The Maize & Blue Nitty Gritty

- The University of Michigan basketball team (8-5; 2-0 B1G) will host a red-hot Penn State squad (11-3; 2-1 B1G) at Crisler Center on Wednesday (Jan. 4). The Nittany Lions come to Ann Arbor having won five straight with conference wins at Illinois (Dec. 10) and Iowa (Jan. 1). Tipoff is scheduled for 7 p.m. with the game broadcast on the B1G Network.
- The Big Ten match-up features the top two teams in the Big Ten and nation for turn-overs. Penn State leads the conference and nation at 8.8, while U-M is second at 9.6.
- U-M snapped a two-game losing streak after a resounding victory over Maryland, 81-46, on Sunday evening at Crisler Center. In the Wolverines second conference win, they held the Terrapins to just 13 first half points, tying the program record for an opponent's lowest total. Along the way, Hunter Dickinson paced the Maize and Blue with a season-best 32 points and 12 rebounds.
- Dickinson's third double-double of the season against Maryland gives him 20 in his career, which helped him break the tie for 18th all-time with U-M head coach Juwan Howard (19). U-M Legend Cazzie Russell owns the 17th spot with 21 in his career.
- For a third straight season, Dickinson leads U-M in scoring (18.8 ppg; 2nd in Big Ten) and rebounding (8.5 rpg; 3rd in Big Ten). He is the fourth Wolverines to lead in both categories in multiple seasons. This season, Dickinson has 11 double figure games, with six 20-plus efforts and two 30-plus. Overall, he has scored in double figures in 63 of 73 career games.
- With seven double figure games over his last eight, including a career-best 22 points twice (Lipscomb & vs. North Carolina), Kobe Bufkin has moved into third on the Wolverines with 12.1 points per game.
- Moving into the starting five, Dug McDaniel has 21 assists as a starter (4.2 app). In his eight games prior, he had 17 (2.1 app). He adds 6.2 points and 2.5 rebounds.
- Together, Bufkin (34 assists, 19 steals) and McDaniel (38 assists, 16 steals) have nearly half of U-M's 170 assists and 72 steals.
- Jett Howard leads U-M with 32 triples, which ranks third in the Big Ten and more than doubles the next closest Wolverine (Bufkin, 15). With 10 double figure games, Howard is second on U-M with 14.6 points per game.
- With 11 games of 5-plus rebounds, Terrance Williams II is second on U-M with 6.7 rebounds per game. He has posted a career-best 11 vs. Eastern Michigan and vs. North Carolina. Prior to this season, his best season average was 2.4 (2021-22).
- Led by Dickinson's 23 blocks (3rd in Big Ten), U-M ranks third in the Big Ten (25th nationally) with 5.1 blocks per game. Four Wolverines have 10-plus blocks this season.
- Grad transfer Jaelin Llewellyn is scheduled to have surgery on his left knee (ACL) on Wednesday, Jan. 4th at U-M hospital (Dr. James Carpenter).

The Series: Michigan & Penn State

- In the first of two meetings this season, after hosting the Nittany Lions, the Wolverines head to State College on Sunday (Jan. 29) at Noon (B1G Network)(
- U-M leads the all-time series against Penn State, 38-14. However, over the last four games it has been an even split (2-2), with each winning at home and on the road.
- The Maize and Blue are 22-3 in Ann Arbor, having won eight of the last 10 games.
- Last season's only match-up turned into a thriller at the Bryce Jordan Center (Feb. 8, 2022). After trailing by 11 midway through the first half, Hunter Dickinson and former Wolverine Eli Brooks helped U-M rally and tie the score at the half (34-34). After scoring first in the second half, the Wolverines never lost the lead again and held on for the 58-57 victory. Dickinson finished with 19 points, 15 rebounds and four blocks, while Brooks had 16 points and five rebounds.

Quick Hitters

- Hunter Dickinson has 10 double figure games with six 20-plus and two 30-plus
- Dickinson has started his last 68 straight games.
- Dickinson has U-M's highest point total this season -- 32 against Maryland (Jan. 1)
- Dickinson has a team-best four 10-plus rebound games with a season- and team-best 14 against Ohio. The other three have been 12 - Purdue Fort Wayne, Jackson State and Maryland.
- Dickinson is averaging 12.9 shots per game
- Kobe Bufkin has eight double figure games and a career-best 22 in back-to-back games -- Lipscomb and vs. North Carolina.
- Bufkin is second on U-M with 34 assists (2.6 apg) with eight games of 3-plus.
- With a team-best 19 steals, Bufkin has a career-best three, three times -- vs. Eastern Michigan, at Minnesota and Maryland.
- Bufkin leads U-M shooting 82.4 percent (28-for-34) on free throws
- Terrance Williams II has 11 games with 5-plus rebounds as he is second with 6.7 per game. He has twice grabbed a career-best 11 rebounds this season -- vs. Eastern Michigan and vs. North Carolina.
- Through 13 games, Williams II has 87 (23 offensive, 64 defensive), which surpasses his prior best of 73 (31 games) last season.
- Williams II has four double-digit scoring games, which is almost half of his career-total of 10. He has a season-best 18 vs. Eastern Michigan, which was part of his first career double-double (18 points, 11 rebounds).
- Dug McDaniel leads U-M with 38 assists (2.9 apg)
- In his first career start, McDaniel scored a career-best 15 points at Minnesota, nearly going perfect for the game (5-for-6 FG; 3-for-3 3FG and 2-for-2 FT).
- Jett Howard leads U-M with 32 three-pointers (2.4 per game). He has 11 games with 2-plus treys. He had a career-best five in his debut against Purdue Fort Wayne.
- With 14.6 points per game, Howard has 11 in double figures and seven of 15-plus. He had a career-best of 21 against Purdue Fort Wayne.
- Howard is averaging 10.8 shots per game
- Howard leads U-M with 31 minutes per game.
- Joey Baker is 4-for-6 from long range over his last three games.

Who are the Michigan Wolverines?

- The University of Michigan basketball program is led by fourth year head coach Juwan Howard -- former Fab Five member and NBA All-Star.
- After a 25-year career in the NBA -- 19 as a player and six as an assistant (all with the Miami Heat), Howard journeyed back to Ann Arbor for his first head coaching job.
- A huge believer in culture -- learned under Pat Riley and Erik Spoelstra -- Howard runs his program by six values -- Discipline, Family, All-In, Accountability, Trust & Sacrifice.
- Howard has instilled his program to be a "solution based" and a "player led" team. He continues to give a voice to his players allowing them the freedom to express opinions on, as well as off, the floor.
- Overall, the Wolverines will look to play at a fast-paced, "read-and-react" offense with ball screen actions as the primary mainstay in their offensive sets. However, U-M constantly adjusts to its personnel with its cuts, downhill attacks and taking the open shot at a much higher level.
- The offense is coordinated by Howard and assistant coach Howard Easley.
- Coordinated by Howard and Saddi Washington, U-M runs a man-to-man defense, however, they do incorporate several zone options.
- Howard wants his Wolverines to continue to gain confidence and keep shooting, so the "green light" is there for everyone. U-M lives by if you miss, take that next one.
- Howard's Wolverines have continued to develop into a "position-less" team as several players will rotate and play multiple spots during a game.

Fast Break with the Wolverines

- Hunter Dickinson, Jace Howard and Terrance Williams II were selected captains for the 2022-23 season. U-M's captains are picked by Juwan Howard.
- U-M welcomes graduate transfers -- Jaelin Llewellyn (Princeton) and Joey Baker (Duke). The duo marks the fourth and fifth transfers to join the Wolverines since 2017 -- Jaaron Simmons (Ohio; 2017-18), Mike Smith (2020-21; Columbia) and DeVante' Jones (2021-22; Coastal Carolina). Simmons is currently U-M's video analyst.
- U-M has five freshmen for its Class of 2022 -- guard Jett Howard, guard Dug McDaniel, big man Tarris Reed Jr. and forwards Gregg Glenn III and Youssef Khayat.
- U-M has two left-handed players on the roster -- Hunter Dickinson and Kobe Bufkin.
- In Juwan Howard's 19-year NBA career he had over 257+ teammates including list highlights of former Wolverines Chris Webber, Loy Vaught, Maurice Taylor as well as current assistant Howard Easley. Other notables include Ray Allen, Carmelo Anthony, Chris Bosh, Tim Hardaway, Allen Iverson, LeBron James, Jason Kidd, Dikembe Mutumbo, Steve Nash, Dirk Nowitzki, Jerry Stackhouse and Dwayne Wade.

Juwan Howard is ...

- One of 52 current DI coaches on the sidelines at their alma maters.
- One of 23 former NBA players currently coaching DI collegiate basketball.

- The list includes Hunter Dickinson (73 games), Terrance Williams II (65 games), Joey Baker (101 games; 88 at Duke) and Jaelin Llewellyn (84 games; 76 at Princeton), who was lost for the season with a left knee injury.
- Despite Kobe Bufkin (41 games) and Jace Howard (37 games) having 30+ games to their credit, 10 other Wolverines are getting their first taste of college hoops -- five freshmen, two sophomores, two walk-ons and one redshirt.
- Michigan has two Wolverines who have played in the Big Ten Tournament -- Hunter Dickinson (3 games) and Terrance Williams II (2 games).
- U-M has four Wolverines who have play in the NCAA Tournament -- Hunter Dickinson (7 games), Terrance Williams II (6 games) and Kobe Bufkin (1 game; 9 minutes) and Jace Howard (1 game; 1 minute).

There and Back Again ... A Wolverine Tale

- Since August, U-M spent the non-conference traveling 23,000-plus miles (22,393).
- In August, the Maize and Blue had an 11-day Summer Tour to France and Greece.
- In the non-conference, the Wolverines had five (four neutral) away games. U-M played Eastern Michigan (W, 88-83) in downtown Detroit before heading to Brooklyn for a pair of games in the Legends Classic -- Pittsburgh (W, 91-60) and Arizona State (L, 87-62).
- The Wolverines headed back to Europe and England to face Kentucky (L, 73-69) in the London Showcase before returning to open the Big Ten season at Minnesota (W, 90-75).
- The Maize and Blue closed its travel schedule heading to Charlotte, with the women's team for the inaugural Jumpman Invitational vs. North Carolina (L, 80-76).

- Last season, Hunter Dickinson became the fourth Wolverine to do it more than once, joining LaVell Blanchard (4x), Rudy Tomjanovich (3x) and Roy Tarpley (3x).
- As a freshman, Dickinson led with 14.1 points & 7.4 rebounds
- As a sophomore, Dickinson led with 18.6 points & 8.6 rebounds
- This season, Dickinson leads with 18.8 points & 8.5 rebounds

The DMV Duo Becomes a Trio

- Hunter Dickinson (DeMatha Catholic) and Terrance Williams II (Gonzaga College) grew up playing with each other as kids and then during their AAU days. They also played against each other in the Washington Catholic League (WCAC) as each won two titles -- Dickinson (2018, '20) and Williams II (2017, '19).
- Now the duo becomes a trio with the addition of Dug McDaniel (Paul VI Catholic).

Now That Was a Debut

- Jett Howard made quite the debut against Purdue Fort Wayne (Nov. 7). With five three-pointers and 21 points, while adding a team-best five assists, he became the first Wolverine freshman to record a 20+ points in their first career game in 23 years.
- The last was Jamal Crawford in his 1999-2000 career opener against Oakland. He scored 21 points on 8-for-16 shooting. He had three three-pointers and guided U-M to an 82-62 win over the Grizzlies (Nov. 19, 1999).
- How did this compare to Jett's father, Juwan? Well the elder Howard's debut was a 13 point, nine rebound, two assist effort in a 100-74 win at Detroit-Mercy (Dec. 2, 1991).

Portal Success

- Over the last five years, Michigan has dipped into the transfer portal five times.
- This season, Michigan welcomes two for the first time with the addition of Princeton's Jaelin Llewellyn and Duke's Joey Baker to the roster. Unfortunately after eight games, U-M lost Llewellyn for the season due to a left ACL injury.
- In 2017-18, Jaaron Simmons, who is currently U-M's video analyst, came to U-M via Ohio and helped the Wolverines to a second straight Big Ten Tournament title in 2018 as well as advance to the Final Four and national title game vs. Villanova.
- In the 2020-21 covid-19 altered season, Columbia's Mike Smith helped U-M to the 2021 Big Ten regular season title, a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament (East) and the program's fourth Elite Eight appearance since 2013.
- In 2021-22, U-M welcomed Coastal Carolina graduate transfer DeVante' Jones. He led the Wolverines in assists (151; 4.6 apg) while adding 10.3 points and 4.5 rebounds per game. He was instrumental in U-M's run to a fifth straight NCAA Sweet 16.

Michigan Loses Llewellyn for the Season

- On Dec. 7th, Juwan Howard announced graduate transfer Jaelin Llewellyn will miss the remainder of the season after suffering an ACL injury to his left knee (non-contact) vs. Kentucky (Dec. 4; London Showcase).
- He is scheduled for surgery on Wednesday, January 4 at U-M by Dr. James Carpenter.

Make that Four Down-to-the-Wire Setbacks

- Michigan has four of its five losses by an average of 3.0 points.
- After a late rally gave U-M a one-point lead with 1:42 left, No. 3 Virginia used a closing 5-2 run to win, 70-68 (-2), in the ACC/B1G Challenge match-up in Crisler Center.
- Traveling across the pond, U-M rallied from a seven-point deficit in the second half to take a one-point lead vs. No. 19 Kentucky in the London Showcase. However, the Wildcats held off the Wolverines to win, 73-69 (-4), despite the Maize and Blue cutting trailing by two-or-fewer points five times.
- After a North Carolina first half rally, the Tar Heels held the lead over the Wolverines the entire second half, despite the Maize and Blue cutting it to just two twice. Free throws sealed UNC's 80-76 (-4) win in the Jumpman Invitational.
- In a game which featured 11 lead changes and seven ties, Central Michigan hit a three-pointer with 11 second left (Reggie Bass) and held on despite two last second U-M shots to win 63-61 (-2).

Continuing a Pattern of Big Ten Success

- Last season, U-M's win over Michigan State (March 1, 2022) gave the Wolverines their 10th Big Ten victory. That victory extended U-M's streak of 10+ conference wins to seven straight seasons -- and 10 over the last 11. Ultimately, U-M closed 2021-22 at 11-9.
- Since 2011-12, the Wolverines have a 130-72 Big Ten record with regular season titles in 2012, '14 and '21 as well as back-to-back Big Ten Tournament titles in 2017 and '18
- In program history, Michigan has 10+ Big Ten wins 36 times.

(Repeat it Five Times) It's Great to be a Wolverine

- Michigan has advanced to the Sweet 16 in five consecutive tournaments (2017, '18, '19, '21, '22) -- a Big Ten record. The 2020 tournament was cancelled due to covid-19.
- U-M is one of just two programs, along with Gonzaga (seven straight), to reach the last five-straight Sweet 16s.
- Since the NCAA Tournament expanded to 64 in 1985, U-M's streak of five-straight Sweet 16s is tied for the fourth-longest by any school. That list includes: North Carolina (9; 1985-93), Duke (9; 1998-2006), Gonzaga (7; 2015-22), Duke (7; 1986-92), Michigan (5; 2017-22), Kansas (5; 1993-97) and Kentucky (5; 1995-99).
- Since 2013, U-M has advanced to the Sweet 16 seven times, tied for the most in the country with the Zags. In fact, since 2013, U-M has advanced to the Elite Eight four times, tied for the most in the country with Duke, Gonzaga and Kentucky.
- During this same span, U-M's 23 NCAA wins is the second-most of any program behind Gonzaga (24) and is tied with North Carolina (23).
- Other 20+ win teams include Duke (22), Kansas (22) and Villanova (22).

Continuing a Pattern of NCAA Success

- Since returning to Michigan, Juwan Howard has five NCAA Tournament wins -- the most among Big Ten coaches over the last three tournaments.
- The list includes: Greg Gard (2), Matt Painter (2), Brad Underwood (2), Chris Holtmann (1), Tom Izzo (1), Fran McCaffery (1), Steve Pikiell (1) & Mike Woodson (1).

The Wolverines vs. the Ranked

- Under Juwan Howard, U-M is 15-19 against ranked opponents
- Michigan has had eight wins over top 10 opponents, with three among the nation's top 5 -- at No. 4 Ohio State (Feb. 21, 2021; 92-87, +5), No. 3 Purdue (Feb. 10, 2022; 82-58, +24) and No. 5 Tennessee (March 19; 76-68, +8) in the 2022 NCAA Tournament.
- U-M was 4-8 during 2021-22 with highlighted wins over No. 3 Purdue (Feb. 10; 82-58, +15), at No. 23 Ohio State (March 6; 75-69, +5), as well as the rallies over No. 24 Colorado State (March 17; 75-63, +12) and No. 5 Tennessee (March 19; 76-68, +8) in the NCAA Tournament.
- During the covid-19 shortened 2020-21 season, U-M was 7-3 against with highlighted wins over No. 9 Wisconsin (Jan. 12; 77-54, +23); at No. 4 Ohio State (Feb. 21; 92-87, +5) and No. 9 Iowa (Feb. 25; 79-57, +22).
- In Howard's first season, U-M was 4-6 against the ranked, however, the Wolverines had wins over No. 6 North Carolina (Nov. 28; 73-64, +9) and No. 8 Gonzaga (Nov. 29; 82-64, +18) at the Battle 4 Atlantis and added victories vs. No. 25 Rutgers (Feb. 1; 69-63, +6) in the B1G Saturday (MSG) and No. 16 Michigan State (Feb. 8; 77-68, +9).

Another Year, Another of the Strongest Schedules

- Michigan played one of the nation's strongest schedules in 2021-22. Last season, the Wolverines ranked among the top 10 for strength of schedule: Sagarin (1st); ESPN BPI (2nd); KPI Rankings (2nd); KenPom (4th) and NCAA Net (7th).
- In 2021-22, U-M played 12 games (4-8) against top 25 ranked teams and 22 (9-13) against teams who played in the 2022 NCAA Tournament.

Wolverines Add Washington III, Kante During Early Signing Period

• Michigan signed top-100 and four-star shooting guard George Washington III and four-star forward Papa Kante during the early signing period.

George Washington III | 6-3 Guard | Dayton, Ohio | Chaminade-Julienne H.S.

- Washington III will suit up for Chaminade-Julienne High School in Dayton, Ohio, this season, following his family's move after his father, George Jr., accepted an assistant coaching position with the Dayton women's basketball program.
- Before his transfer for his senior season, Washington III had two standout seasons at Christian Academy of Louisville. In two seasons with the Centurions, he had a 36-23 record, scored 1,346 points (23.6 ppg), made 136 three-pointers and shot 91.1 percent at the free-throw line (328-for-360).
- As a junior, Washington III scored 23.4 points per game while grabbing 6.8 rebounds to lead the Centurions to a 20-12 overall mark. Shooting 52.5 percent (244-for-464) from the field, he had 65 three-point field goals. Scoring in double figures in 30 of his 31 games, he notched six games of 30+ points and one of 40+ with his career-high 45 against Bardstown (Jan. 8, 2022).
- As a sophomore, he averaged 23.9 points per game, with seven 30+ point games which included a season-best 36 points, twice. He made a team-best three-pointers and shot nearly 93 percent on free throws. With 4.5 rebounds per game, he had 13 games with five or more and had a season-best nine against Pleasure Ridge Park (March 2, 2021).
- In the summer of 2022, Washington III played on the EYBL circuit with All-Ohio Red. He averaged 13.5 points over his 13 game schedule, capping off the summer with 19 points against Team CP3 and Kentucky signee Robert Dillingham.

Papa Kante | 6-10 Forward | Senegal | South Kent Prep School

- Moving to the U.S. in 2019, Kante has been a force at the South Kent Prep School in Kent, Conn. As a junior, he earned All-New England Preparatory School Athletic Council Class AAA honorable mention honors after averaging 15.2 points and helping the Cardinals reach the semifinal of the NESPAC playoffs. Throughout his South Kent career, Kante has 19 games with 10+ points and four games of 20+ points, while tallying six games with 15+ rebounds.
- Kante, who has a 7-foot-4-inch wingspan, played with the N.Y. Renaissance on the 2022 EYBL circuit. He averaged 9.4 points, 7.6 rebounds and 1.3 blocks in 13 games this summer. He posted four double-figure games with a summer-best 17 against LivOn-Fleur De Lis in May. He also added three double-doubles.

Juwan Howard Comments

On the Class of 2023 recruiting class: "Papa and George are tremendous young men who are going to fit into our team and culture with ease. They come from wonderful families, who we really had a chance to get to know during the recruitment process. Both have a mind, and love, for the game, developing skill sets and the work ethic we like to see with players in our program."

On George Washinton III: "George comes from a basketball family. He is a coach's son. With all of that, he has grown up around the game. He has that certain mindset for it. We like that. He is crafty and is a gifted shooter and scorer. He has a well-rounded game and we can't wait to see him suit up."

On Papa Kante: "We are looking forward to bringing Papa into the fold,. He has size, broad shoulders and the ideal frame that could have an impact right away. He is a strong rebounder and loves to block shots. As he continues to add strength and works on all the little details, his offensive game will grow. Coach (Raphael) Chillious runs a great program and is well-known for developing his players for that next step."

Former Fab Five member and U-M All-American Juwan Howard begins his fourth season as the David and Meredith Kaplan men's basketball head coach. Overall, he is the 17th coach in program history.

Compiling 61 wins during his three-year tenure, Howard is the second U-M coach to amass 60+ wins to start their careers, joining his former coach and mentor Steve Fisher (62) on the exclusive list.

Claiming the Big Ten regular season title in 2021, Howard's Wolverines have three straight 10+ Big Ten winning seasons, helping U-M extend the program's streak to seven straight.

Howard has taken U-M to two NCAA Tournament appearances reaching two Sweet 16s (2021 & 2022) and the 2021 Elite Eight. The Wolverines were on track to make the 2020 NCAA Tournament, however, the coronavirus pandemic canceled the postseason.

In his second season, Howard not only guided the Wolverines to their 15th conference regular-season title, but U-M earned its second No. 1 seed in the Big Ten Tournament as well as the No. 1 seed in the NCAA East Region – the program's third No. 1 seed in history. Howard became the first to earn a No. 1 seed as a player and as a coach in the NCAA Tournament.

For his efforts that season, Howard was named the 2021 Associated Press National Coach of the Year, the Wolverines' second recipient and first since Bill Frieder in 1985. He was the first Big Ten coach to be recognized with the award since 2005.

The AP honor highlighted a slew of accolades as Howard was named the Big Ten Coach of the Year and earned the USBWA's District V Coach of the Year and the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) District 7 Coach of the Year awards. He was honored by the United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) with the Henry Iba Award.

In addition to his awards and honors, Howard guided center Hunter Dickinson to not only consensus All-America second team honors but to the Big Ten Freshman of the Year accolade as well. Dickinson added All-Big Ten first team (media) and second team (coaches) honors and was named to the All-Freshman squad, while Isaiah Livers earned a spot on the All-Big Ten second team (coaches and media) and Franz Wagner was an All-Big Ten second team (coaches) and third team (media) selection.

Before returning to his alma mater, Howard spent six years on the staff of the Miami Heat. Working under coach, and mentors, Erik Spoelstra and Pat Riley, Howard helped the Heat to three division titles (2014, '16, and '18) and Eastern Conference championship in 2014.

During the NBA Summer League, he was the head coach of Miami's 2016 team in both Orlando and Las Vegas as well as Team Africa in the 2018 NBA Africa Game. team and earned an All-NBA third team selection and All-Star appearance in 1996.

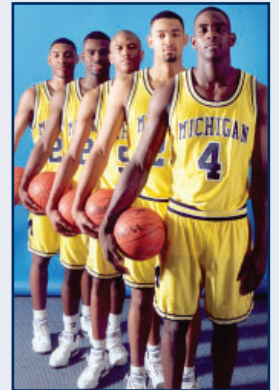

Associate Head Coach Phil Martelli



With over 46 years of coaching, legendary collegiate coach Phil Martelli continues to reshape the Michigan program as well as college basketball on a national landscape. Entering his fourth season as the associate head coach, Martelli not only serves as a mentor to Juwan Howard, but has brought vast experience to the Wolverines.

Michigan, who is 61-32 in the last three seasons, claimed the 2021 Big Ten regular-season title and earned the No. 1 seeds in the Big Ten and NCAA Tournaments in 2021. Despite the 2020 NCAA Tournament being canceled due to covid-19, the Wolverines have reached the Sweet 16 in two of Michigan's NCAA bids.

Before heading to Ann Arbor, Martelli spent 34 years at Saint Joseph's, with the final 24 seasons as head coach, where he built the Hawks' into one of the most consistent Atlantic 10 programs. The Hawks' all-time leader in career victories (444), Martelli recorded nine 20-plus win seasons including a school-record 30 in 2004. His A-10 record of 218-176 ranks second all-time, trailing only Temple's John Chaney.

Martelli's teams made 13 postseason appearances (7 NCAA, 6 NIT) advancing to two NCAA Sweet 16s (1997, 2004) and the 2004 Elite Eight. That 2004 team finished the regular season a perfect 27-0 and No. 1 in the country before suffering its first loss in the A-10 Tournament. Despite that, Saint Joseph's advanced to the Elite Eight. Martelli and his point guard Jameer Nelson swept the consensus National Coach and Player of the Year honors that year.

Overall, Martelli was named the A-10 Coach of the Year four times (1997, 2001, '04, '05), the USBWA District Coach of the Year twice (1997, 2004) and the Philadelphia Big 5 Coach of the Year four times (1996, '97, 2004, '16). He won six A-10 regular season/divisional titles (1997, 2001, '02, '03, '04, '05) and guided the Hawks to three A-10 Tournament titles (1997, 2014, '16). His 18 postseason wins (7 NCAA, 11 NIT) are the most in Saint Joseph's history.

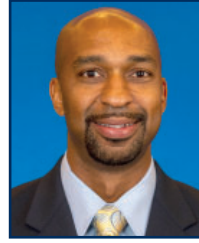
Martelli spent seven years as head basketball coach at Bishop Kenrick High School in the Philadelphia Catholic League; current Hall of Fame women's basketball coach Geno Auriemma served as an assistant under Martelli from 1979-81. He began his coaching career as an assistant coach at his alma mater Widener College in 1977, helping the Pioneers reach the 1978 NCAA Division III Final Four and title game.

Assistant Coach Saddi Washington



With more than two decades of college coaching experience, Saddi Washington begins his seventh season with Michigan. Washington was initially responsible for working with the big men before shifting to coordinate the defensive strategies and wing play.

With Washington's assistance, U-M has averaged 25+ wins per season with a program record 33 wins in 2017-18 (33-8) and 30 more wins in 2018-19 (30-7). The Wolverines have won 10+ Big Ten games in all six of Washington's seasons. He helped the Maize and Blue claim the 2021 Big Ten regular season title, the 2017 and 2018 Big Ten Tournament titles, advanced to five NCAA Sweet 16s, as well as a trip to the 2018 Final Four and the national championship game vs. Villanova.

Prior to heading to Ann Arbor, Washington spent a decade as a member of Oakland University's staff (2006-16) serving seven years as an assistant before being promoted to the associate head coach under Greg Kampe his final three seasons. Washington helped the Golden Grizzlies to 198 wins and five 20-plus win seasons. Oakland made back-to-back trips to the NCAA Tournament (2010, '11) after winning two straight Summit League regular season and conference tournament titles.

Before starting his coaching career serving as a volunteer assistant coach at Romulus High School (2005) under current Alabama head coach Nate Oats, Washington had a seven-year professional career overseas.

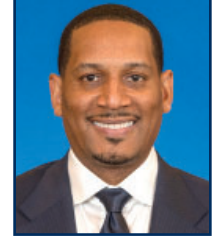
Collegiately, Washington was named to the 1994 Mid-American (MAC) All-Freshman Team, averaging 14 points per game at Western Michigan. A two-time All-MAC selection, he was a first-team pick as a senior in 1998 after scoring 626 points (21.6 per game). He helped lead the Broncos to the NCAA Tournament, where the Broncos upset Clemson in the first round.

Assistant Coach Howard Easley



Michigan native Howard Easley begins his fourth season with the Wolverines after a successful nine years coaching in the NBA. Easley has been instrumental with the guards as well as the Wolverine offensive sets and game strategies. With his efforts, U-M has gone 61-32, winning the 2021 Big Ten regular season title and making two trips to the Sweet 16 in the NCAA Tournament.

Prior to his return to NCAA coaching, Easley spent nearly a decade moving up the ranks in the NBA as a player development assistant with the Los Angeles Clippers, and as an assistant coach with the Washington Wizards (2014-16) and New York Knicks (2016-19).

Chosen with the 30th overall selection by the Minnesota Timberwolves in the 1994 NBA Draft, Easley played 12 seasons in the NBA, making stops with eight teams -- Minnesota, San Antonio, Utah, Dallas, New York, Phoenix, the Clippers and Denver. He played in 786 NBA games and recorded 5,116 career points, 2,748 assists, 540 steals and 516 3-point field goals. His career was highlighted by playing five seasons with the Utah Jazz and Hall of Fame point guard John Stockton, contributing to two Western Conference titles in 1997 and 1998.

A four-year starter at Boston College (1991-94), Easley helped guide the Eagles to the 1994 NCAA East Regional Final, where he earned all-regional tournament honors. He added All-Big East second team honors as a junior (1993) and senior (1994).

Prior to his collegiate career, Easley was a prep standout at Detroit's Southwestern High School, where he was teammates with future NBA players Jalen Rose and Voshon Lenard.
