Nittany Lion Preview

Head coach Russ Rose, in his 34th season leading the women's volleyball program, welcomes back 13 letterwinners, including six returners with starting experience for the 2012 season. Included in the group are 2011 AVCA First Team All-American Deja McClendon (Louisville, Ky.), AVCA Second Team All-American Katie Slay (Raleigh, N.C.), AVCA Third Team All-American Ariel Scott (Ridgewood, N.J.), junior Maddie Martin (Tampa, Fla.), and sophomores Micha Hancock (Edmond, Okla.) and Nia Grant (Warren, Ohio). Other returners include senior Marika Racibarskas (Chatham, N.J.), sophomores Dominique Gonzalez (San Antonio, Texas), Lacey Fuller (San Diego, Calif.) and Aiyana Whitney (Norwood, N.J.) and redshirt sophomores Erica Denney (Aurora, Colo.) and Maggie Harding (State College, Pa.). Rose welcomes the addition of four freshmen, including outside hitters Megan Courtney (Dayton, Ohio) and Paulina Prieto (Miami, Fla.) and defensive specialists Kendal Pierce (Eden, N.Y.) and Lara Caraway (Evans City, Pa.)

The Nittany Lions are coming off a season where they posted a 25-8 overall record, finished tied for second in the Big Ten with a 16-4 record and advanced to the NCAA Regional Semifinals.

Penn State vs. Morehead State

The Nittany Lions have met the Eagles once previously with Penn State winning, 3-0, on Oct. 20, 1983.

Scouting the Eagles

Morehead State was picked to repeat as the Ohio Valley Conference champions in 2012 after making their first NCAA appearance in 2011. The Eagles welcome back eight letterwinners from 2011, including All-OVC and AVCA All-Region setter junior Caitlin Clark. The Eagles also boast three newcomers, including two freshmen and one junior.

Penn State vs. Western Kentucky University

This is the first meeting between the Nittany Lions and the Hilltoppers.

Scouting the Hilltoppers

Western Kentucky University returns nine letterwinners from 2011, including five starters. The team made their sixth appearance in the NCAA tournament in 2011. WKU received votes in the AVCA Top 25 Preseason Coaches Poll.

Penn State vs. Louisville

The Nittany Lions lead the series with the Cardinals, 5-1. The squads last met on Sept. 13, 2008 with the Nittany Lions winning, 3-0. Louisville's lone win against Penn State came on Sept. 16, 1983 with the Cardinals going 3-2 against PSU.

Scouting the Cardinals

Louisville was selected as the preseason favorite to win the BIG EAST for the second straight season. The team captured its first regular season title in 2011 going 13-1. The Cardinals welcome the return of BIG EAST Player of the Year Lola Arslanbekova, as well as All-BIG EAST Preseason Team selections Gwen Rucker and Emily Juhl.

Penn State Recap

The Nittany Lions closed out the 2011 season in the NCAA Regional Semifinals. Penn State made its 31st appearance in the NCAA tournament. The Nittany Lions went 25-8 overall last season and 16-4 in the Big Ten to tie for second place. Three Nittany Lions were named AVCA All-Americans, including first team honoree Deja McClendon, second team pick Katie Slay and third team selection Ariel Scott. Penn State hit .267 in 2011, averaging 13.74 kills per set, 1.71 aces per set, 14.17 digs per set and 2.68 blocks per set. Slay led the team with a .386 hitting percentage and 1.42 blocks per set, while McClendon and Scott both posted 3.54 kills per set to lead the Lions and then freshman Micha Hancock set the Penn State single season record in aces with 91.

What's Next?

Penn State opens its home slate with the Nike Big Four Volleyball Classic on Aug. 31-Sept. 1 at Rec Hall. The Nittany Lions are set to take on No. 6 Stanford on Friday, Aug. 31 at 8 p.m. before challenging No. 2 Texas on Sept. 1 at 7 p.m. Penn State heads to Chicago on Sept. 8-9 to play in the Mother McAuley Tournament against DePaul, Oregon State and UIC.

Season Opening Record

Under head coach Russ Rose, the Nittany Lions are 27-6 in season openers. Penn State's Aug. 26, 2011 loss to Oregon was the Lions' first season-opening loss since 2005 when the Nittany Lions suffered a 3-2 setback to Stanford, also in the AVCA Showcase. All six times the Nittany Lions have lost their season opener, they have rallied to win their second match. Penn State has never opened the season 0-2.

Leading Lions

The team captains for the 2012-13 season are senior Kristin Carpenter, junior Katie Slay and sophomore Dominique Gonzalez.

Nittany Lions Debut At No. 3 in the AVCA Preseason Coaches Poll

The five-time national champion Penn State women's volleyball team heads into the 2012 season ranked No. 3 in the 2012 AVCA Preseason Coaches Poll. The Nittany Lions are one of two Big Ten teams to crack the top five, with Nebraska coming in at No. 4.

UCLA, the defending NCAA Champion, took the top spot with 54 of the 60 possible first place votes, while Texas was ranked No. 2 and was one of four other teams to receive first place votes. Following Nebraska to round of the top five was USC.

Penn State Chosen to Finish Second in the Big Ten

The Nittany Lions were picked to finish second in the Big Ten by the league coaches. Nebraska, the defending Big Ten Champion, was picked as the conference's preseason favorite. Purdue was slated to finish third, while Minnesota sits in fourth and Illinois in fifth. Ohio State rounded out the poll at sixth.

Three Nittany Lions Earn Big Ten Preseason Honors

A trio of Nittany Lions has earned Preseason All-Big Ten honors from the coaches. Juniors Deja McClendon, Katie Slay and Ariel Scott all picked up preseason accolades. McClendon was a unanimous selection for the second straight season, while it was the first honor for Scott and the second for Slay.

Nittany Lions By Month

Penn State is 35-5 (.875) all-time during the month of August. Its first two losses came during the inaugural NACWAA in 1995 when Nebraska swept the Lions, and in the 1999 NACWAA when Florida outlasted Penn State 3-2 in the opening round. Most recently, the Nittany Lions suffered a season opening loss to Oregon in 2011 before rebounding with a hard fought 3-2 win against nationally-ranked USC.

Penn State is 350-54-4 (.863) all-time during the month of September. Amazingly, the Lions are 174-15 (.921) during September dating back to the 1995 season and 47-7 (.870) over the last five years.

The Lions are 379-67 (.850) all-time during the month of October. Penn State has posted a 79-11 (.878) mark in October over the last 10 seasons, a record of 43-3 (.935) in the last five years and did not lose a match during the month from 2007 to 2010.

Penn State is 275-57 (.828) all-time during the month of November, including a 77-8 (.906) mark over the last 10 seasons. The Lions had a six-year streak from 1995-2000 where they did not lose a match in the month, and over the last five seasons, Penn State has a 38-3 (.927) mark in November.

Quick Sets

- During a period from Oct. 16, 1996 to Nov. 9, 2001, Penn State had won 139 consecutive matches when taking a 2-0 lead. Since joining the Big Ten for the 1991 season, Penn State has played in 731 total matches, winning 646. Amazingly, 513 of those 646 wins, or 79%, have been three-game sweeps. Over the last six years, Penn State has won 166 of its 199 victories in three games (83%), including 37 out of 38 (98%) in 2008 and 32 out of 38 in 2009 (84%).

- Over the last 15 years, the Lions have lost only 55 matches. And of those 21 teams that defeated the Lions – Brigham Young, Florida, Illinois, Indiana, Long Beach State, Michigan, Michigan State, Minnesota, Nebraska, Northwestern, Ohio State, Oregon, Purdue, USC, Stanford, Temple, Tennessee, Texas, UCLA, Washington and Wisconsin – only eight of these teams (Nebraska, Stanford, Ohio State, Illinois, Wisconsin, UCLA, Minnesota and Florida) have been able to beat Penn State a third time. The Lions have compiled a 277-54 (84%) mark in the last 15 years versus these teams.
