THIS WEEK'S MATCHUP

• Penn State remains home to battle Niagara in a pair of non-conference matchups on Friday evening and Saturday afternoon.

• This weekend marks the fourth and fifth meetings in the all-time series where the Nittany Lions hold the 2-0-1 advantage. Penn State has outscored Niagara 11-3 allowing just 1.00 goals per game against the Purple Eagles in the series including a pair of 5-1 victories two years ago.

• Junior Denis Smirnov is the only current member of the Nittany Lions to have scored a goal against Niagara with two goals and four assists in two career games. Only Kevin Kerr, Brandon Biro and Nate Sucece have also registered points against the Purple Eagles with four assists between them.

• Both Chris Funkey and Peyton Jones earned a start between the pipes two years ago when Niagara visited Pegula Ice Arena registering 24 and 20 saves, respectively, to each earn a victory.

PERFECT 10

• Penn State jumped six spots to No. 10 in the rankings after its season opening sweep over then-No. 17 Clarkson last week. This marks the first time since the 2017-18 preseason rankings that the Nittany Lions have been ranked inside the top-10 of the USCHO.com poll.

• Penn State has been ranked in the top-10 for 15 weeks over the past two-plus seasons with 13 of those weeks coming during the historic 2016-17 season. The Nittany Lions are 10-8-1 all-time while being ranked inside the top-10, but are 10-4-1 in such games against teams not named Minnesota.

• All-in-all the Big Ten has six teams ranked this week including five in the top-11. Ohio State and Notre Dame hold down the No. 1 and No. 2 spots, respectively, while Minnesota (No. 6), Michigan (No. 11) and Wisconsin (No. 15) join the Nittany Lions in the rankings.

BIG SECOND STAR OF THE WEEK

• Junior Brandon Biro was named the Big Ten's Second Star of the week after scoring twice while adding two assists for four points last weekend against Clarkson.

• The weekly honor is just the second in Biro's career as he was once named the Third Star of the week last season.

• Including the International Game against Brock, Biro has scored at least one goal in each contest (four total) including two game-winning goals so far this season.

• The junior registered one goal and one assist in each game last weekend giving him 13 multi-point games for his career.

DOMINATING THE DRAW

• Penn State ranked just 44th winning just 48.2 percent of its faceoffs during the 2017-18 season. However, after two weeks of play, the Nittany Lions currently rank 16th in the nation at .534 percent good for third in the Big Ten.

• Part of the success last weekend was due in large part to graduate transfer Ludvig Larsson who won 26-of-36 faceoffs. His early season 72.2 percent winning margin is currently good for fourth in the Big Ten and 16th in the nation.

• On the other side, Niagara only won 38.9 percent of its draws last weekend vs. AIC to rank 50th out of the 54 teams who have already begun competition for the 2018-19 season. Ludwig Stenlund is the strongest Purple Eagle on the draw winning 57.1 percent of his attempts (16-for-28).

THE PERFECT FIT

• Larsson also had a seamless transition into Penn State's top offensive production line last week as he was slotted between junior classmates Brandon Biro and Nate Sucece.

• Biro and Sucece had instant chemistry last season playing 33 games alongside each other after just five during the 2016-17. Some might say Larsson goes together with this duo like lamb and tuna fish or perhaps spaghetti and meatball if you're more comfortable with that analogy.

• The Sucece - Larsson - Biro line combined for 10 of the team's 25 points last weekend while earning a combined plus-9 rating on the ice.

BLOCK PARTY

• Penn State dominated in the shot blocking department last week collecting 27 blocks each night. The 27 blocks are the most in a game since the Nittany Lions had 32 against Minnesota on February 21, 2015.

• Penn State's 54 blocks in two games are the most in the nation by a team with only two games played. Junior Kris Myllari leads the nation with 13 blocked shots.

• Myllari registered a career-high eight blocked shots during Friday's 5-1 victory after opening the weekend with five.

• Penn State had five players with at least three blocks on Thursday night and followed that up with four on Friday night.

DON'T GET SHORT WITH ME

• Junior Nate Sucece registered the third shorthanded goal of his career last Thursday putting him in a tie with Dylan Richard '17 for the fourth most all-time at Penn State.

• Sucece is now just one shorty shy of tying Tommy Olczyk '16 and Eric Scheid '16 for second while Andrew Sturtz leads the way with nine.

• Following a four-point weekend, Sucece has moved into a tie with David Glen '16 for eighth on the all-time points list with 69 while his 32 goals are now good for solo seventh breaking a tie with Richard.

• Penn State is one of 14 teams already this season to have at least one shorthanded goal. Colorado College leads the way with three in four games. Maine is the only other school with multiple shorty's with two to its credit.

HAPPY VALLEY FIVE-0

• Penn State scored at least five goals for the first time this season last Friday during a 5-1 victory over Clarkson. Last season the Nittany Lions scored five or more goals 14 times posting a 13-0-1 mark in such games.

SCOUTING NIAGARA



• Niagara finished the 2017-18 season with an 11-22-3 overall record and a 10-15-3 mark in Atlantic Hockey play. The Purple Eagles were swept by AIC in the first round of the Atlantic Hockey Tournament.

• Niagara returns eight of its top 10 scorers from last season, but are without the services of leading scorer Derian Plouffe who was lost to graduation. Plouffe led the team with 17 goals and 35 points. Only senior Tanner Lomsnes returns as a double-digit goal scorer after registering 13 goals last season.

• The Purple Eagles do return starting net-minder Brian Wilson who started 30 games as a freshman last season going 9-19-2 with a .900 save percentage and a 2.72 goals against average. Wilson started both games last weekend against AIC going 1-1-0 with a 2.47 goals against average and a .894 save percentage.

• Niagara split with AIC to open its 2018-19 campaign last weekend winning 4-3 in overtime before dropping a 3-1 decision to close the series.

• The Purple Eagles went 2-for-8 with the man-advantage last weekend while killing 5-of-6 penalties of their own. Last season Niagara finished with a 16.8 percent powerplay and an 82.4 percent penalty kill.

• Freshman Dylan Mills led the team last weekend with four points on one goal and three assists during his first two collegiate games to earn Atlantic Hockey Rookie of the Week. Classmate Ludwig Stenlund was the only Purple Eagle to register multiple goals as he scored twice including the game-winner in overtime last Friday.



WELCOME TO HOCKEY VALLEY



• All-time Penn State has now scored five or more goals in 55 games posting a 53-0-2 record. The Nittany Lions are averaging 4.50 goals per game after their first weekend of play tying for the Big Ten lead while ranking tied for seventh in the nation.

CAPTAIN BERGER

• Following a three-point weekend, senior captain Chase Berger became only the third player in program history to reach 90 points as he now sits at 92, just eight points shy of 100.

• Berger registered the 38th goal of his career on Friday night moving him into a tie with Eric Scheid '16 for the fourth most in program history just six behind David Goodwin '17 for third all-time. The senior's 54 career assists already rank second all-time behind Goodwin.

• Berger also moved past David Glen '16 for fourth all-time in career shots on goal with 357 to his name over the past three-plus seasons. Berger needs 98 more shots this season to pass Casey Bailey for the program standard.

MR. JONES

• Junior goaltender Peyton Jones made the 72nd start of his career last Friday night and needs just one more start to tie Matt Skoff '16 for the program record for starts by a goalie with 73.

• Jones is also now just 212 saves behind Skoff's Penn State record of 2,114 recorded from 2012-16.

HOME IS WHERE YOU MAKE IT

• Penn State will not have to travel outside the Keystone State until Thanksgiving weekend with a trip to Ohio State. The Nittany Lions also don't have to leave the friendly confines of Pegula Ice Arena until a November 10th matchup at Robert Morris on the back end of a home-and-home series.

• The following weekend the Nittany Lions are back home to begin Big Ten play against Michigan as they open the season playing 10 of their first 11 games at home.

• The eight-straight home games to open the season are the most in program history and the second longest home-streak since playing ten-straight at Pegula Ice Arena to close out the first semester of play during the 2016-17 season. Penn State went an astonishing 10-0-0 during that stretch as part of a program record 13-game unbeaten streak and 11-game winning-streak.

SMIRNOV AND SUCESE NAMED B1G PLAYERS TO WATCH

• Junior classmates Denis Smirnov and Nate Sucese were both named to the Preseason Big Ten Players to Watch list.

• This marks the second-consecutive season that Smirnov has made the list as he enters the 2018-19 season second on the team in career points with 74 in just 69 games while Sucese ranks not far behind with 65 points

in 74 career games played. The duo has combined for 65 goals over the past two seasons.

OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

Senior Chase Berger was named the sixth captain in program history for the 2018-19 campaign after serving as an alternate last season. Fellow senior Kevin Kerr and junior Brandon Biro will serve as his alternates.

PERFECT ATTENDANCE AWARD

Senior forward Chase Berger begins the 2018-19 season needing to play in at least 33 games to become the program's all-time leader in games played. The senior hasn't missed a single game in his entire Penn State career becoming the first Nittany Lion in program history to reach 100 games without missing a single one. The senior has now played in 115 straight games.

Recent graduate Trevor Hamilton is currently the only Nittany Lion in program history to not miss a single game while wearing the Blue and White, however, he only played two seasons in Hockey Valley suiting up for 77 games while at Penn State.

Along with Berger and Hamilton, Penn State had three other players appear in every game last season as Liam Folkes, Cole Hults and Kris Myllari skated in all 38 games during the 2017-18 season.

RECAPPING 2017-18

Penn State is coming off its second-consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance after finishing the 2017-18 season at 18-5-5 with a 9-10-5-2 mark in Big Ten, good for a fourth place finish with 34 points in league action.

The Nittany Lions led all Big Ten teams with 138 goals and 374 points last season ranking third and fourth in the nation, respectively, in each category. Penn State returns 109 of those goals and 274 points each topping the Big Ten while ranking first and fourth in the NCAA to open the 2018-19 season.

The Nittany Lions have 20 players returning from last season's roster as they welcome six newcomers to the 2018-19 squad.

Andrew Sturtz became just the third player in program history to reach the 40-point mark in a season as the junior scored 14 goals while adding 26 assists. Sturtz then became the fourth Nittany Lion to ink a professional contract signing a two-way NHL deal with the Ottawa Senators forgoing his final season in Hockey Valley.

Penn State had six players register double-digit goals while two others fell one goal shy of that mark. The Nittany Lions ranked first in the Big Ten and third in the nation averaging 3.63 goals per game during the 2017-18 season.

Brandon Biro had a career-year for the Blue and White ranking second on the team with 31 points on nine goals and 22 assists. Fellow classmates Nate Sucece and Denis Smirnov were also top-5 in points for the Nittany Lions with 29 and 27, respectively while Smirnov led the team with 15 goals and Sucece one behind with 14. Liam Folkes also had a career-year with 13 goals and 10 assists for 23 points.

Senior Trevor Hamilton became the first Penn State player to earn a major conference honor as he was recognized as the Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year after scoring six goals while adding 23 assists for 29 points and leading the nation in blocked shots for the second-consecutive season with 109.

- Graduate transfer **Ludvig Larsson** becomes the program's first-ever Swedish born player as he hails from Malmo, Sweden by the way of Merrimack College (Hockey East).

PACKING THE PEG

- Penn State has played to a sellout crowd in 89-of-93 home games, including all 17 regular season contests during the 2017-18 season.

- More than 6,000 fans have filed into the arena on 59 occasions including 12 games last season.

- In 2017-18, Penn State ranked fifth in average attendance (5,906) and led the nation in building capacity percentage (102.2 percent).

- Last season, Penn State had a season-total of 112,221 fans that have been to Pegula Ice Arena.

WELCOME HOME

- Penn State opened the 5,704-seat Pegula Ice Arena with a 4-1 win against Army Oct. 11, 2013.

- The arena was brought to fruition through an initial \$88 million donation—the largest in University history—in September 2010 from Penn State alumnus Terry Pegula and his wife, Kim. The Pegulas added to that figure to bring their total donation to \$102, supplying \$90 million for the facility.

- The \$90 million facility broke ground in early February 2012 and was turned over to Penn State in September 2013.

THIS IS BIG TEN HOCKEY

- The Big Ten is in its sixth season entering 2018-19. In league action, each Big Ten team will play 24 league games, including 12 home contests.

- The Big Ten is comprised of seven total universities with the University of Notre Dame becoming an official affiliate member at the start of the 2017-18 season.

- Big Ten teams are awarded three points for a regulation or overtime victory, two points for a 3-on-3 overtime or shootout win and one point for a 3-on-3 overtime or shootout loss.

- The 2018-19 season will be the first season the Big Ten has instituted a 3-on-3 overtime period joining the NCHC and WCHA.

- Big Ten schools have won a combined 23 national championships, more than any other league.

- The Big Ten Hockey Conference is the only Power 5 conference to sponsor men's hockey.

- The Big Ten tournament will take place at on campus sites once again during the 2018-19 season.

MEET COACH GADOWSKY

Guy Gadowsky, will guide the Nittany Lions in his 20th collegiate season at the helm of an NCAA Division I program in 2018-19 and his seventh at Penn State.

AT PENN STATE

Following the most successful season in Penn State history, Gadowsky once again led his Nittany Lions to the NCAA Tournament in 2017-18. Penn State was able to take the short drive down to Allentown, Pennsylvania, as they served as host for the Midwest Regional. However, once again the Nittany Lions' season was cut short at the hands of the Denver Pioneers, 5-1, in the NCAA Midwest Regional semifinal.

Earlier during the 2017-18 season, Gadowsky secured his 100th career victory at Penn State, which in turn, was the 100th victory for the program, a 5-1 victory over Minnesota on February 23, 2018. That victory was the start of the first-ever sweep of the Golden Gophers by the Nittany Lions, which secured home-ice for Penn State in the Big Ten Tournament Quarterfinals the following weekend, the first year the conference tournament was held at campus sites. Penn State went on to sweep Minnesota in two games, clinching the series and its fourth B1G Semifinal appearance in five years.

In 2017-18, Gadowsky also saw junior Andrew Sturtz become just the second member of the 100-point club at Penn State as well as becoming the all-time leading goal scorer in program history. Sturtz then graduated early and signed an NHL deal with the Ottawa Senators.

Gadowsky also coached Trevor Hamilton to a Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year award, the first major conference honor awarded to a Nittany Lion. Hamilton also joined Casey Bailey and Vince Pedrie as the only First-Team All-Conference members in program history.

In 2016-17, Gadowsky led Penn State to its most successful season ever, compiling a record of 25-12-2. Penn State won the 2017 Big Ten Tournament and earned its first-ever NCAA

Tournament appearance, falling one game shy of the Frozen Four. The Nittany Lions defeated Union 10-3, tying the record for most goals in a team's tournament debut, before bowing out to eventual national champion Denver, 6-3, in the Midwest Regional final.

Along the way Penn State opened the season 13-1-1 using a program-best 11-game winning streak. The Lions also earned their first-ever uscho.com No. 1 national ranking on Jan. 17, 2017, with a 16-2-1 record. Penn State finished the season as the highest scoring team in the country, averaging 4.10 goals per game.

The 2016-17 Nittany Lions also set numerous single-season team records on offense including most goals (160), assists (265), points (425), shots (1,719), goals/gm (4.10) and shots/gm (44.1) to go along with the program-best 25 victories.

In 2015-16 Gadowsky led Penn State to its first 20-win season, finishing third in the Big Ten with a 21-13-4-1 overall record.

Penn State rose to as high as 14th in the uscho.com National Poll during the 2015-16 campaign. On February 6 the Nittany Lions earned their first-ever victory at Minnesota's Mariucci Arena as they defeated the Gophers 5-3.

PSU secured a 5-2 triumph over Wisconsin in the Big Ten Quarterfinals before bowing out to eventual champion Michigan 7-2 in the semifinals.

Of his 24 players on the 2015-16 roster, eight signed professional contracts in the off-season ranging from the ECHL, AHL, NHL and Europe.

His 2014-15 Nittany Lions exceeded expectations all season, garnering a winning season in overall action (18-15-4) and Big Ten play (10-9-1-0), while earning the program's first national ranking. Despite being picked sixth in the pre-season, Gadowsky's team was in the hunt for a Big Ten title up until the final weekend of the season.

Under Gadowsky's tutelage, junior Casey Bailey led the Big Ten in scoring and parlayed his outstanding season into a two-year contract with

the Toronto Maple Leafs, eventually scoring his first NHL goal in the season finale. Bailey was an All-Big Ten First Team honoree, while six other Nittany Lions earned honorable mention by the league coaches.

The 2014-15 season also saw Gadowsky reach the 200-win plateau in historic fashion when his Lions knocked off No. 4 UMass Lowell, 4-1 on Nov. 15, 2014. The program's rise from its first year in the Big Ten to its sophomore campaign saw gains of 10 wins overall and seven wins in conference play. Additionally, his Lions earned wins over every Big Ten team during the season including a season sweep of perennial power Wisconsin and a first win over Big Ten champion Minnesota on THON Night.

During the 2013-14 campaign, the bench boss guided the Nittany Lions during the Big Ten Conference's first season. Penn State, which faced seven NCAA tournament teams and three Frozen Four participants, capped its season with a 2-1 double-overtime victory against Michigan in the Big Ten quarterfinals.

In 2012-13, Gadowsky led the Nittany Lions to a 13-14-0 record during their inaugural NCAA Division I season. He guided the squad to several marquee victories, including wins against three future Big Ten opponents (Michigan State, Ohio State, Wisconsin). Penn State also topped Vermont at Wells Fargo Arena in front of the largest crowd to watch a college hockey game in an NHL barn (19,529).

In 2011-12, Gadowsky steered Penn State's final season in the ACHA, while recruiting for the future. That team went 29-5-0.

AT PRINCETON

Before coming to Happy Valley, Gadowsky served as Princeton's bench boss for seven seasons. In his first five years as head coach, the Tigers improved their win total in each season. In 2008-09, Princeton captured a program-record 22 victories and earned its second-straight NCAA tournament appearance.

During the 2007-08 campaign, Gadowsky, who inherited a program that had won a combined eight games in the two seasons prior to his arrival, guided Princeton to both the ECAC Hockey tournament and Ivy League crowns. The team earned its first NCAA tournament berth since 1998, Gadowsky garnered ECAC Hockey Coach of the Year honors and was a finalist for the Spencer Penrose Award, presented to Division I hockey's top coach. He was also named Inside College Hockey National Coach of the Year.

Gadowsky had more than 20 Tiger players go on to sign professional contracts, with Kevin Westgarth playing for the Stanley Cup champion Los Angeles Kings in 2011-12. Gadowsky also coached two ECAC and Ivy League Players of the Year as Lee Jubinville (2008) and Zane Kalemba (2009) each won the award in their junior seasons.

AT ALASKA

Prior to Princeton, Gadowsky spent five seasons as head coach of Alaska (1999-2004), where he inherited a team that had not won more than 14 games in each of the previous five seasons since joining the then-Central Collegiate Hockey Association. After two rebuilding seasons, the 2002 CCHA Coach of the Year led the Nanooks, ranked 11th nationally at the end of the season, to their only 20-win campaign since joining the conference. He followed that up with 15 wins in 2002-03 and 16 victories his last season.

Alaska twice hosted the first round of the CCHA playoffs in a three-year span, a feat never accomplished prior to Gadowsky's arrival. During his tenure with the Nanooks, his teams set school records for team grade-point average, wins and game attendance.

BEFORE COLLEGE COACHING

Before joining the collegiate ranks, Gadowsky spent three seasons (1996-99) as head coach and director of hockey operations for the Fresno Falcons of the West Coast Hockey League. He led the squad to the playoffs in each season and left the team as the winningest coach in franchise history. In his first season, Gadowsky posted a 38-win campaign as he garnered WCHL Coach of the Year accolades.

PLAYING CAREER

The Edmonton, Alberta, native played collegiately at Colorado College from 1985-89, serving as team captain as a senior, while also earning the team's Rodman Award, given for outstanding leadership and sportsmanship. The three-time WCHA All-Academic Team member collected 46 points in 134 career games.

Upon graduation, Gadowsky embarked on a seven-year professional career that included stops with the ECHL's Richmond Renegades, the IHL's San Diego Gulls and the AHL's St. John's Maple Leafs and Prince Edward Island Senators. Gadowsky saved his best season for last as he totaled 52 goals and 29 assists for the Fresno Falcons in 1995-96. He earned league MVP and first-team all-star recognition.

Gadowsky also competed with the Canadian National Team and played professionally in Austria, The Netherlands and Sweden during the 1993-94 season.

PERSONAL LIFE

Gadowsky and his wife, Melissa, have two sons, Mac and Magnus, and a daughter, Mia.
