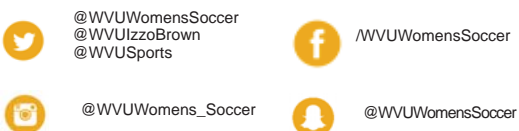

The Kick Off

- The No. 4-ranked and No. 2-seeded WVU women's soccer team makes its second-ever appearance in the NCAA Elite Eight at No. 6-ranked and top-seeded Penn State on Saturday, Nov. 28, at 4 p.m., at Jeffrey Field, in University Park, Pennsylvania.
- Saturday's winner advances to the 2015 NCAA College Cup. WVU has never advanced beyond the Elite Eight.
- Saturday's quarterfinal appearance is the Mountaineers' first since 2007 and first away from Morgantown.
- WVU is making its 16th straight appearance in the NCAA Tournament, the seventh-longest active streak in the nation.
- The Mountaineers' No. 2 overall seed is the highest NCAA seed in program history.
- A win Saturday would be career victory No. 300 for coach Nikki Izzo-Brown (299-105-44).
- The 2015 Mountaineers are the winningest team in program history, having scored their 19th victory of the season with a 5-2 win over Loyola Marymount on Nov. 22. WVU boasts an 88.6 win percentage. The 2002 squad held the previous best win percentage (84.1).
- WVU is tied with No. 3-ranked Stanford at No. 2 nationally in won-lost-tied percentage (0.886).
- WVU's 15 shutouts are the third-best total in the NCAA and a program single-season record.
- WVU has scored 61 goals this year, a program single-season record.
- WVU is the only team nationally to rank in the top five in shutout percentage (No. 3, 0.682) and scoring offense (No. 4, 2.77).
- WVU is the first Big 12 Conference team to advance to the NCAA quarterfinals since Oklahoma State (2011).

WVU in the NCAA Tournament

- The Mountaineers show a 15-14-2 all-time record in NCAA Tournament play.
- WVU is 1-7 all-time in away NCAA Tournament matches, with its lone win a 1-0 third-round victory at then-No. 6 Penn State on Nov. 24, 2007. WVU is 0-1 in the NCAA Tournament quarterfinals.
- The Mountaineers have scored 13 goals in the 2015 tournament, a program-high for a tournament run. WVU's five goals in the third-round win over Loyola Marymount are a program single-game high for the NCAA Tournament.
- The team's shutouts against Duquesne and Northwestern in the first and second rounds marked the second time in program history the Mountaineers have posted back-to-back shutouts; WVU did not allow a goal through the first three rounds of the 2007 NCAA Tournament.
- Prior to this season, WVU had not won an NCAA Tournament match since a 2-1 second-round victory over Penn State on Nov. 14, 2010, in Morgantown.
- WVU has posted 12 shutouts in NCAA Tournament play.

The Last Time in the NCAA Tournament Fourth Round

- No. 12-ranked and fourth-seeded Mountaineers saw their 2007 season end with a 1-0 loss to No. 9-ranked and second-seeded USC, on Nov. 30, at Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium.
- USC's Kasey Johnson scored the lone goal in the 63rd minute. USC outshot WVU, 20-9. Mountaineer freshman Kerri Butler made five saves. USC's Kristin Olsen also stopped five.

West Virginia vs. Penn State

- WVU is 6-6-1 all-time against Penn State. The then-No. 11/12 Mountaineers were victorious in the last meeting, earning a 1-0 victory over No. 5/7 Penn State on Sept. 4, 2015. In a contest delayed multiple times due to weather, Amanda Hill tallied the game-winner in the eighth minute. WVU finished with a 14-8 shot edge, a 6-2 advantage in shots on-goal and a 5-4 edge in corner kicks.
- WVU and PSU have met three times in the NCAA Tournament, with the Mountaineers showing a 2-1 record. WVU has won the last two meetings, a 2-1 victory in Morgantown in the second round of the 2010 NCAA Tournament, and a 1-0 win in the third round of the 2007 NCAA Tournament in University Park. WVU is 1-1 in tournament games in University Park.

A Look at the Nittany Lions

- PSU, the Big Ten regular-season and tournament champion, advanced to the NCAA quarterfinals following three straight shutout wins over Albany (5-0), Boston University (6-0) and Ohio State (4-0) at Jeffrey Field. The Nittany Lions' tournament goal total is a nation-best mark.
- Sophomore forward Megan Schafer paces PSU with 29 points (13 G, 3 A). Senior forward Mallory Weber shows a team-best 10 assists. Senior Britt Eckerstrom owns a 0.51 GAA with nine shutouts and 61 saves.

National Rankings: The Mountaineers earned a No. 4 ranking in the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) NCAA Division I Final Regular-Season Poll. It is the team's highest ranking ever in the final regular-season coaches' poll.

The Mountaineers' ranking was their highest position at the onset of the NCAA Tournament. The squad ranked No. 7 at the start of the 2014 NCAA Tournament and No. 11 at the start of the 2013 NCAA Tournament.

WVU sat at No. 2 in the poll for two weeks prior to the final list. The Mountaineers have been in the top 10 every week this season but the first two.

Sweet 16: The Mountaineers' bid to the 2015 NCAA Tournament is their 16th straight, the seventh-longest active streak in the nation. WVU has advanced to the round of 16 four times and the quarterfinals twice.

A Look at the 2015 NCAA Tournament: The Mountaineers are one of eight teams still fighting for a ticket to the 2015 NCAA College Cup. Of the eight teams still playing, only Rutgers has fewer Elite Eight appearances than WVU (1, 2015).

The three other Elite Eight pairings are: No. 1-seed Florida State - Texas A&M, No. 1-seed Stanford - No. 3-seed Duke and No. 1-seed Virginia - No. 2-seed Rutgers. All three games will be played on Friday, Nov. 27. Florida State is the defending national champion.

What's Next?: The winner of Saturday's NCAA quarterfinal will meet the Virginia - Rutgers winner in the second of two semifinal matches on Friday, Dec. 4, at 7:30 p.m., at WakeMed Soccer Park, in Cary, North Carolina. The contest will be broadcast on ESPNU.

Big 12 in the Tournament: The Mountaineers are the only Big 12 Conference school still standing in the 2015 NCAA Tournament, as No. 15-ranked Texas Tech lost, 3-2, in overtime, to Auburn on Nov. 20, in Tallahassee, Florida.

The Mountaineers are the 2015 Big 12 regular-season champions, while the Red Raiders won the Big 12 Soccer Championship and secured the league's automatic bid.

The Last Time Out: WVU rallied from a 2-2 halftime tie against Loyola Marymount to defeat the Lions, 5-2, in the third round of the NCAA Tournament on Nov. 22, at Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium. The match marked only the second time all season the Mountaineers allowed an opponent to score twice.

Facing sparsely seen adversity, WVU relied on its six seniors, specifically forward Kailey Utley and goalkeeper Hannah Steadman. Held without a shot throughout the first half, Utley connected on all three of her chances in the second half for her first career hat trick. She tallied the game-winner, her team-best seventh of the season, in the 54th minute, then added insurance goals in the 57th minute and the 81st minute. The WVU defense held the Lions to five second-half shots, and Steadman made three saves to go toward her career-best nine-save performance.

Michaela Abam tallied the first score in the 17th minute. After LMU answered in the 26th minute, Heather Kaleiohi wrestled the lead back in the 39th minute. An own goal put the score at 2-2 before halftime.

WVU finished with a 15-14 edge in shots and a 3-2 advantage in corner kicks. The win was the WVU women's soccer team's 100th victory at Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium.

We Are the Champions! (x4): With a 2-1 overtime victory at Oklahoma State on Oct. 23, the Mountaineers clinched the 2015 Big 12 Conference regular-season title, their fourth straight. The Mountaineers have won the title each season since joining the Big 12 in 2012, and WVU is the only program to win four straight outright championships; Texas A&M won four straight titles from 2004-07, but its first was not an outright win. Also the 2015 Big 12 preseason favorite, WVU's accomplishment marks the ninth time in Big 12 history the preseason favorite in the coaches poll also won the title. The Mountaineers own a 27-1-3 all-time record in Big 12 play and are unbeaten at Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium.

Dating back to its days in the Big East Conference, WVU has won five straight conference regular-season crowns and nine since its first title in 2002. WVU has won nine regular season and championship conference titles in six seasons and 14 since 2002.

20th Season Celebration: The West Virginia University women's soccer program celebrates its 20th season in 2015. Named the team's first head coach on Aug. 3, 1995, Nikki Izzo-Brown led an infant program to a 10-7-2 record in 1996, and the Mountaineers have not slowed down since, compiling winning seasons in each of the subsequent years, qualifying for 16 straight NCAA Championship appearances and winning 14 conference titles, including six in the Big 12 Conference. Izzo-Brown has led WVU to a 286-100-44 overall record and a 119-41-20 mark in conference play.

The Next 250: In just 20 seasons, the West Virginia University women's soccer team has earned 286 program wins, an average of 14 victories per season. The Mountaineers scored program win No. 250 with their 1-0 victory over Baylor at the 2013 Big 12 Soccer Championship semifinal on Nov. 8, in Kansas City, Missouri. WVU earned its 275 program victory with a 1-0 overtime win against Buffalo on Sept. 18, 2015, at Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium.

Big 12 Honors: The Big 12 Conference showered WVU with postseason honors in 2015, as the team took three of the conference's top awards. Nikki Izzo-Brown was named the Big 12 Coach of the Year for the fourth straight season, the first coach in league history to earn four consecutive honors. Junior Kadeisha Buchanan was named the Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year for the third straight season, the first defender to earn three consecutive awards, and defender Bianca St. Georges was named the Big 12 Freshman of the Year. A Mountaineer has earned the honor each season since 2013.

Additionally, 10 athletes currently featured in the team's starting lineup earned 11 All-Big awards, a conference- and program-best mark.

Best in the World: Junior defender Kadeisha Buchanan was among 10 players shortlisted for the 2015 Ballon d'Or award as the FIFA Women's Player of the Year, as announced Oct. 19. She was the lone defender on the list and the only athlete under the age of 20.

Buchanan's Brilliance: Tabbed the Best Young Player at the 2015 FIFA Women's World Cup, center back Kadeisha Buchanan returned for her junior season as one of college soccer's top talents. She has anchored a WVU defense that has allowed a program-low nine goals all season and posted a team-record 15 shutouts. Buchanan shows five points (1 G, 3 A) this year and owns 16 (5 G, 6 A) career points.

A two-time NSCAA All-American, Buchanan was the lone sophomore named to the first team in 2014. She also was the youngest WVU women's soccer player to earn first-team accolades. Additionally, she was named the Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year for the second straight season and was one of 16 semifinalists for the Missouri Athletic Club (MAC) Hermann Trophy.

We See You: Juniors Kadeisha Buchanan and Ashley Lawrence were named to the 2015 MAC Hermann Trophy Watch List. College soccer's version of the Heisman Trophy, the award represents the highest level of individual achievement in the sport. WVU was one of five schools to have two student-athletes named to the Watch List. This is the third time since 2007 WVU has had two student-athletes land on the first list of the season. Nine different Mountaineers have been named to the initial Watch List since 2003, including Buchanan in 2014. WVU has had four semifinalists and one finalist since 2003.

One of five defenders named to the Watch List, Buchanan also is one of four semifinalists and one of 13 NSCAA All-Americans from 2014 to be recognized. Lawrence lands on the list for the first time in her career. She is one of 10 midfielders named to the 28-person list.

Mountaineers on the Game's Biggest Stage: Juniors Kadeisha Buchanan and Ashley Lawrence spent their summer gaining experience on the world's biggest stage, as the duo started all five of Canada's matches at the 2015 FIFA Women's World Cup Canada.

The first WVU women's soccer players named to a World Cup roster, Buchanan, a defender, was named the Best Young Player, landed on the FIFA Women's World Cup Canada 2015 All-Star Squad and was featured on a Canadian commemorative stamp. Lawrence, a midfielder, scored Canada's lone goal in a 1-1 draw against Netherland in Group A play on June 16; the score helped advance Canada to the knockout stage for only the second time in six tries. Canada dropped a 2-1 decision to England in the quarterfinals on June 27.

O Canada! Six Mountaineers on the 2015 roster hail from Canada: Kadeisha Buchanan (Ontario), Ashley Lawrence (Ontario), Easter Mayi Kith (Quebec), Amandine Pierre-Louis (Quebec), Carla Portillo (Ontario) and Bianca St. Georges (Quebec). All but Pierre-Louis are currently featured in WVU's starting lineup.

Not Up in Here!: The Mountaineers have resembled a brick wall this season, allowing a combined 129 shots, with only 51 on-frame, for a 0.070 opponent shot percentage. Fourteen of WVU's 19 wins have come via a shutout, including 1-0 victories at Maryland on Aug. 28 and against No. 5/7 Penn State on Sept. 4, and a 2-0 win at RV/15 Ohio State on Sept. 11. WVU shows a program single-season record 15 shutouts, the third-best mark in the NCAA. WVU has allowed just nine goals all year and 40 corner kicks.

The WVU defense is having a record-setting season, as the nine goals allowed are the fewest in program history. The previous WVU record for fewest opponent goals scored in a season is 13 (2008, 2006, 2002).

The defense's strength should shock few, as the Mountaineers were one of the nation's stingiest units in 2014, tallying 12 shutouts, 11 credited to returning senior goalkeeper Hannah Steadman, and allowing only 15 goals; both marks were tops in the Big 12 Conference. Three returned in front of Steadman this season: junior center backs Kadeisha Buchanan and Carly Black, and senior outside back Maggie Bedillion. Black suffered a season-ending knee injury at Ohio State on Sept. 11.

No Shots for You: The Mountaineers denied Longwood a shot in a 4-0 win on Sept. 13, marking the second time in as many seasons and the fifth time in program history that WVU has denied an opponent a shot. The team has denied four opponents a shot on-goal this year.

Stacking Shutouts: Following a 2-1 loss to No. 11/13 Virginia Tech on Aug. 23, WVU put together a program-record nine-match shutout streak. The streak was halted by a TCU goal in the 27th minute in WVU's 2-1 win over the Horned Frogs on Oct. 2, in Morgantown. WVU previously compiled two seven-match shutout streaks, once in 1996, the program's first season, and in 2002.

Five of WVU's 12 shutouts last season came against Big 12 opponents, with four of the blank sheets earned in road contests, marking the first time in program history the team posted a shutout in each of its road league matches. WVU extended the streak to five with a 0-0 double-overtime draw at Oklahoma on Oct. 9, 2015. The streak was halted at No. 16/13 Texas Tech on Oct. 11, 2015, as the Red Raiders tallied one goal in a 4-1 loss to the Mountaineers. WVU allowed just three goals in Big 12 Conference play this season.

She Shoots, She Dishes, She Scores!: Senior forward Kailey Utley emerged as the Mountaineers' top point earner this year. She paces with a team-best 30 points (12 G, 6 A), the second-best total in the Big 12 and the 10th-best single-season total in program history. The point, goal and assist totals are career single-season bests. Utley also ranks No. 1 in the Big 12, No. 4 nationally, in game-winners (7), No. 2 in goals (12) and No. 4 in assists (6). Her game-winning goal at Maryland on Aug. 28 was her first career score in an opponent's venue.

Unbelievable Utley: Loyola Marymount pushed WVU's backs against the wall in their NCAA Tournament third-round meeting, as the Lions and the Mountaineers entered the locker rooms at halftime tied 2-2. Instead of folding in the face of adversity, WVU turned to its six seniors for leadership, and none stood taller than forward Kailey Utley. Denied a shot in the first half, the St. Louis, Missouri, native connected on all three of her shots in the second half to push the Mountaineers to a 5-2 victory and a spot in the Elite Eight.

The three-goal performance was a career best for Utley. The goals pushed her season total to a team-best 12. Additionally, the game-winning goal was her seventh of the season, the fourth-best total in the NCAA.

What Sophomore Slump?: The Mountaineers' top goal scorer (8) and point earner (16) as a freshman in 2014, forward Michaela Abam did not slow down in 2015, as she surpassed those totals 14 matches into the season. Abam now shows a team-best 12 goals, the second-best mark in the Big 12, and 27 points, WVU's second-best total and the third-best conference total. She is tied with Laura Kane (2002) at No. 4 on the WVU all-time sophomore goals list.

Abam was awesome in the Mountaineers' 8-0 win against Villanova on Sept. 6, scoring a program-best four goals for eight points, also a WVU record. Those single-game totals rank No. 3 and No. 9, respectively, in the NCAA this season. She followed that with a two-goal performance in a 4-0 win against Longwood on Sept. 13. Abam also recorded her first career assist this season, aiding on Amandine Pierre-Louis' goal in a 2-1 win against Oklahoma State on Nov. 4. She tallied her first career two-assist performance in the team's 5-2 win over Loyola Marymount on Nov. 22.

U + A = G: Senior Kailey Utley and sophomore Michaela Abam are one of the best scoring duos in Mountaineer history, as the forwards have each tallied a career-best 12 goals this season, the 10th-best single-season total in program history. The duo is the second pair in program history to score 12+ goals in one season. Chrissie Abbott (15) and Katie Barnes (12) combined for 27 goals in 2001.

Utley shows a team-best 30 points. She is the 11th player in program history to score 30+ points, and the first to do so since Frances Silva tallied 43 points (15 G, 13 A) in 2013. Abam sits just behind Utley with 27 points (12 G, 3 A).

Lawrence Pushes Mountaineers' Attack: As WVU junior midfielder Ashley Lawrence goes, so goes the Mountaineer offense, with the team's transition and attack routinely flowing through the Toronto native.

A three-time All-Big 12 First Team honoree, Lawrence shows a team best and career-high eight assists this season and ranks No. 2 in the Big 12 Conference with a 0.36 per-game average. She is one assist short of breaking on to the all-time assist chart for a WVU junior. Lawrence has registered 19 career assists.

Lawrence has a lethal shot, too, and currently ranks third on the team with five goals, the 10th-best total in the Big 12. Most recently, Lawrence scored the team's second goal in WVU's 6-0 win against Kansas on Oct. 16.

Score Often, Score Early: One of coach Nikki Izzo-Brown's weekly goals is for the Mountaineers to score first each game. Izzo-Brown not only urges the Mountaineers to score first - she also wants them to score fast.

WVU has done just that in 2015, tallying six goals in the first four minutes, including the second-fastest score in school history, a goal by Ashley Lawrence 62 seconds into the Mountaineers' 2-1 win over TCU on Oct. 2.

Goal Record Falls: As spectacular as the Mountaineer defense has been this season, the WVU offense has been just as special. The Mountaineers set the program single-season goal record in their 4-0 victory over Northwestern on Nov. 20, and the team's season total now stands at 61, besting the previous record of 55 set in 2006. Fourteen different Mountaineers have scored at least one goal this season, including a team-best 12 from forwards Kailey Utley and Michaela Abam.

Gordon a Natural Fit: Freshman forward Nia Gordon wasted little time adding to the WVU attack, as she has tallied five goals, the third-best output by a Mountaineer. Three of the scores have been game-winners, the fourth-best Big 12 total. Gordon's first shot as a Mountaineer went down as a game-winner, as she scored in the 20th minute of WVU's 2-0 win against SIUE in the season opener on Aug. 21. She tallied the team's game-winner in an 8-0 win against Villanova on Sept. 6, 83 seconds into the match for the sixth-fastest goal in program history. Gordon's third career game-winner was a big one, as she scored in the 49th minute in WVU's 4-1 win at No. 16/13 Texas Tech on Oct. 11.

More Goals? Sure! The Mountaineers have flexed their scoring muscles this season, tallying 61 goals through 22 games. WVU ranks No. 4 nationally with a 2.77 goals/game average.

Double the Fun: Four different Mountaineers have netted at least two goals in one game this season: sophomores Michaela Abam (4 vs. Villanova, Sept. 6; 2 vs. Longwood, Sept. 13) and Kayla Saager (2 vs. Villanova, Sept. 6), and seniors Amanda Hill (2 vs. Kansas, Oct. 16) and Kailey Utley (3 vs. Loyola Marymount, Nov. 22).

Since 2010, WVU has had 23 instances where one Mountaineer has netted at least two goals in one game, including seven two-goal performances in 2014, the program's best single-season total in that time frame. The WVU single-game goal record is four, hit by Abam in the Mountaineers' record-setting 8-0 win over Villanova on Sept. 6.

Big 12 First: WVU's six goals against Kansas on Oct. 16 were the most scored by the Mountaineers in a Big 12 Conference match. Prior to the 6-0 victory, WVU had never scored more than four goals in a Big 12 contest.

Steady Steadman: Senior goalkeeper Hannah Steadman has made the most of her two years at WVU, as she ranks No. 1 in the WVU career record book with a 0.55 career goals-against average (GAA). Including her three games at Tennessee, Steadman ranks No. 20 nationally, No. 3 in Division I, in career active leaders with a 0.54 career GAA. She also shows 23 career shutouts at WVU and ranks No. 5 all-time in the Mountaineer career record book. Steadman's 12 shutouts this season rank No. 2 in program history; the record is 14, set by Kerri Butler in 2010.

Taking Names: With its 1-0 win against No. 5/7 Penn State on Sept. 4 in Morgantown, WVU has defeated at least one top-10 team in each of the last 11 seasons. WVU is 13-10-2 against top-10 teams and 22-26-8 against all ranked opponents since 2005.

Classy Hill Leads the Way: Two-time WVU team captain Amanda Hill was named one of 10 finalists for the 2015 Senior CLASS Award on Oct. 26. Hill is the second Mountaineer (Kate Schwindel, 2014) in as many years to be named a finalist for the award, and the third (Frances Silva, 2013; Schwindel, 2014) to be named a candidate.

A starter at defensive center midfield for all 87 career matches, she is pursuing degrees in exercise physiology and animal and nutritional science at WVU, while also minoring in sport and exercise psychology. Hill also has accumulated more than 750 hours of community service during her WVU career.

Hill owns 29 career points (10 G, 9 A). She has tallied a career-high 13 points (5 G, 3 A) this season. Hill's career-high five goals are the team's third-best total and rank No. 10 in the Big 12 Conference. Additionally, she netted WVU's game-winning goal three times this year, the fourth-best total in the Big 12.

Presented annually, the Senior CLASS Award is given to a student-athlete who shows notable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, classroom, character and competition. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. The winner will be announced during the 2015 NCAA Women's College Cup.

Setting the Standard: Building off the success it achieved throughout the 2014 season, WVU extended its program-record unbeaten streak to 20 with a 2-0 win against SIUE in the 2015 season opener on Aug. 21, at Indiana's Hoosier Classic. The streak stopped with the Mountaineers' 2-1 loss to No. 11/13 Virginia Tech on Aug. 23. The defeat was the team's first since dropping a 2-0 decision to No. 21 Duke on Aug. 29, 2014, at Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium.

WVU matched the program's previous unbeaten streak record of 18 with a 1-0 win over Oklahoma in the 2014 Big 12 Soccer Championship title match on Nov. 9, at Swope Soccer Village, in Kansas City, Missouri. The team set the record with its 0-0 draw against Georgetown in the first round of the 2014 NCAA Tournament on Nov. 15, 2014, in Morgantown.

The Mountaineers put together a 16-match unbeaten streak this season, going 15-0-1 following their early 2-1 defeat to the Hokies. The streak was halted with the team's 1-0 loss to No. 18 Texas Tech in the 2015 Big 12 Soccer Championship semifinal on Nov. 6.

Morgantown Magic: The Mountaineers have developed a true home field advantage, going 100-16-13 at Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium since its opening in August 2004. The team's 100th victory at DDSS was memorable, as the Mountaineers defeated Loyola Marymount, 5-2, on Nov. 22, 2015, to advance to the NCAA Elite Eight for the second time in program history.

The Mountaineers are unbeaten in their last 25 straight home matches and have not dropped a contest since a 2-0 loss to No. 21 Duke on Aug. 29, 2014.

WVU posted two top-15 attendance marks at DDSS throughout the 2015 regular season, with a season-high 1,617 on hand to cheer the Mountaineers to a 2-0 win over Texas on Sept. 25.

The Mountaineer attendance record is 3,000+, set on Nov. 30, 2007, in the team's 1-0 loss to USC in the quarterfinals of the NCAA Tournament. Over the last six seasons, more than 55,000 fans have packed the stands to make Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium one of the toughest environments in the Big 12.

Home Points: Big 12 or Big East, one fact has remained constant for the Mountaineers since 2009 - they do not lose home conference matches. WVU shows a 30-match unbeaten streak in conference games at Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium and has not dropped a league contest since losing 3-2 in overtime to No. 8 Notre Dame on Oct. 2, 2009. WVU is 15-0-1 in all-time home Big 12 matches.

Leading the Mountaineers: Three Mountaineers were named team captains for the 2015 season: seniors Amanda Hill and Kailey Utley, and junior Kadeisha Buchanan. Hill also was a captain in 2014. Captains are voted on by team members.

Seniors' Last Stand: The 2015 Mountaineer senior class earned six conference titles during its time at WVU, the second-best total in the program's 20-year history.

This year's senior class – forwards Kelsie Maloney and Kailey Utley, goalkeeper Hannah Steadman, midfielders Leah Emaus and Amanda Hill and defender Maggie Bedillion – has had a hand in six title wins since 2012, including four straight Big 12 regular-season crowns and the 2013 and 2014 Big 12 Soccer Championship titles. Members of the Big 12 Conference all four years of their WVU careers, the class has helped the Mountaineers compile a 27-1-3 all-time record in Big 12 play and an undefeated mark at Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium.

The program record for conference titles won by one class is seven, set by the 2014 senior class.

New Faces: Twelve newcomers joined the Mountaineers in 2015, including transfers Yulie Lopez (Florida State), Aaran Parry (Tennessee) and Kayla Saager (NC State). Saager, as well as freshmen Hannah Abraham and Easter Mayi Kith, joined WVU in January 2015.

Nice to Meet You: The Mountaineers' 2015 regular-season schedule featured five first-time opponents: Southern Illinois University Edwardsville (SIUE), Maryland, Longwood, Buffalo and Florida Gulf Coast. WVU went 5-0 against the field, defeating SIUE 2-0 on Aug. 21, at Indiana's Hoosier Classic, Maryland 1-0 on Aug. 28, at Ludwig Field, in College Park, Maryland, Longwood 4-0 on Sept. 13, Buffalo, 1-0 (OT) on Sept. 18 and Florida Gulf Coast 1-0, on Sept. 20, all at Dick Dlesk Soccer Stadium.

WVU also earned a 4-0 win against Northwestern in the 2015 NCAA Tournament Second Round on Nov. 20, the first-ever meeting between the two schools, giving WVU a 6-0 mark against first-time opponents this year.

In the program's 20-year history, the Mountaineers have faced 106 different teams.

Records Fall: The Mountaineers established or matched several program records in their 8-0 win against Villanova on Sept. 6, including:

- Individual single-game goal total: 4, by Michaela Abam
- Individual single-game point total: 8, by Michaela Abam
- Individual single-game assist total: 4, by Kailey Utley
- Team single-game goal total: 8 (previously hit in 2006 and 2008)

For Starters: Four Mountaineers have earned their first career starts this season - forward Nia Gordon, midfielder Carla Portillo and defenders Bianca St. Georges and Easter Mayi Kith. In total, WVU has 15 players with at least one career start to their name.

Power of Pink: Raising awareness for breast cancer research is a cause close to coach Nikki Izzo-Brown, and each year, she and the Mountaineers raise funds for Morgantown's Betty Puskar Breast Care Center. This season, WVU donated a check for \$8,647 at halftime of the WVU-TCU contest on Oct. 2.

WVU passed the \$100,000 threshold in 2013. In 12 years, the Mountaineers have raised more than \$120,000 for breast cancer research.

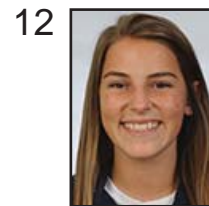
