#### THE MATCHUPS

The No. 4 Nebraska volleyball team faces one of its biggest challenges of the 2015 regular season with two road matches against top-13 teams in a 24-hour span this weekend. On Friday, the Huskers take the court with No. 1 Penn State at Rec Hall in University Park, Pa., at 6 p.m. (CT). The match will be televised nationally on the Big Ten Network. Nebraska immediately travels to Columbus, Ohio after the match to get set for No. 13 Ohio State on Saturday at 6 p.m. (CT). That match at St. John Arena can be seen online with a BTN Plus subscription. John Baylor and Diane Mendenhall will have the radio calls on Husker Sports Network (107.3 FM in Lincoln and 105.9 FM in Omaha).

Nebraska enters the week 11-1 and 2-0 in the Big Ten after sweeping lowa twice last week. The Huskers have won eight straight matches, tying the longest win streak since the 2012 season. NU's 11-1 start is its best since beginning 18-1 in 2011. Penn State is 13-0 and 2-0 in the Big Ten and dropped its first two sets of the season last Saturday in a 3-2 win over No. 16 Minnesota. The Nittany Lions took care of Wisconsin, 3-0, to begin Big Ten play. Ohio State is 12-2 and 1-1 in the Big Ten entering a Friday home match against lowa. The Buckeyes lost to the 16th-ranked Golden Gophers, 2-3, before turning around to beat No. 19 Wisconsin, 3-2. Both Penn State and Ohio State are in the midst of four-match homestands to begin Big Ten play.

#### **DESTINATION OMAHA**

The Huskers are looking to get back to the NCAA Semifinals for the first time since 2008, and it comes with added motivation this year as the NCAA Championship returns to the CenturyLink Center in Omaha for the third time in 10 years. The NCAA Championship was last in Omaha in 2008, when the Huskers fell to eventual champ Penn State in the semifinals. The final four was also in Omaha in 2006, when NU beat Stanford to win the program's third NCAA title. Those matches remain the most attended matches



in NCAA volleyball history with 17,430 at the Nebraska vs. Penn State semifinal in 2008 and 17,209 at the Nebraska vs. Stanford championship match in 2006.

#### **NOTES TO KNOW**

#### **About the Huskers**

- Nebraska is 6-9 all-time against No. 1 teams in the AVCA Top 25 Poll. The Huskers have won three of their last four matchups against top-ranked teams, the latest coming on Oct. 28, 2012 against Penn State at the NU Coliseum, 3-2. The Huskers have never won a true road match against a No. 1 team, as they lost at UCLA in 1992 and at Long Beach State in 1997.
- Nebraska leads the Big Ten with 16.07 digs per set and ranks 44th in the nation.
- The Huskers are hitting .294 on the season to rank second in the Big Ten and 10th nationally.
- Nebraska averages 14.83 kills per set, which ranks second in the conference and third in the nation.
- Two-time All-American **Kadie Rolfzen** is putting up a teambest 3.29 kills per set along with 2.82 digs per set. The junior has 29 career double-doubles and was the B1G Co-Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 21.
- Middle blocker Amber Rolfzen leads the team with 45 blocks.
   Her 1.61 blocks per set leads the Big Ten and is fourth nationally.
   Her block average is on pace to be the best by a Husker since Melissa Elmer's school-record 2.17 in 2005.
- True freshman outside hitter **Mikaela Foecke** averages 2.81 kills per set with a .332 hitting percentage, the best by an NU outside hitter. Foecke has won two Big Ten Co-Freshman of the Week honors.
- Setter **Kelly Hunter** guides the Husker attack with 11.45 assists per set, ranking second in the Big Ten and 12th nationally. The sophomore had a career-high 57 assists and nine kills in the comeback win against Oregon on Sept. 5. Hunter was named the B1G Setter of the Week on Aug. 31 and Nebraska Invitational MVP on opening weekend. She has a team-best four double-doubles, the latest coming at lowa State with a career-high 17 dins
- Libero **Justine Wong-Orantes** averages a team-best 4.13 digs per set and has played every set in 57 consecutive matches dating back to her freshman season in 2013.
- Outside hitter **Kelsey Fien**, an All-Big performer in 2014, is averaging 2.57 kills per set. Fien's career-high 19 kills vs. Oregon on Sept. 5 are the most by a Husker this season.
- Senior middle blocker **Cecilia Hall** is putting up 2.05 kills per set on the season with a .329 hitting percentage. In her first three years, Hall averaged 1.31 kills per set and was a career .290 hitter.

#### **Scouting Penn State**

The Nittany Lions are led by four key attackers. Middle blocker Haleigh Washington sets the tone with 2.76 kills and 1.51 blocks per set. Her .527 hitting percentage leads the Big Ten. Outside hitter Megan Courtney leads the team in kills with 3.15 per set and adds 3.07 digs per set. Last year's AVCA Freshman of the Year Ali Frantti averages 2.93 kills per set and 1.83 digs per set. Aiyana Whitney chips in 3.12 kills and 0.9 blocks per set. Both Frantti and Whitney were second-team All-Americans last year. Penn State leads the league in hitting (.319) and opponent hitting (.114), as well as blocks (3.20 per set). PSU ranks second nationally in hitting percentage, and third in blocks and opponent hitting percentage.

#### **Scouting Ohio State**

The Buckeyes get 4.04 kills and 2.40 digs per set from Elizabeth Campbell, who leads the Big Ten in total points (240.5). Campbell was an AVCA All-America honorable mention pick last year. Middle blocker Taylor Sandbothe adds 3.19 kills and 1.17 blocks per set. Valeria León is second in the conference in digs with 4.79 per set. The Buckeyes are third in the Big Ten in digs per set (15.55) and fourth in opponent hitting percentage (.142).

# **HUSKERS MAKE WAVES IN BEACH VOLLEYBALL**

Nebraska concluded its third and best season of beach volleyball in 2014. The Huskers went 6-2 with both losses coming to the top-two ranked teams in the nation (USC and Hawaii). NU was close to pulling off the upset on No. 1 Hawaii, taking the match down to the final pair. Nebraska finished No. 11 in the final DiG Magazine poll. Nebraska's 6-2 record accounted for both the top winning percentage (.750) and most wins in program history. The Huskers ended the season by capturing the Arizona Wildcat Spring Challenge with a perfect 3-0 record, including a 3-2 upset against No. 11 Arizona in the final match. Justine Wong-Orantes and Alicia Ostrander formed NU's top pair and posted an 8-5 record. Kelly Hunter and Kadie Rolfzen were 8-3, as were Annika Albrecht and Cecilia Hall. Beach volleyball becomes a full-fledged NCAA Championship sport next spring.

#### **NOTES TO KNOW**

#### **Wong-Orantes Moving Up Career Digs Chart**

Junior Justine Wong-Orantes ranks 11th in school history with 1,024 career digs entering the week and needs eight to move into the top 10. Wong-Orantes surpassed 1,000 career digs at lowa State on Sept. 19, becoming the fastest Husker to reach 1,000 digs, doing so in just 75 matches.

#### Rolfzen Closing in on 1,000 Kills

Junior Kadie Rolfzen enters the week with 907 career kills. She is aiming to become the 21st player in Husker history to reach 1,000 career kills and just the ninth to do so before her senior season. The last Husker to reach the 1,000-kill plateau before her senior season was Jordan Larson as a junior in 2007.

#### Coach Cook Wins No. 600

Nebraska head coach John Cook captured his 600th career win in a 3-1 victory against Pittsburgh on Aug. 29. Cook entered the season with 597 career wins in 23 years as head coach at Wisconsin and Nebraska, and the Huskers' third win of the season made him one of 15 active Division I head coaches to reach 600 career wins.

#### Nebraska Picked Second in Big Ten Preseason Poll

The Huskers were picked to finish second by the Big Ten coaches in the conference's preseason poll. Kadie Rolfzen and Kelsey Fien were named to the 14-member preseason All-Big Ten Team. Both were All-Big Ten performers in 2014, while Rolfzen was a third-team AVCA All-American for the second straight season with Fien earning honorable mention.

#### **Ostrander and Hunter Named 2015 Captains**

Senior outside hitter Alicia Ostrander and sophomore setter Kelly Hunter were selected team captains for the 2015 season. Ostrander enjoyed a breakout role in 2014 with 2.49 kills pet set. After the volleyball season, she will join the Nebraska women's basketball team for their season. A standout at both sports at Gordon-Rushville High School, Ostrander practiced with both teams over the summer. Hunter, a highly touted recruit out of Papillion, Neb., will take over the setter reins after redshirting in 2014 while Mary Pollmiller finished out her career.

#### **Huskers Traveled the Globe in 2015 Summer**

A few Huskers spent their summers traveling the globe playing competitively. Justine Wong-Orantes was selected to the first ever B1G Foreign Tour Team and played matches with other Big Ten student-athletes in Croatia, Slovenia and Italy in June. The team also participated in community service initiatives and toured European cities. Briana Holman was selected to the U.S. Collegiate National Team and competed at the World University Games in Gwangju, South Korea in July. It was her second time competing with the U.S. CNT, as she took part in the Tour of China in 2014. Holman had 18 kills in the tournament with two blocks and two aces, as the U.S. CNT finished ninth overall. Alicia Ostrander took part in the U.S. Collegiate National Team round-robin tournament at the USA Volleyball Girls' Junior National Championships in June. Ostrander's CNT Blue Team was the tournament champion with a perfect 3-0 record. Ostrander tallied 31 points in the three matches.

#### Husband, Wife Duo Join Husker Coaching Staff

Chris Tamas is in his first season as a Husker assistant coach, while his wife, Jennifer (Joines) Tamas, is a volunteer assistant. The two came to NU in May from Cal Poly, where they spent the past two seasons in the same roles. Both Chris and Jen are former U.S. National Team captains. Chris was a first-team AVCA All-American in 2003 at Pacific, while Jen was the Big West Conference Player of the Year in 2003 at Pacific.
