• Junior transfer **Jake Rozhansky** scored the game-winning goal in the second overtime to top Rutgers on the road in Big Ten Conference action on Tuesday night in New Jersey. **Gordon Wild** slotted his league-leading sixth goal of the year as well, on a penalty kick in regulation.

• Penn State downed Ohio State at home its last time out. The Nittany Lions scored the first four goals of the match before surrendering two late goals to the Buckeyes. Connor Maloney leads PSU in goals (4) and points (11).

• Maryland overcame a two-goal deficit to defeat Penn State, 4-3, on the road last season. Then-sophomore **George Campbell** scored the first hat trick for Maryland since Stephen King in 2007. He was later tabbed Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week for his performance.

Terps Draw at No. 4 Indiana

Senior defender Alex Crognale scored in the 87th minute to give the No. 5 Maryland men's soccer team a 1-1 draw at No. 4 Indiana in the Big Ten Conference opener Friday night.

Crognale's goal came after Maryland goalkeeper Cody Niedermeier served a long ball to freshman defender Donovan Pines who then found Crognale for the equalizer from six yards. Niedermeier made four saves to lead the Maryland defense which has held every opponent to one goal or less in 2016.

Clutch Crog

Senior Alex Crognale has scored a pair of clutch goals this season for the Terps.

His goal against UCLA in the fifth minute answered an early score by the Bruins in the Terps' season opener at the StubHub Center. He also scored the equalizer versus Indiana in the 87th minute.

A-List Attack

Maryland's offense has been stellar thus far. The Terps are 10th nationally in total goals (15) and scored the most goals through the first four games since the 2012 season (15).

Of the 38 goals scored a year ago, 26 were by players returning this season, including a combined 13 from sophomores Eryk Williamson and Sebastian Elney.

Last Time vs. Penn State

Maryland overcame a two-goal deficit to defeat Penn State, 4-3, last season in State College.

George Campbell notched a hat trick to lead the Terps.

Captain, My Captain

Cody Niedermeier, Cody Albrecht and Alex Crognale will have the honor of repping the captain band this season for the Terps.

The Maryland men's soccer team has increasingly attracted more and more fans to Ludwig Field season after season. Heading into the 2016 campaign, over 500,000 fans have filled the stands to take in exciting Terrapin soccer action since the facility opened in 1995.

The Terps set a Ludwig Field record this season when 8,449 fans watched Maryland defeat UCLA in overtime on a perfect College Park night. Maryland averaged over 3,000 fans per game in 2015.

Sophomore transfer Gordon Wild leads the Big Ten in goals (6) and points (13). The Cologne, Germany, native is currently tied for fourth nationally in goals scored.

Super Sophs

Sebastian Elney was named a second team All-Big Ten selection last season and both he and Eryk Williamson garnered all-freshman honors but don't sleep on the rest of this talented sophomore class.

Amar Sejdic, Diego Silva and Andrew Samuels all spent time in the starting lineup a year ago while DJ Reeves, Connor Smith and Jorge Calix also saw significant action.

Terps Top Rival Georgetown

Gordon Wild scored the game-winning goal with 44 seconds remaining as the No. 7 Maryland men's soccer team edged local rival No. 24 Georgetown, 2-1, on a picturesque Friday night at Ludwig Field. Eryk Williamson also scored for the Terps. The announced crowd of 7,413 was the fourth-largest in Ludwig Field annals.

Terps Draw with UCLA in Opener

The No. 4 Maryland men's soccer team started the season off with a 1-1 draw at No. 16 UCLA at the StubHub Center last Friday night.

Senior Alex Crognale scored the lone goal for the Terps while the Maryland defense held UCLA scoreless the final 108:55 of the match.

What Offseason?

Ludwig Field had a busy summer as did the Terps.

Maryland played host to Barclays Premier League squads Southampton FC and Swansea City over the summer months.

In addition, six Terps spent time with their respective national teams over the offseason. Eryk Williamson and Sebastian Elney played with the U.S. U-20s while freshman Donovan Pines was with the U-19s. Aaron Franco trained with the Peruvian U-20s and Luca Levee (Jamaica) and Dayne St. Clair (Canada) each spent time with their U-20 squads.

B1G Pick

Maryland was picked to win the Big Ten this season, per a poll by the league's coaches released earlier in August. Alex Crognale, Chris Odoi-Atsem and Eryk Williamson were tabbed Players to Watch by the conference.

"You need to have a very strong backline and a highly-motivated team. We have both of those things," Cirovski said of this year's squad. "This is probably one of the deeper more balanced squads since the last time we won a national title."

D-FENSE!

Maryland returns a very strong backline, including senior All-Big Ten honorees Alex Crognale and Chris Odoi-Atsem. In addition, senior Suli Dainkeh has played quality minutes over his four-year career in College Park while sophomore Diego Silva promises to be a rising star on the defense.

League Supremacy

Maryland has won four consecutive tournament championships heading into the 2016 season.

Mael Corboz scored on a top-shelf, free kick from 25 yards to give the University of Maryland its first-ever Big Ten Tournament championship with a 2-1 victory against Indiana at Ludwig Field.

The Terps won their third-straight conference title on Maryland soil after capturing the 2012 and 2013 Atlantic Coast Conference tournament crowns in Germantown.

Wild Named Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week

Gordon Wild was named Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week on Sept. 6.

Wild scored the game-winning goal on a follow-up from a missed penalty kick attempt with 44 seconds remaining to down rival Georgetown in front of the fourth-largest crowd in Ludwig Field history.

The Cologne, Germany, native then added two more goals in a 4-1 rout of South Florida Monday. He also notched his first career assist with the Terrapins.

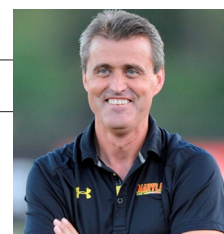

Upon his arrival in College Park in 1993, Sasho Cirovski has transformed Maryland into a national soccer power, leading the Terps to the 2008 and 2005 NCAA titles, seven College Cup appearances, and 13 conference titles, all the while producing numerous top-level professional players. Now entering his 24th season at Maryland, the 2005 NSCAA National Coach of the Year has instilled his passion for excellence in a soccer program that expects to compete for the national title every season.

During his tenure with the Terps, Maryland has been to the NCAA Tournament 21 times, advancing to the College Cup in eight of those years, including four-straight appearances from 2002-05, culminating in the NCAA title in 2005. The Terps have also captured seven conference tournament titles (1996, 2002, 2008, 2010, 2012, 2013, 2014 and 2015) and five conference regular season titles (2003, 2005, 2012, 2013, and 2014) during his stay in College Park

Cirovski was instrumental in helping the Terps make a stellar transition to the Big Ten in 2014, leading Maryland to regular season and tournament championships in its inaugural season in the league and its fourth straight conference tournament title a year later. In 2015, Maryland advanced all the way to the quarterfinals, defeating previous national champions Virginia and Notre Dame along the way. Two more players were drafted as midfielder Tsubasa Endoh (first round) and Ivan Magalhaes (second round) each heard their names called at the 2016 MLS SuperDraft.

Maryland returned to the College Cup for the second straight season in 2013 after capturing ACC regular season and tournament championships for the second consecutive season. The Terps fell to Notre Dame in the national championship game and Patrick Mullins became the first player at Maryland to win two MAC Hermann Trophies.

Maryland put together one of its finest campaigns in 2012, boasting the top winning percentage and scoring offense in the country. The Terps captured the ACC regular season and tournament titles and advanced to the College Cup before bowing out in penalty kicks in the national semifinals. Patrick Mullins was named the MAC Hermann Trophy Winner and all three seniors - Taylor Kemp, John Stertzer, and London Woodberry - all laddered in the MLS through either the MLS SuperDraft or homegrown contracts.

In 2008, the Terps established the 'Gold Standard', capturing the program's third national title and winning more games (23) than any other squad in program history. The team also set program-bests in shutouts (15) and consecutive wins (16) as well as registering a Ludwig Field-record crowd of 6,500 in Maryland's bout with then-No. 1 Wake Forest. The 2008 season marked the first time in the Cirovski-era that the Terps won both the NCAA Tournament and the ACC Tournament. To top it off, Cirovski eclipsed long-time head coach Doyle Royal to become Maryland men's soccer winningest coach in a win against Duke on Sept. 19.

The 2005 championship run did not mark the arrival of the Maryland program, but helped validate its place alongside the nation's elite. In addition to a fourth-straight College Cup appearance, the Terps won the ACC regular season title and posted a 19-4-2 mark. In addition, Cirovski helped mentor Maryland's first Hermann Trophy winner in Jason Garey, who left Maryland as the school's all-time leader in goals (60) and points (140) and was the third pick in the MLS SuperDraft. Cirovski was named the ACC Coach of the Year for the second time in his career, and was the NSCAA National Coach of the Year for the first time in his career as the Terps brought home their first national title since 1968.

Under Cirovski's guidance, the Terps have brought fans out to Ludwig Field in record numbers. In 2009, the

Terps ranked second nationally in overall attendance and a then program-record crowd of 6,946 watched Maryland trump No. 2 North Carolina. Cirovski's efforts to build a winning team that plays an exciting brand of soccer are only matched by his efforts to build Ludwig Field into one of the top soccer venues in the country.

In addition to his leadership on the sidelines, Cirovski is also a leader as the chairman of the men's soccer NSCAA Division I committee. As chairman, Cirovski was the architect in creating the position of NSCAA Program Director, a major triumph for the sport. This position will be the singular voice of college soccer in dealing with NCAA legislative issues, overseeing College Cups and elevating the significance and status of the sport. He was also vital in brokering the television partnership between Fox Soccer Channel and the NSCAA, guaranteeing a weekly spot for college soccer on television.
