STARTING FIVE

- The University of Minnesota men's basketball team is back in action Saturday when it hosts Penn State at 8 p.m. It marks Minnesota's first game this week, but it begins four-game swing in seven days. After the Gophers play the Nittany Lions on Saturday, Minnesota then plays its makeup game at Illinois on Monday, at Maryland Wednesday and at Nebraska Feb. 25.
- Saturday's contest marks the only game contested between the two teams this season. Minnesota is 16-3 at home against PSU all time, dating back to 1975. The game also features two of the best assist play makers in the Big Ten and nationally in Minnesota's Ta'Lon Cooper and Penn State's Jalen Pickett. Both rank in the Big Ten's top five in assists and nationally.
- Michigan State University announced on Monday, Feb. 13 that the men's basketball game between Minnesota and Michigan State, which was to be contested on Wednesday, Feb 15 at Michigan State, was postponed because of the tragic shootings that took place on the Michigan State campus on Monday. Any information regarding rescheduling would be announced at a later date.
- Minnesota played Feb. 12 when it hosted the Iowa Hawkeyes in Williams Arena. Joshua Ola-Joseph led Minnesota with 11 points, Ta'Lon Cooper had 10 points, seven assists, and five rebounds, and Jaden Henley added 10 points, but Iowa pulled away late for a 68-56 win. Minnesota was limited to eight players in the game, as the Gophers were without leading scorer and rebounder Dawson Garcia and guard Braeden Carrington. It was also Minnesota's first game after a COVID pause, in which the Gophers had to postpone the Illinois game from Feb. 7 to Feb. 20.
- Minnesota tied its season-high nine team blocks in the loss against Iowa, and also a best against a Big Ten team. The Gophers also shot 50 percent for the game, the second time in Big Ten play this happened. The first was against Ohio State in the 70-67 win. Will Ramberg also tied a career-high eight points. He saw 29 minutes of action and also grabbed seven rebounds, which tied a team high. Pharrel Payne also had seven rebounds in his fourth start.

ABOUT PENN STATE

- Penn State is 15-11 this season and 6-9 in Big Ten play. The Nittany Lions are coming off a convincing 93-81 win over Illinois Tuesday night.
- Tuesday's star, fifth-year senior Jalen Pickett, scored 41 points against the Illini. He leads the team averaging 18.1 points, is shooting 52 percent on the season and 36.7 from three. He also leads the team with 7.4 rebounds and 25 steals and 181 assists. He ranks first in the Big Ten and fourth nationally in assists and assists per game (7.0). Seth Lundy follows with 14.6 ppg, while Andrew Funk averages 12.6. Arguably one of the oldest teams in the nation, PSU's top five scorers are seniors.
- As a team, the Nittany Lions are averaging 73.2 points and allowing 68.7 per game. They are shooting 46.8 from the field, including 38.9 from three. They average 32.1 rebounds per game and shooting 75.4 from the free throw line.

THE LAST TIME

- Minnesota fell to Penn State in the first round of the Big Ten Tournament on March 9, 2022. Jalen Pickett hit three 3-pointers on his way to 22 points and Penn State defeated Minnesota 60-51. Jamison Battle scored eight points to help Minnesota take a 28-24 lead at halftime. Penn State took its first lead of the second half at 33-32.
- The last time these two teams met at Williams Arena, the Gophers won, 76-70 to snap a five-game losing skid on Feb. 12, 2022. Eric Curry scored 22 points, Payton Willis scored 13 of his 18 in the second half. Willis made 3 of 4 from 3-point range and finished with 10 assists and six rebounds. E.J. Stephens scored 13 points.

POSTPONEMENT GAMES

- The Minnesota men's basketball game originally scheduled for Feb. 7 at Illinois, will now be played on Monday, Feb. 20 at 8 p.m. in Champaign, Ill. The game will be televised on Big Ten Network. The game was postponed due to COVID-19 health and safety protocols within the Golden Gopher program, announced earlier today.
- Michigan State announced on Monday, Feb. 13 that the men's basketball game between Minnesota and Michigan State, which was to be contested on Wednesday, Feb 15 at Michigan State, was postponed because of the tragic shootings that took place on the Michigan State campus on Monday. Any information regarding rescheduling would be announced at a later date.

INJURIES FOR THE GOPHERS

- Minnesota freshman guard Braeden Carrington has suffered a right leg stress reaction and will be sidelined for approximately four weeks, announced Jan. 19. His status will be re-evaluated after that time. Carrington, one of the first off the bench, averages 22 minutes and 6.2 points in 14 games this season.
- Minnesota was without Dawson Garcia and Pharrel Payne against Indiana. Payne returned to the lineup against Northwestern, but Garcia remains day-to-day and has missed the past five games. Garcia started in 18 games and led the team in scoring.

ON THE DOCKET

- Minnesota is back in action Monday when it travels to Illinois for an 8 p.m., tilt. The game will be televised on BTN.
- Mike Grimm and Tanner Hoops will also be on the radio call on KFAN 100.3 FM.

SETTING IT UP

- Ta'Lon Cooper has picked up where he left off last year in assists. The Roebuck, S.C., product ranks third in the Big Ten in assists and assists per games through 23 contests this season. Cooper's 131 assists and 5.7 apg ranks 28th and 17th nationally. He also ranks eighth in the league in assist/turnover ratio at 2.15. His 538 career assists ranks 24th among active leaders nationally, while his 4.56 apg ranks 34th. Cooper also ranks first in the Big Ten in minutes played, averaging 36 per game and 30th nationally. Starting in all 23 games for the Gophers, Cooper has played in 830 minutes.

COOPER MILESTONES

- Ta'Lon Cooper set another milestone in his year with the Golden Gophers. The guard from Roebuck, S.C., established his 1,000th career point during the Maryland game (Feb. 4). Sitting at 1,004 career points, Cooper had a three-year total of 773 points at Morehead State, while producing 231 so far this season with Minnesota. Cooper also established his 500th career assist mark earlier this year at Ohio State (Jan. 12).

YOUNG TALENT

- Minnesota is without the services of Parker Fox and Isaiah Ihnen this year due to season-ending injuries. That being said, the average age of Gopher players available to play is at 20.38. This is in comparison that last year's Gopher team held a team average age of 22.31.

- Minnesota is the only team in the Big Ten to have three freshmen average over 20 minutes of playing time. No Big Ten team has more than two freshman playing 20+ minutes per game and Minnesota is the only team that has four freshmen average over 17. Prior to his injury, Braeden Carrington averaged 22 minutes, while Pharrel Payne averages 22.2, Joshua Ola-Joseph at 21.8 and Jaden Henley at 18.9. Purdue (Smith/Loyer), Ohio State (Sensabaugh/Thornton) and Illinois (Clark/Epps) also have two freshmen over 20 minutes. On Sunday against Iowa, Minnesota started three true freshmen in the game. In fact, within the Big Ten, only six schools have a single freshman that averages over 20 minutes played this season.

GOPHERS IN THE CLASSROOM

- Minnesota held a team grade point average of 3.23 last semester. It was the third-straight semester the Gophers have held a 3.0 team GPA, all of which coming during Coach Johnson's tenure.
- Last year, Minnesota had three Academic All-Big Ten selections, while the team earned the NABC Team Academic Excellence Award. Minnesota also had nine earn degrees last season.

OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

- Coach Johnson named his captains for the 2022-23 season: Jamison Battle, Ta'Lon Cooper, Dawson Garcia and Taurus Samuels. The honor marks the first of their collegiate careers for Battle and Garcia and the second for Cooper and Samuels as they were named captains at Morehead State and Dartmouth.

YEAR 2 FOR COACH BEN JOHNSON

- Head coach Ben Johnson is set to enter his second year as the Golden Gopher men's basketball coach. Named the head coach on March 22, 2021, Johnson had the task of assembling a team from scratch and added 10 newcomers for the 2021-22 season. The Golden Gophers went 13-17 last year and went 9-1 in nonconference play. Under Coach Johnson's tutelage, Minnesota won five road games last season, the first road wins since the 2019-20 campaign. He also recorded six Power 5 wins including two Quad 1 wins.

ROSTER BREAKDOWN

- With one fifth-year senior in Taurus Samuels, the Gophers have two juniors in Jamison Battle and Ta'Lon Cooper, both with four years of college playing experience, along with sophomore Dawson Garcia with three. The Gophers also have junior Will Ramberg and sophomore Treyton Thompson and five true freshmen on the roster.
- The Gophers have nine of their 14 players that hail from Minnesota (Battle, Carrington, Fox, Garcia, Ola-Joseph, Payne, Purcell, Ramberg and Thompson), while two are from California (Henley, Samuels). The Gophers also have one player from Colorado (Betts), one from South Carolina (Cooper) and one from Germany (Ihnen).

HEAD COACH TIDBITS

- Head coach Ben Johnson is not only a graduate of Minnesota, he is also coaching in his hometown. Growing up in Minneapolis, Coach Johnson was also a standout at DeLaSalle High School here in Minneapolis.
- Johnson, 42, is also the youngest head coach in the Big Ten. Micah Shrewsberry at Penn State is the second-youngest at 46.
- Johnson is the first Gopher alum to coach the program since George Hanson in 1970-71.
- Johnson is one of 52 Division I head coaches at the helm of his alma mater. Johnson is also one of four alums coaching their alma mater within the Big Ten (Michigan's Howard, Purdue's Matt Painter and Indiana's Woodson the other three).

GOPHERS IN THE PROS

- The University of Minnesota is well represented within the NBA scene, having seven alumni currently playing, coaching or broadcasting within the league.
- Amir Coffey (played from 2016-19) is in his fourth professional NBA season with the Los Angeles Clippers. In his first two years with the organization, Coffey averaged 3.2 points per game and nine minutes per game. The Hopkins, Minn., product made his presence known in 2021-22 when averaged 9.0 points, 2.0 rebounds and 22.7 minutes played for the Clippers. He later signed a three-year contract with the Clippers this past summer.
- In addition, the Gophers also have five alumni coaching in the NBA ranks. JB Bickerstaff (1998-2001) begins his sixth season as an NBA coach, including his fourth with the Cleveland Cavaliers. Ryan Saunders (2004-08) returns to NBA coaching ranks as an assistant with the Denver Nuggets. Kevin Bursleson (1998-2003) is now the head coach of the Rio Grande Valley Vipers, while Bobby Jackson (1995-97) is the head coach for the Stockton Kings, both of which are in the G League team.
- Minnesota's all-time leading scorer Mychal Thompson (1974-78) is in his 20th season as the Los Angeles Lakers color commentator. Jim Petersen (1980-84) is in his 25th year as a broadcaster for the Minnesota Timberwolves. Quincy Lewis (1995-99) is set to embark on a new career within the NBA as a part of the Utah Jazz in an outreach/alumni role.
- A few Gophers landed spots on NBA G League rosters: Jordan Murphy (Austin Spurs) and Daniel Otoru (Windy City Bulls). Payton Willis and Austin Hollins are both playing in Israel, while Mo Walker is back in London. Walker, however recently suffered a season-ending injury and will be out for the season. Nate Mason is back with Guangzhou Long Lions in China for the second season. Dupree McBrayer is playing with TFT in North Macedonia. Charlie Daniels is also playing professionally in the Armenian League. Sean Sutherlin signed with Nitra in the Slovakian League to play this year.

CAMERON CHRISTIE

6-5 • G • ARLINGTON HEIGHTS, ILL.

Christie is a 6-5, 160-pound guard from Arlington Heights, Ill., and Rolling Meadows High School under Kevin Katovich. Christie is ranked as the No. 1 recruit out of Illinois this season and ranked 84th nationally by 247Sports.com. A First-Team IBCA all-state selection, Christie helped Rolling Meadows to a 28-6 overall record and a Mid-Suburban East conference championship. Christie led the team to its first regional title in more than 21 years. As a junior, Christie surpassed 1,000 career points and averaged 22 points at Rolling Meadows. As a junior, Christie also shot 53 percent from the field, was 93 percent at free throw shooter and 42 percent beyond the arc last season. He also averaged 5 rebounds and 3 assists. Christie garnered all-state honors from the Sun Times and Hoops Report, while he was named conference player of the year and an Under Armour Top 30 list.

"Cam is a driven, competitive winner and we're excited to see him bring that edge to Minnesota," head coach Ben Johnson said. DENNIS EVANS

Evans is a 7-1, 210-pound center hailing from Riverside, Calif. Hillcrest High School under Hugh Wood. Also playing for Team Inland and Kool-Aid Perry, Evans is listed as the No. 13 recruit from Rivals.com, the 27th from 247Sports and 28th from PrepHoops.com. With Hillcrest last year, Evans averaged 11 points, 10 rebounds and seven blocks per game as a junior. He led Hillcrest to a River Valley League Championship in 2022. A true rim protector, Evans produced a 16-block performance last year, which set a new state record. Evans also posted 10-block performances five times last year. He also included a triple-double once last season, his second of his career, the first coming as a sophomore. A standout on the USA Basketball circuit, Evans was also a member of the u17 USA Basketball team that took home gold this past summer in the FIBA championships in Malaga, Spain. Ben Johnson is in his second year at the helm of Golden Gopher men's basketball. Johnson, 42, was named Minnesota's 18th head coach in school history on March 22, 2021.

In his first season as the Gopher men's basketball coach, Johnson had the task of assembling a team from scratch when he added 10 newcomers to the group. The Golden Gophers went 13-17 in 2021-22 and went 9-1 in nonconference play. Under Coach Johnson's tutelage, Minnesota won five road games last season, the first road wins since the 2019-20 campaign. He also recorded six Power 5 wins last year, including two Quad 1 wins.

Johnson notched his first Big Ten Conference win on the road when the team defeated Michigan, 75-65. It marked Minnesota's first win at Michigan since the 2010-11 season. The Gophers also won the inaugural Asheville Championship and earned a thrilling win over Pitt in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge. Jamison Battle and Payton Willis garnered All-Big Ten honorable mention in 2021-22.

Off the court, the Golden Gophers have six individuals earn a degree in May of 2022 as the team held a 3.18 team grade point average last season. He also signed the No. 43 recruiting class in just his first year as a head coach and welcomed eight newcomers to the 2022-23 team.

Johnson, who graduated from Minnesota in 2005 with a bachelor's degree in sociology, returned to his alma mater after spending three seasons at Xavier as an assistant coach. Johnson previously served as an assistant coach at Minnesota from 2013-18 and was a two-time captain during his playing career for the Gophers.

Johnson helped lead Xavier to consecutive top-30 recruiting classes in 2019 and 2020 and the Musketeers posted a collective record of 51-37 in three seasons with him on the bench.

In his previous stint at Minnesota, Johnson helped recruit local standouts and NBA athletes in Daniel Oturu and Amir Coffey to the Gophers. Johnson was instrumental in recruiting and developing Jordan Murphy, who finished his career atop the Gopher record books in rebounds (1,307), free throws made (460), free throws attempted (698) and second in scoring (1,802 points).

Prior to returning to Minnesota in 2013, he spent one season as an assistant coach under

Tim Miles at the University of Nebraska. While with the Huskers,

Johnson assisted in all-day-to-day basketball-related duties while also serving as recruiting coordinator. Johnson also led the development of Nebraska's backcourt players.

Johnson spent 2008-12 as an assistant coach at Northern Iowa. The Panthers went a combined 93-77 in that timeframe, winning at least 20 games in all four years. Northern Iowa reached postseason play in all four years and advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2009-10. That year, UNI won a school-record 30 games and upset top-seeded Kansas in the second round. During his tenure at UNI, the Panthers boasted three first-team All-MVC selections, including 2010 Missouri Valley Conference MVP Adam Koch in 2010. Four players were named to the MVC All-Freshmen or All-Newcomer teams, including a pair in 2011-12.

Prior to his stay at Northern Iowa, Johnson served as an assistant coach for two seasons at the University of Texas-Pan American. He was heavily involved in recruiting, worked with the Broncos perimeter players and coordinated UT-PA's summer camps.

Johnson's coaching career began at the University of Dayton, where he served as a graduate assistant during the 2005-06 season.

Johnson started his collegiate playing career at Northwestern and played two seasons before returning to the Twin Cities to finish his career. He finished with 533 points in 59 games in Maroon and Gold and scored a total of 1,202 career points between the two Big Ten Conference institutions.

The Minneapolis native enjoyed a standout prep career, leading DeLaSalle High School to a pair of state championships. He was a two-time first-team all-state selection in both football and basketball, and as a senior, was named a Street & Smith All-American, as well as an honorable mention Nike All-American.

He was listed as the 60th-best basketball player in the country by Bob Gibbons in his senior season, totaling more than 2,200 points during his high school career. Johnson also was listed on Tom Lemming's High School Football All-American list as a top-20 national recruit and was a two-time all-state performer on the gridiron.

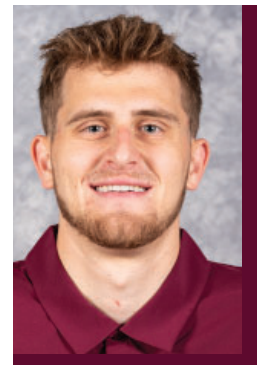
