PENN STATE KNOCKS OFF NO. 4 LOYOLA IN FOUR

The fifth-seeded No. 12 Penn State knocked off fourth-seeded Lewis in four sets (27-25, 19-25, 25-23, 25-19) in the second NCAA play-in match to earn the final remaining spot in the 2014 NCAA national semifinals.

Junior Aaron Russell powered the Nittany Lion offense with 20 kills, nine digs, four blocks and two aces. Redshirt junior Nick Goodell followed close behind with 18 kills, to go along with six digs and two blocks. Senior Peter Russell rounded out the group of double-digit performers with 15 kills, while also posting six digs and three blocks.

WEEK 16 IN REVIEW

Penn State captured its 16th consecutive and 26th overall EIVA Championship crown last weekend, with wins against George Mason and Princeton. The Nittany Lions opened the tournament with a 3-1 win against the Patriots in the semifinals before defeating Princeton to secure the conference title.

PSU CLINCHES 30TH EIVA/ECVL TITLE IN PROGRAM HISTORY

The Penn State victory at Saint Francis marked Penn State's 30th EIVA/ECVL regular season title in program history, marking the 19th time that head coach Mark Pavlik has guided his team to a regular-season title. Since joining the EIVA in 1986, Penn State has surrendered just 11 matches to a conference opponent during the regular season.

NITTANY LIONS IN THE AVCA COACHES POLL

PSU remains in control of its No. 12 ranking in the most recent AVCA DI-II Top 15 poll after tying for 12th three weeks ago. Penn State was 13th four weeks ago after having spent two weeks at No. 14. Five weeks ago, PSU moved back to No. 12 after spending one week at No. 10. Prior to the No. 10 positioning, the Lions were slated No. 12 for six consecutive weeks.

PENN STATE VS. LOYOLA - LAST TIME OUT

The Nittany Lions moved to 10-8 all-time against the Ramblers after dropping a 3-1 decision on the road earlier this season. Despite the outcome, both Aaron Russell and Nick Goodell registered double-digit kill performances, led by 18 from Russell on .452 hitting.

RUSSELL AND GOODELL EARN EIVA ALL-TOURNAMENT HONORS

Redshirt junior Nick Goodell and junior Aaron Russell earned spots on the EIVA Championship All-Tournament team after helping Penn State to the conference title. While both notched back-to-back double-digit performances last weekend, Goodell was tabbed the 2014 Most Outstanding Player.



RUSSELL EARNS OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS

After helping the team to a 2-0 weekend on the road three weeks ago, senior Peter Russell has earned his first conference honor of the 2014 season, as he has been selected as the EIVA Offensive Player of the Week. Russell recorded back-to-back double-digit kill performances in a pair of important road matches last weekend. Against No. 15 Harvard, he finished second on the squad with 14 kills and four digs before posting 10 kills and six digs at Sacred Heart. He concluded the week with a team-high .373 hitting clip, while also ranking second on the squad with 4.00 kills per set.

GOODELL EARNS OUTRIGGER ALL-TOURNAMENT HONORS

Redshirt-junior Nick Goodell earned a spot on the 2014 Outrigger Invitational All-Tournament team. The outside hitter recorded three consecutive double-digit kill performances last week, while leading the team in the category twice. Within the three matches, Goodell set a season-high mark with 19 kills on .455 hitting at Hawaii.

NITTANY LIONS SWEEP EIVA WEEKLY AWARDS

After helping the team wrap up the regular season home slate, redshirt junior Nick Goodell and junior Aaron Russell each received weekly conference recognition. Russell was selected as the EIVA Offensive Player of the Week, while Goodell was tabbed the Defensive Player of the Week.

Russell earned his fourth EIVA Offensive Player of the Week selection after recording two consecutive double digit kill performances during the week. He opened the weekend with 13 kills on .478 hitting in the win against Princeton before closing out the week with a match-high 16 kills, seven digs and three blocks against George Mason. Goodell notched his first EIVA Defensive Player of the Week selection in 2014 after registering six blocks and 10 digs during the 2-0 week at home. Against Princeton, he tallied 13 kills, three blocks and three digs, while also logging eight kills, seven digs and three blocks against George Mason.

WHAT'S NEXT?

Should Penn State defeat Loyola, the Nittany Lions would advance to the NCAA national finals, which are set for Saturday, May 3 at 8 p.m. ET on ESPNU. The advancing squad will take on the winner of the BYU/Stanford NCAA semifinal.

GOODELL PICKS UP EIVA OFFENSIVE WEEKLY HONOR

After helping the team to a pair of victories in the final two regular season matches of the year, redshirt junior Nick Goodell earned his second EIVA Offensive Player of the Week honor this season. Goodell opened the weekend with a team-high 14 kills on .524 hitting at Rutgers-Newark, adding two aces, two digs and two blocks. He returned to the court the next night to guide the Nittany Lions to their eighth consecutive victory at NJIT. He fueled the offense with another double-digit kill performance, tallying 11 kills to go along with five digs and one ace.

HERNANDEZ HIGHLIGHTS 2014 EIVA HALL OF FAME CLASS

The Eastern Intercollegiate Volleyball Association (EIVA) presented its third Hall of Fame Class at the EIVA Championship last weekend, highlighted by former Nittany Lion Ramon Hernandez.

Hernandez earned AVCA All-America honors in three consecutive seasons at Penn State, while also garnering four straight First Team All-East/All-EIVA honors from 1991-94. While at Penn State,

Hernandez also worked his way to the top of the record book, as he currently ranks among the top five in all three blocking categories in PSU history. His 107 solo blocks ranks first all-time, while his 390 block assists ranks fifth and his 497 total blocks ranks third.

PENN STATE EARNS SECOND "EIVA RALLIES!" AWARD

The Nittany Lions have been selected as the recipient of the March "EIVA Rallies! Award." The award marks the second consecutive month that the Nittany Lions have claimed the honor, which is presented monthly to the

This year's 2014 EIVA Rallies! Award is based on fan attendance. Throughout the duration of the campaign, the conference squad with the highest number of fans at each match will be recognized with the monthly EIVA Rallies! Award. At the conclusion of the season, the team with the most fans per match for the entire season will be honored with the 2014 EIVA Rallies! Award.

RUSSELL EARNS EIVA WEEKLY HONOR

After guiding the team to a 1-1 weekend on the road against two nationally ranked foes, junior Aaron Russell has earned EIVA Offensive Player of the Week honors. The award marks the third time Russell has received weekly conference recognition in 2014.

Russell opened the weekend with a team-high 18 kills on .452 hitting in a 3-1 loss at top-ranked Loyola Chicago. The next night, he returned to the court to lead the team to a 3-1 victory at No. 10 Lewis, posting a match-high 22 kills to go along with five digs and four aces.

SEIFERT AND CALLAWAY EARN ACTIVE ANKLE ACCOLADES

Redshirt sophomore Matt Seifert and redshirt freshman Matt Callaway each earned a spot on the Active Ankle All-Tournament team. Seifert closed out the week ranked third on the squad with 14 kills, on a team-high .591 hitting clip. He highlighted the weekend with 10 kills on 14 perfect swings in the match against then-No. 2 Long Beach State.

Callaway finished the 1-1 weekend on the road with a second-best .471 hitting clip after putting up three kills against the Matadors and seven against the 49ers. He also concluded the weekend with a team-high 0.50 blocks per set, highlighted by a multiblock performance in the win against CSUN.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

Following wins against Princeton and George Mason March 28-29, the Nittany Lions moved to 13-0 on the year at Rec Hall, marking their first undefeated home season since 2012. The Nittany Lions bolstered the mark to 15-0 after a pair of wins against the same two squads in the 2014 EIVA Championship. PSU has been unbeaten at home during the regular season in four of the last seven years, registering consecutive unblemished home slates in 2007, 2008 and 2009. Penn State has surrendered just four matches to an opponent at home in the seven-year span.

AMONG THE BEST SERVERS IN THE NATION

Junior Aaron Russell continues to impress from the service line, as his 0.66 aces per frame currently ranks second nationally. His team-high mark also leads the conference. In 2013, Russell tallied 40 aces on the year, which ranks 10th all-time on the single-season record list. With 69 aces on the year, he's set a new single-season personal best. His 69 aces this year ranks second all-time on the single season list. On the career list, his 134 aces ranks second all-time.

SEIFERT TABBED EIVA DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

After anchoring the Penn State defense during a 1-1 weekend on the road, redshirt sophomore Matt Seifert earned his first conference weekly award of the season, being selected as the EIVA Defensive Player of the Week.

Seifert closed out the weekend with 11 total blocks, averaging a team-high 1.22 per frame. He opened the weekend with a squad-best five blocks in a close 3-2 loss at Princeton. Seifert returned the next night to guide the Nittany Lions to a 3-1 win at George Mason, matching a season high mark with six total blocks, while also tallying a career-high six service aces.

A CLEAN SWEEP

Penn State has earned 17 of its victories in straight-sets this season, putting together a 17-1 record in three-set matches. Penn State swept six consecutive opponents from February 7 to February 22 during the regular season to add to the mark.

AN ALL AROUND CONTRIBUTOR

Within the EIVA standings, junior Aaron Russell is the only student-athlete to be ranked within the top-10 in kills, digs and aces. Averaging 4.05 kills per set and 0.66 aces per set, Russell is leading the league in both categories. His 1.92 digs per set ranks 10th overall.

CALLAWAY NAMED OFF THE BLOCK FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

After helping Penn State to its 10th consecutive victory with wins against NJIT and Rutgers-Newark, redshirt freshman Matt Callaway was selected as the Off The Block/Springbak, Inc. National Freshman of the Week. Callaway closed out last week with a team-high 10 blocks, averaging 1.67 per frame.

Callaway opened the weekend with a team-high eight kills and six blocks against NJIT, putting up three solo stuffs. He returned to the court the next evening to lead the Nittany Lions blocking unit for the second consecutive match. He tallied four blocks, including two solo stops to go along with two kills in the win against Rutgers-Newark.

GOODELL NAMED EIVA OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

After guiding Penn State to its eighth consecutive victory, redshirt junior Nick Goodell has earned his first EIVA Offensive Player of the Week honor of the season. Goodell closed out last week ranked second on the team with 45 kills, averaging 4.50 per set on a team-high .468 hitting clip. He also led the squad with eight aces, while also ranking second on the team with six blocks.

In a midweek Big Ten matchup against Ohio State, Goodell fueled the offense with a season-high 20 kills on .533 efficiency. He also added a season-high four aces to go along with three digs and three blocks. He opened the weekend with a double-digit performance against Erskine, tallying 10 kills, one ace, four digs and two blocks in the win.

RUSSELL, GOODELL HAUL IN AVCA ALL-AMERICA HONORS

Junior Aaron Russell and redshirt junior Nick Goodell both earned AVCA All-America honors this season. Russell was selected as a first team AVCA All-American, while Goodell has earned honorable mention honors.

Russell is the first Nittany Lion to earn a selection to the first team since Joe Sunder in 2011. Goodell marks the first honorable mention selection for PSU since 2001, when Carlos Guerra and Zeljko Koljesar each earned the distinction. The duo of accolades improves Penn State's total number of AVCA All-Americans to 81 since 1971. Both awards mark the first career AVCA post season honor for the duo.

SIX EARN ALL-EIVA HONORS

Six Nittany Lions earned EIVA postseason honors this season highlighted by junior Aaron Russell, who tallied his second consecutive Uvaldo Acosta Memorial Player of the Year honor, making him the first Nittany Lion since Joe Sunder (2011-12) to earn back-to-back conference Player of the Year honors.

Russell, redshirt junior Nick Goodell and redshirt sophomore Taylor Hammond earned First Team All-EIVA honors, while senior Peter Russell, redshirt sophomore Matt Seifert and redshirt junior Connor Curry were each awarded second team accolades.

The six All-EIVA honors brings Penn State's all-time number of conference selections to 194 since 1972. Aaron's individual award marks the 15th time a Nittany Lion has been honored as the Player of the Year.

CURRY TABBED ACADEMIC ALL-EIVA

Redshirt junior Connor Curry earned his third consecutive spot on the Academic All-EIVA team in 2014. He joined 14 other student-athletes from six different league schools on the squad.

Marking his third career Academic All-EIVA honor, Curry has served as Penn State's starting libero for the last three seasons, picking up three All-EIVA awards along the way. As one of two team captains this year, he's played in every set for the Nittany Lions in 2014.In addition to recording nine double-digit dig performances, his teamhigh 2.44 digs per frame ranks third in the conference and 12th nationally.

To be eligible for Academic All-EIVA honors, a student-athlete must have a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 3.50 or higher and have participated in at least 60 percent of the matches played by their team.

PENN STATE WINS "EIVA RALLIES!" AWARD

After capturing the monthy EIVA Rallies! Award in February and March, the Nittany Lions were crowned the EIVA Rallies! award winners at the 2014 EIVA Championship. During the regular-season, the award was presented monthly to the EIVA team with the highest attendance from February to April. In March, Penn State averaged 666 fans at its home matches, which was up nearly 100 fans from February's total of 594.

This year's 2014 EIVA Rallies! Award is based on fan attendance. Throughout the duration of the campaign, Penn State emerged as the overall conference squad with the highest number of fans at each match.

Penn State head coach Mark Pavlik and the Penn State men's volleyball team kicked off the EIVA Rallies campaign at the start of the season to help raise awareness for the Sloan Kettering Cancer Center. Pavlik donned a fedora in the Nittany Lions' matchup against travel partner, Saint Francis, Saturday, Feb. 1 to show his support. He put on the hat once more, when PSU visited the Red Flash on the road. University Park will be the site of the 2016 National Collegiate Men's Volleyball Championship, marking the sixth time in school history that Rec Hall has hosted the event.
