### **PENN STATE HOCKEY**

#### THIS WEEK'S MATCHUP

- This weekend marks the 33rd and 34th all-time meetings between Penn State and Wisconsin with the Nittany Lions holding the 17-12-3 series advantage.
- From the 2014-15 season through the 2016-17 season, Penn State owned the series winning 12-of-14 meetings, but since the start of the 2017-18 season things have been more even with a record of 4-4-3. Penn State is 9-5-1 all-time at home against Wisconsin.
- Senior Liam Folkes leads all current players with 17 points in 14 career games against the Badgers scoring 10 goals while adding seven assists. Classmates Nate Sucese and Denis Smirnov have each added eight goals and eight assists for 16 points in 16 career games against Wisconsin. Junior Alex Limoges has also seen success against the Badgers with five goals and 10 assists for 15 points in 11 games.
- Both Folkes and Limoges dominated Wisconsin during the 2019 Big Ten Quarterfinals combining for eight goals and eight assists for 16 points in the three-game series.
- Both teams are near the top of the country in offense as Wisconsin is tied for second averaging 4.50 goals per game and Penn State ranks fourth at 4.40 goals per game. The Nittany Lions have also seen 13 players score at least one goal through the first five games this season ranking second in the nation behind North Dakota, Minnesota State and Denver who have each seen 14 players find the back of the net. The Badgers are tied for third with 12 players recording at least one goal so far this

#### **A GRITTY WIN**

- High-octane offensive hockey usually favors Penn State, but last Friday the Nittany Lions gutted out a 2-1 victory over Robert Morris marking the first time since a 2-1 win over Wisconsin in the 2017 Big Ten Championship game that PSU won a game when scoring two goals or less.
- Penn State is 2-0-0 this season in one-goal contests after posting a 6-5-2 record in such games during the 2018-19 season. Six of the last 12 games between Penn State and Wisconsin starting with the 2017 Big Ten Championship game have been decided by one goal or less with the other six having a 3.83 average goal differential.

#### A TALE OF THREE PERIODS

- Penn State has jumped out to early leads in four of its first five games while outscoring opponents 8-1 over the opening 20 minutes of play so far this season. The Nittany Lions have also closed strong offensively with 10 third period goals. PSU is 4-0-0 when scoring first this season.
- Last season the second period was the strongest for the Nittany Lions with 71 goals and a +16 goal differential, however, this season Penn State has only scored four second period goals compared to 14 for the Badgers during the middle frame.
- Wisconsin is doubling up its opponents in the second period so far this season with a 14-7 scoring edge, but are being outscored 6-5 in the first period.

#### AT THE TOP OF THEIR GAME

• Senior Brandon Biro became the sixth member of the 100-point club at Penn State following his game-winning third period goal last Friday against RMU. The goal was his fourth of the season tying for the team lead.

- Biro is the second Nittany Lion this season to hit the century mark after Denis Smirnov accomplished that same feat against Alaska the week prior.
- With the trio of Biro, Smirnov and Nate Sucese, who reached 100 points late last season, Penn State is the only Division I institution with multiple 100-point scorers entering the weekend. Sucese ranks third nationally among active players with 113 points while Smirnov and Biro rank fourth and fifth with 101 and 100, respectively.
- Sucese is also second in the nation among active players with 52 career goals. His 11 points and nine assists so far this season rank second nationally.
- Sucese also crept up the Penn State all-time scoring list moving into third all-time with his 113 points just five behind Chase Berger '19 (118) and 15 behind David Goodwin '17 (128). The senior also moved into second all-time on the Penn State goals list with 52 and is currently just two shy of Andrew Sturtz's program record.

#### MR INNES

- Senior goaltender Peyton Jones has begUn the season very strong for the Nittany Lions winning all four of the games he has started between the pipes improving his career record to 62-35-8. His 62 wins are the most in the nation among active goaltenders.
- Jones' .942 save percentage so far this season is good for first in the Big Ten and sixth in the nation while his 1.75 goals against average ranks second and 12th, respectively.

#### **TOUGH COMPETITION**

- This marks the first contests for Penn State this season against a ranked opponent and the Nittany Lions are 36-57-7 all-time against ranked opponents including a 19-23-4 record in such games on home ice.
- Over the past three seasons, however the Nittany Lions are above .500 at 27-26-6 including a 15-11-3 mark at Pegula Ice Arena.
- This weekend's games against Wisconsin mark the 10th and 11th games in the all-time series where both teams have been ranked. Penn State is 5-2-2 in the previous nine such games.

### **BLUE-LINE BEAUTY**

- Junior Cole Hults opened the season in a big way against Sacred Heart three weeks ago registering the eighth hat-trick in program history, but just the first by a PSU defenseman. Hults also became the first Big Ten defenseman in over three years to accomplish that feat.
- All eight "Hockey Valley Hat-Trick's" have taken place on home ice with the last seven happening inside Pegula Ice Arena.
- Hults' four goals remain the most in the country by a defenseman.

#### **SCOUTING WISCONSIN**

- Wisconsin lost little and added a lot to a team that pushed Penn State to the brink last season during the Big Ten Quarterfinals. The No. 7 Badgers return 13 of their top-15 scorers from last season including leading scorer Sean Dhooghe who was the only Badger with double-digit goals scoring 15 while adding 11 assists for 26 points.
- Wisconsin is 4-2-0 so far this season including a weekend sweep against two-time reigning National Champion Minnesota-Duluth two weeks ago.
- The Badgers also boast one of the top recruiting classes in the nation having brought in 2019 NHL first-round draft picks Alex Turcotte (5th overall) and Cole Caufield (15th overall). Caufield leads the nation with seven goals through the first six games including multi-goal games in each of his first three NCAA games. Turcotte is third on the team in scoring with three goals and five assists for eight points, but sat out last weekend's series against Clarkson due to an illness.
- Wisconsin is also paced by two of the top defensemen in the nation with junior Wyatt Kalynuk and sophomore K'Andre Miller. Kalynuk already has six helpers this season while Miller has scored a trio of goals from the blue-line.
- Overall, Wisconsin has 12 NHL draft picks on its roster tied for the most in the nation with Boston College and Boston University.
- The Badgers are tied for second in the nation averaging 4.50 goals per game aided by an 11-5 victory over Merrimack early in the season, however, Wisconsin ranks 44th in the nation allowing 3.33 goals per contest.
- Wisconsin has also excelled on special teams early in the season ranking eighth in the country on the power-play converting 25 percent of the time (7-for-28) while its penalty kill is tied for ninth having only allowed two man-advantage goals on 22 chances (90.9 percent).
- Sophomore Daniel Lebedeff returns between the pipes for Wisconsin after winning the starting goaltender job during the 2018-19 season. Lebedeff has started all six games this season posting a 3.15 goals against average and an .890 save percentage.



### SPECIAL TEAMS SUCCESS

- Penn State has scored six power-play goals on 25 attempts so far this season for a 24 percent conversion rate to rank fourth in the Big Ten and 9th in the nation.
- The Nittany Lion PK has also seen early season success allowing just two man-advantage goals on 24 opponent opportunities ranking first in the Big Ten and 8th in the nation, PSU allowed a goal on its first penalty of the season and since then have killed off 22-of-23 including 15-straight.

#### SUCESE -> BIRO -> BACK OF THE NET

- Biro and Sucese exploded for 20 points this season on six goals and 14 assists with each player having an assist on the others on all six occasions.
- With 51 career games as linemates over the past three seasons the duo has now assisted one another on 28 goals including 22 primary helpers.

· Penn State remains home for another Big Ten Conference series when the Michigan State Spartans come to town on November 8-9 for a pair of contests.

#### **HIGH ABOVE**

• At 6'8" senior Nikita Pavlychev is one of three players in the NCAA that share the distinction of tallest player joining Stephen Mundinger of Maine and Keenan Suthers of St. Lawrence. There are then six players at 6'7".

#### **VETERAN PRESENCE**

• With 10 seniors, the Nittany Lions have the second largest senior class in the nation behind only Boston College's 11, but factor in the nine juniors and Penn State has the most upper classmen in the nation with 19 of its 29 players as either a junior or senior.

### O CAPTAIN! MY CAPTAIN!

· Senior Brandon Biro was selected by his peers as the seventh captain in program history for the 2019-20 season after serving as an alternate last season. Fellow senior Liam Folkes and Kris Myllari with serve as alternates.

#### **FOUR LAND ON PRESEASON ALL-B1G TEAMS**

- Junior classmates Evan Barratt and Alex Limoges were named First-Team All-Big Ten by the league's coaches as part of the preseason awards while junior Cole Hults landed on the second-team and Kris Myllari was an honorable mention.
- Barratt became just the fourth Nittany Lion to earn firstteam All-Big Ten accolades following the 2018-19 season scoring 16 goals while adding 27 assists for 43 points, the third highest single-season total in program history. Barratt's 1.34 points per game led the Big Ten and ranked fourth in the nation setting a new single-season program record while his 43 points were good for fourth in the Big Ten and 13th nationally.
- Hults' 28 points last season were the third-most by a Penn State defenseman in a single-season and ranked third in the conference for blueliners. His plus-19 rating was the second-best mark for defensemen in the Big Ten while his 68 blocked shots were good for ninth in

• Myllari ranked second in the Big Ten and fifth in the nation last season with 90 blocked shots while his 21 points were the ninth most in the conference for defensemen. The senior alternate captain set the Penn State career record for goals by a defenseman last season when he notched the 17th of his career at Michigan State.

#### **NITTANY LIONS TABBED B1G FAVORITE**

- For the first time in program history Penn State was picked to win the Big Ten by the league coaches in the
- After finishing in the cellar during the inaugural B1G season in 2013-14, Penn State has finished fourth in three-straight seasons and four of the last five mixing in a third-place finish in 2015-16.
- The regular season champion receives home-ice advantage and a first-round bye in the Big Ten playoffs while the next three seeds earn home ice in the best-of-three quarterfinal round.
- The semifinal and final are then single game contests at the higher-seeded school.

#### **RECAPPING 2018-19**

- Penn State narrowly missing its third-consecutive NCAA Tournament last season after posting a 22-15-2 record and advancing to its second Big Ten Championship game in the past three seasons. The 22 wins are the second most in a single-season in program history.
- The Nittany Lions led the nation in several offensive categories during the 2018-19 campaign including goals (177), assists (301), points (478) and goals per game (4.54) each total set a new program record.
- Penn State is returning 20 letter-winners from that 2018-19 roster including 82 percent of total offense. Nine newcomers will round out the 2019-20 roster.
- Junior Alex Limoges became the first Nittany Lion ever to pace the country in scoring as his program record 50 points tied for the national lead. Limoges also set a program record with 23 goals, a total that led the Big Ten and tied for the second most nationally.
- Junior Evan Barratt became the fourth Nittany Lion to secure Big Ten first-team All-Conference recognition after leading the league and ranking fourth in the nation averaging 1.34 points per game. He potted 16 goals while adding 27 assists for 43 points, the third highest single-season total in program history.
- Along with Limoges and Barratt, Penn State had seven total players with double-digit goals and 11 players register 20 or more points including four with 40-plus points. Senior classmates Liam Folkes and Brandon Biro also had career years with 42 and 40 points, respectively.
- Freshman Paul DeNaples led the Big Ten in plus/minus and ranked third in the nation at +31, the second-best single-season rating in program history.

- Penn State has played to a sellout crowd in 109-of-116 home games, 94-straight regular season, including all 20 regular season contests last season.
- More than 6,000 fans have filed into the arena on 76 occasions including 17 games last season.
- · Last season, Penn State ranked seventh

in average attendance (5,801) and first in the nation in building capacity percentage (101.7 percent).

• Penn State saw a single-season record 133,422 fans come through the gates last season.

#### **WELCOME HOME**

- Penn State opened the 5,704-seat Pegula Ice Arena with a 4-1 win against Army Oct. 11, 2013.
- The arena was brought to fruition through an initial \$88 million donation—the largest in University history—in September 2010 from Penn State alumnus Terry Pegula and his wife, Kim. The Pegulas added to that figure to bring their total donation to \$102, supplying \$90 million for the facility.
- The \$90 million facility broke ground in early February 2012 and was turned over to Penn State in September 2013.

#### THIS IS BIG TEN HOCKEY

- The Big Ten is in its seventh season entering 2019-20. In league action, each Big Ten team will play 24 league games, including 12 home contests.
- The Big Ten is comprised of seven total universities with the University of Notre Dame becoming an official affiliate member at the start of the 2017-18 season.
- Big Ten teams are awarded three points for a regulation or overtime victory, two points for a 3-on-3 overtime or shootout win and one point for a 3-on-3 overtime or shootout loss.
- The 2018-19 season was the first season the Big Ten instituted a 3-on-3 overtime period joining the NCHC and WCHA.
- Big Ten schools have won a combined 23 national championships, more than any other league.
- The Big Ten Hockey Conference is the only Power 5 conference to sponsor men's hockey.
- The Big Ten tournament will take place at campus sites once again during the 2019-20 season.

### **MEET COACH GADOWSKY**

**Guy Gadowsky** will guide the Nittany Lions in his 20th collegiate season at the helm of an NCAA Division I program during the 2019-20 campaign and his eighth at Penn State.

### AT PENN STATE

In 2018-19, Gadowsky led Penn State to its second-highest win total in program history with 22, along with becoming the winningiest coach in Big Ten Tournament history, compiling a 10-6 record over six seasons. The Nittany Lions returned to the Big Ten Championship game for the second time in the past three seasons, but dropped a tough 3-2 decision at Notre Dame.

Penn State secured its most Big Ten



wins in program history with 11 while its 35 points were also the most in a single season. The Nittany Lions once again led the nation in goals per game with a new single-season record of 4.54 while also setting single-season records for goals (177), assists (301) and points (478), each of which were also tops in the nation.

Gadowsky saw sophomore Alex Limoges become the first Nittany Lion ever to lead the nation in points as he set a single-season program record with 50 while his 23 goals were also a new program standard and ranked tied for second in the nation.

Sophomore Evan Barratt became just the fourth player in program history and third in the last three seasons to earn first-team All-Big Ten honors. Barratt, along with teammate Aarne Talvitie, also became the first Niittany Lions ever to represent their countries at the IIHF World Junior Championship. Talvitie captained Finland to the gold medal while Barratt helped Team USA take home the silver.

Despite the win total and records the Nittany Lions fell one spot short of the NCAA Tournament, finishing the season at No. 16 in the PairWise rankings.

In 2017-18, Gadowsky led his Nittany Lions to their second-straight NCAA Tournament. Penn State was able to take the short drive down to Allentown, Pennsylvania, as it served as host for the Midwest Regional. The Nittany Lions' season was cut short at the hands of the Denver Pioneers, 5-1, in the NCAA Midwest Regional semifinal.

Earlier in the 2017-18 season, Gadowsky secured his 100th career victory at Penn State, which in turn, was the 100th victory for the program, a 5-1 victory over Min-

nesota on February 23, 2018. That victory was the start of the first-ever sweep of the Golden Gophers by the Nittany Lions, which secured home-ice for Penn State in the Big Ten Tournament Quarterfinals. Penn State went on to sweep Minnesota in two games, clinching the series and its fourth B1G Semifinal appearance in five years.

Junior Andrew Sturtz become just the second member of the 100-point club at Penn State in 2017-18 and became the all-time leading goal scorer in program history. Sturtz graduated early and signed an NHL deal with the Ottawa Senators.

Gadowsky also coached Trevor Hamilton to a Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year award, the first major conference honor awarded to a Nittany Lion. Hamilton joined Casey Bailey and Vince Pedrie as the only first-team All-Conference members in program history.

In 2016-17, Gadowsky led Penn State to its most successful season ever, compiling a record of 25-12-2. Penn State won the 2017 Big Ten Tournament and earned its first-ever NCAA Tournament appearance, falling one game shy of the Frozen Four. The Nittany Lions defeated Union 10-3, tying the record for most goals in a team's tournament debut, before bowing out to eventual national champion Denver, 6-3, in the Midwest Regional final.

Penn State opened the 2016-17 season 13-1-1 using a program-best 11-game winning streak. The Lions also earned their first-ever uscho.com No. 1 national ranking on Jan. 17, 2017, with a 16-2-1 record. Penn State finished the season as the highest-scoring team in the country, averaging 4.10 goals per game.

### **HEAD COACH GUY GADOWSKY**

The 2016-17 Nittany Lions also set numerous single-season team records on offense including most goals (160), assists (265), points (425), shots (1,719), goals/gm (4.10) and shots/gm (44.1) to go along with the program-best 25 victories.

Penn State had its first 20-win season under Gadowsky in 2015-16, finishing third in the Big Ten with a 21-13-4-1 overall record.

Penn State rose to as high as 14th in the uscho.com National Poll during the 2015-16 campaign. On February 6, the Nittany Lions earned their first-ever victory at Minnesota's Mariucci Arena as they defeated the Gophers 5-3.

PSU secured a 5-2 triumph over Wisconsin in the Big Ten quarterfinals before bowing out to eventual champion Michigan 7-2 in the semifinals.

Of Gadowsky's 24 players on the 2015-16 roster, eight signed professional contracts in the off-season ranging from the ECHL, AHL, NHL and Europe.

His 2014-15 Nittany Lions exceeded expectations all season, garnering a winning season in overall action (18-15-4) and Big Ten play (10-9-1-0), while earning the program's first national ranking. Despite being picked sixth in the preseason, Gadowsky's team was in the hunt for a Big Ten title until the final weekend of the season.

Under Gadowsky's tutelage, junior Casey Bailey led the Big Ten in scoring and parlayed his outstanding season into a two-year contract with the Toronto Maple Leafs, eventually scoring his first NHL goal in the season finale. Bailey was an All-Big Ten first-team honoree, while six other Nittany Lions earned honorable mention recognition from the league coaches.

The 2014-15 season also saw Gadowsky reach the 200-win plateau in historic fashion when his Lions knocked off No. 4 UMass Lowell, 4-1 on Nov. 15, 2014. The program's rise from its first year in the Big Ten to its sophomore campaign saw gains of 10 wins overall and seven wins in conference play.

Penn State earned wins over every Big Ten team during the 2014-15 season including a season sweep of perennial power Wisconsin and a first win over Big Ten champion Minnesota on THON Night.

During the 2013-14 campaign, the bench boss guided the Nittany Lions during the Big Ten Conference's first season of play. Penn State, which faced seven NCAA tournament teams and three Frozen Four participants, capped its season with a 2-1 double-overtime victory against Michigan in the Big Ten quarterfinals.

Gadowsky led the Nittany Lions to a 13-14-0 record during their inaugural NCAA Division I season in 2012-13. He guided the squad to several marquee victories, including wins against three future Big Ten opponents (Michigan State, Ohio State, Wisconsin). Penn State also topped Vermont at Wells Fargo Arena in front of the largest crowd to watch a college hockey game in an NHL barn (19,529).

In 2011-12, Gadowsky steered Penn State's final season in the ACHA, while recruiting for the future. That team went 29-5-0.

### AT PRINCETON

Before coming to Happy Valley, Gadowsky served as Princeton's bench boss for seven seasons. In his first five years as head coach, the Tigers improved their win total in each season. In 2008-09, Princeton captured a program-record 22 victories and earned its second-straight NCAA tournament appearance.

Gadowsky, inherited a program that had a won a combined eight games in the two seasons prior to his arrival and in 2007-08 he guided Princeton to both the ECAC Hockey tournament and Ivy League crowns. The team earned its first NCAA tournament berth since 1998 and Gadowsky garnered ECAC Hockey Coach of the Year honors and was a finalist for the Spencer Penrose Award, presented to Division I hockey's top coach. He was also named Inside College Hockey National Coach of the Year.

More than 20 Tiger players went on to sign professional contracts, with Kevin Westgarth playing for the Stanley Cup champion Los Angeles Kings in 2011-12. Gadowsky also coached two ECAC and Ivy League Players of the Year as Lee Jubinville (2008) and Zane Kalemba (2009) each won the award in their junior seasons.

### **AT ALASKA**

Gadowsky spent five seasons as head coach of Alaska (1999-2004), where he inherited a team that had not won more than 14 games in any of the previous five seasons since joining the then-Central Collegiate Hockey Association. After two rebuilding seasons, the 2002 CCHA Coach of the Year led the Nanooks, ranked 11th nationally at the end of the season, to their only 20-win campaign since joining the conference. He followed that up with 15 wins in 2002-03 and 16 victories his last season.

Alaska twice hosted the first round of the CCHA playoffs in a three-year span, a feat never accomplished prior to Gadowsky's arrival. During his tenure with the Nanooks, his teams set school records for team grade-point average, wins and game attendance.



### **BEFORE COLLEGE COACHING**

Before joining the collegiate ranks, Gadowsky spent three seasons (1996-99) as head coach and director of hockey operations for the Fresno Falcons of the West Coast Hockey League. He led the squad to the playoffs in each season and left the team as the winningest coach in franchise history. In his first season, Gadowsky posted a 38-win campaign and garnered WCHL Coach of the Year accolades.

### **PLAYING CAREER**

The Edmonton, Alberta, native played collegiately at Colorado College from 1985-89, serving as team captain as a senior, while also earning the team's Rodman Award, given for outstanding leadership and sportsmanship. The three-time WCHA All-Academic team member collected 46 points in 134 career games.

Upon graduation, Gadowsky embarked on a seven-year professional career that included stops with the ECHL's Richmond Renegades, the IHL's San Diego Gulls and the AHL's St. John's Maple Leafs and Prince Edward Island Senators. Gadowsky saved his best season for last as he totaled 52 goals and 29 assists for the Fresno Falcons in 1995-96. He earned league MVP and first-team all-star recognition.

Gadowsky also competed with the Canadian National Team and played professionally in Austria, the Netherlands and Sweden during the 1993-94 season.

### **PERSONAL LIFE**

Gadowsky and his wife, Melissa, have two sons, Mac and Magnus, and a daughter, Mia.


