SCOUTING THE SCARLET KNIGHTS

Rutgers begins its home slate with a five-game homestand against Penn State after earning a 1-1 draw with Duke and then falling to Elon, 2-1 to open its 2013 campaign. The Scarlet Knights were 6-1 at Yurcak Field last season.

Both Nathan Bruccoleri and Mael Corboz had strong opening weekends, being named to the Duke Soccer Classic All-Tournament Team. Bruccoleri had a 34th minute strike in the loss to Elon, while Corboz accounted for seven of Rutgers' 20 shots in the pair of games. Kene Eze, the team's leading scorer in 2012, currently leads the team with three points (1G, 1A).

David Greczek made his debut in goal for Rutgers over the weekend, playing all 200 minutes. The 6'1" freshman allowed three goals and made 10 total saves (.769 save percentage). He has faced 22 second half shots through the first two games, compared to four for Rutgers.

OPENING KICK

Penn State (2-0-0) travels to Piscataway, N.J. for a bout with Rutgers (0-1-1) Friday night before taking on No. 23 St. John's (1-1-0) Sunday in a nationally televised match on ESPN3. This is the first road trip of the season for the Nittany Lions, who were 2-2-1 as visitors in 2012. Penn State opened the season with a pair of shutouts for the second time in the last three seasons, downing both Radford and Central Connecticut by 1-0 scorelines.

WADID DELIVERS

Freshman Mark Wadid became the first Penn State rookie to score in a season-opener since August 31, 2001 (Chad Severs) when he drilled a shot inside the near post against Radford. The 69th minute strike proved to be the game-winner, as the Nittany Lions held on for the victory. Goalkeeper Andrew Wolverton made five saves in the game.

DENNIS DOWNS CENTRAL CONN.

After firing 19 shots through the first 80 minutes of action, Penn State finally broke through on the 20th as junior Eli Dennis nodded the game-winner into the back of the net. It was the first career goal at Jeffrey Field for Dennis, who received the ball on a perfect cross from freshman Connor Maloney. The Blue Devils managed just one shot on goal in the match.

KING OF QUEENS

Sunday's match against St. John's is a homecoming of sorts for senior defender Akil Howard, who grew up just three miles away from campus in Queens, N.Y. The center back plans to have most of his family in attendance as he plays at St. John's for the first time in his collegiate career. Fellow center back Martin Seiler spent his redshirt season at St. John's in 2011.

TWO GAMES, ZERO GOALS

Junior goalkeeper Andrew Wolverton has yet to allow a goal in 180 minutes of action this season, collecting six saves through the first two games. The netminder has made a career on clean sheets, posting 17 shutouts in 32 career starts (53%). Wolverton set the Penn State single-season record for shutouts as a freshman (12), and is currently tied for seventh on the PSU career shutout list.

PSU, RUTGERS REIGNITE SERIES

Penn State and Rutgers meet for the first time since 1994 Friday after playing each other 15 times over the course of 12 years between 1982 and 1994. The Scarlet Knights got the better of

the Nittany Lions in their last meeting on November 27, 1994, as they were overtime victors in the second round of the NCAA Tournament. The Blue & White narrowly hold the all-time series advantage, 8-7.

FAMILIAR FOES

Penn State and St. John's are meeting for just the sixth time in history Sunday night, but there is no lack of bad blood between the sides. The Nittany Lions and Red Storm met in the NCAA Tournament three out of four years between 1998 and 2001, with two games going to overtime. The all-time series is even, 2-2-1.

MACK BRADY GAME LOOMS

On Friday, September 13, Penn State will host No. 10 California as it celebrates "Mack Brady Night." Mack -- the late son of Shreyer Honors College Dean, Christian Brady -- passed due to an unexpected blood infection in 2012. Christan and his wife, Elizabeth, established a scholarship for Penn State goalkeepers. All PSU goalkeepers are wearing patches with Mack's name and number on their back this season.

FRESHMEN SHINE

Desperate to fill an offensive void after the loss of 10 seniors, Penn State has welcomed the strong play of rookies Mark Wadid, Connor Maloney and Mason Klerks. Wadid has been a major factor at the forward position, while Maloney has been a revelation at right back. Klerks, meanwhile, has had strong reserve minutes in the midfield.

SEASON REWIND: 2012

In his third season at the helm, Penn State head coach Bob Warming led the Nittany Lions to their first Big Ten Conference championship since 2005. The Blue and White went 2-0-1 in conference play during the final two weeks of the regular season, downing Michigan State and Northwestern to claim a share of the title. The run quickly ended for the Lions, however, as they were knocked out of the Big Ten Tournament in the first round and missed the NCAA Tournament.

MIDFIELD CONSISTENCY

Junior Owen Griffith and Senior Grant Warming return to patrol the central midfield in 2013 after strong seasons in 2012. The pair brings an experienced mindset to the defensive side of the midfield, as both possess the ability to quickly transfer the ball from the backline to the front. Warming has the most career appearances on the team (54). Both players do the little things on the field to drive the engine, seldom appearing in the stat sheet. In fact, Warming is still searching for his first career goal.

LIONS TIE NO. 2 TERPS

Penn State earned an excellent result in its second preseason game, as it played second-ranked Maryland to a 1-1 tie on August 20. Despite returning the nation's best offense from a season ago, the Terps were held to just one goal (on a penalty kick). Freshman Mark Wadid scored his first unofficial goal at Jeffrey Field in the match, as fellow classmate Connor Maloney found him slashing behind the Maryland defense. Wadid corralled the long ball and then beat the Terrapin goalkeeper with a composed shot into the side netting. PSU coaches were pleased with the overall play of center backs Akil Howard and Martin Seiler, who were able to largely shut down the reigning national player of the year, Patrick Mullins.

COACHING CLOUT

Among the elite coaches in the sports for the last three decades, head coach Bob Warming is back for his fourth season at Penn State. Warming has an incredible coaching pedigree, including 417 career Division I victories -- fifth all-time among active DI coaches. He was named Big Ten Coach of the Year in 2012 after leading PSU to the league title.

BIG TEN NETWORK SCHEDULE

Penn State is scheduled to be featured on the Big Ten Network at least two times this season. The booters will first appear on national television when they travel to presason No. 1 Indiana on October 6. The Blue and White will then play two more league games before returning to the national spotlight in a home match against Northwestern on October 27.

BIG DISTINGUISHED SCHOLARS

Current Penn State players, Kyle MacDonald and Danny Sheerin, were named Big Ten Distinguished Scholars on July 10. The distinction is an incredible honor, as student-athletes are required to have a minimum GPA of 3.7 or higher for the 2012-13 academic year.

SCOUTING THE RED STORM

Penn State returns to Queens, N.Y. for the first time since 2001 to take on the 23rd-ranked Red Storm. St. John's opened the season with a 2-1 home victory against NJIT, but were blanked in Charlottesville, Va., 2-0, by Virginia. Sunday's game features two of the winningest head coaches in Division I men's soccer history, as Dave Masur entered 2013 with 367 wins and Bob Warming with 415.

Senior Jimmy Mulligan scored the game-winning goal to down NJIT, while Sean Sepe scored his first career goal. A second team All-Big East honoree in 2012, Jamie Thomas leads the Red Storm in the midfield.

Preseason Big East Goalkeeper of the Year selection Rafael Diaz mans the pipes for St. John's in 2013. The senior had eight shutouts last season, but has already allowed three goals in the first two games.

Appointed the 11th head coach in the history of the Penn State men's soccer program on May 24, 2010, Bob Warming has made an immediate impact in his first three seasons at the helm of the Nittany Lions. The veteran coach guided the team to the Big Ten Tournament championship game in 2010 and 2011, before winning a share of the regular season conference championship in 2012 and earning Big Ten Coach of the Year honors for his efforts.

Following a pair of strong seasons to begin his career at PSU, Warming's 2012 squad accumulated a 3-1-2 conference record to capture the team's first Big Ten regular season championship in seven years. The Nittany Lions held opponents to just over one goal per game during the season, as they went unbeaten in their final four regular season conference contests.

The 2011 campaign presented a major milestone for Warming as he became the 31st NCAA Division I men's soccer head coach to capture 400 career victories after the Nittany Lions downed Florida International, 1-0, in the team's fourth game of the season on Sept. 4. Penn State struggled through the Big Ten regular season, but hit its stride in the conference tournament, earning the distinction of being the first No. 7 seed to reach the title game.

The Nittany Lions switched roles from a high-powered offense in 2010 to a shutdown defense in 2011. The team allowed just 14 goals, the fewest since the 1977 squad surrendered 12 scores. Rookie goalkeeper Andrew Wolverson set school records for the most shutouts in a season (12) and led the Big Ten in GAA (0.60) and save percentage (.821).

Warming led the Lions to 14 wins in 2011, the most by a PSU team since 2002, a Big Ten Tournament title game appearance and to the program's first NCAA postseason victory in five years.

Penn State boasted one of the nation's most prolific offenses in 2010, totaling 144 points (45 goals, 54 assists) in 23 games. Corey Hertzog posted the most productive season by a Nittany Lion in 55 years, recording an NCAA-leading 20 goals and 46 points. Matheus Braga led the nation and shattered the Big Ten single season record in assists, registering 17. Both players earned NSCAA second team All-American honors.

Also successful in the classroom, Penn State received the NSCAA Team Academic Achievement Award in 2010, earning the honor with a 3.07 team GPA.

Warming's three-plus decades as a head coach have been signified by distinction, achievement and success. The six-time finalist for National Coach of the Year holds a lofty place in the NCAA record book, ranking sixth among active Division I head coaches and 15th in Division I history with 406 victories. Warming is also one of only two active coaches in Division I to take two different programs to the College Cup.

Warming, whose distinguished career spans 35 years, came to Happy Valley from Creighton University, where he took over a previously dormant program and developed it into a conference and regional power and national title contender.

In 14 total years in Omaha, served in two different stints (1990-94, 2001-09), Warming, the winningest coach in program history, led the Bluejays to 190 victories, seven Missouri Valley Conference regular season and tournament championships, 11 NCAA Championship appearances, and the 2002 College Cup. His teams proved nearly unbeatable at home, compiling a 107-18-15 record in Omaha. In recognition of his dominance in league play, Warming, a three-time Missouri Valley Conference Coach of the Year honoree, was named the MVC All-Centennial Team Coach in 2006.

An ardent believer in giving back through charitable works, Warming's

2009 Creighton squad won the community service award for performing over 1,500 hours of volunteer activities, including working on Habitat for Humanity projects, reading to elementary school students, and helping out at hospitals. Warming has also served as the honorary chairman of the Boy Scouts of America for Nebraska and as the honorary chairman of the Omaha Children's Crisis Center annual fund raiser.

Warming has not only built successful teams on the field, but also assisted with the design, fundraising, and construction management of three collegiate soccer stadiums, including, most recently, the \$13 million, 6,000-seat, state-of-the-art Michael G. Morrison, S.J., Stadium at Creighton. He and his winning teams helped fill the stands at Morrison Stadium, as Creighton led the MVC and ranked in the NCAA top 10 in attendance each of the past seven seasons.

In honor of significant contributions made to the athletic program at the university, Warming was inducted into the Creighton Athletics Hall of Fame in April 2011, becoming just the seventh head coach to earn the honor in its 43-year history.

In between his tenures at Creighton, Warming served as head coach at Saint Louis University, where he guided it to four Conference USA championships, three NCAA Championship berths and the 1997 College Cup. His Billiken teams also finished ranked in the top 20 in all four seasons.

Warming also previously held head coaching positions at Old Dominion (1996), Charlotte (1982-88), Berry College (1977-81), and Transylvania University (1976). His career coaching record stands at an impressive 415-202-72 (.655).

Warming has also produced numerous professional prospects, as at least one of his players has been selected in every MLS SuperDraft or supplemental draft. He has seen a total of 28 of his players drafted since the league's inception in 1996. Most recently, John Gallagher was selected with the 30th pick in the second round of the 2013 MLS Supplemental Draft. In 2011, Corey Hertzog was selected by the New York Red Bulls with the No. 13 pick in the first round of the SuperDraft, while Drew Cost was a supplemental draft choice of Real Salt Lake.

A 1975 graduate of Berea College (Ky.), Warming was a four-sport varsity letterwinner, starring on the golf, swimming, tennis, and soccer teams. As a starting goalkeeper, he posted a 28-2-2 record. Warming also holds a master's of science degree in sport administration from Eastern Kentucky University.

Warming and his wife, Cindy, have four children – Emily, Bess, and twins Grant and the late Audrey.

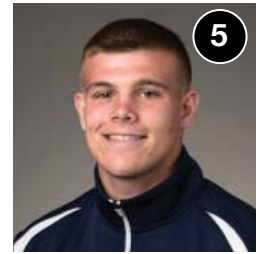

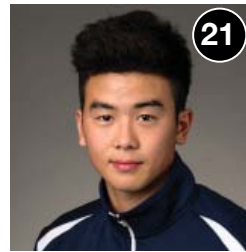
