FIRST SERVE

No. 15 Penn State (12-3, 4-0 Big Ten) closes out its four-match home stand with a pair of Big Ten contests this week. The Nittnay Lions will look to White Out Rec Hall on Wednesday, Oct. 5, when they face the No. 1 Minnesota Golden Gophers (12-1, 4-0 Big Ten) at 7 p.m. PSU wraps up its first spurt of conference home matches with Rutgers (4-13, 0-4 Big Ten) on Saturday, Oct. 8, also at 7 p.m.

PROMOTIONAL SPOTLIGHT: Penn State encourages fans to wear white on Wednesday evening in an effort to "White Out Rec Hall." All fans will receive free promotional shakers. The first 200 students to arrive on match day will receive free t-shirts and pizza.

* Penn State enters Friday night on a ten-match win streak after logging its first two victories over top-25 opponents of the season. The Nittany Lions are coming off their seventh and eighth straight-set victories of the season, after downing then-No. 18 Michigan State, 3-0 (25-22, 25-20, 25-13) on Friday and then-No. 22 Michigan, 3-0 (25-20, 25-19, 25-15) Saturday evening.

* Ali Frantti made an impressive jump in the weekend slate, posting a team-high 21 kills over the weekend while hitting at a .383 clip. The junior added 11 digs, five assists and two blocks. She was frequently targeted on the serve by Michigan, but responded to the challenge, making 26 flawless receptions in the match.

The Michigan match featured a balanced offense in which Penn State matched its highest kills output in a three set match this season with 47. Five players tallied six or more kills. Frantti led the way with 11. Redshirt freshman Tori Gorrell had nine, while juniors Simone Lee and Haleigh Washington added eight apiece. Right side Heidi Thelen notched six kills on a team-best .667 hitting. Junior setter Abby Detering guided the team to a .432 hitting clip while logging her third season double-double with 35 assists and 11 digs.

" Penn State alums and bronze medalists Christa Dietzen and Alisha Glass were both honored for their success in Rio at Friday evening's match. The duo comprises of the third and fourth Penn State volleyball alumnae to medal at the Olympics.

Washington and Lee both rank among the nation's best in statistical categories. Washington ranks eighth in the country in hitting percentage (.422), while Simone Lee's 4.00 kills per set rank 40th in NCAA Division I.

Penn State's ability to limit opponent's offense has been unmatched this season. The Nittany Lions lead the country in limiting opponent's hitting percentage, holding the opposition to a measly .100 efficiency.

PSU finds itself among the top 25 in the country in two other statistical categories. The Nittany Lions have hit the ball at a .309 clip in 2016, coming in second in the league and fifth nationally. Penn State also averages 2.78 blocks per set, coming in seventh in the Big Ten and 22nd among Division I programs

" Penn State climbed to No. 15 in the latest release of the AVCA Top 25 Coaches Poll. PSU has 11 matches against teams represented within the top 25. Including the Nittany Lions, a total of nine Big Ten teams are ranked in the top 25.

" The Nittany Lions face off against the Golden Gophers of Minnesota on Wednesday. Penn State enters the match with a 45-9 edge all-time. Minnesota won the most recent outing between the two sides, but Penn State holds a 10-2 record in the last 12 meetings between the two sides.

Penn State takes on Rutgers for the second time in 2016 on Saturday, Oct. 8. PSU owns a 28-9 lead all-time. The record includes Penn State's win from earlier this season, where the Nittany Lions downed the Scarlet Knights. 3-0 (25-17, 25-17, 25-5).

Penn State follows up its home matches with a road trip to Indiana next weekend. The Blue and White begin the road trip taking on Purdue on Friday, Oct. 14 at 8 p.m. before a quick turnaround to face the Indiana Hoosiers the next night on Oct. 15 at 7 p.m.

NEWS & NOTES

NITTANY LIONS' POTENT DEFENSE LEADS NATION

In the seventh week of play, Penn State has become the toughest defense in the nation for opposing teams to cope with. While 22nd nationally in blocks per set, the Nittany Lions have forced opponents to a measly .100 hitting combined, marking the lowest opponent hitting percentage in the country. The next lowest opponent hitting percentage in the Big Ten is .044 points higher, with Wisconsin limiting foes to a .144 clip.

PENN STATE OFFENSE RANKS TOP IN THE LEAGUE

With two weeks of league play in the books, Penn State has proved to be the most statistically impressive offense in the Big Ten. The Nittany Lions top conference-only stats in both kills per set (14.00) and hitting percentage (370). The offensive success is rooted in junior setter Abby Detering, who averages a B1G second-best 11.25 assists per set. Additionally, four Penn State players find themselves among the top 15 in hitting efficiency within league play - Haleigh Washington (.460, third), Tori Gorrell (.415, sixth), Heidi Thelen (.362, 11th) and Ali Frantti (.356, 13th).

FRANTTI READJUSTS IN CONFERENCE PLAY

Since the beginning of the conference season, it seems Ali Frantti has made the necessary adjustments to be successful in league play. Second on the team in kills per set during conference matches, Frantti has jumped nearly a kill per set in Big Ten action, averaging 3.08 per frame. The junior has also stood out passing Coach Rose noted, most recently being on the receiving end of 26 serves without being aced while adding seven digs against the Wolverines.

LEE'S OFFENSE GUIDES NITTANY LIONS

With double-figure kills in all but two matches this season, junior Simone Lee's 4.00 kills per set ranks third in the Big Ten standings and 40th nationally. Lee also ranks 44th in points nationally, logging 4.61 per set. Lee posted a team-best 12 kills against Michigan State before adding eight against Michigan.

DETERING AT THE HELM

Junior transfer Abby Detering (Florida) and redshirt sophomore Bryanna Weiskircher split time early in the non-conference slate at the setting position. Having started the last 11 consecutive matches, Detering has become an anchor at the position. Last weekend Detering posted 69 assists, 17 digs, six kills and three blocks while guiding the Nittany Lions to a pair of sweeps and .380 hitting over two matches. Detering also notched her third double-double of the season against the Michigan Wolverines, logging 35 assists and 11 digs.

WASHINGTON TOP TEN NATIONALLY IN EFFICIENCY

Junior Haleigh Washington continues to be one of the most consistent offensive threats in the country in 2016, ranking among the best in the nation in hitting efficiency. Hitting at a .422 clip in all matches this season, the Colorado Springs, Colorado product ranks second in the Big Ten and eighth in NCAA Division I in hitting percentage.

THELEN SHIFTS TO RIGHT SIDE

After limited time on the court in her first two seasons, junior Heidi Thelen has found her niche, moving to the right side this season. The move has paid dividends, with Thelen ranking third on the team in hitting percentage (.350) and fourth in kills (90). Most recently, Thelen scored on six kills on nine errorless swings for a .667 clip in the match against Michigan.

WHITE LOCKED IN AT LIBERO

With 15 matches of the 2016 season in the books, freshman defensive specialist Kendall White has made a name for herself this season, starting each match at libero. Since the Indianapolis, Indiana product has been exceptional, leading the team with 3.62 digs per set, good for ninth in the conference. The rookie is half a dig per set shy of the conference's top five. Through conference matches, White has charted 40 digs, good for a 3.33 per set average.

AVCA POLL UPDATE: RELEASE 7

Penn State jumped another spot, now ranked No. 15 in the latest release of the AVCA Top 25 Coaches Poll. The Nittany Lions opened the season ranked No. 9 in the Preseason Poll, before moving to No. 13 and No. 16 in last week's release. PSU has 11 matches against teams represented within the top 25. Including the Nittany Lions, a total of nine Big Ten teams are ranked in the top 25.

PENN STATE INVITATIONAL ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

After three sweeps of Rhode Island, Howard and Clemson, the Penn State Nittany Lions placed three members of the squad in juniors Haleigh Washington, Abby Detering and Heidi Thelen on the All-Tournament team. Washington was named the most outstanding player after a phenomenal performance, notching 27 kills on .610 hitting and adding a team-high 15 blocks in three sets. Detering guided the team to .354 hitting as a unit, notching 91 assists, 14 digs, seven kills and three aces. Thelen posted 21 kills with a team second-best .447 hitting and added four blocks.

nament team following their performances in a 2-1 opening week at home. Lee led the team with 3.73 kills per set while White averaged 3.45 digs per frame. White had at least 16 digs in two matches, while Lee posted double figure kills in two of three matches, including 23 kills vs. North Carolina.

PENN STATE RANKED NINTH IN AVCA PRESEASON POLL

Penn State women's volleyball earned the No. 9 ranking in the 2016 AVCA Preseason Coaches' Poll. The Nittany Lions are among seven Big Ten schools to be ranked within the AVCA Top 25 and one of four conference programs to be voted within the top 10.

Nebraska earned the No. 1 overall ranking with 60 of a possible 64 first place votes. Minnesota and Wisconsin are next at three and four, respectively. Outside the top 10, Illinois was ranked 14th and Ohio State was 15th. Purdue rounded out the group at No. 20. Michigan and Michigan State also represented the league in the poll, as both recieved votes.

NITTANY LIONS PICKED FOURTH IN BIG TEN POLL

Penn State opens the season ranked No. 4 in the Big Ten Preseason Poll, released by the conference early this week. The Big Ten Preseason poll is selected by votes from all 14 conference head coaches.

PRESEASON ALL-BIG TEN NITTANY LIONS

Juniors Haleigh Washington and Ali Frantti have been named to the 2016 Preseason Big Ten Volleyball Team. The pair of Preseason All-Big Ten honors are the second straight for Washington and Frantti, who each earned the honor in 2015. Washington is also among a group of just four honorees to be voted to the team by a unanimous decision.

ROSE ENTERS YEAR 38 ATOP THE NCAA ALL-TIME WINS LIST

With an all-time record of 1201 - 189, few have come close to matching head coach Russ Rose's impressive win total. Rose and Hawaii head coach Dave Shoji went back and forth throughout the year, but Penn State's run to its seventh NCAA national championship in 2014 vaulted Rose 11 wins ahead of Shoji, placing him firmly atop the active division I career standings at the conclusion of the season with 1.161 wins.

Prior to topping the list of DI winningest active coaches by victories, his .865 career winning clip has ranked first on the percentage chart for the last several years. Now at the top of both lists, he's one of just two active NCAA DI coaches to amass more than 1,100 career wins and one of four active coaches across all three divisions to join the 1,000 victories club.

On the list of winningest coaches of all time, Rose's 1,194-189 tally is unmatched at first place. Along with Shoji and former UCLA head coach Andy Banachowski, the three are the only DI coaches in NCAA women's volleyball coaching history to total 1,100 or more victories.

NITTANY LION ALUMS EARN BRONZE WITH TEAM USA

Penn State women's volleyball All-American alums Alisha Glass and Christa (Harmotto) Dietzen earned a Bronze medal with the United States Women's National Team at the Olympic Games in Rio.

Having played key roles for Team USA throughout the event, Glass and Dietzen helped the United States to a 3-1 (25-23, 25-27, 25-22, 25-19) win against the Netherlands to clinch The Americans' second Bronze medal since the 1992 games in Barcelona, Spain. Team USA went 6-0 through Pool play before a close 3-2 loss to Serbia in the semifinals moved the United States to 6-1 heading into the Bronze medal match.

Penn State women's volleyball now has four Olympic medalists in Nittany Lion program history as Glass earns her first and Dietzen picks up her second consecutive. Having previously earned Silver with the U.S. at the 2012 Games in London, Dietzen is Penn State's first women's volleyball alum to win two Olympic medals as a member of the 12-woman roster.

From Hopewell Township, Pa., Dietzen was a two-time first-team All-American and the 2008 CoSIDA Academic All-American of the Year in women's volleyball. From Leland, Mich., Glass also was a two-time first-team All-American for the Nittany Lions. Glass was a member of the initial three national title squads and Dietzen was a member of the first two squads, playing for Hall of Fame Coach Russ Rose.

PENN STATE IN SEASON-OPENERS

Penn State is 33-7-1 all-time in season-openers after sweeping past West Virginia Friday evening at Rec Hall. The win against the Mountaineers marks the fourth consecutive season-opening victory.

QUICK SETS

• From Oct. 16, 1996 to Nov. 9, 2001, Penn State won 139 consecutive matches when taking a 2-0 lead. Since joining the Big Ten conference in 1991, Penn State has played in 888 total matches, winning 787. Since 2008, Penn State has earned 219 of its 274 victories in three sets (80%), including 37-of-38 (98%) in 2008 and 32-of-38 in 2009 (84%). In 2015 Penn State won 22 of its 34 total matches by way of a 3-0 sweep.

NITTANY LIONS MONTH - BY- MONTH

- Penn State is 51-6 (.895) during the month of August under the direction of head coach Russ Rose (since 1979), following a 2-1 weekend at home in the Penn State Classic. Defeating the Mountaineers, the Nittany Lions have not dropped a season-opening match since losing to Oregon in 2011 before rebounding with a hard fought 3-2 win against No. 2 USC the next evening. Penn State's first two season-opening losses came during the inaugural NACWAA in 1995 against Nebraska and in the 1999 NACWAA when Florida outlasted Penn State, 3-2, in the opening round.
- With head coach Russ Rose at the helm of the program, Penn State is 380-55 (.874) during the month of September, dating back to 1979. The Lions are 222-21 (.914) during the month of September dating back to the 1995 season and 62-11 (.849) since 2010.
- PSU is 389-45 (.896) during the month of October during Rose's tenure (since 1979). Penn State has posted a 126-18 (.875) mark in October since the 2000 season, and a record of 82-8 (.911) dating back to 2006, without losing a match during the month from 2006 to the end of the 2009 season.
- Penn State is 294-48 (.860) during the month of November since 1979, including a 122-14(.897) mark since the end of 2000. The Nittany Lions posted a four-year streak from 1996-1999 where they did not lose a match in the month. Since 2010, Penn State is 45-6 (.882), since the end of the 2010 season, having not dropped a match in the month for three straight years from 2012-14.

NITTANY LIONS ON TV

A CLOSER LOOK AT 2016

WHO'S GONE AND WHO'S BACK

Perhaps Penn State's biggest challenge this year will be replacing the offensive power generated from All-American seniors Aiyana Whitney and Megan Courtney. While the offensive gap is just one piece of the puzzle, Penn State does return a few other key pieces in different areas. The Nittany Lions finished the 2015 season ranked third nationally and first in the Big Ten in blocks per set, led by First Team AVCA All-American Haleigh Washington, who led the team with 1.38 blocks per set, which closed out the year ranked third in the conference. A unanimous All-Big Ten selection, Washington also logged 13 double figure kill performances, finishing the year with .442 hitting efficiency that ranked third nationally and first in the league.

Other key offensive returners include AVCA All-America Honorable Mention Ali Frantti, and Simone Lee, who closed out the year starting 18 of the final 21 matches of the year. The Nittany Lions also received significant contributions from Bryanna Weiskircher, who helped set the team to a .295 hitting percentage in her first season at setter, good for fifth nationally in the final standings.

Despite the graduation of seniors Kendall Pierce and Lara Caraway, the Nittany Lions have the most depth in terms of numbers at defensive specialist. Keeton Holcomb is among a group of five returners at the position with the most experience. Holcomb played in 32 matches during her first season in the Blue and White, making 28 starts. She led the team with 3.05 digs per set, highlighting the season with a pair of 20-dig performance in the same day in wins against Mississippi State and Notre Dame.

TRANSFER TIME

Joining Weiskircher and Rivera at the setting position is Abby Detering and Caroline Graham. Both Detering and Graham transferred to Penn State having previously attended Florida and UCLA, respectively. Detering spent the last two seasons at Florida and enters 2016 as a junior on the Nittany Lion roster.

Graham transferred to Penn State after spending a year at UCLA, but did not play on the volleyball team. Graham attended Lycee Alexandre Dumas, serving as team captain from 2014-16. She played club volleyball with AS Tigresses (Tigers), helping the team to a national championship in 2015 and a second-place finish in 2014 and 2016.

Outside hitter Clare Powers rounds out the transfer group. Powers ranked third on the team in kills per set with 1.93 and finished fourth in digs per set with 2.19 in her first season at Saint Mary's before an injury cut her sophomore season short. She transfers to Penn State as a redshirt sophomore on the roster.

WHO'S NEW

Outside of the trio of transfers, Penn State's true freshman class features five newcomers including Emily DeMure, Allison Farrell, Kristin Krause, Emily Sciorra and Kendall White.

Emily DeMure » A four-year letterwinner at Granite Bay, DeMure helped the Grizzly Bears to a DI state championship during the 2013-14 season, as well as an All-League title in the same year. She also helped Granite Bay to a NorCal All-Section title in 2015, served as team captain. She was selected as team MVP at Granite Bay in 2015 and played club volleyball for Gold Cal Juniors.

Allison Farrell » A four-year letterwinner at Glenbard East, Farrell helped the Rams to a regional title during the 2014-15 season. She also earned Upstate 8 All-Conference and All-Area honors in 2015 and played club volleyball with Sports Performance.

Kristin Krause "New Krause joins older sister Taylor on the Nittany Lion roster. A four-year letterwinner at Parkland High, Krause set the Trojans to back-to-back East Penn conference, district and Pennsylvania state championships in 2014-15. Selected as Pennsylvania's volleyball Gatorade State Player of the Year in 2015-16, she played club volleyball with East Coast Power, where she was coached by her father, Mike Krause.

Emily Sciorra "Sciorra was a four-year letterwinner at Chantilly, where she helped the Chargers to a Conference 6A championship in 2013 as the team's libero. Sciorra played club volleyball with Metro Volleyball Club of Washington D.C., helping her team to gold in the Sports Performance National Junior Classic Open.

Kendall White "White was four-year letterwinner at Cathedral, White helped the Irish become the first Indiana 4A team to post an undefeated record (36-0) in 2015 on the way to an Indiana Class 4A state title as the team's libero. Among numerous honors, she was named Indiana's volleyball Gatorade State Player of the Year in 2015-16 and selected as the Indy Star Player of the Year and Cathedral's High School Female Athlete of the Year.

It's been nearly four decades since Russ Rose arrived on campus. Entering his 37th season, the AVCA Hall of Fame head coaches' record-setting seven NCAA national titles and 16 Big Ten championships speak directly to the confidence and character he's passed along throughout his career.

As each year passes, his list of accomplishments continue to swell, but a quick snapshot of his legendary tenure might read something like this: The leader of a women's volleyball powerhouse who's kept his program among the nation's elite for nearly 40 years, guiding his teams to a record-setting seven NCAA national titles, including an unprecedented four consecutive championships from 2007-10. Along with 16 Big Ten titles, his program is one of only two women's volleyball schools to compete in all 34 NCAA Division I Women's Volleyball National Championship events. He's produced four AVCA National Players of the Year, 13 Big Ten conference Players of the Year and at least one AVCA All-American in 35 of 36 seasons. His student-athletes excel in the classroom as well, with an outstanding 156 Academic All-Big Ten selections and five Academic All-Americans.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - Top-ranked Penn State swept past Buffalo in three sets to capture a 3-0 season-opening victory.

Redshirt senior Aiyana Whitney fueled the offense with a match-high 11 kills on .400 hitting, adding three blocks.

Sophomore Heidi Thelen led the blocking unit with a career-high seven blocks, including two solo stuffs. Freshman Keeton Holcomb posted a team-high 10 digs in her first collegiate outing, stepping into the libero role in the second and third sets.

Redshirt freshman Bryanna Weiskircher and freshman Wilma Rivera both made their collegiate debuts at the setting position. Weiskircher tallied 18 assists, three digs, two kills and an ace, while Rivera posted eight assists and four digs.

Penn State opened the match on a 7-4 advantage for an early lead. Buffalo responded with a kill and a block to narrow the gap to one, 7-6. The Nittany Lions responded with a 6-2 streak to widen the lead to five, 13-8. Buffalo battled back with five unanswered points to tie the frame at 13-all.

Sophomore Ali Frantti broke open the knotted frame with a kill, beginning a 5-1 streak that lifted PSU ahead, 18-14.

The Bulls looked to cut off the momentum with a kill, 18-15, but Penn State regrouped with a 6-3 stretch to guide PSU to set point, 24-18. A Buffalo attack error on the next play secured a 25-18 win in the opening frame for the Nittany Lions.

The Nittany Lions got out to a hot start in the second set, using a 7-1 run for a solid advantage. Buffalo answered with a quick 3-1 spurt to trim the lead to four, 8-4. Washington sparked a 5-1 run with a kill to vault PSU ahead, 13-5. A Buffalo kill and a Penn State attack error gave the Bulls an opportunity, 13-7 but PSU rallied back with a 7-2 run to double the lead, 20-9.

Penn State continued to roll, as Courtney sparked a 5-3 stretch with a kill to carry the Nittany Lions to a 25-12 win in the second set.

Penn State and Buffalo kept it tight early in the third set. Tied at 7-7, sophomore Taylor Krause served up an ace to open up a 5-1 streak that pulled PSU ahead by four, 12-8. Buffalo responded with a 4-1 stretch to climb within one, 13-12. Penn State and Buffalo traded service errors, before a kill from Whitney opened up a 4-0 strike that send PSU ahead 18-13, prompting the Bulls to call a timeout.

Buffalo came out of the break with a kill, 18-14, but Penn State regrouped with a 7-2 run to close out the third set with a 25-16 win to complete the sweep.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - Behind double figure kills from senior Megan Courtney and sophomore Ali Frantti, No. 1 Penn State swept past Stony Brook in three sets.

Penn State out-blocked Stony Brook 13.5 to 2.0, led by multi-block performances from six different Nittany Lions. Sophomore Heidi Thelen led the group for the second consecutive outing, totaling nine blocks. Redshirt senior Aiyana Whitney tallied five blocks and six kills, while sophomore Haleigh Washington added four blocks and seven kills.

Tied at 3-3 early in the first set, Penn State cracked open the tied score with a 7-2 run to double the advantage, 10-5, prompting Stony Brook to call a timeout. The Seawolves called a timeout looking to put an end to the run, but Washington came out of the huddle with a kill to make it set point, 24-13. Washington and Weiskircher teamed up for a block on the next play to secure a 24-13 win in the first set.

Penn State shot out to a 5-1 lead in the second set, capped off by back-to-back blocks. The Seawolves looked to break up the momentum with a kill, 5-2, but the Nittany Lions responded with a kill and an ace to make it 7-2. Stony Brook managed to cut off the run, 7-3, but PSU surged ahead on a 9-5 strike to bolster the lead, 16-8.

A Penn State service error and a Stony Brook kill put the Seawolves within six, 16-10, but Penn State didn't let its advantage dip below the mark for the remainder of the frame, locking up a 25-13 win to enter the intermission with a 2-0 lead.

The Nittany Lions and the Seawolves kept it close in the first half of the third set. Tied at 13-13, Penn State followed Stony Brook attack error with an ace from junior Taylor Krause to pull ahead 15-13. The Seawolves responded with a kill, 15-14, but the Nittany Lions answered with two quick points to stay on top, 17-14.

Stony Brook came storming back with four unanswered points to tie the score, 17-17. Frantti halted the momentum with three consecutive kills to lift the Nittany Lions ahead by two, 20-18. Thelen responded with a kill to spark a 4-1 stretch that pushed PSU to set point, 24-19. The Seawolves held off one attempt before Courtney closed out a 25-20 win in the third set to complete the sweep.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - Multi-block performances from five different Nittany Lions pushed No. 1 Penn State past No. 21 Colorado in straight sets in the first match of the Big Ten/Pac-12 Challenge.

Penn State owned a 13.0-3.0 advantage in team blocks against the Buffaloes, led by a match-high seven blocks from sophomore Heidi Thelen. Redshirt senior Aiyana Whitney and sophomore Haleigh Washington added four total blocks each.

Tied up at 4-4 early in the opening frame, a service ace from Taylor Krause sparked a 6-1 streak that sent the Nittany Lions ahead, 10-5, causing the Buffs to call a timeout. Courtney looked to extend the momentum out of the break with an ace, 11-5, but Colorado followed with a 6-1 stretch to climb within one, 12-11.

A kill from Thelen and an ace from Weiskircher opened up a 4-0 strike capped off by back-to-back blocks, lifting Penn State up by as many as five, 16-11. A Nittany Lion attack error broke up the streak, 16-12, but PSU regrouped with a 7-3 run to take over an eight-point lead, 23-15.

The Buffaloes looked to spark a comeback with three unanswered points, 23-18, but Washington put down a kill to make it set point, 24-18. The Buffs held off one attempt before Frantti put away the final kill to secure a 25-19 win.

Penn State shot out to a 6-0 lead in the second set, prompting Colorado to call an early timeout. Colorado came out of the break with a 6-3 stretch to arrive within three, 9-6. Courtney followed with a solo stuff, 10-6, but the Buffs continued to match the Nittany Lions point-for-point, to pull within four, 14-10.

PSU managed to remain within four points heading down the stretch. Leading by four, 21-17, a Colorado kill trimmed the Nittany Lion lead back to three, 21-18. Penn State answered back with a quick 3-0 burst to arrive at set point, 24-18.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - Top-ranked Penn State swept past Buffalo in three sets to capture a 3-0 season-opening victory.

Redshirt senior Aiyana Whitney fueled the offense with a match-high 11 kills on .400 hitting, adding three blocks.

Sophomore Heidi Thelen led the blocking unit with a career-high seven blocks, including two solo stuffs. Freshman Keeton Holcomb posted a team-high 10 digs in her first collegiate outing, stepping into the libero role in the second and third sets.

Redshirt freshman Bryanna Weiskircher and freshman Wilma Rivera both made their collegiate debuts at the setting position. Weiskircher tallied 18 assists, three digs, two kills and an ace, while Rivera posted eight assists and four digs.

Redshirt senior Aiyana Whitney fueled the offense with a match-high 11 kills on .400 hitting, adding three blocks.

PISCATAWAY, **N.J.** - The No. 18 Penn State women's volleyball team (9-3, 1-0 Big Ten) rolled past the Scarlet Knights of Rutgers (4-10, 0-1 Big Ten), 3-0 (25-17, 25-17, 25-5), on Wednesday evening inside College Avenue Gym.

Junior outside hitters Simone Lee and Ali Frantti led the way, scoring 13 and 11 kills apiece, hitting .579 and .458 respectively.

As a team, the Nittany Lions opened Big Ten play hitting at an impressive .468 clip, committing just five errors throughout the match. The team also exceeded serving, recording 10 aces in the outing.

The match started with a solo block from Lee before Detering aced the Scarlet Knights for a 3-0 lead. Rutgers scored twice during the span of the next seven points, when an enormous kill courtesy of Frantti forced a Rutgers timeout at 8-2. Rutgers scored three times before a block from Frantti and Washington pushed the Nittany Lions to be the first to 10 points. A kill of the slide from Haleigh Washington the next play edged the PSU lead to 11-5. The two sides swapped points back and forth with nothing between the two sides, as each scored six points. Penn State's lead spanned between five and six points. A kill from middle blocker Tori Gorrell made Penn State the first team to 20, before a solo stuff from Frantti made a 21-14 lead. Washington notched an enormous block with Thelen before an error from Rutgers ended the set. Frantti, Gorrell and Lee each notched three kills in the 25-17 first set victory.

An over pass kill from Washington highlighted the early action in the second, as Penn State jumped to an early 3-1 lead. An enormous swing from Lee made the score 5-2 in the Nittany Lions' favor, when Rutgers responded with two of their own. Penn State responded with a 3-0 run, capped by a kill from Gorrell, before Rutgers put together a 4-0 spurt to tie the set, 8-8. The two sides traded blows, with Frantti posting an electric kill to make the score 12-10 in PSU's favor. There was no separation between the two sides, going back and forth, before Thelen's third kill of the night and an ace from Laura Broerman sparked a 3-0 run, causing a Rutgers timeout at an 18-14 Penn State edge. The stoppage didn't slow PSU, as the Blue and White opened a 4-2 run, finished with a solo stop from Washington to force Rutgers' second timeout at 22-16. Lee hammered down two of her set-best five kills in the final three plays as PSU claimed the second set, 25-17.

A pair of impressive kills from Frantti and Heidi Thelen followed by three consecutive aces from Abby Detering catapulted Penn State to a 6-0 lead to open the third set. Rutgers called timeout and followed with its first point of the set. Lee notched her sixth kill to spark a 4-0 run. Lee committed a service error before following it up with a kill the next play for an 11-2 lead. A pair of hammers from Frantti and one from Washington extended the lead to 14-2. A 4-2 run for the Nittany Lions including an ace from Frantti for the team's ninth of the evening made the score 18-4, prompting Rutgers' second timeout. Lee came out of the timeout hot, scoring on consecutive kills before a block from Washington and Detering and an ace from Carley Muller made the score 22-4. Rutgers scored just once more before Penn State claimed the match with a 25-5 third set victory

EVANSTON, III. - The No. 18 Penn State women's volleyball team (10-3, 2-0 Big Ten) earned its second win in league play at Northwestern (7-7, 0-2 Big Ten), 3-0 (27-25, 25-17, 25-17), on Sunday afternoon in Welsh-Ryan Arena.

Penn State held a balanced attack in the match, with five players logging five or more kills. Junior outside hitter Simone Lee led the way once again, posting 10 kills in the match along with eight digs and four aces. Junior right side Heidi Thelen played a key role in the victory, notching nine kills and a team-best four blocks. Redshirt freshman Tori Gorrell added six kills and matched Thelen's blocking output.

The first set opened with two straight points from Northwestern. A kill from junior outside hitter Simone Lee put the Nittany Lions back on track, as she aced the opposition two points later to tie the match. Northwestern responded with four straight points, forcing a Penn State timeout as the Nittany Lions trailed, 7-3. Junior right side Heidi Thelen hammered down a kill out of the break before an errant attack from Northwestern closed the gap to three at 8-5. NU made a 3-0 run before a pair of Wildcat errors and a block from junior setter Abby Detering and Haleigh Washington led Northwestern to use its first timeout with just a two-point lead. A pair of kills from Lee and errors from the Wildcats brought the match to a 12-12 tie before Northwestern opened a 4-0 run to take the lead once again, 16-12.

A kill from Thelen and an ace from libero Kendall White launched a 4-1 scoring run for the Nittany Lions, prompting a Northwestern timeout at 18-17. PSU took the lead following a block from Detering and Washington for a 20-19 lead. Northwestern scored two in a row after a kill off the slide from Washington knotted the match once again at 21-21. The teams swapped points with Lee tying the set once again at 22-22 with her third kill of the day. A quick kill from the middle gave NU set point, before Lee hammered down yet another kill to tie the match. The junior followed the kill with an ace, but an error tied the set at 25-all. Thelen came up big when needed the most, supplying a pair of kills to close out the opening frame, 27-25.

Back-to-back aces from Detering highlighted a 4-1 run to open the second set. Northwestern called timeout following the initial run, forcing an error before middle blocker Tori Gorrell got on the board with a kill of her own. White added the third ace of the match for a 7-3 PSU lead. A pair of kills from Washington and Lee made the score 10-7. A pair of kills from Gorrell and Thelen made it 12-8 in PSU's favor, causing a Northwestern timeout.

Gorrell struck again out of the break before a 3-0 NU run. Junior outside hitter Ali Frantti looked to turn the tide, striking a ball down the line for a 15-12 PSU advantage. A kill from Washington and a trio of errors from Northwestern opened a six-point gap at 20-14. Northwestern scored twice before two blocks involving Gorrell, Lee and Thelen gave Penn State set point. NU fended off set point once before Lee smashed the winner for a 25-17, set two victory.

Washington, Lee and Gorrell each charted kills in the opening portion of the third. A block from Thelen gave PSU a 4-3 lead before NU responded with a kill. Lee quickly added two more kills and an ace, while Gorrell logged a stuff to give PSU an 8-5 lead and force a Northwestern timeout. Gorrell and Thelen combined for a block before Gorrell hit another kill down the middle for a five-point lead. Northwestern burned its second timeout as PSU led, 10-5.

A pair of kills from Washington and junior Ali Frantti helped guide PSU to a 13-8 lead. The sides swapped points before strikes from Lee and Thelen opened the gap to six at 18-12. After a pair of errors from the Wildcats, Gorrell slammed down a kill and Frantti logged a solo block for an eight-point lead, 22-14. Frantti notched a final kill before an NU service error ended the third, 25-17.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. – The No. 16 Penn State women's volleyball team (11-3, 3-0 Big Ten) notched its seventh consecutive sweep on Friday night in Rec Hall, taking down No. 18 Michigan State (12-3, 1-2 Big Ten), 3-0 (25-22, 25-20, 25-13) in front of a raucous crowd of 3,524.

Penn State once again strung together an impressive match, with a strong .333 hitting efficient on offense while limiting the Spartans to just a .103 clip on 97 attacks. PSU logged 42 kills to the Spartans' 31.

The trio of juniors in Simone Lee, Haleigh Washington and Ali Frantti led the way for the Nittany Lions. Lee logged a team-best 12 kills, with Frantti also scoring double-figures with 10 of her own. Washington had nine kills, an ace and a pair of blocks. Lee added a pair of stuffs as well.

The first set was back-and-forth in the early going, with a host of players in Lee, Washington, Frantti and redshirt freshman Tori Gorrell all notching kills to lead to a 15-15 tie. A pair of Michigan State hammers gave the Spartans a two-point lead when Penn State called for time. The break worked, as three consecutive kills from Lee, Washington and Frantti and a Michigan State error caused Michigan State to take its first break of the set with PSU ahead, 19-17. A 3-0 run punctuated by a spike from Gorrel forced Michigan State's second timeout at 23-19. MSU fended off three set points before an error from the Spartans led to a Penn State victory, 25-22.

The second set saw nine ties in the early going before a kill from Washington gave PSU an 11-10 lead. Penn State would not trail again in the set. A block from junior opposite Heidi Thelen and three MSU errors gave Penn State an 18-14 advantage. Michigan State wouldn't back down, pulling within two on a kill at 20-18 when Penn state took its only timeout that set. The Nittany Lions closed out the second set with a 5-2 run, as Gorrell and Lee denied the ball for set point, 25-20.

Penn State came out of the break fired up and put together the most complete set of the evening. Lee, Washington, Gorrell and Frantti all posted kills in the first six points of the match on kills for a 5-1 lead. Michigan State pulled within three at 8-5 when PSU opened a 4-0 run highlighted by a block from Washington and junior setter Abby Detering. MSU called for time at 12-5, but Penn State rattled off three straight points afterwards. A kill for Detering made it 18-8. Lee tacked on a pair of kills before PSU was aced twice. The team called timeout at 23-13 before putting the match away with a MSU error, 25-13.

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. – The No. 16 Penn State women's volleyball team (12-3, 4-0 Big Ten) earned its second top-25 victory of the weekend on Saturday night, taking down the visiting Michigan Wolverines (13-3, 2-2 Big Ten), 3-0 (25-20, 25-19, 25-15), inside the friendly confines of Rec Hall.

A slew of Nittany Lions contributed on the offensive end as the team notched 47 kills in the match, tying its largest output in a three-set outing this season.

Junior outside hitter Ali Frantti paced the club with 11 kills on .391 hitting, while adding seven digs and a pair of blocks. Redshirt freshman Tori Gorrell tabbed nine kills and a team-best five blocks, while Simone Lee and Haleigh Washington had eight kills apiece. Washington also tallied five blocks

Opposite Heidi Thelen had six spikes on a team-high .667 hitting clip. Junior setter Abby Detering paced the offense to a .432 clip as a team while accounting for 35 of the team's 44 assists. She added four kills of her own while notching 11 digs for her third double-double of the season.

Penn State jumped ahead early in the first set and never looked back. After trailing 4-3 early, PSU made a 4-0 spurt on kills from Lee, Frantti and Gorrell to secure an 8-4 lead. Michigan called for a timeout. Penn State scored twice more before Michigan responded. Michigan pulled within two when an ace from defensive specialist Keeton Holcomb and a kill from Frantti sparked a 4-0 run to make it 13-8 for the Nittany Lions. Gorrell, Frantti, and Lee all knocked down kills in a 5-2 PSU run to open the gap to five at 19-14 when Michigan called its second timeout. Michigan pulled within three at 20-17, prompting a PSU timeout. The Blue and White responded, rattling off five of the final eight points, as a kill from Washington punctuated the first frame, finishing the set at 25-20.

The second was tightly contested early on. With four ties and three lead changes near the beginning, the teams went back and forth before a kill for Detering gave PSU an 18-15 advantage. Two plays later Gorrell slammed down a kill in the middle before Washington and Thelen combined for a block the next play to force Michigan timeout at 20-16 in Penn State's favor. With a service error from Holcomb the Wolverines pulled within three at 22-19. Penn State called for time. Out of the break PSU took the final three points of the set, with a pair of Washington blocks powering the team to a 25-19, set two victory.

Much like the night prior, Penn State put together its best set of the night in the third. The team opened on a 5-1 tear, with a pair of aces from Washington and a kill from Detering forcing Michigan to call for time. Washington would spike the ball in the middle to make PSU the first to 10. Michigan pulled within three at 13-10 before another kill from Washington and her third ace of the set backed the Wolverines into calling time at 15-10. It seemed from there that for every point Michigan scored, Penn State scored twice. An ace from defensive specialist Lainy Pierce highlighted a 5-3 run for the Nittany Lions, bringing the score to 20-13. Michigan would only score twice more, as kills from Frantti and Washington closed out the match with a 25-15 set three win.
