THREE-POINTERS

- The game Tuesday is part of the inaugural Gavitt Tipoff Games, an eight-team Big Ten vs. Big East challenge in honor of Dave Gavitt, founder of the Big East and a basketball visionary. It also is a part of ESPN's annual Tipoff Marathon, now in its eighth year.
- Head coach Patrick Chambers goes for his 100th career victory Tuesday against DePaul in his sixth season as a college head coach.
- Penn State and DePaul are meeting for the first time in 31 years, the seventh game in a series dating back to 1938. The Blue Demons have a 6-0 advantage in the series after a 78-61 decision Dec. 12, 1984 in Rec Hall when DePaul was ranked No. 2 in the country and went on to be a No. 1-seed in the NCAA tourney.

THE MATCHUP

SCOUTING DEPAUL

The Blue Demons opened their season with a 69-63 win over Western Michigan Saturday at McGrath-Phillips Arena in Chicago. Billy Garrett Jr. led the Blue Demons with 18 points, five rebounds and four assists while Myke Henry finished with 16 points. Tommy Hamilton IV contributed 11 points and a team-high seven rebounds.

The Blue Demons are coached by Dave Leitao, who began his second stint as the DePaul head coach this season. He last led the team in 2002-05.

DePaul returned 11 players, including three starters, from the 2014-15 season, headlined by Henry, Garrett Jr. and Hamilton IV. Garrett is the top returning scorer after averaging 12.3 points per game while Henry 12.0 points and 5.4 rebounds. Hamilton averaged 10.0 points and 5.3 rebounds. Overall, the Blue Demons return nearly 70 percent of the scoring and just over 60 percent of the rebounding from last season.

SERIES HISTORY

The Lions are 0-6 all-time against DePaul with the last meeting coming during the 1984-85 season. The Blue Demons were ranked in the Top 5 nationally in each of the last three games in the series.

NON-CONFERENCE WINS

Penn State has won each of its last 13 non-conference games in the Bryce Jordan Center, dating back to Nov. 13, 2013, and a 90-80 setback vs. Bucknell. The Nittany Lions were 7-0 vs. non-league opponents in the BJC last season.

UP NEXT

Penn State takes its first road test against Duquesne at 7 p.m. Friday in the CONSOL Energy Center. The Nittany Lions lead the all-time series 26-19 including victories in six of the last seven games. The last six games between the teams have been decided by an average of 5.5 points.

LAST TIME OUT

Shep Garner scored 10 of his 15 points in the second half and Penn State beat VMI 62-50 on Saturday in the season opener for both teams. Garner hit back-to-back 3-pointers, including a 4-point play, to extend Penn State's lead to 51-31 midway through the second half. Garner finished with four of Penn State's five 3-pointers. Penn State led 29-24 at halftime and opened the second half on a 15-4 run to build a 44-28 lead. Brandon Taylor added 13 points for Penn State and Payton Banks had 12.

Coach Chambers will hold weekly press conferences and teleconferences during the season. A schedule will be emailed out every Monday. Coach Chambers will not be available on game day prior to tip-off. Post game press conferences will be held after each game, home and away.

PLAYER INTERVIEWS

All player interviews must be arranged through Alissa Clendenen in the Strategic Communications office at least two days in advance. Players will generally be available on a weekly basis throughout the season, in conjunction with head coach Patrick Chambers' weekly press conference. Interviews will not be granted on game day prior to tip-off. Player phone numbers will not be released. Following games, requested Penn State players will be brought to the postgame media interview room. The Penn State locker room is closed.

CREDENTIALS

CHAMBERS TAKES ON YEAR FIVE

The 2015-16 season marks the fifth year at the helm of the Nittany Lions for head coach Patrick Chambers. The Philly native is coming off his best season in University Park after posting a win total (18) that had been topped just twice in the last decade and four times since 2000. Chambers has seen his overall win total climb each of the last three years and has continued to make waves in Big Ten play.

SENIOR LEADERSHIP

A pair of four-year players – Brandon Taylor and Donovan Jack – combined with Jordan Dickerson, who has played a year and a half in Happy Valley, and Devin Foster, who joined the Lions last year, make up the 2015-16 senior class. Taylor and Jack have been a part of 44 wins in their first three years, the most since the 2011-12 class entered its final year with 57 victories.

ROOKIE RECOGNITION

The freshman class of Josh Reaves, Mike Watkins and Deividas Zengulis make up the most heralded group to sign at Penn State to date. The trio was rated as the No. 28 class in the nation by 247 Sports, marking the first Top 30 group to join the Nittany Lions. Both four-star players, Reaves and Watkins were each ranked among the Top 100 players in the country by ESPN with Reaves holding the No. 81 spot and Watkins coming in at No. 89 at the time of their signing. Zengulis was a three-star recruit and a Top 12 prospect from Maryland.

LIONS GAIN UCONN TRANSFER

Terrence Samuel joined the Nittany Lions in July after playing two years at the University of Connecticut. He will have two seasons of eligibility remaining after sitting out the 2015-16 campaign to satisfy NCAA transfer rules. A member of the Huskies' 2014 NCAA Championship team, Samuel saw action in 65 career games with eight starts as a sophomore. He averaged 3.6 points and 2.5 rebounds per game in his second season in Storrs with career averages of 3.0 ppg and 1.7 rpg.

BLOCK PARTY

The Nittany Lions have a total of three players in the Penn State Top 10 in the blocks category. Donovan Jack and Jordan Dickerson are tied at No. 8 with 82 career blocks, while Brandon Taylor is 10th with 74. Jack and Dickerson also share the No. 8 position in single-season blocks with 53 after putting up the total in 2013-14 and 2014-15, respectively. It was the first time Penn State had a player produce more than 50 blocks in back-to-back seasons since 1998 and 1999 when Calvin Booth did so.

RETURN TO REC ... TIMES TWO

Penn State's non-conference schedule is highlighted by two games to be played in historic Rec Hall. The Nittany Lions will take on Canisius and Louisiana-Monroe Dec. 10 and 12, respectively, as part of the second Return to Rec. Penn State last played in Rec Hall during the 2013-14 season in a Return to Rec event that marked the first men's basketball game played there since the Nittany Lions defeated Wisconsin, 79-50, in the building on Jan. 7, 1996. From 1926-96, the Lions compiled a stellar 514-183 (73.7%) record in Rec Hall, including a 45-game win streak from 1951-55.

PSU TAKES NYC

The Nittany Lion basketball and men's hockey programs will take over Madison Square Garden Jan. 30 in the first Big Ten Super Saturday - Hoops and Hockey doubleheader. The teams will both take on Michigan with tip slated for noon and puck drop scheduled for 7 p.m., both on Big Ten Network. In the first of four annual events at "The World's Most Famous Arena," which also will host the 2018 Big Ten Men's Basketball Tournament Feb. 28-March 4 of that year. Big Ten men's basketball and hockey programs will play regular-season games at Madison Square Garden in late January or early February in 2016 through 2019.

LAS VEGAS CLASSIC

Penn State will take part in the Continental Tire Las Vegas Classic Dec. 22-23 at the Orleans Arena in Las Vegas. The Nittany Lions will open action by taking on Colorado at 10:30 p.m. ET Tuesday, Dec. 22. The winner of the Penn State-Colorado game will play the winner of the SMU vs. Kent State matchup at 10:30 p.m. ET Dec. 23 on FoxSports1. The losers in each game will play each other at 8 p.m. ET, also on FoxSports1. Each team will play four games in the Classic – the first two at on-campus sites and the final two rounds at the Orleans Arena. Penn State's two games are vs. Canisius and Louisiana-Monroe in the Return to Rec series.

STAFF CHANGES

Head coach Patrick Chambers announced a series of staff changes in the offseason, beginning with the move by Ross Condon from director of operations to assistant coach in wake of the departure of Brian Daly. David Caporaletti, who previously spent four seasons as the director of on-campus recruiting, filled Condon's former post. Nicholas Colella then moved into the recruiting role and graduate managers Evann Baker and Kevin Hacke were added to the mix.

TWENTY SEASONS IN THE BJC

The 2015-16 campaign will be the 20th season in the Bryce Jordan Center. Since opening its doors to basketball Jan. 7, 1996, with a 79-50 win over Wisconsin, the BJC has hosted 316 Nittany Lion games with the team holding a winning percentage of 61.1 in those contests. Penn State has won at least 10 home games in four of the last five seasons.

120TH SEASON PENN STATE BASKETBALL

The Nittany Lions embark on the 120th season of basketball at Penn State and their 25th as a member of the Big Ten in 2015-16. The Lions began play in 1897 with a pair of contests vs. Bucknell, who they will face for the fourth-consecutive season and the 102nd time overall. Penn State has made 13 postseason appearances in the last 27 years (4 NCAA, 8 NIT, 1 CBI) and a total of 20 (9 NCAA, 10 NIT, 1 CBI) overall.

SIGNING DAY



Penn State men's basketball coach Patrick Chambers inked the highest-rated recruiting class in program history, signing four standout players to NCAA Letters of Intent to play for the Nittany Lions on Nov. 11.

Nazeer Bostick, Tony Carr and Lamar Stevens, all products of Philadelphia's Roman Catholic and AAU Team Final, along with Oak Hill/DC Premier export Joe Hampton will join the Penn State squad for the 2016-17 season. The group is touted as the sixth-ranked class in the country according to ESPN at the start of the day, which also ranked three of the individuals among their Top 100 players.

"Today marks the culmination of three years of hard work and dedication by this coaching staff to building relationships with these players and their families," Chambers said. "We are excited to watch these four guys come together and are impressed with their dedication to directing the course of Penn State basketball.

"All four believe in the vision we have for this program – in building it piece by piece and achieving success while earning degrees, developing men and serving our community. I want to welcome Nazeer, Tony, Joe and Lamar to the Penn State family."

The signing of the class was celebrated with an event the night of Nov. 11 with season ticket holders and invited guests. All four members of the 2016-17 class participated via Skype.

Over the last three seasons, Patrick Chambers has reinvigorated Penn State basketball. Since being named the 12th head coach in program history June 6, 2011, the Philly native quickly energized his players and staff, as well as the Penn State fan base with his passion, enthusiasm and his team's all-out style of play.

He has seen his team's win total, both overall and in the power-packed Big Ten, climb each season, racking up a sweep of Top 25-ranked Ohio State and a road win at Indiana last season. In both victory and defeat, Chambers' teams are heralded for their work ethic, perseverance and relentless attitude.

During his time with the Nittany Lions, Chambers has guided three players to a combined five All-Big Ten honors, including Tim Frazier's first-team nod in 2011. Frazier ended his career as the all-time leader in assists at Penn State – a record Chambers holds to this date at his alma mater Philadelphia – before going on to earn a spot on the Boston Celtics training camp roster.

To Penn State students, Chambers is known around campus for his infectious energy. He ordered up a pair of golf carts and began making spur-of-the-moment trips around the University Park campus distributing t-shirts. In his first few years, he visited amusement parks, pep rallies, student groups, and classes and threw out first pitches. Chambers even went as far as to go behind the counter to serve free Big Macs to students at State College's downtown McDonald's and donned a Penn State football jersey and helmet to fire up the famed "Nittanyville" student campout.

The youngest of 12 children (nine boys, three girls) from a Philadelphia Irish Catholic family so large it ate dinner in shifts, Chambers' route to Penn State was anything but usual and stands as a testament to the values of family, faith and attitude, which he holds dear. It was a path shaped by 2011 Naismith Hall of Fame inductee Herb Magee, Philadelphia high school coaching legend Dan Dougherty and highly successful Villanova coach Jay Wright. It also was shaped by a life altering attack that nearly claimed his life 10 years prior to his accepting the Nittany Lion post.

Chambers rise in coaching has been meteoric. He served as a part-time assistant at Episcopal Academy (HS), Director of Operations at Villanova, assistant coach at Villanova, associate head coach on Jay Wright's 2009 NCAA Final Four team and head coach at Boston University in a short seven years prior to leading a Big Ten program. The dizzying pace is reflective of his no holds barred approach to every day.

- Is the youngest of 12 children
- Has 3 of 11 siblings who graduated from Penn State.
- Spent 10 years as a highly-successful salesman and part owner of his family's printing business in Philadelphia.
- Was in collegiate coaching just five years before earning his first head coaching position at Boston University.
- Played in college for 2011 Naismith Hall of Fame inductee Herb Magee, also known as "The Shot Doctor."
- Helped lead Villanova to five straight NCAA Tournament appearances and the 2009 Final Four.
- Was instrumental in recruiting the No. 3 ranked recruiting class in the nation according to ESPN.com to Villanova in 2009.
- Has an older brother, Tim, who was the 1984 Ivy League Player of the Year in football and led Penn to three-straight Ivy League titles. He is now a writer, producer and director and released the film "Mighty Macs" about the Immaculata women's 1972 NCAA championship team.
- Has an older brother, Paul, who was a three-year starter at point guard for the Penn Quakers.

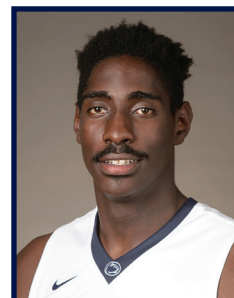
