ON THE PITCH

The No. 8 Penn State women's soccer team (4-1-0) opens Big Ten play this weekend in Indiana. The Nittany Lions begin conference play with a 7 p.m. match on Fri., Sept. 12 at Purdue. Penn State then travels to Bloomington, Ind., for a 1 p.m. matchup against Indiana.

RANKING RIGHT

The Nittany Lions' 4-1 start has shown that they're one of the best teams in the nation. In three of the four national collegiate women's soccer polls, Penn State is ranked in the top-10: seventh in the Bennett Rank, eighth in the NSCAA weekly poll and ninth in TopDrawerSoccer.com's list.

SPREADING THE WEALTH

Five games into the 2014 campaign, Penn State has threatened opponents up and down the lineup. The team's 12 goals have come from seven different players and five Nittany Lions have at least one assist. Mallory Weber (Novi,

SCOUTING THE BOILERMAKERS

Purdue (4-1-1) has started off strong this season, and is riding a five-game unbeaten streak coming into Friday's match. A major reason for the Boilermakers' success comes from their goalkeeping staff. Jordan Ginther, Maddy Olsen and Erika Yohn have played at least 140 minutes, allowing four goals in six matches with two shutouts. Maddy Williams is the team's top point-getter, with three goals and assists each to go along with 42 shots.

SERIES HISTORY vs. PURDUE

Penn State holds a 13-1-1 all-time record against the Boilermakers. Last season, the Nittany Lions dominated Purdue, 6-1, with five different players scoring goals. In the win, which was one in a string of nine wins, the Lions held the Boilermakers to just one shot.

SCOUTING THE HOOSIERS

Indiana (4-2) is coming off of a weekend sweep with wins over Dayton and George Mason. The team has yet to allow more than two goals in a match this season, helped in part by the play of four of its freshmen. Indiana has been led offensively by Jessie Bujouves, the only Hoosier with multiple goals (4). In net, the tandem of Katie Greulich and Sarah Stone has a combined 1.15 goals against average and .667 save percentage.

SERIES HISTORY vs. INDIANA

Against the Hoosiers, Penn State holds a 21-1-1 series advantage. In 2013, Penn State and Indiana went into halftime tied 1-1, but the Lions scored three goals in the second half for a 4-1 win and a perfect 8-0-0 September record.

Mich.) leads the pack with four goals scored, while Megan Schafer (Langhorne, Pa.) and Frannie Crouse (Greensburg, Pa.) have each scored a pair of goals.

HURD HURTS OPPONENT IN NORTH CAROLINA

Team captain Emily Hurd (Sammamish, Wash.) epitomized leadership in Penn State's 4-3 win over Duke on Sept. 7. The senior notched four points, scoring the Nittany Lions' opening goal of the game and dishing out two assists, one of which was on the game-winner, to match a career-best four points. She was named to the TopDrawerSoccer.com Women's Team of the Week for her performance after being honored on the All-Duke Nike Classic team.

UNDEFEATED START WAS SOMETHING SPECIAL

The Nittany Lions' 3-0 start was certainly impressive, but it's even more so when looking back in the program record books. The team has not had a 3-0 start to the season since 2005, when Penn State went 23-0-2 and advanced to its second Women's College Cup. Additionally, the perfect start is the first under head coach Erica Walsh's tutelage.

SCHAFER SCORES WEEKLY HONORS

Megan Schafer (Langhorne, Pa.) was named the Big Ten Co-Freshman Player of the Week on Sept. 3 after a stellar performance in the 3-1 win over UConn. She netted the first two goals of her collegiate career and became first freshman since 2010 to score a pair of goals in a single match. Schafer scored the 2-0 game-winner in the 27th minute, capitalizing on a UConn clearing attempt to put it past the Huskies goalkeeper. She scored again at 43:49, rising above a goal mouth scramble following a Penn State corner kick for the 3-0 lead.

FRESHMEN ON FIRE

The Nittany Lions' freshmen have proven to be major contributors during the 2014 campaign. Emily Ogle (Strongsville, Ohio), Frannie Crouse (Greensburg, Pa.), Elizabeth Ball (Richmond, Va.) and Maddie Elliston (Omaha, Neb.) have started every game, while Haleigh Echard (Lebanon, Pa.), Katy Keen (Zionsville, Ind.) and Megan Schafer (Langhorne, Pa.) played as reserves in the matches. At the top of the class sit Ogle and Schafer. Ogle, a TopDrawerSoccer.com Women's Team of the Week honoree, scored a goal and dished out an assist against No. 12 West Virginia, while Schafer, the Sept. 3 Big Ten Co-Freshman Player of the Week, became the first freshman since 2010 to score a pair when she netted two, including the game winner, against UConn.

HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE

The Nittany Lions take home field advantage to the next level. The team is 193-22-9 all-time at Jeffrey Field, losing just two matches in the past three seasons and shutting out visitors in 17 of 35 matches.

LIONS PICKED TO WIN BIG TEN

Penn State was tabbed to win the Big Ten regular season title, according to the 2014 Big Ten Women's Soccer Preseason Coaches' Poll. Wisconsin and Maryland earned the second- and third-most votes, respectively. The Nittany Lions have sat atop the poll every season since the poll began in 2003.

Three players from each Big Ten team were named Big Ten Women's Soccer Preseason Players to Watch, with senior Emily Hurd (Sammamish, Wash.) and juniors Mallory Weber (Novi, Mich.) and Raquel Rodriguez (San Jose, Costa Rica) representing the Blue and White.

CHURCH NAMED TO MAC HERMANN TROPHY WATCH LIST

Penn State senior Whitney Church (Ashburn, Va.) was named to the 2014 Women's Missouri Athletic Club's Hermann Award Watch List. This is Church's second-consecutive appearance on the Hermann Award Watch List. Church is one of 35 female NCAA Division I players named to the list and one of two Big Ten female student-athletes selected. The senior was an NSCAA All-Great Lakes and All-Big Ten second team selection in 2013. A defender, Church logged the second-most minutes on the Nittany Lions, starting 21 of 23 games for 1,945 minutes.

LIONS ON THE INTERNATIONAL STAGE

Over the summer, sophomore Brittany Basinger (Purcellville, Va.) and freshman Rose Chandler (Atlanta, Ga.) represented the United States at the 2014 FIFA Under-20 Women's World Cup, hosted by Canada. Penn State Head Coach Erica Walsh was also a member of the U.S. U-20 Women's National Team, serving as an assistant coach. The U.S. U-20 team went 2-2 at the tournament, besting China PR and Brazil, and was eliminated after the Group stage after falling 3-1 to Korea DPR. This was Chandler's first appearance as a member of the U-20 team while Basinger was a member of the 2014 CONCACAF Women's U-20 Championship team.

Chandler, Basinger and Walsh won't be the only Lions to don their country's colors in 2014. Junior Raquel Rodriguez (San Jose, Costa Rica) is a member of the Costa Rican Women's National Team. Rodriguez will compete for Costa Rica at the 2014 CONCACAF Women's Championship in October in an attempt to qualify for the 2015 FIFA Women's World Cup.

2012 NSCAA NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR TWO-TIME BIG TEN COACH OF THE YEAR (2009, 2012)

Head coach Erica Walsh enters her eighth season at the helm of the Penn State women's soccer program in 2014.

The Nittany Lions appeared in their 19th-straight NCAA Tournament in 2013, due in part to the success of senior Maya Hayes. The sixth-overall selection in the WPSL draft, Hayes set Penn State's single season record for points (79) in 2011 and finished her career ranked third in goals scored (71) and points (163), sixth in game-winning goals (17) and seventh in shots (291). Hayes was a M.A.C. Hermann Award Trophy semifinalist for the second straight year.

Walsh's 2012 Nittany Lions were the most successful team in program history after advancing to their first-ever national title game. The Nittany Lions won 21 of 27 games and were unbeaten in Big Ten action with a 10-0-1 record. The Lions registered their 15th consecutive Big Ten title and 18th-straight NCAA Tournament appearance. The 15-title mark is the second-most consecutive Big Ten Championships by a women's program, behind Northwestern's women's tennis team (16).

Senior Christine Nairn became just the seventh Nittany Lion to finish as a finalist for the prestigious Missouri Athletic Club's Hermann Trophy in 2012 under Walsh's tutelage while junior Maya Hayes was named a semifinalist for the award.

Walsh's success was recognized at the conference and national level as she earned Big Ten Coach of the Year and NSCAA National Coach of the Year honors.

Her 2011 team was a dominant force, winning 21 of 26 matches, while outscoring opponents 70-24. The Nittany Lions were 10-1-0 in Big Ten action and posted the seventh undefeated season at Jeffrey Field (9-0). Walsh helped guide the Lions to their 14th-straight Big Ten title and a spot to the NCAA Sweet Sixteen for the first time since 2007.

With Walsh's guidance, as a sophomore, Hayes became the nation's most prolific scorer in soccer in 2011 and was a finalist for the M.A.C. Hermann Trophy. Hayes led the nation with 31 goals and 70 points, breaking the then-Penn State single-season record for points.

During the 2011 summer, Walsh had an extraordinary experience of being one of the top assistants to Pia Sundhage and the 2011 United State women's national team at the FIFA World Cup in Germany. The U.S. made a sparkling run through knockout play to the final, falling to eventual champion Japan.

The 2010 campaign saw Walsh's young club make a remarkable turnaround mid-season, overcoming a two-game deficit in the league standings over the final weeks to capture a share of its 13th straight Big Ten title.

After a tough 2-4 start to the 2009 season, Walsh led the Nittany Lions to a remarkable turnaround, going 10-1-2 in the last 13 games of the regular season, earning her the 2009 Big Ten Coach of the Year Award for her efforts. With the impressive end to the season, Walsh and her charges captured the program's 12th-straight Big Ten Championship. By winning the Big Ten, the Nittany Lions continued their string of NCAA Tournament berths, making their 15th-straight appearance in the 64-team field in 2009. For the second time in three years, Penn State hosted the first and second rounds of tournament play.

Walsh also orchestrated one of the finest awards seasons in Penn State history when Katie Schoepfer, Alyssa Naeher and Christine Nairn swept the year-end Big Ten Player of the Year awards. Schoepfer was named the Offensive Player

of the Year, Naeher the Defensive Player of the Year and Nairn the Freshman of the Year. Danielle Toney was named to the All-Big Ten first team, while Lexi Marton garnered a second team mention.

Walsh continued her success from the 2007 campaign into a 16-8-0 record that saw Penn State capture its 11th-straight Big Ten Championship and the 2008 Big Ten Tournament crown. Her transition to Penn State was quite smooth as the 2007 team finished 18-4-2, including a 9-1-0 mark in conference play, and was ranked 12th in the final NSCAA poll of the season.

When she came to Penn State, Walsh brought with her a wealth of experience at both the international and collegiate levels. She already has coached at six different universities, including three stints as head coach as well as serving as an assistant for the U.S. U-19 team in 2004. Walsh served as head coach of the U-17 team from December 2004 until her hire at Penn State in February 2007.

In January 2009, Walsh was appointed as a member of the Panel of Instructors and Lecturers for FIFA Courses. In addition, she was appointed as the Chairman of the Women's Technical Committee for the period of January 1, 2009 to June 30, 2011.

In January of 2008, Walsh was named as the assistant coach by Pia Sundhage for the U.S. National Team. With Walsh's help and guidance the U.S. team completed its historic run with a gold medal at the 2008 Olympic Games in Beijing, China. Even sweeter was that Walsh's main responsibility was the U.S. Team's defense, which held fellow world power Brazil scoreless in the gold medal game.

The head coach at Harvard University as well as the U.S. U-17 team prior to her hiring at Penn State, Walsh has consistently been active among the coaching ranks both at the Division I level and the U.S. Youth National Team program for nearly a decade. Prior to her time with the Crimson, she was part of a Florida State staff that led the Seminoles to one of its most successful year to date. FSU joined Penn State in the 2005 Women's Soccer College Cup, with both programs reaching the national semifinals.

Walsh's coaching path began in 1997 as a graduate assistant with Bucknell University. In 1998, she accepted a position at Dartmouth, where she was an assistant coach for two seasons. After helping the team to a final NSCAA ranking of No. 8 at the conclusion of the team's 1998 NCAA quarterfinal run as well as an Ivy League championship in 1999, Walsh assumed head coaching duties before the 2000 season.

As head coach, Walsh led the Big Green to back-to-back Ivy League co-championships in 2000 and 2001. Her squad was ranked in the NSCAA's top 25 each year, rising as high as No. 13 in 2001. In her three seasons as head coach, Dartmouth was invited to the NCAA Tournament each season and reached the round of 16 twice. All three of her teams earned the NSCAA's Academic Team Award.

Walsh left Dartmouth to earn her Master's in business administration at Lehigh University where she served as a graduate assistant from 2003-04. Beginning in the spring of 2004, Walsh joined the United States U-19 team as an assistant coach where she helped with preparations for the U-19 World Cup. The U.S. finished with the bronze medal in Thailand after defeating Brazil in the third place match. After the World Cup, Walsh was appointed the U.S. National Team's U-17 head coach, a position which she held for three years.

As a player, Walsh was an NSCAA All-Region selection at William & Mary. A two-time first team All-CAA pick, she propelled her team to four NCAA Tournament appearances as well as two CAA regular season and two CAA league championships. In March of 2010, Walsh's alma mater, William & Mary, honored her by inducting her into the W&M Athletics Hall of Fame.

A high school All-American at Lower Moreland, she was also a member of the U.S. U-17 National Team.

Walsh earned her Bachelor of Science degree with a concentration in biology from William & Mary in 1997. The Huntingdon Valley, Pa., native holds an NSCAA Advanced National Degree and a USSF "A" Coaching License.

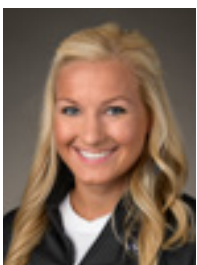

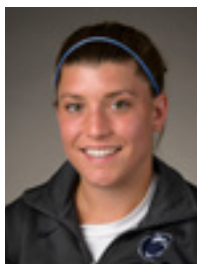
