the Indianapolis Colts for his third NFL season, but is on injured reserve.

A total of 350 Nittany Lions have been selected all-time in the NFL Draft, which ranks seventh among Division I institutions, including 37 in the first round. The Nittany Lions have had at least three players drafted six of the last seven years. The six selections in April were the most since 2010 when six Nittany Lions were chosen.

Penn State has had at least one representative in 47 of 52 Super Bowls and 107 appearances overall, which is fifth among FBS institutions. Forty Nittany Lions have claimed 57 Super Bowl rings.

HEAD COACH JAMES FRANKLIN

CAREER AT A GLANCE

- Franklin was named the 16th head football coach in the storied history of the Nittany Lion program on January 11, 2014.
- Franklin enters his eighth year as a collegiate head coach, leading his first seven squads to a bowl game.
- Franklin is one of nine current FBS head coaches to lead his teams to a bowl game in each of his first seven seasons as a head coach. He is one of six current Autonomy 5 head coaches to accomplish the feat.
- He owns a 60-32 career record, with six consecutive winning seasons.
- Franklin has led his teams to two Top 10 finishes (2 at Penn State) and four Top 25 finishes (2 at Vanderbilt; 2 at Penn State).
- Franklin led the Nittany Lions to back-to-back New Year's Six bowls in 2016 (Rose) and 2017 (Fiesta) for the first time since 1985 (Orange) and 1986 (Fiesta).
- Franklin has 23 years of coaching experience at the collegiate and NFL level.
- In his seven years as a head coach, Franklin mentored 57 players who have gone on to the NFL ranks.
- Franklin has secured Top 25 recruiting classes each of his last six seasons, including a Top 5 class at Penn State in 2018.

NITTANY LIONS ON THE FIELD

2017 SEASON

- Penn State continued to be among the nation's elite in 2017, climbing as high as No. 2 in the rankings and appearing in a second-straight New Year's Six bowl, earning a 35-28 win over No. 11 Washington in the PlayStation Fiesta Bowl.
- The Nittany Lions earned back-to-back 11-win seasons for the fifth time in program history and first time since 2008 and 2009 with an 11-2 record.
- Penn State finished the season No. 8 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls and No. 9 in the final CFP rankings. It was the 24th Top 10 AP finish in program history.
- The Nittany Lions used a balanced attack with a highscoring offense and a stingy defense to lead FBS in scoring differential with a +24.6 margin.
- Offensively, Penn State finished seventh in FBS with a 41.1 scoring average, which is the third-highest in program history, and 19th in total offense with a 460.3 average, which also ranks third in PSU history.
- Defensively, the Nittany Lions were seventh in FBS in scoring average (16.5 ppg) and sacks (3.23 spg), while coming in 17th in total defense (329.5).
- Penn State posted back-to-back-to-back 40-sack seasons for the first time since 2005-07.
- Running back Saquon Barkley capped a stellar collegiate career by winning the Paul Hornung Award for the nation's most versatile player, three major Big Ten awards – Graham-George Big Ten Offensive Player of the Year, Ameche-Dayne Big Ten Running Back of the Year, Rodgers-Dwight Big Ten Return Specialist – and the Chicago Tribune Silver Football for the secondstraight season. Barkley is just the fifth player since 1924 to win two Silver Football honors.
- Barkley became the 100th first-team All-American in program history with Consensus All-America honors and finished fourth in the Heisman Trophy voting.

- The Nittany Lions had 18 players garner All-Big Ten accolades, including four first-team selections in Barkley (running back and return specialist), Marcus Allen and Mike Gesicki.
- Quarterback Trace McSorley, the Offensive MVP of the Playstation Fiesta Bowl, followed up his recordbreaking 2016 campaign with another outstanding season. In 2017, McSorley broke the Penn State singleseason record for completions (284), total offense (4,061), touchdowns responsible for (37), 300-yard passing games (5) and 200-yard passing games (11).
- McSorley also became the second player in Big Ten history with 25 passing touchdowns and 10 rushing scores in a season, joining Ohio State's J.T. Barrett (2014, 2017).
- Wide receiver DaeSean Hamilton ended his Penn State career as the program's career receptions leader (214) and second in school history in receiving yards (2,842).
- The Nittany Lions sent nine players to senior all-star games, which is the most since 2003 when nine student-athletes were in postseason games (Senior Bowl: Allen, Gesicki, Hamilton, Christian Campbell; East-West Shrine Bowl: Hamilton, Jason Cabinda, Curtis Cothran, Parker Cothren, Grant Haley; NFLPA Collegiate Bowl: Troy Apke).

2016 SEASON

- Penn State surged in 2016, winning nine consecutive games en route to the Big Ten Championship, a Rose Bowl berth and an 11-3 overall record.
- Penn State finished the season ranked No. 5 in the College Football Playoff rankings and No. 7 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls. It was Penn State's highest finish in the polls since 2005.
- The Lions claimed their fourth overall Big Ten Championship and first outright title since 1994 with a thrilling 38-31 comeback win over Wisconsin in the Big Ten Championship Game.
- In 2016, Franklin was honored as Sporting News National Coach of the Year and the Woody Hayes National Coach of the Year, as well as the Dave McLain Big Ten Coach of the Year and Associated Press Big Ten Coach of the Year.
- Franklin was also a finalist for the Paul "Bear" Bryant, Eddie Robinson and Associated Press National Coach of the Year awards.
- The 2016 season brought record-breaking performances from the Lions as the offense set marks for total offense (6,056), passing yards (3,650), points scored (526) and double-digit comeback wins (4).
- The Lions' +14.4 scoring improvement in 2016 ranked fourth in FBS and second among Autonomy 5 schools.
- Barkley was selected as the Graham-George Big Ten Offensive Player of the Year, Big Ten Running Back of the Year and Chicago Tribune Silver Football winner for the conference's top player.
- McSorley was named the Grange-Griffin Big Ten Championship Game MVP, as well as earning Maxwell Club Tri-State Player of the Year and All-Big Ten second team honors. He was the first Penn State quarterback to win all-conference honors since Daryll Clark in 2009.
- Not to be outdone, the Lion defense finished seventh in FBS in tackles for loss (8.1) and 19th in sacks (2.86).

2015 SEASON

- Franklin guided the Nittany Lions to a 7-6 record in 2015 and a berth in the TaxSlayer Bowl.
- Under Franklin's tutelage, Carl Nassib claimed a trio of national awards – Lombardi Award, Lott IMPACT Trophy and Ted Hendricks Award – and became Penn State's 13th unanimous Consensus All-American.
- Nassib also led the nation in sacks with a school-record 15.5 in 2015
- The 2015 season also saw Christian Hackenberg break every Penn State career passing record, including passing yards, passing touchdowns and completions, and true freshman Saquon Barkley break the freshman season rushing record with a 1,000-yard campaign.
- Barkley was named the Big Ten Network's Freshman of the Year and claimed second team All-Big Ten honors, while wide receiver Chris Godwin (second team) and defensive tackles Austin Johnson (second team) and Anthony Zettel (third team) also earned All-Big Ten accolades.

2014 SFASON

- Franklin's first season was bookended with a pair of thrilling victories for the Nittany Lions. The Penn State head coach's inaugural season began with a final-play 26-24 victory over UCF in Dublin, Ireland, in Penn State's first-ever international game and ended with a comeback, a 31-30 overtime win over Boston College in the New Era Pinstripe Bowl in Yankee Stadium. The Nittany Lions overcame a 14-point deficit late in the third quarter, tying the largest comeback in Penn State's bowl history.
- With the Pinstripe Bowl win, Franklin became just the third Penn State coach to lead
 the team to at least seven wins in his first season, joining Dick Harlow (1915) and Bill
 O'Brien (2012).
- Franklin guided the Nittany Lions to a 4-0 start, joining Harlow as the only first-year Penn State coaches to win their initial four games.
- In Franklin's first season at Penn State, he helped Mike Hull to the Butkus-Fitzgerald Big Ten Linebacker of the Year award to carry on the "Linebacker U" tradition.
- Zettel earned All-Big Ten first team honors, while receiver DaeSean Hamilton garnered All-Big Ten second team accolades after pulling in 82 catches for 899 yards.

NITTANY LIONS IN THE CLASSROOM

- The Nittany Lions had a program-record 35 student-athletes claim Academic All-Big Ten honors in the fall of 2017.
- Tyler Yazujian collected a berth on the CoSIDA Academic All-America® first team in 2016 after an appearance on the second team in 2015.
- The 2015 fall semester saw the Nittany Lions post a record 56 squad members with at least a 3.0 grade-point average (GPA), marking the fifth consecutive semester (including summer sessions) the Nittany Lions have had more than 50 student-athletes with a 3.0 GPA or better.
- The 56 Nittany Lions with a 3.0 GPA or higher surpasses the mark of 55 set by the 2008 fall semester for the most 3.0 students in a semester in football program history.
- · Additionally, 22 Nittany Lions earned Academic All-Big Ten recognition in 2015.
- A total of 23 Nittany Lions posted a 3.5 GPA or higher in the 2015 fall semester, with 19 earning Dean's List recognition for having 3.5 GPA or higher with 12 credits earned in undergraduate work.
- The Nittany Lion freshmen were impressive in the 2015 fall semester with 14 posting a 3.0 or higher.
- During Franklin's first fall semester on campus, the football student-athletes set program records with 25 student-athletes earning Dean's List recognition (3.5 GPA) and 57 players owning a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher after the 2014 fall semester.
- Additionally, 51 squad members compiled at least a 3.0 GPA in the fall of 2014, the third-highest semester total in program history.
- The spring of 2015 saw continued success in the classroom with 51 student-athletes compiling at least a 3.0 GPA, marking the first time in program history with 50 or more 3.0s in a spring semester.

NITTANY LIONS IN THE COMMUNITY

- The Nittany Lions are active in the community, participating in activities such as Uplifting Athletes, THON, Pennsylvania Special Olympics Summer Games, State College Area Food Bank and Penn State Hershey Children's Hospital visits.
- In 2017, linebacker Brandon Smith was selected to the Allstate AFCA Good Works team
 for his selflessness and community service. He was one of 11 FBS honorees in 2017
 and is the first Nittany Lion to claim the award since Ben Kline in 2015, and the fourth
 overall.
- The football team's 2,100 hours of community service in 2014-15 equated to nearly 40 percent of the 5,300 community service hours by Penn State student-athletes.
- The engaging and enthusiastic Franklin is a popular speaker and media interview subject. He was a guest analyst on ESPN's coverage from the site of college football's National Championship game, spending a day appearing on various ESPN platforms in 2013 and 2014. In 2015, Franklin joined the FOX studio crew for pregame, halftime and postgame coverage of the Big Ten Championship Game.
- In February 2015, Franklin was the lone college head coach among the speakers and panelists at the prestigious MIT Sloan Sports Analytics Conference in Boston. He was a panelist for the session, "The Formula to Win: College Football Analytics," which was moderated by ESPN reporter Rachel Nichols.





RECRUITING SUCCESS

- Franklin's recruiting classes in the last four years have been ranked an average of 15.5 nationally, which is a significant jump from the 40.8 average from 2012-14.
- Sixty-nine of the 113 signees under Franklin are from within a 250-mile radius of State College.
- Six of the 15 highest-ranked 247Sports Composite recruits at Penn State since 2000 have been signed by Franklin.
- The 2018 recruiting class was ranked No. 4 among all three major recruiting outlets
 – 247Sports, ESPN.com and Rivals. The No. 4 finish is the highest in program history.
- The 3.74 average star ranking for the 2018 class was the highest since 2010 (3.89) according to 247Sports Composite.
- Penn State signed Rivals No. 1 Pennsylvania recruit in three-straight years (2018 Micah Parsons; 2017 Lamont Wade; 2016 Miles Sanders) for the first time since 2004 (Anthony Morelli), 2005 (Justin King) and 2006 (Jared Odrick).
- With the signing of Micah Parsons, Justin Shorter and Ricky Slade, Penn State inked three 247Sports Composite 5-star recruits for the first time since rankings began in 2001.
- The Nittany Lions also signed 12 ESPN300 recruits for the first time since 2006, when ESPN rankings started.
- Parsons was the No. 5-rated recruit in the 247Sports Composite, which is the highest recruit signed by Penn State since 2005 when Derrick Williams was the No. 4 overall recruit.
- In 2017, the newest set of Nittany Lions finished in the Top 15 in the country, ranking as high as 12th by Rivals.
- The Class of 2016 at Penn State finished in the Top 20, ranking as high as 18th by ESPN, and featured a pair of five-star recruits.
- In 2016, Franklin secured the No.1 player in the state of Pennsylvania (Sanders) for the first time since Jared Odrick (2006).
- The Nittany Lions laid claim to the No. 1 running back in the state of Pennsylvania in 2015 (Saquon Barkley) and 2016 (Sanders).
- In February 2015, the Nittany Lions' highly-regarded class of 25 signees was ranked in the Top 15 nationally by the four major recruiting services.
- Franklin and his staff organized a Top 25 recruiting class in short order after being hired at Penn State in January 2014.
- While at Vanderbilt, Franklin assembled a recruiting class that finished as high as 19th in 2014.
- In each of his three seasons in Nashville, Franklin signed classes that finished in the Top 50 nationally. Prior to Franklin's arrival, the Commodores average class rank was 64.6 since 2000 (based on 247Sports composite).

HELPING THE COMMODORES GET THEIR WINGS

- Franklin directed Vanderbilt to consecutive Top 25 finishes for the first time in the 124-year history of the program (No. 23/24 2013 & No. 23/20 2012).
- The Commodores finished 23rd in the final 2012 Associated Press poll, marking their first AP final ranking since 1948.
- Franklin's 24 wins tied Dan McGugin for the most by a Vanderbilt coach in his first three seasons.
- Franklin led Vanderbilt to a bowl game in each of his three seasons in Nashville, with the last two years resulting in wins over NC State (Music City Bowl) and Houston (BBVA Compass Bowl). The Commodores had played in four bowl games all-time in the 121 seasons prior to his arrival, none in consecutive years.
- Vanderbilt had posted four nine-win seasons in program history, with Franklin's last two teams comprising half of the total.
- Over the last 20 games during the 2012-13 seasons, the Commodores' 16-4 record was second-best in the SEC to Alabama's 17-3 mark.
- Franklin guided the Commodores to a 6-6 regular-season record and earned a berth in the Liberty Bowl during his first season after inheriting a Vanderbilt team that finished 2-10 in both 2009 and 2010, with a combined mark of 1-15 SEC play.
- The 2011 bowl berth was Vanderbilt's second since 1983 and running back Zac Stacy broke the Commodores' season record with 1,193 rushing yards.

6 2018 PENN STATE FOOTBALL

- The Commodores had a breakthrough campaign in 2012 under Franklin, finishing on a seven-game winning streak (longest since 1948) to post a 9-4 mark, Vanderbilt's most wins in 97 years, and a berth in the Music City Bowl, in which VU defeated NC State. 38-24.
- A victory at Missouri sparked an 8-1 finish, which included three consecutive SEC road wins for the first time in program history.
- The Commodores were 5-3 in SEC play, winning five SEC games for the first time since 1935, and posted two shutouts for the first time since 1968.
- Franklin was among five finalists for the Bear Bryant National Coach of the Year award in 2012.
- Stacy became the first player in Vanderbilt history to rush for 1,000 yards in consecutive seasons, gaining 1,141 yards to finish his career with a school-record 3,143 yards and 30 rushing touchdowns.
- Wide receiver Jordan Matthews broke the Vanderbilt season receiving record with 1,363 yards on 94 catches.
- Vanderbilt continued its historic rise under Franklin during the 2013 season, capping a school-record second consecutive 9-4 campaign with a 41-24 win over Houston in the BBVA Compass Bowl.
- The Commodores defeated Florida, Georgia and Tennessee in the same season for the first time in program history, winning in Gainesville and Knoxville.
- Franklin helped Matthews develop into a two-time All-American and the SEC's career leader in receptions (262) and receiving yardage (3,759). Matthews broke the SEC season record with 112 receptions for 1,477 yards and seven touchdowns in 2013, becoming the first SEC receiver to make 100 catches in a season.

RISING UP THE RANKS

- Franklin began his coaching career as the wide receivers coach at Kutztown (Pa.) University (1995) and was a graduate assistant coach at his alma mater, East Stroudsburg (Pa.) University in 1996, working with the secondary.
- He then was the wide receivers coach at James Madison (1997), a graduate assistant (tight ends) at Washington State in 1998 and the wide receivers coach at Idaho State (1999).
- In 2000, Franklin was named the wide receivers coach at Maryland under head coach Ron Vanderlinden, who would go on to coach the Penn State linebackers from 2001-13.
- Franklin continued in that role under new head coach Ralph Friedgen in 2002 and '03
 and helped the Terps to three consecutive 10-win seasons, including an appearance in
 the 2002 FedEx Orange Bowl. In 2003, Franklin added duties as recruiting coordinator
 and directed back-to-back recruiting classes ranked in the Top 25 nationally. Franklin
 and former Nittany Lion head coach Bill O'Brien (running backs) were Maryland
 assistant coaches in 2003 and '04 under Friedgen.
- After five successful years at Maryland, Franklin was named wide receivers coach on Mike Sherman's Green Bay Packers staff in 2005. During that season, Green Bay ranked third in the NFL in receptions (383) and seventh in receiving yards (3,766). Donald Driver was among the top receivers in the NFL, ranking second in receptions and eighth in receiving yards, with a then-career-high 86 catches for 1,221 yards.

- Franklin served as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Kansas State
 during the 2006-07 seasons under head coach Ron Prince. In 2006, he helped the
 Wildcats to their first winning season in four years. Franklin coached quarterback Josh
 Freeman and oversaw an offense that produced a 3,000-yard passer (Freeman), 1,500yard receiver (All-American wide receiver Jordy Nelson) and 1,000-yard rusher (James
 Johnson) during the 2007 season, a first in school history. Freeman would go on to
 become the Wildcats' highest NFL offensive draft pick since 1954 when the Tampa Bay
 Buccaneers selected him 17th overall in the 2009 NFL Draft.
- Franklin returned to Maryland in 2008 as the Terps' assistant head coach and offensive coordinator. He helped the Terrapins to victories in the 2008 Humanitarian Bowl and the 2010 Military Bowl. The 2010 squad was among the national leaders in scoring offense at 32.2 points per game and was led by ACC Rookie of the Year quarterback Danny O'Brien. He threw for 2,438 yards, 22 touchdowns and only eight interceptions in 2010, with All-ACC receiver Torrey Smith making 67 catches for 1,055 yards and 12 scores.
- In 1998, Franklin began his participation in the NFL's Minority Coaching Fellowship Program, starting with a stint with the Miami Dolphins and working with Hall of Fame quarterback Dan Marino. Franklin also worked with Donovan McNabb of the Philadelphia Eagles (1999) and Minnesota Vikings (2008) in the NFL program.

PLAYING CAREER

- Franklin was a four-year letterman at quarterback and a two-time All-PSAC selection at East Stroudsburg.
- Franklin graduated having broken or tied 23 school records.
- He set seven school records as a senior to earn team MVP honors and was a Harlon Hill Trophy nominee as the NCAA Division II Player of the Year.
- Among the season records he set were for total offense (3,128 yards), passing yards (2,586) and touchdown passes (19).
- Franklin was inducted into the East Stroudsburg Athletics Hall of Fame October 15, 2016.

PERSONAL

- Franklin graduated from East Stroudsburg (Pa.) University in 1995 with a degree in psychology and earned a master's degree in educational leadership from Washington State University.
- Franklin graduated from Neshaminy High School in Langhorne.
- Franklin and his wife, Fumi, have two daughters, Shola and Addison.

LEADERSHIP



TEAM CAPTAINS ELECTED

- Seniors Trace McSorley and Nick Scott and junior Blake Gillikin have been voted as team captains for the 2018 season by their teammates.
- McSorley and Scott are team captains for the second-straight season.
- Gillikin is coming off a season in which he garnered secondteam All-Big Ten accolades from the coaches and media. He also took home second-team all-conference honors from the Associated Press and was honorable-mention All-America by GPR Punt Ratings. He finished 35th in FBS with a 43.2 punting average and was fourth in FBS in coffin wedge average (89.84) according to GPR Punt Rating. Gillikin also excelled in the classroom, earning CoSIDA Academic All-District and Academic All-Big Ten honors while maintaining a 4.0 cumulative grade-point average.
- McSorley, who was a captain in 2017, enters his final season in the Blue & White having thrown a touchdown pass in 28-straight games, the longest active streak in FBS. He holds the Penn State career records for completion percentage (61.8), passing efficiency (152.9), passing touchdowns (59), total offense (8,268). He also owns the Penn State season marks for passing yards (3,614; 2016), completions (284; 2017), passing touchdowns (29; 2016), total offense (4,061; 2017), 300-yard passing games (5; 2016 and 2017), 200yard passing games (11; 2016 and 2017) and touchdowns responsible for (37; 2017). In 2017, McSorley became just the second player in Big Ten history to have 25 passing touchdowns and 10 rushing scores in the same season, joining Ohio State's J.T. Barrett (2014 and 2017). McSorley earned his second consecutive berth on the All-Big Ten second team as selected by the coaches and media last season. McSorley was a finalist for the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award and Manning Award.
- Scott, who was a captain last season, had 33 tackles, including 1.5 tackles for loss. He scooped up a fumble against Indiana, which was forced by Irvin Charles on Hooiser punt return, and took it 13 yards for his second career touchdown. He previously had a rushing touchdown against Army in 2015. A leader on special teams, Scott finished third on the team with nine tackles on special teams with eight coming on kickoffs and one on punt coverage in 2017.



LEADERSHIP COUNCIL ANNOUNCED

- The Leadership Council, which is comprised of 13 seniors, five juniors, three sophomores and three redshirt freshmen (24 total), serves as the voice for the team in the decision-making process.
- This year's Leadership Council members are: seniors Mark Allen, Torrence Brown, Jake Cooper, Koa Farmer, Trace McSorley, Amani Oruwariye, Nick Scott, Charlie Shuman, Johnathan Thomas, DeAndre Thompkins, Kyle Vasey, Jason Vranic and Chasz Wright; juniors Ryan Bates, Blake Gillikin, Juwan Johnson, John Reid and Tommy Stevens; sophomores Tariq Castro-Fields, Will Fries and Michal Menet; and freshmen Sean Clifford, Jonathan Sutherland and C.J. Thorpe.
- This group is not only charged with leading the team, but the expectation is to also uphold the program's four core values: positive attitude, great work ethic, competitive in everything and must be willing to sacrifice. The Leadership Council meets at least twice a month in Franklin's office and has a profound impact on the chemistry and culture of the entire organization.

SERIES NOTES

HEAD COACH PAT NARDUZZI

- Pat Narduzzi guided Pitt to back-to-back 8-5 seasons in his first two years at the helm, earning trips to the Military Bowl (2015) and Pinstripe Bowl (2016), and led Pitt to a victory over nationally-ranked Miami in the 2017 season finale.
- Narduzzi arrived at Pitt following eight years as the defensive coordinator at Michigan State. Under his direction, the Spartans were the only team to rank in the nation's top 10 in total defense and rushing defense each season from 2011-14.
- In 2013, Narduzzi was named the recipient of the prestigious Broyles Award, annually presented to the country's top assistant coach.
- Prior to Michigan State, notable stops for Narduzzi included three years (2004-06) as defensive coordinator under Mike Dantonio at Cincinnati and one year as the defensive coordinator at Miami (Ohio).
- Narduzzi was a starting linebacker under his father, the late Bill Narduzzi, as a freshman at Youngstown State University in 1985 before transferring to Rhode Island, where he became a three-year starter for the Rams from 1987-89.

SCOUTING THE PANTHERS

- Pitt opened 2018 with a win, prevailing in overtime over FCS-level Albany, 33-7.
- The Panthers are coming off a 5-7 season in which they upset No. 2 Miami, 24-14, in the regular season finale. They also gave eventual National Champion Clemson its only loss in 2016.
- Sophomore quarterback Kenny Pickett is a threat through the air and with his feet and is set to make his third career start. His first was in the win over No.
 Miami last season in which he went 18-for-29 for 193 yards while rushing 13 times for 60 yards. Against Albany this season, he completed 16-of-22 passes for 154 yards and two touchdowns with an interception. He also rushed six times for 42 yards and a touchdown.
- Seven Pitt ball carriers ran the ball 37 times for 238 yards against Albany.
- Pitt's defense returns nine starters from 2017, including more than 80 percent of last season's tackle, tackle for loss and sack production.
- Pitt was voted by the media to place fifth this season in the ACC's Coastal Division.

SERIES RECORD

The Nittany Lions have met the Panthers more than any other opponent - 98 times - with Penn State owning a 51-43-4 series advantage. The teams first met in 1893 and played every season from 1900-31 and 1935-92, often in a compelling final game of the regular season. The teams did not meet from 1993-96, when Penn State began play in the Big Ten Conference, and then played a four-game series from 1997-2000, with the Nittany Lions winning the 1997-99 contests. They began another four-year series in 2016. Penn State is 28-36-4 playing at Pitt.

LAST MEETING

NO. 4 PENN STATE TOPS PITT

No. 4 Penn State dominated the field position battle with strong defense and special teams and Saquon Barkley and Mike Gesicki scored a pair of touchdowns each in a 33-14 victory over Pittsburgh.

The Nittany Lions led from their first score to the end, never allowing Pittsburgh within single digits after building a 14-0 lead in the first quarter. Penn State was also aided by its eighth-largest crowd ever and the largest since 2009, as 109,898 packed Beaver Stadium.

Penn State's average drive start was at its own 37, while Pittsburgh's average drive start was inside its own 18, and the Nittany Lions took advantage with four touchdowns and a safety, while Pittsburgh reached the end zone just once despite a pair of 15-play drives. Safety Marcus Allen made the safety stop and led the Lions with 12 tackles.

Penn State could not have asked for a better start, intercepting Pittsburgh's fourth play from scrimmage on defense and scoring on the ensuing offensive possession with a touchdown reception by tight end Mike Gesicki. Quarterback Trace McSorley engineered a six-play, 62-yard touchdown drive later in the quarter for a 14-0 lead. McSorley broke free for a career-long 36-yard run on third-and-2 to key the drive and later found Gesicki again with 5:20 remaining in the quarter. Pitt put together a pair of 15-play drives in the second quarter, but only mustered a field goal to go into halftime trailing 14-3.

McSorley found Saquon Barkley over the middle for a 46-yard touchdown reception and 21-3 lead early in the third quarter. Pittsburgh answered with a nine-play, 59-yard field goal drive, but Barkley found the end zone from 8 yards out on the first play of the fourth quarter.

Pittsburgh answered the Barkley score with its first touchdown, but 28-14 was as close as Pittsburgh would come. Penn State added a safety and field goal for the final margin.

PITT NOTES

NITTANY LIONS & PANTHERS CONTINUE KEYSTONE CLASSIC

- Penn State and Pitt are set for the third game of a four-game home-and-home series dubbed the Keystone Classic presented by Peoples Natural Gas.
- The intrastate series resumed in 2016 at Pitt after a 16-year hiatus, with the Panthers hanging on to win, 42-39. Pitt returned to Beaver Stadium in 2017 for the first time in 18 years, with the Nittany Lions earning a 33-14 victory.
- Penn State is playing on the road for the 69th time in the 99-game series. Just 24 meetings have been in Happy Valley, while six were at neutral sites.
- The series concludes Sept. 14, 2019 at Beaver Stadium.

VERSUS PENNSYLVANIA SCHOOLS

- Against the two other current FBS schools, Pitt (51-43-4) and Temple (40-4-1), Penn State owns a combined 91-47-5 record.
- The 91 wins account for 10.4 percent of Penn State's 879 all-time wins.
- Penn State owns a 168-95-12 record all-time against current NCAA Division I teams in Pennsylvania.
- That figure includes current FCS teams Bucknell (28-10-0), Lafayette (10-5-1), Lehigh (16-6-1), Penn (18-25-4) and Villanova (5-3-1). However, Penn State has not played any of those teams since playing Penn in 1958.
- Penn State's next scheduled in-state games following the 2019 game versus Pitt are against Villanova (2021) and Temple (2026 and '27).

PENN STATE VS. ACC

- Penn State is 151-87-10 all-time against the schools who are current members of the Atlantic Coast Conference, having played every ACC school except Duke and Virginia Tech.
- Penn State is scheduled to play Virginia Tech in 2020 (away) and 2025 (home).

HISTORIC SERIES

- Penn State has many long and storied series on the gridiron. The Nittany Lions have played 20 teams 20 or more times in the 132-year history of the program.
- Penn State owns a winning record against 16 of the 20 teams that it has met 20 or more times.
- Nine of the 20 teams are on the 2018 schedule, including Pitt (98 meetings), lowa (27), Illinois (23), Indiana (21), Michigan (21), Ohio State (33), Michigan State (32) Rutgers (27) and Maryland (40).
- Since 2012, Penn State has played or has a future meeting scheduled meeting with 13 of the 20 teams (all of the FBS teams except Navy). Those opponents include: Army (2015), Illinois (2014-15, '18, '21), Iowa (2016-21), Pitt (2016-19), Syracuse (2012), Temple (2014-16) and West Virginia (2023-24), while the Lions will meet yearly with Big Ten East Division opponents Indiana, Maryland, Michigan, Michigan State, Ohio State and Rutgers.
- Fifteen of the 20 programs are currently members of NCAA Division I FBS. Bucknell, Lehigh and Penn are in NCAA Division I FCS, while Gettysburg and Lebanon Valley are Division III programs.

- Pitt head coach Pat Narduzzi faced Penn State as Michigan State's defensive coordinator from 2007-14.
- Pitt offensive coordinator Shawn Watson has 12 years coaching experience at current Big Ten schools. He served as a position coach at Illinois (1983-86) and Northwestern (1997-98), a tight ends coach (2006) and offensive coordinator at Nebraska (2007-10) and assisted Indiana in 2016 for their bowl game.

LIONS UNDER THE LIGHTS

- The 2018 season marks the 18th straight with at least one regular-season night game on the schedule, and the 10th since 2000 with multiple night games in the same season.
- Two of Penn State's first four games of the season will be played at night, starting with an 8 p.m. kick at Pittsburgh on ABC, while the Week 4 game at Illinois will kick at 9 p.m. Friday on FS1.
- After defeating Michigan in Week 8 of 2017, Penn State has won its last seven night games, including a 4-0 mark last season, and eight of their last nine dating back to 2015.
- Penn State is 49-30 at night all-time. The figure breaks down to 14-9 at home, 23-14 on the road and 12-7 in neutral site games. Penn State is 1-1 at regular season neutral sites, 11-6 in bowl games and 1-0 in conference championship games.
- The Lions' night games since 2000 include: Michigan, lowa and Georgia State (2017); Ohio State, lowa, Rutgers and Wisconsin (2016); Ohio State and Rutgers (2015); Boston College (Pinstripe Bowl), Ohio State, Michigan and Rutgers (2014); Ohio State, Michigan and UCF (2013); Iowa and Ohio State (2012); Northwestern (2011); Alabama, Iowa and Michigan (2010); Iowa (2009); Illinois, Wisconsin and Ohio State (2008); Notre Dame, Ohio State and Texas A&M (2007), Michigan (2006), Illinois, Ohio State and Florida State (2005), Minnesota and Boston College (2004), Nebraska (2002 and 2003), Miami (Fla.) (2001) and Indiana (2000).
- On Oct. 12, 2013, the Lions claimed the longest game in Big Ten history when they edged Michigan under the lights, 43-40, in four overtimes in front of a sellout Beaver Stadium crowd of 107.844 on Homecoming.

TAKING ON THE NEIGHBORS

- For the fifth consecutive year, Penn State is playing at least four FBS teams that are within a 250-mile drive (based on Google Maps from stadium to stadium).
- Penn State went 4-0 against its neighbors last season.
- The only nearby FBS team Penn State has not played since 2012 is West Virginia, but the Mountaineers are on Penn State's schedule in 2023 and 2024.
- Since joining the Big Ten in 1993, Penn State is 43-4 against FBS teams within 250 miles.
- All-time, Penn State is 289-111-17 against its current FBS regional foes.

BLACKLEDGE ON ABC BROADCAST TEAM

- Former Penn State quarterback Todd Blackledge will be calling Saturday's meeting between the Nittany Lions and Panthers.
- Blackledge led Penn State to an 11-1 record and its first National Championship with a 27-23 victory over previously unbeaten Georgia in the 1983 Sugar Bowl. He earned the Davey O'Brien Award as the nation's top quarterback in 1982, was sixth in balloting for the Heisman Trophy and concluded his collegiate career with 26 school records.
- A three-year starter, Blackledge directed the Nittany Lions to a 29-4 record, including 13 comeback victories, from 1980-82, including two Fiesta Bowl wins and one Sugar Bowl victory.
- Blackledge began his national broadcasting career in 1994 with ABC Sports, serving as a studio and game analyst. He then served as a game analyst for ESPN (1997-98) before joining CBS in 1999. He returned to ESPN/ABC in 2006.
- Blackledge received the University's prestigious Distinguished Alumni Award in 2009.
- Blackledge earned a B.A. in speech communication in 1983, graduating Phi Beta Kappa with a 3.80 grade point average. A first-team Academic All-American, he also was presented the Eric Walker Award, given to the Penn State senior who has most "enhanced the esteem and recognition of the University." In 1997, Blackledge was inducted into the prestigious Academic All-America Hall of Fame

OVERTIME OVER TIME

- College football introduced overtime during the bowl season in 1995 and adopted it for regular season games in 1996.
- Since then, Penn State has played 13 overtime games, including six over the 2012-14 seasons. Nine of the 13 overtime tilts have come at home, two in true road games, one in the 2006 Orange Bowl and one in the 2014 Pinstripe Bowl.
- Penn State is 8-5 all-time in overtime games, with a 5-4 record at Beaver Stadium, 1-1 mark in true road games and 2-0 ledger at a neutral site.
- Penn State has won three-straight overtime games under James Franklin. It's the longest streak of overtime wins since winning five-straight from 2006 to 2013
- Most recently, Penn State went into overtime in a season opener for the first time, opening the 2018 season with a 45-38 OT-win over Appalachian State.
 Miles Sanders rushed four times for 25 yards and a touchdown to open the bonus period, and then Amani Oruwariye intercepted an App State pass on first down from the 15 in the end zone.
- It was the seventh overtime game at Beaver Stadium since the start of the 2012 season. Penn State is 5-2 in those games.
- The 2018 overtime game was the first since Penn State defeated Minnesota, 29-26, on Oct. 1, 2016. After Minnesota kicked a field goal on its first possession, Penn State running back Saquon Barkley rushed 25 yards for a touchdown on the Nittany Lions first offensive play.
- Penn State's first two overtime contests came vs. Iowa in 2000 and 2002 at home. The Nittany Lions dropped their first three contests that went to the extra period, but won five straight overtime contests before falling to Nebraska on Nov. 23, 2013.

NITTANY LIONS IN NFL VENUES

- Penn State returns to Heinz Field, also home of the NFL's Pittsburgh Steelers, for the first time since 2016 and the second time overall.
- It is Penn State's first regular season game in an NFL venue since the Pitt game in 2016.
- Penn State last played in an NFL stadium during the 2017 Fiesta Bowl, defeating Washington in University of Phoenix Stadium, home of the Arizona Cardinals.
- Penn State has played games in 11 current NFL venues. In addition to the aforementioned venues, Penn State has played in the current homes of the Baltimore Ravens (M&T Bank Stadium), Indianapolis Colts (Lucas Oil Stadium), Jacksonville Jaguars (EverBank Field), Miami Dolphins (Sun Life Stadium), New Orleans Saints (Mercedes-Benz Superdome), New York Giants/New York Jets (MetLife Stadium), Philadelphia Eagles (Lincoln Financial Field), Tampa Bay Buccaneers (Raymond James Stadium) and Washington Redskins (FedEx Field).
- The Lions have played 39 regular season games in 13 different stadiums with permanent NFL tenants.
- The Lions have played 21 bowl games in 11 different venues that housed NFL teams at the time, posting a 13-8 record.

STREAKING

- With a win over Appalachian State in the 2018 season opener, Penn State extended its home winning streak to 15 games, tied for sixth-longest in the school annals. It is the longest home winning streak since a 21-game streak from 1970-74.
- The Nittany Lions have scored 20 or more points in 24 consecutive games, which is the longest streak in program history, breaking the record of 20-straight games from 1993-95. It is also the third-longest streak in Big Ten history behind the 25-game streak by Michigan State (2013-15) and 46-game streak by Ohio State (2006-14).
- QB Trace McSorley has thrown a touchdown pass in 29 consecutive games, dating to the 2016 TaxSlayer Bowl, extending his school record. It is the longest active streak in FBS.
- Penn State has rushed for 200 yards in four consecutive games, dating back to last season's Nebraska game on November 18, 2018.

TOP 10 AGAIN

- After a pair of back-to-back 11-win seasons, Penn State starts the 2018 ranked No. 9 in the Amway Coaches Poll and No. 10 in the Associated Press poll.
- This is the second-straight season the Nittany Lions have started the year in the Top 10.
- The Nittany Lions ended the 2017 season 11-2 with a 35-28 win over No. 11 Washington in the PlayStation Fiesta Bowl. Penn State finished No. 8 in both polls, marking the second-straight season with a Top 10 finish for the first time since 2008 and 2009.
- Penn State was No. 9 in the final College Football Playoff rankings.
- The 11-win season was its 16th overall and seventh since joining the Big Ten.
- The Nittany Lions finished in the Top 10 of the Amway Coaches poll for the ninth time in program history.

HOME IN HAPPY VALLEY

- · Penn State's 15-game home win streak is the thirdlongest active streak in FBS.
- · Penn State completed its 2017 home schedule with a second consecutive perfect 7-0 record. It is the first time the Lions have posted back-to-back undefeated home seasons since 1985 (6-0) and 1986 (7-0).
- The Nittany Lions have gone 7-0 at home six times in the Big Ten era (1994, 1998, 2005, 2008, 2016, 2017).
- · Dating back to 2015, Penn State has won 21 of its last 22 home games.

THIRTY-NINE 2017 LETTERWINNERS RETURN

- Penn State returns 39 lettermen from last year's Fiesta Bowl championship squad - 21 on offense, 16 on defense and two on special teams.
- A total of 41 lettermen are returning for the Nittany Lions. In addition to the 39 lettermen returning from 2017, Mark Allen (2015) and CB John Reid (2015 & 2016) also have letterman status
- Of the 41 overall lettermen returning, 23 have starting experience - 11 on offense, 10 on defense and two on special teams.
- The Nittany Lions lost the services of 22 lettermen nine on offense, 11 on defense and two specialists.

THIRTEEN STARTERS RETURNING

- The Nittany Lions return 13 starters eight on offense, three on defense and two on special teams.
- Ten additional Penn Staters have starting experience three on offense and seven on defense.
- Among the returning starters are 2017 All-Big Ten second team selections Trace McSorley and Blake Gillikin, as well as third-team All-Big Ten honorees Ryan Bates and Shareef Miller.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

- Penn State and many Big Ten teams are among the youngest in FBS.
- Underclassmen comprise 65.6 percent of Penn State's roster, which ranks as the 20th highest figure in FBS.
- However, the figure only ranks seventh in the Big Ten. Illinois (76.5), Minnesota (69.9), Wisconsin (68.6), Indiana (66.4), Nebraska (66.2) and Iowa (66.1) all have higher percentages of underclassmen on their roster.

FANS FLOCK TO BEAVER STADIUM

- The Penn State Student Section sold out more than 21,000 tickets in just 48 minutes, highlighted by the sold-out allotments of the senior (3), junior (4), sophomore (6) and freshmen (9) classes in less than 10 minutes each.
- The Penn State Student Section has consistently sold out for four decades, showing the unwavering passion and dedication of Penn State students.
- Penn State has sold more than 6,300 new season football tickets for the 2018 campaign.
- The Penn State football team averaged 106,707 fans per game in the 2017 season to rank third in the NCAA in attendance.
- The increase of 6,450 fans per game ranked fifth in the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS).
- Penn State's 106,707 average attendance is the highest for the program since 2009 when the Nittany Lions had 107,008 fans come through gates on average.
- The No. 3 national ranking is the highest since the 2010 season when Penn State also finished third in FBS with an average home attendance of 104,234.
- Additionally, the increase of 6,450 fans per game is the highest since a 10,642-average jump in 2001 when the stadium capacity increased by more than 12,000 seats to 107,282.
- Recognized as one the nation's premier game day atmospheres, the passionate and loyal students, alumni and fans filling Beaver Stadium have Penn State bucking the attendance trends among FBS games nationally, which saw an average per game decline of 1,409 fans this past season.
- The 2017 season saw the largest home crowd in Penn State history as a record-breaking 110,823 fans filled the stadium in a 42-13 victory over No. 19/15 Michigan on Oct. 21.

NITTANY LIONS CLAIM "HERBIES"

- ESPN analyst Kirk Herbstreit held the Nittany Lions in high esteem in his annual preseason "Herbie Awards" show
- Herbstreit tabbed two Penn State quarterbacks for awards. He selected Trace McSorley as the "Most Exciting Player" in college football and fellow signal caller Tommy Stevens as the "Most Unselfish" player in college football.
- Penn State's incredible fans also got in the action, as Herbie recognized the Penn State White Out as the "Best Atmosphere" in college football, while the student section was recognized as the best in college football, as well.
- Herbstreit also picked the Lions to win the Big Ten Championship and reach the College Football Playoff.

ON TV

- Penn State has had 294 of its last 296 games televised, including 187 consecutive games.
- Over the last 14 seasons, every Penn State game has aired on either ABC, FOX, BTN, NBC or an ESPN channel.

FUTURE SCHEDULES ANNOUNCED

- Penn State and Temple are set to renew their football series, with two games among several non-conference contests the Nittany Lions have set from 2021-27.
- The Nittany Lions visit Temple on Sept. 12, 2026 and host the Owls on Sept. 18, 2027. The teams last met in 2016, a 34-27 Penn State win, and have played 45 times. From 2006-16, the teams played every year except 2013.
- Penn State welcomes two more regional foes to Beaver Stadium in upcoming seasons. Villanova visits State College on Sept. 25, 2021 and Sept. 13, 2025 and Delaware travels to Happy Valley on Sept. 9, 2023 and Sept. 11, 2027. The Nittany Lions lead the series with the Wildcats, 5-3-1, with the teams last playing in 1951. Penn State and Delaware will be meeting for the first time.
- Delaware has played in four FCS National Championship games, winning the 2003 title. Villanova won the 2009 FCS national title.
- Penn State hosts Central Michigan on Sept. 24, 2022 in the second meeting between the schools. The Nittany Lions won the only previous contest in 2005.
- Penn State's 2021 schedule is complete. The Nittany Lions open the 2021 season at Wisconsin (Sept. 4), and host Ball State (Sept. 11), Auburn (Sept. 18) and Villanova (Sept. 25) during non-conference play, resuming Big Ten action at lowa Oct. 9.
- The first-ever meeting with Virginia Tech in 2020 is amongst several marquee non-conference match-ups for the Nittany Lions from 2016-25, in addition to the nine-game Big Ten schedule:
- Penn State hosts Pitt on Sept. 14, 2019 in the 100thalltime meeting;
- Penn State and Virginia Tech meet for the first time in 2020 (away) and 2025 (home);
- The Nittany Lions and Auburn play for the third and fourth time overall, but the first time in the regular season, in 2021 (home) and 2022 (away). Penn State posted a 43-14 win over the Tigers in the 1996 Outback Bowl and Auburn earned a 13-9 victory in the 2003 Capital One Bowl.
- Penn State and West Virginia clash for the first time since 1992 and the 60th time overall in 2023 (home), with a 2024 contest in Morgantown.
- The Big Ten announced its conference football schedules for 2022 through 2025. Penn State hosts five conference games in 2022 and 2024 and welcomes four BIG opponents in 2023 and 2025.
- The 2022 Big Ten schedule opens Sept. 3 at Purdue, followed by a home game against Ohio State (Oct. 1) and a road trip to Michigan (Oct. 8). The Nittany Lions return to Beaver Stadium for game against Illinois (Oct. 15) and Michigan State (Oct. 29), sandwiched around the bye week. After traveling to Indiana Nov. 5, Penn State rounds out its 2022 Big Ten schedule against Maryland (Nov. 12), Minnesota (Nov. 19) and at Rutgers (Nov. 26).
- In 2023, Penn State plays its first two conference games on the road at Illinois (Sept. 16) and Northwestern (Sept. 23). The Nittany Lions return to Beaver Stadium to meet Indiana (Oct. 7) before a trip to Michigan State (Oct. 14) and Ohio State (Oct. 21). Penn State has a three-game homestand against lowa (Oct. 28), Michigan (Nov. 4) and Rutgers (Nov. 18) before closing out the season at Maryland (Nov. 25).
- Penn State opens the 2024 Big Ten slate at Rutgers (Sept. 14). After a two-week hiatus, the Lions return to BIG play at home against Maryland (Oct. 5) and Illinois (Oct. 12), before heading to Wisconsin (Oct. 19). Penn State is back in Beaver Stadium to face Nebraska (Oct. 26) and Ohio State (Nov. 9) sandwiched around a bye week. The remainder of the 2024 Big Ten schedule is at Michigan (Nov. 16), at Indiana (Nov. 23) and the home finale against Michigan State (Nov. 30).
- The 2025 Big Ten schedule opens against Rutgers Sept. 20, followed by visit to Illinois (Sept. 27). After a home game against Purdue (Oct. 11), the Nittany Lions head on back-to-back road trips to Maryland (Oct. 18) and Minnesota (Oct. 25). Penn State is home against Indiana (Nov. 1) before visiting Ohio State (Nov. 15). Rounding out the 2025 conference slate is a home game against Michigan (Nov. 22) and at Michigan State (Nov. 29).

CONTINUING ACADEMIC TRADITION

- Punter Blake Gillikin leads the Nittany Lions in the classroom with a perfect cumulative 4.0 grade point average following the 2018 spring semester.
- Gillikin claimed the Evan Pugh Scholar Award, given to those juniors and seniors who are in the upper 0.5 percent of their respective classes, in May 2018.
- Gillikin was presented with the President's Freshman Award, given annually to undergraduate degree candidates who have earned a 4.0 cumulative gradepoint average based on at least 12 graded Penn State credits completed in their first semester of admission, in May 2017.
- Gillikin also serves as the treasurer for Penn State's Uplifting Athletes, helping the chapter raise nearly \$1.3 million for kidney cancer treatment and research since the first Penn State Lift for Life was held in 2003.
- Gillikin led a quartet of Nittany Lion football players earning Big Ten Distinguished Scholar recognition for having a 3.7 or higher GPA for the 2017-18 academic year. He was joined by Charlie Shuman, Christopher Welde and Jake Zembiec.
- Those four were among a Penn State-record 35 football student-athletes to earn All-Big Ten Academic honors following the 2017 fall semester.
- The football team's success in the classroom also contributed to an overall school record for fall Academic All-Big Ten honorees. Penn State tallied 117 fall honorees, shattering the previous fall mark of 100 set during the 2012-13 academic year.
- Gillikin and graduate Cody Hodgens both posted 4.0 GPAs, making the Nittany Lions the only Big Ten football team with two 4.0 students.

COACHING STAFF CHANGES

- The Nittany Lion coaching staff has a new look with the addition of a 10th assistant coach, as well as a few off-season changes.
- Penn State assistant coach Ricky Rahne was promoted to offensive coordinator. He will return to coaching the quarterbacks after spending the last two seasons as the tight ends coach.
- The Nittany Lions added former Penn State graduate assistant Tyler Bowen as offensive recruiting coordinator and tight ends coach, David Corley as wide receivers coach, Phil Galiano as special teams coordinator and assistant defensive line coach and Ja'Juan Seider as running backs coach.
- In addition, Sean Spencer added associate head coach to his title, while offensive line coach Matt Limegrover will handle run game coordinator responsibilities.
- Following his stint as a GA at Penn State, Bowen spent two seasons at Fordham as the offensive line coach (2015-16) and offensive coordinator (2016) and one season at Maryland as the offensive line coach (2017).
- Corley has 10 years of collegiate coaching experience and was most recently the wide receivers coach at Army after spending three seasons at Connecticut.
- Galiano is a veteran in the coaching ranks with 17 years of experience, including two seasons as an assistant special teams coach and one season as a special teams intern in the NFL.
- Galiano served as a defensive consultant for the Nittany Lions in 2017.
- Seider comes to Happy Valley with 10 seasons of collegiate coaching experience, most recently serving as the running backs coach at the University of Florida.

- Senior quarterback Trace McSorley is listed on six major preseason watch lists.
- McSorley is a nominee for the Maxwell Award (National Player of the Year), Walter Camp Award (National Player of the Year), Davey O'Brien Award (nation's top quarterback), Manning Award (nation's top quarterback), Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award (nation's top quarterback) and Wuerffel Trophy (College Football's Premier Award for Community Service).
- The Maxwell Award, named in honor of Robert W.
 "Tiny" Maxwell, has been given to America's College
 Player of the Year since 1937. Maxwell's contributions
 to the game of football were extensive, including time
 as a player, a sportswriter and an official.
- Penn State is tied for the national lead among all schools with its seven Maxwell Award winners.
- The Walter Camp Trophy is awarded to the outstanding player of the year who has exemplified the qualities of self-discipline, unselfish team play, desire to excel, mature judgement and respect for leadership. He must be a dedicated competitor who has made effective use of his athletic talent to enhance the great American game of college football. His standout performance on the playing field must be accompanied by an equally strong effort to contribute to the betterment of the life of all his fellow human beings. He must exhibit an awareness of the need to fulfill his role as a leader. He must espouse the ideals adhered to by Walter Camp, the "Father of American Football."
- Penn State has two Walter Camp winners in John Cappelletti, who won the award in 1973, and Larry Johnson, who claimed the honor in 2002.
- The Davey O'Brien National Quarterback Award is presented annually to the nation's best college quarterback and is the oldest and most prestigious national quarterback award. The Davey O'Brien Award honors candidates who exemplify Davey O'Brien's enduring character while exhibiting teamwork, sportsmanship and leadership in both academics and athletics.
- Todd Blackledge (1982) and Kerry Collins (1994) are the Nittany Lions that have claimed the Davey O'Brien Award
- Prior to the 2004 college football season, the Manning Award was created by the Allstate Sugar Bowl in honor of the college football accomplishments of Archie, Peyton and Eli Manning. It is the only college football quarterback award that includes the candidates' bowl performances in its balloting; therefore, it is presented annually following the completion of the bowl season. The winner is selected by a panel of national media covering college football, as well as each of the Mannings.
- The Golden Arm Award is presented at the end of each football season and the winner is selected based on his accomplishments both on and off the field. Candidates must be a college senior or fourth-year junior on schedule to graduate with their class. The Golden Arm Award is named in honor of Johnny Unitas, who was an 18-year veteran of the NFL and played his collegiate career at the University of Louisville before joining the Baltimore Colts in 1958. His career passing figures include 2,830 pass completions for 40,239 yards, 290 touchdowns and throwing a touchdown pass in 47 consecutive games.
- The Wuerffel Trophy, known as "College Football's Premier Award for Community Service," is presented annually by the All Sports Association in Fort Walton Beach Florida. Named after 1996 Heisman Trophy winning quarterback Danny Wuerffel from the University of Florida, the Wuerffel Trophy is awarded to the FBS player that best combines exemplary community service with athletic and academic achievement.

McSORLEY AMONG ACTIVE LEADERS

- Senior quarterback Trace McSorley owns the longest active streak for consecutive games with a touchdown pass at 29.
- The streak dates back to the 2016 TaxSlayer Bowl. McSorley had his closest call of the streak in this season's opening contest, not getting his lone touchdown pass until just 42 seconds remained in regulation.
- McSorley's active career rankings in FBS are:

TOUCHDOWN TRACE

- Quarterback Trace McSorley was responsible for three of Penn State's six touchdowns in the season opener against App State, running for two and throwing for one.
- McSorley recorded his 17th career game with a passing and a rushing touchdown (seven in 2016, nine in 2017, one in 2018).
- McSorley's two rushing touchdowns marked his second career multiple rushing touchdown game. He had three rushing touchdowns against Michigan last season.
- Responsible for 80 touchdowns in his career, McSorley is tied with Middle Tennessee's Brent Stockstill for second among active FBS players. Washington's Jake Browning leads with 91.
- McSorley's 80 TDR is a Penn State record by a large margin. The previous record was 65 by Daryll Clark (2006-09).

McSORLEY MAKES HIS MARK

- Quarterback Trace McSorley owns the top-two single-season passing touchdown totals in Penn State history, as his 28 passing touchdowns in 2017 trails only his 29 passing TDs in 2016.
- With three touchdowns responsible for at Maryland, McSorley broke his own season TDR record of 36 set in 2016. He finished the 2017 season with 39 touchdowns responsible for.
- McSorley is the first player in Penn State history with two 3,000-yard passing seasons. He recorded 3,570 yards in 2017 and 3,614 yards in 2016.
- His 3,570 passing yards in 2017 rank second on the Penn State season passing chart, trailing only his 2016 mark (3,614) for the record.
- McSorley's five 300-yard passing games in 2017 tied his own record set in 2016.
- McSorley's 11 games with 200 or more passing yards in 2017 tied the Penn State record set by McSorley in 2016 and Matt McGloin in 2012.
- McSorley had 427 pass attempts last season to finish third on the Penn State season list.
- With 284 completions in 2017, McSorley broke the Penn State season completions record of 270 held by McGloin (2012) and Christian Hackenberg (2014).
- McSorley tallied 491 rushing yards in 2017 to finish in second place on Penn State's season quarterback rushing yardage list, behind Michael Robinson's 806 yards in 2005.
- McSorley tied the Penn State record for rushing touchdowns by a quarterback in a season with 11 rushing scores in 2017 to equal the mark of 11 set by Michael Robinson in 2005.
- McSorley registered 402 yards of total offense (342 passing, 60 rushing) in the Fiesta Bowl against Washington, which ranks fourth in Penn State history.
 McSorley owns five of the 10 best total offense marks in the Nittany Lion annals.
- McSorley completed 15-straight pass attempts from the first quarter through the third quarter at Northwestern in 2017, breaking the Penn State record for consecutive completions. The previous record was set by Kerry Collins when he had 14-straight completions at Minnesota during the 1994 season.

GROUND GAME ROLLS

- In the season opener against App State, Penn State rushed for 205 yards, surpassing 200 yards for the fourth-straight game, dating back to November 18, 2017 vs. Nebraska.
- It's Penn State's longest 200-yard rushing game streak since a seven-game streak from 2007-08.
- In his second career start, RB Miles Sanders rushed for two touchdowns, including a 4-yard score in overtime
- Sanders set a career high with 91 yards rushing, with 62 of those yards coming in the fourth quarter and overtime. He also set career highs with 19 rushes and three receptions.
- Freshman RB Ricky Slade and senior Mark Allen also contributed. Slade scored the first touchdown of his career in the third quarter on a 27-yard run. Allen added 24 yards on five carries and had a career-best three receptions. His previous high was two against Indiana in 2015

HAMLER'S GRAND ENTRANCE

- WR/KR KJ Hamler made an impact in his collegiate debut, catching three passes for a team-high 67 yards and a game-tying touchdown, while also breaking through for 52 yards on his lone kickoff return to setup the game-tying drive with less than two minutes to go in regulation.
- Hamler is the first Penn State freshman to catch a touchdown pass in a season opener since Geno Lewis in the 2013 opener against Syracuse.
- The redshirt freshman also hauled in a 46-yard reception early in the fourth quarter, which led to a Miles Sanders rushing touchdown and a 31-17 Penn State lead with 11:17 remaining. It was Penn State's longest completion of the day.

TIGHT ENDS EXCEL

- TE Jonathan Holland's second-quarter, 29-yard reception against Appalachian State was the longest of his career. His previous long was 8 yards last season vs. Georgia State.
- Holland set career highs with two catches and 36 yards. His previous receptions career best was one, which he accomplished three times, most recently against Michigan State in 2017.
- TE Danny Dalton grabbed his first career catch in the first quarter

OFFENSE CONTINUES PRODUCING

- Penn State tallied 45 points and covered 434 yards in its season-opening win over Appalachian State.
- The Nittany Lions have scored 20 or more points in 24 consecutive games, which is the longest streak in program history, breaking the record of 20-straight games from 1993-95. It is also the third-longest streak in Big Ten history behind the 25-game streak by Michigan State (2013-15) and 46-game streak by Ohio State (2006-14).
- The Nittany Lions have scored 30 or more points 19 times in the last 21 games.
- The Nittany Lions scored 40 points for the 12th time since 2016.
- Penn State averaged 460.3 yards of total offense per game in 2017 to rank second in the Big Ten and 19th in FBS. It was also its highest average since 1994 (520.2 avg.).

HOLLAND ON MACKEY WATCH LIST

- Junior tight end Jonathan Holland garnered a spot on the 2018 John Mackey Award preseason watch list.
- The Mackey Award is given annually to the most outstanding collegiate tight end. The award is named after NFL Hall of Fame member John Mackey, who is considered to be the best to have played the tight end position.
- Mike Gesicki was a finalist for the honor in 2017.

- The 2018 Penn State Lift for Life included a kids clinic for the fifth year in a row, which was run by the Nittany Lion true freshmen football student-athletes. The event concluded with an autograph session with team.
- Founded by Penn State Football teammates Scott Shirley, Dave Costlow and Damone Jones in 2003, Lift for Life has benefitted cancer research and the rare disease community. The 2018 Uplifting Athletes officers are: offensive linemen Ryan Bates and Steven Gonzalez, co-presidents: quarterback Trace McSorley, vice president; offensive lineman CJ Thorpe, business liaison; punter Blake Gillikin, treasurer; offensive lineman Alex Gellerstedt, assistant treasurer; offensive lineman Connor McGovern, secretary; linebacker Frank DiLeo, assistant secretary. - The Nittany Lions returned 83 starts on the offensive line, a number that ranks 41st in the country and sixth in the Big Ten, per Phil Steele.
- Penn State is one of 18 teams to return all five starters on the offensive line.
- In the Big Ten, Illinois, Indiana, Maryland and Wisconsin also return all five o-linemen. Penn State plays all four this season.
- Boston College, California, Coastal Carolina, Florida, Kansas State, Marshall, Missouri, Northern Illinois, Old Dominion, San Diego State, Utah State, Vanderbilt and Wake Forest also return their starting five.
- Juniors Ryan Bates and Connor McGovern lead the way for returning Penn State offensive line starters with 22 apiece. McGovern has started the last 22 contests for the Nittany Lions.
- The other Nittany Lions with starting experience in the trenches are: junior Steven Gonzalez (16), senior Chasz Wright (14) and sophomore Will Fries (9).
- The Nittany Lions graduated Brendan Mahon, who had 41 career starts at guard and tackle, and Andrew Nelson, who had 28 starts at guard and tackle.

READY IN THE OPENER

- CB Amani Oruwariye sealed Penn State's seasonopening win in overtime with his sixth career interception.
- Oruwariye has had an interception in three consecutive season openers (2016 vs. Kent State; 2017 vs. Akron).
- Oruwariye also forced the first fumble of his career in the third quarter.
- Oruwariye tied a career high with seven tackles. He had seven against Michigan State in 2016.

ORUWARIYE ON NAGURSKI LIST

- Corner back Amani Oruwariye is among the candidates for the Bronko Nagurski Trophy, which is given yearly to the National Defensive Player of the Year.
- The award is named for legendary two-way player from the University of Minnesota, Bronko Nagurski, who dominated college football then became a star for the Chicago Bears in the 1930s.
- Penn State has never won a Nagurski Trophy, but has had five finalists, most recently Carl Nassib in 2015.

NEW FACES STARTING ON D

- In his first start at middle linebacker in the opener against App State, Jan Johnson had a career-high 11 tackles, including four solo. His previous best was four vs. Rutgers last season.
- Making his second-career start at safety, Nick Scott recorded a career-best nine tackles. His previous high was eight tackles against Pitt in 2017. Scott also had his first career sack and tied career highs with one tackle for loss and one pass breakup.
- S Garrett Taylor had a career-best eight tackles in his first start. His previous high mark was three, set last season vs. Nebraska.
- Also making his first start, DE Yetur Gross-Matos tied his career best with three tackles. This marks the fourth time in his career that he recorded three tackles, with the last coming against Rutgers in 2017.

MILLER NAMED TO TWO WATCH LISTS

- Junior Shareef Miller landed on the Bednarik Award watch list for the National Defensive Player of the Year, and the Ted Hendricks Award preseason watch list, which is presented annually to the top defensive end in college football.
- The Bednarik Award has been presented to the College Defensive Player of the Year since 1995. Chuck Bednarik, former standout at Penn and with the Philadelphia Eagles, is a member of both the College Football Hall of Fame's Class of '69 and the NFL Hall of Fame's Class of '67.
- The Ted Hendricks Award is named in honor of college football's first three-time first-team All-American. It is in the spirit of Ted Hendricks' aggressive style of play, winning attitude and determination that the Defensive End of the Year Award for college football's premier defensive end is presented.
- Penn State's lone winner of the Hendricks Award is Carl Nassib in 2015, while Michael Haynes (2002), Tamba Hali (2005), Maurice Evans (2007) and Aaron Maybin (2008) were finalists for the honor.

SACK MASTERS

- Nick Scott and Cam Brown registered their first career full sacks in the season opener against App State, accounting for Penn State's two sacks.
- The Penn State defense continued to find the quarterback in 2017, averaging 3.23 sacks per game to tie for the Big Ten lead and rank seventh in FBS.
- The Nittany Lions totaled 42 sacks in 13 games. Following totals of 46 sacks in 2015 and 40 sacks in 2016, Penn State posted back-to-back-to-back 40-sack seasons for the first time since it posted three-consecutive 40-sack seasons in 2005 (41), 2006 (40) and 2007 (46).
- Penn State brought a balanced pass rush in 2017 as 22 different Nittany Lions had at least assisted on a sack.

FARMER ON TWO WATCH LISTS

- Senior linebacker Koa Farmer is on the watch lists for the Butkus Award and the Polynesian College Football Player of the Year Award.
- The award, named in honor of legendary linebacker Dick Butkus, annually recognizes the nation's top collegiate linebacker.
- Farmer is vying to become the first Nittany Lion to earn the honor since Paul Posluszny in 2005. LaVar Arrington also won the award in 1999, and five have previously been named finalists: Shane Conlan (1986), Andre Collins (1989), Brandon Short (1999), Posluszny (2006) and Dan Connor (2007).
- The Polynesian College Football Player of the Year Award is presented annually to the most outstanding Polynesian college football player that epitomizes great ability and integrity.

SCOTT IN CONTENTION FOR GOOD WORKS TEAM

- Senior safety Nick Scott is a nominee for the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team.
- The Allstate AFCA Good Works Team is comprised of 11 players from the NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision and 11 players from the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision, Divisions II, III and the NAIA and one honorary head coach. To be in consideration by Allstate and the AFCA for a nomination, each player must be actively involved with a charitable organization or service group while maintaining a strong academic standing.
- Four Nittany Lions have earned Good Works Team accolades -- Brandon Smith (2017), Ben Kline (2015), Stefen Wisniewski (2010) and Wayne Holmes (1994).
- Scott, who is a two-time captain, has been active in the community. He danced independently in THON, the world's largest student-run philanthropy, in 2018, raising more than \$12,300 for the cause. He has also made visits to Penn State Children's Hospital with the team and participated in Lift for Life, which raises money for rare diseases, and Special Olympics.

LIMITED ACCESS

- In 2017, Penn State was seventh in the nation and second in the Big Ten in scoring defense, averaging 16.5 points allowed per game. It was the lowest figure at Penn State since yielding just 12.2 points per game in 2009.
- Penn State allowed 8.9 points per game fewer in 2017 than it did in 2016 (25.4).
- Penn State owned a pair of shutout victories and allowed more than 20 points in a game just four times.
- Penn State shutout opponents in at least one half in seven games (Akron, Georgia State, Indiana, Northwestern, Michigan, Rutgers, Maryland).
- Penn State was strong at the start of games. It was the last team to give up a first-quarter point (Week 9; Ohio State) and did not allow a first-quarter touchdown until Week 10 (Michigan State). PSU allowed an opening drive score for the first time against Rutgers (Week 11).
- Penn State ranked fourth in FBS in first-half scoring defense, allowing just 7.54 points per game. Penn State was particularly strong in the first quarter, ranking third in FBS allowing just 1.77 points per game. The Lions were nearly as strong in the third quarter as they were sixth in points allowed per game (2.85 avg.) according to Coaches by the Numbers.
- Penn State recorded two shutouts in a season for the first time since notching two in 2007 (59-0 over FIU; 31-0 vs. Indiana).
- The Nittany Lions nearly earned their third shutout of the season at Northwestern, but the Wildcats scored in the final two minutes of the game, snapping a fivequarter shutout streak that started in the second half of the Indiana game.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

FRESHMAN KICKERS DEBUT

- Penn State debuted a pair of kickers in its season opener against App State.
- PK Jake Pinegar booted his first career field goal (32 yards) late in the second quarter.
- Pinegar was a perfect 6-for-6 on extra points. Penn State has made its last 149 extra points
- PK Rafael Checa made his first career appearance, averaging 60.2 yards per kickoff, including two touchbacks.

GILLIKIN 50/50

- P **Blake Gillikin**'s 55-yard punt to the Appalachian State 19 was the 50th inside the 20 of his career.
- The punt was also the 29th of Gillikin's career of 50 or more yards.

GILLIKIN ON RAY GUY WATCH LIST

- Punter Blake Gillikin is again on the preseason watch list for the Ray Guy Award list for the nation's top punter.
- The Augusta Sports Council created the Ray Guy Award in 2000 to honor Thomson, Georgia native and College and Pro Football Hall of Fame inductee, Ray Guy. Among the statistics used to identify the winner is net punting average, number of times punt is downed or kicked out of bounds inside the opponents 20-yard line, total yardage punted, average returned yardage and percentage of punts not returned with particular emphasis placed on net punting average. The winner must display team leadership, self-discipline and have a positive impact on the team's success.

SEASON NOTES

PENN STATE SEASON OPENERS

- The 2018 season marks the 132nd in Penn State history. with the Nittany Lions owning a record of 109-21-2 in opening games.
- The 2018 opener was the third of four consecutive season openers at home: Kent State (2016; W, 33-13), Akron (2017; W, 52-0), Appalachian State (2018; W, 45-38 OT) and Idaho (2019).
- The Lions have won 15 of their last 17 season openers and their last six consecutive.
- Penn State's longest streaks of winning their season openers are: 12 (1919-30), 11 (1893-1903), 10 (1973-82; 2002-11), 9 (1909-17) and 7 (1942-48).
- Penn State has only lost consecutive season openers three times in school history; 1964-65, 1989-90, 2000-01.
- The Nittany Lions went unbeaten from 1909-30, winning 20-of-21 season openers. They tied Wissahickon Barracks, 6-6, in 1918 and the streak was stopped by Waynesburg, a 7-0 setback, in 1931.

HOME OPENER HISTORY

- Penn State's all-time record in home openers is 118-13-1 and 50-9 in Beaver Stadium.
- Penn State has won 16 out of its last 17 home openers and its last six consecutive, defeating Appalachian State (2018; 45-38 OT) Akron in 2014 (21-3) and 2017 (52-0), Kent State (2016; 33-13), Buffalo (2015; 27-14), and Eastern Michigan (2013; 45-7).
- The attendance total of 105,232 for the 2018 opener against App State was the highest for a home opener since 106,577 watched Penn State topple Coastal Carolina in 2008.

SIX BOWL TEAMS HIGHLIGHT SCHEDULE

- The Nittany Lions will face six teams that participated in a bowl game during the 2017 campaign.
- Five of the six teams won their bowl games last season, including a pair of teams that won New Year's Six bowl
- Appalachian State shut out Toledo in the Dollar General Bowl (34-0), No. 5 Ohio State stymied No. 8 USC in the Goodyear Cotton Bowl (24-7), No. 16 Michigan State defeated No. 18 Washington State in the San Diego County Credit Union Holiday Bowl (42-17), Iowa downed Boston College in the New Era Pinstripe Bowl (27-20) and No. 6 Wisconsin topped No. 10 Miami (Fla.) in the Capital One Orange Bowl (34-24).
- Additionally, Michigan fell to South Carolina in the Outback Bowl (26-19). It was the only loss by a B1G team in the bowl season.

PENN STATE IN 26TH BIG TEN SEASON

- After 106 years as an independent in football. Penn. State began play in the Big Ten Conference in 1993 and will play its 26th season in the conference.
- The Nittany Lions were outright Big Ten Champions in 1994 and 2016 and shared titles with Ohio State in 2005 and 2008
- · Penn State beat Oregon to win the 1995 Rose Bowl and played USC in the 2009 and 2017 Rose Bowls.
- · Penn State won the 2006 Orange Bowl and finished the season ranked No. 3.

NITTANY LION POSITION CHANGES

· Among the Penn State players who will play new positions heading into the fall are: Damion Barber (DE to DT) Joe DuMond (LB to DE), Dae'Lun Darien (WR to LB), Brailyn Franklin (LB to DE), Hunter Kelly (OL to OL/DL), Lamont Wade (CB to S) and Chris Welde (RB to CB).

PENN STATE NUMBER CHANGES

 Three Nittany Lions are wearing new numbers in 2018: Dae'Lun Darien (41), Donovan Johnson (2) and C.J. Thorpe (69).

PENN STATE VS. BIG TEN

- · Penn State has won 16 out of its last 18 games against Big Ten opponents.
- · Penn State won 13 consecutive games against Big Ten opponents from 2016-17, breaking its record of 12 from 1993-94
- Penn State owns a 208-101-3 mark against Big Ten Conference teams since the Nittany Lions first opposed Ohio State in 1912.
- The Nittany Lions began play as a member of the Big Ten Conference in 1993 and have a 126-75 mark.
- Penn State played 109 games vs. the current Big Ten alignment when either or both Penn State itself (prior to 1993) or the opponent (Nebraska prior to 2011; Maryland and Rutgers prior to 2014) was not yet a member of the Big Ten. The Nittany Lions went 80-26-3 in those games.

MICHIGAN STATE IS HOMECOMING FOE

- · When the Penn State alumni return to Happy Valley for the 2018 Homecoming game, they will cheer their Nittany Lions on against Michigan State on Oct. 13.
- · This is the fourth time Penn State will square off against Michigan State in a Homecoming game. The Nittany Lions lost to the Spartans in 1946 (19-16), tied them in 1948 (14-14) and lost in 1951 (32-21)
- · Penn State owns a 71-22-5 record all-time on Homecoming, including wins in 11 of its last 13 games.

BLUE-WHITE

- The 2019 date has been set for the annual Blue-White Game, which is one of the highlights of the Penn State sports calendar.
- The Blue-White football game will be played Saturday, April 13, 2019 in Beaver Stadium. The intra-squad scrimmage is tentatively scheduled to kick in the early to mid-afternoon. The Nittany Lions concluded spring practice on April 21, with an estimated 71,000 fans attending the 2018 Blue-White Game, the nation's fourth-largest spring football crowd this year.
- · The Blue-White Game is the university's unofficial annual spring reunion. The game has drawn more than 50,000 fans in 10 of the past 12 years, including six crowds above 70,000.
- · More details will be announced after the 2018 season.

FIESTA BOWL CHAMPIONS

- Penn State defeated No. 11 Washington, 35-28, in the 2017 PlayStation Fiesta Bowl to win its seventh Fiesta Bowl trophy
- Penn State has a 7-0 record in the Fiesta Bowl, ranking the Nittany Lions as the winningest team in the game's history in terms of overall wins and winning percentage.
- Penn State participated in the seventh (1977; Arizona State), 10th (1980; Ohio State), 11th (1982; USC), 16th (1987; Miami), 21st (1992; Tennessee), 26th (1997; Texas) and 47th (2017; Washington) editions of the game.
- Penn State's seven appearances in the Fiesta Bowl are the most of any bowl in program history.
- Only Ohio State (8) has appeared in the Fiesta Bowl more than Penn State, while Arizona State (5-1; Ione loss to Penn State) and Nebraska (2-4) have six appearances.

ANOTHER NEW YEAR'S SIX BOWL

- James Franklin guided the Nittany Lions to a second-straight New Year's Six bowl appearance with a berth in the 2017 PlayStation Fiesta Bowl, following a bid to the 2017 Rose Bowl presented by Northwestern Mutual.
- It was the first time since 1985 (Orange) and 1986 (Fiesta) that the Nittany Lions played in New Year's Six bowls in back-to-back years.

COLLINS GOING INTO THE HALL

- Penn State national award winner and first-team All-America QB Kerry Collins has been elected to the College Football Hall of Fame as part of the 2018 class.
- Collins will be inducted to the Hall of Fame December 4, 2018 at the 61st National Football Foundation (NFF) Annual Awards Dinner in New York City. Collins and the other inductees will also be recognized at their respective collegiate institutions with NFF Hall of Fame On-Campus Salutes, presented by Fidelity Investments, during the fall.
- Collins is the 25th member of the Penn State football family to be elected to the College Hall of Fame.
- Linebacker Shane Conlan was the most recent player inductee in 2014, while former Nittany Lion player Bill Bowes was enshrined into the Hall of Fame as the University of New Hampshire head coach in 2016.
- Collins helped Penn State post a 40-9 record from 1991-94 and was instrumental in the Nittany Lions earning a 22-2 overall mark (14-2 conference) during their first two years in the Big Ten Conference, posting records of 10-2 in 1993 and 12-0 in 1994.
- The recipient of the 1994 Maxwell Award as the National Player of the Year, he helped the Nittany Lions win three New Year's Day bowl games: the 1992 Fiesta, 1994 Citrus and 1995 Rose Bowls.

COLLEGE HALL OF FAME NOMINEES

- First-team All-Americans Bobby Engram, Jeff Hartings and Steve Wisniewski have been selected as a part of the national ballot for the National Football Foundation's College Hall of Fame's Class of 2019.
- A total of 76 players and six coaches from FBS are on the 2019 ballot.
- The trio of standouts who were instrumental in helping Penn State post undefeated and championship seasons have an opportunity to join 19 former Nittany Lion players and five Penn State coaches who have been inducted into the Hall. Engram and Hartings are appearing on the ballot for the first time.
- Also on the ballot is former Nittany Lion studentathlete Glenn Killinger, who is among the candidates for the divisional coach Class of 2019. Killinger was inducted into the Hall of Fame as a player in 1966.
- Quarterback Kerry Collins will be inducted into the Hall of Fame in December, joining the likes of Shane Conlan, Curt Warner and Lydell Mitchell.
- The announcement of the 2019 Class will be made Monday, Jan. 7, 2019, in Santa Clara, California. The city is serving as the host for the CFP National Championship, which will be played later that day at Levi's Stadium.
- Engram helped Penn State to a 42-7 record during his career (1991, 1993-95), including a 19-5 record in Big Ten play. The recipient of the inaugural Biletnikoff Award in 1994 as the nation's top receiver, he helped Penn State to four bowl wins during his time in Happy Valley, including the 1995 Rose Bowl and 1992 Fiesta Bowl. In addition, Engram was selected as the MVP of the 1996 Outback Bowl and the 1993 Citrus Bowl (offensive MVP).
- Hartings excelled on the field and in the classroom for the Nittany Lions, claiming first-team CoSIDA Academic All-America honors and six first-team All-America accolades during his career. In 1995, he was an NFF Hall of Fame Scholar-Athlete team honoree and Rotary Lombardi Trophy semifinalist. The native of St. Henry, Ohio was the keystone of the offensive line that helped the 1994 offense break 14 school season records and seven Big Ten season marks.
- Wisniewski was a three-year starter at guard for the Nittany Lions who would go on to become an All-Pro lineman in the NFL. He was one of two sophomores to start on the 1986 National Championship team and he opened holes for two first-team All-America running backs, Blair Thomas (1987) and D.J. Dozier (1986). One of just four Penn State offensive linemen to earn a pair of first-team All-America honors, he was recognized in 1988 by the American Football Coaches (AFCA) and repeated All-America accolades from Sporting News. A 1988 team captain, Wisniewski is one of just two offensive linemen to earn Penn State's team MVP honor since its creation in 1978.

GAME RECAP

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - A rushing touchdown from Miles Sanders and an interception in the end zone by Amani Oruwariye secured a thrilling 45-38 overtime victory for No. 10/9 Penn State over Appalachian State in front of 105,232 roaring fans in the 2018 opener.

It was the largest crowd for a Penn State season opener since 2008.

Trailing by a touchdown with 1 minute, 39 seconds to go in regulation, guarterback Trace McSorley engineered a touchdown drive to tie the game at 38-38 and force overtime. Penn State went on offense first and handed the ball to Sanders four consecutive times, with his last rush crossing the goal line from 4 yards out. Appalachian State threatened on its offensive possession, converting a fourthand-1 to earn a fresh set of downs at the 15-yard line, but Oruwariye picked Zac Thomas' first-down pass off in the end zone to end the game. It was the third consecutive season opener in which Oruwariye pulled in an interception.

The Nittany Lions held a 24-10 lead through three guarters, but the Mountaineers stormed back in the fourth quarter, scoring four touchdowns and allowing just one for a 38-31 lead with under two minutes to play.

Penn State responded as redshirt freshman KJ Hamler setup a game-tying touchdown drive with a 52-yard kickoff return out of the end zone, patiently waiting for a lane to develop before bursting down the right sideline. McSorley went to work from the App State 48 with 1:39 on the clock, going 5-for-6 passing - including a fourth-and-2 conversion and ultimately connected with Hamler for a 15-yard touchdown to tie the score at 38-38 with 42 seconds to play.

Appalachian State missed a 56-yard field goal attempt on its ensuing drive with 15 seconds left on the clock, sending the game to overtime. Penn State got the ball first in the extra session and handed it over Sanders to do all of the work on the ground. Sanders used four carries to rush for 25 yards and a touchdown that put the Nittany Lions

After the Mountaineers converted on a fourth down, Thomas heaved a ball into the corner of the end zone, but it was Oruwariye who came down with the pigskin to seal the Penn State victory.

McSorley accounted for three touchdowns, two rushing and one passing, and finished with 283 total offense yards. The senior signal caller connected on 21 of his 36 passing

Sanders rushed for 91 yards and two touchdowns, including the game-winner. Linebacker Jan Johnson led the Nittany Lion defense with 11 total tackles.

KEYS AND DIFFERENCE MAKERS

Miles Sanders (PSU, RB) and the Ground Game Making just his second career start, Sanders enjoyed a career game, setting highs in rushing yards (91), attempts (19) and rushing touchdowns (2), not to mention the gamewinning score in overtime.

Five of Penn State's six touchdowns scored in the game came on the ground, as McSorley scored two and totaled 53 yards rushing 12 carries. Freshman Ricky Slade added 39 yards on six carries in his debut, including a 27-yard touchdown run late in the third quarter.

Trace McSorley (PSU, QB)

McSorley completed 21-of-36 passes for 230 yards and a touchdown and rushed 12 times for 53 yards and two touchdowns

KJ Hamler (PSU, WR/KR)

Hamler made an impact in his collegiate debut, catching four passes for a team-high 68 yards and a game-tying touchdown, while also breaking through for 52 yards on his lone kickoff return to setup the game-tying drive with less than two minutes to go in regulation. The redshirt freshman also hauled in a 46-yard reception early in the fourth quarter, which led to a Miles Sanders rushing touchdown and a 31-17 Penn State lead with 11:17 remaining.

Notable Nittany Lions

Wide receiver Juwan Johnson led the Lions with six receptions, totaling 67 yards. He was one of seven receivers that McSorley targeted.

On defense, Johnson made his first career start at middle linebacker and totaled a game- and career-high 11 tackles. In the secondary, safety Nick Scott made a career-best nine tackles and registered his first career sack.

Appalachian State Kickoff Return Touchdown

Penn State scored on the game's opening drive, but App State's Darrynton Evans returned the ensuing kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown. It was the first kickoff return touchdown Penn State had allowed since yielding one at Northwestern in 2015
