BIG TEN. BIG NEWS.

- The 2019 Big Ten Men's Ice Hockey Tournament opens Friday with three best-of-three quarterfinal series at campus sites. The tournament will continue to feature a three-weekend format with all games taking place on the campus of the higher-seeded teams.
- The tournament begins March 8-10 as No. 2 seed Notre Dame will host No. 7 seed Michigan State, No. 3 seed Minnesota will entertain No. 6 seed Michigan and No. 4 seed Penn State will host No. 5 seed Wisconsin. Notre Dame is the defending Big Ten Tournament Champion.
- As the top-seeded team, Big Ten Champion Ohio State will have a bye to the single-elimination semifinals, which are scheduled for the weekend of March 16-17. The field will be re-seeded following the quarterfinals, as the highest-seeded team advancing from the quarterfinals will host the second-highest advancing seed, while the lowest-seeded advancing team will play at Ohio State.
- The highest-seeded team remaining after the semifinals will host a championship game scheduled for the weekend of March 23-24.
- With 34 points in 24 conference games, Michigan State junior forward Taro Hirose earned the conference scoring title. Hirose paced all Big Ten players with 24 assists in conference play and added 10 goals. Hirose is the first Spartan to claim the Big Ten scoring title since the honor's inception in 2015.
- Over the last five years, Ohio State is the only school to have won at least one game in the Big Ten Tournament each season. The Buckeyes have won eight Big Ten Tournament games over the last five seasons, the most of any school.
- Eight of the top 21 scorers in the nation this season skate for Big Ten squads. Michigan State's Taro Hirose leads the country with 50 points and also paces all Division I skaters with 35 assists. Hirose is joined atop the national points list by Penn State's Alex Limonges (41 points; 5th), Minnesota's Rem Pitlick (41 points; 5th), Penn State's Evan Barratt (39 points; 11th), Minnesota's Tyler Sheehy (38 points; 14th), Michigan State's Patrick Khodorenko (37 points; 17th), Ohio State's Mason Jobst (36 points; 14th) and Penn State's Brandon Biro (36 points; 14th).
- For the second time in conference history, every Big Ten team has reached 12 overall victories on the season. Every Big Ten team has an overall winning percentage of at least .426 this season.
- Ohio State's Sasha Larocque and Penn State's Chase Berger were named finalists for the 2018-19 Senior CLASS Award. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School, the Senior CLASS Award honors the attributes of senior students in four areas: community, classroom, character and competition. To be eligible for the award, student-athletes must be classified as NCAA Division I seniors. The finalists were chosen by national media from the list of candidates announced in the fall.
- The finalists for the 2019 Hockey Humanitarian Award include a pair of Big Ten representatives in Ohio State's Tommy Parran and Wisconsin's Jake Bunz. Also among the finalists for the honor, presented annually to college hockey's "finest citizen" for leadership in community service, is Wisconsin women's hockey standout Annie Pankowski. The 24th recipient of the Hockey Humanitarian Award will be announced Friday, April 12th as part of the 2019 NCAA Men's Frozen Four in Buffalo, N.Y. Additionally, the Hockey Humanitarian Award Foundation will make a donation to the charity most important to each of the five finalists.

- Scored the overtime game-winning goal with less than 27 seconds left on Friday to give Wisconsin its first overtime win since Feb. 4, 2017, after scoring his team-leading seventh power-play tally in the game
- Added an assist on Saturday's game-tying goal with 1:07 left in regulation that sent the game to overtime in a 5-4 OT victory
- Earns his third career weekly award and first since Dec. 11, 2018 (First Star)

Since its inception in 1896, the pursuit and attainment of academic excellence has been a priority for every Big Ten member institution. But maintaining the conference's standard of competing at the highest level in athletics also endures as an important component of the Big Ten experience. Striking that balance between academics and athletics is integral to the Big Ten's identity. Recognized as one of intercollegiate sports' most successful undertakings, the Big Ten strives for success from its students not only on the field and in the classroom, but around the world as well.

PREMIER ACADEMIC INSTITUTIONS

The Big Ten Academic Alliance is an academic consortium of all 14 Big Ten universities, which is widely considered to be the model for effective and voluntary collaboration among top research universities.

Every Big Ten Academic Alliance institution ranks among the top 70 universities in the nation according to the 2017 Academic Ranking of World Universities, including four in the top 25.

The Big Ten leads all conferences with more than 1,700 Academic All-Americans, including 34 honorees during the 2017-18 academic year.

Big Ten Academic Alliance schools annually conduct \$10 billion in funded research, \$5 billion more than any other conference.

A HISTORY OF ATHLETIC SUCCESS

Big Ten schools have won at least seven national championships in seven of the last 10 academic years and at least three in each of the last 25 years.

In the last five full academic years, current Big Ten institutions have claimed 31 team national championships in 15 different sports.

Over the last 12 full academic years, current Big Ten institutions have won 85 team national titles in 23 different sports.

BROAD-BASED PROGRAMMING

The Big Ten will administer over \$200 million in direct financial support to more than 9,800 students competing in intercollegiate athletics for more than 11,000 participation opportunities on more than 350 teams in 42 different sports.

The Big Ten sponsors 28 official conference sports, 14 for men and 14 for women, including the addition of men's ice hockey and men's and women's lacrosse the last five years.

The Big Ten leads the nation in total students competing in intercollegiate athletics and participation opportunities, and sponsors more official sports than all conferences except the Ivy League.

Almost 1,400 Big Ten competitors have participated in the Olympics, winning more than 600 medals, including nearly 300 gold. In the 2016 and 2018 Olympic Games, more than 200 representatives from Big Ten institutions including current or former students and coaches were members of Olympic teams. Big Ten Olympians collected more than 50 medals in the most recent games in Rio and PyeongChang.

PASSIONATE FOLLOWING

The Big Ten leads all conferences with 5.7 million alumni and nearly 580,000 students.

Each year more than 11 million patrons attend Big Ten home contests, as the conference has led the nation in attendance for men's basketball, ice hockey, volleyball and wrestling.

LEADERS IN INNOVATION

Took part in the nation's first bowl game, winning the 1902 Rose Bowl Game, and signed an exclusive contract with the Tournament of Roses in 1946, making it the first bowl with permanent conference affiliations.

Awarded the first Big Ten Medal of Honor in 1915, honoring outstanding seniors who demonstrated excellence in academics and athletics.

Formed the Big Ten Advisory Commission in 1972, enlisting former students that competed in conference athletics to serve as liaisons to the NCAA's Diversity and Inclusion Department, the Big Ten Student-Athlete Advisory Commission and other organizations.

Became the first conference to voluntarily adopt male and female participation goals after launching its Gender Equity Action Plan in 1992.

Implemented the first collegiate football system of instant replay in 2004, which the NCAA approved for use among all conferences in 2006.

Launched the Big Ten Network (BTN) in 2007, the first national conference-owned television network.

Began partnering with the Ivy League to study the effects of head injuries in sports in 2012.

Accepted Johns Hopkins University as the conference's first sport affiliate members in men's and women's lacrosse in 2013 and 2015, respectively, and added Notre Dame as a sport affiliate member in men's ice hockey in 2017.

EXTENSIVE TELEVISION EXPOSURE

Through the Big Ten's current media agreements with BTN, ABC/ESPN, CBS and FOX, more than 1,600 Big Ten events are produced and distributed nationally and globally on an annual basis.

BTN is in almost 60 million homes across the United States and Canada. BTN2Go is BTN's digital extension, delivering live and on-demand programming to computers, smartphones and tablets. BTN Plus within BTN2Go streams hundreds of additional events each season.

COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

For more than 25 years, through the Big Ten's SCORE (Success Comes Out of Reading Everyday) program, the conference has partnered with Chicago elementary schools to improve reading performance.

Surrounding the Big Ten Football Championship Game and Basketball Tournaments, the conference has held numerous community initiatives, partnered with the College Football Playoff Foundation and other events such as the Big Ten Career Expo, SaturDAY of Service and Youth Football Clinics. In addition, the Big Ten has hosted a downtown 5K, collaborated with a local breast cancer awareness group and provided unique event experiences for military veterans.
