- Keita Bates-Diop was one of 14 players nationally selected to the U.S. Basketball Writers Association Oscar Robertson Trophy Midseason Watch List Jan. 22. The award is given to the USBWA's college basketball player of the year.
- Chris Holtmann is the first Big Ten coach to record a 9-0 record in conference play during his first season since Sam Barry went 11-0 to start the 1923 campaign at Iowa 95 years ago. Holtmann is the third coach in conference history to start his career in league play at 9-0 or better.

• Both Jae'Sean Tate and Keita Bates-Diop, along with fifth-year transfer Andrew Dakich, are college graduates. Tate (sport industry) and Bates-Diop (economics) earned Ohio State degrees after three and a half years when they went through graduation ceremonies Dec. 17 in Columbus. Dakich (history) is a graduate of Michigan playing his final year of eligibility at Ohio State as a graduate transfer. Both Dakich and Tate are working on graduate degrees in coaching. Bates-Diop is now working on a minor in psychology. As a team, the Buckeyes posted a team

Buckeyes Among Leaders in Home Wins

Ohio State is No. 1 nationally for the most home wins with a 146-23 (.864) record since the 2009-10 season. Maryland is the next-best Big Ten team at No. 13 with 131 wins. Going back to the 2008-09 season to the present, the Buckeyes own the most home victories with 161 wins over 187 games (161-26). The Buckeyes also have played the fifth-most ranked teams in the country since 2005. Ohio State has played 130 opponents ranked among the *Associated Press* Top 25 during that span. That total trails only West Virginia (143), Michigan State (139), North Carolina (132) and Texas (132).

Ohio State played in its 300th game this decade (2010-18) vs. The Citadel and is 228-81 after the win vs. Nebraska. The Buckeyes have put together the winningest decade in Ohio State history.

• Tate is one of just seven players in the NCAA this season to make every field goal attempt in a game in which they took double-digit shots after connecting on all 10 field goal attempts vs. Northeastern...Tate is second nationally in field goal percentage (.552) among players 6-4 or shorter...Bates-Diop is tied for fifth nationally among players 6-7 or shorter with 39 blocked shots...among players with at least 35 blocks, Bates-Diop has the second-highest PAR (points+assists+rebounds) nationally at 29.8.

Hot Start to Big Ten Campaign

Ohio State last started 9-0 in the Big Ten during the 2011 conference season with 11-consecutive wins to start the league season. Chris Holtmann is the first Ohio State coach to start the conference season 9-0 in his first year in Columbus.

* The last time Ohio State won nine-consecutive conference games was at the end of the 2010 season (4) and the start of the 2011 campaign (11). Seven of those games were on the road and four were against ranked teams (at No. 11 Michigan State, at No. 23 Illinois, vs. No. 12 Purdue and at No. 18 Minnesota).

The Next Four

The Buckeyes are home to face Penn State Thursday, Indiana Jan. 29 and Illinois Feb. 4. The Buckeyes are back on the road Feb. 7 at Purdue. Ohio State, which defeated Nebraska Monday in Columbus, has not played four-consecutive home games during the Big Ten Conference season since the 1987 league campaign. The Buckeyes lost to Purdue (Jan. 29) and Illinois (Feb. 2) before knocking off both Michigan (Feb. 5) and Michigan State (Feb. 9) that season. The last time Ohio State played three-consecutive league games at home was during the 2010 conference season against Minnesota (Jan. 31), Penn State (Feb. 2) and Iowa (Feb. 7). The Buckeyes won each of those contests.

Bates-Diop Back-to-Back B1G POW

Keita Bates-Diop was named the Big Ten Conference Player of the Week Jan. 15 after earning the honor the week before as well on Jan. 8. It's the third of the season for the 6-7 forward after earning the honor Dec. 11, 2017. Most recently, Bates-Diop averaged 23 points and 8.5 rebounds in a home win over Maryland and a road victory at Rutgers. He

averaged 29.5 points and 10 rebounds in wins at Iowa and at home vs. No. 1 Michigan State to claim B1G POW last week. He poured in a career-high 32 points vs. the Spartans after a 27-point effort at Iowa. His earlier award also followed a pair of Ohio State victories. In the 97-62 win over William & Mary Dec. 9, Bates-Diop scored a then career-high 27 points after an 18-point, nine-rebound effort against Michigan Dec. 4. For that week, Bates-Diop connected on 62 percent of his shots from the field (16-26), 50 percent from 3-point range (4-8) and 90 percent at the foul line (9-10). Against William & Mary, the Buckeyes made 10-consecuitve field goal attempts early in the second half, Bates-Diop made five of those buckets, all from inside the arc, to help Ohio State to a commanding lead.

Rookie Recognized, Again

Freshman Kaleb Wesson was named the Big Ten Freshman of the Week by the Big Ten Conference Jan. 22 after earning the honor first Dec. 4. Wesson averaged 11.5 points and 7.0 rebounds in wins at Northwestern and vs. Minnesota in New York last week.

Early Leaders

Junior Keita Bates-Diop has paced the Buckeyes over the first 22 games of the season with 19.7 points a game with a total of 193 rebounds (8.8 rpg.). He is one of three regulars shooting better than 50 percent from the field (163-323/.505). He also leads the Buckeyes with 39 blocks. Senior Jae'Sean Tate connects on 55 percent of his shots (112-203) for an average of 12.6 ppg. He is second with 62 assists. In 18 starts over 21 games, freshman center Kaleb Wesson has scored on 79 of 143 field goal attempts (.552) and leads the team in both made (75) and attempted (101) free throw attempts. As a team, Ohio State has scored at least 80 points in 11 games this season (3 in 2016-17) and has made 50 percent or better in nine games (11 in 2016-17).


Ohio State vs. Penn State Series

Ohio State leads the all-time series with Penn State 34-14. The Buckeyes are 17-4 in Columbus and 13-8 in State College. The teams have met six times on neutral courts with the Buckeyes winning four. Ranked Ohio State teams are 18-4 against the Nittany Lions. The last time Ohio State was ranked in the Penn State series was March 4, 2015, a 72-67 win for the No. 23 Buckeyes in State College. The last time a ranked Ohio State squad fell to Penn State was Feb. 27, 2014 when the unranked Nittany Lions claimed a 65-63 win in at Penn State over the No. 14 Buckeyes. Seniors Jae'Sean Tate and Kam Williams along with junior Keita Bates-Diop have the most experience among the current Buckeyes with four games played against the Huskers by

Last Time vs. Penn State

Game 30 Ohio State 71, Penn State 70 Feb. 28, 2017, State College

STATE COLLEGE, Pa. -- Ohio State players swarmed one of their own, offering hugs and handshakes before assembling the traditional postgame line to offer the same to their opponents. Jae'Sean Tate saved Ohio State with a late layup that lifted the Buckeyes to a 71-70 win over Penn State. Tate took a pass at mid court, spun by two Penn State defenders in the lane and kissed the ball off the glass for the game-winner. It countered a deep 3-pointer from Penn State's Tony Carr that gave the Nittany Lions a 70-69 lead with nine seconds to play. Marc Loving added 15 points and Trevor Thompson chipped in 11 for the Buckeyes who won on the road for the fourth time this season. Tate finished with 12 points and nine rebounds. Penn State was out of timeouts and a desperation heave fell short. Carr finished with 21, Shep Garner notched 20 points and Lamar Stevens added 16 for Penn State.



Tate and Bates-Diop and five by Williams. Tate averages 12.3 points and 5.3 boards in the series. He has made 22-30 field goals (.733) in 28 minutes per game vs. Penn State. Williams contributes 4.4 points and 2.0 boards. Bates-Diop averages 10.8 points and 4.8 rebounds.

Ohio State vs. The $\operatorname{Big}\nolimits$ Ten

The Buckeyes own an overall record of 811-713 against current league members. Chris Holtmann is new to the Big Ten but no stranger to Big Ten competition. He faced six league opponents during his six years as a head coach prior to taking over for the Buckeyes this year. He entered his first year of Big Ten competition with a 4-5 record vs. conference foes. He is 13-5 vs. conference opponents in seven years as a head coach.

CBS Sports Classic-Year 4

CBS Sports has brought together four of the nation's most prestigious college basketball teams the last three years and will do so again over the next three. Kentucky, North Carolina, Ohio State and UCLA, will again meet for a college basketball showcase, the CBSSPORTS CLASSIC in 2017, 2018 and 2019. These four schools have combined to win 26 national championships and are among the winningest college basketball programs of all-time. The event debuted at the United Center in Chicago Dec. 20, 2014. North Carolina faced Ohio State and UCLA took on Kentucky. The CBS SPORTS CLASSIC moved to Barclays Center in Brooklyn, New York, Dec. 19, 2015, where the Buckeyes knocked off No. 4 Kentucky 74-67. The teams travelled to Las Vegas in 2016 where the Buckeyes faced UCLA. Ohio State played North Carolina Dec. 23 in New Orleans. The event will be held in Chicago in 2018. The Buckeyes are 1-3 in the event to date with a win over Kentucky and losses to North Carolina (2) and UCLA.

Holtmann Era Begins in Columbus

June 9, 2017 marked the first day of the Chris Holtmann era at Ohio State. After six seasons as a head coach, including the last three at Butler, Holtmann became the 14th head coach in Ohio State men's basketball history. In his young career to date, Holtmann already has earned coach of the year honors in both the Big South Conference (2013), where he spent three seasons coaching Gardner-Webb (2001-13), and in the Big East (2017) in the final of three seasons with the Bulldogs. His first game in Columbus, a win over Robert Morris, was the 200th of his head coaching career (132-89).

Buckeyes In Midst of Best Decade in History

With 228 wins in the last nine seasons (2010-18), Ohio State already has more victories this decade than in any other in the program's history. Ohio State won 189 games from 1980-1989 and 188 contests from 1960-69. The winning percentage of .738 (228-81/309) in the last nine years is the best previous winning percentage in a decade in Ohio State history.

Noting the Nebraska Game

- Ohio State now leads the all-time series with Nebraska 15-4 and is 8-1 in Columbus.
- Ranked Ohio State teams are 9-1 against the Huskers. The last time Ohio State was ranked coming into the Nebraska game was March 14, 2014 and the No. 24 Buckeyes took a 71-67 win in Indianapolis.
- Ohio State is now 16-2 this season when leading at the half.
- The Buckeyes are 18-1 this season when shooting a higher field goal percentage than their opponent.
- The last time Ohio State gave up 30+ points by an individual was when Jamal Murray (Ken-

- Keita Bates-Diop led the scoring effort for the Buckeyes with 20 points. He added six rebounds, two assists and two blocks.
- Bates-Diop has 17 consecutive games in double digits, the longest active streak in the Big Ten. Eight of those 17 games are 20+ point games.
- Bates-Diop moves to 50th on the list of alltime scoring, passing Lenzelle Smith, Jason Singleton, and Bill Andreas.
- With 17 points tonight, Jae'Sean Tate passes Brent Darby to take 26th on the list of all-time scoring. Next on the list is Brian Brown with 1,384.
- Tate grabbed seven rebounds with two assists and one steal.
- C.J. Jackson dished a team-high four assists. He added four rebounds and 12 points, going 3-3 from the line.
- Jackson now has 17 games this season with 10 or more points, 16 of which are from the last 19 games.
- Jackson has made at least one 3-pointer in each of the last 18 games.

Ohio State Faces Several in AP Top 25

The Buckeyes will face six opponents in 2017-18 ranked among the nation's Top 25 in the current *Associated Press* Poll. The Buckeyes opened the PK80 event in Portland, Oregon, vs. No. 15 Gonzaga, the runner-up in the 2017 NCAA Tournament, Nov. 23 (L 86-59). No. 10 North Carolina, the 2017 National Champion, defeated the Buckeyes 86-72 Dec. 3 in New Orleans. Clemson, No. 18 in the poll this week, downed the Buckeyes 79-65 Nov. 29 in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge in Columbus. In Big Ten play, the Buckeyes topped current No. 25 Michigan at home Dec. 4 71-62 and then No. 1/current No. 6 Michigan State (H) 80-64 Jan. 7. The Buckeyes take on No. 3 Purdue (A) once this season. Ohio State travels to West Lafayette Feb. 7.

Veterans Lead Host of Newcomers

Seniors Kam Williams, now in his fifth year, and Jae'Sean Tate are the most experienced Buckeyes on the 2017-18 roster with 124 and 117 games played, respectively. Keita Bates-Diop, who sat out the majority of the 2016-17 season with a stress fracture, is next at 97 games played. Heading into the 2017-18 campaign, Ohio State has seven players new to the program.

Bates-Diop Returns

After sitting out all but nine games in 2016-17 with a stress fracture in his left leg, Keita Bates-Diop is back healthy and expected to make significant contributions to the Buckeyes this season. Bates-Diop has two seasons of eligibility remaining after receiving a medical redshirt after last season. Bates-Diop averages 10.6 points and 5.3 rebounds a game in 97 career appearances. His ability to block shots (109 career rejections) and convert at the foul line (165-213/.775) also adds balance to the Ohio State offensive and defensive efforts this year.

The state's top player, forward Kaleb Wesson of nearby Westerville, Ohio, signed with the Buckeyes in November of 2016. The No. 2 player in the state from a year ago, forward Kyle Young, took a different route to becoming a Buckeye. Young, a Massillon, Ohio, native, committed to Butler while Holtmann was coaching in Indianapolis last year. Once Holtmann and his three assistants from Butler agreed to take over the Ohio State program, Young decided to return to his home state and play for the Buckeyes. In all, seven players on Ohio State's current roster hail from the state of Ohio.

Seven players returned from the 2016-17 roster with one freshman (Kaleb Wesson) set to join the 2017-18 Buckeyes when Holtmann settled in as Ohio State's 14th head coach in men's basketball. Soon after, another highly-touted regional prospect elected to join Ohio State's 2017-18 roster. Musa Jal-

low, a 6-5 Bloomington, Indiana, native completed requirements to graduate from Bloomington North High School early and reclassify from the class of 2018-19 to 2017-18 and become a Buckeye. One of top players in the state of Indiana, Jallow gives the Buckeyes a quality scorer, rebounder and defender.

In addition to adding a pair of scholarship studentathletes in the freshman class, the Buckeyes also grew the roster with a graduate transfer and three additional walk-ons for a roster of 14 heading into the 2017-18 season. had planned to join Butler as a preferred walk-on before Chris Holtmann and his staff took over at Ohio State. Fulton elected to alter his path to Columbus in the same capacity once Holtmann became a Buckeye. A pair of local products also elected to don the Scarlet and Gray after starting their careers elsewhere. Juniors Matt Lehmann, who prepped locally at Bishop Watterson, and Danny Hummer, from nearby Upper Arlington, completed the Ohio State roster for this season. Lehmann played briefly for West Virginia before transferring to Ohio State to continue his academic pursuits. Hummer played for Air Force before electing to return to Columbus and join the Buckeyes.

Schedule to Test Buckeyes in 2017-18

Chris Holtmann inherited one of the more difficult schedules in recent memory at Ohio State. The season tipped off officially Nov. 10 vs. Robert Morris (W, 95-64) to begin the Chris Holtmann era in Columbus.

- * The Buckeyes took part in the annual Big Ten/ACC Challenge Nov. 29. Ohio State fell to Clemson in Columbus 79-65.
- * In honor of Nike's Phil Knight's 80th birthday, Ohio State traveled to Portland, Oregon, for three games the week of Thanksgiving after a home game vs. Northeastern Nov. 19 for the PK80 Invitational

Nov. 23-26. Ohio State opened the event in Portland vs. then-No. 17 Gonzaga Nov. 23.

- * Now in its fourth year, Ohio State played in the CBSSports Classic. The event took place in New Orleans this season Dec. 23. The Buckeyes take on defending national champion North Carolina (L, 86-72) while Kentucky faced UCLA. The Buckeyes battled both teams that squared off for the 2017 NCAA title this season (Gonzaga and UNC).
- * Two Big Ten Conference were played in early December this year as the conference showcases its annual postseason tournament a week earlier than normal at Madison Square Garden in New York (Feb. 28-March 4). Ohio State travelled to Wisconsin Dec. 2 (W, 83-58) and defeated Michigan Dec. 4 (71-62) in Columbus.
- *Two of Ohio State's nine league road games will be played in non-traditional venues this season. Ohio State faced Northwestern Jan. 17 at Allstate Arena in Rosemont, Illinois, while renovations take place at the Wildcats' Welsh-Ryan Arena. The Buckeyes and Minnesota played at Madison Square Garden in New York Jan. 20 as part of the 2018 Big Ten Super Saturday double-header with the hockey programs from Minnesota and Michigan State. Ohio State defeated both Northwestern and Minnesota.
- * The Buckeyes will have 18 home games in 2017-18 plus an exhibition contest vs. the College of Wooster Nov. 5.
- * Eight Big Ten Conference opponents take on the Buckeyes once this year. Ohio State plays host to Illinois, Maryland, Michigan State and Nebraska and travel only to Minnesota (neutral site), Northwestern (Allstate Arena, Rosemont, Illinois), Purdue and Wisconsin. The Buckeyes play Indiana, Iowa, Michigan, Penn State and Rutgers both home and away.
- * Ohio State will play 17 regular-season games against 14 teams that advanced to postseason play in 2017. Eleven games are scheduled vs. 2017 NCAA Tournament teams (Wisconsin, Gonzaga, Northwestern, Maryland, Minnesota, Texas Southern, North Carolina, Michigan (2), Purdue and Michigan State) while six contests pit the Buckeyes vs. 2017 NIT squads (Illinois, Clemson, Indiana (2) and Iowa (2).
- * Every Ohio State game will be available on BTN, ESPN, FOX or CBS platforms. At least one home game (Michigan State) and a neutral site game (North Carolina) are scheduled for CBS.

Williams On Pace for 1,000 Career Points

Jae'Sean Tate became the 54th player to accomplish the feat of scoring 1,000 career points at Ohio State with 20 points at Maryland Feb. 11. He has 1,371 points (11.7 ppg.) in 117 career appearances. Keita Bates-Diop, the 55th Buckeye all-time to score 1,000 career points, did so with 17 points vs. Minnesota Jan. 20 at Madison Square Garden. Fifth-year senior Kam Williams (953 career points) is close to reaching 1,000 points. Williams scored 300 points as a junior and 290 during his sophomore season.

106 Years in the Big Ten

Ohio State celebrates 106 years as a member of the Big Ten Conference in men's basketball in 2018. The Buckeyes finished in the No. 6 spot in the 1913 conference standings, the first season of league play. Over 105 seasons, Ohio State has earned 20 Big Ten regular-season titles with 27 NCAA tournament appearances, one national championship (1960) and 10 trips to the Final Four. Ten former coaches and players are members of the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame while 51 student-athletes have been drafted by National Basketball Association teams, including 24 in the first round.

Tate in Exclusive Club, Bates-Diop Joins

Ohio State senior Jae'Sean Tate entered both the 1,000 career-point and 500 career-rebound club last season with 458 points and 205 boards. He currently owns 1,371 points and 686 rebounds. Keita Bates-Diop became the 28th Buckeye in history with both 1,000 points and 500 rebounds with a 17-point effort vs. Minnesota Jan. 20. In 97 career games, Bates-Diop has 1,033 points and 518 boards.

Off the Bench

- Keita Bates-Diop had season-ending surgery Jan. 25, 2017 on his left leg to repair a stress fracture he had been battling since missing about two months of 2016 summer workouts with the injury. Bates-Diop played in nine games last season around illness, a right ankle sprain sustained in the Providence game (Nov. 17, 2016) and lingering pain from the left-leg stress fracture. He averaged 9.7 points and 5.2 rebounds last season. Ohio State applied for a medical redshirt season on Bates-Diop's behalf following the 2016-17 campaign. it was granted and he has two seasons of eligibility remaining (2017-18 and 2018-19).
- The Buckeyes were 7-7 in 2016-17 in games decided by five or fewer points. Wins were against Michigan (70-66), Providence (72-67), Connecticut (64-60), UNC Asheville (79-77), Michigan State (72-67), at Nebraska (67-66) and at Penn State (71-70). Losses were to Indiana (96-92), Virginia (63-61) on the road, Florida Atlantic (79-77), at Illinois (75-70), Purdue (76-75), Northwestern

(74-72) and Nebraska (58-57).

• Jae'Sean Tate was the only Power 5 Conference player 6-4 or shorter who averaged more than six rebounds per game in 2016-17. Overall, Tate tied for 18th nationally among players 6-4 or shorter with 6.4 rebounds per game...he also was ninth nationally among players 6-4 or shorter with 1.9 offensive rebounds per game.

HEAD COACH CHRIS HOLTMANN

Chris Holtmann took over the Ohio State men's basketball head coaching position June 12, 2017 after a successful three-year stint as head coach at Butler (2015-2017). He was an assistant at Butler during the 2013-14 season after a three-year run as head coach at Cardara Wohle (2011).

Holtmann was named conference coach of the year at both his previous stops earning the honor in 2013 in the Big South and then in 2017 in the Big East following a 25-9 campaing with the Bulldogs.

The 14th head coach in Ohio State history, Holtmann is a 1994 graduate of Taylor University, where he majored in Psychology. He also has a master's degree in Athletics Administration from Ball State (2000).

As a player at Taylor, he earned NAIA All-America status in 1994 under the direction of Paul Patterson.

Prior to becoming a head coach, Holtmann was an assistant for John Groce (Ohio U.) and Brandon Miller (Butler). Both Groce and Miller were former Ohio State assistant coaches.

Game 1 Ohio State 95, Robert Morris 64 Nov. 10, 2017, Columbus

COLUMBUS. -- Keita Bates-Diop had 19 points and 11 rebounds to help Ohio State beat Robert Morris 95-64 Friday in the season opener for both teams. Kam Williams scored 16 points. Kaleb Wesson added 13 and seven rebounds and Musa Jallow scored 11 points. including three dunks. Williams hit a 3-pointer during a 14-2 run that gave Ohio State an 18-8 with 12:16 remaining in the first half and the Buckeyes led by at least eight points the rest of the way. The Colonials struggled to hit shots and deal with Ohio State's size. The Buckeyes shot 60 percent from the field, outscored the Colonials 66-18 in the paint and outrebounded them 51-23. Robert Morris shot just 35 percent from the field. Matty McConnell and freshman Koby Thomas scored 22 points apiece and combined to hit 7 of 13 from 3-point range for Robert Morris. The game marked the first win for Chris Holtmann as head coach of the Buckeves. It also served as the 200th game coached in seven seasons as a head coach, which includes three seasons each at Gardner-Webb and Butler.

Notes:

- Ohio State and Robert Morris have met four times with the Buckeyes winning all four matchups.
- Buckeyes are 13-0 against teams representing the Northeast Conference
- . Ohio State is 100-17 all-time in home openers.
- The Buckeyes' 95 points were the highest since Nov. 25th, 2016 against Marshall.
- Ohio State now has 623 wins when one or more players record a double-double.
- Chris Holtmann recorded his 115th win as a head coach for his career. The win was the first of his Ohio State career. The contest also maked the 200th as a head coach.
- Holtmann is the 11th head coach in Ohio State history to win his first game.
- Keita Bates-Diop led the Buckeyes scoring efforts against Robert Morris with 19 points along with 11 rebounds. He has recorded a double double in both the last two season openers for the Buckeyes. He also reached double digits in both scoring and rebounding (14/14) vs. Navy last year in Annapolis before missing most of the season with a stress fracture in his left leg.
- Bates-Diop recorded his first double-double of the season and his seventh of his career.
- Bates-Diop finished with a career-high seven offensive rebounds.
- Kam Williams recorded 16 points to make him the second leading scorer for the Buckeyes.
- Kaleb Wesson, a freshman, started his Buckeye career with 13 points and seven rebounds off the bench.
- Wesson was 5-7 from the field and 3-5 on free throw attempts.

Game 2 Ohio State 82, Radford 72 Nov. 12, 2017. Columbus

COLUMBUS. -- Keita Bates-Diop had his second strong performance on his path to injury recovery with 22 points and 10 rebounds when Ohio State defeated Radford 82-72. C.J. Jackson added 19 points and Jae'Sean Tate had 13 points and 10 rebounds for the Buckeyes (2-0), who led 44-34 at the half. OSU was up by 26 in the second half before Radford had a late flurry. Carlik Jones led Radford (1-1) with 19 points and Randy Phillips scored 12. Ohio State led 44-34 at the half but the Highlanders presented problems with their press although they failed to take advantage in the first half. Radford in its opener Friday vs. Georgia Southwestern trailed by two at half-time but started the second half on a 21-5 run that led to a 72-63 win. The Highlanders had the role reversed against the Buckeyes by being outscored 17-1 in the first 6 1/2 minutes after the break. Jackson's point total set a career high for the junior college transfer, now in his second season with the Buckeyes.



- Jackson tied his career high of six defensive rebounds for the third time (last at Michigan, 2/4/17).
- Both Bates-Diop (22/10) and Tate (13/10) recorded double doubles in the game, the last time two Buckeyes did so was vs. Fairleigh Dickinson (12/3/16) when Trevor Thompson (13/10) and Tate (12/12) recorded the feat in a 70-62 victory.
- Ohio State is 624-271 all-time when at least one player records a double-double and 143-51 in games when two Buckeyes reach double figures


Game 3 Ohio State 82, Texas Southern 64 Nov. 16, 2017, Columbus

COLUMBUS. -- Keita Bates-Diop, Jae Sean Tate and Micah Potter scored 17 points apiece to help Ohio State hold off Texas Southern for an 82-64 win. Bates-Diop added 12 rebounds. Musa Jallow had 13 points and four steals in his first career start and C.J. Jackson scored eight with nine assists for Ohio State (3-0). The Buckeyes held a 39-30 rebounding edge. Jallow punctuated a 16-2 run with his third 3-pointer to give the Buckeyes a 75-59 lead with 3:55 remaining in the game. Ohio State led by 18 points with 17:12 to go, but Texas Southern used a 24-8 run to pull within four points with 6:58 left. Donte Clark scored eight points during the stretch. He finished with 17 points, hitting 8-of-9 free throws. Both teams struggled to find consistent offense early. Game 11 Ohio State 97, William & Mary 62 **Dec. 9, 2017, Columbus**

COLUMBUS -- Keita Bates-Diop scored a career-high 27 points to lead Ohio State to a 97-62 victory against William & Mary. The Buckeyes shot 65 percent from the field and made 11-of-21 3-point shots while dishing out a season-high 19 assists. Ohio State made 10 consecutive shots early in the second half and went on a 16-0 run to lead by 40 with four minutes remaining. David Cohn and Nathan Knight led the way for the Tribe with 15 and 13 points, respectively. Freshman Kaleb Wesson scored 17 points and grabbed seven rebounds, and C.J. Jackson added 16 with six assists for the Buckeyes. William & Mary's Knight entered the game averaging 20.3 points and 8.6 rebounds per game. With the Tribe trailing 28-22, Knight caught a pass off a pick-and-roll and attacked the basket, but Ohio State forward Musa Jallow drew a charge. The next possession, Knight fouled Bates-Diop and went to the bench for the final 7:49 of the half with three fouls. From that moment on, Ohio State outscored William & Mary 20-10. Andre Wesson's 3 with 12:05 showing on the first-half clock gave the Buckeyes a 22-20 lead and began a 27-4 run through the next 11 minutes



- Andrew Dakich scored a career-high eight points on a perfect 3-3 from the field and 2-2 from behind the arc. He also added three rebounds and two assists


Game 12 Ohio State 80, Appalachian State 67 Dec. 16, 2017, Columbus

COLUMBUS -- Jae'Sean Tate scored 19 points for Ohio State in a 80-67 win against Appalachian State at Value City Arena. Keita Bates-Diop added 18 points and Kaleb Wesson 16 for the Buckeyes, who matched their season-high four-game winning streak that opened the season. Ronshad Shabazz scored 15 points and Delaware, Ohio, native Griffin Kinney had 14 for the Mountaineers in their third straight defeat. A fire alarm delayed the game for 20 minutes with Ohio State leading 48-33. The failure of an exhaust fan in a concessions stand set off the fire alarm, triggering an announcement to evacuate the building. The all-clear was given after nine minutes. Later, after Appalachian State pulled to within nine, the Buckeyes went on a 9-0 run for a 67-47 lead before the Mountaineers made a late push. The Buckeyes led 40-27 at the half. The Buckeyes shot better than 50 percent (30-57) for the second consecutive game and for the third time in the last four outings. Ohio State went to the foul line 23 times (17 makes), marking the third-consecutive game and seventh time this year the Buckeyes have gone to the stripe 20 or more times.

- This game marked the first meeting between Ohio State and Appalachian State. The Buckeyes are 1-0 over the Mountaineers and have an 8-3 record over teams representing the Sun Belt Conference.
- The game was delayed at 17:47 (2H) for 20 minutes because of a fire alarm in the arena
- Ohio State is now 2-0 when C.J. Jackson, Kam Williams, Kaleb Wesson, Jae'Sean Tate and Keita Bates-Diop start for the Buckeyes.
- Ohio State is 7-2 when leading at the half.
- Jae'Sean Tate and Keita Bates-Diop graduated Dec. 17. Tate is graduating with a degree in Sport Industry and Bates-Diop with a degree in Economics.
- The game marked the first time Chris Holtmann has coached against Appalachian State.
- Jae'Sean Tate led the scoring effort with 19 points for the Buck-
- Tate now has 1,254 career points. He is now ranked 33rd among all-time leading scorers at Ohio State, passing Ronnie Stokes (1,240).
- Keita Bates-Diop netted 18 points and tied a team-high eight rebounds.
- Bates-Diop recorded a career-high four steals and a seasonhigh three blocks.
- Bates-Diop went a perfect 6-6 from the free throw line.
- Kaleb Wesson recorded eight rebounds, a career-high for him and a tied for the team-high (Bates-Diop) in the game.

Game 13 Ohio State 94, The Citadel 65 Dec. 19, 2017. Columbus

COLUMBUS -- Kam Williams and Keita Bates-Diop each scored 17 points as Ohio State won its fifth-consecutive game with a 94-65 win over The Citadel. C.J. Jackson added 13 points and Andrew Dakich 10 for the Buckeyes. Kaiden Rice had 14 points, and Alex Reed and Zane Najdawi added 11 apiece for the Bulldogs. Ohio State led 44-23 at the half and built the margin to 39 at 88-49 with five minutes left. The Bulldogs were 12th in the nation in scoring at 89.3 points per game but much of that is predicated on getting points from their press and hitting shots. They had neither working when OSU took a 21-point halftime lead. The Bulldogs usually start two freshmen and two sophomores and have had as many as four frosh players on the court at the same time, so there continues to be growing pains. Six of the 12 players are freshmen. The Citadel is one of seven Division I schools without a senior on the roster. After making 3 of 14 3-pointers in the previous game against Appalachian State, the Buckeyes made improvements by hitting 13 of 35 vs. the Bulldogs.

- The Buckeyes are 18-1 all-time against members of the Southern Conference.
- The Citadel attempted 43 3-pointers in the contest. This was the third-most 3-pointers 0hio State has allowed since 1996, and the most allowed since Nov. 25, 2007 when VMI attempted 49.
- · Ohio State recorded a season-high 27 assists on the night.
- The Buckeyes attempted a season-high 74 shots on the night.

Game 21 No. 22 Ohio State 67, Minnesota 49 Jan. 20, 2018, New York

NEW YORK -- Keita Bates-Diop had 17 points and 12 rebounds for his eighth double-double of the season, leading No. 22 Ohio State over Minnesota 67-49 at Madison Square Garden for its seventh consecutive win. Ohio State's first-year coach Chris Holtmann is the third Big Ten coach to win his first eight conference games. Sam Barry won 11 straight for Iowa in 1923 and Walter Meanwell holds the record with 12 for Wisconsin in 1912. The Buckeyes used a 24-2 burst to overcome a 10-point deficit midway through the first half. They stayed in control, and went on to match last season's win total - with 10 regular season game remaining. Minnesota was held to just six field goals (28.6 percent) in the second half with 10 turnovers. Kaleb Wesson added 15 points and eight rebounds for Ohio State. Bates-Diop reached 1,000 career points, with his fourth point against Minnesota, to become the 55th Buckeye to do so. Jae'Sean Tate had 10 points, six rebounds and five assists and trails Brent Darby (1,368) by 14 points for the 26th spot on the school's scoring list.

- The game marked the 143rd meeting between Ohio State and Minnesota.
- The Buckeyes lead the series 86-57 all-time against the Gophers, and 3-0 in neutral games.
- Ohio State has won five of the last six meetings between the
- two, with its last loss being a 78-68 loss at Minnesota Jan. 8, 2017. Ohio State (No. 22) has won the last 10 of the last 11 meetings when it entered the game ranked in the Top 25.
- The Buckeyes are 15-2 this season when leading at the half.
- Ohio State is 16-1 on the year when leading with five minutes remaining
- The Buckeyes are 14-2 when holding their opponents to under 50 pct, from the field this season.
- Ohio State outscored Minnesota in the paint 40-20 in the contest.
- The Buckeyes are 17-1 this season when shooting a higher field goal percentage than their opponent.
- Ohio State scored 22 points off 15 Minnesota turnovers.
- The Buckeyes shot a season high 90 pct. (9/10) from the free throw line
- Ohio State has held its opponent to less than 50 points in two of the last three contests, the other being Rutgers (46)
- The game marked the first time Chris Holtmann has faced Minnesota in his career.
- Holtmann is now 8-0 against Big Ten opponents to start his Ohio State tenure. Holtmann's 8-0 start is the best record to start off a Big Ten
- tenure since Sam Barry went 11-0 in 1923 at Iowa. Keita Bates-Diop scored a game-high 17 points while also grab-
- bing 12 rebounds in the contest.
- Bates-Diop's 17 points move his career total to 1,013, and makes him the 55th player in Ohio State history to score 1,000 career points (1.013).
- Bates-Diop also recorded his eighth double-double of the season and the 14th of his career.
- The Buckeyes are 13-1 in games which Bates-Diop records a double-double



No. 13 Ohio State 64, Nebraska 59 Jan. 22, 2018, Columbus

COLUMBUS -- Keita Bates-Diop scored 14 of his 20 points in the second half and No. 13 Ohio State beat Nebraska 64-59. The back-and-forth game had seven lead changes in the second half. A pair of foul shots by Nebraska's James Palmer Jr. cut Ohio State's lead to four with 2:19 remaining, but the Cornhuskers couldn't pull any closer. Jae'Sean Tate put the Buckeyes up by six with a layup with 1:02 left, and a pair of foul shots by Kaleb Wesson stretched it to eight. Palmer hit a 3-pointer with 12 seconds left, but Nebraska ran out of time. Palmer had a career-high 34 points. Nebraska Ohio State surpassed its win total for all of last season. Earlier in the day, it moved from No. 22 to No. 13 in the AP Top 25, its highest position since 2014.

- Ohio State now leads the all-time series with Nebraska 15-4 and is 8-1 in Columbus.

- The last time Ohio State gave up 30+ points by an individual was when Jamal Murray (Kentucky) scored 33 points on Dec. 19, 2015. Nebraska's James Palmer Jr. scored 34. The point total was the most by an opponent in Value City Arena history, eclipsing Ray Barbosa's 32 points scored for UMBC Dec. 2, 2007.
- The Buckeyes tied the season low with six turnovers, none in the second half.
- The game marked the first time Chris Holtmann has coached against Nebraska.
- Holtmann is now 9-0 in the Big Ten. Holtmann's start is the best record to start of a Big Ten career since Sam Barry went 11-0 in 1923 at lowa.
- Keita Bates-Diop led the scoring effort for the Buckeyes with 20 points. He added six rebounds, two assists and two blocks.
- Bates-Diop has 17 consecutive games in double digits, the longest active streak in the Big Ten. Eight of those 17 games are 20+point games.
- Bates-Diop moves to 50th on the list of all-time scoring, passing Lenzelle Smith, Jason Singleton, and Bill Andreas.
- With 17 points tonight, Jae'Sean Tate passes Brent Darby to take 26th on the list of all-time scoring. Next on the list is Brian Brown with 1,384.
- Tate grabbed seven rebounds with two assists and one steal.
- C.J. Jackson dished a team-high four assists. He added four rebounds and 12 points, going 3-3 from the line.
- Jackson now has 17 games this season with 10 or more points, 16 of which are from the last 19 games.
- Jackson has made at least one 3-pointer in each of the last 18 games.
- Kaleb Wesson tied a season high with six made free throws.
- Wesson had 12 points, seven rebounds and two assists


