### ABOUT PENN STATE

The Nittany Lions enter the weekend with a 5-1-0 record through six games, playing each one of those at Pegula Ice Arena in State College, Pa.

PSU opened with a sweep over Long Island before a split with Canisius and a sweep over shared opponent Niagara last weekend.

Offense has been the source for Penn State this season, averaging 4.0 per game so far and averaging over 40 shots on goal per contest. Junior **Kevin Wall** has been the offensive threat with six goals and seven points. That goal total is fourth in the nation and second in the Big Ten.

In the pipes, **Osler Autio** has played four of the contests and posted a 3-1-0 mark with a 1.50 GAA and .938 save percentage. Fellow netminder **Liam Souliere** is 2-0-0 with a 2.00 GAA and .945 save percentage. Souliere got the win in the most recent contest vs. Niagara.

As a team, Penn State is only allowing 1.8 goals per game and has only surrendered more than two goals in a contest once, the 4-1 loss to Canisius (Oct. 8).

### LAST WEEKEND

It was a tale of two games last weekend for North Dakota, splitting against then-No. 7 Quinnipiac in a top-10 showdown from Hamden, Conn.

On Friday, QU scored a pair of power play goals and struck four times over the final 40 minutes to capture a 5-2 win in the opener.

North Dakota bounced back on Saturday, with **Mark Senden**, **Judd Caulfield** and **Connor Ford** each finding the back of the net in a 3-1 win.

**Zach Driscoll** stopped 35 of the 36 shots sent his way, including 12 in the final period, to help UND improve to 5-1 all-time against the Bobcats.

The penalty kill also played a large role on Saturday, holding QU to 0-for-5 on the man advantage, including a 5-on-3.

### GOING THE DISTANCE

Destination games have become a bit of a norm for North Dakota since the first one in 2012, but so have wins in these contests.

UND is 4-0 in destination games, picking up wins over Clarkson, Omaha, Boston College and Minnesota.

### MISS NEW BUDY

Forward **Brendan Budy** returned to the lineup in Saturday's win over Quinnipiac after missing the first five games of the season due to an injury.

The forward tallied nine points (4g, 5a) last season in 28 games for UND as a sophomore.

### POWER SURGE

Quinnipiac entered the weekend having not allowed a power play goal all season, but UND quickly put an end to that with a 2-for-6 weekend with the man advantage.

No goal was bigger on the power play than **Judd Caulfield's** eventual game-winner in the second period to put UND in front, 2-1, in the 3-1 victory.

### BACK 2 BLACK

UND broke out its black jerseys on Saturday night for the first time all season, posting a 3-1 win over Quinnipiac to halt a two-game slide.

North Dakota is 11-2-1 in the business suits since 2019-20.

### MATTEOOOOOOO!

Freshman forward **Matteo Costantini** scored his first-collegiate goal in the 5-2 loss to Quinnipiac.

The forward stripped the defender of the puck, carried down the wall and fired it through the legs of the goaltender for the first goal of the weekend.

### LEADING BY EXAMPLE

Senior captain **Mark Senden** opened the scoring for UND in the weekend finale at Quinnipiac, something that is a good sign for the green and white.

North Dakota is now 14-2-0 when Senden scores a goal and has won its last six.

### JUST JUDD-Y

**Judd Caulfield** has scored a pair of goals this season and both have come at crucial times.

The junior sniped his first of the year late in the third period to put UND up 4-2 over the Beavers in an eventual 4-3 win. Caulfield also added an assist on UND's opening goal.

Caulfield added his second, another game winner, in the 3-1 win over Quinnipiac with a power play strike in the second period to put the Hawks in front, 2-1.

### THE LONG NON-CON

Oct. 16 ended a long streak of home wins against non-conference opponents for UND, with Bemidji State becoming the first since Minnesota State on Oct. 19, 2018 to defeat the Hawks at the Ralph.

North Dakota had won 17 straight games

### PSU COACHING STAFF

**Guy Gadowsky** is in his 10th season as Penn State head coach and is 333-331-60 during his tenure.

Gadowsky's staff includes associate head coach **Keith Fisher**, assistant coach **Juliano Pagliero** and volunteer assistant coach **Matt Morrow**.

### SERIES HISTORY

This will be the first all-time meeting between North Dakota and Penn State.

UND has battled a Guy Gadowsky-coached team before, however, taking on Princeton in the 2008 NCAA Tournament.

The Fighting Sioux took care of the Tigers, 5-1, led by a hat trick from Ryan Duncan.

**LOUIS, LOUIS!**

Sophomore forward **Louis Jamernik** picked up the first multi-point game of his career with a goal and assist in the win at Bemidji State.

Jamernik tied the game at 1-1 with his second-career goal before assisting on the second UND strike just moments later.

The sophomore made it a three-point weekend with an assist on UND's second goal in Saturday's contest.

**KUNZ, THERE IT IS**

Freshman forward **Jackson Kunz** scored his first-collegiate goal in the win over Bemidji State on Friday.

Kunz fired one past the goalie following a won draw by fellow-freshman **Matteo Costantini** to put UND up 3-1 in the 4-3 win.

**HAIN TRAIN**

After missing the first two games due to injury, **Gavin Hain** returned in the win over Bemidji State and made his impact felt.

The senior scored in the second period to put UND up 2-1 while also playing key minutes on the penalty kill.

**DOMINATING THE ATLANTIC**

You can notch another pair of wins for UND against Atlantic Hockey foes, with North Dakota moving to 31-2-0 in its history against teams from that conference.

The green and white are also 24-0-0 in Grand Forks in those games.

**OPENING STRONG**

Since 1995, UND has opened the regular season with a two-game home series eight times and is 15-0-1 in those games.

The only non-win came in a tie against Vermont in 2013.

**FAMILY AFFAIR**

Freshman **Jake Schmaltz** joined a family tradition on Friday, scoring in his collegiate debut.

The McFarland, Wis., native joined his cousins, Nick and Jordan, in all scoring in their first games.

Jordan found the net in the season opener against Alaska Anchorage in 2012 while Nick potted the lone strike against Bemidji State in 2014.

Schmaltz made it a weekend to remember for the freshman, potting a pair of goals in the 4-0 win on Saturday to finish the weekend with four points.

He became the first player to score in back-to-back games to begin his career since **Drew Stafford** in 2003-04.

Schmaltz was named the NCHC's Co-Rookie of the Week for his weekend.

**ASHTON TO ACTION**

Transfer **Ashton Calder** had quite the debut in his first game since transferring to UND from Lake Superior State, scoring a pair of goals and adding an assist in the win on Oct. 8.

He becomes the first player since **Darcy Zajac** on Oct. 6, 2006 to score twice in their UND debut. Zajac did it in a 6-1 win over Quinnipiac.

Calder continued his success against Bemidji State in his career, scoring 13 points (6g, 7a) in 18 career games, with a two-goal night in Saturday's meeting.

The junior leads the team with four goals and is tied for the lead with seven points.

**SECOND HELPINGS**

The newly-promoted top line of **Riese Gaber**, **Jake Schmaltz** and **Judd Caulfield** have been a scoring machine so far for UND.

The group has combined for 17 points (7g, 10a) this season, with three of those goals coming as game winners.

The line also carries a +9 rating and makes up three of the top-6 scorers to start the year.

**NOTHING DRIVES LIKE A FORD**

Transfer center **Connor Ford** exploded in the faceoff dot in the win over Niagara (Oct. 9), finishing with 20 wins on 26 attempts.

The graduate forward completed his night with a pair of assists to notch his first-two points in a UND jersey.

He came up clutch in the dot against Bemidji State on Saturday, winning 18 of 26 draws and adding a pair of assists.

His best game came in the Saturday night win over Quinnipiac, picking up the primary assist on UND's second goal before icing the game with his first tally of the season in the third period.

The grad student also won 17 of the 26 draws he took in the win.

Ford is second in the nation with 88 faceoff wins and carries a 60.3 winning percentage.

**DOUBLIN' UP**

The Hawks also won their first NCHC Frozen Faceoff and became the first school to win both in one season.

**STARTING FROM SCRATCH**

North Dakota is in a bit of an unfamiliar place entering 2021-22, after seeing eight players sign NHL contracts after the season.

It will be a different look, as 14 newcomers are slated to don the green and white for the first time. Five transfers join the fold while nine freshman start their collegiate careers.

The 14 newcomers are the most on a roster for UND since the 1973 Fighting Sioux had 15 new faces.

**OFFENSE REPLACES OFFENSE**

North Dakota was a scoring machine in 2020-21, leading the nation with 3.93 goals per game. Despite seven of their eight top scorers from last season turning pro, the Hawks are set to bring in more offense.

UND got off to a hot start in the offensive category, scoring 22 goals in six games.

North Dakota also leads in the nation in shooting percentage at 14.6%.

**LEADERS OF THE PACK**

Senior forward **Mark Senden** was voted team captain for the 2021-22 season.

Senden has been a leader at every level, captaining the Fargo Force to a USHL Clark Cup title as well as Wayzata to a Minnesota Class 2A state championship as a prep.

The Medina, Minn., native matched his career-high for offensive output last season, striking for 14 points on three goals and 11 helpers. The Fighting Hawks were 10-0-0 last season when he found the scoresheet and 25-3 over his career when he tallies at least a point.

Senior forward **Gavin Hain**, junior defenseman **Ethan Frisch** and sophomore defenseman **Jake Sanderson** were all named assistant captains.

**FEELING DRIZZY**

Transfer **Zach Driscoll** comes to UND after a stellar, three-year career with Bemidji State. There, he earned back-to-back All-WCHA selections over his final two years, finishing with a 21-8-4 record in 2019-20 with a 1.63 GAA and .937 save percentage to rank inside the top-10 in the nation for GAA, save percentage, wins and shutouts.

Last season, Driscoll led the nation in shots faced (832) and saves made (767) to help the Beavers reach the NCAA Tournament.

He opened his UND career with a pair of 18-save wins over Niagara, including a shutout to seal the sweep.

Driscoll becomes the first goalie in NCAA history to record a shutout with three-different teams in his career.

**OFFENSE FROM THE DEFENSE**

North Dakota boasted the second-highest-scoring blueline in the country a year ago, although it must fill the void created by its top-two scorers Matt Kiersted and Jacob Bernard-Docker turning pro.

UND returns its next five defensive scorers, including sophomores **Tyler Kleven**, who was third in the NCHC among defenseman with

### Nickname History

The University of North Dakota boasts a proud history of varsity athletics nicknames. UND's first official athletics nickname was the "Flickertails," although its origin remains somewhat a mystery. The nickname made its first public appearance in a Grand Forks Herald account of UND's football loss to Minnesota on Oct. 8, 1904, 15 years after UND's first athletics contest was played. According to Lee Bohnet's A Century of UND Sports, "The author was not identified, but there is strong evidence the nickname was coined by a Minneapolis sportswriter who may have covered the game for the Herald. The writer lauded the fighting spirit of the North Dakota players."

In 1911, UND's student body officially adopted "Flickertails" as its athletics nickname. UND would remain known as the "Flickertails" (as well, unofficially, as the "Nodaks") for a third of a century, establishing an early athletics history.

In the fall of 1930, the university adopted the nickname "Sioux" for its varsity teams following a successful renaming campaign by the Dakota Student, UND's student newspaper. The word "Fighting" was later added, and UND would be known as the "Fighting Sioux" until the summer of 2012.

The university utilized several "Fighting Sioux" logos throughout the decades, perhaps most notably the green geometric logo introduced in 1976 and the most recent full-color logo was unveiled in 1999. The former was designed by an artist at the UND News Bureau, while the latter was created by noted Native American artist and UND alum Bennett Brien.

The University of North Dakota officially retired its longtime "Fighting Sioux" nickname and logo prior to the 2012-13 athletics season.

UND's varsity athletics teams operated without an official nickname, while the university continued the process of adopting the third official nickname in school history last fall. During that time, the university's varsity athletics teams will continue to be referred to as "the University of North Dakota," "North Dakota," or "UND."

Former President Dr. Robert Kelley announced in mid-November 2015 that "Fighting Hawks" would be the University's new moniker. UND would win its eighth NCAA national title in that season with the Fighting Hawk logo making its first appearance in the following campaign.



five goals, and **Jake Sanderson**, who was sixth in the conference with 15 points.

The Hawks also return defensemen **Cooper Moore** and **Ethan Frisch** while gaining transfers **Brady Ferner** and **Chris Jandric**.

UND also welcomes in freshmen **Brent Johnson** and **Luke Bast**.

Its taking no time for the new defensive core to get in on the offense, with the backend striking for 16 points through the first six games.

### FOUR SCORE

The 4-goal mark proved once again to be the magic number for North Dakota in 2020-21.

The Fighting Hawks went 16-1-0 when scoring at least four goals, but won just six times in the 12 games (6-5-1) when failing to hit that mark.

In 2019-20, UND was 15-1-2 when scoring four or more and 11-1-0 in 2018-19.

UND has reached the four-goal mark in three of its first four games to open the 2021-22 slate, jumping to 44-3-2 since 2018-19.

### NO PLACE LIKE HOME

Over the last two seasons, North Dakota is 29-3-0 on its home ice and has outscored opponents, 134-48, over that stretch.

UND has only won fewer than 10 games at home once since the building opened in 2001.

Saturday's loss to Bemidji State was the third since Oct. 2019, with two of those three coming in overtime.

### SANDY THE MAN-DY

Sophomore defenseman **Jake Sanderson** was one of the seven players named to the 2021 NCHC Preseason All-Conference Team, as announced by the league in September.

Last season, the Whitefish, Mont., native appeared in 22 games for the Fighting Hawks, notching two goals and 13 assists for 15 points. Sanderson led all UND blueliners with a +20 rating while being whistled for only one penalty all season.

Sanderson became the program's eighth first rounder since 2010 and the 20th player in UND history to be selected in the first round when he went fifth overall to Ottawa in the 2020 NHL Entry Draft.

The sophomore defenseman started his 2021-22 season with a bang, scoring a pair of goals and adding two assists against Niagara to earn

NCHC Defenseman of the Week honors.

Sanderson scored a goal in the opening game at Quinnipiac before potting a pair of assists in Saturday's win to finish the weekend with three points.

He currently is tied for the team lead with seven points.

### NINE IS FINE

UND's roster features nine NHL draft picks, the second-most of any NCHC program behind Denver.

UND's nine draft picks include: defensemen **Cooper Moore** (DET), **Brent Johnson** (WSH), **Tyler Kleven** (OTT), **Jake Sanderson** (OTT) and forwards **Jake Schmaltz** (BOS), **Gavin Hain** (PHI), **Matteo Costantini** (BUF), **Judd Caulfield** (PIT) and **Jackson Kunz** (VAN).

Sanderson, who was taken fifth overall by Ottawa in 2020, is the highest-selected defenseman in North Dakota history and the highest player taken since Jonathan Toews went third to Chicago in 2006.

UND has had at least one player taken in each NHL Entry Draft since 1999.

### NEW LOCATIONS, SAME NORTH DAKOTA

This year brings some new locations to the program for the first time, with a Texan and Swede sent to don the green and white for the first time.

Freshman defenseman **Brent Johnson**, a native of Frisco, Texas, is the first Texas-born player to put on a North Dakota sweater.

Johnson earned All-USHL Second Team honors last season with Sioux Falls after posting 32 points in 47 games from the blue line, where he led all Stampede defensemen in points (32), goals (11) and assists (21). Johnson broke the team goal-scoring rookie record for a defenseman with his point total. Rookie goaltender **Jakob Hellsten** is also set to become the first Swedish-born player to play for UND.

The Ljusdal, Sweden, native spent last season with the Halmstad Hammers HC where he posted a 2.62 GAA and .908 save percentage. Hellsten has also worn the Tre Kronor at the U-16, U-17 and U-18 level.

### **GREAT FACES, GREAT PLACES**

South Dakota also makes an appearance on the roster for the first time in a long time, with defenseman **Brady Ferner** joining the team after transferring from RPI.

The Dakota Dunes, S.D., native is the first South Dakota native to play hockey at UND since Buzz and Prince Johnson from 1947-50 (Webster, S.D.).

Ferner played two seasons at RPI, notching 12 points in 70 games of action. He spent last season as a volunteer assistant coach with the Sioux City Musketeers (USHL) after RPI opted out of the season due to COVID-19 concerns.

### **LOCAL FLAVOR ON REPEAT**

The state of North Dakota is well represented on the roster this season, with five players suiting up from the Peace Garden State.

Goaltender **Kaleb Johnson** and forwards **Dane Montgomery, Judd Caulfield** and **Jackson Kunz** all hail from Grand Forks while defenseman **Tyler Kleven** is from Fargo.

This marks the most North Dakota natives on the UND roster since the 2004-05 team had six: Andy Schneider (Grand Forks), Nick Fuher (Grand Forks), Quinn Fyelling (Minot), James Massen (Bismarck), Robby Bina (Grand Forks) and Jean-Philippe Lamoureux (Grand Forks).

### **MIDWESTERN HOSTS**

North Dakota will be the host school for the 2026 NCAA Frozen Four in Las Vegas, Nev., (T-Mobile Arena) and the 2023 and 2025 NCAA Regionals at SCHEELS Arena (Fargo, N.D.), announced by the NCAA. This adds to UND's long resume of hosting NCAA events.

North Dakota has previously hosted NCAA Regionals in 2015, 2017, 2019 and 2021 at SCHEELS Arena, 2006 at Ralph Engelstad Arena in Grand Forks and 2018 at Denny Sanford PREMIER Center in Sioux Falls, S.D., in the past 15 years.

As his seventh year at the helm of North Dakota begins in 2021-22, head coach Brad Berry has put his own distinct stamp on a program already steeped in tradition and success. Berry has guided his alma mater to a 141-63-24 (.670) record in his six seasons with six winning seasons, three NCAA Tournament appearances (2016, 2017, 2021), a national championship (2016) and one of the best seasons in school history that got cut short due to the COVID-19 pandemic in 2019-20.

Navigating one of the oddest seasons in memory in 2020-21, Berry helped the Fighting Hawks return to the NCAA Tournament with a vengeance. UND posted a 22-6-1 record, despite playing only seven games at home, on its way to a second straight National Collegiate Hockey Conference regular season title and became the first team in NCHC history to win both the regular season and postseason title. The Hawks advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2017, earning the No.1 overall seed. UND rolled past American International in the regional semifinals before battling Minnesota Duluth to the longest game in NCAA Tournament history, dropping a 3-2 thriller in five overtimes.

A season that started in a pod at Omaha during the month of December, UND faced every challenge thrown its way to capture multiple individual awards. Six players earned All-NCHC status while sophomore Shane Pinto became the first player in conference history to be unanimously named player of the year. The forward was also named a Hobey Baker Award Hat Trick finalist, the second straight year a UND player has been a finalist, joining teammates Jordan Kawaguchi and Matt Kiersted as All-Americans.

Berry was named a finalist for Spencer Penrose AHCA National Coach of the Year Award, a honor that he won the year prior, while repeating his NCHC Herb Brooks Coach of the Year selection.

Jordan Kawaguchi followed up his junior season with a sparkling senior year, serving as team captain and being selected as the 2020-21 Senior CLASS Award® winner in NCAA® Division I men's hockey. The award, chosen by a nationwide vote of Division I men's hockey coaches, national hockey media, and fans, is given annually to the most outstanding senior student-athlete in Division I men's hockey. He became the first student-athlete at North Dakota to earn the award.

The 2019-20 Fighting Hawks rolled off a school-record 18-1-0 mark at home on the way to a 26-5-4 overall campaign. UND captured the National Collegiate Hockey Conference's regular season title, its third in the last six seasons and second under Berry. A postseason that was viewed with tons of optimism was

cut short with North Dakota holding the top spot in the NCAA PairWise Rankings before the conference tournaments-- and eventually the entire rest of the season-- was canceled.

It was a season that began with little fanfare as zero UND players were on preseason all-conference teams and the Hawks were picked to finish fourth in the NCHC. But, North Dakota used a much-improved power play, a standout duo in the net, an influx of new talent and a Hobey Baker Award Hat Trick finalist to turn in one of the most exciting seasons in UND's esteemed history.

Junior Jordan Kawaguchi burst upon the national scene and became the USCHO.com National Player of the Year, finishing second in the country in points (15-30--45) and leading North Dakota in clutch situations with 13 game-winning points. Junior Peter Thome won the league's goals-against average title, recording a slim 1.37 GAA with a 7-3-1 mark while sophomore Adam Scheel won 19 games with a 2.07 GAA. Freshman Shane Pinto and fellow newcomer senior transfer Westin Michaud injected some instant offense, tying for the team lead with 16 goals during the magical campaign.

Berry was named the Spencer Penrose AHCA Award co-winner along with National Coach of the Year honors from College Hockey News and USCHO.com. He also was named the NCHC Herb Brooks Coach of the Year, the second of his career.

He began his head-coaching career in 2015-16 by leading UND to its eighth NCAA championship, becoming the first person in

the history of NCAA Division I men's hockey to win a national title in his first year behind the bench.

In 2016-17, Berry guided the defending national champions to the program's 15th straight NCAA Tournament berth, the second-longest streak in the history of the sport.

Berry has also continued UND's reputation for developing professional hockey players, churning out more than two dozen such players in just five years, including 12 who have already played in the National Hockey League heading into the 2020-2021 season: Brock Boeser (Vancouver), Drake Caggiula (Chicago), Rhett Gardner (Dallas), Shane Gersich (Washington), Luke Johnson (Minnesota), Tyson Jost (Colorado), Paul LaDue (LA Kings), Austin Poganski (St. Louis), Tucker Poolman (Winnipeg), Nick Schmaltz (Arizona), Troy Stecher (Vancouver) and Christian Wolanin (Ottawa).

A former NHL defenseman himself, Berry masterfully guided his alma mater to the program's eighth national title in his debut season of 2015-16, bringing to a halt a 16-year drought for the storied program. Berry and the Fighting Hawks went 34-6-4, establishing a team record for most wins by a rookie head coach, and their .818 winning percentage was the second best in program history.

Berry also led UND to its second straight Penrose Cup as National Collegiate Hockey Conference regular-season champion, resulting in NCHC Herb Brooks Coach of the Year honors. He also garnered national coach of the year honors from U.S. College Hockey Online (USCHO) and was one of eight finalists for the Spencer Penrose Award, given to the American Hockey Coaches Association (AHCA) Coach of the Year.

Four of Berry's players – forwards Boeser and Caggiula, defenseman Stecher, and goaltender Cam Johnson – earned All-America honors, joining UND's 1986-87 team as the only entries in school history to boast four All-Americans.

Following the season, eight players signed pro contracts: Caggiula, Stecher, LaDue, Schmaltz (Chicago Blackhawks), Keaton Thompson (Anaheim Ducks), Luke Johnson (Chicago Blackhawks), Bryn Chyzik (AHL's Rockford IceHogs), and Coltyn Sanderson (ECHL's Orlando Solar Bears).

UND has also thrived in the classroom under Berry, placing 19 players on the NCHC Academic All-Conference Team for the third consecutive season in 2019-20, including a team-record 12 being named to the NCHC Scholar-Athlete Team. In his tenure, Berry's teams have boasted a whopping 93 NCHC All-Academic Team members.

Berry was named head coach at North Dakota on May 18, 2015, becoming the 16th head coach in program history and the sixth former UND player to take the helm.

Berry had recently completed his ninth season as an assistant coach at UND in 2014-15. He served two stints in that role, first from 2000-01 through 2005-06 and again from 2012-13 through 2014-15. He also previously spent time as an assistant coach with the NHL's Columbus Blue Jackets (2010-12) and the AHL's Manitoba Moose (2006-08).

During his nine years on the UND staff, Berry helped lead the

program to eight NCAA Tournament appearances, five NCAA Frozen Four berths (2014-15, 2013-14, 2005-06, 2004-05 and 2000-01), three regular season conference titles (2014-15, 2003-04 and 2000-01), and one conference tournament championship (2005-06).

Berry oversaw the team's defensemen during both of his stints at UND and routinely produced blue line units that ranked among the conference national leaders, both offensively and defensively. In each of the last two seasons, UND led the nation in both points and points per game by defensemen. At the other end of the ice, UND allowed a league-low 2.24 goals against per game in 2014-15 and ranked among the top three in the conference in that category in five of Berry's last six seasons with the program.

Before returning to UND prior to the 2012-13 season, Berry spent two years (2010-12) as an assistant coach with the NHL's Columbus Blue Jackets. Prior to that, Berry founded The Hockey Academy in Grand Forks, which focuses on developing and training youth hockey players within Grand Forks and surrounding areas. During that time (2008-10), he doubled as a part-time scout with the NHL's Vancouver Canucks.

Berry was an assistant coach with the Manitoba Moose from 2006-08 and helped lead the Vancouver Canucks AHL affiliate to a playoff appearance in each of his two years, including a North Division title in 2006-07.

At every stop during his career, Berry has enhanced his reputation as a coach who develops National Hockey League defensemen. Eleven of his former UND pupils have reached NHL rosters, including two-time Stanley Cup champion Matt Greene of the Los Angeles Kings. While with the AHL's Manitoba Moose, Berry mentored future Vancouver Canucks stalwart Alexander Edler. During his two years with the Blue Jackets, Berry coached the likes of James Wisniewski, Mike Commodore, Marc Methot, Jack Johnson, Kris Russell, Anton Stralman, Fedor Tyutin, and Rostislav Klesla.

Berry himself was a standout defenseman as a player, first at UND where he collected 74 points (12 goals, 62 assists) in 112 games from 1983-86 under legendary head coach John "Gino" Gasparini. Berry also won a gold medal with Canada at the 1985 IIHF World Junior Hockey Championship.

A second-round draft pick (29th overall) of the Winnipeg Jets in 1983, Berry went on to play in 241 NHL games over eight years, including stints with Winnipeg, Minnesota and Dallas. His professional playing career also included stops in the Swedish Elite League and the International Hockey League (IHL). While with the IHL's Michigan K-Wings, Berry was a three-time IHL All-Star and was named the K-Wings' Defenseman of the Year three times.

After his playing career ended, Berry was a professional scout with the 1999-2000 Dallas Stars team that advanced to the Stanley Cup Finals.

A native of Bashaw, Alberta, Berry's family includes his wife, Suzanne, daughters, Brianna and Brooke, and son, Bauer.
