Penn State and Maryland have met for a total of 14 times previously dating back to the 1999 season, with the Nittany Lions owning a 9-5 overall record over the Terps. The teams met earlier this season, with the Terrapins winning three close games. Macy Jones and Alyssa VanDerveer each hit home runs in that series, including VanDerveer's grand slam in the second game. Jones and Lexi Knief each had two doubles.

SCOUTING THE TERRAPINS

Maryland enters the Big Ten Tournament with a 27-26 overall record, including 9-14 in the Big Ten. The Terrapins went 1-2 last weekend against Michigan State, winning the second game 6-5, but dropping the first and third games by 4-3 and 7-4 decisions, respectively. Maryland has lost seven of their last eight games.

Senior Outfielder Erin Pronobis leads the squad with a .370 average as one of five players with a .300 or better average. She has 57 hits, 12 home runs and 44 RBI, while playing in all 53 games. Junior Lindsey Schmeiser is batting .364 with a team-leading 60 hits, including 20 doubles and 11 homers, while driving in 42 runs. Sophomore Hannah Dewey has a .358 average, while junior Corey Schwartz is batting .320 and senior Shannon Bustillos is hitting .300. Schwartz has 14 homers, while Bustillos has 11.

Senior right hander Kaitlyn Schmeiser leads the Terrapins in the circle. Schmeiser is 19-11 with a 3.37 ERA in 47 appearances, including 28 starts and nine complete games. She has struck out 170 batters and walked 36 in 201.2 innings. Schmeiser also has five saves. Dewey, a lefty, is 6-11 with a 5.88 ERA in 36 appearances, including 18 starts and a complete game. She has 57 strikeouts and 78 walks in 100 innings.

QUICK HITS

- The Nittany Lions are the ninth seed in the Big Ten Tournament, taking on the eighth seeded Terrapins. The winner will advance to Friday's quarterfinal matchup against top-seed Michigan.
- With 28 wins this season, the Nittany Lions are two away from the 12th 30-win season in program history.
- The Nittany Lions have hit 40 in a season for the first time since 2013. They have sent 45 over the fence. Shots by Macy Jones and Alyssa VanDerveer on April 22 against St. Francis(Pa.) put Penn State over the 40 mark.
- VanDerveer leads the team with 13 homers while Kristina Brackpool and Jones have 10. This
 is the first time in program history that Penn State has had three players hit 10 or more home
 runs in the same season.

FACES IN THE CROWD

Reina Furuya and Shelby Miller were featured in Sports Illustrated's "Faces In the Crowd" section of their May 4, 2015 issue for their grand slams in the top of the fourth inning in Penn State's 15-5 win against Wisconsin on April 4. Miller hit the first slam with no one out and then Furuya, who led off the inning with a double, came to the plate with just one out and already five in, in the inning and slammed another bases loaded homer to achieve the historic feat. Penn State became just the sixth team in recorded Division I NCAA softball history to hit a pair of grand slams in one inning.

ALL-BIG TEN HONORS

Junior outfielders Lexi Knief and Macy Jones were selected as Second Team All-Big Ten on Wednesday by the conference's coaches. Knief earned her second straight All-Big Ten selection after leading the team in batting average (.408), hits(71), doubles(14), triples(4), and on-base percentage (.469). Jones is hitting .348, including .373 in Big Ten play, with 56 hits, including nine doubles, two triples and 10 homers with 43 RBI. Sophomore third baseman Shelby Miller was named to the All-Defensive Team.

MILESTONE WATCH

Multiple Nittany Lions are chasing singleseason records entering the final week of the regular season. Alyssa VanDerveer is currently third on the all-time single season home runs list at Penn State with 13. She is three behind Jennifer Tripken(2002) for second place and seven behind Cassidy Bell(2013) for first. With 10 dingers each, Kristina Brackpool and Macy Jones are tied for fifth with Jen Acunto(2005). Brackpool, with 44 RBI, is also five away from the single season mark at Penn State, which is shared by Tripken and Nan Sichler (1988). Lexi Knief is three hits away from the single season record, held by Sichler(74), and four doubles away from the record held by Acunto and Danielle Kinley(2007). Knief is currently batting 408, which would put her fourth alltime in single season average.

BUILDING THE PROGRAM

With 28 wins this year, the Nittany Lions have their most since 2011. Penn State's nine conference wins are also their most since 2012 and the ninth seed in the Big Ten Tournament is their highest since 2007.

HOME SWEET HOME

With their win over Rutgers on Sunday, Penn State picked up its 11th home victory of the season. That is the most Nittany Lion home wins since Beard Field opened in 2011. The Nittany Lions have their most home wins in a season since earning 12 in 1999.

GRAND PRESENCE

The Nittany Lions have hit an impressive seven grand slams during the 2015 season. Two came in the doubleheader sweep of Bucknell (Apr. 1) and another pair followed in the same game and the same inning no less, the top of the fourth in the series finale vs. Wisconsin (Apr. 4). Kristina Brackpool hit her second grand slam of the season in a midweek doubleheader with Ohio State (Apr. 15). Alyssa VanDerveer hit her third slam, a

first inning blast, against Maryland (Apr. 18). Below is a look at the official tally, when they were hit and who against.

BTN SEASON DEBUT

The Nittany Lions will made their debut on the Big Ten Network during the series finale vs. Maryland on Sunday, April 19. It marked the first time since the 2013 regular season finale vs. Illinois that the Blue & White were on the national network.

MVP - MOST VERSATILE PLAYER

One could argue that Macy Jones is her team's most valuable player but there is no doubt that she is in fact Penn State's most versatile as she has starred in the field, circle and batter's box this season. Jones is the only member of the Blue & White pitching corps who yields the aluminum and she has done so quite successfully, ranking second on the team in on base percentage (.451) and second in slugging percentage (.615). Her 43 RBI is second on the squad to Kristina Brackpool(44) and her 10 home runs are tied for second to Alyssa VanDerveer(13). She also leads the pitching staff with a 3.66 ERA and has a team-low 21 walks in 20 appearances.

CUTS LIKE A KNIEF

Junior Lexi Knief's ability to cut through opposing pitching this year has been remarkable. She leads the team in batting average (.408), hits(71), doubles (14) and triples(4). The centerfielder is slugging an impressive .534 on the season, fourth most among her teammates, and leads the team with a .469 on-base percentage.

PUT ME IN COACH

Macy Jones is the only Nittany Lion to have started and played in all 55 games this season. She has split time in between the circle and the outfield and has even seen a little time at first base, making four starts and 16 relief appearances in the circle and 51 starts in the field. Freshmen Mollie Sorenson and Alyssa VanDerveer are the next closest iron women, as Sorenson has played in 54 of 55 total contests in 2015, with 52 starts. VanDerveer has started and played in 53 contests as either the backstop or designated player with the exception of one game at first base.

A HALF CENTURY OF TRADITION

Penn State softball is celebrating its 50th anniversary in 2015, making it the oldest program among the schools in the power five conferences (ACC, B1G, Big 12, Pac-12, SEC). The Lions started up in 1965 under head coach Pat McTarsney and went 2-2 in their first season with wins against Elizabethtown and Wilson colleges. PSU defeated both in-state schools by a combined 46-4 score. The second oldest program among the power five is Arizona State, which began play just two years later in 1967.

AMANDA LEHOTAK

Head Coach • Second Season NEBRASKA-OMAHA '03

RECORD AT PENN STATE: 37-55 (.402) CAREER RECORD: 225-261 (.463)

Amanda Lehotak is in her second season as the Penn State softball head coach in 2015.

In her inaugural season at the helm of the program in 2014, Lehotak led the Nittany Lions to a 14-35 overall record with a 5-18 Big Ten record, finishing a spot higher in the conference standings than the year prior. Four players batted over .300 with Lexi Knief earning All-Big Ten second team accolades. Lehotak's team also achieved success in the classroom; nine players were named to the Academic All-Big Ten team and Alicia Walker garnered Big Ten Distinguished Scholar Award honors.

Named the seventh coach in program history on July 22, 2013, Lehotak came to Penn State with seven years of head coaching experience under her belt, including the previous two seasons at Texas-San Antonio.

Lehotak guided the Roadrunners to a 27-26 overall record in 2013 to give the program just their second winning overall record in the last seven years. She also led the team to a fifth-place finish and a berth in the WAC Tournament in UTSA's first season in the conference. Additionally, Darian Blake was named to the All-WAC first team.

In her first season at UTSA, Lehotak and the Roadrunners posted a 24-28 overall record and 12-8 mark in Southland Conference play en route to a third-place finish, which was the program's highest finish since 2009. She had five players earn All-Southland honors in 2012, including Freshman of the Year Megan Low.

Prior to her time at UTSA, Lehotak spent six seasons at Jacksonville University, including five as the head coach. The Dolphins improved their win total each of Lehotak's five seasons at the helm, culminating in a 44-16 overall record and 18-2 conference mark in 2011.

That season, Jacksonville won the Atlantic Sun regular-season and tournament titles on its way to the first NCAA Tournament appearance in school history. Lehotak was selected as the 2011 Atlantic Sun Coach of the Year as her squad set school records for home runs, earned run average, shutouts and fielding percentage. Lehotak left Jacksonville with a school-record 137 wins.

In 2010, Lehotak led the Dolphins to a then-second-best win total in program history with a 33-23 overall record. Additionally, a then-program-record five student-athletes earned All-Atlantic Sun recognition under her guidance in 2010.

A native of Omaha, Neb., Lehotak played collegiately at the University of Mississippi for two seasons (2000-01) before finishing her career at Nebraska-Omaha (2002-03). She set the single-season hits record in 2001 at Ole Miss and was a third team All-American at UNO with a pair of first team All-North Central Conference selections. Lehotak earned her bachelor's degree in family science from Nebraska-Omaha in 2003.

Megan Gibson is in her second season as an assistant coach for the Nittany Lions in 2015. She serves primarily as the pitching coach.

Under her leadership in 2014, Lion hurlers amassed 14 wins to go along with 177 strikeouts, 22 complete games and a pair of shutouts. The Penn State pitching staff also accumulated four saves on the season which was tied for fourth most in the Big Ten.

BEFORE PENN STATE

An All-American at Texas A&M, Gibson joined the Penn State coaching staff after spending two seasons as an assistant under head coach Amanda Lehotak at University of Texas-San Antonio (UTSA). Under Gibson's guidance in 2013, UTSA garnered a formidable 2.76 earned run average while holding opponents to a .254 batting average.

Prior to UTSA, Gibson spent four seasons in the National Professional Fastpitch League (NPF). After leading Texas A&M to a runner-up finish at the 2008 Women's College World Series (WCWS), she was selected by the Philadelphia Force with the No. 2 overall pick of the 2008 NPF Senior Draft. In addition to her time in the league, Gibson spent a season in the Japanese Softball Association.

Along with her career in the NPF, Gibson served under Texas A&M head coach Jo Evans as a graduate assistant in fall 2008 and again as a volunteer pitching coach during the 2011 season. She also spent time as a softball instructor at High Performance Baseball in Tomball and as a volunteer assistant coach at Spring High School in 2010.

Gibson's collegiate career was one of the most decorated in Texas A&M history. Her stellar play in both the pitcher's circle and batter's box earned her National Fastpitch Coaches Association All-America honors as a freshman, junior and senior, and she finished as a runner-up the for association's Player of the Year award in 2008. Gibson is the only player in Big 12 Conference history to be named both Player and Pitcher of the Year as a senior and she went on to lead the Aggies to the conference tournament title as the event's Most Valuable Player. She also led Texas A&M to a league crown in 2005 and a WCWS appearance in 2007. In all, Gibson owns six career school records, including doubles (48), home runs (56), RBIs (183), total bases (447), slugging percentage (.717) and walks (172). She also ranks in the program's top 10 in seven other categories. In October of 2014, Gibson was inducted into Texas A&M's Athletic Hall of Fame.

Gibson, a native of Spring, Texas, graduated from Texas A&M in 2008 with a bachelor's degree in sports management and a minor in business.



Joe Guthrie is in his second season as an assistant coach for Penn State's softball program in 2015. His primary responsibilities are hitting and the outfield, in addition to serving as the program's recruiting coordinator.

Under his direction in 2014, the Lions belted a total of 13 home runs and amassed 304 total hits. A busy off-season for Guthrie culminated in the fall of 2014 with Penn State claiming the 17th best recruiting class in the nation as ranked by Full Count Softball.

BEFORE PENN STATE

Guthrie joined the Penn State coaching staff after a six-year stint as head softball coach and assistant athletic director at the Marion Military Institute in Alabama. He led Marion to the National Junior Collegiate Athletic Association (NJCAA) Region 22 Tournament three of his last four seasons, in addition to coaching 21 all-conference players.

Guthrie played baseball at Kentucky before transferring to Bevill State. He graduated with an American studies degree from Alabama in 2001. After earning his Master's degree at Jacksonville State University as a Distinguished Military Graduate, he was a member of the U.S. Army from 2002-05. Guthrie earned numerous accolades in the military, and served a one-year combat tour in Iraq.



Four-year Nittany Lion (2011-14) and 2012 second team All-Big Ten honoree Kasie Hatfield joins the Penn State softball team as a volunteer assistant coach in 2015.

The Tampa, Fla., native brings 190 games of experience in the Blue and White to the coaching staff as well as a .245 career batting average with the Lions. Hatfield capped off her career with .309 batting average and a .493 slugging percentage her senior year to go along with 42 hits, 27 RBI and a pair of home runs for 67 total bases.

Hatfield graduated from Penn State with a degree in animal sciences.




