## The Book on the Boilermakers

**At First Glance:** Purdue (17-11, 7-10 BIG) continues a regular-season ending four-match road trip in University Park, Pennsylvania, on Saturday. The Boilermakers are looking to make their 11th NCAA Tournament appearance in the last 13 seasons after going 23-10, finishing fifth in the Big Ten and advancing to the NCAA Second Round in 2015. The Purdue roster features seven returning players, two redshirts, a transfer and three newcomers. Head coach Dave Shondell is in his 14th season with the team.

**Last Time Out:** The Boilermakers went 1-1 last week, falling to No. 15 Michigan State in three sets Wednesday in East Lansing, and topping Iowa at home Saturday. Purdue topped in-state foe Indiana in five sets Wednesday to sweep the season series and win its ninth straight vs. IU.

**Statistically Speaking:** Outside hitter Danielle Cuttino paces the Purdue offense with 4.06 kills per set, while hitting at a .268 clip and adding 0.60 blocks per set. Outside hitter Azariah Stahl follows with 2.61 kills per set, 2.31 digs per set, 0.45 blocks per set and 16 aces. Middle blocker Faye Adelaja adds 2.36 kills per set and 0.86 blocks per stanza, while hitting at a team-best .380 clip. Outside hitter Sherridan Atkinson (2.00) and middle blocker Blake Mohler (1.42) also contribute offensively.

Mohler paces the Boilermakers at the net with 0.95 blocks per set. Adelaja follows with 0.86 blocks per set, while Atkinson has put up 0.60 blocks per set. In the back court, libero Natalie Haben leads the way with 3.14 digs per set to go with 21 aces. Stahl (2.31), defensive specialist Brooke Peters (2.30), setter Ashley Evans (2.06), and defensive specialist Carissa Damler (1.93) follow with nearly two digs per set. Evans also adds 10.81 assists per set and a team-best 28 aces, while Peters has served up 25 aces. As a team, Purdue is hitting at a .248 clip and has served up 112 aces.

## Series Information

**Penn State (PSU leads the series 53-6):** The Boilermakers won five of the first six contests with the Nittany Lions in the series which began on Nov. 7, 1981. Penn State won 42 straight, including 36 in 3-0 sweeps, dating from 1988 until Purdue took a five-set decision on Oct. 8, 2010, in West Lafayette. The win marked the first Purdue win over PSU since Dec. 4, 1987. PSU has won the last 10 contests, including a 3-0 decision Oct. 14 in West Lafayette.

## What a Difference a Win Makes...

If the Boilermakers top No. 15 Penn State on Saturday:

- They will earn head coach Dave Shondell his 300th collegiate victory (300-162).
- They will move to 18-11 overall and improve to 8-10 in the Big Ten.
- They will win snap a 10 match losing streak against the Nittany Lions, giving Purdue its first win over PSU since Oct. 8, 2010.
- They will post their first win against PSU in Happy Valley since Nov. 13, 1982 (a 26-match stretch).
- They will post their fifth win over a Top 25 foe in 2016.
- They will improve to 206-173 all-time when playing in the month of November, including a 6-7 mark when playing on Nov. 19. The Boilermakers last played on Nov. 19 in 2014, sweeping Rutgers.

## The Dave Shondell File

•Shondell, who became the fourth coach in Purdue volleyball history in February 2003, is in his 14th year at the helm of the Boilermaker volleyball program.

•Shondell joined the Purdue staff after 22 years as a successful club and high school coach in central Indiana.

•In 13 years as head coach at Muncie Central High School, he led the Bearcats to four state titles and a 428-52 record. That winning percentage (.891) is the second-best winning percentage in Indiana high school volleyball history.

•In his 13-plus years at Purdue, Shondell has posted a 299-162 overall record, including a 152-125 mark in the Big Ten Conference.

## News About the Nittany Lions

**At First Glance:** The No. 15 Penn State Nittany Lions (19-9, 11-6 BIG) begin a regular season-ending three matches homestand against Purdue on Saturday. The Nittany Lions return 14 letterwinners, including six starters, from the 2015 team which went 28-6 and finished fourth in the Big Ten. Penn State is coached by Russ Rose, who is in his 38th season with the team.

**Last Time Out:** The Nittany Lions went 1-1 last week, topping Maryland in four sets Friday and falling to Ohio State in five sets Saturday. PSU fell to No. 1 Nebraska on Wednesday in Lincoln.

**Statistically Speaking:** Outside hitter Simone Lee paces the Penn State offense with 4.16 kills per set, while hitting at a .263 clip and adding 1.58 digs per set and 15 aces. Middle blocker Haleigh Washington (2.44), outside hitter Ali Frantti (2.19) and middle blocker Heidi Thelen (1.80) follow. Washington is hitting at a team-best .438 clip and has managed a team-leading 1.19 blocks per set and 22 aces. Middle blocker Tori Gorrell adds 1.01 blocks per set to go with 1.65 kills per set and a .352 hitting percentage.

Defensively, libero Kendall White leads the way with 4.07 digs per set, followed by setter Abby Detering (1.77), Frantti (1.77) and defensive specialist Keeton Holcomb (1.71). Detering also adds 9.66 assists per set and a team-best 27 aces. As a team, Penn State is hitting at a .283 clip and has served up 120 aces.

### Among the Nation

Individually, middle blocker Faye Adelaja ranks 29th nationally in hitting percentage (.379), while setter Ashley Evans ranks 37th in assists per set (10.83). Outside hitter Danielle Cuttino ranks 40th in total kills (422), 44th in kills per set (4.06) and 50th in total points (463).

### Records/Milestones

Redshirt senior Faye Adelaja has managed 379 total blocks as a Boilermaker, just 17 out of the Top 10 in that category.

In addition, several Boilermakers recently reached or are approaching milestones. Adelaja is one kill away from 800. Junior Danielle Cuttino is eight blocks away from 300. Sophomore Brooke Peters is 19 digs from 400.

Redshirt sophomore Carissa Damler tallied her 200th dig Nov. 9 vs. Michigan State. Freshman Blake Mohler recorded her 100th block Saturday against Iowa. Junior Danielle Cuttino posted her 800th career kill Saturday. Freshman Natalie Haben posted her 300th dig Saturday. Redshirt sophomore Sherridan Atkinson tallied her 200th kill at Indiana on Wednesday (216), while junior Azariah Stahl managed her 300th dig (310).

### The Slate

In the Oct. 10 listings, the Boilermakers' schedule was ranked as the toughest in the country in terms of strength of schedule, one of the pillars of the RPI system. In the most recent rankings, released Nov. 14, Purdue is listed at No. 3.

Purdue was slated to play 11 matches against teams ranked in the AVCA Preseason Top 25 Poll, and three more against teams that were receiving votes outside of the Top 25. In reality, the Boilermakers have faced 11 ranked teams thus far: No. 2 Minnesota, No. 3 Nebraska, No. 3 Wisconsin, No. 4 Kansas, No. 9 Stanford, No. 10 Penn State, No. 13 Michigan, No. 15 Michigan State twice, No. 22 Illinois and No. 24 Kentucky.

### In the RPI

The first NCAA rating percentage index report was released on Oct. 3 and the Boilermakers checked in at No. 7. In the Nov. 14 listing, Purdue checked in at No. 21 in RPI. Eleven teams Purdue has already played in 2016 were listed among the initial Top 50: No. 1 Wisconsin, No. 2 Minnesota, No. 4 Nebraska, No. 5 Stanford, No. 9 Washington State, No. 12 Michigan, No. 18 Kentucky, No. 19 Michigan State, No. 24 Coastal Carolina, No. 30 Penn State, No. 35 Notre Dame, No. 39 Kansas, No. 40 Indiana and No. 50 Cal Poly. One more - No. 31 Ohio State - is still ahead on the slate as are four rematches.

RPI rankings are based upon a team's wins and losses and its strength of schedule. It is comprised of a team's winning percentage (25%), its opponents' winning percentage (50%) and the winning percentage of those opponents' opponents (25%). Opponent winning percentage and the winning percentage of opponents' opponents make up the strength of schedule portion of the formula.

### Poll Position

The Boilermakers dropped out of the AVCA Coaches' Poll Top 25 on Oct. 24, marking the first time since the preseason 2015 listing that Purdue had not been included. The team had been ranked in 24 straight polls (Aug. 31, 2015 through the Oct. 17 No. 24 listing). The Boilermakers are listed fifth among vote getters outside of the Top 25 this week (Nov. 7 poll).

The team's Sept. 19 ranking (No. 10) was the program's highest since being ranked No. 8 in the Sept. 8, 2014 poll. Purdue was ranked throughout the 2015 season, save the preseason listing, peaking at No. 14 and ending the year at No. 17.

## Top 10 Wins

The Boilermakers have posted 13 wins over Top 10 foes in the Dave Shondell era, including 10 since 2010. A five-set win over No. 9 Stanford on Sept. 9 and a four-set win over No. 4 Kansas on Sept. 16 marked the first Top 10 wins since Nov. 21, 2015, vs. No. 3 Minnesota. Purdue topped three Top 10 foes in 2010 (No. 1 Florida, No. 4 Penn State and No. 10 Illinois). The 1983 Boilermakers posted four Top 10 wins (No. 6 Kentucky, No. 7 Cal Poly, No. 8 Nebraska and No. 10 Texas).

## Adelaja Brings Balance

Redshirt senior middle blocker Faye Adelaja is one of just 12 players in Purdue lore with more than 700 kills and more than 350 blocks. The Baton Rouge, La., native has tallied 799 kills in her career and put up 379 blocks. Adelaja tallied six block assists Nov. 9, breaking into the career top 10 with 326, surpassing Tiffany Fisher (322, 2008-11). She is just 17 blocks away from the total blocks Top 10 (Brooke White, 10th, 396 from 1993-96).

Adelaja is the Boilermakers' most efficient hitter, hitting at a .380 clip in 2016. She has hit at a .300 or better clip in 15 of the 25 matches she has played and also has put up five or more blocks in 10 matches, including six of the last eight.

Adelaja is on pace to break Purdue's career hitting percentage record. She checks in with a .366 mark with at least four matches to play, just behind KiKi Jones' .367 mark from 2011-14. A model of versatility and reliability on the court, she has hit at a .250 or better clip in 76 of her 116 matches, including .300 or better 52 times, .400 or better in 50 and .500 or better 29 times. She has racked up double-digit kill tallies 28 times, leading the team on eight occasions. Adelaja has put up her share of stuffs as well, posting five or more blocks in 31 matches and leading the Boilermakers at the net 48 times.

## Evans Joins Elite Group

Redshirt junior setter Ashley Evans joined an elite group on Wednesday, Purdue setters with at least 2,000 career assists and 750 digs. To date, Evans has dished out 2,556 assists and pulled up 780 digs. In program history, only five other women have accomplished the feat: Renata Dargan (5871 assists, 921 digs); Rachel Davis (3294 assists, 874 digs); Darcy Orin (4523 assists, 853 digs); Jaclyn Hart (4918 assists, 818 digs); Kelly Niedbalski (3056 assists, 811 digs). Taryn Catlin posted 4584 assists and 717 digs, just missing inclusion.

## Evans Named Academic All-District

Redshirt junior setter Ashley Evans was one of six Division I players named to the CoSIDA Academic All-District V team. Fifty-one players from eight geographic districts across the United States and Canada were so honored from Division I institutions. District V covers Illinois, Indiana, Michigan and Ohio.

This is the second straight Academic All-District honor for Evans, who was a third team Academic All-America selection in 2015. The mechanical engineering major has dished out 10.81 assists per set, ranking 37th nationally and fifth in the Big Ten, while also adding 2.06 digs per set and a team-best 28 aces. She has helped the Boilermakers to a team hitting percentage of .250 or better in 15 matches this season, including .300 or better nine times and .500 or better once. She has posted eight double-doubles, combining assists and digs each time, and also one triple-double. All told, Evans has tallied 25 career double-doubles, while posting 37 double-digit dig efforts and three double-digit kill tallies.

Purdue volleyball has earned 33 Academic All-District honors since 1982, including 18 under Coach Shondell (since 2003). Evans is the seventh multi-time honoree and the most recent since Ariel Turner (2011 and 2012). Danita Merlau (2006, 2007, 2008) and Kristen Arthurs (2008, 2009, 2010) are the lone three-time selections in program lore.

Evans will be on the ballot for Academic All-America honors, which will be announced December 8.

Shondell boasts two protégés in the high school ranks: former player Anne (Mastandrea) Bremner, head coach at Glenbard North High School in Carol Stream, Illinois, and former volunteer assistant and manager Travis Fuller, head coach at Greenfield-Central High School in Greenfield, Indiana.

Current Purdue supervisor of operations Stephanie (Lynch) Harpeneau was a four-year letterwinner under Shondell. Several former players, managers and volunteer assistants are still involved in volleyball in the club and youth ranks.

## Efficient Offense

The Boilermakers hit at a .517 clip against Indiana on Sept. 24, marking the fifth-best hitting percentage in program lore and second best in the rally scoring era (behind a .529 mark vs. George Washington, 8/25/12). Purdue put down 37 kills, while committing just six errors in 60 attempts. Middle blockers Faye Adelaja (8-0-9, .889) and Blake Mohler (7-0-8, .875) led the way efficiency-wise, while outside hitter Danielle Cuttino put down a team-best nine kills. Six players tallied six or more kills in the match and all hit at a .286 or better clip.

## Triple Threat

Redshirt junior setter Ashley Evans became the most recent addition to the Triple Threat club, posting her first career triple double against No. 24 Kentucky on Aug. 27. Evans dished out 43 assists, while also tallying 10 kills of her own and 10 digs, marking the first triple double for a Boilermaker since Val Nichol recorded her fourth on Nov. 19, 2014. Evans is the 15th individual to record a triple double in program history and just the fourth setter to do so, joining Nichol (4), Jaclyn Hart and Renata Dargan.

## Cuttino Named Big Ten Player of the Week

Junior outside hitter Danielle Cuttino earns her first Big Ten Player of the Week honor after pacing the Boilermaker attack in a pair of wins over No. 9 Stanford and Cal Poly at the Stanford Invitational last weekend. The Indianapolis native put down a team-leading 4.33 kills per set, while hitting at a .333 clip and adding 0.89 blocks per set. In the upset win over Stanford, the junior posted 18 kills, a season-best three digs and four blocks. Against Cal Poly, she managed a match-high 21 kills on a .447 hitting percentage, while adding four blocks. Cuttino recorded her 500th career kill against Cal Poly (513) and her 250th career block (252). She has posted double-digit kill tallies in all eight matches this season. Cuttino also was named ESPNW Player of the Week for her efforts.

## Preseason Predictions

The Boilermakers were picked as FloVolleyball's No. 16 team in the website's preseason NCAA countdown. The site said "If it avoids injuries, look for Purdue to scramble with Ohio State and Penn State for a spot just behind Nebraska, Minnesota, and Wisconsin."

Purdue was picked to finish ninth in the Big Ten in both the league's preseason coaches' poll and PrepVolleyball.com's preseason conference rankings. Prepvolleyball also listed the Boilermakers at No. 29 on its Preseason Top 50 Countdown.

## Shondell's Successes

Under Dave Shondell's watch, the program has become part of an elite group nationally. Including the 2015 season, Purdue is one of 11 schools nationally to make 10 NCAA second round appearances in the last 12 seasons. In addition, the Boilermakers have made seven Sweet 16 berths in the last 12 seasons, making the program one of just 12 in the nation that can boast the accomplishment. Purdue also claims elite status as one of only 12 Division I teams to reach the NCAA Sweet 16 four of the last six years. The Boilermakers also have excelled in the classroom, garnering the NCAA Public Recognition Award for 11 straight seasons, making them one of just three volleyball squads and one of 110 teams across NCAA sports to be honored each year of the program's existence.

Under Shondell, Purdue has posted eight 20-win seasons, including 23 victories in 2015, the program's sixth-straight 20-win campaign, and defeated 48 ranked foes. In 2011, the Boilermakers finished second in the Big Ten, its best conference placing since 1987, and posted 29 wins, the most since 1985. Shondell has coached players to 15 All-American honors and four Academic All-America accolades. His charges also have earned 22 All-Big Ten and 84 Academic All-Big Ten accolades.

Aiding Shondell are associate head coach John Shondell and assistant coach Kathy Jewell. The trio are the longest tenured complete staff in the Big Ten Conference.

## 2015: A Look Back

The Boilermakers finished their season 23-10 and 13-7 in the Big Ten. The fifth-place finish marked the sixth straight and 11th spot among the conference top five in the last 12 seasons. Purdue was ranked in all 14 regular season polls, and received votes in the preseason poll, peaking at No. 14 on Nov. 23. The team advanced to the NCAA Second Round for the 10th straight time under Shondell in 10 NCAA appearances since 2004. Purdue reached the 20-win milestone for the sixth-straight season and ninth time in the last 11 years, while the 23 wins were tied for the most since 2011. The Boilermakers defeated three ranked foes and were ranked 27th nationally in hitting percentage, 37th in assists per set and 48th in kills per set.

Right side hitter Annie Drews was named among the top 28 players in the country as she earned AVCA Second Team All-America honors. Middle blockers Faye Adelaja and Danielle Cuttino garnered Honorable Mention All-America acclaim. The trio also garnered first team All-Northeast Region honors. The trio of All-America honorees marked the first for the Boilermakers in program history. Purdue previously had two honorees in a season five times (1983, 1984, 2011, 2013, 2014).

The Boilermakers carried on a tradition of 12 straight years with an All-Big Ten selection and six straight years with a first team selection as senior outside hitter Annie Drews and redshirt junior Faye Adelaja garnered all-conference honors. Drews was named as a unanimous All-Big Ten selection, while Adelaja received honorable mention honors. Purdue has had a first team selection each year since 2010 and has earned two All-Big Ten honors each year since 2011, including honorable mention selections.
