The Scene Setter

- Michigan and Penn State play its lone regular season match-up Tuesday (Feb. 8) at the Bryce Jordan Center. U-M's second straight road game starts a busy week for the Maize and Blue, as the Wolverines will play three games over the next five days.
- In U-M's final 10 Big Ten games, the Wolverines will face six nationally ranked foes.
- After having its first regular season game with No. 4 Purdue postponed due to covid-19 protocols within the Wolverine program, it was rescheduled for Thursday (Feb. 10). Now that new date will mark just five days between U-M's first match-up with the Boilermakers at Mackey Arena, an 82-76 loss (Feb. 5). The schedule closes with No. 16 Ohio State coming to Ann Arbor on Saturday (Feb. 12).
- Already road warriors (11 games), U-M have three road games over its next five Big Ten games. So far, the Wolverines have a 4-7 record away from Ann Arbor.
- After that five-game stretch, the Wolverines will play four straight at Crisler Center from Feb. 23 to March 3.
- Hunter Dickinson has 20+ points in six of his last seven games (22.7 ppg, 62.4%). He has nine total 20+ point games this season and leads U-M with 18.1 points and 7.9 rebounds for second straight season.
- Eli Brooks is expected to play in his 146th game at Penn State, tying him with Zavier Simpson as U-M's all-time leader for career games played. Brooks has started all 20 games averaging 11.7 points, 3.4 rebounds and 2.9 assists.

The Penn State Nittany Lions

- Penn State hosts U-M sporting a 9-10 overall record and a 4-7 mark in Big Ten play in Micah Shrewsberry's first season as head coach. The Nittany Lions have lost four of its last five games -- all on the road.
- The Nittany Lions, who are 7-3 at home, will play five of its next seven games at home in the Bryce Jordan Center.
- Penn State averages 65.5 points, grabs 36.3 rebounds and is shooting 42.8 percent from the field.
- Penn State is led by junior forward Seth Lundy, who has averaged 13.0 points, 5.8 rebounds, leads the team in three-pointers (39) and blocks (11) while adding 18 steals.
- Senior guard Jalen Pickett (Siena transfer) posts 12.8 points per game and leads the team with 4.2 assists. His 30 three-pointers is third on the team. Backcourt mate and senior Sam Sessoms has balanced the Nittany Lions guardsw with his 11.4 points, 3.4 rebounds and 3.0 assists.
- One of four super seniors, John Harrar has provided strong play down low averaging 10.3 points and a team-best 9.5 rebounds, including 3.3 offensive boards (tops in Big Ten and 18thg nationally). His 63 offensive rebounds are more than triple the next closest Nittany Lion.
- With 86 percent of his offense coming from long range (92-of-107), senior Myles Dread has made 33 triples averaging 6.1 points per game.

Who are the Michigan Wolverines?

- Michigan is led by third year coach Juwan Howard. After 25 years in the NBA -- 19 as a player and six as an assistant (all with the Miami Heat), Howard embarked on his first head coaching journey with his alma mater.
- For a third straight season, associate head coach Phil Martelli (third year) and assistants Saddi Washington (sixth year) and Howard Easley (third year) will help Juwan Howard on the sidelines.
- A big believer in culture -- especially from his Miami Heat days with Pat Riley and Erik Spoelstra -- Howard runs his program by six values -- Discipline, Family, All-In, Accountability, Trust and Sacrifice.
- Howard wants his Wolverine program to be a "solution based" and "player led" team. He continues to give a voice to his players allowing them freedom to express opinions in practice, huddles and on the floor.
- Overall, the Wolverines will look to play at a fast-paced, "read-and-react" offense with ball screen actions as the primary mainstay in their offensive sets. However, U-M constantly adjusts to its personnel with more cutting, downhill attacks and taking the open shot at a much higher level.
- Howard's Wolverines have continued to develop into a "position-less" team as several players will rotate and play multiple spots during a game.
- Defensively, U-M primarily runs a man-to-man defense, however, they will incorporate some zone packages.
- Coined by Saddi Washington, the Wolverines big men live by a basic philosophy -- "BIG" ... "Basic is Good" -- control what you can control and do your job.

Last Time on the Hardwood

- Despite a valiant effort and a career-best-tying 28 points from Hunter Dickinson, Michigan fell 82-76 to No. 4-ranked Purdue at a raucous Mackey Arena.
- The Wolverines and Boilermakers each shot better than 50 percent from the field (55.8 percent and 51.7 percent, respectively), however, Purdue's rebounding advantage (32 to 22) and inside scoring (44 to 26) led to the win. Michigan countered with eight three-pointers, while holding the nation's No. 2-rated deep-shooting team to five, half of its per-game average (9.9 per game).
- Dickinson led the Wolverines with his ninth 20-plus-point performance of the season as he closed with a career-best-tying 28 points, finishing 12-for-17 from the field, with a pair of three-pointers. He added two rebounds and two blocks. Five of his 11 three-pointers have come in the state of Indiana.
- DeVante' Jones added 12 points, four rebounds and four assists, while Caleb Houston had 11 points and three assists.

Breaking Down U-M's Big Fella

- For a second straight season, Hunter Dickinson leads U-M in scoring (18.1) and rebounding (7.9). Last season as a consensus All-America second teamer, he led U-M with 14.1 points (first frosh since 2018-19; Ignas Brazdeikis) and 7.4 rebounds (first frosh since 2012-13; Mitch McGary).
- The last Wolverine to average more than 17+ points in a season was Nik Stauskas (17.5 ppg) during 2013-14, when he guided U-M to the Big Ten title (by three games) and was named the Big Ten Player of the Year. The last Wolverine to average 18+ points was Manny Harris (18.1) during the 2009-10 season.
- Dickinson has 16 double figure games with a team-best nine 20+ point games including a career-best-tying 28 at Purdue (Feb. 5). He has had 20+ points in six of his last seven games.
- The last Wolverine to average more than 8+ rebounds in a season was LaVell Blanchard (8.4 rpg) during the 2000-01 season -- two decades ago. Dickinson has a team-best six games of 10+ rebounds, which has led to his team-best five double-doubles.
- Dickinson had 25 assists (0.9 apg) in 28 games last season. This season (19 games), he has 42 (2.2 apg), including a career-best six against Maryland (Jan. 18). He has eight games of 3+ dimes.
- Dickinson has a team-best seven games with 10+ field goals as he is shooting 60.3% from the field, which is second in the Big Ten and 11th nationally. Purdue's Zach Edey (68.5%) leads the nation and Big Ten.

Breaking Down the Elder Statesmen Duo

- Eli Brooks has continued his longevity in his extra season. Starting all 20 games, when he suits up at Penn State, he will tie Xavier Simpson's mark for most career games at U-M with 146.
- Behind Hunter Dickinson's team-leading 18.1 points per game, Brooks is second with 11.7 points per game as he has posted 14 games in double figures, which sets a new single season career best. He had 13 double figure games in each of his last two seasons.
- With his 11.7 per game average, Brooks is inching his way toward 1,000 points. With 955 career points, he needs just 45 more to become the 56th Wolverine to reach the milestone.
- Brooks is second on U-M with 31 three-pointers -- as he now has three straight seasons of 30+ long range buckets. He needs five more to become the 15th Wolverine to surpass 150 in a career. He had a career-best 52 as a sophomore.
- Brooks has started his last 77 games -- basically his last three seasons. However, they are not technically consecutive as he has missed two games -- one (Wisconsin, Feb. 27, 2020) due to after effects of a broken nose and another (at Minnesota, Jan. 16, 2021) due to a foot injury. For his career, he has 89.
- This season, Brooks has gone 38-for-43 (88.4%) from the free throw line. He is 78-for-87 over (89.6%) over his last two seasons and for his career he is shooting - 81.6% (124-for-152).
- DeVante' Jones has made 12 of his 16 three-pointers during his last 10 games after starting his career with the Wolverines making just four in his first 10 games. In addition to his shooting, he has scored in double figures in eight of his last 11 -- with a season-best 19 against Nebraska (Feb. 1).
- Jones leads U-M with 77 (3.9 apg) assists. He has a season-best eight assists at Nebraska (Dec. 7) and vs. UNLV (Nov. 19) at the Roman Main Event in Las Vegas. He has 10 games of 4+ assists. Brooks is second with 58 (2.9 apg) -- his third straight season with 50+ assists.
- After surpassing 100 career games played, Jones needs three more starts (97) to surpass the century mark.

U-M's International Tandem

- Not only did they battle during their prep days in Florida, not only are they roommates, but Caleb Houston (Canada) and Moussa Diabate (France) have continued their impact in the first year at U-M.
- Starting all 20 games, Houston leads U-M with 34 three-pointers as he has used those long range buckets to average 10.7 per game, third on U-M. He has added 4.4 rebounds per game.
- Houston has made 3+ three-pointers in six games, including three of his last six games with a career-best five at Indiana (Jan. 23). He has 11 double figure games with a career-best 19 at Indiana.
- Diabate, who has 13 starts, has continued to clean the glass with his 6.1 per game. He has 5+ board in 15 games, including a career-best 13 against Minnesota (Dec. 11).
- In addition to be board work, Diabate has slowly improved his scoring averaging 8.6 per game. He has eight double figure games, with a career-best 15 at Rutgers (Jan. 4).
- After a career-best three blocks at Michigan State (Jan. 29) and one at Purdue (Feb. 4), Diabate has 15 on the season. Combined with Hunter Dickinson (20) combine for 35 of U-M's 56 blocks (63%).

COVID and the Maize & Blue

- Michigan has six games effected by protocols this season. First, U-M's non-conference match-up with Purdue-Fort Wayne (Dec. 21) was canceled due to internal protocols within the Mastodons program.
- U-M's game at Rutgers (Jan. 4) saw the Wolverines without five players -- four (Frankie Collins, Jaron Faulds, Brandon Johns, Jr., and Terrance Williams II) due to protocols and Zeb Jackson out for personal reasons. Rutgers beat U-M for the first time in 14 tries, 75-67.
- U-M had its home games with Michigan State (Jan. 8) and Purdue (Jan. 11) postponed due to COVID-19 protocols within the Wolverines program. The Wolverines did not have enough scholarship players to meet the Big Ten's requirement of seven. The Big Ten is working to reschedule both games.
- Returning, U-M headed to Illinois with 15 players, however, upon arrival and following warm-ups, Hunter Dickinson and Brandon Johns, Jr., would not play due to conditioning and stamina after effects. Jackson missed a second game due to person leave and Brandon Wade to illness (non-covid).
- Dickinson made his return against Maryland (Jan. 18), however, Brandon Johns, Jr. was still unable to participate due to the after effects.

Breaking Down the Covid Year

- The NCAA is allowing the 2020-21 season to not count as a competition season for student-athletes, essentially allowing an extra season of eligibility, as long as the student-athlete was otherwise eligible.
- So current sophomores, juniors and seniors have an extra season. Incoming freshmen do not qualify.
- Schools can grant an additional season if they have a scholarship available as the extra season counts towards a program's allotment. However, athletes could elect to pay their own way. Additionally, student-athletes could transfer with the extra season, however, they would need to meet the NCAA transfer eligibility requirements.
- For Michigan Basketball, Eli Brooks elected to use his bonus season to return to the Wolverines and is working on his masters. Graduate guard DeVante' Jones still has his extra season available after coming to U-M after his career at Coastal Carolina.
- Wolverine seniors Brandon Johns, Jr., Adrien Nunez, Jaron Faulds, redshirt senior Brandon Wade and sophomores Hunter Dickinson, Jace Howard, Zeb Jackson and Terrance Williams II have an extra season.

One of the Strongest Schedules

- U-M continues to play one of the strongest schedules in the nation -- KenPom (12th), Sagarin (10th) and ESPN BPI (15th). U-M had two games postponed (MSU and Purdue) due to covid-19 protocols within the Wolverine program, however, the Purdue game has been rescheduled for Feb. 10 and the MSU game for March 1.
- The Wolverines still have to face some of the top KenPom schedule teams in the near future -- at Penn State (8th; Feb. 8), Ohio State (13th; Feb. 12), at Wisconsin (9th; Feb. 20), Illinois (15th; Feb. 27), Michigan State (17th; March 1) and at Ohio State (13th; March 6).

Fast Break with the Wolverines

- In mid-November, U-M AD Warde Manuel announced a five-year extension for Juwan Howard. His contract will now runs through the 2025-26 season.
- Eli Brooks (graduate student), DeVante' Jones (graduate student; Coastal Carolina) and Jaron Faulds (senior) have taken advantage of the NCAA's extra year of eligibility following the coronavirus pandemic.
- Seniors Isaiah Livers, Chaundee Brown, Jr. and Mike Smith all had the option to return with an extra year, however, they all elected to turn professional. Livers was selected by the Detroit Pistons with the 42nd pick, while Brown has played in the NBA (L.A. Lakers, Atlanta Hawks and G League) and Smith is with the G-League (Sioux Falls).
- Eli Brooks was selected as U-M's team captain by head coach Juwan Howard. It marks the second season Brooks has been given the honor. He is now the 17th Wolverines to serve as captain for multiple seasons.
- Fun fact, Brooks taught himself to play golf after watching YouTube videos. An avid dog lover Brooks has a golden retriever named Finn.
- Michigan has a trio of lefties -- Hunter Dickinson, Zeb Jackson and Kobe Bufkin.
- Hunter Dickinson (DeMatha Catholic) and Terrance Williams II (Gonzaga College) grew up playing with each other during AAU days but also played against each other in the Washington Catholic League (WCAC). Each won two league titles -- Dickinson (2018, '20) and Williams II (2017, '19).
- Zeb Jackson and Caleb Houston played together at Montverde Academy during the 2019-20, winning the high school national title. Houston followed up helping Montverde to the national title in 2021 -- the school's sixth all-time.
- Houston (Montverde) and Moussa Diabate (IMG Academy) played against each other during their prep days

Will the Third Time Continue the Charm?

- U-M welcomed Coastal Carolina graduate transfer DeVante' Jones. He is the third graduate transfer for the Wolverines since Jaaron Simmons (Ohio) joined for the 2017-18 season and Mike Smith (Columbia) in 2020-21.
- Simmons, who is currently U-M's video analyst, helped the Wolverines to a second straight Big Ten Tournament title as well as advance to the Final Four and national title game vs. Villanova in 2018.
- In a covid-19 altered season, Smith guided the Maize and Blue to the 2021 Big Ten regular season title, a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament (East) and the program's fourth Elite Eight appearance since 2013.

Brooks Longevity Continues to Grow

- Eli Brooks is U-M's all-time wins leader with 116. He passed former teammates Zavier Simpson and Jon Teske, who amassed 108 victories in their four seasons (2017-20).
- Eli Brooks (145) needs to play in one more games to reach another U-M's milestone for career games, which is held by Zavier Simpson (2017-20) at 146.
- After some unofficial research, Brooks is behind current Iowa guard Jordan Bohannon, who hold the NCAA record for games played with 164. Wisconsin's Brad Davison (150) and Illinois' Da'Monte Williams (148) and Trent Frazier (146) are ahead of Brooks.

Michigan vs. the Ranked

- U-M coach Juwan Howard is 11-12 against ranked foes since taking over the Wolverines with six top 10 wins, highlighted with a win at No. 4 Ohio State (92-87).
- Last season Michigan was 7-3 against ranked opponents, including three top 10 wins -- No. 9 Wisconsin (+23; 77-54); at No. 4 Ohio State (+5; 92-87) and No. 9 Iowa (+22; 79-57).

Howard and Harbaugh Make History

- Juwan Howard and Jim Harbaugh made history after the U-M duo earned the Associated Press National Coach of the Year awards helping Michigan become the first school to sweep the AP honor in football and men's basketball in the same calendar year since the football award was established in 1998.
- Howard, who was the Wolverines' second recipient and first since Bill Frieder in 1985, guided the 2021 Wolverines to the Big Ten regular season title (15th in history), the No. 1 seed in the Big Ten Tournament and NCAA Tournament, where they advanced to the Elite Eight.
- Harbaugh, who is U-M's first football coach to win the award, has his Wolverines 12-1, snapped an eight-game losing streak against Ohio State (42-27), advanced to its first Big Ten title game (defeating Iowa, 42-3) and earned the No. 2 seed in the College Football Playoff (vs. No. 3 Georgia).
- Howard and Harbaugh are the first Big Ten coaches to earn the national honor since 2005 -- Illinois' Bruce Webber (basketball) and Penn State's Joe Paterno (football).

- U-M's Juwan Howard is one of seven former NBA players who are coaching at their respective alma maters.

How U-M Won the 2021 Big Ten Title

- In what has turned out to be a unique season with COVID-19, the Big Ten regular season title was agreed to be determined by overall winning percentage as many schedules fluctuated due to the global pandemic.
- Needing to win one in its last two games (both against Michigan State), U-M clinched the Big Ten title after a 69-50 win against the Spartans at Crisler Center (March 4).
- The title was the 15th in U-M history and first since the Wolverines won the 2014 title by three games thanks to the play of Big Ten Player of the Year Nik Stauskas.
- The regular season titles made the Wolverines the No. 1 seed in the Big Ten Tournament for just the second time in program history (2014).

Michigan in the Big Ten Tournament

- U-M has a 29-20 (25-19*) all-time record at the Big Ten Tournament.
- U-M has a first round bye in eight straight tournaments.
- U-M has earned two double-byes (2019, '21).
- U-M has won 14 straight opening games -- the most of any major tournament team.
- U-M has titles in its five championship game appearances. After winning the inaugural tournament in 1998, which was later vacated, U-M became the third team to win back-to-back titles after capturing the titles in 2017 (Washington, D.C.) and 2018 (NYC).
- In 1998, U-M defeated Iowa, Minnesota and Purdue to win the Big Ten's inaugural postseason tournament. Following sanctions, U-M vacated recognition of that title.
- In 2017, following a well-documented pre-tournament plane crash, U-M won four games in four days to win its first Big Ten Tournament title in nearly two decades. As the No. 8-seed, U-M became the lowest seed ever to win the conference tournament. The Maize and Blue defeated Wisconsin, 71-56, to claim the title -- its only win over the Badgers in the conference tournament.
- In 2018, U-M successfully defended its tournament championship, winning another four games in four days for a second straight year to become the first No. 5-seed to win the conference tournament. The Maize and Blue defeated Purdue, 75-66 in the title game.
- U-M set the record for most consecutive wins at the tournament with 10 straight (2017 to 2019); passing Ohio State's previous mark of eight. U-M reached the championship game three straight times during the stretch, winning two titles.

Michigan in the NCAA Tournament

- U-M has made 30 (26*) NCAA Tournament appearances.
- U-M has a 64-28 (57-24*) all-time record in the NCAA Tournament.
- U-M has been to eight (six*) Final Four's (1964, '65, '76, '89, '92*, '93*, '13, '18).
- U-M is 7-1 (5-1*) all-time in national semifinal games and owns the best winning percentage, .875, of any school to play in at least five games.
- U-M has advanced to seven (five*) championship games -- 1965, 1976, 1989, 1992*, 1993*, 2013 and 2018. U-M is 1-6 (1-4*) in national title games; capturing the championship in 1989.
- U-M won the program's first and only NCAA championship in 1989, following a dramatic 80-79 overtime win against Seton Hall when Rumeal Robinson made two free throws to secure the title. During the "Shock the World" run, Glen Rice set the NCAA Tournament record for most points in a single tournament with 184 (30.6 ppg).
- U-M has national title game appearances under four different head coaches -- Dave Strack (1965 vs. UCLA); Johnny Orr (1976 vs. Indiana); Steve Fisher (1989 vs. Seton Hall; 1992 vs. Duke & 1993 vs. North Carolina) and John Beilein (2013, vs. Louisville and 2018 vs. Villanova).
- U-M has 17 (16*) Sweet 16 appearances, including in its last four tournaments.
- U-M has 15 (14*) Elite Eight appearances, including four of its last eight tournaments.
- U-M has been a No. 1 seed on three occasions -- 1985, 1993* & 2021.
- U-M has been a No. 2 seed on three occasions -- 1986, 2014 & 2019.

Jett Howard

A 6-foot-7 guard out of Miami, Fla., Jett follows in his brother, Jace, in committing to play for their father in Ann Arbor. Starting his high school career at University School, Howard helped guide the Sharks to two consecutive Class 5A State titles before transferring to IMG Academy. As a sophomore, Howard was the second-leading scorer with 15.6 points and 3.7 assists per game, while also being named to the All-County second team.

Transferring to IMG, Howard teamed up with current U-M forward Moussa Diabate during his junior season and closed the campaign with a 21-3 mark. Howard averaged 9.8 points and 2.0 assists, while shooting 44.4 percent from beyond the arc. Now serving as one of IMG's top scorers this season, Howard currently averages 13.2 points, shooting 47.1 percent (33-for-70) from the floor and 45.2 percent (19-for-42) at the three-point line.

In the summer circuit, he played in the Nike EYBL circuit with Nightrydas Elite and averaged 11.8 points, 4.8 rebounds and 2.9 averaged assists.

Tarris Reed, Jr.

A St. Louis native, Reed averaged 14.5 points, 8.3 rebounds, 1.5 steals and 1.2 blocks as a sophomore before a breakout junior season, averaging a double-double, 21.8 points and 11.5 rebounds as a junior. His play last season helped Chaminade to a third-place finish at Missouri Class 6 Finals and earned him recognition as the Post-Dispatch All-Metro Boys Basketball Player of the Year.

During his time as a Red Devil, Reed was selected to the First-Team All-Metro Catholic Conference in back-to-back years and was named to the Class 6 All-State and All-District Teams by the Missouri Basketball Coaches association last year.

This season, Reed transferred to Link Academy in Branson, Mo. where he currently averages 14.5 points and 7.3 rebounds.

On the summer circuits, Reed faced signees Howard and Glenn as part of the MoKan Elite, and averaged 15.4 points and 6.9 rebounds in 2021.

Dug McDaniel

Hailing from Washington, D.C., McDaniel, a 5-11 point guard, was the first commitment of the Class of 2022 and enters his final year at St. Paul VI Catholic in Fairfax, Va. He plays in the Washington Catholic Athletic Conference (WCAC), the same conference current Wolverines Hunter Dickinson (DeMatha) and Terrance Williams II (Gonzaga) played in before coming to Ann Arbor.

Last season, McDaniel had a standout junior season averaging a double-double with 22.0 points and 10.0 assists in an 11-game shortened season due to COVID-19. McDaniel, along with former teammate Trevor Keels (Duke), fell to DeMatha in a dramatic 109-107 loss in the WCAC championship game.

As a sophomore, McDaniel guided St. Paul IV to a 27-8 overall record and the 2020 VISSA Division 1 State championship after finishing second in the WCAC (16-4) and closing as the runner-up in the WCAC Tournament. McDaniel's averaged 10.9 points and 5.2 assists as a freshman, helping the Panthers to a 27-9 record and runner-up WCAC finish. He was honored as a Northern Virginia All-Freshman Team selection, as well as the All-Washington Catholic Athletic Conference first team.

So far, McDaniel has averaged 16.7 points, 5.7 rebounds, 4.7 assists, and 1.3 steals this season. Along with signee Glenn, McDaniel participated in several of USA Basketball's junior minicamps throughout 2019.

During his AAU play, he averaged 19.0 points and 8.0 assists with Team Takeover.

Gregg Glenn III

Glenn III, a 6-7 power forward out of Calvary Christian Academy in Fort Lauderdale, Fla., was named to the MaxPreps Freshman All-America third team for averaging 14.0 points, 7.8 rebounds and 2.6 assists. As a sophomore, he earned All-Broward County second-team honors after guiding Calvary to the district semifinals. Glenn posted 12.4 points, 6.1 rebounds and 2.2 assists per game in the 2021 season, helping the Warriors to a 17-7 record en route to a Class 3A State championship title. This year, Glenn is averaging 15.3 points, 7.6 rebounds, 2.4 steals and 1.4 blocks.

In addition to his prep career, Glenn II has competed for USA Basketball, playing with the U16 National Team, which won the gold medal in Brazil during the 2019 FIBA Americas Championship.

On the AAU circuit, he played with signee Howard with Nike EYBL's Nightrydas Elite.

Former Michigan men's basketball All-American and Fab Five member Juwan Howard begins his third season as the David and Meredith Kaplan Men's Basketball Head Coach with the Wolverines, the 17th in the history of the program.

In his second season, Howard guided the Wolverines to a 23-5 record and 14-3 Big Ten mark, helping the Maize and Blue claim its 15th conference regular-season title. As a result, U-M earned its second No. 1 seed in the Big Ten Tournament and on Selection Sunday, Howard's Wolverines were named the No. 1 seed in the NCAA East Region -- the program's third No. 1 seed in history, joining the 1985 and 1993 (vacated) teams. Howard also became the first person to earn a No. 1 seed as a player and as a coach in the NCAA Tournament.

At the 2021 NCAA Tournament, the Wolverines advanced to their fourth straight Sweet 16 after wins over Texas Southern and LSU. After a victory over Florida State, U-M moved on to its fourth Elite Eight in the last eight tournaments. Ultimately, U-M fell to UCLA in the Regional final.

For his efforts this past season, Howard was named the 2021 Associated Press National Coach of the Year, the Wolverines' second recipient and first since Bill Frieder in 1985. He was also the first Big Ten coach to be recognized with the award since 2005. The AP honor highlighted a slew of accolades as Howard was the recipient of the United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) Henry Iba Award and was named National Coach of the Year by The Athletic and the Sporting News.

Howard was also named the Big Ten Coach of the Year by the coaches and media and the Associated Press, and earned the USBWA's District V Coach of the Year and the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) District 7 Coach of the Year awards.

In addition to his personal awards and honors, Howard guided center Hunter Dickinson to not only consensus All-America second team honors but to the Big Ten Freshman of the Year accolade as well. Dickinson added All-Big Ten first team (media) and second team (coaches) honors and was named to the All-Freshman squad, while Isaiah Livers earned a spot on the All-Big Ten second team (coaches and media) and Franz Wagner was an All-Big Ten second team (coaches) and third team (media) selection.

In two seasons with the Wolverines, Howard has amassed 42 wins, helping him become the winningest two-year coach at U-M. He passed his former coach and mentor Steve Fisher, who won 37 games in his first two seasons (non-interim).

The Chicago, Illinois, native's return to his alma mater for his first head coaching position came after spending six years on the coaching staff with the Miami Heat. Howard worked under Erik Spoelstra and helped the Heat win three division titles (2014, '16, and '18) and one Eastern Conference championship (2014). Howard served as the head coach of Miami's 2016 NBA Summer League teams in both Orlando and Las Vegas and also for Team Africa in the NBA Africa Game 2018.

Prior to his coaching career, Howard had an accomplished 19-year NBA playing career capped off by winning back-to-back NBA championships (2012, 2013) with the Heat playing with LeBron James, Dwyane Wade and Chris Bosh.

The No. 5 overall pick in 1994, Howard appeared in 1,208 games with 900 starts while averaging 13.4 points, 6.1 rebounds, and 2.2 assists. In total, he closed his career with 16,159 points and 7,428 rebounds while adding 2,663 assists. He was named to the 1995 NBA All-Rookie second team and was an All-NBA third team and All-Star in 1996.

PHIL MARTELLI Associate Head Coach



With over 45 years of coaching, legendary collegiate coach Phil Martelli continues to reshape the Michigan program as well as college basketball on a national landscape. Entering his third season as the associate head coach, Martelli not only serves as a mentor to Juwan Howard, but has brought vast experience to the Wolverines.

Michigan, who is 42-17 in the last two seasons, claimed the 2021 Big Ten regular-season title and earned the No. 1 seeds in the Big Ten and NCAA Tournaments in 2021. U-M reached the semi final of the Big Ten Tournament and followed with a trip to the Elite Eight.

Before heading to Ann Arbor, Martelli spent 34 years at Saint Joseph's, with the final 24 seasons as head coach, where he built the Hawks' into one of the most consistent Atlantic 10 programs. → e Hawks' all-time leader in career victories (444), Martelli recorded nine 20-plus win seasons including a school-record 30 in 2004. His A-10 record of 218-176 ranks second all-time, trailing only Temple's John Chaney.

Martelli's teams made 13 postseason appearances (7 NCAA, 6 NIT) advancing to two NCAA Sweet 16s (1997, 2004) and the 2004 Elite Eight. That 2004 team finished the regular season a perfect 27-0 and No. 1 in the country before suffering its first loss in the A-10 Tournament. Despite that, Saint Joseph's advanced to the Elite Eight. Martelli and his point guard Jameer Nelson swept the consensus National Coach and Player of the Year honors that year.

Overall, Martelli was named the A-10 Coach of the Year four times (1997, 2001,'04, '05), the USBWA District Coach of the Year twice (1997, 2004) and the Philadelphia Big 5 Coach of the Year four times (1996, '97, 2004, '16).

He won six A-10 regular season/divisional titles (1997, 2001, '02, '03, '04, '05) and guided the Hawks to three A-10 Tournament titles (1997, 2014, '16). His 18 postseason wins (7 NCAA, 11 NIT) are the most in Saint Joseph's history.

Martelli spent seven years as head basketball coach at Bishop Kenrick High School in the Philadelphia Catholic League; current Hall of Fame women's basketball coach Geno Auriemma served as an assistant under Martelli from 1979-81.

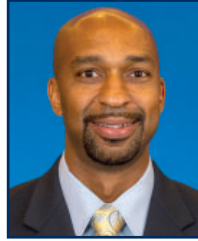
He began his coaching career as an assistant coach at his alma mater Widener College in 1977, helping the Pioneers reach the 1978 NCAA Division III Final Four and title game.

SADDI WASHINGTON Assistant Coach



With nearly two decades of college coaching experience, Saddi Washington begins his sixth season with Michigan. Washington was initially responsible for working with the big men before shifting to coordinate the defensive strategies and wing play.

With Washington's assistance, U-M has averaged 26.2 wins per season with a program record 33 wins in 2017-18 (33-8) and 30 more wins in 2018-19 (30-7). → e Wolverines have won 10-plus Big Ten games in all five seasons Washington has been on staff and claimed the 2021 Big Ten regular season title, the 2017 and 2018 Big Ten Tournament titles, advanced to four NCAA Sweet 16s, as well as a trip to the 2018 Final Four and national championship game vs. Villanova.

In his first season with the Maize and Blue, and after a well-documented plane crash, U-M won four games in four days to claim the 2017 Big Ten Tournament title. → e following year, the Wolverines repeated their e orts with four straight wins to win back-to-back conference tournament titles. In 2019, U-M made it three straight trips to the championship game, setting the tournament record with 10 straight wins, before falling in the championship game.

The Wolverines made four trips to the NCAA Tournament reaching the Sweet 16 in each of the those seasons, including the 2018 national title game. Washington spent a decade as a member of Oakland University's staff (2006-16) serving seven years as an assistant before being promoted to the associate head coach under Greg Kampe his final three seasons. Washington helped the Golden Grizzlies to 198 wins and five 20-plus win seasons. Oakland made back-to-back trips to the NCAA Tournament (2010, '11) after winning two straight Summit League regular season and conference tournament titles.

Before starting his coaching career serving as a volunteer assistant coach at Romulus High School (2005) under current Alabama head coach Nate Oats, Washington had a seven-year professional career overseas.

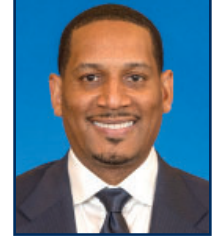
Collegiately, Washington was named to the 1994 Mid-American (MAC) All-Freshman Team, averaging 14 points per game at Western Michigan. A two-time All-MAC selection, he was a first-team pick as a senior in 1998 after scoring 626 points (21.6 per game). He helped lead the Broncos to the NCAA Tournament, where the Broncos upset Clemson in the first round.

HOWARD EISLEY Assistant Coach



Michigan native Howard Eisley begins his third season with the Wolverines after a successful nine years in the NBA. Joining Juwan Howard's staff in 2019, Eisley has been instrumental with the guards, as well as the Wolverine offensive sets and game strategies. With his efforts, U-M has gone 42-17, winning the 2019 Battle 4 Atlantis and claiming the 2021 Big Ten regular season title.

After the 2020 postseason was canceled due to the coronavirus pandemic, the Wolverines earned the No. 1 seed in the 2021 Big Ten and NCAA Tournaments. Following a semifinal appearance in the conference tournament, the Wolverines advanced to the NCAA's Elite Eight.

Prior to his return to NCAA coaching, Eisley spent nearly a decade moving up the ranks in the NBA as a player development assistant with the Los Angeles Clippers, and as an assistant coach with the Washington Wizards (2014-16) and New York Knicks (2016-19).

Chosen with the 30th overall selection by the Minnesota Timberwolves in the 1994 NBA Draft, Eisley played 12 seasons in the NBA, making stops with eight teams – Minnesota, San Antonio, Utah, Dallas, New York, Phoenix, the Clippers and Denver. He played in 786 NBA games and recorded 5,116 career points, 2,748 assists, 540 steals and 516 3-point field goals. His career was highlighted by playing five seasons with the Utah Jazz and Hall of Fame point guard John Stockton, contributing to two Western Conference titles in 1997 and 1998.

A four-year starter at Boston College (1991-94), Eisley helped guide the Eagles to the 1994 NCAA East Regional Final, where he earned all-regional tournament honors. He added All-Big East second team honors as a junior (1993) and senior (1994).

Prior to his collegiate career, Eisley was a prep standout at Detroit's Southwestern High School, where he was teammates with future NBA players Jalen Rose and Voshon Lenard.

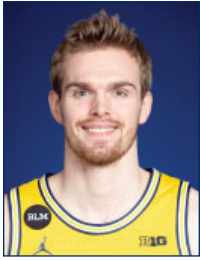
