THE STARTING FIVE

• No. 23/22 Michigan State continues conference action, traveling to Penn State to take on the Lady Lions on Thursday, Jan. 7 at the Bryce Jordan Center. The game will be televised on BTN Plus. The Spartans are currently 10-3 overall and 1-1 in league play, while Penn State is 6-7 overall and 1-1 in the B1G.

• With 21 points and a season-high 12 rebounds against Wisconsin on Jan. 3, junior forward Aerial Powers earned her fourth double-double of the season and 38th of her career. She is just one shy of tying Kristen Rasmussen (1997-00) who had 39 in her career. MSU Hall of Famer Mary Kay Intyre (1978-80) is the Spartan career leader in double-doubles with 43.

• The Spartans are fifth in the nation and second in the Big Ten in 3-point field goal defense, as opponents are shooting only 24.0 percent from beyond the arc. Boston College is first in the nation (22.6 percent), while Northwestern is first in the conference (23.9 percent). Eight times this season, the Spartans have held opponents to under 25.0 percent from the 3-point line, including holding Ohio State to 10.0 percent (2-20).

• MSU shortened its bench in the win against Wisconsin with four players tallying at least 30 minutes and scoring in double figures (Jankoska, Powers, Hines, Agee). Against the Badgers, only eight Spartans saw action, which was the fewest this season.

• Michigan State is seventh in the nation and second in the Big Ten in rebound margin (+14.7). Maryland is first in the nation and the league (+19.2). The Spartans have out-rebounded their opponents in 12 of 13 games this season. The only time that MSU was out-rebounded this season was a 84-76 loss to No. 5 Baylor on Nov. 28. The Bears out-rebounded the Spartans, 34-30.

TEAM NOTES

ABOUT PENN STATE

The Lady Lions are 6-7 overall and 1-1 in Big Ten play. Penn State captured the league opener with a 79-72 win over No. 14 Northwestern at home on Dec. 31. On Jan. 3, Minnesota topped Penn State 98-85 in Minneapolis. The Lady Lions weathered the storm of a four-game losing streak and have now won three of their last five games. PSU is a solid 6-1 at home this season, while Michigan State is 3-1 in true road games.

Freshman guard Teniya Page is one of five Lady Lions who averages over 10.0 points per game. Page leads the team in scoring averaging 14.8 points and 4.6 rebounds per game. Senior guard Brianna Banks is second in scoring with 13.5 ppg, while junior guard Lindsey Spann is third in scoring with 12.8 ppg. Junior forward Kaliyah Mitchell (10.5 ppg) and junior forward Peyton Whitted (10.2 ppg) round out the quintet of double-digit scorers. Whitted is the team leader in rebounds with 9.1 rpg.

Page is 23rd in the Big Ten in scoring (14.8 ppg). Peyton Whitted is tied for third in rebounding with Ohio State's Shayla Cooper, averaging 9.1 rpg. Page is also 11th in the conference in assists (4.0 apg). The Lady Lions are solid from the charity stripe. Spann third (87.8) behind Rutgers' Tyler Scaife (90.9) and MSU's Tori Jankoska (87.9). Mitchell is fifth in the Big Ten in free throw percentage (86.4).

After two league games, Page is fifth in B1G only stats, while Whyte is tied for 13th with 17.0 ppg. Senior center Candice Agee is tied for fifth in rebounding (10.0 rpg), while Mitchell is tied for ninth (9.0 rpg). Spann is tied for third in 3-point field goals made with 3.5 per game.

The Lady Lions are 10th in the Big Ten in scoring offense (72.1) and 12th in the league in scoring defense (69.8). Penn State is fifth in the B1G in steals (8.9) and seventh in turnover margin (+2.3). PSU is 13th in field goal percentage (41.8) just ahead of Illinois (41.7). Penn State is also 11th in blocks (3.6 bpg), while standing 13th in assists (13.1 apg).

After two B1G contests, Penn State is second in scoring offense (82.0), while ranking 14th in scoring defense (85.0), to rank tied for 10th in scoring margin (-3.0). The Lady Lions are tied for fourth in 3-point field goal percentage (38.5) and seventh in 3-point field goal defense (35.0). PSU is first in rebounding offense (50.5), while standing tied for second with Iowa in defensive rebounds (31.5).

Penn State head coach Coquese Washington is in her ninth season leading the Lady Lions, logging a 154-112 (.579) ledger.

LAST TIME MSU VERSUS PENN STATE - Spartans 74, Lady Lions 67 - Feb. 11, 2015

Sophomore guard/forward Aerial Powers became the fastest Michigan State women's basketball player to 1,000 points as the Spartans defeated Penn State at the Bryce Jordan Center, 74-67.

Powers ended the game with 26 points and has now scored 1,006 points in her two-year career, becoming the second Spartan this season and the 24th in MSU program history to hit 1,000 career points, as senior forward Becca Mills reached the 1,000 points milestone earlier this season at Michigan on Jan. 4. The 26 points Wednesday gives Powers 564 points this season, moving up to No. 2 on MSU's single-season scoring list and just 33 points from tying Liz Shimek's 597 points in 2005-06 for the school record.

SPARTANS AGAINST THE LADY LIONS SERIES HISTORY

Michigan State and Penn State will be meeting for the 43rd time in the series, with PSU holding a 27-15 advantage, including 16-5 in University Park. The Spartans have won six of the last nine games between the two teams. Last season, Michigan State defeated Penn State, 74-67, on Feb. 11, 2015. Aerial Powers earned her 1,000 point last season against the Nittany Lions.

SPARTANS CAREER AGAINST PENN STATE

Junior forward Aerial Powers has played only two games against Penn State, but has made the most of her appearances. She has averaged 19.9 points and 9.5 rebounds in two games. Last season in University Park, Powers had a memorable game scoring her 1,000 point on a free throw in the Spartans' 74-67 win. Junior guard Tori Jankoska has also played two games against the Lady Lions, scoring 18 points with 11 boards in the MSU win. Overall, Jankoska has averaged 13.0 ppg and 5.5 rpg. Senior center Jasmine Hine has played a team-high six games against Penn State, starting one. In six games, she has averaged 4.7 points.

Eight current Spartans have played at least one game against Penn State in their career, including Powers, Hines, Jankoska, Cara Miller, Kennedy Johnson, Akyah Taylor, Branndais Agee and Lexi Gussert.

CLOSE CALLS

All three of Michigan State's losses this season have been by a very close margin. The Spartans trio of losses by eight points or less. MSU fell to Baylor by eight points, 84-76, while losing to Louisville by seven 85-78. The Spartans closest game of the season was an 85-80 defeat to Ohio State in Columbus on Dec. 31.

HOW THE SPARTANS' RANK

Michigan State is fourth in the conference in scoring defense, allowing only 59.6 points per game. The Spartans are also first in the Big Ten in free throw percentage (.770), as well as standing second in three-point field goal defense (.240). Michigan State is also second in rebound margin (+14.7), just behind Maryland (+19.2).

Aerial Powers is ninth in the B1G in scoring with 18.5 ppg. Powers is still sixth in rebounds with 8.6 rpg. Tori Jankoska is tied for 12th in scoring, averaging 17.4 ppg. She is also second in free throw percentage, shooting 87.9 percent. Akyah Taylor is tied for third in offensive rebounds with 3.2 per game.

SPARTANS IN B1G OPENERS

Michigan State is 23-12 in home Big Ten openers in 35 years in the league. The Spartans have won six of their last seven in the Breslin Center. MSU has only played Wisconsin in the B1G home opener twice, falling 67-66, during the 1983-84 season and winning on Sunday.

After a loss to Ohio State, Michigan State is 17-18 all-time in Big Ten openers, having won its last four of its last six ... Under Coach Merchant, the Spartans are 5-4 in Big Ten openers ... This is the fourth time in the last five years that MSU has opened Big Ten play on the road, beating Minnesota, 81-56, in the 2013-14 season ... This was the first time since the 1998-99 season that Michigan State tipped off Big Ten action against Ohio State, when the Spartans lost to the Buckeyes, 62-60, in East Lansing.

LAST TIME OUT: MSU VS. WISCONSIN

Aerial Powers scored 21 points and grabbed 12 rebounds, Jasmine Hines added 15 points and No. 24 Michigan State turned back Wisconsin on Sunday.

Tori Jankoska added 14 points and seven assists and Brannndais Agee had 11 points, five steals and four assists for the Spartans (10-3, 1-1 Big Ten), who were perfect on nine free throws in the fourth quarter.

Dakota Whyte and Cayla McMorris had 14 points apiece for Wisconsin (5-7, 1-1).

JANKOSKA HONORED BY BIG TEN

Michigan State junior guard Tori Jankoska was named Big Ten Women's Basketball Player of the Week the week of Dec. 28.

The Freeland, Mich., native earned her second career Big Ten Player of the Week honor, also being honored in February 2015. Jankoska also earned Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors on Feb. 25, 2014. Jankoska guided the Spartans to a win over Detroit on Dec. 21 with a near triple-double. Against the Titans she recorded a game-high 28 points and 10 rebounds. She also added seven assists in recording her first double-double of the season. She shot 81.8 percent (9-11) from the floor and 66.7 percent (4-6) from three-point range. The junior was also a perfect 6-6 from the charity stripe.

This season both Jankoska (Nov. 30) junior forward Aerial Powers (Dec. 14) have been named to the Big Ten honor roll.

AGAINST IN-STATE SCHOOLS

Michigan State has had great success against other collegiate programs in the state of Michigan over the past 12 seasons. Since the beginning of the 2002-03 season, the Spartans are 47-4 (.922) against in-state rivals, including a 32-4 (.889) mark under Coach Merchant. All-time, Michigan State is 180-59 (.753) against other Michigan schools.

MAGIC NUMBERS

In head coach Suzy Merchant's tenure, when two numbers on the scoreboard were achieved it typically has been a sign of a MSU win. The Spartans scored over 70 points for the 11th-straight game and the 11th time overall this season. MSU has won 77 of its last 82 games when scoring at least 70 points, and MSU is 94-10 under head coach Suzy Merchant when hanging at least 70 points on the scoreboard. This year, MSU is 9-3 when scoring at least 70 points.

SPARTANS IN JUNKANOO JAM

Michigan State played in the Bahamas for the second time, after playing in the Junkanoo Jam in the 2009-10 season, going 2-0 with a 78-47 win over George Washington on Nov. 27, 2009 and a wild, 93-90 double-OT win over Oklahoma State on Nov. 28, 2009. Senior Allyssa DeHaan was named the Lucaya Division's most valuable player, while Kalisha Keane joined her on the all-tournament team.

Overall, the Spartans are now 3-1 in the Junkanoo Jam with a win against Cincinnati and a loss to No. 5/4 Baylor. Tori Jankoska and Aerial Powers were both named to the all-tournament team.

IN THE MONTH OF DECEMBER

The Spartans improved to 164-94 (.636) all-time in the month of December. Under Coach Merchant, Michigan State is 47-24 (.662) in the 12th month of the calendar year. The Spartans have won 19 of their last 30 games in December.

CLOSING IT OUT

The Spartans have been extremely effective closing out games over the last couple years, winning 128 of their last 1312 games (.970) when leading with five minutes left, including 79 of their last 82. In Coach Merchant's tenure, Michigan State is 164-7 (.959) when holding a lead with five minutes left. This season, the Spartans are 10-0 when leading with five minutes left.

AGAINST RANKED OPPONENTS

Under Coach Merchant, Michigan State is 22-40 against ranked teams, including 15-12 at home and 5-17 on the road. As a ranked team against fellow ranked team, MSU is 12-20 versus ranked teams. This season MSU is 0-2 against ranked teams with losses to then-No. 5 Baylor and No. 9 Ohio State.

SHE'S BACK

Junior forward Aerial Powers returned to the lineup on Nov. 21 against Idaho State. The All-American scored 12 points in 20 minutes of action against Idaho State. In just her second game, she scored an efficient 20 points in 14 minutes. She has reached double figures in scoring in every game she has played this season. Powers also had her first double-double of the season against Davidson on Dec. 9.

UP NEXT

The Spartans will now return home to host No. 16 Northwestern on Sunday, Jan. 10 on BTN. The time of that game is set for 2 p.m. MSU will then travel to Indiana to take on the Hoosiers on Wednesday, Jan. 13 at 7 p.m. on BTN Plus.

POWERS NAMED TO PRESEASON WATCH LISTS

The John R. Wooden Award announced the Women's Preseason Top 30 on ESPN's SportsCenter and on ESPNW. The list is comprised of 30 student-

athletes who are the early front-runners for college basketball's most prestigious honor. The list is chosen by a preseason poll of national women's college basketball media members. Junior forward Aerial Powers represented Michigan State. Powers was also named to the Naismith Early Season Watch List on Dec. 9. She was one of nine players from the Big Ten conference honored on the Naismith Preseason list.

Senior guard Denzel Valentine was named to the men's Wooden Award Watch List and the Naismith Watch List. Seven conferences are represented on the list with the SEC boasting seven selections, followed by the ACC and Big Ten with six apiece. Thirteen schools in the nation have a player on both the men and the women's side. In the Big Ten, Michigan State and Maryland are the only schools to be represented on both the men and women's side.

BOUNTIFUL BENCH

In 13 games, MSU have had 280 points off the bench. Against Cincinnati alone, the Spartan reserves scored 49 points, including 20 from Aerial Powers alone. MSU also got 18 points from Cara Miller and Lexi Gussert alone, which were season highs for both players. MSU's opponents have scored only 215 points off the bench through the first 13 games of this season. Senior Akyah Taylor has scored 64 points off the bench, averaging 8.0 ppg, while freshman Jenna Allen averages 4.0 ppg off the bench.

BOUNCE BACK ABILITY

In Coach Merchant's first nine seasons, the Spartans are 61-25 (70.9%) following a loss.

POWERS EARNS PRESEASON HONOR

Michigan State junior forward Aerial Powers was named Associated Press honorable mention preseason All-America. Powers, a native of Detroit, Michigan, earned honorable mention All-American honors by both the AP and the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) following her sophomore campaign. She is one of seven All-Americans in Michigan State history.

The forward had a record-setting season in 2015, establishing new Spartan single-season records for points (678) and rebounds (375). She also became just the second Michigan State women's basketball player to average over 20 points per game. Powers also broke the MSU record for scoring average with a 21.9 points per game. She shattered a 40-year-old record, as Linda Stoick averaged 20.4 ppg during the 1975 season.

WHO'S BACK

This season the Spartans return their top two scorers from last season in All-Big Ten honorees Aerial Powers and Tori Jankoska. Both had monster sophomore campaigns with Powers averaging 21.9 points and 12.1 rebounds per game. Jankoska was second on the team in scoring averaging 17.5 ppg and was first in assists with 3.9 apg. Sophomores

Lexi Gussert and Kennedy Johnson are back with a year under their belts. Due to an injury plagued season last year both played 29 games. Senior Cara Miller also so significant time last season, playing in 30 games and starting 11.

Michigan State also had three players returning to the lineup. Senior Jasmine Hines missed most of the 2014-15 season with injury, while redshirt-sophomore Brannndais Agee was out all of last season. Senior Akyah Taylor comes back to East Lansing after two seasons at St. Francis. Taylor played in 16 games during the 2012-13 season.

FANS CONTINUE TO PACK THE BRESLIN

Michigan State women's basketball continues to pack the Breslin Center, finishing the 2014-15 season 10th in the nation in home attendance. The Spartans averaged 6,119 fans in 16 home games this season. MSU had a total of 97,906 fans pass through the gates. This is the 11th-straight season that the Spartans have been ranked in the top 15 nationally in attendance. MSU has had a total attendance of at least 80,000 since 2005-06.

AERIAL POWERS GOLD MEDALIST

Junior forward Aerial Powers has a very eventful offseason. She helped guide the United States to a gold medal in the World University Games. The U.S. defeated Canada in the gold medal game, as Powers led the team with 27 points and nine rebounds. Powers also led the team in scoring for the tournament with 18.0 points per game on 51.4 percent shooting from the floor. She averaged 6.0 rebounds per game in six games.

The United States finished with a perfect 6-0 record after going 3-0 in the group stage and sweeping through the medal round. USA Basketball women's teams have participated in 18 World University Games and collected a record 10 golds, six silvers and one bronze medal. Team USA has won gold medals in the past six World University Games in which it has competed (2001, 2005, 2009, 2011, 2013, 2015).

SPARTANS RANKED IN PRESEASON POLL

Michigan State women's basketball opened the 2015-16 season ranked No. 24 in the Associated Press Top 25 Poll.

This marks the third-straight season that the Spartans are ranked in the Preseason AP Poll after being No. 20 in 2013-14 and No. 14 in 2014-15. It is also the sixth time under head coach Suzy Merchant that MSU has had a preseason AP ranking with a No. 17 ranking in her first year at the helm of the Spartans in 2007-08, along with No. 10 in 2009-10 and No. 25 in 2010-11. The Spartans are one of four Big Ten Conference teams in this year's Preseason AP Top 25, joined by No. 6 Ohio State, No. 9 Maryland and No. 19 Northwestern. Additionally, Rutgers and Iowa were among others receiving votes. Those three opponents make up a total of five preseason ranked foes on the Spartans' 2015-16 sched-

ule, along with No. 5 Baylor, No. 8 Louisville.

MSU SIGNS NATIONALLY RANKED RECRUITING CLASS

Michigan State women's basketball head coach Suzy Merchant announced the signing of three National Letters of Intent, including Mardreka Cook (Muskegon, Michigan/Muskegon), Nia Hollie (Minnetonka, Minnesota/Hopkins) and Taryn McCutcheon (Parkersburg, West Virginia/Parkersburg South). The three players are currently ranked No. 11 by ESPN Hoopgurlz.

Cook is a 6-0 forward from Muskegon, Michigan, who plays for head coach Rodney Walker at Muskegon High School. She is ranked No. 37 in the nation by both ESPN's Hoopgurlz and Dan Olson's Collegiate Girls Basketball Report. As junior, Cook averaged 22 points and 14 rebounds, leading Muskegon back to the district finals. In just three seasons, she surpassed the 1,000-point mark and is a three-time all-conference selection. Last season, she also added first-team all-state accolades to her resume. She is the daughter of Sabrina Ware and Mardrekus Cook.

Hollie is a 6-0 forward from Minnetonka, Minnesota, who plays for head coach Brian Cosgriff at Hopkins High School. Hollie is also ranked No. 27 by Prospect Nation and No. 33 by the All-Star Girls Basketball Report. Last season, Hollie led Hopkins High School to the class 4A state championship, while earning all-tournament honors. She scored a game-high 26 points in the championship game, as the Royals ended the season with a 30-1 record. She is also a three-time all-conference honoree, as well as earning all-state accolades as a sophomore and a junior. For her high school career, she has averaged 15.7 ppg and 4.6 rpg. She is the daughter of Hortense Hollie and Alton Brown III.

McCutcheon is a 5-5 guard from Parkersburg, West Virginia, who plays for head coach Scott Stephens at Parkersburg South High School. She is ranked No. 71 in the country by ESPN's Hoopgurlz and No. 70 by Dan Olson's Collegiate Girls Basketball Report. McCutcheon is also ranked No. 59 by Prospect Nation and No. 82 by Blue Star Basketball. She is a three-time first-team all-state honoree. McCutcheon is also a three-time Two Rivers Athletic Conference and Ohio Valley Athletic Conference selection. In her first three years of high school, McCutcheon and the Parkersburg South have accumulated a 68-13 overall record, including winning the state title as a freshman. In high school, she has averaged 15.0 ppg 7.0 apg. She is the daughter of Deana and Jason McCutcheon, who were both collegiate athletes.

MICHIGAN STATE HEAD COACH SUZY MERCHANT

The level of success is undeniable. Suzy Merchant, entering her ninth season as head coach of the Michigan State women's basketball program, has proven to be one of the best coaches in Michigan State history and a force in the Big Ten Conference. Through her first eight seasons, Merchant has brought the Spartan program to the upper echelon at the Big Ten and national level. The Spartans have finished third or better in the Big Ten in seven of the last eight seasons, and her conference record of 89-47 (65.4%) is the 10th-best career winning percentage in the 32-year history of the Big Ten and is the second-highest percentage among active coaches. The Spartans have won at least 20 games in seven of her eight seasons.

The Great Lakes State native was hired at MSU on April 30, 2007, after spending time as a head coach at Eastern Michigan (1998-07) and Saginaw Valley State (1995-98). In her 20 years as a head coach, she has won more than 64-percent of her games, collecting a 380-207 (.648) career record, including 179-87 (.673) in her eight seasons in East Lansing. Merchant became the fastest Spartan coach to 100 wins. She is also the winningest coach in Eastern Michigan history, compiling a 147-91 record in her nine seasons.

Through her first eight seasons at MSU, 27 Spartans have earned All-Big Ten recognition (the most in the conference) and 42 have been named Academic All-Big Ten. A pair of Spartans have earned major Big Ten awards - Kalisha Keane was the Big Ten Player of the Year in 2010-11, following up the Sixth Player of the Year award as a junior, while Lykendra Johnson (2010-11) and Allyssa DeHaan (2009-10) were named Big Ten Defensive Players of the Year. DeHaan, who finished her career second all-time in NCAA history in blocked shots, and Keane were also named All-Americans following their senior seasons. In 2013-14, Aerial Powers became the first Spartan freshman to earn first-team All-Big Ten honors. Last season, Powers earned All-American honors after setting a single-season record with 24 double-doubles.

The 2014-15 Spartans suffered through an injury-plagued season, finishing 16-15 overall and 7-11 in Big Ten action. Powers and Tori Jankoska earned All-Big Ten honors with Power being named to the First Team and Jankoska to the second. The Spartans have been packing the stands as well, finishing 10th in the nation and second in the Big Ten in attendance, averaging 6,119 fans per game.

In 2013-14, MSU captured a share of the Big Ten title with a 23-10 overall record and a stellar 13-3 league record. The Green and White have now had 11-straight 20-win season. The Spartans qualified for the "Big Dance" for a school-record sixth-straight season, advancing to the second round. Powers was also named to the All-Freshman team, while Annalise Pickrel was named to the second-team, Klarissa Bell, Jankoska and Becca Mills picked up honorable mention honors.

In 2012-13, Michigan State overcame adversity to go 25-9, the third-most wins in program history. MSU went 10-6 in Big Ten play to tie for third and won at least 10 conference games for the 11th-straight season. They made it to the Big Ten Tournament Championship game for the first time under Merchant and for just the second time in program history. Three Spartans earned All-Big Ten honors with junior Bell being named to the third team, and senior Jasmine Thomas and sophomore Kiana Johnson added as honorable mention selections. Also, the team had a program-record seven Academic All-Big Ten honors.

In 2011-12, the Spartans continued their string of 20-win seasons, going 20-12 and advancing to their fourth-consecutive NCAA Tournament. MSU went 11-5 in conference play to tie for second in the Big Ten. Seniors Lykendra Johnson and Porsche Poole earned second team All-Big Ten accolades. With the win over Oakland (Nov. 27) last season, Merchant became the fastest head coach to 100 wins as a Spartan, needing only 143 games.

Merchant put her stamp on the Spartan program during the 2010-11 season, leading the Spartans to their first outright Big Ten title in school history. MSU went 13-3, winning the conference by two games.

In the summer of 2009, Merchant spent time with USA Basketball as an assistant coach for the Women's World University Games team in Belgrade, Serbia. Team USA went undefeated and took home the Gold medal, topping Russia, 83-64 in the championship game.

In her first season at Michigan State, Merchant took the youngest team in the Big Ten to its seventh-straight post-season trip, advancing to the championship game of the WNIT, and tied for the most wins (23) by a first-year Spartan basketball coach in MSU history.

During her tenure with the Eagles, Merchant guided Eastern Michigan to a record of 147-91 (.618), including three 20-win seasons, three postseason appearances and two Mid-American Conference West Division titles. Before coaching at Eastern Michigan, Merchant spent three seasons at Saginaw Valley State, posting a 54-29 (.651) record.

A four-year starter and three-year captain at Central Michigan (1987-91), Merchant holds Chippewa records for assists with 463 and single-season assists with 156, and is tied for first in single-game assists with 11. She also finished her career third-best in made 3-point field goals with 75.

A native of Traverse City, Mich., Merchant was a three-sport standout at Traverse City Central High School, lettering in basketball, volleyball and softball. She earned honorable mention All-America honors by USA Today and was a two-time Class A all-state selection in basketball. She also earned all-state honors in volleyball. During the summer of 2010, she was inducted into the Traverse City Central H.S. Hall of Fame.
