SETTING THE SCENE

- Penn State will resume Big Ten play on Sunday when it travels to East Lansing, Mich. for a noon showdown with Michigan State at the Spartans' DeMartin Soccer Complex.
- The match, which pits two teams seeking its first conference victory of the season, will be aired live on the Big Ten Network.

LAST TIME OUT

- Penn State busted out of a four-game winless stretch on Tuesday night, downing Penn, 2-0, at Jeffrey Field.
- Juniors Jacob Barron and Julian Cardona accounted for the Nittany Lion goals with John Gallagher registering assists on both scores.
- Freshman goalkeeper Andrew Wolverton made five saves, including four in the first half, to earn his Big Ten-leading eighth shutout of the season.

DEFENSIVELY DRIVEN

- Solid team defense continues to be the hallmark of the 2011 Nittany Lions.
- Penn State has allowed the fewest goals of any Big Ten team (6) and leads the conference in goals against average (0.52) and shutouts (8).
- The veteran back line, made up of seniors Mark Fetrow, Justin Lee, Matt Smallwood, and junior Brian Fogue, who have combined to start 210 career games, has played strong defense in front of freshman goalkeeper Andrew Wolverton.

MICHIGAN STATE PREVIEW

- Michigan State is also coming off a Tuesday evening win, as the Spartans knocked off UW-Milwaukee, 2-1, in East Lansing.
- After a slow start, Michigan State is 2-1-1 over its last four games and has scored at least one goal in every game.
- Freshman Adam Montague has emerged as the Spartans top scorer to this point of the season, totaling eight points on three goals and two assists.
- Mark Barone (1 goal, 4 assists), Rubin Bega (2 goals, 1 assist), and Cyrus Saydee (1 goal, 3

assists) have been consistent offensive contributors.

- Junior Kevin Cope, a Second Team All-Big Ten selection in 2010, and redshirt senior goalkeeper Jeremy Clark anchor a MSU defense that has allowed 13 goals in 11 games.
- Clark owns a 1.11 goals against average and has posted one shutout in his first season as a starter.

PENN STATE-MICHIGAN STATE SERIES

- Penn State possesses an 18-8-2 series record against Michigan State, including a 7-3-2 mark in East Lansing.
- In their last road trip to face the Spartans, in 2009, the Nittany Lions pulled out a 1-0 victory, in a game that was also televised on the Big Ten Network.
- In 2010, Penn State got goals from Corey Hertzog and Matheus Braga to claim a 2-1 come-from-behind win over MSU in Happy Valley.
- In 12 all-time appearances on the Big Ten Network, Penn State has posted a 6-6 record.

NEXT UP FOR THE NITTANY LIONS

- Next week, Penn State's schedule features a non-conference road contest and a Big Ten home match.
- On Wednesday, Oct. 12, the Nittany Lions will travel to Akron, Ohio to face the No. 3-ranked Zips (7-1-2) in a 7 p.m. game at Lee Jackson Field.
- Four days later, on Sunday, Oct. 16, Penn State will welcome Northwestern (4-4-3, 0-0-1) to Jeffrey Field for a 2 p.m. clash, which will be broadcast live on the Big Ten Network.

KEY STATS

- Penn State has totaled 41 points (13 goals, 15 assists) while allowing opponents just a total of 17 points (6 goals, 5 assists).
- In 1,030:00 total minutes of play this season, Penn State has trailed for just 35:00 (3%).

WOLVERTON ANCHORS DEFENSE

- Through the first 11 games of his collegiate career, freshman goalkeeper Andrew Wolverton has registered eight shutouts.
- Wolverton is just two shutouts shy of tying the Penn State single season record of 10 held by Angelo Nickas (1980), Whit Gibson (1998), and Conrad Taylor (2005).
- Ranks first in the Big Ten in goals against average (0.52), shutouts (8), and shutouts per game (0.73).
- Ranks No. 12 in the NCAA in goals against average.

STRONG AT HOME

- Penn State finished out its non-conference home schedule unbeaten, posting a 5-0-1 record.
- The Nittany Lions didn't allow a goal to a non-conference opponent at Jeffrey Field in 2011, outscoring foes, 9-0.
- Penn State's loss to Michigan is its lone blemish at home this season and the two goals that the Wolverines tallies represent the lone scores surrendered by PSU.
- Penn State has Big Ten home games versus Northwestern (10/16) and Wisconsin (11/5) remaining on its schedule.
- Penn State was 8-5-0 at home in 2010, outscoring opponents, 28-24.

STRONG IN THE FIRST HALF

- Through the season's first 11 games, Penn State has yet to allow a first half goal, outscoring opponents, 3-0.
- Penn State also holds a sizeable first half advantage in shots (68-49) and corner kicks (38-22).
- Opponents have committed 19 more first half fouls than Penn State (63-44).

PENN STATE IN THE STAT RANKINGS

- Penn State ranks No. 1 in the Big Ten in goals allowed (6), goals against average (0.52), shutouts (8), and corner kicks (71).
- Penn State ranks No. 4 in the NCAA in shutout percentage (0.70) and No. 11 in team goals against average (0.57).

WARMING REACHES MILESTONE

- With Penn State's 1-0 win over Florida International on September, head coach Bob Warming secured his 400th career win.
- Became just the 31st coach in NCAA men's soccer history to reach the 400-win milestone.
- Ranks sixth among active Division I head coaches and 15th all-time in career wins.

CAREER OVERVIEW:

- 34-year coaching veteran
- Six-time finalist for NCAA Division I National Coach of the Year
- Led two teams to the College Cup (Saint Louis, 1997; Creighton, 2002)
- Led his teams to 29 winning seasons.
- Only Division I coach to have at least one player drafted into the MLS every year since the

league's inception.

- Inducted into the Creighton University Athletics Hall of Fame in May 2011.

2011 AWARDS AND RECOGNITION

- Minh Vu was named Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week on August 29 for scoring his first Division I goal in his first game as a Nittany Lion in a 1-0 win over Siena.
- Andrew Wolverton was honored as Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week on September 12 following a 3-0 shutout of Saint Peter's.
- Jordan Tyler was named to the TopDrawerSoccer.com National Team of the Week on September 12 for scoring two goals in 3-0 win over Saint Peter's.
- Andrew Wolverton was selected to the TopDrawerSoccer.com National Team of the Week on September 19 for recording shutouts versus Saint Francis (Pa.) and Hartford.

ROSTER MAKEOVER

- Penn State lost 71% of its goals, 57% of its assists, and 66% of its points from last year's squad, including the NCAA scoring champion in Corey Hertzog (20 goals, 6 assists) and the nation's leader in assists in Matheus Braga (17).
- In all, 12 letterwinners and six starters are gone from the 2010 team that went 14-8-1, played for a Big Ten title, and advanced to the third round of the NCAA Championship.
- Replacing those losses on the 2011 roster are 12 newcomers, including five transfers and seven freshmen.
- Jacob Barron (UC Davis), Julian Cardona (Butler), and Hasani Sinclair (South Florida) transferred from Division I programs while Mihn Vu (Pima Community College) and Marvin Ledgister (North Iowa Area Community College) came to Penn State from junior colleges.
- Through 11 games, transfers have combined for 42 starts and accounted for 22 of Penn State's 41 points.
- Andrew Wolverton (11) and Owen Griffith (2) are the only freshmen to earn starts in 2011.

2011 CAPTAINS

- Senior defender Matt Smallwood was named the team captain prior to the start of the 2011 season.
- Smallwood exclusively served in that role until the week leading up to Penn State's match-up with Michigan State when head coach Bob Warming appointed fellow seniors Mackenzie Arment, Mark Fetrow, and Justin Lee as co-captains.
- The four co-captains have combined to start 225 games at Penn State.

COST JOINS WARMING'S STAFF

- In late September, Penn State head coach Bob Warming added former Nittany Lion Drew Cost (2007-10) to his coaching staff as a volunteer assistant.
- Cost was a team co-captain in 2010 and was a

two-time All-Big Ten midfielder.

- Starting 70 career games, he finished with 30 points (10 goals, 10 assists)
- Selected by Real Salt Lake in the 2010 MLS Supplemental Draft with the No. 14 pick (32nd overall) in the second round.
- After spending training camp with the defending Real Salt Lake, he signed with the Rochester Rhinos of USL PRO.
- Appearing in 19 games, Cost scored two goals in his first professional season.

WARMING'S STAFF HAS NEW FACES IN 2011

- 2010 assistants Jason Mims (Nebraska Omaha) and Isang Jacob (IUPUI) landed Division I head coaching jobs in the offseason.
- On May 11, Warming added Bo Oshoniyi, former assistant at Wake Forest and South Florida, to his staff.
- A two-time All-American goalkeeper at Central Connecticut State, Oshoniyi won two Division II national championships.
- Drafted into the MLS by Columbus, he played 12 years as a professional, capturing a title with Kansas City in 2000.
- On June 27, Warming added Chad Duernberger, former head coach at Division II University of Charleston, to his bench.
- One of the youngest head coaches in the nation when he was hired by his alma mater in 2008, the 24-year-old Duernberger engineered an impressive and rapid turnaround after inheriting a Charleston program that went 0-17-0 the year prior.
- 2009 team went 19-4-0, advancing to the NCAA quarterfinals and earning a final No. 7 ranking.
- Named 2009 NSCAA Division II Coach of the Year.
- Was a four-year starter for Charleston (2002-06), earning First Team All-WVIAC honors three times and all-region recognition in 2002.

BIG TEN PRESEASON POLL

- Penn State was selected to place third in the Big Ten this season by a vote of the conferences head coaches in the annual preseason poll.
- The Nittany Lions finished tied for fourth in 2010, posting a 2-3-1 conference record but advanced to the Big Ten Tournament championship game for the second consecutive season.
- Indiana was chosen as the favorite to win the Big Ten, marking the eighth time in nine seasons that Indiana was tabbed to take the title.
- Penn State's Matt Smallwood, Mackenzie Arment, and Jordan Tyler were recognized as "Players to Watch" in 2011.

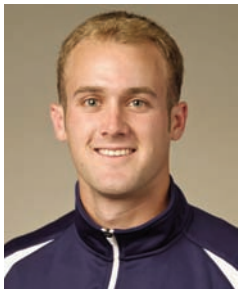
