Nittany Lions Open 2012 Season With Big Ten/

BIG EAST Challenge: The Penn State baseball team, under the direction of seventh year head coach Robbie Wine, is set to begin the program's 124th season, as the Nittany Lions travel to Florida for the fourth annual BIG EAST/Big Ten Challenge beginning this Friday.

Looking to start off the season with another strong performance in the competition, Penn State will open with Seton Hall on Friday at 4 p.m. before battling West Virginia on Saturday at 4 p.m. and Cincinnati on Sunday at 10 a.m.

Over the past three years, Penn State has been a force in the annual competition. During each of the first three contests, the Lions won two of their three games after topping West Virginia and Seton Hall last year. The Big Ten won the inaugural event in 2009 with a 15-9 record, while the Big East has won the last two outings.

What to Watch For: The Nittany Lions return an impressive corps of talent from the 2011 team. Of the 10 position players who started at least 30 games in 2011, six will be returning, including seniors Joey DeBernardis, Jordan Steranka and Sean Deegan. Furthermore, of the seven pitchers who appeared in at least 15 games, six will be returning. Steven Hill, who joined Deegan on the All-Conference squad, will return after earning second-team honors for his work as the staff ace last season. During the year, he posted a league-best 2.57 ERA while notching a 6-5 record. He also fired four complete games.

Scouting the Pirates: The Pirates of Seton Hall had a stellar year last season, nine of their last 11 games, sweeping through the BIG EAST Tournament to capture the conference title. In addition, Seton Hall won its first game at the NCAA Regional in College Station, Texas. Most of the Pirate depth comes from the outfield, returning all three starting outfielders in Dale Anderson, Zach Granite and Will Walsh.

Scouting the Mountaineers: The Mountaineers completed 2011 with a 28-27 overall record, including a 14-13 mark in BIG EAST action to qualify WVU for its fourth consecutive BIG EAST Tournament appearance. Five starting position players return for 2012 with a total of 14 letterwinners returning, including five pitchers.

Scouting the Bearcats: The Bearcats are coming off a solid campaign, going 30-27 with a 14-13 mark in BIG EAST action. Sophomore DH Justin Glass, senior OF/C Braden Kline and junior outfielder Jake Proctor are Cincinnati's top returning starters. Last season, Glass batted .326 with four home runs and 45 RBI in 57 games. Kline hit .326 with five home runs and 31 RBI. Proctor ended last season with a .286 batting average with a team-best 51 runs scored, 30 RBI and three home runs. He also stole 21 bases.

AS A SOPHOMORE IN 2011: Pieced together an outstanding sophomore campaign, earning third-team All-Big Ten honors after going 6-4 with a 3.19 ERA and 59 strikeouts in 84.2 innings of work ... Held his opposition to a .234 batting average, which was the lowest mark in the conference ... Also ranked among the top-10 pitchers in wins, ERA, innings pitched, and strikeouts ... Allowed two runs or less in nine of his first 10 outings during the year ... Picked up his first win of the season after limiting NC State to one run on four hits over 5.1 innings of work on March 5 ... Continued to shine against top-notch competition after recording seven strikeouts while holding No. 26 Wichita State to just one hit over five innings on March 20 ... Posted another seven strikeouts during six shutout innings against Le Moyne on March 27 ... Put together his finest start of the season against Illinois on April 2 after setting a career-high with nine strikeouts while allowing just one run during a complete game effort ... Allowed just two runs in each of his next three starts, highlighted by a six-inning, one-hit effort against Purdue on April 17 and an eight-inning, five-strikeout performance against Ohio State on April 23 ... Earned his sixth win of the season after striking out seven while allowing just three hits over 6.2 innings against Iowa on May 7 during a nationally televised game on the Big Ten Network ... Wrapped up conference action with a 4-0 record, 3.06 ERA, and 36 strikeouts ... Started the first game of the Big Ten Tournament against Purdue, firing five innings with two strikeouts on May 25 ... Only qualifying pitcher in the Big Ten that did not allow a single home run during the year ... Honored with the Ed Drapcho Award as Penn State's most improved player ... Cut his ERA in half and allowed 12 fewer hits despite firing nearly twice as many innings as he did during his freshman campaign ... Named Third Team All-Big Ten ... Also named Academic All-Big Ten.

AS A FRESHMAN IN 2010: Saw significant action in freshman campaign, going 1-4 with a 7.95 ERA in 18 games (six starts) ... Was sixth on the squad with 43 innings pitched ... Ended the season with strong performance in the finale vs. Michigan (5/22), throwing 1.1 scoreless frames along with two strikeouts ... Allowed three runs in four innings vs. La Salle (4/27) in final start of the season ... Pitched a scoreless inning vs. Mount St. Mary's (4/21) ... Made first Big Ten start vs. Northwestern (4/11), throwing 4.2 innings while allowing four earned runs with five strikeouts, a game the Lions went on to win ... AS A SOPHOMORE IN 2011: Pieced together a breakout sophomore campaign, earning second-team All-Big Ten honors while receiving the Charles Medlar Award as Penn State's top pitcher ... Anchored the starting rotation throughout the year, starting 15 games while leading all conference pitchers with a 2.57 ERA ... Fired 101.2 innings, which led the squad and ranked second in the Big Ten ... Tossed at least six innings in 12 starts, including a league-high four complete games ... Opened the year with a season-high eight strikeouts while scattering five hits over 7.2 innings of work against West Virginia during the BIG EAST / Big Ten Challenge on February 19 ... Limited NC State to six hits in 6.2 innings of work while posting five strikeouts on March 5 ... Tossed his first complete game of the season and earned the victory after striking out five while allowing just one unearned run during the second game of a doubleheader against Norfolk State on March 19 ... Continued his hot streak with 7.1 innings of work against No. 26 Wichita State, which earned him his second straight victory ... Picked up another win after surrendering just five hits and two runs while striking out seven during a complete game effort against Le Moyne on March 26 ... Tossed his first shutout of the season after blanking Northwestern during a 12-0 victory in Evanston ... Limited the Wildcats to seven hits while striking out two without allowing a walk ... Fired at least six innings in each of his next three starts, highlighted by an eight-inning effort against Michigan State on April 29 ... Named the Big Ten Co-Pitcher of the Week for his performance against Minnesota on May 13 ... Scattered just four hits and struck out six without surrendering a walk while firing his second shutout of the season against the Golden Gophers ... Wrapped up the regular season with seven shutout innings against Michigan on May 19 to earn his sixth victory of the year ... Surrendered just 12 walks during the season and ranked 17th in the nation with a 1.06 walks-per-nine-innings rate ... Finished the year with a 2.08 ERA in conference action, which was the lowest in the league.

AS A FRESHMAN IN 2010: Appeared in 21 games with eight starts while throwing 68 innings (second on the squad) ... 43 strikeouts were third-best ... Finished the season with sensational start vs. Michigan (5/21), tying a career-high seven innings, allowing only three runs. The Lions went on to a thrilling 6-5 walk-off win in the ninth ... Was the tough-luck loser at Minnesota (5/15), bouncing back from a tough first inning to go 5.2, allowing only four runs with five strikeouts in the Metrodome ... Earned first-career save as part of win over No. 24 Pitt (4/13), throwing 1.1 scoreless innings with two strikeouts ... Picked up second win of the season, coming into a jam against Columbia (3/20) while tossing 1.2 sparkling innings ... Second strong start in as many outings, tossing six innings while only allowing two runs with three strikeouts at Texas State (3/14) ... Impressed in first career outings, tossing 5.2 innings of one-run ball in the Big Ten/BIG EAST Challenge ... Pitched three innings against Notre Dame (2/28), allowing one run while striking out six. Got out of a bases loaded one-out jam in the ninth by striking out consecutive hitters to force extra innings ... Retired all eight batters he faced in the season-opener against Cincinnati (2/26) to earn the win. Came in with runners on the corners and only one out, proceeding to strike out the first batter on three hits while retiring the next hitter as well.
