NISSANY LIONS HOST NEBRASKA IN BIG TEN OPENER

The Penn State women's gymnastics team continues its season-opening homestand Saturday, Jan. 16 inside Rec Hall against Big Ten opponent Nebraska. Start time for the meet is scheduled for 4 p.m. Saturday's meet is the annual Flip for the Cure as both teams will don their pink leotards in support of breast cancer awareness.

The Cornhuskers (2-0) opened up the 2016 season with a first-place finish (194.050) in a triangular meet against Arizona State (192.700) and Bowling Green (191.900). Junior Jennie Laeng led the Huskers with her first all-around title on a career-high 39.350. She finished first or tied for first on all four events. Also in the all-around, Grace Williams finished second with her score of 39.025. Williams and freshman Megan Schwehofer also brought home event titles for the Huskers. Williams tied Laeng for the title on the uneven bars (9.850) and on the balance beam, Schwehofer tied Laeng and Williams for the title (9.825).

All fans are encouraged to wear pink and fans that do attend the meet wearing pink can purchase tickets for \$4. Also fans 4' 10" and shorter can purchase tickets for \$3. The annual Flip for the Cure meet benefits the Pink Zone.

Saturday's meet will be a BTN Student U production live on BTN2go.com. Parker Thompson and Nittany Lion women's gymnastics alum Sharaya Musser will be on the call for the Big Ten Network Student U stream. Fans can also follow along with live results on GoPSUsports.com.

Single meet tickets are available for all home meets in advance and at the door on the event night at a cost of \$8 for adults and \$5 for youth. Group tickets (20 or more) can be purchased in advance for a reduced rate of \$4 each.

HEAD COACH JEFF THOMPSON



Entering his sixth season at the helm of the Penn State women's gymnastics program, Jeff Thompson has led the Nittany Lions program back on to the national scene. Named the ninth head coach in program history on July 15, 2010, Thompson helped the Nittany Lions end a four-year drought and return to the NCAA Championships in 2014.

In 2015, Thompson and his staff helped Briannah Tsang earn the honor of Big Ten Freshman of the Year. Tsang is the fourth Nittany Lion in program history to receive the accolade.

As a team, Penn State finished the regular season with a record of 14-3. The Nittany Lions ended the 2015 season ranked No. 22 in the NCAA to mark the 13th straight season the program has finished among the top-25 nationally.

During the 2014-15 academic year, the Penn State women's gymnastics team won its fifth-straight Champs Cup [Penn State Team Community Service Award] for work in the community.

It was memorable 2014 campaign, as the Blue and White posted one of its most consistent seasons in the gym and in the classroom. The Lions set a school record for the highest score in a road meet – ranking third all-time – and recorded the highest postseason score in school history to place second at the NCAA Regional and earn their 17th trip to the NCAA Championships in school history.

A trip to the NCAA Championships, hosting the NCAA Regional and Big Ten Championships in Rec Hall, eight Penn State all-time top-10 performances, five Academic All-Big Ten, five Big Ten weekly award winners, four NACGC/W Scholastic All-Americans, three All-Big Ten honorees and one All-American highlighted the successful campaign.

Kassidy Stauder capped one of the most remarkable seasons in Penn State history with regular-season All-America honors on the balance beam. It was the first honor of her career and came on the heels of being named first team All-Big Ten and Big Ten All-Championship. Stauder won 16 individual titles, including three all-around, six balance beam and seven uneven bar crowns in 2014.

Sidney Sanabria-Robles and Krystal Welsh were named second team All-Big Ten, while freshman Emma Sibson posted two of the top-10 vaults in school history during her rookie campaign and was a two-time Big Ten Freshman of the Week award winner.

As a team, Penn State finished the season ranked No. 12 nationally and owned a 20-3 regular season record, including a third place finish in the Big Ten

regular season standings. For the fourth straight year, the women's gymnastics program was awarded the Penn State Team Community Service Award for their work in the community during the 2013-14 academic year.

On the coaching front, Thompson guided the Lions to the first 20-win regular season in school history and became just the third head coach in NCAA history to lead two different programs to the NCAA Championships. He joined K.J. Kindler (Iowa State & Oklahoma) and Judi Avener-Markell (Penn State & Florida).

The 2013 season concluded with senior Sharaya Musser earning regular-season All-America honors on balance beam and in the all-around and also All-America honors on balance beam and in the all-around at the NCAA Championships to push her career total to eight All-America certificates. The Lions were ranked as high as No. 14 in the national rankings and ended the season at No. 15 with a National Qualifying Score of 392.375.

Musser was also a first team All-Big Ten selection, Big Ten All-Championship Team pick and joined Lindsay Musgrove on the Big Ten Distinguished Scholars ledger. Madison Merriam was a first team All-Big Ten selection, as well.

Five gymnasts earned Academic All-Big Ten accolades for their work in the classroom, including Alex Witt, along with Merriam, Musgrove, Musser and Stauder. In 2013, the team was awarded the Penn State Team Community Service Award for the third straight year.

In 2012, Thompson and his staff helped Musser earn the distinction of Big Ten Gymnast of the Year, marking the seventh time in program history a Nittany Lion was bestowed the award. Musser's award marked the third time in a four year span that a Penn State gymnast won the Big Ten Gymnast of the Year award. Additionally, Musser advanced to the NCAA Championships where she was named an All-American on floor exercise and balance beam. Thompson also produced six Academic All-Big Ten selections and two NACGC/W

scholar athletes. Also in 2012, the team was awarded the Penn State Team Community Service Award for the second straight year.

A two-time SEC Coach of the Year, Thompson joined the Penn State family in 2010 after 11 successful years at Auburn University.

In his first season at the helm of the Nittany Lion program, Thompson guided the Nittany Lions to a second place finish at the 2011 Big Ten Championships, with Natalie Ettl and Musser earning individual event titles on uneven bars and in the all-around, respectively. Penn State earned a berth to the NCAA Regional Championships as the No. 2 seed and narrowly missed advancing to the NCAA Championships.

Three Nittany Lions were selected to the 2011 All-Big Ten team, and Musser, a Honda Award nominee, advanced to the NCAA National Championships to represent Penn State. Outside the gym, the Nittany Lions excelled in the classroom and community. Five gymnasts earned Academic All-Big Ten laurels and the team was awarded the Penn State Team Community Service Award.

In 11 years as the head of the Auburn University women's gymnastics program, Thompson was named both the SEC Coach of the Year and NCAA Regional Head Coach of the Year in 2003 and 2008. The Tigers qualified for NCAA Regionals under Thompson for the first time in 2003 and advanced to the NCAA Championship that same year. Auburn's women's gymnastics team continued to improve each year and qualified for the NCAA Regionals for eight consecutive years. In 2005, Auburn hosted the NCAA Women's Gymnastics Championships.

With the exception of the University of Alabama, Thompson's teams posted victories over every SEC team during his tenure. In his final season in 2010, Thompson led Auburn to upset victories over No. 8 Arkansas, No. 12 Kentucky and finally defeated 10-time National Champion and five-time defending SEC Champion Georgia for the first time in program history.

Thompson and his wife, Rachelle, helped produced four NCAA All-Americans, four All-SEC selections, three SEC Gymnast of the Year winners and one SEC Freshman of the Year during their time at Auburn. They coached nine NCAA Championship individual qualifiers and four NCAA Regional Event Champions. Their gymnasts also excelled in the classroom and in the community in their 11 years with the program. There were three SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year winners, three CoSIDA Academic All-District members, 41 NACGC/W Academic All-Americans and 53 SEC Academic Honor Roll selections.

Prior to arriving at Auburn, Thompson was the assistant coach at Louisiana State University from 1994-99 and was the Junior Olympic Program Director at the Cincinnati Gymnastics Academy in Fairfield, Ohio from 1993-94. Thompson also held assistant coaching positions at two Big Ten institutions, Illinois and Wisconsin, as well as serving as a graduate assistant coach at Kentucky.

Thompson earned a bachelor of arts in education with an emphasis in Physical Education from Kentucky in 1985. He went on to receive a Master of Science in Biomechanics in 1995.

A native of Highland Heights, Ky., Jeff is married to the former Rachelle Fruge, who is the associate head coach for the Nittany Lions, and they have two sons, Parker and Griffin.



MEET TWO: NEWS & NOTES

SERIES VS. NEBRASKA

The Nittany Lions won the inaugural meeting between the two programs inside Rec Hall on Feb. 9, 1983 by a margin of 174.75-173.95.

After Nebraska joined the Big Ten prior to the 2011-12 school year, Penn State and Nebraska first met as conference opponents at the 2012 Big Ten Championships. Nebraska won the 2012 Big Ten title with its score of 197.100. The Nittany Lions finished sixth at the Big Ten with a score of 195.700.

Since 2013, Penn State and Nebraska have met in the regular season each season. Nebraska has defeated Penn State in each regular season meet and Big Ten Championship meet since the Cornhuskers joined the Big Ten conference.

In the 2014 season, Nebraska made a pair of trips to Happy Valley. Nebraska was victorious in both occasions.

Nebraska holds a 21-5-0 advantage in the all-time series against Penn State.

NITTANY LION DEBUTS

Five Nittany Lions made their debut on Jan. 9, 2016 against North Carolina State. Five of the seven freshmen competed along with junior transfer Kiera Brown.

In their debuts, freshman Jessica Jones won the floor exercise title with her score of 9.850 and Brown won the uneven bars with a score of 9.950. Brown's score of 9.950 tied the number three performance in school history.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

The 2016 roster is comprised of 14 student-athletes, which includes seven freshmen. Eight of the 14 Nittany Lions are newcomers to the program, as Kiera Brown will be a junior this season for Penn State. Brown joins the Nittany Lions after transferring from the University of Georgia.

The 2016 Nittany Lions do not feature any seniors, but will be led by a quartet of juniors. The Nittany Lions also return Briannah Tsang, who was the 2015 Big Ten Co-Freshman of the Year.

VAULT RECORD FALLS

On Jan. 31, 2015, at Illinois, Penn State posted the best team score in school history on the vault with a 49.550.

The 49.550 broke the school record that was first set on Feb. 16, 2003 in a tri-meet at West Virginia with Rutgers (49.500).

The previous record of 49.500 was equaled on two other occasions; 2004 NCAA Regionals and vs. Cornell, Iowa and Yale on Jan. 23, 2010. Both were home competitions.

All six gymnasts posted scores of 9.850 or better on the event, marking the first time Penn State has seen all six performers top the 9.850 mark on any event since it occurred in 2014 on the floor exercise at the NCAA Regional.

Six of the top-10 all-time team vault scores have come on the road, including the school record performance at Illinois.

The Lions also tied for the No. 7 spot on the vault list with a 49.450 vs. Brockport, Iowa State and Penn on Feb. 28. They equaled the score from last season at New Hampshire w/Bridgeport & George Washington on March 8.

NITTANY LIONS ON BTN

The Penn State women's gymnastics team will be featured twice on the Big Ten Network during the 2016 season.

The women's program enters the 2016 campaign ranked 17th in the NCAA and was picked fourth in the Big Ten Preseason Coaches' Poll. The Nittany Lions are slated to host Iowa, Michigan, Minnesota and Rutgers on Saturday, March 12 live on BTN starting at 1 p.m.

The 2016 Women's Big Ten Championships are hosted by the University of Nebraska inside the Devaney Center on March 19 in two sessions, starting at noon and 5 p.m. Both sessions will be live on BTN.

THE FIRST TEAM TO TWENTY

The 2014 edition of the Nittany Lions became the first group of gymnasts to crack the 20-win plateau during the regular season in school history.

With two victories at the Big Ten Quad in Ann Arbor, Mich., the team moved past the 2007 squad for the most regular season victories in school history.

The 2007 team finished the year with a 19-4 overall mark and finished third at the NCAA Regional Championships.

In 2014, Penn State finished fifth at the Big Ten Championships, but followed that up with a second place showing, behind eventual co-national champion Florida, at the NCAA Regional and advanced to the NCAA Championships for the 17th time in program history.

THOMPSON CLOSING IN ON 150 WINS

Head coach Jeff Thompson is in his 17th season as a collegiate head coach and is closing in on his 150th career regular season victory. In his career, Thompson has compiled a 146-101 record.

In his sixth season at the helm of Penn State, Thompson has earned 60 regular season victories and is 74-19 overall. Add that to his 72 wins while at Auburn and the Highland Heights, Ky., native sits at 146 career wins. His overall record while at Auburn was 72-82.

In 2014, the Nittany Lions owned a 20-3 regular season record and set a school record for regular season victories on March 15 in the Big Ten Quad in Ann Arbor.

The previous school record was held by the 2007 squad, which finished 19-4 and placed third at the NCAA Regional Championships.

THOMPSON IN ELITE COMPANY

Head coach Jeff Thompson headed back to the NCAA Championships for the second time as a head coach and his first as the leader of the Nittany Lions in 2014.

Thompson's first appearance at the national meet came with Auburn in 2003 and he led the Nittany Lions back to the national summit for the first time since the program went in 2009.

He is just the third head coach in NCAA history to navigate two different programs to the NCAA Championships, joining K.J. Kindler (Iowa State & Oklahoma) and Judi Markell (Penn State and Florida).

Thompson took Auburn to the championships during his fourth season at the helm of the program. The Tigers finished 12th at the 2003 NCAA Championships, posting a team score of 193.525.

The Highland Heights, Kentucky, native guided Penn State to their 17th appearance at the NCAA Championships in his fourth year, as well. The Blue and White finished 12th with a team score of 194.825.

BIG TEN GYMNASTS TO WATCH

Penn State's Kiera Brown and Briannah Tsang were selected by the Big Ten women's gymnastics coaches as "Gymnasts to Watch" for the upcoming season.

Brown, a transfer from Georgia, will be a junior this year for the Nittany Lions. At Georgia, Brown was named All-SEC after she finished tied for second on the uneven bars at the 2014 SEC Championships. She also finished the 2014 season tied for 19th nationally on the uneven bars.

Tsang enters her sophomore season with the Nittany Lions after being named the 2015 Big Ten Freshman of the Year. Tsang was also named to the All-Big Ten second team. Last season, she competed in all 12 of the team's meets, including the NCAA Regional Championships. In 2015, she won at least one event title in each of her first seven career meets and posted at least one event win in eight of her 12 competitions.

OPENING SCORE IN SCHOOL HISTORY

The tally of 194.125 is the 10th highest season opening score in school history and their best first meet mark since a 194.675 in 2015.

Three of the top-10 scores have come under the watch of head coach Jeff Thompson.

Five of them have been recorded at home, with four others accomplished at the Super Six Challenge; 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2007.

Penn State enjoys one of the most historic collegiate gymnastics venues in the country and they take pride in giving the home crowd something to cheer for, including a lot of wins.

Since 1975, Penn State owns a 223-53 overall record in home meets. The Nittany Lions are 220-53 at Rec Hall and are 3-0 in meets contested inside the Bryce Jordan Center.

The loss to North Carolina State on Jan. 9, 2016, snapped a seven-meet winning streak inside Rec Hall. The seven-meet winning streak was the fourth-best in program history.

Penn State swept its last two home meets in 2014 and was unblemished in its five home dates in 2015.

NITTANY LIONS WELCOME THREE IN 2017

Tess McCracken, Kristen Politz and Mikayla Waddell have signed their National Letters of Intent to attend Penn State University and participate in women's gymnastics for the 2017 season, head coach Jeff Thompson announced on Nov. 11, 2015.

McCracken, who trains at World Olympic Gymnastics Academy (WOGA) in Plano, Texas, has been coached by Laurent Landi, Cecile Canqueteau-Landi and Natasha Boyarskaya.

She was the 2012 Texas level 10 state champion on balance beam as well as second place on uneven bars while tallying a third place in the all-around. McCracken went on to compete in the USA Junior Olympic National Championships where she finished in the top-10 in the nation on uneven bars and balance beam.

Politz currently trains at Rebound Gymnastics in Marlboro, New Jersey, and is coached by Bob and Diane Ferrell.

Politz is a five-time consecutive Junior Olympic National Championship qualifier where she first qualified at the age of 12 and placed first on floor exercise and first in the all-around at the National Invitational Tournament.

In 2015, she finished sixth in the nation on the uneven bars at the USA Gymnastics Junior Olympic National Championships. During the same season, she was third on the balance beam at the Region Seven Championships and earned the title of New Jersey State champion in the all-around several weeks earlier by sweeping the titles on all four events.

In 2014, she finished first in the region on floor exercise and followed it up with a fourth place finish at the Junior Olympic National Championships.

Waddell, who trains at ENA Gymnastics in Paramus, New Jersey, is coached by Craig and Jennifer Zappa and John Wojtczuk and she, too, comes to Penn State with a great history.

In 2014, Waddell finished fourth in the nation on balance beam and seventh in the nation on Vault at the Junior Olympic National Championships.

She was also named the Region Seven vault, balance beam and all-around champion in 2014 as well as the state champion on balance beam. In 2013, she was the Region Seven champion on balance beam and in 2012, as a Level 9, she was the national champion on vault and balance beam at Eastern Nationals.

LOOKING AHEAD

Following the Nebraska meet, the Nittany Lions take to the road for the first time this season. Penn State heads to Big Ten opponent Maryland for a Sunday afternoon showdown on Jan. 24. The meet is scheduled for a 4 p.m. start inside the XFINITY Center.

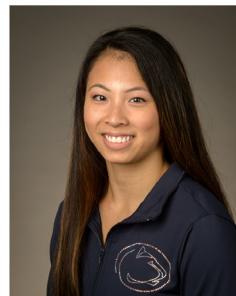
